### **FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW**

- UVa and Notre Dame are meeting for the ninth time in series history and for the seventh time at Klöckner Stadium where the Cavaliers hold a 5-1 advantage over the Fighting Irish.
- Notre Dame (37.9) and UVa (37.7) are No. 2 and No. 3 in the nation in team shooting percentage. Both are chasing Stony Brook (40.4) who leads the nation.
- Tuesday night's game with Saint Joseph's was the 500th career game of Dom Starsia's head coaching career. The NCAA all-time leader in DI wins has coached 353 games at Virginia and 147 career games at Brown over a 33-year head coaching career.
- UVa goalie Matt Barrett is No. 4 in the nation with 14.50 saves per game.
- UVa's James Pannell (Offensive) and Matt Barrett (Defensive) earned ACC Player of the Week honors for their play against No. 8 Cornell.

### **GAME OVERVIEW**

Virginia returns to ACC play when it hosts the Notre Dame Fighting Irish on Saturday at Klöckner Stadium. Faceoff is set for noon. UVa is ranked No. 7 in both the USILA coaches and Cascade/Maverik media polls. Notre Dame is No. 4 in both the coaches and media polls.

### THE SERIES VS. THE FIGHTING IRISH

Saturday marks the ninth all-time meeting between the Cavaliers and Fighting Irish, and the second in ACC play after Notre Dame officially joined the conference July 1, 2013. UVa leads the all-time series 5-3, but has dropped the last two meetings. The first six games in the series were played in Charlottesville before the 2012 meeting in Chester, Pa., followed by UVa's first-ever trip to Notre Dame in 2014.

Notre Dame head coach Kevin Corrigan, a UVa alum, is in his 27th season with the Fighting Irish after spending two seasons as an assistant coach for the Cavaliers under former head coaching legend Jim Adams. Corrigan has led Notre Dame to 19 NCAA Tournaments while in South Bend and three Championship Weekends. Notre Dame returns 16 ND monogram winners from last year's 12-6 squad that lost to Duke in the 2014 NCAA title game.

Widely regarded as one of the best teachers, motivators and tacticians in the game, Dom Starsia is in his 23rd season at the helm of the Virginia men's lacrosse program.

Under Starsia's guidance, his Cavalier squads have won four NCAA titles and reached the

final four 13 times. He has won more games than any coach in Atlantic Coast Conference and Virginia history, sporting a 262-91 (.742) record since coming to Charlottesville in 1993. Now in his 23rd season with Virginia, Starsia has coached 353 games, fittingly his 300th game at Virginia was the 2011 NCAA title game against Maryland at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium.

### HALL OF FAMER STARSIA TOPS NCAA DI WINS LIST

- Virginia head coach Dom Starsia is one of the most accomplished coaches in the history of the college game coaching at Brown (1983-92) and Virginia (1993-present)
- He passed Jack Emmer for most career wins by a head coach while coaching at a NCAA Division I school with UVa's guarterfinal win over Cornell in 2011
- He becomes the second UVa head coach to hold the record as Jim Adams retired with 284 career victories after the 1992 season, giving way to Starsia to take the Cavalier program over in 1993 - Adams retired as the record holder
- He was inducted into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame in November 2008
- He has led UVa to four national championships ('99, '03, '06, '11)
- His teams have made 25 NCAA Tournament appearances, the most by any Division I coach in history
- His Cavalier squads have advanced to the final four 13
- One of four coaches in college lacrosse history to win 100+ games at two schools (along with Jack Emmer, Dave Urick and John Danowski who joined the group in 2013)
- Only Division I coach to win 200+ games at one Division I school while winning 100+ at another Division I institution
- He is a three-time national coach of the year ('85, '91, '11)
- · ACC Coach of the Year a record eight times

# **COVERING THE CAVALIERS**

### UNIOUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVa's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

**Commonwealth:** Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

### **CREDENTIALS**

Admission to the press box is by official credential only and is strictly limited to members of the working press, radio and television personnel. Please allow ample time for the mailing of credentials or they will be left at the Will Call window at Klöckner Stadium.

