ABOUT THE GAME

- ♦ No. 16 TCU plays its second game in Amon G. Carter Stadium after its \$164 million rebuild when it hosts Virginia.
- ♦ The Horned Frogs have the nation's longest current winning streak at 10 in a row.
- ♦ Saturday's contest marks TCU's 10th consecutive sellout at Amon G. Carter Stadium.
- ♦ TCU is facing an ACC opponent for just the third time since 1997. The previous two games were in the opening three weeks of the 2009 campaign, when the Frogs won at Virginia (30-14) and Clemson (14-10).
- ♦ TCU has its first pre-noon kickoff for a home game since an 11:10 a.m. start on Sept. 16, 2000, when the 21st-ranked Frogs won 41-14 over Northwestern behind LaDainian Tomlinson's 243 yards rushing and two touchdowns.
- ♦ Over the last eight seasons, TCU is 39-3 at home, 42-2 in day games and 70-5 when playing on a Saturday.
- ♦ TCU has its first home game at Amon G. Carter Stadium on ESPN since a 23-20 overtime victory over Utah on Sept. 15, 2005.

PROTECTING THE CARTER

- ♦ TCU has won 27 of its last 28 home games and is 57-7 under head coach Gary Patterson in Amon G. Carter Stadium.
- ♦ In its last 17 home dates, TCU has allowed just 22 touchdowns and outscored its opponents 793-194 (an average margin of 47-11).
- ♦ The Frogs have recorded seven shutouts in their past 34 home dates.
- ♦ Since 1999, TCU is 68-7 in its last 75 home games.

SERIES NOTES

- ♦ TCU and Virginia are meeting for just the third time in their history and the first time in Fort Worth.
- ♦ The Frogs opened the 2009 campaign with a 30-14 win in Charlottesville. TCU has seven players on its current roster who played in that contest. Most notably, tailback Matthew Tucker had 38 yards rushing on 10 carries, while linebacker Kenny Cain recorded two tackles. Both Tucker and Cain were true freshmen.
- ♦ The only previous game between the schools was a 20-10 Cavalier victory in the 1994 Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La. The lone Frog to have been a part of that game was tight ends coach/special teams coordinator Dan Sharp. He was the TCU tight ends coach in 1994.

TIES TO THE STATE OF VIRGINIA

- ♦ TCU assistant head coach/offensive line coach Eddie Williamson was head coach at VMI from 1985-88.

TCU NOTABLES

- ♦ Quarterback Casey Pachall leads the nation in passing efficiency with a 242.4 rating. Pachall has completed 33-of-39 passes (84.6 percent) for 536 yards with five touchdowns and no interceptions. Pachall set a TCU record last week with 16 consecutive completions dating back to last season.
- ♦ Wide receiver Josh Boyce is tied for TCU's career lead in receiving touchdowns with 17. He has nine catches for 168 yards and two touchdowns this season.
- ♦ Leading rusher Waymon James has 168 yards on a 9.9 per carry mark.
- ♦ TCU has not allowed a touchdown this season and in its last nine quarters dating back to the 2011 Poinsettia Bowl.
- ♦ The Frogs have played 15 true freshmen this season, tied with LSU and Ohio State for the most nationally.
- ♦ TCU has played more true freshmen (15) than it has scholarship seniors (11).
- ♦ With a 56-0 season-opening victory over Grambling State, Gary Patterson became TCU's all-time winningest coach. He is now 111-30. His .787 winning percentage ranks fourth nationally among active coaches.

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. (AP) - The last thing Virginia needed after a sputtering, turnover-filled season-opening loss was to be tested by the defense that led the nation in fewest yards allowed last season.

In its season opener Saturday, No. 16 TCU picked up where it left off last year, stifling the Cavaliers' new spread offense and cruising to a 30-14 victory that was more convincing than the score indicates.

TCU's offense, meanwhile, gave Virginia a tutorial on how to run the spread. The Horned Frogs gashed the Cavaliers for 203 yards on the ground, and Andy Dalton was 15-of-21 for 177 yards and one touchdown. They scored on all five of their trips into the red zone, although three times they had to settle for Ross Evans field goals.

Nobody needs to tell the Cavaliers about crazy first games. A week ago, Virginia had seven turnovers in the loss to William and Mary.

This time they had just one - an interception on a tipped pass - but made plenty of other mistakes. A personal foul penalty on Corey Mosley kept one TCU touchdown drive alive, and a failed fake punt at midfield led to another Horned Frogs touchdown.

