



FIELD HOCKEY

NOTING VIRGINIA

- Virginia is trying to snap a five-game losing streak after suffering back-to-back sweeps against UNC and Louisville and then a 2-0 loss at Duke to close out the fall regular-season
- The 2-0 loss at Duke was the first time this season that the Cavaliers failed to score a goal in a game. UVA suffered two shutouts last season, both were 1-0 losses to Boston College
- Sophomore striker **Laura Janssen** leads the team in goals scored with five, two of which were game winners. Both game winners were scored in the final minutes of previously scoreless games. She scored the game-winner with 3:10 left in the ACC contest against Wake Forest and with 1:24 remaining in the first Syracuse game, also an ACC game
- Janssen has scored a goal in three of the last five games
- Janssen's five goals is tied for third-most in the ACC. Her 10 points is also tied for third
- Janssen leads the team in shooting efficiency, scoring her five goals on 12 shots (.417), nine of those attempts were on goal
- Junior back **Amber Ezechiels** leads the team in assists with four. She is in a six-way tie for second in the ACC in that stat
- Ezechiels also has scored two goals this season, both in the 3-2 double overtime victory over Syracuse. Her eight points ranks second on the team
- Freshman **Anneloes Knol** scored her first career goal in the finale of the UNC series. Knol tied the game 1-1 with a strike in the third quarter against the Tar Heels. Prior to netting that goal, Knol had three shots that appeared to be goals overturned upon review
- Knol has started every game this season for the Cavaliers, the only UVA freshman to do so
- Sophomore midfielder **Adele Iacobucci** has scored the remainder of the Cavaliers' goals (3). Last season, she scored one goal with an assist

TEAM CAPTAINS

- Seniors **Makayla Gallen** and **Rachel Robinson** are this year's team captains
- This is Robinson's third season serving as a team captain

ROOKIES

- Midfielder **Anneloes Knol** has started every game this season, the only UVA freshman to do so and one of just five total UVA players
- Three other first-years have been in at least one starting lineup: twin sisters **Lilly** (striker) and **Meghen Hengerer** (midfielder) and striker **Xas Morgan**. All three have appeared in every game this season
- The Hengerer twins are from New Jersey, but lived in Ireland during their middle school year. Morgan was born in Durban, South Africa, is a dual American/South African citizen. She also lived three years in the Netherlands, but went to high school near Chicago
- Striker **Mary VanLoh** has played in five games this season
- All eight of the Cavalier freshmen saw playing time in the opening weekend's games against Wake Forest

GOALIES

- The Virginia goalkeeping tandem of **Lauren Hausheer** and **Taylor Henriksen** lead the ACC with a combined 49 saves this season. Syracuse has the second-most saves with 32
- The two combined for an ACC-best 10 saves in the opener against North Carolina
- Hausheer followed that with seven saves against UNC in the finale, one shy of a career high. She logged six saves in the Saturday game against Louisville
- Henriksen started the first five games of the season, Hausheer (a preseason All-ACC honoree) has started the last four
- Henriksen is averaging 5.0 saves per game, second highest in the conference. She has two shutouts this season
- Henriksen had one career save coming into this season. She now has 30
- Henriksen was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 29) and the NFCA Play Safe National Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 30) after UVA's games against Wake Forest
- Henriksen made nine saves in the opener in what was just the second start of her career. She went on to pick up her first win and her first shutout in Sunday's 1-0 victory
- Both goalies are enrolled in UVA's prestigious McIntire School of Commerce, majoring in commerce
- Hausheer is pursuing two concentrations (Marketing and IT) and two tracks (Business Analytics and Strategic Brand Consulting) as well as a psych minor (note: concentrations are the school's equivalent of a major and tracks are like minors)

ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

- Virginia is looking for its second ACC title. The team won its first (and only) in 2016. That year, UVA was the six seed in the tournament, becoming the lowest-ever seed to win the ACC Field Hockey Championship
- Last season, the Cavaliers made the ACC semifinals before falling to host BC, 1-0, in overtime
- Makayla Gallen and Greer Gill were named to the 2019 All-Tournament team

