### VIRGINIA-RHODE ISLAND SERIES

- Virginia holds a 7-0 edge in the all-time series.
- The teams have not met since the 1999 season when UVa swept a three-game series in Charlottesville.

### NOTING RHODE ISLAND

- Rhode Island was swept in a three-game series at Mississippi State to open the season.
- In the first game, URI held an 8-7 ninth-inning lead before the Bulldogs rallied for the win.
- The Rams went 37-20-1 last year and were considered by many pundits as the top team left out of the NCAA Tournament.
- URI had big non-conference wins at Miami (Fla.), NC State and Oklahoma State last year and also scored a neutral-site victory against Ohio State.
- URI returns seven of its eight position starters from that team.

### CAVALIERS EARN FIRST-EVER NO. 1 NATIONAL RANKING

- After a strong opening weekend at nationally-ranked East Carolina, Virginia earned a No. 1 national ranking by Baseball America and Rivals.com.
- It marks the first No. 1 ranking in school history for Virginia Baseball.
- The baseball team becomes the 10th athletics program at Virginia to garner a No. 1 national ranking, joining men's basketball, women's basketball, field hockey, football, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, men's soccer, women's soccer and men's tennis.

### WEEKEND SUCCESS SINCE 2004

- Virginia is 1-0 in weekend series this season after winning two of three games at then-No. 11 East Carolina last week.
- The Cavaliers have won 14 straight non-conference weekend series (three games or more) and have not lost a non-league series since 2003 at Auburn.
- UVa has posted a winning record in 19 straight non-conference weekends (regular season), dating to a split with Penn State in 2004.

### ODDS AND ENDS

- Virginia returns its entire starting lineup from 2009.
- UVa has led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA the last five years (3.13).
- The Cavaliers hit 59 home runs last year – most by a UVa team since 2002.
- Virginia led the ACC with a .327 batting average last year, the highest BA at UVa since 1985.
- UVa stole at least 100 bases last season (119) for the fourth straight year.

**BALANCE THROUGHOUT LINEUP**

- Eight Virginia players have at least four hits through the first four games.
- In the last two games vs. East Carolina and George Washington, at least eight of the nine starters recorded one hit or more.
- UVA has posted at least 10 hits in each of its three wins.

**DEFENSE OFF TO GOOD START**

- Through four games, Virginia has committed just one error – good for an impressive .994 fielding pct.
- The Cavaliers recorded a .972 fielding mark last year.

• The school record for fielding percentage is .975, set in 2005.

**CANNON CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS**

- Tyler Cannon comes into the weekend with 698 career at bats, which is tied for ninth in UVA history (Tim Henry, 2004-07); he needs two ABs to match Jon Benick (1998-2001) for eighth.
- With two doubles last week, Cannon now has 45 doubles – tied for eighth at UVA. He also ranks seventh in triples (9) and 10th in HBP (19) and is nearing the top 10 in games played (189), runs (137), hits (205) and stolen bases (39).

**ARICO, CANNON MOVE UP IN UVA ANNALS**

- With his save Wednesday, Kevin Arico now has 13 career saves – good for fourth in Virginia history.
- With his triple Sunday, Jarrett Parker has hit 11 triples in his career, which is tied for second in UVA history. He needs two more three-baggers to tie Brian Buchanan (1992-94) for the Virginia record.

**VETERAN-LADEN CAVALIERS**

- Virginia has one of its most experienced teams ever.
- The Cavaliers' returning position players have combined for 951 career starts, led by senior shortstop Tyler Cannon, who has started 183 games.
- Ten players have started at least 50 career games apiece for UVA. Cannon, Dan Grovatt (123), Jarrett Parker (114) and Phil Gosselin (107) each have more than 100 career starts.

**STARTING LINEUP BACK IN TACT**

- Virtually the entire offense returns from 2009, including everyone from the starting lineup.
- Almost all of the offensive production is back – 99 percent of the RBI-production returns, with 98.4 percent of the hit-producers (755 of 767) coming back.
- Virginia hit .327 last season – the Cavaliers' best mark since 1985 – and swatted 59 home runs – UVA's most since 2002.
- Dan Grovatt (.356), Jarrett Parker (.355) and Tyler Cannon (.351) led UVA in batting last year. UVA has nine regular starters back who hit at least .292 last year.

**WHO'S GONE?**

- Virginia will need to replace 229.0 innings lost from the 2009 squad.
- The top loss comes from starter Andrew Carraway, who tossed 91.0 innings last year.
- Matt Packer pitched 61 innings – second-most out of the bullpen.

**UVA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST FIVE YEARS**

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past five seasons, boasting a 3.13 team ERA.
- UVA ranked in the top 15 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- North Carolina is the only other team to rank among the top 15 nationally in ERA for the last six years.
- Virginia is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits and walks allowed each of the last two years.

- The Cavaliers stole 119 bases in 145 attempts last year, as five players stole at least 13 bases apiece.

### STRONG CORE OF PITCHERS BACK, BUT HOLES REMAIN

- UVa has to fill the holes of six pitchers who logged 226.0 innings and made 30 starts last season. Nine pitchers return.
- Danny Hultzen (9-1, 2.17) and Robert Morey (3-0, 3.33) each had strong 2009 seasons and will anchor the rotation, but the third weekend rotation slot as well as several bullpen spots are still in limbo.
- UVa had a 3.23 ERA last year (third nationally) and has the best ERA in the nation (3.13) over the last five seasons.

### NEXT MAN UP ON MOUND

- While Virginia has plenty of arms returning, they still need players to step up, particularly in the bullpen.
- Senior Neal Davis and freshman Aaron Stull both will be key left-handed options.
- From the right side, Kevin Arico, Corey Hunt, Ryan Briggs, Tyler Wilson, Chad O'Connor, Branden Kline, Shane Halley, Will Roberts, Justin Thompson, Cody Winarski and Whit Mayberry all will have chances to step up for UVa.

### NEWCOMERS ADD TALENT, DEPTH

- UVa welcomes a top-10 recruiting class this year, including five who were previously drafted.
- Stephen Bruno, Reed Gagnani and Chris Taylor all will push the returning infielders at second, third and shortstop for immediate playing time.
- Kenny Swab (C/1B/OF) and Ryan Levine (C/1B) each are physical players who add power to the lineup.
- Ryan Briggs, Branden Kline, Cody Winarski, Whit Mayberry and Aaron Stull all provide options on the mound.
- Rob Amaro gives UVa another option at first or behind the plate, while Colin Harrington adds depth in the infield and outfield.

## VERSATILITY WILL BE KEY

- Much of the Cavaliers' depth comes because of their versatility – several players could see action at a variety of positions.
- John Hicks and Kenny Swab each are athletic players who primarily are catchers but both will shift to first base and the outfield at times.
- Danny Hultzen will pitch and also is a strong first baseman and will DH as well, while Phil Gosselin could play at second or left field.
- Corey Hunt (INF) and Shane Halley (OF) each will pitch, but are great defensive players in the field as well.

## SCHEDULE WILL CHALLENGE

- Virginia's schedule is not for the faint of heart – 11 teams from the 2009 NCAA Tournament line the schedule.
- Thirty-six games will come against teams that won at least 30 games last year.
- UVa opened with a three-game set at East Carolina, a 2009 Super Regional qualifier.
- The ACC slate features six NCAA teams from last season – North Carolina (CWS), Clemson and Florida State (Super Regionals) and Boston College, Georgia Tech and Miami (Regionals).
