THE SERIES vs. VIRGINIA

- This will mark only the second time NC State and Virginia have met on the gridiron since the 2012 season. In his eighth year at the helm of the Wolfpack program, Dave Doeren is facing the Cavaliers for just the second time and this will mark his first visit to Scott Stadium.
- When the two squads last met in 2018, UVa was the last league school that Doeren had not played since coming to NC State.
- Charlottesville has not been friendly to the Wolfpack over the years. Although NC State won the last road game, 28-14, in 2011, the Pack is 3-9 in its last 12 trips, dating back to 1984.
- Despite its lack of recent history, this week's game will mark the 59th between NC State and Virginia in a series that dates back to 1904. The Wolfpack holds a 35-22-1 advantage in the series.
- State and Virginia played every year from 1960 - 2003, but have met just five times since the ACC expanded in 2004.
- Gene Corrigan, the father of Wolfpack Director of Athletics Boo Corrigan, was the head lacrosse coach at Virginia from 1959-67, the head soccer coach from 1958-65 and served as AD from 1971-81. Boo spent much of his youth living in Charlottesville.

NOTING THE WOLFPACK

- NC State is playing its third straight road game - the last two have been against ranked opponents. It marks the first time the Pack has played three straight road games since 1986.
- Wolfpack head coach Dave Doeren is in his eighth season with the Wolfpack, tying him for second among the longest tenured coaches in NC State history behind Earle Edwards (17, 1954-70) and Beattie Feathers (8, 1944-51).
- The Pack's come-from-behind win at Pitt was first time since Doeren's first year at NC State that his squad won a game with a last minute score. That season, the Pack kicked a field goal to beat Richmond with 33 seconds remaining.
- Junior PK Christopher Dunn has connected on 14 straight field goals - the third-longest streak in school history (he also holds the second-longest at 19).
- Ricky Person was named to the Paul Hornung Honor Roll for his performance against Wake Forest after rushing for 99 yards and two touchdowns, throwing a two-yard touchdown pass, catching a pass and returning a kickoff.

de-LEARY-ous

Devlin Leary's redshirt sophomore season at NC State hasn't gone exactly as he had planned, but then again, what has in 2020?

After Leary started the last five games of 2019, he entered spring practice as the starter under new offensive coordinator Tim Beck (Leary's third OC and third QB coach in his three years). After five spring practices and the COVID shutdown, Leary was still listed as the starter. But when practice started in August, Leary

was forced to miss more than two weeks due to contact tracing - crucial time as the Pack prepared for the season.

After coming off the bench to throw for a TD at Virginia Tech, Leary exploded after getting the starting nod at Pitt - leading the Pack to victory over that favored and ranked squad.

He threw for a career-high 336 yards on 28-44 passing, becoming the first Wolfpack QB with 330+ passing yards, 4 passing TDs and no INTs in a game since Russell Wilson in 2009

More impressive was his poise when it counted. When the Wolfpack got the ball, down 5 with 1:44 left on the clock and no timeouts, he drove the offense 75 yards for the winning score - going 6-9 for 74 yards on that final drive. He was the first NC State quarterback since Mike Glennon in 2012 (vs. No. 3 FSU) to engineer a game-winning touchdown drive. The two NFL quarterbacks that preceded him - Jacoby Brissett and Ryan Finley - did not accomplish that feat.

His completion percentage this year is .667 compared to last year's mark of .481.

Leary was named a Manning Award Star of the Week and was a Davey O'Brien Great 8 choice for his performance.

Last season, Leary was the first redshirt freshman to start at QB for the Wolfpack since Russell Wilson in 2010.

SPARE A NICKEL?

Because we could use one.

Players at that position haven't been easy to come by this season due to injuries and illness. After Stephen Griffin - who started at nickel in nine games last season - graduated, Tyler Baker-Williams was poised to take his spot in 2020. The junior started three games at the spot last year and had plenty of experience.

In one of the first practices of fall camp, Baker-Williams expected backup Cayman Czesak went down with a season-ending knee injury. And then further into fall camp, Baker-Williams missed crucial time due to contact tracing - only returning the week of the first game. During his time out, cornerback Taiyon Palmer moved over to the nickel spot but true freshman Joshua Pierre-Louis became the main option behind experience TBW.

After starting weeks 1 and 2, Baker-Williams was contact traced for a second time and had to miss the Pitt game. Pierre-Louis played in his spot, but was ejected for targeting. That left Plamer as the only nickel standing.

