SOUTH'S OLDEST RIVALRY

- UNC and Virginia will face off in the 125th edition of the South's Oldest Rivalry.
- Only Minnesota and Wisconsin's annual battle for Paul Bunyan's Axe has been played more often (128 times) among FBS rivalries. Miami (Ohio) and Cincinnati have met 124 times, but are not scheduled to play in 2020.
- UNC is 26-25 all-time on the road against Virginia.
- The Tar Heels have lost three in a row to the Cavaliers, the longest such streak since dropping four in a row between 2006-09.
- Carolina's last win in the series came in Charlottesville in 2016. Mitch Trubisky threw three touchdown passes and No. 22 North Carolina came away with a 35-14 victory.
- Last year in Chapel Hill, quarterback Bryce Perkins amassed 490 total yards and accounted for five touchdowns to help Virginia beat North Carolina in a Saturday evening shootout, 38-31.
- Sam Howell had four touchdowns and 353 yards. Dyami Brown exploded for a career-high 202 receiving yards and three touchdowns for the Tar Heels.

LAST TIME OUT

- Javonte Williams ran for 160 yards and three touchdowns to help No. 14 North Carolina beat No. 23 NC State 48-21 in last Saturday's renewal of the longtime state rivalry.
- Virginia lost at No. 11 Miami, 19-14, on a rainy Saturday evening at Hard Rock Stadium. The Cavaliers have lost four in a row after a 38-20 win over Duke in their season opener.

BROWN VS. VIRGINIA

- Mack Brown is 3-8 all-time against Virginia. All 11 meetings have come as the UNC head coach.

CAROLINA IN THE POLLS

- Carolina is ranked No. 15 in the Associated Press poll this week. The Tar Heels sit at No. 13 in the Amway Coaches Poll.

UP NEXT

- Carolina makes the short jaunt to Duke next Saturday in Durham.

Outlets may access the highlights, along with any weekly head coach press conferences, through the ACC Media Portal. This portal replaces the ACC Video Clip Service (AVCS). The use of ACC game highlights provided through the ACC Media Portal remain subject to those restrictions outlined in the ACC News Access Guidelines. Interested affiliates should email licensing@xosdigital.com to register for the ACC Media Portal and for additional information. Approved affiliates will receive a confirmation email along with credentials to access the ACC Media Portal.

ACC DIGITAL LICENSE: Per the ACC News Access Guidelines, game footage (station shot or broadcast) may not be distributed through digital platforms without a license. The ACC and XOS Digital now offer a turnkey digital highlight license specifically designed for local TV affiliates. This license will cover the use of ACC game footage across official station websites, apps, and social media platforms. Distribution of in-game highlights on any platform during the broadcast window is strictly prohibited, regardless of a digital license. The branding program contained in Blueprint 919 seeks to help football student-athletes determine who they are, define their key traits, develop their image, recognize their target audiences, and maximize their external presence.

CHRIS SMITH FIELD AT KENAN STADIUM

• The Eddie and Jo Allison Smith Foundation made a transformational gift in 2020 to support the Carolina football program with resources to build on its recent success and secure future excellence. The field at Kenan Stadium is now Chris Smith Field, recognizing the Smith Family and their son Chris, a 1987 graduate of Carolina.

• The family foundation is headed by longtime Carolina leader and benefactor Eddie Smith Jr. '65 of Greenville, North Carolina, and was cofounded with his late wife Jo Allison Smith. Their gift will support staffing needs, fund facility improvements and help build an endowment to cover future operating costs.

CAROLINA ALL-AMERICANS

• The Carolina football program has developed 69 student-athletes, who combined to earn 86 All-America honors. Of those 86 honors, 16 were earned under Mack Brown's guidance from 1988-97. Of note, current cornerbacks coach Dre Bly garnered three first-team honors, two of which came with Brown at the helm.

CAROLINA AND THE NFL DRAFT

• The Carolina football program has produced 248 NFL Draft picks. Of those selections, the Tar Heels have produced 24 first-round selections, which are the most of any school in the state of North Carolina, ahead of NC State (17), Duke (6) and Wake Forest (5).

FAMILY AFFAIR

• The UNC football lettermen have taken to calling themselves the Carolina Football Family, and nowhere is that more evident than this year's roster. The 2020 Tar Heels have two sets of brothers and four players who are sons of former Tar Heels, who all played for Mack Brown. The Fox brothers, Tomon and Tomari, are a pair of defensive menaces from Lawrenceville, Ga, while Dyami and Khafre Brown are two dynamic wide receivers from Charlotte. In addition, cornerbacks coach Dre Bly is the uncle of freshman wide receiver Josh Downs.

• The two sets of brothers enjoyed a tremendous start to the season against Syracuse. Dyami had a game-high 94 receiving yards, while Khafre made his first collegiate start and had three catches for 35 yards. On the defensive side, Tomari had two sacks, while older brother Tomon added a sack of his own.

• As for the second generation Tar Heels, Jefferson Boaz's father Jay Boaz played for Coach Brown at UNC from 1991-94. Christopher Holliday is the son of Tar Heel great and current Associate Athletic Director for Football Corey Holliday (1990-93). Jeffrey Saturday is the son of Jeff Saturday, who played at Carolina from 1994-97; and Will Crowley is the son of Pat Crowley, who spent his time at UNC from 1986-89.

BARTON, PEPPERS NAMED ON HOF BALLOT

• Carolina legends Harris Barton and Julius Peppers are included on the 2021 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame.