Virginia also started two possessions at its 3 because of bad fair-catch decisions - once to catch the ball, once to let it go - and botched the snap on a field goal attempt.

But the Cavaliers' biggest problem was simply an inability to move the ball. Virginia ran a no-hurry, no-huddle spread offense, with Sewell milking the play clock before taking the snap, in an attempt to control the time of possession. It worked in the first half, but by the end of the game TCU had a 34:49 to 25:11 advantage with the ball.

Sewell played the whole game after sharing time with Marc Verica and Vic Hall last week. Hall, sidelined by a hip injury, played only as a holder Saturday. Sewell was sacked eight times and was 8 of 18 for 120 yards, including TD passes of 56 yards to Javaris Brown and 26 yards to Tim Smith late in the game.

Joseph Turner and Jeremy Kerley had scoring runs for the Horned Frogs.

THE 2012 SENIOR CLASS

- ♦ With just 11 scholarship seniors on this year's roster, TCU is tied for the eighth-lowest total in the nation.
- ♦ The Frogs' 2012 seniors have a 38-3 record.
- ♦ The seniors have played a part in TCU winning three straight conference championships for the first time in program history.
- ♦ This year's seniors have seen the Frogs reach a pair of BCS games, including a 2011 Rose Bowl championship.
- ♦ The seniors have won three straight games against top-five ranked teams, are 2-1 in bowl games, 7-2 against teams from BCS automatic-qualifying conferences and 18-1 at Amon G. Carter Stadium.
- ♦ The seniors have combined for 66 starts in their career.

- ♦ TCU is one of just four programs (Alabama, Boise State, Oregon) to finish in the top 15 of both the Associated Press and *USA Today* polls over the last four seasons.
- ♦ The Frogs have finished in the top 25 in six of the last seven seasons.
- ♦ TCU has been ranked 184 times since the AP poll was established in 1936, placing 42nd nationally.

FROG FEVER

- ♦ TCU has had 10 straight sellouts and 12 in its last 16 home contests at Amon G. Carter Stadium.
- ♦ TCU sold out of its 31,257 football season tickets this year and has a waiting list.
- ♦ Four of TCU's final five home games are sold out. Only the Oct. 6 home date with Iowa State, due to the Cyclones returning tickets, has seats remaining.
- ♦ The Frogs have set a single-season record for season-ticket sales in each of the last three seasons.
- ♦ Nearly 35,000 TCU fans traveled to the 2011 Rose Bowl. Over 20,000 made the trip the previous year to the Fiesta Bowl.
- ♦ Over its last eight home games at the old Amon G. Carter Stadium, TCU had an average attendance of 43,355 to represent 97.7 percent of capacity.

A NEW HOME

- ♦ A \$164 million rebuild of Amon G. Carter Stadium was completely funded by donor support.
- ♦ The new Amon G. Carter Stadium has a seating capacity of 45,000.
- ♦ The six Founders' Club suites, located at midfield between the first and second levels, were sold at \$15 million each to provide lead gifts totaling \$90 million.
- ♦ There are 25 suites, all sold, on the west side. One of those suites is located on the Champions' level, next to the television booth.
- ♦ The press box has 132 seats to accommodate media.



OPEN DATES

- ♦ TCU was one of just four schools to have a bye the opening weekend (Sept. 1) of the season.
- ♦ By kicking at 6 p.m. CDT on Sept. 8, TCU tied for second nationally in the latest scheduled start to a season by a team this year. Army had the latest start with a 6:30 p.m. CDT kick at San Diego State.
- ♦ The last time the Frogs had an open date the first week of the season was 2009, when they went 12-0 en route to the Fiesta Bowl. TCU won 30-14 at Virginia to open that campaign.

COLLECTING RINGS

- ♦ TCU has won three consecutive conference titles for the first time in its history, giving the Frogs 17 conference titles overall.
- ♦ TCU is one of 12 schools to play in at least 13 bowl games over the last 14 years.