PICK YOUR POISON

The Wolfpack has gained victory in two of its first three games in 2020, and each time out the Wolfpack offense found a different way to move the ball.

In Week 1 against Wake Forest, the Wolfpack showed that it could be effective running the ball - gaining 270 yards on the ground and boasting two running backs with 90+ yards (Ricky Person with 99 and Zonovan Knight with 97). Four of the Pack's six TDs came on the ground.

In the win at #24 Pitt, the Wolfpack showed that it can be effective through the air as well, as Devin Leary threw for 336 yards - most for a Pack QB since 2018. All four Wolfpack TDs came through the air as well.

RED ZONE SUCCESS

Heading into the fourth game of the season, NC State is one of only 15 schools nationally that has scored every time it has entered the red zone in 2020.

The Pack is a perfect 12-of-12 in red zone attempts thus far, the third-most red zone scores nationally. Not only is the Pack converting, but 11 of those 12 trips have resulted in a TD (91.7% for fourth-best nationally).

Eleven of NC State's 13 touchdowns on the season have all come as red zone scores.

The 2020 success is a far cry from the Wolfpack's 2019 struggles in the zone. The Pack ranked 67th nationally in red zone conversions last season and the 23 red zone TDs scored ranked 92nd nationally.

#BUILDTHEWALL

It's not a political statement. It's a defensive rallying cry.

Junior nose Alim McNeill has been a stalwart force in the middle of the defensive front for the Wolfpack in 2020. At 6'2, 320 (ish), McNeill is not only huge and explosively strong, but freakishly athletic (he was named to The Athletic's "freak" list for 2020. (He power cleans 323 lbs. and boasts a 640-lb. squat.)

At Pitt last week, with NC State holding a slim 17-13 lead in the third quarter, the Panthers drove down to the Pack 1 yardline and had first and goal. That's when McNeill was joined by 6'4, 344(ish)-lb. redshirt freshman Josh Harris to form a human wall

That wall was impenetrable, as the Pack stopped a run on 1st down and 2nd down, then Harris knocked them back for two yards on the fourth down attempt to give the Wolfpack the ball back.

THE BREAKFAST CLUB

It's going to take a lot of pancakes.

Pitt entered last week's game leading the nation in sacks with 17 in three games - 5.7 per game. That highly vaunted defense was stymied by the Pack's offensive line, which allowed just one of Pitt's two sacks on the day.

Every Sunday during the football season, the Wolfpack offensive staff hands out bottles of syrup to his players in commemoration of their pancake blocks from the previous game. Against Pitt, the Pack earned 10 bottles.

AN ICKEY SITUATION

At this point in his young career, sophomore Ikem "Ickey" Ekwonu would need a LOT of pancakes to use up all the syrup he's received. He has 52 pancakes in his 15 career contests, including six in the season opener and vs. Pitt.

After starting the last seven games of the season at left tackle last season, Ickey is playing at left guard in 2020. He was a BIG force behind the Wolfpack's highest rushing total (270 yards) in 28 games vs. Wake Forest, with a key block on NC State's first score of the game: a 30-yard rush by Zonovan Knight and again in the pass-heavy win at Pitt.

Ickey was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the opener.

TOUCHDOWN, EMEZIE:

The win at Pitt did not mark senior wide receiver Emeka Emezie's career high in terms of catches (he had seven) or receiving yards (he had 101) but he did set one crucial career best: he scored two touchdowns.

He scored the game-winning touchdown with 23 seconds remaining on a 13-yard throw from Devin Leary and had a 35-yard TD grab in the 2nd quarter to put Pack up 17-7.

Emezie now boasts 134 career receptions - the eighth-best mark in school history while his 1,500 career yards rank 19th. His 10 career touchdowns also ranks 19th in school history.

Four of the top 10 reception leaders in school history have played for head coach Dave Doeren. Jaylen Samuels (Pittsburgh Steelers) is the school career record holder with 202 career grabs, Kelvin Harmon (Washington Football Team) ranks fourth with 177 and Jakobi Meyers is fifth with 168.

Even more interesting - all four played together on the 2017 squad.

CARY GOOD:

Senior tight end Cary Angeline is back in familiar territory. After he led the Pack last season with five receiving TDs, he is once again leading the Pack with three in 2020.

