### OPENING KICK

#### THE SOUTH'S OLDEST RIVALRY

- Virginia and North Carolina will meet for the 125th time in the South's Oldest Rivalry, a series that began in 1892.

#### VIRGINIA VS. NORTH CAROLINA

- UVA trails the all-time series with North Carolina, 63-57-4.
- There is a difference in the series record between the two schools because of the game in 1956 that North Carolina forfeited for using an ineligible player. All of UNC's games in 1956 were forfeited by conference action. Both schools count the 1956 game as a win.
- Saturday's game will tie the rivalry for the second-longest series in NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision history. The "Deep South's Oldest Rivalry" between Auburn and Georgia for decades was one game behind the UVA/UNC rivalry, but an extra meeting in 2017 (SEC Championship) has brought them even.
- The two schools have met every season since 1919 and there have been only four seasons since 1900 when they did not meet (1906, 1909 and 1917-18, when football was postponed at both schools because of World War I).



ILB Nick Jackson leads the ACC with 10.6 tackles per game. With 53 tackles, he is just the third-different Cavalier since 2000 to notch 50+ tackles through first five games (Micah Kiser, Quin Blanding) of a season.

#### FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- The Cavaliers have faced the Tar Heels more than any other school (124) in program history.
- Virginia is playing on Halloween for the 17th time and for the first time since 2015 against Georgia Tech. UVA is 7-9 all-time on Halloween and Saturday's game is only the Cavaliers' fifth Halloween game at Scott Stadium (1981, 1992, 2009, 2015).
- For UVA head coach **Bronco Mendenhall**, Saturday marks the 200th game in his head coaching career. He previously coached 142 games at BYU and Saturday will be his 58th at UVA. He will become one of eight active coaches with a career winning percentage over .600 with at least 200 FBS career games coached.
- WR **Billy Kemp IV** has 41 receptions this season. Kemp's 41 receptions are the most by a Cavalier in program history through the first five games of a season.
- **Kemp** is No. 1 in the ACC and No. 10 in the nation with 8.2 receptions per game.
- ILB **Nick Jackson** leads the ACC with 10.6 tackles per game. Last time out he recorded a career-high 16 tackles at then-No. 11 Miami.

### #TheStandard: BY THE NUMBERS

- 3** UVA's current three-game winning streak in the series with UNC is its longest since winning four in a row from 2006-09.
- 4** Tony Poljan is No. 4 in the nation among tight ends with 22 receptions. His three touchdowns rank No. 8 among FBS tight ends.
- 21** WR Terrell Jana has at least one catch in 21-straight games. His streak started at Georgia Tech on Nov. 17, 2018.

## VIRGINIA ATHLETICS NEW BRAND IDENTITY

- The University of Virginia athletics department introduced this year its new brand identity. The refreshed designs provide updates on a brand rich in history and tradition. The work was developed by Nike's Global Identity Group (GIG) and includes updates to the iconic V-Sabre mark, two new secondary marks, a revised color scheme and the introduction of new typography, numerals and patterns.
- Nike's GIG team works with a select number of its sideline partners each year to update the athletics department's brand identity based on the goals provided by the institution. The launch of the new Virginia Athletics brand identity is the culmination of an 18-month collaborative process with Nike that began with discovery sessions with UVA coaches, student-athletes and administrators.

## UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

## UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

## THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

## UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

## WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

## MENDENHALL VS. BROWN

- Saturday is the fourth all-time meeting between UVA head coach Bronco Mendenhall and UNC head coach Mack Brown, but just the second at their respective schools.
- The two previous meetings came when Mendenhall was the head coach at BYU and Brown the head coach at Texas. Mendenhall came out on top in the last BYU/Texas meeting during the 2013 season when his BYU Cougars defeated then-No. 15 Texas, 40-21, in Austin. Brown barely won the first meeting in 2012 when then-No. 21 Texas beat BYU, 17-16, in Austin.

## THE MOST OFFENSE TYPICALLY WINS

- In UVA vs. UNC games since 1940, the winning team has out-rushed the loser 58 of 77 times, with one game featuring the same yardage for both.
- The winning team has had more offensive yards 70 times and has been outgained just 16 times since 1940. UNC was the most recent team (2019) to outgain UVA and lose (539-517).
- The loser has outgained the winner just nine times since 1975, but it has happened seven times in the last 19 years, including in 2007, 2008, 2011, 2014 and 2019.

## ON THE GROUND

- Since 2006, the Tar Heels have averaged 142.1 rushing yards per game vs. the Cavaliers, with UVA winning seven of the last 13 meetings.
- In contrast, UVA has averaged 150.4 rushing yards per game vs. the Tar Heels since 2006.
- Since 1996, UNC has scored 20 rushing touchdowns with three coming in 2015 and two coming in 1997, 2011 and 2016. In contrast, UVA has scored 33 times on the ground in that span.
- In the last 24 games, UNC's offense has scored 60 touchdowns, with 39 coming in six games (1997, 2002, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2016, 2019), while the defense has scored nine touchdowns (eight interceptions and one punt return).

## TURNOVERS MAKE A DIFFERENCE

- Since 1982, the Cavaliers are 16-3-1 when committing fewer turnovers than the Tar Heels. The losses occurred in 1995, 2001 and 2016, while the tie was in 1984.
- Over the last 11 years, North Carolina has committed 19 turnovers, while UVA has committed 22 (which includes 10 combined from the 2010 & 2015 games).
- North Carolina is 10-2 vs. Virginia when committing fewer turnovers.
- There have been six games since 1982 where each team committed the same number of miscues and Virginia has won five (1985, 1988, 2003, 2018, 2019).
- The 2019 meeting, neither team turned the ball over and UVA won, 38-31.

