FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Saturday's game with UCLA opens the 125th season of UVA football and the 101st season the Cavaliers open the year at home. UVA is 74-19-7 all-time when the first game of the season is in Charlottesville.
- UVA head coach Mike London is 4-0 all-time at UVA in season openers. No previous UVA head coach won his first four season-opening games for the Cavaliers.
- Saturday's game against UCLA marks the 50th career game of Mike London's head coaching tenure at Virginia.
- The last football game for both UVA and UCLA was against Virginia Tech. UVA in the 2013 regular season finale (L, 16-6) and UCLA in the 2013 Sun Bowl (W, 42-12).
- UVA in 2013 and Florida State in 2002 are the only teams in college football history to play 11 teams during the regular season that would go on to play in a bowl game.

#UCLAvsUVA AT A GLANCE

VIRGINIA OPENS 125TH SEASON OF FOOTBALL

- The University of Virginia opens its 125th season of football Saturday against UCLA.
- UVA will be playing its 84th season in Scott Stadium, which opened Oct. 15, 1931, against VMI.
- UVA is 80-35-9 (.681) all-time in season openers.
- The Cavaliers are 74-19-7 (.775) in home season openers and have won 17 of their last 20 openers in Scott Stadium.
- In his career as a head coach, Mike London has won all six of his season-openers: 2008 at Elon and 2009 at Duke while at Richmond and 2010 vs. Richmond, 2011 vs. William & Mary, 2012 vs. Richmond and 2013 vs. BYU while at Virginia.
- London is the only UVA head coach to win season openers in his first four years at Virginia. Last year's 19-16 win over BYU in the season opener snapped a tie with Rice Warren (1913, 1920-21), who was the only other man to win season openers in his first three years at Virginia.

UCLA MAKES SECOND-EVER TRIP TO AN ACC STADIUM

- UCLA is making its second-ever trip to an ACC stadium when it visits Scott Stadium this Saturday.
- The only other time UCLA played at an ACC stadium was in 1955 when the then-No. 1 Bruins lost to former ACC member Maryland, 7-0, at Byrd Stadium. The Terrapins were ranked No. 5 in the nation that week in a game that was billed as "The Best in the West" vs. "The Best in the East."
- UCLA is 17-13 all-time versus current members of the ACC, most recently beating Virginia Tech last time out in the 2013 Sun Bowl, 42-12.
- UCLA's games against Pitt (9-5), Syracuse (2-6) and Miami (2-1) all were played before those programs were members of the ACC. UCLA has also played Duke (1-0), Florida State (0-1), NC State (2-0) and Virginia Tech (1-0).
- UCLA has never played in the Commonwealth of Virginia before.

Players are available for interviews each Monday, depending on class schedules. If you have specific player interview requests, they should be directed to Vincent Briedis in the UVa Athletics Media Relations office by Noon Sunday.

Requested defensive players and defensive coaches will be available for telephone interviews Tuesday, while offensive players and offensive coaches will be available Wednesday.

No player or coach interviews will be arranged after Wednesday during game week.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Coach London will hold his postgame press conference in the media room, while requested players and assistant coaches will be brought to the media room to meet with media representatives after London. UVa athletics media relations personnel will take player requests during the fourth quarter of each game.

Virginia's locker room is closed to media following games, both at home and on the road.

No other announcements regarding player injuries will be made until the end of practice on Thursday or two days prior to the next football game (Tuesday for Thursday game, Thursday for Saturday). On that day, within 90 minutes of the end of practice, injured players' playing status for the next game will be announced in one of five categories:

- Definitely will play
- Probable
- Questionable
- Doubtful
- Out

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

VIRGINIA VS. UCLA AND THE PAC-12

- Virginia is facing UCLA for the first time in program history.
- Saturday's game is only the fifth time Virginia has faced a member of the Pac-12 Conference.
- UVA is 0-4 against the Pac-12 and its the only BCS conference the Cavaliers are winless against.
- UCLA is the third team from the Pac-12 to ever travel to Scott Stadium, joining USC (2008) and Oregon (2013).
- UVA returned the trip to USC on Sept. 11, 2010 and fell to the then-No. 14 Trojans, 17-14 in head coach Mike London's first road contest at the helm for Virginia.
- UVA also lost at Washington in 1976.
- The Cavaliers open the 2015 season at UCLA on Sept. 5.
- UVA also travels to Oregon on Sept. 10, 2016.
- The Cavaliers will host Stanford in 2017 and travel to Stanford in 2018.

VIRGINIA - UCLA CONNECTIONS

- UVA offensive coordinator Steve Fairchild and UCLA offensive coordinator Noel Mazzone each has worked with NFL Pro-Bowl quarterback Phillip Rivers. Fairchild worked with Rivers during his recent stint with the Chargers and Mazzone as the offensive coordinator at NC State, Rivers' alma mater.
- Fairchild was the offensive coordinator for the Buffalo Bills when UCLA's defensive line coach Angus McClure was a NFL guest coach for the Bills in 2006 and 2007. McClure was the offensive line coach and run game coordinator for the University of Buffalo at the time.