Angeline in the end zone was a big reason the Pack pulled off the 30-29 upset at No. 24 Pitt. Not only did he have a career-best two TD catches, but both came on third down.

In the first quarter after Pitt jumped out to a 7-0 lead, the Pack took its first offensive possession right down the field and QB Devin Leary found Angeline from six yards out on a third

#HTT

Hard. Tough. Together.

When former Wolfpack quarterback Philip Rivers came back to visit his alma mater several years ago, he told the football team that at NC State, "We play hard. We play tough. And we play together."

Those words resonated with head coach Dave Doeren, now in his ninth year leading the NC State football program. Hard and tough is in his DNA and his programs have become known for being gutsy and gritty. But it's the together part that makes the Wolfpack unique.

There is strength in the Pack.

The duo struck again in the fourth quarter with the Pack down 23-17. This time, it was a third-and-16 that was converted into another score with a wide-open 25 yard score down the middle of the field.

A GOOD PERSON

A healthy Ricky Person is a good thing. After missing nine games over his first two seasons with injuries, the Wolfpack's junior running back entered fall camp healthy and has been able to stay that way through the first three games. In fact, he was able to go a career-high 50 snaps in the win at No. 24 Pitt.

Person rushed for 99 yards on 14 carries to lead the Wolfpack in the win over Wake Forest and added another 64 vs. Virginia Tech. While playing 30 snaps in the opener, he also rushed for two touchdowns in the 45-42 win: a 1-yard run in the 2nd quarter and a three-yard run that put the Wolfpack ahead to stay in the 4th quarter. He also *threw* a touchdown pass - a 2-yarder to WR Devin Carter and had a 33-yard run to set up fellow running back Zonovan Knight's TD (NC State's first of the season) with a 33-yard run.

EXPERIENCED LEADERS

Dave Doeren has almost completely revamped his coaching staff over the past two seasons. In fact, only one assistant coach - WR coach George McDonald - was at NC State prior to 2019.

Prior to last season, Doeren brought in co-DC Tony Gibson, TE/FB coach Todd Goebbel, OL coach John Garrison and QB coach Kurt Roper. After the 2019 campaign, Gibson took over as sole defensive coordinator, and heads an entirely new defensive staff: Charley Wiles (DL), Joe DeForest (SAF), Brian Mitchell (CB) and Freddie Aughtry-Lindsay (NIC). On offense, Roper moved over to running backs and OC Tim Beck joined the staff.

The Wolfpack's 10 assistant coaches boast 250 years of combined experience - *two and a half CENTURIES!*

STREAKING

Junior placekicker Christopher Dunn not only ranks fourth in career field goals (47) and fourth in career percentage (.887), he has posted two of the top five longest consecutive field goal streaks in school history and holds the school record for PAT streaks.

Between 2018 and 2019, Dunn connected on 19 straight FGs - the second-longest streak in school history - before missing a 51-yarder at West Virginia last season. Over the last six games of last season and the first three of 2020, he's started another streak by hitting 14 straight. That's the third-longest streak in school history and is currently the fourth-longest in the country.

Dunn has also now set the school record for consecutive point after makes, as he is a perfect 91-for-91 for his Wolfpack career.

Dunn has made his last 36 kicks: 13 field goals and 23 PATs.

SPEAKING OF SPECIALISTS

NC State arguably boasts the top kicker/punter combination in college football this season, with each being named to the preseason watch list for their specialty.

Dunn has been named to the Lou Groza Award Watch List, while punter Trenton Gill was named to the Ray Guy Award Watch List. Only one other ACC school (Virginia Tech) has a player on both lists and NC State is only one of only seven schools nationally that can make the claim.

Dunn has had an impressive first couple of seasons as the Pack's placekicker and ranks in the top four in field goals and FG percentage. He owns two of the longest FGs made streaks in school history. Last season, he was named a semifinalist for the 2019 Lou Groza Award and was a second-team All-ACC selection after accounting for 91 points with 21 field goals.

In 2019 - his first year as the Pack's starting punter - Gill set the Wolfpack single-season record for punting average with a 47.6 mark and his career 47.3 average is the NC State career record. This season he ranks 10th nationally in punting with a 45.1 ypp mark.

GOOD WORKS GILL

Back in April, when NC State students had been sent home and football had come to an abrupt halt, Pack punter Trenton Gill was thinking about ways he could help those in need. The junior record-setter wanted to help small businesses in his hometown of Hillsborough that were struggling through the shutdown, but he also wanted to help families who were struggling to pay bills and buy groceries. He came up with a way to do both!