## NATURE OF THE RIVALRY

- There is a strong historical lineage and academic standing between UVA and UNC.
- UVA was founded by Thomas Jefferson, the third President of the United States, while UNC was the first operational state university in the United States.
- UVA had its writer-in-residence William Faulkner, while UNC is the alma mater of Thomas Wolfe.
- President Woodrow Wilson attended UVA and was president of the Jefferson Literary and Debating Society, while President James K. Polk attended UNC.
- UVA and UNC were also the first future members of the ACC to be elected to the prestigious Association of American Universities. UVA was elected in 1904 and UNC in 1922.
- UVA was the opponent for the dedication game at UNC's Kenan Stadium in 1927.
- Kenan Stadium was used as a model by the designers of Scott Stadium.

## FIRST FAMILY TAKES IN 1928 MEETING

- President Calvin Coolidge and his wife, Grace, attended the 1928 Virginia vs. North Carolina Thanksgiving Day football game at UVA's Lambeth Field. The President was joined by the governors of both Virginia (Gov. Harry F. Byrd) and North Carolina (H.W. Chase). Over 20,000 spectators attended UNC's 24-20 win 91 years ago. Lambeth Field's grandstand only sat 8,000. Additional temporary bleachers helped hold the overflow crowd.

## THE TRIANGLE-FECTA

- UVA hosts Duke, North Carolina and NC State at Scott Stadium in 2020. It marks just the fourth time the Cavaliers will host all three schools from the Triangle at Scott Stadium in the same season. This has also happened in 1958, 1967 and 1969.
- UVA is 1-1 against Triangle teams this season with a win over Duke and a loss to NC State. In 1958, 1967 and 1969 UVA went 1-2 at Scott Stadium against Triangle teams.

## VIRGINIA - NORTH CAROLINA CONNECTIONS

- UNC head coach Mack Brown's daughter, Barbara, teaches urban planning for the University of Virginia's School of Architecture.
- UNC's senior advisor to the head coach, Sparky Woods, was the offensive coordinator and quarterback coach at Virginia in 1997-98 where he oversaw an offense that boasted future NFL talents like Thomas Jones, Germane Crowell and Aaron Brooks.

## Last Meeting

Virginia became bowl eligible for the third consecutive year with a 38-31 win at North Carolina at Kenan Stadium the last time these two teams met.

Virginia took control of the game with three consecutive touchdowns and outscored the Tar Heels 21-14 in the second half, all coming in the third quarter. UVA was 5-for-5 in the redzone and finished with 517 yards of total offense to 539 for North Carolina.

QB Bryce Perkins set a UVA school record with 490 total yards on offense (378 passing, 112 rushing) to lead the Cavaliers to the win. WR Terrell Jana caught a career-high 13 passes for 146 yards.

After a North Carolina field goal, Virginia found the end zone as Perkins ran it in for a touchdown. The Cavaliers added a 21-yard field goal from Brian Delaney to lead 10-7. The Tar Heels scored back-to-back touchdowns to lead 17-10. UVA responded with a touchdown pass to WR Hasise Dubois with 13 seconds to go in the first half to tie the game 17-17.

Out of the break, UVA regained the lead when Perkins rushed for a 65-yard touchdown. The Cavaliers added to the lead as Perkins connected with TE Tanner Cowley for a touchdown. North Carolina cut it to 31-28, but Virginia responded just two minutes later as Perkins found TE Grant Misch for a touchdown. The Tar Heels scored with 43 seconds remaining in the third quarter to make it 38-31. Neither team scored in the fourth quarter.

## HOME SWEET HOME

- Virginia returns home to Scott Stadium for the third time in 2020.
- UVA is winners of 13 of its last 15 games at Scott Stadium, dating back to the start of the 2018 season.
- With UVA's four-game losing streak, UVA will look to use the friendly confines of Scott Stadium to get back in the W column. UVA has only led for a combined 30:47 this season, all of which came in the Duke game at Scott Stadium.
- UVA has experienced good success in Charlottesville against UNC. From 1983-2008, UVA won 14 in a row at Scott Stadium against North Carolina. The Cavaliers experienced a five-game home losing streak to UNC (2010-2016), but won the last time the Tar Heels came to Scott Stadium in 2018. UVA has won 15 of the last 20 meetings with UNC in Charlottesville.

## JACKSON IS TRENDING TOWARD THE VICINITY OF FORMER UVA ALL-AMERICANS

- ILB Nick Jackson leads the ACC in tackles per game with 10.6 per game. He also ranks No. 23 in the nation.
- Since 2000, Jackson is only the third different Cavalier to record at least 50 tackles through the first five games of the season. The other two were All-Americans FS Quin Blanding and ILB Micah Kiser.
- Kiser, a current starter for the Los Angeles Rams, is only the second player in ACC history to lead the league in tackles three seasons in a row (2015-17), joining Luke Kuechly (2009-11).
- Blanding is the only player in ACC history to finish No. 2 in tackles four years in a row. No one had done it three times until Blanding did it. Blanding is UVA's all-time leading tackler (495).

## KEMP BECOMING A WORKHORSE FOR THE UVA OFFENSE

- WR Billy Kemp IV has become a workhorse for the Virginia offense. He currently ranks No. 1 in the ACC and No. 10 in the nation with 8.2 receptions per game. He tallied a career-high 10 catches at No. 1 Clemson and again against NC State. His 96 receiving yards against the Tigers was also a career high.
- Kemp ranks No. 6 in the ACC and No. 55 nationally with 73.0 receiving yards per game.
- Over his last 10 games, dating back to Nov. 9, 2019 vs. Georgia Tech, Kemp has caught 61 passes (6.1 rpg) for 558 yards (55.8 ypg) and two touchdowns (vs. VT & NC State).