TCU QUICK HITS

- ♦ TCU is the only school in the nation to win at least 11 games in six of the last seven seasons.
- ♦ TCU is one of just four programs (Alabama, Boise State, Oregon) to finish in the top 15 of both the Associated Press and *USA Today* polls over the last four campaigns.
- ♦ TCU is one of just three schools (Florida, Utah) to win at least six bowl games in the last seven seasons.
- ♦ Last year's 36-35 victory at Boise State was TCU's third straight win over a top-five ranked opponent and improved the Frogs' record to 4-1 in their last five games against top-five teams. In the 2010 campaign, TCU won 47-7 at No. 5 Utah while defeating No. 5 Wisconsin 21-19 in the Rose Bowl.
- ♦ TCU has won 40 of its last 43 games and is 52-5 in its last 57 contests.
- ♦ Since 2008, the Frogs' 49 wins (49-5) trail only Boise State (51-4) and Alabama (51-6).

FROG OFFENSIVE NOTES

THE NATION'S BEST

- ♦ TCU quarterback Casey Pachall tops the nation in passing efficiency with a 242.4 rating. West Virginia's Geno Smith is second at 209.8. No other quarterback is above 197.0.
- ♦ Pachall has completed 33-of-39 passes (84.6 percent) for 536 yards with five touchdowns and no interceptions.
- ♦ TCU is the only school in the nation to have two different quarterbacks rank in the top 12 in passing efficiency over the last three seasons.
- ♦ Pachall was 12th last year with a 158.0 mark. Andy Dalton finished fifth (166.5) in 2010 and eighth (151.8) as a junior in 2009.
- ♦ Pachall was the third-highest ranking non-senior or junior in passing efficiency last season, trailing only fellow sophomores Keith Price (Washington) and Bryn Renner (North Carolina).

PACHALL ADDS TO RECORD COUNT

- ♦ Beginning with his final two passes in the 2011 Poinsettia Bowl and extending through his first five attempts at Kansas, Casey Pachall set a TCU record with 16 consecutive completions.
- ♦ Pachall broke the previous Frog mark of 14 by Jeff Ballard (2006).
- ♦ Pachall set TCU single-season records last year for completion percentage (66.5), passing yards (2,921) and completions (228).

THE LAST ONE

- ♦ Casey Pachall was the last starting quarterback in the nation to have an incomplete pass attempt this season.
- ♦ Pachall's first incomplection, on his 17th pass, came in the second quarter at Kansas during the season's third week.

STRONG EFFORT IN LAWRENCE

- ♦ Casey Pachall's 335 yards passing at Kansas represented the second-best game of his career, surpassed only by his 473-yard effort in last year's win at Boise State.
- ♦ Pachall completed 24-of-30 passes with two touchdowns against the Jayhawks.



STREAKS SNAPPED

- ♦ TCU's streak of scoring at least 30 points in eight straight games came to an end at Kansas.
- ♦ The Frogs also saw their run of totaling at least 27 points in 32 consecutive regular-season games snapped.
- ♦ TCU lost three fumbles inside the Kansas 10 while also missing a 27-yard field goal.

MAKING HIS MARK

- ♦ Quarterback Trevone Boykin made his collegiate debut in the second half of the Grambling State game.
- ♦ Boykin completed all eight of his pass attempts for 75 yards, including a 7-yard scoring toss to David Bush. He also ran for 57 yards on five carries with a 34-yard touchdown scamper.

IT'S A RUSH

- ♦ The Frogs have won 46 straight games when rushing for more yards than passing.
- ♦ TCU is 61-1 in its last 62 games when rushing for at least 167 yards. The lone loss came in last year's season opener when the Frogs ran for 215 yards at Baylor.
- ♦ The Frogs are 62-3 under Gary Patterson when rushing for at least 200 yards.

THE TWO-HEADED MONSTER

- ♦ In Waymon James and Matthew Tucker, TCU is the lone school in the nation to have two players on the 2012 Doak Walker Award Watch List.
- ♦ TCU is one of just five schools to return a pair of running backs who topped 700 yards last year. The others are LSU, Tulsa, Virginia and Wisconsin.

TOTING THE PIGSKIN

- ♦ Waymon James' 9.9 yards per carry average ranks fourth nationally among the top-56 rushers in the country.
- ♦ James has a team-high 168 yards rushing with his 84.0 per game mark placing 56th in the nation.

JUST SHY OF THE CENTURY MARK

- ♦ Waymon James' 99 yards rushing at Kansas left him just one yard shy of his fifth career 100-yard game.

- ♦ Matthew Tucker is sixth on TCU's career chart for rushing touchdowns. His next score will tie him for fifth with 1955 Heisman Trophy runner-up Jim Swink:

- ♦ Josh Boyce's five catches for 66 yards at Kansas put him over the 100-career reception mark. He's now at 104.
- ♦ Boyce's 100th grab was on an 8-yard pass from Casey Pachall on the game's opening play.