Gill decided he would raise money to buy meals from restaurants in Hillsborough that were struggling, and then donate the meals to families in need.

He started a GoFundMe page to raise donations. Then he partnered with OCIM (Orange Congregations in Missions) to identify families who would benefit from the meals. Then he contacted *eight* different local restaurants. By the time he was finished, his efforts ended up purchasing more than 1,000 meals - giving much needed business to those eight establishments and feeding many families.

Because of his efforts, Gill was named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Teams® for 2020 - marking the third time in the past four seasons that NC State has had a player recognized on that prestigious team (A.J. Cole, III in 2017, James Smith-Williams in 2019).

TALENTED TRANSFERS

The Wolfpack defense has benefited from the addition of three transfers on defense in this early season, with all three earning starting nods this season: DE Daniel Joseph, strong safety Rakeim Ashford and linebacker Levi Jones.

Back in 2016, Joseph - who hails from Toronto - was recruited by Dave Doeren and the Pack before ultimately signing with Penn State. Now four years later, he's finally with the Wolfpack as a graduate transfer. He started the first two contests, and in the opener tallied five total tackles, including two sacks for a loss of nine yards - including a six-yard drop when Wake had 3rd-and-15 on its final possession and down three points. He also had a quarterback hurry.

Ashford saw more action that was probably intended in game 1, as starting free safety Tanner Ingle was only able to play two snaps due to an injury. Ashford, who transferred from Jones College in Mississippi, didn't arrive in Raleigh until August but was praised for how quickly he picked up the defense. In the opener, he played 80 snaps tallying 10 tackles and he started the game at Virginia Tech for Ingle before leaving with an injury. He missed the Pitt game.

Levi Jones, who sat out last season after transferring from USC, was in for 22 snaps vs. Wake Forest, tallying three tackles - including a sack - and recovering a fumble. He started the road game at Virginia Tech and last week at Pitt.

FAMILY TIES

Two freshman quarterbacks for NC State already have their names in the Wolfpack record book ... at least their last names.

Rookie Ben Finley, a 2020 early enrollee, is the younger brother of former signal caller Ryan Finley. Ryan holds the school record for career completion percentage (.645), and ranks second in passing yards (10,505), second in completions (881) and fourth in touchdowns (60). Finley was the Wolfpack starter from 2016-18 and now plays for the Cincinnati Bengals.

Walkon rookie QB Andrew Harvey is the son of Terry Harvey, a football and baseball star for NC State from 1991-95. Harvey stands sixth in the career records books in passing yards (5,925), seventh in completions (442), seventh in touchdowns (31) and 12th in percentage (.563). The younger Harvey's maternal grandfather, Vance Cockerham, played center for the Wolfpack in the early 60s for Coach Earle Edwards.

RILEY REMIX

First there were two. Then there were none. Now we're back to two again.

Last season, two Rileys (no relation) were expected to start on offense for the Wolfpack: C.J. at wide receiver and Tyrone at offensive tackle.

Tyrone, a redshirt senior at the time, went down with a foot injury on the second day of fall practice and had to miss the season after undergoing surgery. C.J., who was redshirt junior, suffered an ACL injury in the season opener, underwent surgery and missed the rest of the season as well.

Riley and Riley, who have both already graduated, have each received extra years of eligibility from the NCAA. This season marks Tyrone's sixth and C.J.'s fifth.

Tyrone has started each of the first three games at left tackle. C.J. missed the opener but came back to play 22 snaps at Virginia Tech and score his first touchdown since 2018.

SIXES

The Wolfpack expected to enter the season with three redshirt senior tight ends on the roster in 2020: Cary Angeline, Dylan Autenrieth and Dylan Parham. However, that has changed.

Those three players are still on the roster and all three played in Game 1, but they aren't all listed as redshirt seniors any more. Angeline, a preseason candidate for the Mackey Award, is the only one who ended last season healthy and played in all 12 games. Autenrieth went down with a knee injury in week 3 and missed the rest of the season after undergoing surgery. Parham missed the last five games of 2019 with an ankle injury.

Although Autenrieth and Parham have both graduated, they are listed as redshirt juniors in terms of eligibility after each earned a sixth year from the NCAA (Parham's sixth year was actually because of a 2018 hernia injury that forced him to miss 12 games).