## POLJAN BRINGING THE TIGHT END BACK TO UVA

- TE Tony Poljan, a grad transfer from Central Michigan, has 22 receptions for 172 yards and three touchdowns this season.
- Since 2000, only Virginia tight end Heath Miller (22) in 2003 had as many receptions as Poljan has had through the first five games. Poljan's three touchdowns is one more than what Miller had in 2003. Miller went on to notch 70 receptions for 835 yards and six touchdowns in 2003.
- Since 2001, UVA tight ends have accumulated 803 receptions, 8,329 receiving yards and 73 touchdowns, by far the best in the ACC over that span.
- From that list of tight ends, 10 have enjoyed careers in the NFL with seven lasting 3+ years.

## POLJAN ONE OF THE NATION'S MORE PRODUCTIVE TIGHT ENDS

- TE Tony Poljan is tied for No. 4 in the nation among tight ends with 22 receptions.
- The ACC boasts three of the nation's Top 4 tight ends in regards to receptions.
- Of all the tight ends in the Top 5, Poljan is the only one who doesn't lead his team or is No. 2 in receptions as he is third behind WR Billy Kemp IV (41) and WR Terrell Jana (25).

- WR Terrell Jana has 17 games with at least three receptions since the start of the 2019 season. That ranks tied for No. 3 in all of FBS.

**FIELD POSITION HURTING THE CAVALIERS**

- Virginia is losing the field position battle by an average of 5.8 yards for the season. UVA's average starting field position is its own 26.6, while its opponents on average start at the 32.4-yard line.
- UVA also has only started five drives on its opponents side of the field, while four of those times came in the opener against Duke. Against Duke UVA turned the short field into two touchdowns, threw one interception and the last one took a kneel to end the game.
- In comparison, UVA's opponents have started 15 drives on the Cavaliers' side of the field. The UVA defense has battled well under the circumstances, yielding four touchdowns and four field goals. The defense has also forced two punts, one interception and one missed field goal. Two other times the game ended with a QB kneel.
- Compared to last season, UVA had +6.6 average in field position for the season as its average starting field position was the 33.9 yard-line, while opponents were starting on average at their own 27.3 yard line.

**VIRGINIA SPREADS OUT THE TACKLES FOR LOSS**

- Virginia is No. 15 in the nation and No. 5 in the ACC with 8.0 tackles for loss per game. Seven different Cavaliers have recorded at least 3.0 TFLs so far this season, which ranks tied for No. 2 in the nation.
- UVA's seven players are: Noah Taylor (6.5); Zane Zandier (5.0); Charles Snowden (4.5); Jowon Briggs (4.0); Richard Burney (4.0); Brenton Nelson (3.5); Nick Jackson (3.0). Overall, 15 different Cavaliers have recorded at least one TFL.

- At Miami PK Brian Delaney become the 11th Cavalier with 200+ career points and needs five points to pass Kenny Stadlin for No. 10 on UVA's all-time career scoring ledger.
- Delaney is also No. 6 all-time at UVA in career points kicking with 200. Delaney set the UVA single-season record for points kicking with 110 in 2019. His 50 PATs in 2019 are also a UVA single-season record.
- Delaney is also tied for No. 6 all-time at UVA with 37 career field goals, sharing the spot with Kenny Stadlin (1983-85). Next on the list is Wayne Morrison (1979-82) who is No. 5 with 38 made field goals. No. 4 is Ian Frye (2012-15) with 45 made field goals.

**TAYLOR A UNIQUE TALENT FOR THE CAVALIERS**

- OLB Noah Taylor is the one of two players in the nation with at least 25 tackles (27), six TFLs (6.5), two sacks (2.5) and two passes defended (2). Navy's Diego Fagot is the other.
- Taylor is used in a myriad of ways, coming off the edge, as well as dropping into coverage. Of his 27 tackles, 19 have come on rushing plays.
- Taylor is building on his breakthrough 2019 season when he finished 2019 with 57 tackles, 13.5 TFL, 7.0 sacks, 2 INT, 4 PBU, 1 FF and 1 punt block. His 7.0 sacks ranked No. 2 among ACC linebackers in 2019, second to former UVA teammate Jordan Mack (Carolina Panthers). Taylor was also just one of three FBS players with 2+ INTs and 7+ sacks in 2019 and the only one returning to college football in 2020.

The last Cavalier to reach 1,000-career rushing yards was former QB Bryce Perkins last season when he became the 44th player in program history to reach the milestone. He is only the third UVA quarterback to reach the milestone and the first since Shawn Moore in 1990.

## LAVEL DAVIS JR. STRETCHES THE FIELD

- WR Lavel Davis Jr. is No. 10 in the nation and No. 1 in yards per reception (23.33). He also ranks No. 1 in the nation among freshmen wide receivers with at least five receptions. The only freshman in the nation with a better mark is running back Deuce Vaughn from Kansas State.
- Five of Davis Jr.'s nine receptions this season have gone for 20+ yards and three have gone for 30+ yards. All nine of his receptions have gone for a first down or a touchdown.
- Dating back to 2000, Davis Jr.'s 23.33 yards per reception mark through UVA's first five games is the second highest in program history of players with at least seven receptions. Only Andre Levrone as a senior in 2017 had a better yards per catch average (25.1).

## FRESHMAN SCORING RATE FOR DAVIS IS HIGH

- WR Lavel Davis Jr. is tied for No. 2 in the nation among freshmen for receiving touchdowns with 3. He trails Oklahoma's Marvin Mims (6) and shares the second spot with Tahj Washington (Memphis), Jahmyr Gibbs (Georgia Tech) and Jordan Addison (Pitt).

## BLOUNT AND ZANDIER ARE A TACKLING DUO

- Only 33 active FBS players have 200+ career tackles and UVA has two of them. Both FS Joey Blount (210) and ILB Zane Zandier (221) are part of the 33. Blount and Zandier are one of four active Power-5 teammates with 200+ career tackles. Texas Tech, Louisville and Northwestern also have two players with 200+ career tackles.