FAMILIARITY BETWEEN UVA'S TENUTA AND UCLA'S MAZZONE

- While UCLA and UVA have never met in football, there is some familiarity between UVA's defensive coordinator Jon Tenuta and UCLA's offensive coordinator Noel Mazzone.
- As a defensive coordinator, Tenuta has had to prepare three times for a Mazzone-coordinated offense. Tenuta is 3-0 in those games.
- While as the defensive coordinator at North Carolina, Tenuta first faced Mazzone in 2001 when Mazzone was the offensive coordinator at Auburn.
- The other two games came when Tenuta was the defensive coordinator at Georgia Tech and faced Mazzone as the offensive coordinator at NC State (2003 & 2004).
- Tenuta and Mazzone also faced each other three years in a row, 1989-91, when Tenuta was on the SMU staff and Mazzone was on the TCU staff. Mazzone was the quarterbacks coach at TCU, while Tenuta was the defensive backs coach for the first meeting and the defensive coordinator for the second two.

UVA CONNECTIONS WITH THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

- The state of California supplied the fifth-most applicants to the University of Virginia for the Fall 2014 first-year class. Virginia was first, followed by New York, New Jersey, Maryland and then California.
- UVA football has had numerous California natives on its roster over the years, but have not had one since 2009 when OLB Darren Childs (San Diego) was on Grounds.
- Two UVA assistant coaches grew up in California.
- Offensive coordinator Steve Fairchild attended San Diego's Patrick Henry High School. Other notable alumni from Patrick Henry High School are current Atlanta Braves starting pitcher Aaron Harang, 1998 Heisman Trophy winner Ricky Williams and actress Annette Bening.
- UVA assistant coach Scott Wachenheim was born in Encino, Calif. (12 miles from UCLA) and went to William Howard Taft High School in Woodland Hills (14 miles from UCLA).
- Taft High School has several notable alumni, such as actors Robin Wright, Lisa Kudrow and Jason Bateman, MLB Hall of Famer Robin Yount and St. Louis Rams head coach Jeff Fisher.
- Wachenheim attended high school at the same time as Kudrow (Phoebe on "Friends") and Susan Olsen, who played Cindy Brady on TV's "The Brady Bunch."
- Associate head coach for offense Tom O'Brien was stationed in San Diego for part of his nine years in the Marines and is where he met his wife, Jennifer.

A VIRGINIA GENTLEMAN LEADS UCLA

- UCLA's Chancellor, Dr. Gene Block, spent nearly 30 years on the Grounds of the University of Virginia in a myriad of positions.
- Block joined the faculty at UVA in 1978 as a professor of biology. He served as vice provost for research from 1993 to 1998 and then as vice president for research and public service until his appointment as vice president and provost in 2001. In 1998, he received the Commonwealth of Virginia's Outstanding Public Service Award for his work with Virginia's business community.
- Block was named Chancellor at UCLA in 2007.
- UCLA football sports information director Steve Rourke is a 1979 graduate of UVA.

SCHOOLS BOUND FOR THE EAST: UVA HOSTS UCLA

- UCLA's trip to Scott Stadium marks the 13th time in UVA program history that the Cavaliers have hosted a team from west of the Mississippi River.
- Teams that have visited Charlottesville from the West are: BYU (2000, 2013), Colorado State (2002), Idaho (2011), Kansas (1991), Louisiana Tech (2012), Oregon (2013), San Jose State (1998), Texas (1996), TCU (2009), UCLA (2014), USC (2008) and Wyoming (2006).
- UVA is 6-5 against teams from west of the Mississippi River when the game is played in Charlottesville.
- Including 2014, UVA has hosted a team from west of the Mississippi River in seven of the past nine seasons after hosting only five in the first 116 years of the program.
- The Rose Bowl, home of UCLA, is 2,567 miles from Scott Stadium. Round trip is 5,134 miles.
- More teams from west of the Mississippi River are scheduled to come to Charlottesville in the future: Boise State (2015), Stanford (2017) and BYU (2019). UVA will return each trip the subsequent season.

VIRGINIA IN THE MONTH OF AUGUST

- UVA's 2014 season-opening game with UCLA on Aug. 30 marks the eighth game in Virginia football history to be played in the month of August and the second year in a row the Cavaliers have played August football.
- Virginia is 2-5 all-time in the month of August and 2-2 at Scott Stadium.
- UVA faced Notre Dame in 1989 (Kickoff Classic), Wisconsin in 2001, Colorado State & Florida State in 2002, Duke in 2003, USC in 2008 and BYU in 2013.

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 437 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 246-179-12.