WAKE FOREST MATCH UP

- Virginia and Wake Forest (3-7, 2-4) split their two games this season with Wake winning the non-conference contest, 2-1, and UVA taking the ACC game 1-0
- Wake Forest has played the most games this fall (10) while UVA has played the second-most (9)
- The two teams have the two lowest goals-per-game averages in the ACC with Wake at 1.40 and UVA with 1.22 per game
- The Demon Deacons have a conference-low .563 save percentage. UVA's goalies are stopping 71.0 percent of the shots they face
- Virginia leads the all-time series 27-19 and had won six-straight in the match-up prior to its loss in this year's opener

PRESEASON ALL-ACC

- Virginia had a league-high three players named to the Preseason All-ACC team, all three of whom are on the defense
- A pair of 2019 NFHCA All-American backs, senior **Rachel Robinson** (first team) and junior **Amber Ezechiels** (second team), both of whom were also all-conference players last season, earned the preseason accolade
- Junior goalkeeper **Lauren Hausheer** was also named to the preseason All-ACC team. This is her first time earning a conference accolade (other than a defensive player of the week nod)

HOW WE SPENT OUR SOCIAL DISTANCING

- **Lauren Hausheer** had a virtual internship at Prince Michel Vineyard and Winery in their marketing department
- **Taylor Henriksen** began a foodie Instagram account called taylor_likes_brussels_sprouts
- **Makayla Gallen** and **Amber Ezechiels** have been fostering animals from the Charlottesville SPCA since coming back to town. They started off with four kittens and then moved on to a dog

HEAD COACH MICHELE MADISON

- Head coach **Michele Madison** is in her 15th season at Virginia and her 32nd overall as a head coach
- Madison is a member of the National Field Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame and was named the 2017 ACC Coach of the Year
- She has a career record of 415-251-8 (.626 win percentage) and a 204-106 (.666 win percentage) record at UVA
- Her 415 wins is sixth most among active DI coaches and ranks 8th overall
- She picked up her 400th career win on Sept. 20, 2019 at Syracuse
- Madison picked up her 200th win at the helm of the Cavaliers in the NCAA first round victory over Delaware
- Madison is one of only two active Division I head coaches to be a part of two United States Olympic staffs, having worked as a manager with the 1988 Olympic Team in Seoul and served as the head goalkeeper coach with the 1996 squad in Atlanta

MEET THE VETERANS

- The Cavaliers have three “fourth-years” (as they are called at the University of Virginia) anchoring the squad
- **Lauren Hausheer** is a junior in eligibility, but is a fourth-year student at the University after redshirting the 2018-19 season (what would have been her sophomore year)
- Last season was her first year as a starter in goal after appearing in just eight games her freshman season, though she made 19 saves on 20 shots on goal for a .950 save percentage her freshman year
- She comes into the season with a .781 career save percentage with seven shutouts
- She is a member of the US U-21 team
- Striker **Makayla Gallen** has appeared in every game for the Cavaliers since her freshman year.
- Gallen comes into the season with 13 goals, 11 assists and 37 points in her career
- **Rachel Robinson** was named the 2019 ACC Field Hockey Scholar-Athlete of the Year as a junior. The kinesiology major has twice been named as the seventh player in program history to be named the ACC Field Hockey Scholar-Athlete of the Year, but the first to do so since Lori Mastropietro in 1998

FRESHMAN CLASS

- The Cavaliers have eight freshmen on this year’s team: Emily Graeff (Phoenixville, Pa.), Anneloes Knol (Utrecht, Netherlands), Esha Shah (Ellicott City, Md.), Alexandra Morgan (Winnetka, Ill.), Lilly Hengerer (Bedminster, N.J.), Meghan Hengerer (Bedminster, N.J.), Gery Schnarrs (Camp Hill, Pa.) and Mary VanLoh (Houston, Tex.)
- “Overall, I am very excited about this talented incoming class,” Michele Madison said. “They possess, at different levels, the things we value at UVA: a strong skill set, potential top-speed play and connectivity with teammates. I really think we have eight glue players, players who compete and play to make the team better. They seem to be extremely coachable. We will see how they cope when they are challenged to play out of their comfort zone, which is where all the mistakes and growth happens.”