- ♦ Boyce has at least one reception in 27 of his 28 career games.

- ♦ Josh Boyce was the only TCU wide receiver to be a first-team all-conference selection in the Frogs' seven-year MW history.

- ♦ Carter had career highs with eight receptions for 141 yards and two touchdowns at Kansas.
- ♦ His previous-best in receiving yards was a 120-yard effort on four receptions with two scores at Boise State last season.

GET TO KNOW HIM

- ♦ Redshirt freshman LaDarius Brown had the first five receptions of his career go for 70 yards at Kansas.
- ♦ Brown had the first five-catch game by a Frog freshman since Brandon Carter totaled five grabs versus SMU last year.

A FLYIN' FROG

- ♦ Skye Dawson, the 2011 Poinsettia Bowl Offensive Most Valuable Player, is a three-time track and field conference champion and 2012 All-American in the 4x100 relay.
- ♦ Dawson won the 2010 Mountain West Indoor Championship in the 60 meters with a 6.69, the third-fastest time in MW history.
- ♦ Dawson has a personal-best time of 10.29 in the 100 meters.

THE FUTURE

- ♦ Seven of TCU's nine wide receivers on the depth chart are either freshmen or sophomores.
- ♦ Sitting out this season per NCAA transfer rules are Ja'Juan Story and Josh Doctson.
- ♦ Story, who redshirted at Florida last season, was ranked by ESPN as the nation's sixth-best receiver coming out of Nature Coast Technical High School in Brooksville, Fla.
- ♦ Doctson placed fifth on Wyoming last season with 35 receptions as a true freshman, including three grabs for 43 yards and a touchdown versus TCU.

SPREADING IT AROUND

- ♦ Ten different Frogs have combined for the team's 41 receptions.
- ♦ Josh Boyce and Brandon Carter, tied for the team lead with nine catches, have combined for five of the six touchdown receptions.

- ♦ Collins' older brother, Lavon, is an all-conference hurdler and member of the 4x400 relay for the TCU track and field team.

MR. TOUCHDOWN

- ♦ Matt Brown, last year's back-up quarterback, was converted to wide receiver in fall camp.
- ♦ Brown had six rushing touchdowns on just 24 carries in 2011. His six rushing scores tied for second on TCU behind only Matthew Tucker (12).

OFFENSIVE CONSISTENCY

- ♦ The Frogs' 5,723 yards of total offense last season ranked third in TCU history.

FROG DEFENSIVE NOTES

A TCU TRADITION

- ◆ Since the NCAA began tracking statistics in 1937, TCU is tied with Alabama for the most times leading the nation in total defense at five. All five No. 1 rankings for the Frogs are in the last 12 seasons.
- ◆ In 2010, TCU became just the third program in NCAA history to top the nation in total defense in three consecutive seasons (2008-10). The others are Toledo (1969-71) and Oklahoma (1985-87).

STINGY D

- ◆ TCU has not allowed a touchdown in its last nine quarters, dating back to last season's Poinsettia Bowl.
- ◆ The Frogs rank second in the nation in scoring defense, allowing just 3.0 points per game. TCU trails only Florida State (1.0 ppg).
- ◆ The 70 yards surrendered to Grambling State marked the second-lowest total by a TCU opponent in 12 seasons under Gary Patterson.
- ◆ The lowest total allowed by a Patterson defense was 60 yards to Northern Illinois in the 2006 Poinsettia Bowl.

MAGIC NUMBER 17

- ◆ Under head coach Gary Patterson, TCU is 79-2 when allowing 17 points or less.

SHUTOUTS

- ◆ With its 56-0 victory over Grambling State, TCU recorded the 10th shutout in Gary Patterson's 12 seasons as head coach.
- ◆ The Frogs have had at least one shutout in each of the last four years.

YOUNG FACES

- ◆ Linebacker Kenny Cain is the lone senior to start on defense for TCU.
- ◆ Walk-on cornerback Brian Alexis is the only senior in the secondary. There are no seniors at the safety position.
- ◆ Seven of TCU's 11 defensive starters have three or fewer career starts.

MAKING STOPS

- ◆ TCU ranks fifth nationally in opponent third-down conversions, limiting Grambling State and Kansas to a combined success rate of 18.5 percent (5-of-27).