• Barton was a four-year starter for the Tar Heels, first at center and then at tackle as one of the best offensive linemen ever to play in college football. A first-team All-American in 1986, Barton was named first team All-ACC as a senior when he led an offensive line that helped Carolina rank first in the Atlantic Coast Conference and sixth nationally in total offense.

• Peppers played in Chapel Hill from 1999-2001 becoming one of the most disruptive defensive players the sport has ever seen. A unanimous first-team All-American in 2001, he won the Chuck Bednarik Award for the nation's top defensive player and the Rotary Lombardi Award, which at the time was given to the nation's top interior lineman. He finished 10th in the Heisman Trophy balloting, was a finalist for the Nagurski Trophy and was honored as Chevrolet's Defensive Player of the Year.

• An announced is expected in early 2021.

MACK FACTS

ACTIVE CAREER WINS LEADER

With 255 career victories, Mack Brown has produced the most wins of any active coach in the nation. He is trailed by Nick Saban at Alabama (247), Brian Kelly at Notre Dame (244), Willie Fritz at Tulane (176), and Gary Patterson at TCU (173). Brown's 255 wins rank ninth on the NCAA all-time list for coaches with at least 10 years at an FBS institution. He has won 158 games at Texas, 80 at UNC, 11 at Tulane and six at Appalachian State.

ONE OF SIX WITH A TITLE

Mack Brown is one of only six active head coaches who has won a National Championship. Brown, who won the title with Texas following the 2005 season, is accompanied by Jimbo Fisher (Texas A&M), Les Miles (Kansas), Ed Orgeron (LSU), Nick Saban (Alabama) and Dabo Swinney (Clemson).

BROWN BECOMES UNC'S WINS LEADER

Mack Brown took over as the Tar Heels' all-time wins leader after the 20-17 victory over Duke on Oct 26, 2019. Brown's 73rd win surpassed Dick Crum, who posted 72 victories from 1978-87.

10-WIN SEASONS

Mack Brown has led his teams to 12 seasons of 10 or more victories during his career. He led UNC to three 10-win campaigns in his first stint with the program before guiding Texas to nine consecutive seasons of 10 wins or more. Brown posted his first 10-win season in 1993 and the Tar Heels went on to post 10 wins in 1996 and '97.

BROWN IN THE POLLS

Mack Brown-led teams have finished ranked in the final Top 25 polls 16 times during his coaching career. He led Texas to 12 Top-25 finishes and UNC to four. Of the 16 occasions, Brown's teams have finished in the Top 10 nine times, including six Top-5 finishes.

BROWN AND THE NFL DRAFT

Mack Brown has produced 110 NFL Draft picks, including 22 first-round selections and 15 second-round picks. During his first stint at UNC, Brown guided 47 players who would go on to be drafted, including six first rounders and seven second rounders. Of note, Brown's 1996 Carolina roster saw 22 players go on to have their names called at the NFL Draft.

TWO-BACK SYSTEM

- Carolina boasts the top running back tandem in all of college football in the likes of senior Michael Carter and junior Javonte Williams.
- Carter and Williams are the only pair of teammates nationally to average more than 100 yards rushing per game (among teams that have played more than one game).
- The two have combined to average 229.2 yards on the ground this season. Carter is 8th in the nation with 116.8 yards, while Williams is 10th with 112.4 yards per game (min. two games played).
- Williams' 12 total TDs (10 rush, two receiving) are the second most in the country. He trails Alabama's Najee Harris, who has 14 rushing touchdowns this season.
- Williams is one of two players (Travis Etienne, Clemson) nationally with 500+ rushing yards and 200+ receiving yards.
- Carter is third nationally with 160.4 all-purpose yards per game, while Williams ranks fifth with 152.4 yards from scrimmage (min. two games played).
- Williams rushed for 160 yards against NC State to become the first Tar Heel rusher to gain 100+ yards in three-straight games since Elijah Hood in final three games of 2015.
- Williams scored three rushing touchdowns against NC State. He's rushed for multiple touchdowns in three of five games this season and has scored eight touchdowns in UNC's three games this season in Kenan Stadium.
- ***Against Virginia Tech, Carter (229) and Williams (224) became the first pair of Power 5 teammates to post at least 224 yards from scrimmage since Michael Crabtree (237) and Danny Amendola (233) did it for Texas Tech in 2007.***
- Carter and Williams combined for 475 all-purpose yards against Virginia Tech. That is the most by a pair of running backs in the ACC going back at least 15 seasons.
- Carter rushed for a career-high 214 yards against Virginia Tech. He averaged a school-record 12.6 yards per carry (min. 15 attempts) to break the record of Gio Bernard, who averaged 11.4 vs. the Hokies in 2012.
- Williams also set a new career high with 169 rushing yards against VT. They are the first pair of Tar Heels to rush for 160 or more yards in the same game, and the first pair of 100-yard backs for UNC since Elijah Hood gained 220 and T.J. Logan had 100 yards vs. NC State in 2015.
- The two star backs combined to rush for 1,936 yards one year ago. Carter led the way with 1,003 yards, while Williams wasn't far behind with 933 yards of his own - both career highs.
- Carter began his senior campaign on the watch list for the Hornung Award (most versatile player) and both backs are listed on the Doak Walker Award Watch List for the top running back.

