



FIELD HOCKEY

OPENING WEEKEND

- The Cavaliers split a pair of games last weekend against Wake Forest
- On Saturday, the Cavaliers took an early 1-0 lead on a goal from **Adele Iacobucci** after a corner 3:31 into the game, but Wake Forest scored two goals in the second half to pick up the victory. Virginia had two potential goals whistled off in the first half
- On Sunday, Laura Janssen broke a scoreless tie by knocking in a pass from Iacobucci with 3:10 remaining in regulation.
- Wake Forest had a chance to tie the game, earning a penalty corner with just over a minute left, but the attempt by Anne van Hoof was high. The Demon Deacons were awarded another penalty corner with four seconds left on the clock. UVA blocked the shot, but had another penalty corner called. With no time left on the clock, the Deacons final shot sailed wide and out of play to end the game
- **Adele Iacobucci** leads the team with three points on her goal and her assist. She also leads the team in shots with five
- **Laura Janssen**, one of the Cavaliers top goal scorers from last year, has two points on her game-winning goal on Sunday

ACC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Sophomore goalkeeper **Taylor Henriksen** was named this week's ACC Defensive Player of the Week
- Henriksen made nine saves on Saturday in what was just the second start of her career
- She went on to pick up her first win and her first shutout in Sunday's 1-0 victory
- She has an .857 save percentage through the first two games, tops in the conference
- Henriksen was also named the NFHCA Play Safe National Defensive Player of the Week

ROOKIES

- All eight of the Cavalier freshmen saw playing time in last weekend's games
- Twin sisters **Lilly and Meghen Hengerer** were both in the starting lineup on Sunday. Lilly also started Saturday's game
- **Anneloes Knol** has started both games and has seen significant playing time, taking four shots this season

TEAM CAPTAINS

- Seniors **Makayla Gallen** and **Rachel Robinson** are this year's team captains
- This is Robinson's third season serving as a team captain

THE SYRACUSE MATCH-UP

- This will be the first game of the year for the Orange
- Friday's game is an ACC contest. Sunday's game will not count in the conference standings
- Virginia leads the all-time series, 7-3, and has won the last four match-ups
- UVA won last year's meeting, 2-0, in Syracuse. It was Michele Madison's 400th career victory
- Three of the last five meetings have been decided in overtime including the 2018 double overtime game in Charlottesville

PRESEASON ALL-ACC

- Virginia had a league-high three players named to the Preseason All-ACC team, all three of whom are on the defense
- A pair of 2019 NFHCA All-American backs, senior **Rachel Robinson** (first team) and junior **Amber Ezechiels** (second team), both of whom were also all-conference players last season, earned the preseason accolade
- Junior goalkeeper **Lauren Hausheer** was also named to the preseason All-ACC team. This is her first time earning a conference accolade (other than a defensive player of the week nod)

- **Lauren Hausheer** had a virtual internship at Prince Michel Vineyard and Winery in their marketing department
- **Taylor Henriksen** began a foodie Instagram account called taylor_likes_brussels_sprouts
- **Makayla Gallen** and **Amber Ezechiels** have been fostering animals from the Charlottesville SPCA since coming back to town. They started off with four kittens and then moved on to a dog

TURF FIELD COVID POLICIES

- Due to health and safety considerations in addition to the current guidelines established for sports venues by the Commonwealth of Virginia, attendance at UVA home competitions is limited to family of student-athletes and each team's coaching staff until further notice. There is no public admission to these events and all tailgating in University parking lots is prohibited
- A limited number of UVA student-athletes will also be admitted to games played outdoors
- Masks must be worn by fans at all times while inside the stadium
- Fans are asked to socially distance from one another, congregating in groups of no more than five people
- Gate will open 30 minutes prior to gametime