## NELSON CLIMBING THE ACTIVE CAREER LIST FOR INTS

- SS Brenton Nelson has eight career interceptions. He is tied for No. 7 among active FBS players for most career interceptions.
- FS Joey Blount (6) and CB De'Vante Cross (4), along with Nelson (8), make Virginia one of three schools with at least three players with 4+ career interceptions. Cincinnati has seven with 4+, while LSU, like UVA, has three.
- CB Nick Grant has three interceptions, also joining the Top 100 of career interceptions among active players.

## LONG UVA SCORING DRIVES

- Five games into the season, UVA already has scoring drives of 97 yards (vs. NC State), 94 yards (vs. Duke) and 94 yards (at Miami). All three drives resulted in touchdowns and are longer than any drive the Cavaliers had in 2017, 2018 and 2019.
- The last time UVA had multiple drives of 90+ yards was in 2016 when UVA set a program record with a 99-yard drive vs. Central Michigan and also had a 90-yard drive against UConn.
- UVA has seven drives of 75 yards or more and all seven have resulted in touchdowns.

## DELANEY BREAKS UVA'S CONSECUTIVE FIELD GOALS MADE RECORD

- Senior Brian Delaney made 17-straight field goals, breaking the UVA record owned by Jake McInerney. In 1989, McInerney made 14 in a row. Delaney's streak came to an end at Wake Forest on Oct. 17 after he missed his third attempt of the game.
- Delaney's streak had started on Oct. 11, 2019 at Miami when he made three field goals in a row after his first attempt of the game was blocked.
- The ACC record is 34, set by Wake Forest's Nick Sciba last season, breaking the previous record of 27 held by NC State's Marc Primanti.

## NATIONS MOST SEASONED OFFENSIVE LINE

- Virginia returns all its starting offensive linemen from 2019 and the unit boasts 140 career starts at the position, which is No. 1 in all of FBS.
- Looking at UVA's top leaders in career starts, the top three returning players with most career offensive starts are all offensive linemen (Dillon Reinkensmeyer, 42; Ryan Nelson, 32; Chris Glaser, 27).
- UVA has not started the same five offensive linemen for every game in a season since 2011.

## STONE MAKES FIRST CAREER START

- QB Lindell Stone made his first career start against Wake Forest. With 193 passing yards, he became the 22nd Cavalier in program history to throw for 150+ yards in his first career start.
- Stone's 193 passing yards ranks No. 10 all-time among UVA quarterbacks making their first career starts.

## STONE'S CAREER DAY AGAINST NC STATE

- Fourth-year QB Lindell Stone had a career day against NC State when he was called into the game in the second quarter after starting QB Brennan Armstrong left with an injury.
- It was just the fifth appearance of Stone's career and first that didn't come in the fourth quarter. Entering the game his only pass of 2020 had gone for -7 yards and his career QB efficiency rating was 5.03.
- Stone tossed his first career passing touchdown in the closing seconds of the second quarter when he found Billy Kemp IV for the two-yard score. On the scoring drive Stone was 6-of-9 for 75 yards and the touchdown pass.
- Stone finished with career highs in completions (30), attempts (53), yards (240) and touchdowns (3).
- Stone marked the 17th time since 2000 a Cavalier quarterback has completed 30+ passes in a game. Six of those occurrences have happened since 2017.

**THE MENDENHALL ERA: HOLDING OPPONENTS TO CERTAIN THRESHOLDS**

- Virginia, under Bronco Mendenhall, has held opponents under 400 yards of total offense 36 times since the start of the 2016 season (55 games). UVA is 21-15 under Mendenhall in those games.
- Since the start of the 2018 season, UVA has held 23 opponents (30 games) under 400 yards of total offense. UVA is 16-7 under Mendenhall in those games.
- The 2019 team faced injuries in the secondary like no other position group during Mendenhall's tenure and still managed to do this 10 times. By the end of the season, or immediately after its conclusion, 11 members of the secondary in 2019 were out due to injury, or required a post-season surgery (played with ailment).

**JANA JOINS THE 100/1,000 CLUB AT VIRGINIA**

- WR Terrell Jana notched nine receptions against NC State on Oct. 10 to become the 23rd Cavalier in program history to reach 100 career receptions and 1,000 receiving yards. Jana became the 43rd player in program history to reach 1,000 career receiving yards in the 2019 Orange Bowl against Florida.
- Eight of the 23 Cavaliers to join the 100/1,000 club had current UVA wide receiver coach Marques Hagans as a coach.

**THE HAGANS FACTOR**

- With WR Terrell Jana moving into No. 21 all-time at UVA in receiving yards, he becomes the ninth Cavalier in the Top 25 to be coached by current UVA receivers coach and alum Marques Hagans.
- Hagans has coached: No. 2 Olamide Zaccheaus, No. 5 Kris Burd, No. 8 Hasise Dubois, No. 11 Darius Jennings, No. 12 Tim Smith, No. 17 Joe Reed, No. 18 Doni Dowling, No. 20 Canaan Severin and No. 25 Jana. Hagans worked with Burd while as an offensive GA in 2011.
- In all, 11 of the 42 Cavaliers that have reached the 1,000-yard receiving plateau in their career have been coached by Hagans.

**MITCHELL HONORS HAGANS WITH JERSEY PICK**

- WR Hayden Mitchell, who wore No. 83 the last two years, picked No. 18 when it was his time to choose this season. He did so to honor his position coach, Marques Hagans, who wore the number as a QB/WR at UVA (2002-05).
- Mitchell is a former walk-on. The Richmond, Va., native was awarded a scholarship this past August after practice.