AERIAL ATTACK

- Sam Howell has thrown seven touchdown passes over the last three games, and five of the seven have gone for 25 yards or longer. In fact, four were 30+ yards in length (33, 37, 38 and 43).
- Dyami Brown, who tied the school record with 12 receiving TDs in 2019, has hauled in three touchdowns in the last three weeks from 25, 37 and 43 yards out.
- Brown's 16 career receiving TDs are tied for eighth most in program history.
- Dazz Newsome somersaulted into the end zone against Virginia Tech for his 13th career receiving TD. He also added a second career rushing TD in the win.
- Beau Corrales averaged 35.3 yards per catch at Florida State. He had a career-high 141 yards and scored his 12th career TD.
- Sam Howell completed 18 of 23 passes against Virginia Tech to register a .782 completion percentage, the best of his collegiate career.

SCORING SPREE

- Carolina ranks sixth nationally and leads the ACC with 531.2 yards per game of total offense.
- The Heels are seventh in the country and second to Virginia Tech in the league with 249 rushing yards per game.
- UNC is second in the conference to Clemson in scoring offense with 37.8 points per game.

D-FENCE

- UNC ranks fourth in the ACC in total defense (374.8) and fifth in scoring defense (25.0).
- Carolina is fourth in the league by surrendering only 128.6 yards on the ground.

SORTING OUT STATE

- ***For just the second time in school history, the Tar Heels had two rushers over 100 yards (160 by Javonte Williams, 106 by Michael Carter), a 100-yard receiver (105 by Dyami Brown) and a passer with 200 yards (252 by Sam Howell). The only other time was against Maryland in 1993 (Curtis Johnson and Leon Johnson were the rushers, Jason Stanicek the quarterback and both Bucky Brooks and Corey Holliday the receivers).***
- Carolina is 3-0 against NC State when both teams are ranked in the AP poll.
- The 27-point victory over No. 23 NC State is UNC's largest win over an AP-ranked opponent since a 38-3 win over No. 13 Clemson in 2001. This is UNC's third-largest win ever over a ranked team (also a 41-9 win over No. 6 Florida State in 2001).
- ***The Tar Heels gained 578 total yards and have posted 550-plus yards of total offense in three straight games for the first time in at least 50 years, dating back to existing records that begin in 1971.***
- Carolina rushed for 326 yards and passed for 252. NC State passed for 358, but the Tar Heel



UNC SCHEDULE NOTES

- North Carolina's 11 opponents combined for a 75-66 (.532) record in 2019.
- Eight of the 11 opponents competed in a bowl game during the 2019 campaign: Boston College (Birmingham), Charlotte (Bahamas), Florida State (Sun Bowl), Miami (Independence), Notre Dame (Camping World), Virginia (Orange), Virginia Tech (Belk) and Wake Forest (Pinstripe).
 - The Tar Heels will open the season with a home conference game for the first time since 2003 vs. Florida State.
 - Boston College: This is just the third game the Tar Heels have ever played in Chestnut Hill, Mass., and the first since a 31-13 win in 2009.
 - Florida State: UNC's first trip to Tallahassee since the last-second Nick Weiler field goal that lifted Carolina to a thrilling 37-35 win during the 2016 season.
 - Syracuse: The first visit to Kenan Stadium since the Orange joined the ACC. The last time Syracuse played in Chapel Hill was a 49-47 three-overtime classic that went to the visitors in 2003.
 - Wake Forest: After playing a non-conference game last season in Winston-Salem, 2020 marks the first time the two in-state foes will play in back-to-back seasons since 2011 and 2012.

defense allowed only 34 rushing yards.

- NC State's 34 rushing yards were the fewest allowed by the Tar Heels since holding Rutgers to one yard on Sept. 10, 2011.
- The 48 points scored by the Tar Heels were the most against NC State since 1996, when UNC produced 52.
- This marked the first time UNC has scored 40 or more points in consecutive games against NC State since 1982 (41) and 1983 (42). The Tar Heels scored 41 last season in Raleigh.
- Carolina's 34 first downs were a season-high and its possession time of 39:08 is also the best so far in 2020.

FSU FALLOUT

- It may have been Carolina's first setback of the season at Florida State, but there are still plenty of positives that came out of the game.
- UNC's defense pitched a shutout in the second half to get within 31-28, after trailing 31-7 at halftime.
- The offense managed 558 total yards with Sam Howell throwing for 374 yards, second most in his collegiate career. He had 283 yards alone after halftime.

CLOSE CALLS

- Since the return of Mack Brown to take over the program in 2019, Carolina owns a 10-7 overall record.
- All seven losses have been by seven points or less with two setbacks coming in overtime.
- Nine of Carolina's 13 games in 2019 were decided by seven points or fewer. That was the most by any team in the AP Poll era going back to 1936.
- UNC lost 43-41 in six overtimes at Virginia Tech in the longest game in ACC history.
- Carolina won 20-17 over Duke, marking the first time since 2010 that three or more wins have come by four points or less.
- UNC lost 34-27 in OT at Pitt. That marked the 4th OT game in a stretch of 16 games going back to the Syracuse game in 2018.

THROWING RECORDS OUT THE WINDOW

- Carolina and Virginia Tech flashed on offense all game long in what turned out to be a record-setting game by ACC standards on Oct. 10.
- The 101 combined points were the most ever scored in a game that featured both conference teams ranked in the AP poll.
- The 56 points were the most UNC has ever scored against an AP-ranked opponent. The previous high was 45 on three occasions (No. 17 Pitt in 1974, No. 23 Boston College in 2008 and No. 25 Duke in 2014).

