VIRGINIA-BOSTON COLLEGE SERIES

- Virginia is 14-1 all-time against Boston College, with all the meetings coming since BC started ACC play in 2006.
- UVA has taken all five series; BC won its first game against UVA two years ago in Chestnut Hill, although the Cavaliers won two of three in the series.
- Virginia swept a three-game series with BC in Charlottesville March 19-21, then topped the Eagles in the ACC tournament as well.

2011 TEAM IS FASTEST TO 40 WINS IN SCHOOL HISTORY

- With its 40-4 start, the 2011 Virginia team reached 40 wins in the fewest number of games in program history and the second fewest in ACC history (Clemson, 43 games, 1995).
- Virginia hit the 40-win plateau in game 49 last year (May 4 vs. VCU).
- This also marks the first time Virginia has reached 40 wins prior to the month of May.

O'CONNOR REACHES 350 WINS IN FEWEST GAMES IN ACC HISTORY

- In his eighth season as Virginia's head coach, Brian O'Connor stands at 356 wins entering the weekend (364-122-1); he reached 350 on April 15.
- He posted 350 wins in the fewest number of games in ACC history (472).
- Mike Martin of Florida State was the fastest in ACC history to reach 350 wins (while a member of the ACC). He needed 478 games (in seven seasons from 1992 to 1998) to reach the mark.
- Other current coaches of note in the ACC: Jack Leggett (Clemson) and Danny Hall (GT) each needed 487 games to reach 350 wins (350-137 each).

CAVALIERS RANKED NO. 1 IN FOURTH RPI

- UVA is ranked No. 1 in the third RPI report, announced Tuesday by the NCAA.
- UVA held the No. 2 spot for the first two weeks, but supplanted Florida for the No. 1 position last week.
- Virginia already is 10-3 against the RPI top 25 and 12-4 against the top 50 this year.

ODDS AND ENDS

- Virginia owns a Division I-high 40 wins this season (Vanderbilt is second with 35 wins).
- UVA leads the country with a +4.9 scoring margin (Mercer is second at +4.2).
- Steven Proscia is now 10th in career hits at Virginia with 231.
- Virginia is batting .338 as a team in 17 games during the month of April.
- David Coleman is batting .545 with a team-high 19 RBI in April, while Proscia has a team-best 31 hits in the April.

ROBERTS OWNS LONGEST ACTIVE WIN STREAK

- Will Roberts boasts the longest active win streak in the nation with 15 straight victories.
- Roberts has yet to absorb a loss at UVa and is 15-0 in his career, including 8-0 this year.
- The only other pitchers nationally to have a 10 or more game winning streak currently are Texas' Taylor Jungmann (11) and Appalachian State's Will Helms (10).
- UVa's Danny Hultzen owned the longest active streak (17) until his loss last Saturday to NC State.

BATS COME IN LIKE A LION IN APRIL

- Since the start of April, Virginia has been sizzling at the plate, hitting at a .338 clip in 17 games during the month (15-2 record).
- UVa has had at least 10 hits in 14 of 17 games.
- UVa has 205 hits, including 43 doubles, six triples and eight homers, in the last 17 games (in contrast, its opponents have 133 hits in the same period).
- Six Cavalier regulars are hitting over .300 during that span, including a pair over .400 – David Coleman (.545) and Steven Proscia (.403). Reed Gragnani is batting .354 and John Barr is hitting .329 in April.

VIRGINIA RANKS IN TOP 25 IN ATTENDANCE

- Entering the week (through 29 dates), Virginia ranked 15th nationally in total attendance in 2011 with 82,630.
- UVa also stood 22nd in average attendance at 2,849 fans per game.
- UVa has played in front of 11 home crowds of 3,000-plus this season.

COLEMAN CONTINUES TO MASH

- David Coleman has been the Cavaliers' hottest hitter of late, batting .545 (24-for-44) with a team-best 19 RBI in April.
- He has posted a pair of four-hit games in April and notched hits in 13 of the 14 games he has played in the month (only exception was the 5-inning rain-shortened game).

PITCHING, DEFENSE COMBINE FOR LETHAL COMBO

- Virginia boasts a strong tandem of pitching and defense this year.
- UVa has allowed just 2.7 runs per game, tied with Texas A&M for the fewest in Division I baseball.
- Virginia entered the week with a .983 fielding percentage, which was second in the nation behind San Francisco (.984).
- UVa has committed 27 errors in 44 games.
- The Cavaliers set a school record in 2010 with a .977 fielding percentage.