HEAD COACH MICHELE MADISON

- Head coach **Michele Madison** is in her 15th season at Virginia and her 32nd overall as a head coach
- She has a career record of 412-245-8 (.626 win percentage) and a 201-101 (.666 win percentage) record at UVA
- Madison is a member of the National Field Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame and was named the 2017 ACC Coach of the Year
- Her 412 wins is sixth most among active DI coaches and ranks 8th overall
- She picked up her 400th career win on Sept. 20, 2019 at Syracuse
- Madison picked up her 200th win at the helm of the Cavaliers in the NCAA first round victory over Delaware
- Madison is one of only two active Division I head coaches to be a part of two United States Olympic staffs, having worked as a manager with the 1988 Olympic Team in Seoul and served as the head goalkeeper coach with the 1996 squad in Atlanta

MEET THE VETERANS

- The Cavaliers have three “fourth-years” (as they are called at the University of Virginia) anchoring the squad
- **Lauren Hausheer** is a junior in eligibility, but is a fourth-year student at the University after redshirting the 2018-19 season (what would have been her sophomore year)
- Last season was her first year as a starter in goal after appearing in just eight games her freshman season, though she made 19 saves on 20 shots on goal for a .950 save percentage her freshman year
- She comes into the season with a .781 career save percentage with seven shutouts
- She is a member of the US U-21 team
- Hausheer is studying in the McIntire School of Commerce pursuing two concentrations (Marketing and IT) and two tracks (Business Analytics and Strategic Brand Consulting) as well as a psych minor (note: concentrations are the school’s equivalent of a major and tracks are like minors)
- Striker **Makayla Gallen** has appeared in every game for the Cavaliers since her freshman year.
- Gallen comes into the season with 13 goals, 11 assists and 37 points in her career
- **Rachel Robinson** was named the 2019 ACC Field Hockey Scholar-Athlete of the Year as a junior. The kinesiology major has twice been named was the seventh player in program history to be named the ACC Field Hockey Scholar-Athlete of the Year, but the first to do so since Lori Mastropietro in 1998

FRESHMAN CLASS

- The Cavaliers have eight freshmen on this year’s team: Emily Graeff (Phoenixville, Pa.), Anneloes Knol (Utrecht, Netherlands), Esha Shah (Ellicott City, Md.), Alexandra Morgan (Winnetka, Ill.), Lilly Hengerer (Bedminster, N.J.), Meghan Hengerer (Bedminster, N.J.), Gery Schnarrs (Camp Hill, Pa.) and Mary VanLoh (Houston, Tex.)
- “Overall, I am very excited about this talented incoming class,” Michele Madison said. “They possess, at different levels, the things we value at UVA: a strong skill set, potential top-speed play and connectivity with teammates. I really think we have eight glue players, players who compete and play to make the team better. They seem to be extremely coachable. We will see how they cope when they are challenged to play out of their comfort zone, which is where all the mistakes and growth happens.”

2019 SEASON

- Virginia is coming off a season that saw the team return to the NCAA semifinals for the first time since 2010 (fifth time overall after making back-to-back trips in 1997 and 1998 and again in 2009 and 2010)
- Virginia’s season came to a close with a 2-1 loss to Princeton in the semifinals. UVA has lost to Princeton each of the last four years in the NCAA Championship, twice in the first round, including a double-overtime loss in 2017, and on a last-second goal in the 2016 quarterfinals. All four games were decided by a single goal
- The Cavaliers finished 2019 strong, winning 10 of their last 12 games. Their losses were falling in overtime to Boston College, 1-0, in the semifinals of the ACC Championship, and the season-ending 2-1 loss to Princeton in the Final Four
- The Cavaliers had one of the stingiest defenses in the nation in 2019, ranking fifth in NCAA I by allowing just 1.06 goals per game. North Carolina is the only ACC team ranked higher with a 1.04 goals-against average
- Junior goalkeeper **Lauren Hausheer** had a conference-best 1.00 goals-against average last season, which ranked third in the nation. She was second in the ACC with a .744 save percentage, trailing only Sarah Dwyer of BC
- Virginia has had 12 different players score goals last season. It was a well-rounded offense that did not have a single player in double-digits for goals scored
- The 2020 team returns three of the top four goal scorers: sophomore back **Cato Geusgens** (team-high 8 goals last season) and strikers **Laura Janssen** (7) and **Makayla Gallen** (6). Janssen had a team-best shooting percentage, scoring her 7 goals on 18 shots (14 shots on goal)