PLAYER TO WATCH

- ◆ Defensive end Stansly Maponga is TCU's lone preseason All-Big 12 selection.
- ◆ Maponga appears on watch lists for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Chuck Bednarik Award, Ted Hendricks Award and Rotary Lombardi Award.

NOSE FOR THE BALL

- ◆ Stansly Maponga has taken part in a sack in nine of his last 14 games.
- ◆ Maponga has either forced a fumble or made a recovery in seven of his last 15 contests. He forced a fumble at Kansas.
- ◆ Maponga's five forced fumbles last season were the most by a Frog since All-American Jerry Hughes led the nation with six in 2008.

SACK WATCH

- ◆ TCU has recorded three sacks in both of its games this season.
- ◆ Five Frogs have combined for TCU's six sacks in 2012.
- ◆ Linebacker Joel Hasley leads the way with two sacks, both coming at Kansas.
- ◆ True freshman defensive end Devonte Fields is the lone Frog to have a sack in both games this season.
- ◆ The Frogs have at least three sacks in five of their last nine games.

MR. TAKEAWAY

- ◆ Free safety Elisha Olabode has taken part in a takeaway in each of the opening two games.
- ◆ Olabode had a 28-yard interception return for a touchdown against Grambling State and a fumble recovery at Kansas.

BALL HAWKS

- ◆ TCU has returned three of its last five interceptions for touchdowns.
- ◆ The Frogs have nine pick sixes with their last 26 interceptions.
- ◆ TCU is one of just three teams (Maryland, Tulsa) to return three picks for touchdowns in each of the last two seasons.
- ◆ Elisha Olabode found the end zone with a 28-yard interception return versus Grambling State.
- ◆ Olabode's touchdown was his first career pick and the first interception for a score by a Frog since Kris Gardner's 16-yard return against UNLV on Dec. 3, 2011.
- ◆ Olabode had the first pick for a touchdown by a TCU safety since current Carolina Panther Colin Jones went 30 yards at UNLV on Oct. 30, 2010.

- ♦ True freshman defensive end Devonte Fields has a team-high 3 1/2 tackles for loss while placing second with 1 1/2 sacks.
- ♦ Fields' six stops are tied with redshirt freshman tackle Davion Pierson for the most on the TCU defensive front.
- ♦ Fields had a team-high three tackles for loss, including a sack, among five stops in his collegiate debut versus Grambling State.
- ♦ Fields is one of just five true freshmen to start in the 12-year tenure of head coach Gary Patterson. Four of those five true freshmen have been on the defensive line (Kelly Griffin, 2007; Chucky Hunter, 2011; Jon Lewis, 2011; Devonte Fields, 2012).

BATTING THEM DOWN

- ♦ Jason Verrett's four pass breakups at Kansas were the most by a Frog since Tyrone Sanders also had four at Arizona on Sept. 27, 2003.
- ♦ Verrett is tied for third nationally with his average of 2.5 passes defended per game.
- ♦ Verrett's 58 tackles last season, which placed fifth on the Frogs, were the most by a TCU cornerback since 2001, when Jason Goss also totaled 58 stops in Gary Patterson's first season as head coach.
- ♦ Goss has returned to TCU to complete work on his degree and is an undergraduate student assistant coach for the Frogs.

NEW FACES

- ♦ The 2012 TCU defensive coaching staff has a pair of new faces, although one is quite familiar, in safeties coach Chad Glasgow and linebackers coach Randy Shannon.
- ♦ Glasgow was TCU's safeties coach for 10 seasons (2001-10) before serving last year as Texas Tech's defensive coordinator. In his last three campaigns with TCU, the Frogs led the nation in total defense each season.
- ♦ Shannon, a former head coach at Miami (Fla.), is in his first year as TCU's linebackers coach. In five of his six seasons (2001-06) as their defensive coordinator, the Hurricanes ranked in the top seven nationally in total defense. Shannon was a four-year letterman at linebacker and a starter on Miami's 1987 national championship team. He has three national championship rings as a player and coach.

NO FRIEND OF RUNNING BACKS

- ♦ During his 141-game tenure as head coach, Gary Patterson has seen only 25 100-yard rushing games by opposing players.