HAMMERING THE HOKIES

- Carolina's 656 yards of total offense was the fifth highest total in school history and third most in an ACC game.
- The 656 yards are the second most ever allowed by Virginia Tech (Alabama gained 833 in 1973).
- UNC rushed for 399 yards, its highest total against an ACC opponent since 1988 against Duke (408) and most in any game since 1993 versus Ohio (432).

JAVONTE'S HARD TO HANDLE

- Junior RB Javonte Williams was a lightly-recruited back out of Wallace, N.C. despite rushing for over 2,000 yards and 27 TDs, while leading Wallace-Rose Hill to its fourth-straight state championship.
- In fact, his only scholarship offer was from East Carolina before UNC's staff jumped in. Not only was Williams an excellent athlete, but he was Valedictorian of his high school class.
- He produced over 5 yards after contact on 30.8% of his runs in 2019, the second-highest rate in the FBS behind only Clemson's Travis Etienne. Overall, Williams broke an impressive 56 tackles on 165 carries, according to PFF.

NO TD'S ALLOWED

- Carolina's defense did not surrender a touchdown against Syracuse in the season opener, the first time since shutting out Idaho, 66-0, on Sept. 9, 2012.
- It was also the fewest points allowed against an ACC opponent since Duke scored six on Nov. 7, 2009.

SIBLING RIVALRIES

- Carolina features a pair of brothers that have played critical roles in 2020. On offense, wide receivers Dyami Brown and Khafre Brown have combined for 31 catches, 495 receiving yards and 4 TDs. Younger brother, Khafre, scored his first collegiate TD at Boston Collegem while Dyami hauled in two against Virginia Tech and another at Florida State.
- Tomon and Tomari Fox have wreaked havoc on defense for the Tar Heels. The two standouts have totaled 7.0 sacks, 12.0 TFL and 44 tackles thus far in 2020.

WINNING THE 4Q

- Carolina picked up right where it left off in 2019 by dominating its opponents in the fourth quarter. UNC outscored Syracuse, 21-0, in the 2020 season opener on Sept. 12.
 - **For the season, Carolina is a +33 in 2020.**
- Last season, Carolina ranked third in the FBS (1st ACC) with a +69 (120-51) point differential in the fourth quarter. UNC ranked ninth worst in FBS in 2017-18 at -72.
- QB Sam Howell was 62 of 93 for 947 yards and 12 TDs (0 INTs) in the fourth quarter during his Freshman All-America season. He ranked second nationally in TD passes and third in passing yards in the fourth quarter in 2019.
 - **Howell has still yet to throw an interception in the fourth quarter in his collegiate career.**
- WR Dazz Newsome led the nation in the fourth quarter in first downs (19), second in 15+ yard receptions (11) and third in receiving yards (363).
- WRs Dyami Brown and Newsome both scored four receiving TDs in the fourth, tied for sixth in the nation.

SENIOR BOWL WATCH LIST

• Michael Carter, Dazz Newsome and Chazz Surratt have been placed on the 2021 Reese's Senior Bowl Top 250 Watch List. All three players were named All-ACC as juniors in 2019.

• After posting career high figures in rushing (1,003) and all-purpose (1,623) yards in 2019, Carter has been tabbed for the Doak Walker (top running back) and Paul Hornung Award (top versatile player) Watch Lists this fall.

• Newsome was a second-team All-ACC selection after hauling in 10 receiving touchdowns and 1,018 receiving yards, both career highs, in 2019. He is listed on the 2020 Biletnikoff Award Watch List, given annually to the season's outstanding FBS receiver.

• Surratt was the runner-up for ACC Defensive Player of the Year honors last season after recording 115 tackles in his first season at linebacker. The converted quarterback finds himself on the watch lists for the Bednarik, Butkus and Nagurski awards.

SURRATT THE LINEBACKER

• Junior Chazz Surratt made the decision at the end of the 2018 season that his best opportunity to keep playing football after college was to switch from quarterback to linebacker.

• An interesting choice from a player who once held the state of North Carolina's record for total offense. In his first game after the switch, Surratt, a Denver, N.C. product, was called upon to start against South Carolina at LB in the 2019 opener, a position he hadn't played since his freshman year of high school and hadn't played a full game at since middle school.

• Surratt went on to have a stellar 2019, finishing runner-up as ACC Defensive Player of the Year and was named first-team All-ACC.

• Entering 2020, Surratt has received plenty of buzz in the preseason. He has been named to the watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Butkus Award, Lott Trophy and Nagurski Trophy. He is also a preseason first-team All-America selection by CBS Sports, Sporting News and Street & Smith's.

SURRATT AMONG MOST EXCITING CFB PLAYERS

• Chazz Surratt is the No. 12 most exciting player in college football according to ESPN. According to ESPN staff writer Alex Scarborough, the qualifications are simple: If you can't take your eye off them, they qualify.

• The converted quarterback turned linebacker was sensational last season as a junior ranking second in the ACC with 115 tackles. Now cross-training this offseason as an edge rusher, Surratt could make an even bigger impact as a senior in 2020.

ASANTE DRAWS INSPIRATION FROM BROTHER

• Sophomore LB Eugene Asante has enjoyed a strong preseason and Mack Brown has spoken numerous times about his growth in his second season with the Tar Heels.

• In fact, his development has allowed the coaching staff to move Chazz Surratt outside as a possible edge rusher this fall.