NFHCA RANKINGS

- The Cavaliers were ranked No. 4 in the final NFHCA Coaches’ Poll (which comes out before the NCAA tournament). UVA was the No. 3 seed in the NCAA Championship field
- The Cavaliers were ranked in the top-10 in the final eight polls of the year. The Cavaliers started the season ranked No. 11 in the NFHCA rankings
- Virginia has been ranked in the top-25 every single week since the 2012 preseason poll

2019 SEASON

- Virginia is coming off a season that saw the team return to the NCAA semifinals for the first time since 2010 (fifth time overall after making back-to-back trips in 1997 and 1998 and again in 2009 and 2010)
- Virginia's season came to a close with a 2-1 loss to Princeton in the semifinals. UVA has lost to Princeton each of the last four years in the NCAA Championship, twice in the first round, including a double-overtime loss in 2017, and on a last-second goal in the 2016 quarterfinals. All four games were decided by a single goal
- The Cavaliers finished 2019 strong, winning 10 of their last 12 games. Their losses were falling in overtime to Boston College, 1-0, in the semifinals of the ACC Championship, and the season-ending 2-1 loss to Princeton in the Final Four
- The Cavaliers had one of the stingiest defenses in the nation in 2019, ranking fifth in NCAA I by allowing just 1.06 goals per game. North Carolina is the only ACC team ranked higher with a 1.04 goals-against average
- Junior goalkeeper **Lauren Hausheer** had a conference-best 1.00 goals-against average last season, which ranked third in the nation. She was second in the ACC with a .744 save percentage, trailing only Sarah Dwyer of BC
- Virginia has had 12 different players score goals last season. It was a well-rounded offense that did not have a single player in double-digits for goals scored
- The 2020 team returns three of the top four goal scorers: sophomore back **Cato Geusgens** (team-high 8 goals last season) and strikers **Laura Janssen** (7) and **Makayla Gallen** (6). Janssen had a team-best shooting percentage, scoring her 7 goals on 18 shots (14 shots on goal)

SENIOR NATIONAL TEAM MEMBERS

- **Rachel Robinson** was named to the roster of the 2020 U.S. Women's National Team, by USWNT head coach Caroline Nelson-Nichols in January (Jan. 10). She has yet to earn her first international cap
- **Annie McDonough** and **Makayla Gallen** are members of the U.S. Women's National Indoor Team
- Both traveled in January to compete in the Rohrmax Cup, in Vienna, Austria
- McDonough is a veteran of the U.S. Women's Indoor Team, having been a member of the squad during its gold medal run at the 2017 Pan American Championships. Six months before joining the Cavaliers, she traveled to Berlin, Germany to play for Team USA in the 2018 Indoor Hockey World Cup

JUNIOR NATIONAL TEAM MEMBERS

- **Greer Gill** and **Lauren Hausheer** are members of the US U21 team
- **Danielle Husar** is a member of the Canadian U21 Junior National Team
- All three are hoping to play in next year's Junior Pan Am Games. The Junior Pan Am's field hockey tournament, which will feature a pool of qualifying teams, was originally slated to be played in early December of 2020 in Santiago, Chile, but has since been moved back to April 12-25, 2021. The tournament will also be a U-22 competition in order to make sure that those who should have played this year but will have aged out by next still have an opportunity to represent their nations

USWNT DEVELOPMENT TEAM

- **Rachel Dawson** is the head coach of the US Women's National Development Team

TEAM RISE

- **Xas Morgan** is on the USA Field Hockey Rise Women's National Team (basically the U19 team)
- **Ole Keusgen** is the head coach of the US squad, a position he has held since 2019

ASSISTANT COACH MINI BIOS

- **Ole Keusgen** is in his sixth season at Virginia
- Keusgen is in his fourth season working with the USA Field Hockey Junior High Performance Program. He was the head coach of the 2018 U19 team and has been leading the US Rise Women's National Team since 2019
- Keusgen has been playing field hockey since the age of six, including playing professionally in Germany with one of the most successful field hockey clubs in European history, Uhlenhorst Mülheim, winning the German Indoor championship in 2015 and the Euro Indoor Club Cup in 2015
- **Rachel Dawson** is in her fourth season at Virginia. She joined the coaching staff after retiring from the USWNT after the Rio Olympics
- Dawson was a three-time Olympian, competing in Beijing in 2008 and London in 2012 and helped lead the Americans to a fifth-place showing at the Rio 2016 Olympic Games
- Dawson has 298 international caps
- Dawson played at North Carolina and earned the 2007 Honda Award as the National Player of the Year for field hockey and was selected as one of the five finalists for the Honda-Broderick Cup as the nation's top collegiate female athlete
- Dawson was the 2007 ACC Defensive Player of the Year and the 2007 ACC Tournament MVP
- Dawson made her USA Field Hockey coaching debut in 2019-20, serving as an assistant coach for the US Women's National Development Team. She is now the head coach of the team