FROG SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

A RECORD BREAKING PERFORMANCE

- ♦ True freshman Deante' Gray set a TCU single-game record with 160 punt return yards, including a 70-yard touchdown, on just five attempts against Grambling State.
- ♦ The previous mark of 146 yards on seven returns was set by Lindy Berry versus Miami in 1947.
- ♦ Gray's 70-yard return for a touchdown came on his first collegiate touch. It was just 1:59 into the game and after a three-and-out on Grambling State's opening series.
- ♦ Gray had the first punt return for a touchdown by a Frog since Jeremy Kerley went 69 yards against Colorado State on Oct. 17, 2009.

SPEAKING OF KERLEY

- ♦ Less than 18 hours after Deante' Gray's 70-yard punt return for a touchdown, former TCU All-America return specialist Jeremy Kerley took a punt 68 yards for a touchdown for the New York Jets against the Buffalo Bills.

TOPPING THE NATION

- ♦ Deante' Gray ranks second in the nation in punt returns with his average of 32.0 yards per attempt.



A STRONG TRADITION

- ♦ TCU had the first-team All-MW return specialist all seven seasons it was in the league (Cory Rodgers, 2005; Brian Bonner, 2006-07; Jeremy Kerley, 2008-10; Greg McCoy, 2011).
- ♦ With McCoy being selected the 2011 MW Special Teams Player of the Year, a Frog garnered that honor each of the last three seasons (Jeremy Kerley, 2009-10).

AWARD WATCH

- ♦ Brandon Carter appears on the watch list for the Paul Hornung Award, recognizing the nation's most versatile player.

DEFENDING THEIR HOME

- ♦ TCU has won 27 of its last 28 home games and is 57-7 under Gary Patterson at Amon G. Carter Stadium.
- ♦ In its last 17 home dates, TCU has allowed just 22 touchdowns and outscored its opponents 793-194 (an average margin of 47-11).
- ♦ The Frogs have recorded seven shutouts in their past 34 home dates.
- ♦ Since 1999, TCU is 68-7 in its last 75 home games.
- ♦ The Frogs won a Mountain West-record 17 straight home contests versus league opponents. TCU lost just one MW home game in the last five seasons, a 27-20 decision to Utah on Oct. 18, 2007.
- ♦ TCU was 25-2 all-time at home in MW games.
- ♦ TCU had a school and MW record 22-game overall home winning streak snapped in last year's 40-33 overtime loss to SMU. The 22 straight home wins ranked third for the longest current streak in the nation at the time (Oklahoma 39, Boise State 34).

ROAD WARRIORS

- ♦ The Frogs have won 18 of their last 20 road contests.
- ♦ The 36-35 win at Boise State enabled TCU to set a Mountain West record with its 12 straight road wins in league play. The previous mark of 11 was held by BYU (2005-07) and snapped by the Frogs with a 32-7 win in Fort Worth in 2008.
- ♦ TCU ended Boise State's nation's best 35-game home winning streak with a 36-35 victory. The Broncos had also won 65 straight regular-season home contests and 47 consecutive conference home games.
- ♦ TCU snapped Utah's then MW-record 21-game home winning streak with a 47-7 victory in 2010.
- ♦ With a 17-10 win in Norman in 2005, TCU gave Oklahoma one of its two home losses since 2001.
- ♦ Two of BYU's six home losses the last eight seasons are to TCU.
- ♦ The Frogs went undefeated in road games in 2009 and 2010. Prior to 2009, TCU hadn't accomplished the feat since 1955.

GOING OUT IN STYLE

- ♦ TCU was the first school in MW history to win the league title in three straight seasons.
- ♦ TCU closed its Mountain West era by not losing a conference game over its final three years in the league. The Frogs left the MW with the following record win streaks that were all active: consecutive conference wins (24), consecutive home league victories (17) and consecutive road league wins (12).

DOUBLE DIGITS

- ♦ TCU has reached the 10-win mark the last four years and eight times in the last 10 seasons under head coach Gary Patterson. Prior to Patterson's arrival on campus in 1998, the Frogs had just four 10-win seasons in their history.
- ♦ TCU has won 11 games the last four seasons and seven times in the past nine years.

THE WIN COLUMN

- ♦ TCU has won 40 of its last 43 games and is 52-5 in its last 57 contests.
- ♦ Since 2008, the Frogs' 49 wins (49-5) trail only Boise State (51-4) and Alabama (51-6).
- ♦ TCU is one of six teams (Ohio State, Oregon, Virginia Tech, Stanford, Wisconsin) to play in a BCS game two of the last three seasons.