**REINKENSMEYER ACCOMPLISHES RARE OFFENSIVE LINE FEAT**

- After starting the season opener against Duke at left guard, Virginia fifth-year offensive lineman Dillon Reinkensmeyer has started a game at all five offensive line positions. He is now the only FBS player to accomplish this feat in research dating back to the start of the 2010 season.
- Reinkensmeyer owns 21 starts at center, 12 starts at right tackle, five starts at left guard, two starts at left tackle and two starts at right guard.
- Reinkensmeyer's 42 career starts are top on the UVA offense.
- Research has found a number of players who started at center, and at guard and a tackle position over their careers prior to 2010, but no confirmations of all five.

**"BREAKING THE ROCK"**

"Breaking the Rock," has also become a tradition in UVA football, started in 2018 by Shawn Griswold, the team's director of football development and performance. It represents how you move a mountain, one rock at a time. The hardest worker during summer workouts is awarded the honor of swinging the sledgehammer and breaking the designated rock to close the summer phase. After a Cavalier win, the "unofficial player of the game" breaks the rock for that week. Below is the collection of Cavaliers to Break the Rock since the tradition began. Griswold started the tradition while at Tulsa and also included it at Pitt and Arizona State.

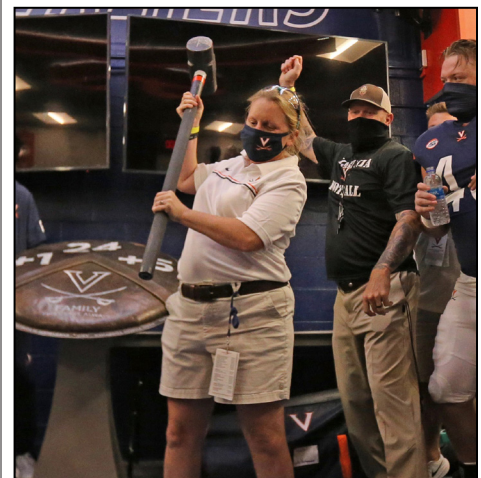

**LAVEL DAVIS JR. SHINES IN DEBUT**

- WR Lavel Davis Jr. led UVA with 101 receiving yards and two touchdowns on four receptions in his collegiate debut against Duke. The 101 receiving yards by the Dorchester, S.C., native is the first time a Cavalier has recorded 100+ receiving yards in his collegiate debut.
- He scored touchdowns on scoring strikes of 18 and 26 yards in the fourth quarter. His first, an 18-yard pass from Brennan Armstrong, gave UVA the lead (24-20) for good with 12:43 left to play against Duke. He was named ACC receiver and rookie of the week for his efforts.

**HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE DUKE WIN**

- With the help of the Havoc Hoos, Virginia forced seven Duke turnovers on Sept. 26. UVA has forced 25 Duke turnovers during its current six-game winning streak over the Blue Devils.
- UVA's seven forced turnovers and five interceptions are both single-game highs for a team in FBS this season.
- In 131 seasons of Virginia football, the Cavaliers have notched a program record five interceptions 10 times in a game. Two of those times have come in the Bronco Mendenhall era at UVA and both times against Duke (2016 and 2020).
- At +4 in the turnover margin, UVA is No. 1 in the nation in that category.
- UVA opened back-to-back seasons with ACC wins for the first time in program history after winning at Pitt to open 2019.
- Zane Zandier notched a career-high 15 tackles, which is a single-game best in the ACC this season. He was named ACC Linebacker of the Week for his efforts.
- TB Wayne Taulapapa rushed 16 times for a career-high 95 yards against Duke. His previous high was 77 against Duke last year.

**CAVALIERS THAT MADE COLLEGIATE DEBUTS IN 2020**

- Fourteen Cavaliers have made their collegiate debuts so far in 2020.
- QB Iraken Armstead\*\*, LB Sam Brady\*\*, DL Jahmeer Carter\*\*, DB Chayce Chalmers, WR Josh Clifford, WR Lavel Davis Jr.\*\*, DB Jake Dewease, LS Tucker Finkelston, DB Elijah Gaines\*\*, DB Donovan Johnson\*\*, TE Mike Kosar, DE Nusi Malani\*\*, WR Demick Starling\*\* and LB Hunter Stewart made collegiate debuts so far in 2020.
- \*\* denotes true freshman

**THE THOMPSON TRIFECTA**

- QB Keytaon Thompson caught a three-yard pass at No. 1 Clemson for his first career receiving touchdown. It was just Thompson's second career reception with his first coming last season when he was at Mississippi State.
- In his career, Thompson has now passed for, rushed for and received for a touchdown. He previously had eight passing touchdowns and 10 rushing touchdowns at Mississippi State.

**UVA PASSING GAME UNDER BRONCO MENDENHALL**

- Five of the top eight single-game passing contests from a quarterback standpoint have happened during the head coach Bronco Mendenhall and offensive coordinator Robert Anae's tenure at UVA (2016-pres.).
- Kurt Benkert, the starting quarterback in 2016 and 2017 owns the No. 1 (455, vs. UConn, 2017), No. 2 (421, vs. Central Michigan, 2016) and No. 6 (384, at Miami, 2017) spots. Bryce Perkins, the starting quarterback in 2018 and 2019 has the No. 7 spot (379, vs. Ohio, 2018) and No. 8 spot (378, at UNC, 2019).
- Virginia also amassed 5,445 yards of total offense in 2019, marking the sixth time in program history a Cavalier team recorded over 5,000 yards in a single season. The 2019 season marked the second-best output in program history (1990, 5,516) and only the second time a Cavalier team tallied 5,000+ yards of total offense in back-to-back seasons after notching 5,033 total yards in 2018.
- Only ten times in program history has a UVA quarterback thrown for 20+ touchdowns in a season and five of those times have happened in the past five seasons: 2015 (Matt Johns, 20); 2016 (Kurt Benkert, 21); 2017 (Kurt Benkert, 25); 2018 (Bryce Perkins, 25); 2019 (Bryce Perkins, 22).