- These facts prompt the question if the first year is related to former All-ACC performer and UVa graduate, Ras-I Dowling, who hailed from Chesapeake.
- While Ras-I Dowling also wore No. 19 during his time on Grounds as a cornerback, there is no relation to the current UVa receiver.
- However, Doni Dowling does have some Varina High School ties with this current UVa roster. Current UVa cornerbacks Maurice Canady and Tim Harris played alongside Dowling at Varina.
- Ras-I Dowling graduated in 3.5 years from UVa in December 2010 and was the No. 2 overall pick in the 2011 NFL Draft by the New England Patriots. He currently is with the New York Jets.

REMEMBER THE TITANS

- UVa's Jay Whitmire graduated from T.C. Williams High School in Alexandria, Va., the same school made famous in Disney film, "Remember the Titans."
- There is a tragic connection between UVa and Charlottesville with one of the real life individuals from the famous Titans story.
- Gerry Bertier, the defensive lineman who was paralyzed from the waist down in an automobile accident, passed away at the University of Virginia hospital due to injuries suffered from a second accident, when his car was struck by a drunk driver on March 20, 1981 on Route 20 in Charlottesville. Bertier was 27.

UVA RETURNS EXPERIENCE IN THE SECONDARY

- UVA opens the 2014 season with 112 career starts among its returning defensive backs, which is the most in the nation amongst teams that run schemes with four defensive backs.
- Demetrious Nicholson leads the group with 30 career starts. He started the first 30 games of his collegiate career before being hurt in game five last season against Ball State and did not play the rest of the season.
- All-American Anthony Harris is second among returning defensive backs with 23 career starts.
- 2014 is a stark difference over 2012 when UVA was one of the four schools in the nation without a senior in the secondary and started four sophomores for most games, sometimes throwing a freshmen into the mix. 2012 sophomores Anthony Harris (12), DreQuan Hoskey (10) and Brandon Phelps (12) started the majority of the games, while 2012 freshman Maurice Canady (2) also started two games. Now they make up one of the nation's most experienced defensive backfields.

COLEY & ROMERO RETURN FOR SENIOR CAMPAIGN

- Senior linebackers Henry Coley and Daquan Romero each return to starting lineup for the Cavaliers.
- Coley moved to inside linebacker in 2013 and led UVA with 91 tackles.
- He is a two-time All-ACC Academic team member, already owns a degree in African American studies and an extension of defensive coordinator Jon Tenuta.
- Romero was second on the team with 89 tackles and No. 13 in the ACC.

DEPTH ON THE DEFENSIVE LINE

- UVA may have no seniors starting on the defensive line in 2014, but they have a lot of depth and experience.
- David Dean, Eli Harold, Mike Moore and Donte Wilkins have all started games for the Cavaliers.
- The likes of Andrew Brown, Trent Corney and Kwontie Moore will see time to give rest to the unit as a whole.
- This wasn't always the case, guys like Harold (806 plays) and Dean (719 plays) saw significant time in 2013.

BLANDING AND BROWN BEGIN UVA CAREERS

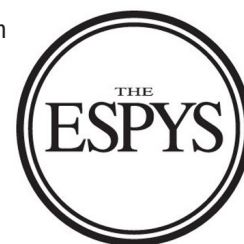
- Freshmen Quin Blanding and Andrew Brown became the first multiple five-star recruits UVA signed in one year since 2002 when the Cavaliers signed three, Ahmad Brooks, Michael Johnson and Kai Parham.
- Brooks later prepped a year at Hargrave Military and enrolled a year later.
- Brown was rated the No. 5 overall recruit in the nation and the No. 1 defensive tackle, while Blanding was rated the No. 10 overall recruit in the nation and No. 1 safety.
- Blanding and Brown join TB Taquan Mizzell as former five-star recruits on the UVA roster. Mizzell, nicknamed Smoke in high school for his elusiveness, signed in 2013 and was the first five-star recruit for the Cavaliers since Eugene Monroe in 2005.

FRESHMAN QUIN BLANDING GETS THE STARTING NOD AT FREE SAFETY

- Freshman Quin Blanding will make his collegiate debut against UCLA.
- Blanding is slated to start at free safety and will become the first UVA true freshman to start a season opener at one of the two safety positions since Tony Blount did so on Sept. 11, 1976.
- Blount played strong safety for the Cavaliers in a road opener at Washington, Virginia's first-ever game against a Pac-12 school. At the time of the 1976 game it was the Pac-8 Conference.
- Blanding will be the first true freshman Cavalier at any position to start a season opener since fellow UVA teammate Demetrious Nicholson did so in 2011. Nicholson and Blanding are both graduates of Bayside High School in Virginia Beach.
- Blount was a four-year letterwinner (1976-79) and starter for the Cavaliers. Current UVA defensive coordinator Jon Tenuta was Blount's backup at one point.