GROWING THEM UP

- ♦ TCU has 15 true freshmen on its depth chart this season, tying it with Texas for second most in the nation. Colorado has 16.

- ♦ The Frogs are 42-2 in day games over the last eight seasons and 37-11 at night. The NCAA constitutes a night game as starting at 5 p.m. or later.
- ♦ TCU is 70-5 in Saturday contests dating back to the start of the 2005 campaign and 77-7 overall when playing on any day of the week other than Thursday.
- ♦ During their run of success on Saturdays, the Frogs are 9-8 on other days of the week (1-0 on Sundays, 0-1 on Mondays, 2-0 on Tuesdays, 1-0 on Wednesdays, 2-6 on Thursdays and 3-1 on Fridays).
- ♦ Six of TCU's 13 losses over the last eight years have been on Thursdays.
- ♦ TCU's two wins on Tuesdays and one victory on Wednesday all came in the Poinsettia Bowl (2006, 2008, 2011).

THE BCS

- ♦ TCU was 18th in the final 2011 BCS standings.
- ♦ TCU finished third in the 2010 BCS standings, setting a record for the second straight year for the highest finish by a team from a non-automatic qualifying league. The Frogs were fourth in the final 2009 BCS standings.
- ♦ Prior to the 2011 season, TCU had the longest current streak (12 weeks) in the nation for appearing in the top five of the BCS standings.

TCU HEAD COACH GARY PATTERSON



Gary Patterson became TCU's all-time winningest coach with the season-opening 56-0 win over Grambling State.

Patterson now has 111 victories to break the previous mark of 109 wins by Dutch Meyer (109-79-13, 1934-52). Patterson's .787 winning percentage (110-30) ranks fourth among active coaches. He is one of eight coaches with at least 100 victories at their current school.

In August 2011, Patterson was named the nation's top coach by *Sports Illustrated* and *ESPN The Magazine*. *Sporting News* tabbed him in January 2012 as the nation's third-best coach.

In leading TCU to back-to-back BCS appearances in the 2009 and 2010 seasons, including a 2011 Rose Bowl championship, Patterson received 10 National Coach of the Year honors.

Patterson has produced at least 10 wins in eight of the last 10 years, including seven seasons of 11 or more victories. He has led the Frogs to seven conference titles and 13 bowl games in 14 years.

FORT WORTH - Casey Pachall and Trevone Boykin combined to complete all 17 passes for TCU - the most team attempts in FBS history without an incompletion - and the Horned Frogs gave Gary Patterson his school-record 110th career victory during a 56-0 win over Grambling State.

The contest marked the first game for TCU as a Big 12 Conference member as well as the debut of the \$164 million rebuilt Amon G. Carter Stadium.

Deante' Gray, one of a TCU-record 13 true freshmen to play for the Frogs, returned a punt 70 yards for a touchdown only two minutes into the game. The play helped Gray set a TCU single-game record with 160 punt return yards on just five attempts, breaking Lindy Berry's mark of 146 yards on seven returns set versus Miami in 1947.

Wayman James had a 1-yard TD run on the Frogs' first offensive possession before Elisha Olabode returned an interception 28 yards to make it 21-0 with 7:54 still left in the first quarter. Pachall played only the first half, completing all nine of his passes for 201 yards and three touchdowns, two to Josh Boyce, while the Frogs jumped out to a 42-0 lead.

The TCU defense limited GSU to only 70 yards of total offense, the second-lowest figure in Patterson's tenure as head coach.

Pachall's passing total marked his third career 300-yard game and his second-best output as a Horned Frog. Brandon Carter hauled in a career-best eight receptions for 141 yards and both of Pachall's scoring passes, one in the first quarter and another in the third.

Carter's second TD came on a highlight-reel grab that saw him pick a deep ball out of the air over a Jayhawk defender and tightrope the sideline into the end zone for a 25-yard completion.

Waymon James led the Frog rushing attack with 99 yards on only 12 carries. TCU's offense totaled 487 yards and was forced to punt only once in the contest.

The Frog defense, led by 12 tackles and a pair of sacks by linebacker Joel Hasley, kept the opponent out of the end zone for the second straight week. KU managed just 77 yards on the ground, while TCU limited Jayhawk signal caller Dayne Crist to only a 19-of-39 showing through the air.

Sam Carter recorded his first career interception in the second quarter, which led to Brandon Carter's first touchdown.