**UVA BRINGS IN TRANSFERS FROM THE PORTOL**

- Virginia welcomes eight transfers to the program for the 2020 season, seven of which are grad transfers.
- The Cavaliers welcome DB D'Angelo Amos (JMU), DL Adeeb Atariwa (JMU), LS Danny Caracciolo (Bryant/JMU), WR Ra'Shaun Henry (St. Francis (Pa.)), TE Tony Poljan (Central Michigan), TB Shane Simpson (Towson), QB Keytaon Thompson (Mississippi State), and TB Ronnie Walker Jr. (Indiana).
- Walker will have two years of eligibility starting in 2021 after serving a NCAA-mandatory season of residency.
- Amos, Atariwa and Simpson are all currently roommates after facing each other previously in CAA

## UNIQUELY VIRGINIA FOOTBALL

## GUIDING PRINCIPLES

- The Virginia football program under Bronco Mendenhall has 14 guiding principles. They can be found on the walls of the McCue Center and outlining the fences of the practice facility. They are a constant reminder to the foundation of the program. Each one is a vehicle for the Virginia football program to develop people.
- **Bronco Mendenhall Said It:** "I would love to win a national championship. I'd love to develop a great program here. But what I would really love is for every kid in my program to have an amazing life."
- Family. First, Last, Always
- Earned Not Given
- Will Before Skill
- And ...
- 400 Percent
- The Power of Choice
- Two Ways
- Protect our Cart
- Less Drama, More Work
- Hard Things Together
- Everybody is Somebody
- It Pays to be a Winner
- Champions Do Extra
- Make it a Masterpiece

## TASK UNIT LEADERS

- The Cavaliers have 10 task-unit leaders and each has an assistant. Working together, they determine the order in which players select their jersey numbers, choose the movie that's shown the night before a game (not taking place this season), pick the color combination of the uniform UVA will wear in a given game, recognize teammates for their effort in practice, and decide which players make up the four special-teams units: kickoff, kickoff return, punt and punt return.
- **Bronco Mendenhall Said It:** "It's their program. The idea simply is, I like the idea of delegating and providing leadership opportunities as much as possible. I try to get as much off it [head coach's plate] as possible, so the only thing that I have remaining to do is competitive work. Then that allows me to help our team at the highest level with the time that I have."
- OLB **Charles Snowden Said It:** "I know he's [Mendenhall] big on leadership development, so I think he just gives us opportunities to lead within football. We definitely see our peers in a different light than the coaches do. The coaches kind of see football only. We know who's coming back and getting in extra work, we know how guys carry themselves, we know how invested they are."

## THE 4TH SIDE

- Offense and defense are two sides. Special teams is the third side. **The 4th Side**, in Bronco Mendenhall's teaching, is the sidelines. Mendenhall has made it a point of emphasis with his team since arriving in Charlottesville that **The 4th Side** is as important as the other three. And just as he expects his teams to perform on offense, defense and special teams, Mendenhall wants his players on the sidelines to thrive. By extension, the UVA fan base is also part of the **The 4th Side**.
- **Bronco Mendenhall Said It:** "It starts on our sideline and possibly the name of all of our fans as the entire stadium becomes The 4th Side."
- WR **Terrell Jana Said It:** "It is the 4th Side for a reason because of the four aspects of the team. Coach shows film in the meeting room of players on the 4th Side. The team sees that and takes pride in that."



## EARN YOUR JERSEY NUMBER

- Head coach Bronco Mendenhall introduced what he sees as the bedrock of his "earned not given" mantra when he arrived in Charlottesville in 2016. There are no double numbers and once a number is earned, that student-athlete has it for the season. The majority of numbers are picked over the course of the selection ceremonies during the final three weekends of fall camp. Once the season ends, all players return to the status of no number for winter conditioning, spring ball and summer workouts.
- To be considered for number selection, players have to meet certain physical benchmarks – weight room numbers, conditioning times, etc. – but it's also about dedication to the program, overall effort in practice and having the right disposition in the locker room.
- Bronco Mendenhall doesn't choose the order. The task unit leaders do.
- **Bronco Mendenhall Said It:** "The task unit leaders, they're the ones who are with their teammates every day in the locker room. They're with them in class. They're with them in their apartments. They see a lot more than I see. Our players have embraced it, and it matters to them to be endorsed by their peers to be on our team."
- Alum **Jordan Mack Said It:** "Part of our program is earned not given. They know what to expect coming in, and they know nothing is going to be given. To earn a number, gear, anything with a Virginia sabre on it, you're going to have to earn it through your hard work."

## STATE CHANGERS

- White ► Grey ► Orange ► Navy ► Black
- Workout gear color is immediate feedback where our student-athletes stand in their training in order to drive positive change.
- Everything in performance is tracked from the moment they step on Grounds to show their gains. All new players begin their UVA careers wearing white.
- Black workout gear is the pinnacle in the UVA strength & conditioning. Two current Cavaliers have reached that pinnacle: DE Richard Burney and CB Nick Grant.

## THURSDAY'S HEROES

- The Thursday's Heroes program is coordinated by the University of Virginia football team. Originally at BYU, Thursday's Heroes transitioned to UVA when Bronco Mendenhall became Head Coach in 2016. Since then, the program has continued to grow, warming the hearts of players, coaches, fans, and of course, the Heroes. Each Thursday during the Fall and Spring season (this is not happening this year), an individual who is undergoing a difficult circumstance (medical, physical, cognitive, etc.) and their family is invited to tour the football facilities, watch practice, meet the coaches/team, and receive special gifts unique to each Hero. Different players take turns showering the Hero with gifts, including UVA gear, an official game jersey, Beats by Dre, a bicycle, school supplies, Halloween costumes, and special video messages from favorite celebrities (Peyton Manning, Kenny Chesney, Damian Lillard, Chris Long and Hugh Jackman to name a few have taken part). The goal of the program is simple: to put a smile on the Hero's face and to welcome them to the Virginia Football family.
- TB **Wayne Taulapapa Said It:** "Everybody is Somebody ... Every day we look up to them and the fight they are in. We want them to know they are with us and we are with them."