Special requests should be made in advance. Parking is always available on an unreserved basis at University Hall. Normal pregame and postgame information is supplied.

### **PHOTOGRAPHERS**

Requests for photo passes must be made in advance through the Athletics Media Relations Office. Photographers must observe the field markings for lacrosse. No tri-pod equipment may be used on the field level, for the safety of the players and photographers.

### RANIA

Broadcasts are made from the radio broadcast facilities in Klöckner Stadium. There is one courtesy line available for use by visiting radio crews. Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVa Athletics Media Relations Office.

### **INTERVIEWS**

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

### THE SERIES VS. THE FIGHTING IRISH

• Virginia holds a 5-3 lead in the all-time series against Notre Dame, but have lost the last two meetings.

- The teams had a three-year series that ended in 2003 and have met three times since, the 2006 and 2012 NCAA Tournaments, as well as ACC play in 2014.
- Four of the meetings between UVa and Notre Dame have come in the NCAA Tournament (1993, 1994, 2006, 2012) and UVa holds a 3-1 record.
- Last year's ACC matchup marked the first time the the series had been played in South Bend. The first six games in the series were contested at UVa's Klöckner Stadium.

• Weather in South Bend forced the 2014 meeting inside at the Loftus Sports Center.

- The 2012 meeting came in the guarterfinal round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament at PPL Park in Chester, Pa., the site of the 2014 ACC Tournament.
- Notre Dame's first victory was an 11-8 win in 2001 as the Fighting Irish advanced to Championship Weekend that season before falling to Syracuse in the semifinals.
- The Fighting Irish, ranked sixth at game time, became just the scond team ranked fifth or lower to defeat the Cavaliers at Klöckner.
- Notre Dame won the most recent NCAA meeting, a 12-10 triumph over UVa to advance to the 2012 Championship Weekend before falling to Loyola in the semifinals.
- The 2012 meeting was the final game in the illustrious career of UVa's Steele Stanwick. UVa's all-time point leader
- finished his career with seven points and five assists against Notre Dame.

   Virginia's 23-4 win in the 1994 Tournament represents its biggest win over a ranked team in program history (Notre Dame was ranked 14th at game time.) The margin of victory also marks UVa's greatest in NCAA Tournament action
- 2006 Tewaaraton Trophy winner Matt Ward led UVa with four goals in the 2006 meeting between UVa and Notre Dame, as the Cavaliers won 14-10 in the NCAA First Round on their way to the program's fourth NCAA title

### **CAVALIERS, IRISH SHARE TIES**

- UVa and Notre Dame share several ties which could be intriguing.
- Guy Van Arsdale, currently the head coach at Jacksonville and older brother of UVa associate head coach Marc Van Arsdale, was an assistant coach at Notre Dame in 2004.
- Notre Dame head coach Kevin Corrigan is a graduate of UVa and played on three Cavalier squads that made the NCAA Tournament from 1979-81.
- Corrigan was an assistant coach on Jim Adams' staff at UVa in 1987 and 1988 before being named head coach at Notre Dame prior to the 1989 season.
- Corrigan's father, Gene Corrigan, served as athletics director at UVa from 1971-80, was the UVa lacrosse head coach from 1959-67, was the soccer coach from 1958-65 (among other positions).
- Gene Corrigan left UVa to become Notre Dame's athletics director in 1981 and left in 1987 to become the ACC's thirdever commissioner from 1987-1997.
- Notre Dame head coach Kevin Corrigan is first cousins with former UVa women's basketball head coaching legend Debbie Ryan.
- Kevin Córrigan also was a local Charlottesville high school coach for one season, serving as an assistant boy's lacrosse coach at Western Albemarle High School in 1982.

### VIRGINIA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 120-25 (.8276) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 2-0 mark in 2015. UVa also is 11-2 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993, the first season Dom Starsia was the head coach of the Cavaliers.