• Asante draws inspiration from his older brother, Larry Asante, who played at Nebraska and then spent six years in the NFL, before seeing his career end in 2015 when he was cut by the Oakland Raiders.

• "His career didn't end the way me and my family dreamed of ... I need to go 110 percent because in the real world your dreams can get cut at any time."

BROWN, NEWSOME BREAK OUT IN 2019

• Dazz Newsome had a breakout year in 2019, raising his receiving grade from 67.3 to 84.7 according to Pro Football Focus. He was one of the biggest deep threats in the slot in college football, logging the most deep catches of 20-plus yards with 13 and tying for the most deep touchdowns in the slot with six. Dating back to 2018, Newsome has been one of the most elusive receivers in the college game by breaking an incredible rate of tackles after the catch (45 broken on 134 catches).

• While Newsome put up numbers in the slot, Brown did the same on the outside. Brown produced nine deep touchdowns on the outside, which trailed only LSU's Ja'Marr Chase and was three more than anyone else in the FBS in



2019. Brown was also one of the most difficult receivers to face in contested situations — Brown hauled in the 11th-best rate of contested catches at 61.9%.

WIDE RECEIVER HYPE

• According to ACC Network analyst and former Boston College star Mark Herzlich, the Tar Heels might just be the biggest threat to Clemson in the ACC this season. One reason he thinks that is the Tar Heel receiving corps.

• "UNC has the best wide receivers in the league with Dazz Newsome, Diami Brown and Beau Corrales. They are going to be unstoppable, especially with their size and their speed ... They are going to give Sam Howell a lot of outlets down the field."

AMONG MOST IMPROVED TEAMS IN 2019

• UNC finished 2019 with a 7-6 record, the program's first winning season since 2016. The seven wins was two more than the win totals of both 2017 and 2018 (5) combined.

• The Tar Heels showed an improvement of five games from 2018 (2-9) to 2019 (7-6). That was the second-best mark in the ACC behind only Louisville and tied for 10th nationally among FBS programs.

GROVES GIVEN MUSCLE MILK

MALE ATHLETE OF THE YEAR AWARD

• Wide receiver Rontavius 'Toe' Groves was awarded the Muscle Milk Male Athlete of the Year award in May 2019, presented by the Collegiate and Professional Sports Dietitians Association (CPSDA). The award recognizes one male and one female collegiate, Olympic, professional or tactical (military, police or fire) athlete whose athletic accomplishments reflect dedication to sports nutrition. Groves was nominated by Director of Sports Nutrition Kelsee Gomes.

• Through a diligent regimen of high-protein, high-carbohydrate diet supplemented with high-calorie shakes, Groves has transformed his body from a 160-pound incoming freshman to a 187-pound junior. He took advantage of UNC's nutrition program after suffering patellar tendon injuries in the spring of his redshirt freshman season (2016) and during the 2017 campaign.

KIERNAN'S DUBLIN BEGINNINGS

• Sophomore punter Ben Kiernan played his high school football at Raleigh's Wakefield High School, but he didn't arrive in the U.S. until he was 15. Kiernan spent the first decade and a half of his life in Dublin, Ireland, where he played rugby and soccer. Seeking more opportunities and better colleges, Kiernan's parents decided to move to the Raleigh area. After moving just two weeks prior to the start of the 8th grade, Kiernan's father Mike had a chance encounter with the football coach at Food Lion and he told him to have Ben try out for football, where he would punt a football for the first time.

• Kiernan's twin older brothers, Tom and Jack, played rugby at NC State.

• Kiernan's 13-year-old sister Freya is in a lifetime battle with cerebral palsy. The Kiernan's adopted Freya, who was born in China, when she was nine months old.

SAM HOWELL SUPERLATIVES

• Sam Howell's 38 passing touchdowns in 2019 were the most by a true freshman in FBS history. The previous record was 30 from Clemson's Trevor Lawrence in 2018.

• Howell's 38 touchdowns were the second most ever by an ACC freshman quarterback. Florida State's Jamies Winston threw 40 touchdown passes in 2013 as a redshirt freshman.

• Howell's 38 touchdowns were the third most in ACC history, trailing only Deshaun Watson's record 41 TD passes for Clemson in 2016 and Winston's 40 in 2013.

• Howell set the UNC single-season record with 38 touchdown passes, surpassing Mitch Trubisky's 30 in 2016.

• Howell ranked fourth nationally and led all ACC QBs with 38 passing TDs. His 3,641 passing yards led the ACC and ranked 14th nationally.

• Howell's 3,641 passing yards were the most ever by an ACC true freshman quarterback.

• Howell was second in the ACC in pass efficiency at 160.3 and third in total offense (277.4 ypg).

• Howell threw multiple touchdowns in all 13 games last year and 16 of 18 games in his career.

• Joined James Winston as the only ACC QBs in the last 15 years to throw 35+ TDs (38), throw 10 or fewer INTs (7), throw for 3,000 yards (3,641), average eight yards per attempt (8.6), and complete 60% of the passes (61.4).

• Howell had eight games in 2019 with three or more touchdown passes and 10 in his career.

• Howell's touchdown-interception ratio of plus 31 (38-7) was the best in UNC history. Mitch Trubisky was plus 24 (30/6) in 2016. Howell's plus 31 was eight better than UCF's Dillon Gabriel (+22) and nine better than USC's Kedon Slovis (+21).

• Led or tied among ACC QBs in completions of 10+ yards (154), 30+ yards (30) and 40+ yards (17).