## UNIQUELY VIRGINIA FOOTBALL

## MAD HATTERS (PUT ON THE HATS)

- The “Mad Hatters” is the name of the Virginia Football Scout Team. It drew inspiration from the character frozen in time in “Alice in Wonderland,” but the name has as much to do with the evolution of pennies scout team players once draped over their shoulder pads to brightly colored pieces of fabric, which stretch over their helmets. Hence, “Put on the hats.”
- Each Thursday after practice the “Mad Hatter of the Week” is announced by a task unit leader.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* “The way I frame it to our team is without going through that process, I think there is a fundamental step missed in their development. Most recruits and most young people want to come in and play their first year. Most of us, right, it’s kind of about us. When you’re in that role, it’s really about serving and helping your team.”

## UVA GROUNDSKEEPERS

- Virginia’s football program wants to be a catalyst for change in the community, helping to turn the pain of the Charlottesville riots of Aug. 12, 2017 into a celebration of life, love and unity. During the summer of 2020, a player-led initiative was born in the form of the Groundskeepers in order to “Take Back our Grounds” from the white nationalists that descended upon Charlottesville in 2017.
- To be part of the Groundskeepers, participants take part in their own march, which starts downtown at Heather Heyer Way — the street named in honor of the woman who lost her life during the Aug. 12 demonstrations — before heading to the Enslaved Workers Memorial and the Rotunda.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* “We chose to take this march in direct opposition and the exact opposite direction of the events that happened in the death of Heather Heyer. We’re standing against hate, inequality, anything that doesn’t reflect well on the state of mankind, especially at the University of Virginia.”
- **OLB Charles Snowden** *Said It:* “We are committed to making a change in our community. We are committed to fighting for what’s right. We are committed to a better future. We are the Groundskeepers. Just thinking about what transpired those two days and what those two days signify and stand for — There were protests led in the name of hatred, racism, oppression and that’s harmful. That’s hurtful to a lot of people and that’s not what the city of Charlottesville stands for. That’s not what the University of Virginia stands for. The Groundskeepers here at UVA, we just want to show that’s not who we are and not what we stand for. So we’re just trying to take back the power of those days and show that we stand for love, unity, respect, uplifting one another, and just doing what’s right.”
- One of UVA’s four flags they run onto the field with each game is a flag that represents the Groundskeeper, which serves as constant reminder to the community of the importance of being unified in love rather than hate.

## THE SHIELD

- The shield is an important part of the Virginia football program. On the shield, which was modeled after shields used in the movie 300, has three numbers: +1, 24, +5. They represent a formula that Bronco Mendenhall and his staff developed after years of data study and analytics that will lead to probable wins. Each game UVA’s goal is to be at least +1 in turnover margin, score at least 24 points while holding opponents under 24 points and being at least +5 in field position. Accomplishing each of those goals in a game creates a winning scenario.
- Virginia’s shield (pictured) is always represented in the UVA locker room.
- The shield also has the UVA guiding principles painted around the shield.

### ARMSTRONG IS NAMED QB1

- QB Brennan Armstrong was named the starting quarterback by Bronco Mendenhall on Aug. 27. He is the third opening-day starting quarterback under Bronco Mendenhall, joining Kurt Benkert (2016-17) and Bryce Perkins (2018-19).
- Armstrong is one of UVA's four team captains as voted upon by his peers. He is the only non-senior, joining DE Richard Burney, WR Terrell Jana and OLB Charles Snowden.
- Armstrong is the first left-handed starting QB at UVA since Jameel Sewell (2006, 2007, 2009).
- Armstrong enrolled at UVA in January 2018 and backed up Perkins the last two seasons, saving his redshirt season in 2018 under the NCAA participation rules.
- Armstrong is the 13th different UVA starting quarterback to start an opener in the last 16 seasons. The list includes: Bryce Perkins (2018-19), Kurt Benkert (2016-17), Matt Johns (2015), Greyson Lambert (2014), David Watford (2013), Michael Rocco (2011-12), Marc Verica (2010), Vic Hall (2009), Peter Lalich (2008), Jameel Sewell (2007), Christian Olsen (2006) and Marques Hagans (2005).

### ARMSTRONG CONTINUES TO MATURE AS THE STARTING QB

- QB Brennan Armstrong threw for 200+ yards in each of his first two career starts, including 269 against Duke and 270 at No. 1 Clemson. He is only the second Cavalier to throw for 200+ passing yards in each of his first two career starts. Armstrong joins Matt Blundin, who did so in his first four career starts that spanned 1989, 1990 and 1991.
- With UVA trailing by three points (20-17) entering the fourth quarter in the season-opening win over Duke, Armstrong was 8-of-9 passing for 144 yards and two touchdowns. His lone incompletion was ruled a catch on the field by Davis Jr., but overturned on replay.
- Armstrong passed for 270 yards and three touchdowns at No. 1 Clemson, while also rushing for 89 more yards. Dating back to 2000, he is the only QB to pass for 225+ yards, pass for 3+ touchdowns and rush for 70+ yards in a game against the Tigers.
- With Armstrong under center, the UVA offense accumulated 417 yards of total offense at No. 1 Clemson. The Cavaliers became the first ACC team to earn 400+ yards of total offense against the Tigers since 2017 when NC State (Nov. 4) did so. Since the start of the 2019 season only LSU, Ohio State, Virginia (twice) and Syracuse have averaged 5.0+ yards per play against the Clemson defense.