ANDREW BROWN IS UVA'S SECOND GATORADE NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR - ATTENDS ESPYS

- UVA freshman defensive tackle was named the 2013 Gatorade High School National Player of the Year.
- Former UVA great Terry Kirby is the only other Cavalier football player to earn the award.
- The five-star recruit is the 11th Virginia athlete to earn Gatorade National Player of the Year honors in their respective sports.
- Current UVA senior women's soccer player Morgan Brian was the 2011 Gatorade National Female Athlete of the Year.
- Seven former UVA men's soccer players and one women's basketball player also won the national honor for their respective sports.
- Brown attended the 2014 ESPYS at the Nokia Theatre in Los Angeles in July.



ANTHONY HARRIS EARNS THE GRAY-CARRINGTON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

- Established in 1971 in memory of Arthur P. "Pete" Gray IV and expanded in 1987 to include Edward C. Carrington Jr., this award honors two outstanding students whose achievements have served as an inspiration to others. Its one of the highest honors given to a UVA student.
- Winners exhibit traits that defined Pete Gray and Ed Carrington, including personal integrity, achievement, leadership and humility.
- Harris said what makes this award special is that it's not a sports award; it's an award that the entire student body is eligible for. "To actually win meant that I accomplished not only some things on the football field, but things within the social and academic community as well," said Harris. "It is a very humbling award."

ANTHONY HARRIS LED THE NATION IN INTERCEPTIONS IN 2013

- Anthony Harris led the nation with eight interceptions in 2013.
- Harris set a UVa record recording at least one INT (six overall) in five straight games.
- The eight picks by Harris were four more than the entire UVa team had in 2012.
- The eight interceptions were the most by a Cavalier since Ronde Barber led the ACC with eight in 1994.
- The eight interceptions rank No. 2 all-time at UVa for most in a season.
- Harris' eight interceptions are the most by a UVa safety since Keith McMeans led the nation with nine in 1987. Harris' 2013 season is tied for No. 2 at UVa for INTs in a season with Kevin Cook (1987) and Barber.
- Harris was named a first-team All-American by Sports Illustrated and a second-team honoree by the Walter Camp Football Foundation for his 2013 efforts.

LOOKING BACK AT 2013: UVA ON THIRD DOWNS

- UVa closed out 2013 No. 3 in the nation as a defense forcing three and outs, posting a 6.00 three and out average per game.
- UVa's opponents went three and out 72 times over 12 games; 39.3 percent of UVa's opponents drives ended in a three and out.
- UVa was No. 2 in the ACC as Clemson was No. 2 in the nation with 6.08 three and outs per game.
- The Cavaliers improved on their 2012 numbers when they finished No. 15 in the nation in three and outs per game with a 4.58 average.
- UVa's defense in 2013 held strong on third downs.
- UVa's opponents were 58-181 (.320) on third downs.
- UVa finished 2013 ranked No. 8 in the nation on third down defense and No. 3 in the ACC.

TENUTA GAVE UVA'S DEFENSE AN AGGRESSIVE MAKEOVER IN 2013

- Virginia's associate head coach for defense and defensive coordinator Jon Tenuta is a UVa alum and has brought an aggressive makeover to the Cavaliers.
- UVa over the past six seasons has the sixth-worst turnover margin in the nation. In 2012 UVa recorded only four interceptions, the fewest by a Virginia Cavalier team since the birth of the forward pass.
- Tenuta said prior to the 2013 season that "we want to create problems for the front five and never let the quarterback set his feet in the passing game."
- UVa over the past few seasons have been near the bottom nationally in turnover margin and sacks per game – Tenuta wants to change that.
- During Tenuta's first season at UVa the Cavaliers boasted Anthony Harris who led the nation in interceptions. Eli Harold was No. 4 in the nation among underclassmen with 8.5 sacks.
- Tenuta enters his 34th season of collegiate coaching and his 18th as a defensive coordinator. He has had stops in the ACC, Big Ten, Big 12 and at Notre Dame and looks to continue to create turnovers and sack numbers that have declined in recent years at UVa prior.

NICHOLSON ANCHORS DEFENSIVE SECONDARY

- Senior CB Demetrious Nicholson is now the veteran of the Virginia defense, starting the first 30 games of his career since he stepped foot on Grounds prior to the 2011 season.
- An injury in the third quarter against Ball State led him to miss the final seven games of the 2013 season.
- Of the 2,055 defensive plays Virginia lined up for since the opening game of the 2011 season until the injury against Ball State, Nicholson played 1,981 of those plays, meaning from Sept. 3, 2011 through Oct. 5, 2013 he played 96.39 percent of UVa's defensive plays.
- In 2011 Nicholson became the first freshman to start the season-opener at the cornerback position since Kevin Cook in 1986, when the Cavaliers faced South Carolina in Scott Stadium.

COLEY & MOORE SPEND 2013 SUMMER IN AFRICA

- Linebackers Henry Coley and Kwontie Moore took a summer class at Virginia that took them to South Africa in July 2013.
- Coley and Moore paid attention to the social, economic and environmental aspects in and throughout different regions of South Africa.
- From rural regions to industrial ones, the class conversed, ate, slept and fellowshiped with locals all over the region in order to fully immerse themselves in the culture.