### **UVA TOPS RANKED TEAM IN FIRST TWO GAMES**

- UVa's men's lacrosse team (2-0) has opened the season with wins over No. 7 Loyola (13-12) and No. 16 Drexel (14-10).
- It marks the the eighth time in Dom Starsia's 23 seasons as UVa's head coach the Cavaliers have opened up a season facing back-to-back ranked opponents.
- It is only the third time UVa has swept those ranked opponents, splitting the other five times.
- In addition to this season the feat also happened in 2011 and 1995.
- UVa is ranked No. 7 in this week's USILA coaches poll and eight of UVa's 13 regular season opponents have been ranked in the Top 20. Another two opponents have received votes in the sports' oldest poll (established in 1973).

### **UVA'S DEFENSIVE YOUTH**

- The 2015 UVa defense may be the most inexperienced unit ever under head coach Dom Starsia.
- With a season-ending injury to All-American Tanner Scales, the Cavaliers started two true freshmen in Logan Greco and Scott Hooper at close defense in the season opener at No. 7 Loyola. Also starting against Loyola was senior Davi Sacco, who has played sparingly in nine career games over the past three seasons after walking onto the team in 2012.
- Sacco held All-American attackman Nikko Pontrello from Loyola to one goal and two assists. For his efforts, Sacco was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week.
- At LSM is sophomore Michael Howard, who played in three games in 2014. Senior Tanner Ottenbreit brings 36 games of experience into 2015.
- At SSDM you have sophomore Will McNamara, who made his collegiate debut at Loyola. Sophomore Carlson Milikin and freshman Jack Falk also ran at SSDM against Loyola.
- Sophomore goalie Matt Barrett is the most seasoned player on the defensive end, having started all 16 games in 2014 as a true freshman.

### **VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE**

- According to UVa head coach Dom Starsia "If there's any single statistic that speaks to your effort overall, then it's that one (ground balls)."
- UVa has led the nation in ground balls three of the last five years.
- Since the NCAA started including ground balls per game in their national rankings in 2009. UVa has never finished a season lower than No. 3 in ground balls per game.
- UVa is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game over the last six seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVa, finishing in the Top-5 three during the same span.
- In uncharacteristic fashion for UVa, the Cavaliers have lost five of six ground ball battles this season. One contributing factor is UVa is only winning 38.8 percent (66-of-170) of its faceoffs.

### **CAN'T SCORE UNLESS YOU CLEAR THE BALL**

- Virginia registered a .918 percent success rate on clears in 2013, giving the Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent.
- No other team in the nation has ever been able to boast such a streak.
- UVa cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010.
- During that time UVa twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011 UVa ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.
- The streak snapped in 2014 when UVa only cleared at a .851 rate.
- According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SIDs, only 17 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, four times its been done by UVa, dating back to 1971 the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport.
- UVa records on clearing date back to 1971 some schools like Syracuse (1983), only go back to a certain year in regards to clearing stats. Below is the current list of all-time .900+ clearing schools in a season:

### **VIRGINIA IN OVERTIME UNDER DOM STARSIA**

- UVa is 23-16 all-time in overtime under Dom Starsia. Seven of those losses came in NCAA Tournament action. UVa is 3-7 in OT games in the NCAA Tournament under Starsia.
- Since the start of the 2007 season, UVa is 13-4 in overtime games under Starsia.
- The four losses since 2007 came at Duke (2007), Syracuse in the NCAA semifinal in 2008, Johns Hopkins (2012) in a regular season matchup and last season at Syracuse (2013). The Hopkins game in 2012 was the only OT loss since 2007 at Klöckner Stadium.
- Virginia is 14-2 all-time in OT games at Klöckner Stadium, which doubles as the record under Starsia.
- The first loss was the 2000 meeting with Syracuse and the second was the 2012 Hopkins game.
- Starsia is 14-3 all-time at home in OT games while at UVa the 1998 Syracuse game was played at the Field Hockey Turf Field, resulting in a loss.