WAHOOS RACK UP ACC-RECORD 12TH SHUTOUT

- Virginia has recorded a dozen shutouts in its 40 wins this season, breaking the ACC record.
- The conference record of 11 shutouts was held by the 1977 Clemson and 2005 Virginia teams.
- The NCAA single-season shutout record is 24, set by the 1972 Arizona State team.
- UVa posted two shutouts in 2010 and five in 2009.

CAVALIERS STRIKE FOR BIG INNINGS

- Virginia has a tendency to score in bunches, with 51 innings of three runs or more this season.
- The Cavaliers' single-inning high is 10 runs vs. Maryland; UVa scored nine in an inning vs. Duke as well.
- UVa has scored three runs in 29 different innings.
- On the flip side, Virginia has allowed just 13 innings of three or more runs (seven 3-run innings, five 4-run innings, one 6-run inning).

PAIR OF 10-GAME WIN STREAKS

- For the first time in school history, Virginia has recorded a pair of win streaks of 10 games or more in the same season.
- Virginia had a 12-game win streak, starting March 22, which ended April 10 at Georgia Tech.
- The Cavaliers took 13 straight from March 1-19.
- The loss to Georgia Tech also snapped a school-record 11-game game road win streak.

PITCHING HAS BEEN LINCHPIN TO SUCCESS

- Virginia is the lone team to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts per nine innings and fewest hits and walks allowed per nine innings.
- UVa stands in the top-10 in all of those categories as of the Monday report: ERA (6th, 2.31), strikeouts/nine innings (2nd, 10.2), fewest hits/9 inns (3rd, 6.92), fewest walks/9 inns (4th, 2.24).
- UVa has allowed more than four earned runs just five times this year.

VIRGINIA 42ND PROGRAM TO 2,000 WINS

- Virginia became the 42nd Division I program to reach 2,000 all-time wins on March 29 with its win over George Washington.
- The Cavaliers have won 2,015 games all time (1,612 losses, 40 ties).

VIRGINIA CUTS DOWN ON BASES ON BALLS

- UVa pitchers have reduced their bases on balls by more than one per game this season, walking just 99 batters (2.24/9 innings). In 2010 UVa averaged 3.31 walks per nine innings.
- This has been key to UVa racking up an ACC-leading 2.31 team ERA.
- UVa averages nearly a walk fewer per nine innings than any other ACC team this year. (Clemson and Miami, 3.18/9 IP).

HULTZEN CONTINUES TO DOMINATE

- Danny Hultzen ranks second in the nation in strikeouts this year with 104, trailing Trevor Bauer of UCLA (127).
- Hultzen has struck out at least nine batters in eight of his 10 starts this season (13.63 per nine innings - first in the nation).
- He has issued only 11 walks (9.45:1 strikeout to walk ratio).
- UVa is 9-1 in Hultzen's starts this year and 33-9 in his career, including 23-3 since 2010; UVa is 13-0 when Hultzen racks up 10 or more strikeouts.
- Virginia's streak of 15 straight series-opening wins

- With 104 strikeouts this season, Hultzen ranks eighth in UVa single-season history (needs three to reach seventh, which he set in 2009).

HULTZEN OWNS UVA STRIKEOUTS RECORD, MOVES UP ACC CHART

- Hultzen broke the Virginia career strikeouts record earlier this season. With 334 career strikeouts Hultzen has passed Seth Greisinger (1994-96), who had 290.
- By passing Greisinger, Hultzen also moved into the top 25 on the ACC's all-time strikeouts ledger. He currently is tied for 11th in ACC history with Matt Lynch of Florida State (2000-03) and needs four strikeouts to reach the top 10.

HULTZEN CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Danny Hultzen continues his march up the all-time Virginia pitching charts.
- He passed Jacob Thompson (2006-08) for first in career wins at UVa two weeks with his 28th career win.
- Hultzen is second in career winning percentage (.933; 28-3), just behind Robert Poutier (.917; 11-1).
- His career ERA of 2.19 stands third in UVa history, while his 334 strikeouts ranks first.
- He ranks sixth in innings pitched with 270.2. With 9.2 innings, he will match Pat Daneker (1995-97) for fifth place.

WILSON A FINALIST FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

- Tyler Wilson has been named one of 10 finalists for the 2011 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award for baseball.
- One-third of the final voting tally comes from fan votes at seniorclassaward.com.
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- A biology major, Wilson is planning to go into the medical field and become an orthopedic surgeon after his baseball career concludes.

