Virginia closes out a three-game road swing on Friday night in the match with the Hokies The Hoos are coming off a tough road swing with a 1-1 draw at Duke on Thursday and then a 3-0 loss at Clemson on Sunday afternoon

The meeting with the Hokies will be the second this season as the squads face off twice in the first four matches of the year with both matches designated as non-conference matches The Cavaliers are ranked No. 11 in the initial United Soccer Coaches poll released this week Through three games, the Cavaliers have six different players with points as three players have recorded goals and four players have notched an assist in a balanced attack With television schedules announced, the Cavaliers will be on TV in seven of the eight remaining games in the regular season with only the match at Virginia Tech being a streaming broadcast The Cavaliers will play an abbreviated season this fall, featuring a four-game ACC schedule and three against conference opponents designated as non-conference matches

THE SERIES WITH VIRGINIA TECH

The Cavaliers lead in the all-time series with Virginia Tech 21-4-1

UVA won the first meeting in 2020, taking a 3-1 victory in the non-conference season opener The Cavaliers have outscored the Hokies 78-13 over the course of the series

UVA has won eight of the last 10 meetings between the schools with both losses away from home The Cavaliers are 15-1-0 against Virginia Tech at home and 11-1-0 in matches at Klöckner Stadium The squads have rarely play at Virginia Tech with UVA leading the series 5-2-0 on the road The teams played seven times prior to Virginia Tech joining the ACC in 2004 with UVA going 7-0-0

- · In the 78th minute she connected with Alexa Spaanstra off a corner for what proved to the the game-winning goal
- · She then got in the scoring column in the 83rd minute when she took a pass from Cam Lexow and buried it for the 3-0 lead

HOOS PICKED TO FINISH THIRD IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

- ·The Cavaliers were picked to finish third in the ACC in a presasson vote of league coaches this season
- · Virginia received two first place votes and tallied 113 points picked behind North Carolina and Florida State
- · North Carolina was picked to repeat as regular-season champions, while Florida State was picked to finish second

- · Ordoñez tied for the ACC lead in goals scored last season (15) while Spaanstra was second in the ACC in assists (12)
- ·The preseason All-ACC team was made up of 11 players and featured players from five different teams
- · North Carolina and Florida State each had three players selected, UVA and Louisville had two and Duke had one player

CAVALIERS SET TO PLAY ABBREVIATED SCHEDULE IN THE FALL

- ·Virginia is set to play an abbreviated schedule this fall made up of 11 contests which all come against ACC teams
- ·The Cavaliers will play an eight-game conference schedule with three matches designated as non-conference contests
- · UVA's two matches against Virginia Tech and a road trip to North Carolina will not count in the ACC standings this season
- ·The eight-game ACC schedule will feature four home games and four road games
- ·Virginia will play seven matches against teams that went to the NCAA Tournament in the 2019 season in this schedule
- · Of those seven contests, four come on the road at Clemson, Duke, North Carolina and Virginia Tech- the home opponents in that group are FSU, Louisville and Virginia Tech

UNITED SOCCER COACHES RELEASE INITIAL RANKINGS FOR WEEK THREE

- ·The United Soccer Coaches released its initial rankings for the fall of 2020 on Sept. 22 and the Hoos came in at No. 11
- ·The organization is only ranking teams competing in the fall season in the limited poll that sees 15 teams ranked
- ·The Atlantic Coast Conference has a strong presence with six teams in the poll all in the top 12 and all of the top three

NCAA COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS STRUCTURE FOR CHAMPIONSHIPS AND SPRING SEASON

- · The NCAA has made recommendations to the Board of Directors on a process for holding fall championships in the spring
- ·The current recommendation is for brackets to be filled at 75 percent (48 teams) instead of the usual 64 teams
- · Fall contests are to be counted toward selection for the championships in the spring when resumes are considered
- •The spring season will be played Feb. 3 April 17 with NCAA Tournament selections to be made on April 18
- ·The College Cup is set to be conducted May 13-17 and the tournament field will have 31 automatic bids and 17 at-large

IVORY CLIMBING THE RANKS IN THE RECORD BOOK

- · In her third season, goalkeeper Laurel Ivory is already working her way into the history books at UVA
- · Currently, Ivory is fourth all-time in shutouts with 28 solo shutouts in her career
- ·With 43 wins, Ivory is fourth all-time in victories as a keeper she has a 43-11-8 record for her career

CAVALIERS RESPOND WELL AFTER A LOSS UNDER SWANSON

- · Responding after a loss has been a trend for the Cavaliers throughout Steve Swanson's tenure at UVA

- · Junior midfielder Sydney Zandi delivered a quick strike on the game-winner at No. 8 Penn State last season
- \cdot Her goal came 0:26 seconds after Penn State scored the equalizer in the 85th minute of play
- · Zandi's goal was tied for second-fastest answering goal in UVA history, matching Jen Redmond vs. Wake in 2006
- ·The fastest answering goal in program history was in 0:19 seconds by Lori Lindsey vs. Duke in the 2001 season

CAVALIERS EARN UNITED SOCCER COACHES TEAM ACADEMIC AWARD

- ·The Cavaliers were recognized by the United Soccer Coaches last season as a Team Academic Award winner
- \cdot To earn the recognition the team GPA must be a 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for all rostered members
- · It was the 10th consecutive season for the Cavaliers to be recognized with the academic honor

A PROGRAM RECORD SEVEN CAVALIERS NAMED TO ALL-ACC TEAMS

- \cdot Seven Cavaliers were named as All-ACC selections this season setting a new UVA mark for selections in a season
- · Meghan McCool earned All-ACC first team honors as the only player from UVA selected to the first team

LINIOLIFLY LIVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

- · Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson: "Campus" is never used.
- · First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process. This tends to be used less in athletic eligibility references.
- Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

- · Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."
- Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.
- Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely
 contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in
 general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos"
 sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

• The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS: ORANGE AND BLUE

- Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.
- One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAHOOWA

- The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.
- Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."