• Tied UNC school record and set freshman record with 5 TD passes at Virginia Tech. Set UNC freshman records for completions (33) and attempts (51) at Georgia Tech and yards (401) at NC State.

• In leading Carolina to seven wins and a bowl victory in 2019, Howell won more games last season than the Tar Heels did in the two previous seasons combined (5).

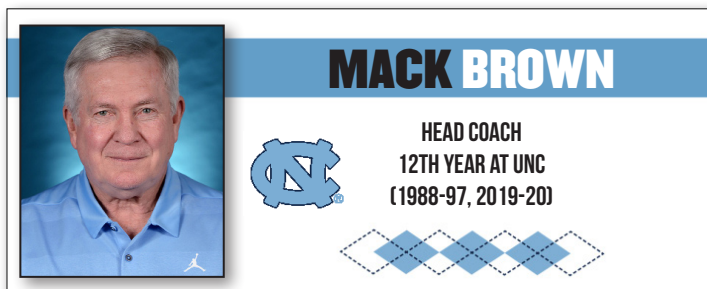

HEAD COACH MACK BROWN



Mack Brown, whose charismatic style and disciplined approach propelled the University of North Carolina to the Top Five and the University of Texas to the 2005 BCS National Championship, began his second stint as head coach in Chapel Hill on Nov. 27, 2018 with the goal of leading another Carolina resurgence.

A 42-year veteran of collegiate coaching, Brown has served as a head coach for 31 seasons with stops at Texas (1998-2013), North Carolina (1988-97, 2019), Tulane (1985-87), and Appalachian State (1983). Over his 31 seasons, Brown has posted a record of 250-128-1 (.661). Those 250 career victories rank ninth on the FBS all-time list and are the most among active coaches. The 2005 Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year and the 2008 Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year, Brown is one of a handful of coaches in college football history to lead two separate programs to Top-Five national finishes.

In his first season back at the helm at North Carolina in 2019, Brown led the Tar Heels to a 6-6 record and the Military Bowl. The six wins are one more than UNC had won in its previous two seasons combined (5) and the Heels qualified for a bowl game for the first time since 2016. Carolina played close games seemingly all season. Its nine games decided by seven points or less were the most since 1936. The Tar Heels' six losses came by a total of just 26 points and the combined records of those teams was 57-18.

At the completion of his Texas tenure in 2013, Brown was one of just four active coaches to reach the 200-victory plateau. He was also one of only two coaches nationally to lead his teams to 21 bowls in 22 seasons, and the only one to have 23 winning seasons in the previous 24 years. His 225 wins from 1990 to 2013, which combined the last eight years of his first stint at UNC and his entire Texas tenure, were the most of any coach in the country.

As a result, Brown was inducted into the National Football Foundation College Football Hall of Fame in December of 2018. He is the sixth Tar Heel to be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame and the second coach, joining innovator Carl Grey Snavelly, who was inducted in 1965. In addition to the College Football Hall of Fame, Brown is also a member of the Texas Sports Hall of Fame, the Longhorn Hall of Honor, the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame, the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame and the Holiday Bowl Hall of Fame.

MACK BROWN AND THE NFL DRAFT

- Mack Brown had a player selected in 28 straight NFL Drafts prior to 2014. In fact, Brown has had a player selected in the NFL Draft in 30 of his 31 drafts as a head coach.
- Mack Brown has coached 20 players (16 Texas/four UNC) who have been drafted in the first round in his past 18 NFL Drafts.
- Mack Brown has coached a first-round selection in 12 of his last 20 NFL Drafts.
- Mack Brown has coached 73 NFL Draft picks over his last 18 years.
- Of those 73 NFL Draft picks, 56 picks were chosen in the first four rounds.
- In 31 drafts as a head coach at North Carolina (1988-97, 2019), Texas (1998-2013), Tulane (1985-87) and Appalachian State (1983), Mack Brown has seen 110 of his former players selected in the NFL Draft.

Brown has also succeeded in preparing his student-athletes for the next level. In the 31 NFL Drafts during Brown's time as a head coach, the NFL has picked 110 of his student-athletes, and at least one was selected in 28 straight drafts. He had 20 players selected in the first round of the draft from 1998 to 2013, and three members of his 1997 Carolina squad were picked in the first round of the 1998 NFL Draft, which tied for the most of any collegiate program.

With all of the success on the field, the primary emphasis has remained the same with Brown's squads -- maintaining a high level of achievement in the classroom and in the community. Eighty percent of his players at North Carolina received their degrees and he increased the pace at Texas, while more than a third of his players at UT regularly earned 3.0 grade point averages and achieved spots on the Big 12 Commissioner's and Athletics Director's Honor Rolls.

Prior to returning to Carolina, Brown served as both a college football studio analyst and color analyst for ESPN.

Brown's first stint as head coach of the Tar Heels came from 1988-97. He led Carolina to a record of 69-46-1 (.599), which included three 10-win seasons, six consecutive bowl games, a Top-Five finish, a Top-10 finish and two Top-20 finishes.

At UNC, Brown recruited and coached several of the finest players in school history. From his 1997 squad alone, DE Greg Ellis (No. 8, Dallas Cowboys), LB Brian Simmons (No. 17, Cincinnati Bengals) and DT Vonnie Holliday (No. 19, Green Bay Packers) were selected among the first 19 picks in the 1998 NFL Draft.