IAN FRYE RETURNS HEALTHY IN 2014

- Junior PK Ian Frye returns healthy in 2014 after missing the final eight games sustained in the Pitt game.
- Frye's range can reach 50+ and owns the third-longest made field goal in program history, connecting on a 53-yard field goal as time expired in the first half against BYU.
- The kick is tied with Connor Hughes, who hit his 53-yarder in 2003 against Wake Forest.
- The program record is 56 yards by Kenny Stadlin in 1984 against Virginia Tech and matched by Rafael Garcia vs. Texas in 1995.
- Coach London put Frye on scholarship during the spring semester.

UVA WILL DEBUT A NEW LONG SNAPPER

- UVa will debut a new long snapper in 2014 after using only two over the past seven seasons.
- From 2007-10 Danny Aiken was UVa's long snapper before moving on to the NFL. He currently is the New England Patriots' long snapper.

ALEC VOZENILEK CAN PLACE KICK IN A PINCH

- UVa punter Alec Vozenilek is an option to place kick in a pinch if needed. The precedent was set last season.
- Due to an injury to Ian Frye at Pitt in 2013, UVa's punter Alec Vozenilek filled in on field goals and PAT attempts the rest of the 2013 season.
- Vozenilek kicked his first two career field goals, making a 39-yard field goal on his first career attempt. He later made a 38-yard field goal and both his PAT attempts against Ball State.
- Vozenilek also did his normal duties of punting, booting one 56 yards and averaging 45.0 yards per punt.
- Vozenilek kicked a career-high four field goals at Maryland. His fifth attempt sailed wide right from 42 yards in the game's final seconds.

ALEC VOZENILEK IS A SEASONED PUNTER

- Alec Vozenilek returns for his final season after serving as UVa's punter the past two seasons. His punting numbers have improved over the last 24 games. Of Vozenilek's 151 career punts, 43.7 percent have gone for 50 yards, or have pinned an opponent inside the 20 yard line.
- Vozenilek booted the fifth-longest punt in the nation in 2013 with a 77-yard kick at Pitt. The punt was also the fourth longest in UVa history.
- Vozenilek punted 13 balls over 50 yards and averaged 41.2 yards per kick in 2013.

- There were seven seniors on UVA's roster in 2013. Five of those seniors decided to pursue a career in professional football and took part in UVA's NFL Pro Day.
- All five of UVA's participants from its NFL Pro Day in March have taken part in a camp this NFL Preseason.
- OG/C Luke Bowanko (Jaguars), OT Morgan Moses (Redskins) and DT Brent Urban (Ravens) were all drafted.
- WR Tim Smith (Browns) and DE Jake Snyder (Vikings) signed free agent contracts.
- Overall, 28 former Cavaliers are currently playing in the NFL.

DID YOU KNOW?

• UVa freshman Quin Blanding was named after the folk-rock song titled "The Mighty Quinn" by his mother Cory Lee. It was the first song she heard following a checkup during her seventh month of pregnancy and the moment held significant meaning to her. At that checkup the doctor's told her they thought they saw a hole in Quin's head and that it appeared to them his cerebrum wasn't connected. Quin was born completely healthy. Cory named him Quin with one "n" instead of two in recognition of that moment during pregnancy.

• Blanding's father Kevin played football at NCAA Division II Glenville State (W.V.) for current Arizona football head coach Rich Rodriguez.

• UVa head coach Mike London's younger brother, Paul, was a defensive back for Virginia from 1992-95. Paul played a major part during UVa's NCAA record streak of 39 straight games with at least one interception. The streak ran from Nov. 6, 1993 through Nov. 29, 1996.

• UVa quarterback David Watford and current wide receivers coach Marques Hagans are first cousins and both were quarterbacks at Hampton High before enrolling at UVa.

• UVa's oldest living football alum, Dr. John Risher, turned 104 years old this year; he also works in the press box on the UVa stats crew on game day. (More on page 18).

• Paul Wisman also works in the press box on the UVa stats crew staff and has done so since 1956. His 59 straight years of work in the press box is the longest current streak in the nation (More on page 18).

• Current UVa offensive line coach Scott Wachenheim was the offensive coordinator at Liberty (2006-08) when UVa WR Dominique Terrell's older brother, Zach, was a standout All-Big South running back and slot receiver for the Flames.

• CB Demetrious Nicholson has been growing his signature dread locks since the summer of 2005, just before he entered the sixth grade.

• WR Kyle Dockins also has been growing his dread locks since the sixth grade, dating back to 2006.

• Sophomore CB Kelvin Rainey has two brothers that have played FBS football. His older brother Johnathan played at New Mexico (2008-11), while his other older brother Derrick played at Arizona (2010-13).