WILSON SEAMLESSLY MOVES TO ROTATION

- After pitching out of the bullpen for most of his first three seasons, including 51 straight relief outings entering the season, Tyler Wilson has shifted to the weekend rotation in 2011.
- He is 5-0 with a 2.51 ERA in 10 starts this year. In 61.0 innings he has allowed just 46 hits and 17 walks with 73 strikeouts (fifth most in ACC).
- Wilson now owns 22 career wins, which is tied for third in Virginia history (22-7, 3.06 ERA).
- He ranks fourth in career pitching appearances at UVa with 82 (13 starts)

- Wilson has 216 career strikeouts, which ranks 10th in UVa history; he needs 13 strikeouts to tie Joe Koshansky (2001-04) for ninth.

ROBERTS SCORELESS STREAK ENDS AT 26.2 INNS

- Will Roberts gave up a run-scoring single to Duke's David Perkins April 17 in the first inning, ending his scoreless innings streak at 26.2.
- That is the longest scoreless streak for a UVa pitcher since Sean Doolittle worked 29.0-consecutive scoreless innings from April 10-May 25, 2005.
- He had not allowed a run in his previous four starts (5.0 innings vs. Towson, 9.0 vs. George Washington, 7.0 vs. Radford, 5.0 vs. Georgetown).
- He last allowed a run in the sixth inning of the March 16 win over James Madison.
- Roberts currently ranks fourth in the ACC with a 1.61 ERA and is tied for second in wins (8) and shutouts (2) while standing ninth in innings pitched (61.1).

LAST YEAR: UVA TAKES FOUR FROM BC

- Virginia won all four games with BC last season, sweeping a three-game series in Charlottesville March 19-21 before winning 6-4 on May 26 in the ACC tournament.
- UVa pitchers limited BC hitters to just five runs and 18 hits in the regular-season series.
- Phil Gosselin was 7-for-10 in the series, while Dan Grovatt went 4-for-10 and drove in six runs.
- Virginia pitchers posted a 1.67 ERA in the series, with starters Danny Hultzen, Robert Morey and Cody Winiarski combining for a 0.81 ERA while striking out 23 and walking just three.

CAVALIERS GRIND OPPONENTS' RUNNING GAME TO A HALT

- Virginia has slowed its opponents on the basepaths, giving up just 15 stolen bases in 28 attempts (53.6 percent success rate).
- UVa has allowed the fewest stolen bases of any ACC team (FSU ranks second with 21 stolen bases allowed).
- In throwing out 46.4 percent of potential base stealers, UVa also tops the ACC. UNC is second (43.2 percent).

KLING EMPHATICALLY SHUTS THE DOOR

- In his first season as the Virginia closer, sophomore righty Branden Kline has been brilliant with 13 saves.
- He is tied for first in the NCAA in saves; the total also is the fourth most in a season in UVa history.
- Kline has struck out 38 in 26.2 innings (team-high 20 games). In that span he has allowed five runs, 18 hits and 10 walks (1.69 ERA).
- He pitched in 24 games (eight starts) as a freshman and was entrusted with big starts in the championship games of both the NCAA regional and super regional.

HICKS SWINGING A HOT STICK

- John Hicks has been on fire at the plate this year.
- He is batting a team-best .359, which ranks eighth in the ACC.
- Hicks is the lone Cavalier to reach base in every game this season.
- Hicks has racked up a .333 batting average in 21 ACC games this season (15th in conference).

PROSCIA SCORCHING IN ACC PLAY

- Steven Proscia boasts Virginia's best batting average in ACC play, swinging it at a .404 clip (38-for-94). That ranks second in the conference behind Clemson's Brad Miller (.410).
- Proscia is tied with FSU's James Ramsey with a league-leading 23 RBI in ACC games. Proscia also leads the ACC with 38 hits in conference games.
- He owns a .420 on base percentage in ACC play.
- Proscia has racked up two or more hits in 12 of the 21 ACC games, with at least one hit in 18 of 21, including nine straight.

PROSCIA ETCHES NAME IN VIRGINIA CAREER RECORDS BOOK

- Steven Proscia continues to stand out as one of Virginia's all-time top run producers.
- He has moved into a first-place tie in career RBI with Sean Doolittle (2005-07) at Virginia with 167.
- Proscia now has 231 career hits, which ranks ninth in Virginia history (he needs nine hits to tie for eighth).
- Proscia also owns 54 career doubles, which is second in the Virginia career annals behind Tyler Cannon (2007-10) with 62.
- He is three short of the UVa career top 10 in at bats. With 695 at bats Proscia is just shy of Tim Henry (698) and Jon Benick (700) for 10th and ninth, respectively.