Along with that trio of first-rounders, Brown also helped develop several other Tar Heel standouts. CB Dré Bly, who is currently Carolina's DBs coach, was a three-time All-American who recorded an ACC-record 20 interceptions during his career and played 11 seasons in the NFL. Corey Holliday, who currently serves as UNC's Associate A.D. for Football Ad-

ministration, finished his career as the leading receiver in Carolina history, was a CFA/Hitachi Scholar-Athlete, and is a former member of the Pittsburgh Steelers. Dwight Hollier, who currently serves as UNC's Senior Associate A.D. for Student-Athlete Health, Well-Being & Program Outreach, made more than 500 tackles during his Carolina career and also played in the NFL. RB Natrone Means, who rushed for more than 1,000 yards in his final two seasons at UNC, went on to lead the San Diego Chargers to Super Bowl XXIX and the Jacksonville Jaguars to the 1996 AFC title game.

QBs Jason Stanicek and Mike Thomas combined to rewrite Carolina's passing and total offense records. DT Marcus Jones, a consensus first-team All-American, earned ACC Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1995. CB Thomas Smith came to UNC in 1989 as a walk-on from a small high school in North Carolina and departed as a first-round pick of the AFC Champion Buffalo Bills. RB Leon Johnson, one of the premier all-purpose offensive threats in ACC history, played eight seasons in the NFL. TE Freddie Jones, a second-round draft choice of the San Diego Chargers in 1997, was one of the NFL's top pass-catching tight ends and played eight seasons in the NFL.

During his first 10 seasons at Carolina, the Tar Heels featured a Lombardi Award finalist, a two-time Thorpe Award finalist, a Butkus Award finalist and semifinalist, 16 All-Americans, 34 first-team All-ACC selections,

an ACC Defensive Player of the Year and an ACC Rookie of the Year. Brown also helped his players with professional aspirations as 38 of his Tar Heels heard their names called in the NFL Draft, including 16 in the first three rounds. In addition to the three first-rounders in 1998, Marcus Jones (Tampa Bay Buccaneers '96) and Thomas Smith (Buffalo Bills '93) were first-round selections; Freddie Jones (San Diego Chargers '97), Rick Terry (New York Jets '97), Bucky Brooks (Buffalo Bills '94) and Natrone Means (San Diego Chargers '93) were second-round picks; and James Hamilton (Jacksonville Jaguars '97), William Henderson (Green Bay Packers '95), Jimmy Hitchcock (New England Patriots '95), Rondell Jones (Denver Broncos '93), Brian Bollinger (San Francisco 49ers '92), Kevin Donnalley (Houston Texans '91) and Darrell Hamilton (Denver Broncos '89) were chosen in the third round.

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. (AP) — Javonte Williams ran for three fourth-quarter touchdowns and No. 18 North Carolina overcame a mistake-filled performance to beat Syracuse 31-6 on Saturday in the season opener for both teams.

Michael Carter added 138 yards of total offense for the Tar Heels (1-0, 1-0 Atlantic Coast Conference), who won in an empty home stadium after the school opted to open with no fans in attendance due to the coronavirus pandemic.

The Tar Heels opened with a touchdown drive only to sputter well into the third quarter in a performance plagued by turnovers and penalties. But they gradually settled into a rhythm, looking much more like the team expected to be a contender in the ACC race.

By the fourth quarter, they were rolling, with Williams scoring from 1 yard out on the first play of the period followed by a 6-yard score on the next drive. And by the time he bounced off a tackler and scored on another 6-yard run, the Tar Heels had turned a 10-6 lead into a 25-point margin.

Syracuse's offense did little well, generating little from its running game unless it came on quarterback Tommy DeVito scrambling to keep plays alive. But DeVito completed just 13 of 31 passes for 112 yards while taking seven sacks, as the Orange (0-1, 0-1) finished with 202 total yards.

CHESTNUT HILL, MASS.—Sam Howell threw for two touchdowns and Trey Morrison scored after intercepting the potential tying 2-point conversion with 45 seconds left on Saturday to lead No. 12 North Carolina to a 26-22 victory over Boston College.

With the cancellation of one game because of the virus and a scheduled off week leaving North Carolina idle since Sept. 12, the Tar Heels (2-0, 2-0 Atlantic Coast Conference) sent BC (2-1, 1-1) to its first loss under new coach Jeff Hafley.

Howell completed 14 of 26 passes for 225 yards, including a 41-yard score to Javonte Williams that gave Carolina a 21-13 lead with just over a minute left in the first half. Williams ran for 57 yards and caught two passes for 56, and Michael Carter carried 16 times for 121 yards for the Tar Heels.

UNC led 24-16 with just under six minutes left before Phil Jurkovec drove BC into Tar Heels territory and completed three passes in the end zone. The first two were negated by penalties, but a 6-yard pass to C.J. Lewis made it a two-point game with 45 seconds left, with the 2-point conversion to come.

Jurkovec scrambled and threw to the end zone, but Morrison picked him off and ran down the left sideline for the rare defensive 2-point conversion.

Jurkovec completed 37 of 56 passes for 313 yards and two touchdowns, hitting tight end Hunter Long nine times for 96 yards. Boston College, which led the ACC in rushing last year behind A.J. Dillon's third straight 1,000-yard season, totaled just 40 yards rushing.

The Eagles traded field goals for touchdowns most of the game but still had a chance after forcing a 47-yard field goal attempt that Grayson Atkins missed wide to the left with 5:46 to play. Jurkovec connected on a 10-yard pass to Lewis, who was called for offensive pass interference, and later a 22-yard strike to Long that was negated by a holding call.