• Air Force Academy graduate and UVa assistant coach Scott Wachenheim was awarded his bachelor's degree by then-President Ronald Reagan.

• Graduate assistant Jacob Hodges served as a team manager for two years (2008, 2009) and then was a three-year letterwinner as UVa's holder (2010-12).

• DE Trent Corney's older brother, Taylor, won the Bronze at the 2009 Pan American Junior Championships in the Decathlon. Taylor has also been ranked in the Top 10 in the world in the Decathlon.

• Matt Johns made his collegiate debut as the UVa holder in 2013. The first time Johns made it into a college game he had to hold in the rain on Ian Frye's 53-yard field goal in the 2013 season-opening win over BYU. Frye's kick sailed through as time expired in the first half, tying the third-longest field goal in UVa history.

• P/PK Alec Vozenilek's younger brother Rob is a member of UVa's men's basketball squad. On off days from spring football, Alec drove down to Greensboro, N.C., to support his brother and watch UVa win the ACC Tournament. Alec also attended all of UVa's NCAA Tournament games in Raleigh, N.C., and at Madison Square Garden in New York City.

GREYSON LAMBERT TO MAKE FIRST CAREER START AGAINST UCLA

- On May 5 after the conclusion of spring practice, UVa head coach Mike London put Greyson Lambert atop of his post-spring depth chart at quarterback. The redshirt sophomore is poised to start his first collegiate game in the season opener against UCLA.
- Lambert became the fifth different QB to start a game during the Mike London era at Virginia.
- Of London's 49 games at UVa, 21 have been started by Michael Rocco, 12 by Marc Verica, 12 by David Watford and four by Phillip Sims.
- Lambert is the eighth different UVa QB to start a game since the start of the 2007 season. Included in that group was two games started by Vic Hall and two by Peter Lalich. The other 82 games over the span of seven seasons have been started by Jameel Sewell (23), Marc Verica (22), Michael Rocco (21), David Watford (12) and Phillip Sims (4).

GREYSON LAMBERT ON A SHORT LIST OF ACC QUARTERBACKS

- Greyson Lambert attempted 75 passes in his seven games off the bench in 2013.
- Despite making his first career start Saturday against UCLA, Lambert is one of the more experienced starting ACC quarterbacks from last year.
- Lambert is one six starting ACC quarterbacks in 2014 that attempted at least 50 passes last season.
- The other quarterbacks with at least 50 pass attempts in 2013 are from Clemson (Cole Stoudt), Duke (Anthony Boone), Florida State (Jameis Winston), North Carolina (Marquise Williams) and Syracuse (Terrel Hunt).

WITH WATFORD ITS ALL IN THE FAMILY

- David Watford and current UVa wide receivers coach Marques Hagans are first cousins.
- Both played quarterback at Hampton High School in Hampton, Va., and Watford followed his older cousin to UVa to play quarterback.
- Hagans was the starting quarterback at UVa from 2004-05. He was wide receiver and kick returner in 2002 and 2003 when he was the back up quarterback to Matt Schaub.
- Other notable quarterbacks from the Hampton HS football family are Ronald Curry and Tyrod Taylor.

WATFORD IN THE UVA RECORD BOOK

- David Watford owns a few UVa passing records.
- Watford owns the UVa record for completions in a game with 43 against Georgia Tech last season. The mark is also an opponent record for the Yellow Jackets.
- His 61 attempts against Georgia Tech is also a UVa record for a game.
- Watford passed for 376 yards against Georgia Tech in 2013, the fourth highest passing total in UVa history.
- Watford also owns the single season UVa record for completions in a season by a sophomore with 244.
- His 427 passing attempts in 2013 are also a school record for a season.

WATFORD OWNS OVERTIME WIN FOR VIRGINIA

- David Watford led UVa to an overtime victory over Idaho in 2011.
- Coming off the bench as a true freshman, Watford completed a 27-yard pass to fellow true freshman Dominique Terrell for what ended up as the game-winning touchdown.
- The Virginia defense deflected a two-point attempt afterwards to solidify the overtime victory, 21-20.
- Watford ended the Idaho game 10-of-20 for 95 yards and the touchdown.