TAYLOR SETS THE TABLE

- Chris Taylor has filled the leadoff slot in every game this season and has proven to be strong on that role.
- He is fourth on the team with a .304 batting average and is tied for third in the ACC with Georgia Tech's Kyle Wren with 44 runs.
- Taylor has notched hits in 36 of his 44 games this year and has reached base safely in all but one game.
- He led off the April 19 game at Radford with a home run on the game's first pitch (his first college home run).
- Taylor had 59 at bats in 29 games last year (13 starts) and hit .305.

MOST MARCH WINS EVER

- Virginia recorded its best month of March in program history.
- UVa won a school-record 19 games in March (19-1).
- It marks the third-best winning percentage for a UVa team in March (.950), behind only the 1967 (5-0) and 1971 (6-0) teams.

SOUTHPAWS GIVE UVA MORE OPTIONS OUT OF PEN

- Virginia has added a quartet of left-handed options to its bullpen this year, with a healthy Scott Silverstein, sophomore Aaron Stull and freshmen Kyle Crockett and Ryan Ashooh.
- The lefties have combined to work 29.1 innings out of the bullpen and 37.0 innings total in 32 appearances.
- In 65 games last year, left-handers made just 25 appearances out of the bullpen for the Cavaliers.
- Silverstein did not pitch his first two seasons at UVA while recovering from shoulder surgery.

ROBERTS RECORDS FIRST PERFECT GAME IN VIRGINIA HISTORY

- Will Roberts notched the first perfect game in Virginia baseball history on March 29 in a 2-0 win over George Washington at Davenport Field.
- Roberts is the second ACC pitcher to record a perfect game and just the eighth in Division I history to post a nine-inning perfect game.
- He needed only 98 pitches to finish off the perfect game.

ROBERTS NAMED NATIONAL PLAYER OF WEEK, ACC PITCHER OF WEEK

- After his perfect game-effort against George Washington, Will Roberts was named one of Collegiate Baseball's National Players of the Week, the publication announced April 4.
- He also was named the NCBWA National Pitcher of the Week
- In addition, Roberts earned ACC Pitcher of the Week honors for the first time.

O'CONNOR RANKS FOURTH IN WIN PERCENTAGE ENTERING 2010

- UVA head coach Brian O'Connor entered 2011 with a career record of 316-118-1 (.728) and a 126-71-1 record in ACC play.
- O'Connor's 72.8 winning percentage ranked as the fourth best mark among active NCAA Division I coaches entering the 2011 season.
- The only coaches who own a higher winning percentage are Mike Martin (Florida State), Mike Fox (North Carolina) and Gene Stephenson (Wichita State).

DEMAND RESULTS IN RECORD ATTENDANCE

- A school-record 125,959 fans walked through the turnstiles at Davenport Field in 2010 (14th nationally). UVA averaged 3,148 fans per game.
- Virginia obliterated all of its previous attendance records. The previous season highs were 1,774 per game and 65,661 total in 2007.
- Virginia played in front of 11 home sellout crowds, including a school-record 4,825 for the May 16 contest with North Carolina.

VIRGINIA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST SIX YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past six seasons, boasting a 3.26 team ERA.
- UVA is the only school to rank in the top 20 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- Virginia also is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits allowed each of the last three years.

 - OF Jarrett Parker (2nd round, SF), 2B Phil Gosselin (5th round, ATL), RHP Robert Morey (5th round, FLA), RHP Kevin Arico (10th round, CIN), OF Dan Grovatt (11th round, PIT), INF Tyler Cannon (12th round, CLE) and Neal Davis (36th round, PHI).
 - RHP Tyler Wilson (35th round, CIN) and C/1B/OF Ken-ny Swab each have returned for their senior seasons.
 - The previous UVA high for draft picks in a year was six.

CAVALIERS RANK FIFTH IN SB SINCE 2006

- Virginia ranks fifth nationally in stolen bases over the last four years with 589 (117.8 per year).
- UVA trails only Jackson State, Mississippi Valley State, Prairie View and Savannah State over that span.
- The Cavaliers stole just 94 bases last year (its fewest in the last five years).