NFHCA RANKINGS

- The Cavaliers were ranked No. 4 in the final NFHCA Coaches’ Poll (which comes out before the NCAA tournament). UVA was the No. 3 seed in the NCAA Championship field
- The Cavaliers were ranked in the top-10 in the final eight polls of the year. The Cavaliers started the season ranked No. 11 in the NFHCA rankings
- Virginia has been ranked in the top-25 every single week since the 2012 preseason poll

SENIOR NATIONAL TEAM MEMBERS

- **Rachel Robinson** was named to the roster of the 2020 U.S. Women's National Team, by USWNT head coach Caroline Nelson-Nichols in January (Jan. 10). She has yet to earn her first international cap
- **Annie McDonough** and **Makayla Gallen** are members of the U.S. Women's National Indoor Team
- Both traveled in January to compete in the Rohrmax Cup, in Vienna, Austria
- McDonough is a veteran of the U.S. Women's Indoor Team, having been a member of the squad during its gold medal run at the 2017 Pan American Championships. Six months before joining the Cavaliers, she traveled to Berlin, Germany to play for Team USA in the 2018 Indoor Hockey World Cup

JUNIOR NATIONAL TEAM MEMBERS

- **Greer Gill** and **Lauren Hausheer** are members of the US U21 team
- **Danielle Husar** is a member of the Canadian U21 Junior National Team
- All three are hoping to play in next year's Junior Pan Am Games. The Junior Pan Am's field hockey tournament, which will feature a pool of qualifying teams, was originally slated to be played in early December of 2020 in Santiago, Chile, but has since been moved back to April 12-25, 2021. The tournament will also be a U-22 competition in order to make sure that those who should have played this year but will have aged out by next still have an opportunity to represent their nations

USWNT DEVELOPMENT TEAM

- **Rachel Dawson** is the head coach of the US Women's National Development Team

TEAM RISE

- **Xas Morgan** is on the USA Field Hockey Rise Women's National Team (basically the U19 team)
- **Ole Keusgen** is the head coach of the US squad, a position he has held since 2019

ASSISTANT COACH MINI BIOS

- **Ole Keusgen** is in his sixth season at Virginia
- Keusgen is in his fourth season working with the USA Field Hockey Junior High Performance Program. He was the head coach of the 2018 U19 team and has been leading the US Rise Women's National Team since 2019
- Keusgen has been playing field hockey since the age of six, including playing professionally in Germany with one of the most successful field hockey clubs in European history, Uhlenhorst Mülheim, winning the German Indoor championship in 2015 and the Euro Indoor Club Cup in 2015
- **Rachel Dawson** is in her fourth season at Virginia. She joined the coaching staff after retiring from the USWNT after the Rio Olympics
- Dawson was a three-time Olympian, competing in Beijing in 2008 and London in 2012 and helped lead the Americans to a fifth-place showing at the Rio 2016 Olympic Games
- Dawson has 298 international caps
- Dawson played at North Carolina and earned the 2007 Honda Award as the National Player of the Year for field hockey and was selected as one of the five finalists for the Honda-Broderick Cup as the nation's top collegiate female athlete
- Dawson was the 2007 ACC Defensive Player of the Year and the 2007 ACC Tournament MVP
- Dawson made her USA Field Hockey coaching debut in 2019-20, serving as an assistant coach for the US Women's National Development Team. She is now the head coach of the team

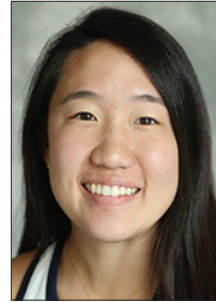