A LOOK BACK AT COLLEGE FOOTBALL HISTORY ON THE GROUNDS OF UVA AS THE COLONNADES AT LAMBETH FIELD CELEBRATE 101 YEARS

- The colonnades at Lambeth Field turn 101 in 2014. The playing surface at Lambeth Field hosted Virginia football from 1902 until Scott Stadium opened up in the midst of the 1931 season on Oct. 15, 1931.
- Lambeth Field is the location where the American game of football that we know today, played from youth league all the way up to the NFL, was first played.
- It all started in 1909 with the death of UVA's Archer Christian.
- Christian died in 1909 as a result of injuries sustained in a football game at Georgetown on Nov. 13, 1909. Christian's death highlighted 29 football related deaths during the 1909 season. Papers from all over the country carried the front-page headline of Christian's death.
- Former UVA President Edwin A. Alderman and the father of UV athletics, William Lambeth, went to New York City to meet with other presidents and administrators from other big time universities to discuss how they could make the game of football safer.
- At the time there was legislation happening in Washington to make it illegal to play the game of football in America.
- A new rules committee that was appointed from that meeting in New York City included Lambeth and the father of American football, Walter Camp.
- Lambeth noted to the committee, which met almost on a monthly basis, that the two deaths he had seen personally were due to exhaustion. At the time there were no substitutions, if you came out you could no longer return. The original game had a lot of pulling and pushing. Players were not considered down until they really couldn't move under the pile. Lambeth suggested that the game be split into four quarters, totaling 15 minutes a piece and that players could substitute back in. Walter Camp's notes from the committee meetings credit Lambeth, in the margins, with these changes.
- The committee asked Lambeth to take the new rules back to the University of Virginia and experiment with them during the spring of 1910.
- On the Grounds of the University of Virginia, under the watchful eye of William Lambeth, a new version of American football, divided into four quarters was played for the first time in history.
- Other notable rules that were played for the first time that spring at Lambeth Field were: seven men required on the line at the time of the snap, players could no longer push or pull the ball carrier and the forward pass could now be made across the line of scrimmage.
- Virginia football returned to its roots at Lambeth Field during camp in 2013 and 2014, taking part in various scrimmages and practices on the hallowed ground.

WISEMAN AND RISHER HAVE BOTH WORKED ON UVA'S FOOTBALL STAT CREW FOR 50+ YEARS

- Paul Wiseman and Dr. John Risher have each worked on the stats crew at Scott Stadium for over 50 years.
- Wiseman enters his 58th consecutive season on the UVA stat crew, which is tied with Toledo's Chet Sullwold for the longest active streak in FBS football. Both men started in 1956.
- Risher began in 1963 and enters his 51st season in a row.
- Risher used to be Wiseman's primary care physician in Lynchburg before retiring. When Risher found out what Wiseman did with UVA, he hounded him to plug him in with the stats crew too.
- Risher is UVA's oldest living football alum. He turned 104 on May 13 of this year. He golfed nine holes on his 100th birthday in 2010.
- Wiseman has missed only one home game at Scott Stadium since he started working on the stat crew and that was the 2011 season-opening game against William & Mary.
- The William & Mary game in 2011 is the only home game Wiseman has missed for that matter at Scott Stadium since 1946.
- In April 2013, both Risher and Wiseman were recipients of the "Order of the Crossed Sabre" award, which goes annually to someone who has contributed greatly to Virginia football.

Mike London enters his fifth season at Virginia with a complete roster of players he has recruited, a large number of returning letterwinners and all of his coaching coordinators from the 2013 campaign. Fresh off a recruiting class that included two top-10 prospects for the first time in the program's history, London believes the Cavaliers are in position to return to the form that saw UVa win eight

games in 2011 and compete in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.

Facing one of the nation's toughest schedules in 2014 will be a challenge, but the energetic London feels the Cavaliers are ready to turn the corner. With recruiting classes consistently ranked among the top-30 in the nation, Virginia is in a position to erase the memories of the 2013 campaign when it went 2-10 with a roster that featured just six seniors who played on a consistent basis. In both 2012 and 2013, the Cavaliers were among the nation's leading teams in terms of playing true freshmen.

Knowing London's backstory, it is easy to understand why he is so optimistic as well as why his players enjoy and embrace his coaching approach.

A former Richmond police detective, London's time in law enforcement dealing with the entire spectrum of human emotions and actions has provided a wealth of experience that he draws on to assist players both on and off the field. There are few stressful situations he has not faced — including having a loaded pistol pointed at him and the trigger pulled, only to have the weapon malfunction and not discharge its potentially lethal round.

London also had the remarkable opportunity to save one of his daughter's lives when he was identified as a perfect match for her rare bone marrow disorder. That opportunity is one reason why London is an advocate of servitude and makes sure his players understand and embrace the concept of giving back through a variety of community services activities. One of the most visible is the team's annual bone marrow donor registration drive as part of the national "Get in the Game, Save a Life" initiative.

London's biography includes plenty of chapters of football success on the field as well.

In the spring of 2013 OT Oday Aboushi was selected by the New York Jets to mark the 30th consecutive season a UVa player has been picked in the NFL Draft, the second longest streak among ACC schools.

In 2011, he led Virginia to one of its most outstanding seasons as the Cavaliers went 8-4 during the regular season, finished second in the ACC's Coastal Division with a 5-3 mark and played Auburn in the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Cavaliers were one win from advancing to the ACC's Championship game.

The Virginia turnaround featured four games that the team won in the final seconds. Along the way the Cavaliers became the first college football program to ever win road games at Miami and Florida State in the same season on the way to UVa being ranked in the Associated Press Top-25 poll for the first time since the 2007 season.