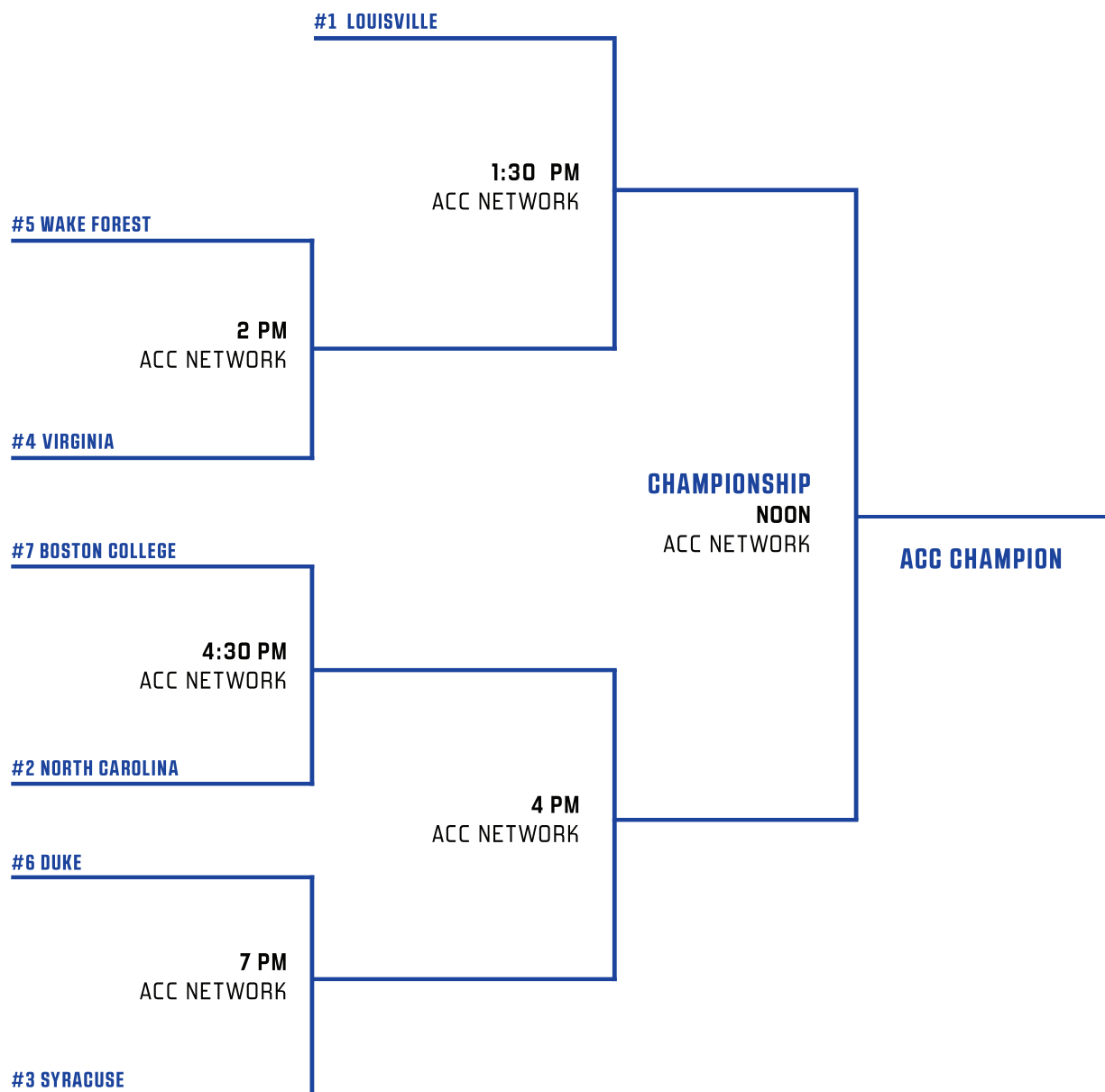

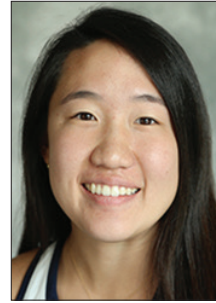