### **DOM (INATION) OF THE USILA POLLS**

- Since Dom Starsia took over as head coach of the Virginia program in 1993, there have been 245 USILA coaches polls, including this week's poll.
- Of those 245 polls, Virginia has been ranked No. 1 in 55 of them.
- Which means in the midst of 23 seasons under Dom Starsia, Virginia has been ranked No. 1 in the nation 22.6 percent of the time.
- The two programs closest to UVa's dominance are Syracuse at 50 weeks and Johns Hopkins at 41 weeks.
- The USILA coaches poll is the oldest lacrosse poll and was established in 1973.

Game 1 Virginia 13, Loyola 12 Feb. 7 • Baltimore, Md.

No. 9 Virginia (1-0) manufactured a fivegoal third quarter and survived a late rally by No. 7 Loyola (0-1) to win its season-opening game, 13-12, at the Ridley Athletic Complex. Virginia has won its season-opening game for eight straight seasons.

UVa used a four-goal run in the third quarter to break open a 6-6 game. Greg Coholan scored two of his career-high four goals to start the spurt. Matt Emery scored his first career goal and Zed Williams capped the run on a laser that found its way between the legs of Loyola goalie Pat McEnerney, giving the Cavaliers a 10-6 advantage at the 6:32 mark in the third quarter.

Loyola came roaring back, cutting its deficit to one goal, 12-11, after back-to-back goals by Romar Dennis. The second goal came with 4:30 left in the game and capped a 5-2 run by the Greyhounds. Williams gave UVa just enough breathing room with his unassisted goal with 3:11 left in the contest.

The Greyhounds managed another goal at 2:04 by Zach Herreweyers, but it wasn't enough. In the final seconds Loyola's Nikko Pontrello turned the ball over to Virginia with 29 seconds left. Loyola, however, received the ball back on a turnover by UVa goalie Matt Barrett with 13 seconds left. Logan Greco caused a turnover with six seconds left, giving UVa the ball back, but he lost it almost immediately. Pat Frazier picked up the ground ball for Loyola and his desperation shot went high as time expired, securing the win for Virginia.

The first half featured the each team countering with haymakers, as the score was knotted at 6-6 entering the intermission. UVa and Loyola traded goals most of the half until back-to-back scores were tallied by Zed Williams and Joe French. The goal by French gave the Cavaliers a 5-4 lead with 6:50 left in the second quarter.

Loyola reacted quickly, scoring two straight goals of its own, retaking the lead 6-5. Romar Dennis capped the Greyhounds' run with 4:48 left in the first half. UVa's Owen Van Arsdale evened the score on a Greg Coholan pass with 3:21 left. In the final seconds of the second quarter Coholan tried to deposit another goal into the cage, but was stuffed by McEnerney, the Loyola goalie.

The No. 9 Virginia Cavaliers (2-0) overcame a snowstorm and an early three-goal deficit to defeat No. 16 Drexel (0-1) at Klöckner Stadium, 14-10.

Drexel scored the game's first three goals to take an early 3-0 lead. UVa fought back with a 6-1 run to take a 7-5 lead with 3:45 left in the second period. Ryan Tucker scored two goals during the run and Zed Williams capped the scoring with an unassisted goal.

Jules Raucci tallied a goal at 2:05 in the second quarter to bring Drexel within one goal, 7-6, but that was as close as the Dragons got to the Cavaliers. James Pannell scored on a Ryan Lukacovic helper with 26 seconds left that started a 5-1 Cavalier run that carried into the third quarter.

The snow came bellowing in during halftime, forcing a 15-minute delay to clear the lines and stock the field with yellow lacrosse balls.

Drexel and Virginia traded two goals apiece over the next several minutes with the score standing at 14-8 with 12:33 left. Drexel managed back-to-back goals to cut the UVa advantage to four goals, 14-10, courtesy of Jake Gennosa and Ryan Belka. The two goals by Drexel capped the game's scoring as UVa's defense thwarted any Drexel comeback attempt.

Lukacovic, Pannell and Tucker all led UVa with four points, while Matt Barrett made 12 saves in the cage, four of which came in a late fourth-quarter barrage by the Dragons. Van Arsdale led all players with three goals.