For his efforts, London was recognized as the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coach of the Year. He was also selected by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes to receive its 2011 Grant Teaff Coach of the Year Award. Five of his players earned either first or second-team All-ACC honors. The 2011 team saw two players — CB Chase Minnifield and OG Austin Pasztor — receive All-America honors and CB Demetrius Nicholson was named a Freshman All-American.

Since taking over the Virginia program London has worked tirelessly to build relationships with the University's faculty and staff, alumni and former players, fans and supporters and the region's high school coaches. He has made dozens of appearances, spoke at clinics and been readily available to the media.

He has had the team hold spring practices and coaches clinics across the state, including in Virginia Beach to build support and interest in one of the state's most fertile recruiting areas.

He defines the culture for the football team by prescribing three basic tenets for his players:

- Go to Class
- Show Class
- Treat People with Dignity and Respect

The results of his actions were tangible. In his first spring semester at UVa the team posted its best cumulative grade point average in 10 years. Those results have continued to improve and during the spring of 2013, his players once again set a high mark for its GPA.

While all of those things are impressive, London is the first to remind everyone his primary goal is to reverse the fortunes of the Cavalier program on the field. Success has been a big part of the Mike London story even prior to being named the 39th coach in the Virginia program's history.

In two seasons at Richmond, London led the Spiders to a 24-5 record. In his first year at the helm, his team went 13-3 and won the Football Championship Series national title. The 2009 Spider team, ranked nine consecutive weeks at No. 1 in the FCS polls, went 11-2 and reached the quarterfinals of the FCS playoffs. His teams were 13-4 in the Colonial Athletic Association during the 2008 and 2009 campaigns.

London's efforts in 2008 earned him FCS National Coach of the Year honors from both the American Football Coaches Association and Schutt Sports/ American Football Monthly magazine. London was also honored as the Black Coaches Association Male Coach of the Year in 2008, beating out Mike Tomlin of the Super Bowl Champion Pittsburgh Steelers for the award. In addition to the national honors, London was tabbed the State Coach of the Year from both VaSID and the Peninsula Sports Club.

Under London's watch, 16 Spiders were named to the All-CAA Football Team in 2009 after placing 12 in 2008. His first year at UR, nine Spiders garnered 15 All-America awards and six were recognized on the Academic All-Conference Team. DE Lawrence Sidbury was a fourth-round NFL draft pick by the Atlanta Falcons, while RB Josh Vaughan was a free-agent signee by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Before returning to coach his alma mater, London spent six of seven seasons coaching for Al Groh at Virginia. In 2001 London joined the UVa staff for the first time as the defensive line coach. He took over the responsibilities as recruiting coordinator in 2002. In 2005 London left UVa to work as the defensive line coach for the NFL's Houston Texans. He returned to Virginia in 2006 as the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach.

During his tenure with the Cavaliers, he saw five defensive players (Chris Long, Marcus Hamilton, Chris Canty, Andrew Hoffman and Monsanto Pope) drafted by NFL teams. Long was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year in 2007, earned unanimous All-America honors, was the Ted Hendricks Award winner as the nation's top defensive end and the second overall selection in the 2008 NFL Draft.

A native of Hampton, Va., London played defensive back at Richmond from 1979-82. Under head coach Dal Shealy, he led the Spiders with six interceptions as a senior captain in 1982. In addition to earning all-state honors, he was chosen the team's MVP and received the Spiders' Coaches Award. In 1982, the Virginia Peninsula Sports Club selected him as the male in-state Athlete of the Year.

London graduated from Richmond in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later received a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy, serving as a detective for the street crimes unit from November of 1984 to July of 1989. The Dallas Cowboys signed him as a free agent in 1983.

London broke into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989, spending two seasons with Richmond as the outside linebackers coach and admissions liaison, followed by four seasons (1991-94) as the defensive line coach at William & Mary.

He returned to Richmond for two more years (1995-96) as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator, coaching All-America LB Shawn Barber, who was a fourth-round draft pick by the Washington Redskins in 1998 and played 10 years in the NFL. London served as defensive line coach at Boston College for the 1997-2000 seasons, where he helped lead the Eagles to two bowl appearances.

London and his wife Regina, are the parents of four children — Ticynn, Korben, Jaicyn and Madicyn. He has three older children, Michael, Jr., Brandon and Kristen through a previous marriage. The 53-year-old London was born in West Point, N.Y. in 1960.

His son, Brandon, led Massachusetts in receiving in 2006 and finished his career as the school's second leading receiver. He was signed to the Miami Dolphins active roster in 2008 after spending the 2007 season on the Super Bowl Champion New York Giants practice squad. Brandon since 2010 has been with the Montreal Alouettes of the CFL. One of London's daughters, Kristen, played on the UVa women's basketball team during the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons. His younger brother, Paul, was a defensive back at UVa from 1991-95.