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. (AP) — Michael Carter ran for a career-high 214 yards and two touchdowns -- including a 62-yarder midway through the fourth quarter -- to help eighth-ranked North Carolina beat No. 19 Virginia Tech 56-45 on Saturday.

The Tar Heels (3-0, 3-0 Atlantic Coast Conference) leaned on a dominating running game. Javonte Williams also ran for a career-best 169 yards and two scores of his own, with both backs finding gaping lanes and weaving through defenders to keep the chains moving on the way to 399 yards on the ground.

UNC said it was only the second time in program history that the Tar Heels had seen two players crack the 150-yard mark in the same game, the other coming 39 years earlier.

Throw in Sam Howell's three touchdown passes, and UNC finished with its highest scoring output ever against the Hokies along with 656 total yards -- the No. 2 total ever posted against Virginia Tech's defense, which was severely depleted in the secondary.

Carter's huge run around the right side with 8:49 left finally gave the Tar Heels some cushion after they had seen the Hokies rally from a 42-17 deficit early in the third quarter to make it a one-possession game entering the fourth quarter.

Khalil Herbert ran for 138 yards and two touchdowns for Virginia Tech (2-1, 2-1), which again played shorthanded due to a combination of coronavirus and injury issues. Hendon Hooker, a returning starting quarterback who had yet to play this year, threw for two scores and ran for another.

This was UNC's first home game since Gov. Roy Cooper announced the state would ease public-gathering restrictions related to the pandemic by allowing schools to fill 7% of their stadium capacity for fans. That cleared the way for 3,535 fans scattered about the 50,500-seat Kenan Stadium.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — Jordan Travis ran for two touchdowns and threw a scoring pass to help Florida State build a big first-half lead, and the Seminoles held off No. 5 North Carolina 31-28 on Saturday night.

Travis guided an offensive that generated 434 yards for Florida State (2-3, 1-3 Atlantic Coast Conference), but was shut out in the second half.

North Carolina quarterback Sam Howell led three second-half touchdown drives to pull to 31-28, but the Tar Heels (3-1, 3-1) had drops on third and fourth down in the final seconds to end the comeback bid.

The Seminoles gave coach Mike Norvell a signature victory in his first season in Tallahassee following a shaky start that included a blowout loss at Miami.

Travis, a redshirt sophomore, completed 8 of 19 passes for 191 yards and ran 16 times for 107 yards as the Seminoles jumped out to a 31-7 halftime lead, the most dominating performance for the program in recent memory. What followed was a nail-biting second half as the Tar Heels mounted a comeback attempt.

Howell completed 20 of 36 yards for 374 yards against the Seminoles, whom he was committed to for about six months in 2018 before signing with North Carolina just weeks after Mack Brown was hired.

North Carolina was 13th in FBS in third-down conversions (51%) coming into the game, but the Tar Heels were just 2 of 11 on third-down conversions and 0 for 3 on fourth-down tries.

Florida State ran for a season-high 241 yards on 36 carries. La'Damian Webb had 109 yards on 12 carries.

The win was the Seminoles' first over an AP Top 25 team since Boston College on Nov. 17 2018. Florida State's last win over a Top 10 team was No. 6 Michigan in the Orange Bowl on Dec. 30, 2016.

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. (AP) — Javonte Williams ran for 160 yards and three touchdowns to help No. 14 North Carolina beat No. 23 North Carolina State 48-21 in Saturday's renewal of the longtime state rivalry.

Michael Carter ran for 106 yards and a score of his own for the Tar Heels (4-1, 4-1 Atlantic Coast Conference), who used a run-through-and-over-tacklers ground game that helped them take control in the third quarter.

"I said it earlier in the year and they reinforce it every week: I think they're probably the best combination of two backs in the country," UNC coach Mack Brown said, adding: "When we get them going, the rest of it works."

UNC ran for 326 yards and finished with 578 overall, bouncing back from an upset loss at Florida State to beat the Wolfpack (4-2, 4-2) by a lopsided margin for the second straight season.

Williams had three touchdowns in last year's 41-10 win, then had a pair of short TD runs as UNC ran off 21 straight points after leading just 17-7 at halftime. He punctuated another big rivalry performance by blowing through a huge hole up front, then cutting past multiple defenders to the pylon for a 27-yard score that made it 45-14 with 14:11 left.

Sam Howell threw for 252 yards and a TD for the Tar Heels, while Dymari Brown had 105 yards on a career-best seven catches.

The Wolfpack had little go right offensively in the first game without injured starting quarterback Devin Leary. Bailey Hockman started but was pulled after three series for true freshman Ben Finley, only to see the Wolfpack go back to Hockman in the third after Finley threw two interceptions — one off a bobbled pass by Dylan Parham in the end zone that should've been a first-half touchdown -- and lost a fumble on a sack.

Finley threw for 143 yards and a 42-yard score to Emeke Emezie, while Hockman scored on a short keeper and threw for a TD after returning with the Tar Heels up big. But N.C. State managed just 34 yards rushing and had four turnovers.

"We just didn't play good enough to win, didn't give ourselves a chance with the turnovers," Wolfpack coach Dave Doeren said. "Like I told them in the locker room, if you don't stop the run and you turn the football over, it's a really hard day. And that's what happened today."

This was the first meeting with both teams ranked in the AP Top 25 since 1993.