QBU

NC State IS #QBU - it's not even debatable. *Five* former Wolfpack signal callers are on 2020 NFL rosters. Those five have a combined 35 years of experience playing in the NFL, with 409 career starts among them.

Russell Wilson (a three-year starter and graduate of NC State) has started every single game since his NFL career started in 2012, and has made two Super Bowl appearances with the Seattle Seahawks.

Philip Rivers begins his 17th NFL season, including his 15th as a starter, but starts with a new team as he signed as a free agent with the Indianapolis Colts.

Jacoby Brissett will back up Rivers in Indianapolis this season, after he started 15 games last season for the Colts. As a rookie with Cincinnati last season, Ryan Finley started three games. Mike Glennon begins his seventh NFL season as the backup in Jacksonville.

During the 2019 NFL season, NC State led all other schools with four alums to start at QB during the season (Cal and Oklahoma each boast two).

TURNING THE CORNER

The cornerback position was a revolving door at last season - not because of the performance on the field - but because injuries completely decimated the Pack roster at that spot. 2020 hasn't started much better.

A total of six different NC State players ended up with at least two starts at CB in 2019 and at points in the campaign, the Wolfpack was without its top *five* CBs.

Chris Ingram (19 career starts) and Teshaun Smith (four career starts) were both lost for the season in the Syracuse game on Oct. 10. Smith is back in action for 2020 and Ingram should be back in October as he continues to rehab from an ACL injury.

While Ingram continues to miss, Teshaun Smith has been reinjured and will miss the 2020 season. RS-freshman Shyheim Battle has started the first three games at right corner, but three different players have started at left corner: Smith, Cecil Powell and Malik Dunlap.

SIX DEGREES OF WOLFPACK NATION: The 2020 Wolfpack coaching staff boasts six new members and nine of the 10 assistant coaches are either in their first or second season at NC State.

On offense, new coordinator Tim Beck is in his first year, while OL coach John Garrison, TE coach Todd Goebbel and RB coach Kurt Roper are in their second campaigns with the Pack.

On defense, Tony Gibson, who joined the staff in 2019, is the only returning coach, while Joe DeForest (Saf), Brian Mitchell (CB), Charley Wiles (DL) and Freddie Aughtry-Lindsay are new.

Wide receivers coach George McDonald, now in his sixth season at NC State, is the only coach on the staff with a tenure of more than two seasons.

But just because these coaches are new to NC State doesn't mean they're new to each other. In fact, five of the six new members of the staff have coached with at least one other coach at a previous stop (and the sixth, Freddie Aughtry-Lindsay, is an NC State graduate). Also, the Pack's new Assistant to the Head Coach Ruffin McNeill has previous coaching ties with the current staff.

NO. 1

Since 2014, NC State head coach Dave Doeren has honored a member of the Wolfpack squad by giving them the No. 1 jersey. For 2019, red-shirt junior linebacker Isaiah Moore, who has also been elected a team captain, will don that special number.

Moore is only the second underclassman to earn the privilege (Jaylen Samuels wore the No. 1 jersey as a junior and senior). He returns in 2020 for this third year as a starter and was the third-leading tackler on the team last season.

Moore has also been the de facto leader of the team's involvement in the #PackUnited movement, which stands out against racial violence and social justice.

ACCEUS HANGS UP HIS CLEATS

The defense has lost an experienced veteran as senior linebacker Louis Acceus will not play this season due to medical reasons. He will continue to work with the team as a student coach. Acceus played in 32 games for the Wolfpack during his career, starting nine contests. He was one of the team leaders in tackles from his weakside linebacker spot when an injury forced him to miss the last four games.

RUFFIN IT:

One of the bright spots of a bizarre offseason in 2020 was that head coach Dave Doeren was able to bring his mentor and friend Ruffin McNeill to his staff. McNeill, one of the most well-liked and respected people in college football, is serving as the special assistant to the head coach and has been a great resource for Doeren as well as the entire program.

Doeren has known McNeill, who boasts four decades of coaching experience, for more than 20 years and their professional paths have crossed several times. When Doeren was a graduate assistant at USC in 1999, McNeill was the defensive line coach at nearby Fresno State. The two coached in the Big 12 together from 2002-05 - Doeren at Kansas and McNeill at Texas Tech - and for Doeren's first three years at NC State, McNeill was the head coach at East Carolina.