### UVA QUARTERBACKS IN THEIR FIRST-CAREER START

- QB Brennan Armstrong made his first collegiate start against Duke at Scott Stadium.
- Armstrong threw for 269 yards and two touchdowns against Duke, which is the second-most by a Cavalier starting quarterback making his first career start.
- Since 1955, 22 Virginia quarterbacks have passed for at least 150 yards in their first-career start. Here is a breakdown of the most passing yards by a Virginia QB in their first-ever start:

## SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 479 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 273-194-12.

## Bronco Mendenhall Head Coach • Fifth Season

Since arriving at Virginia for the 2016 season, head coach Bronco Mendenhall's impact on the Cavalier program has been immense. From a two-win season, to the ACC's Coastal Division Championship and a New Year's Six bowl invitation, Virginia football's ascent has both remarkable and historic.

Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after a highly successful 11-year career at BYU with a vision and a plan of execution for the daunting renovation project he faced. He has masterfully crafted principles and culture, and instilled pride and purpose, leading to a standard of unbroken growth in just four seasons.

Having a plan and being able to execute a strategic approach to achieving results have been mission critical to Mendenhall's formula for success.

"Teams and organizations are perfectly designed to get the results that they get,"

Mendenhall is fond of saying regarding both successes and failures. His pursuit of "unbroken growth" centers around learning, applying and improving on tools, frameworks, networks, innovation and processes that deliver those results. His ultimate goal is more expansive than building a great football organization. He strives to build great people.

On-field success is just part of the story Mendenhall has scripted at Virginia. He is a powerful believer in balance, which he frequently sums up with one simple word ... AND. It has become the calling card for the UVA football program.

"I think decisions are made based on principle, and I think principles are governed by beliefs," Mendenhall said. "AND is one of our guiding principles, and that is based on my belief that football is a vehicle to develop people."

At his introductory press conference, Mendenhall stressed that he wanted students AND athletes and believed that combination was achievable, especially at an institution such as Virginia that ranks among the top three public universities in the nation. Since that time, he has not compromised his approach to achieving those means. More importantly, his teams have bought in on the concepts with great enthusiasm and demonstrated they can do so while also being successful on the field.

"I would love to win a national championship," Mendenhall said. "I'd love to develop a great program here. But what I would really love is for every kid in my program to have an amazing life."

In the world of big-time football, Mendenhall's philosophy is unconventional, but that doesn't faze him.

"I'm looking for the complete development of everyone in our program – and winning," he said. "One is not at the expense of the other. I think they go hand-in-hand, and winning, without the other, would be hollow to me."

Under Mendenhall, the UVA program has progressed from two to six to eight to nine wins. Achievements and recognitions on the field, in the classroom and around the community have exponentially increased as well.

In 2019, UVA placed 10 players on the ACC All-Academic team, the most in the program's history. Linebacker

Jordan Mack was named the ACC's Jim Tatum Award winner as the league's top football scholar-athlete and was a finalist for the William B. Campbell Trophy, known in the sport as the "academic Heisman." Linebacker Micah Kiser, now a member of the Los Angeles Rams, won the award in 2017.

Giving back has become a cornerstone of Virginia football. Players frequently visit the University's Children's Medical Center and speak at local elementary schools. The team's Thursday's Heroes program has been recognized for its efforts to honor individuals across the state of Virginia who are dealing with personal adversity. In 2020, the ACC honored the Thursday's Heroes program with its "Game Changers" award, which recognizes and highlights specific conference teams' involvement with their local communities.

"I'm in pursuit, and we're in pursuit as a football program, of both of those things, and without compromising our expectations for one or the other," Mendenhall said. "I want good young people. I'm talking about morals, values, character, behavior and contribution to the world. And I want a great team. I know it sounds idealistic, but I would not coach football if I did not think it could be done, and I would not coach at Virginia if I did not think there was support for doing it that way."

Mendenhall's pursuit of individual growth is only magnified by the success his teams have also achieved on the field. His name appears often when the accolades of college football's leading active coaches are charted.

"To me, football is just a magical and powerful platform to have motivated learners, and I get to teach life lessons through the sport of football," Mendenhall said. "The trophies, the wins, they're necessary for job security and the world makes a big deal of that. But it is hollow without the substance. Relationships are everything. Other than that, it would just be a game, and that does not sound quite meaningful enough to me."

- The Cavaliers are 77-21-7 all-time in season openers at home.
- Virginia opened a season against Duke for the 20th time. The Cavaliers are 10-10 all-time against the Blue Devils in season openers.
- UVA is 39-33 all-time against Duke. UVA has won six-straight against the Blue Devils.
- UVA is 22-11 all-time against Duke at Scott Stadium.
- Bronco Mendenhall is 12-4 all-time in season openers, including 4-1 at UVA.
- UVA tied a single-game record with five interceptions. The last time UVA notched five interceptions was against Duke's Daniel Jones in 2016. UVA has now accomplished this feat 10 times.
- Virginia has forced 25 turnovers against Duke over the last six games, including 12 over the 2019 and 2020 meetings.
- OL Dillon Reinkensmeyer started at left guard, making him the only player in all of FBS since 2010 to start at least one career game at all five offensive line positions. He owns 21 career starts at center, 12 at right tackle, two at right guard, two at right tackle and now one at left guard.
- QB Brennan Armstrong made his first career start and became only the second left-handed quarterback to start a game for Virginia.
- Armstrong's four-yard rushing touchdown in the second quarter was the first of his career.

- WR Lavel Davis Jr.'s 18-yard reception in the second quarter was the first of his career.

### Game Notes

- UVA's nine-game home winning streak was snapped. It was tied for the tenth-longest in the nation among active streaks and was tied for the third-longest of the UVA modern era. UVA has only lost two of its last 15 games at Scott Stadium (2018 vs. Pitt; 2020 vs. NC State).
- For the 36th time under Bronco Mendenhall, UVA held an opponent (363) under 400 yards of total offense. UVA is 21-15 in those games, including 16-7 since the start of 2018.