McNeill most recently served as the assistant head coach at Oklahoma, where he led the defensive tackles and outside linebackers during his three seasons with the program. He also served as defensive coordinator for much of the 2018 campaign. He left the program in January in order to return to North Carolina to help care for his elderly father.

He was the head coach at East Carolina, his alma mater for six seasons (2010-15). He posted a 42-34 record at ECU and his Pirates' teams played in four bowl games and beat Ohio 37-20 in the 2013 Beef O'Brady's Bowl.

CARTER-FINLEY STADIUM

One of the landmarks of North Carolina's capital city, Carter-Finley Stadium has gained a national reputation as being one of the toughest places to play. The home of the Wolfpack, which celebrated its 50th birthday in 2016, boasts 57,600 permanent seats and is surrounded by acres of convenient parking.

The playing surface at Carter-Finley Stadium was reconstructed in 2009. Named for Wolfpack alumnus Wayne T. Day in 2002, it is built to USGA specifications for a golf green.

The south end zone is the home of the 103,254 square-foot Murphy Center, which is the football team's home for training and preparation.

NC State practices just a stone's throw away at the Wolfpack Practice Complex and the mammoth Close-King Indoor Practice Facility. The outdoor complex covers seven acres and boasts three full fields, a training room, restrooms and a video/coaching tower. The indoor facility boasts a full, 120-yard football field and roof height sufficient for kicking game, with suspended goal posts, additional training and conditioning space beyond both end zones.

The A.E. Finley Fieldhouse in the north end zone houses two spacious, state-of-the-art locker rooms that can be divided into smaller locker rooms when NC State plays host to high school championship games. There are also halftime locker room areas for the cheerleaders, the dance team, game referees and coaches.

HEAD COACH DAVE DOEREN

- In his eighth season at NC State, his 10th season as a head coach overall.
- Is tied for second among the longest tenured coaches in NC State history behind Earle Edwards (17, 1954-70) and Beattie Feathers (8, 1944-51).
- In the past three seasons, has had 13 players drafted by the NFL - including an ACC-best seven in 2017. That was the sixth-highest total nationally.
- 257 members of his Wolfpack teams have earned their degrees.
- The graduation success rate for football is at an all-time high (74%) and has risen each of the past four years.
- NC State has boasted 26 Academic All-ACC performers under his guidance and in 2018, Ryan Finley was named to the prestigious NFF National Scholar-Athlete Team.
- With nine victories, the 2018 Wolfpack was one of just six teams in the 126-year history of NC State football to post nine or more regular season wins. It marked the first time since 1991-92 that State posted back-to-back nine-win seasons (only the third time in school history).
- His teams qualified for five consecutive bowl games - the second-longest bowl streak in school history.
- Has coached bowl eligible teams in 14 of his 18 years in Division I.
- One of his players has won one of college football's national award in 2017 and 2018: Bradley Chubb (2017 Nagurski & Hendricks) and Garrett Brabbury (2018 Rimington).
- In 2014, the Wolfpack posted its best rushing average since 1992.
- Members of his teams have turned in over 8,000 collective hours of community service during his tenure at NC State.
- Led Northern Illinois to the most successful two years in program history.
- His first Husky squad won the school's first MAC Championship since 1983 and tied the school record with 11 wins.
- His 2012 NIU team repeated as league champ and set a new school mark with 12 victories, earning a trip to the Orange Bowl - the first BCS berth ever for a MAC school.
- Was a finalist for several national coach of the year awards in 2012.
- NIU boasted the nation's longest conference winning streak (17) and never lost a home game during his tenure in DeKalb.
- Spend five seasons in the Big Ten, serving as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Wisconsin.
- The Badgers posted a 49-15 mark while he was on staff.
- Spent four seasons at Kansas and was on staff when the Jayhawks ended a seven-year bowl drought.
- In 2000 and 2001, coached the secondary at NCAA Division I-AA powerhouse Montana. The Grizzlies advanced to the national title game in 2000, losing by two points, but returned in 2001 to win the championship.
- Montana posted a 28-3 record and won two Big Sky titles during his tenure.
- Planned to go to medical school following college and become an orthopedic surgeon. He took the MCAT but after helping coach high school between his junior and senior years, fell in love with coaching.
- Lettered at tight end at Drake and was an Academic All-American.
- Earned his undergraduate degree in pre-medical biology. Earned his master's from Drake in educational leadership and began work on a Ph.D. while serving as a graduate assistant at the University of Southern California.
