Louisville Travels to Charlottesville to Face Virginia

◆ The University of Louisville football team hits the road for the first time in two weeks when the Cardinals face Virginia on Saturday at 8 p.m. on the ACC Network.

◆ Playing short-handed, the Cardinals dropped to 2-5 overall and 1-5 in the ACC with a 42-35 loss at home to Virginia Tech. The Cardinals announced prior to the game that nine defensive players were unavailable for the game against the Hokies.

◆ Running back **Javian Hawkins** recorded 17 carries for 129 yards and a touchdown in the loss to the Hokies. It was the 12th 100-yard rushing game of Hawkins' career, tied for the third most in Louisville history.

◆ Hawkins recorded a 90-yard touchdown run right before the half to cut the Hokies' lead to 21-14. It was the longest rush by a UofL player since a 91-yard run by Howard Stevens in 1971. Hawkins moved into 10th place on the school's all-time rushing list with 2,355 yards, passing Victor Anderson.

◆ Quarterback **Malik Cunningham** closed out the day 23-for-35 for a career-high 350 yards and three touchdowns. He became the 14th Louisville quarterback to surpass 4,000 passing yards for his career.

◆ He recorded the third 300-yard passing game of the season and his career, becoming the 12th Louisville quarterback with at least three games of 300 yards

◆ Linebacker **C.J. Avery** led the Cardinals with 10 tackles on the afternoon. It was the third double-digit tackle game of the season for Avery and the fifth of his career. The native of Grenada, Miss., set a career-high with two tackles for loss on Saturday.

Key Storylines

◆ Hawkins has rushed for 303 yards in the last two games, recording over 100-yards in back-to-back games after running for 129 yards and a touchdown in a loss to Virginia Tech. The 5-foot-9 running back needs 178 yards to become the first UofL back to rush for 1,000 yards in consecutive seasons since Calvin Prince in 1976 and 1977. Hawkins moved into 10th place on Louisville's career rushing list with 2,355 yards, passing Victor Anderson.

Cunningham moved into seventh place on Louisville's career touchdown passes list with 38, tied with Stefan LeFors and Jeff Brohm
- ◆ Wide receiver **Dez Fitzpatrick** went for a career-high 158 yards on five catches against Virginia Tech. Fitzpatrick's 82-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter was the longest catch of his career. The reception was tied for the ninth-longest passing play in program history.
- ◆ With the touchdown, he moved into fifth all-time at Louisville with 20 career scoring receptions.
- ◆ Wide receiver **Tutu Atwell** closed out with eight catches for 78 yards in the loss to Virginia Tech. The Miami, Fla., native moved into ninth on Louisville's career receiving yards list with 2,210. He leads the Cardinals with 40 receptions for 528 yards and five scores.
- ◆ Tight end **Marshon Ford** had two receptions for 37 yards and a touchdown. The Louisville, Ky., has a touchdown catch in five of the seven games this season. He moved into fourth place all-time at Louisville for touchdown catches by a tight end with 12.
- ◆ Linebacker **C.J. Avery** continues to lead the Cardinals in tackles after recording 10 tackles in the loss to Virginia Tech. It was the third double-digit tackle game of the season for Avery and the fifth of his career. The senior also set a career-high with two tackles for loss on Saturday.
- ◆ The Cardinals recorded 548 yards of total offense in the loss to Virginia Tech, the third time this season and the second-consecutive week the Cardinals recorded over 500 yards of total offense. It's the second time Louisville went over 500 yards in a loss this season. Louisville has gone over the 500-yard mark in eight of the 20 games in the Scott Satterfield era.
- ◆ Louisville averaged 8.4 yards per play on Saturday, one week after averaging 9.3 per play against Florida State. The Cardinals have amassed 1,117 yards of offense over the last two weeks, averaging 8.9 yards per play.
- ◆ Louisville allowed just one third-down conversion on Saturday (1-of-7), the fewest third down conversions allowed by the Cardinals since the 2016 season opener against Charlotte (0-for-13).

SERIES HISTORY: VIRGINIA

- ◆ Louisville and Virginia will meet for the ninth time when the two teams square off on Saturday. The Cardinals own a 5-3 series advantage.
- ◆ Virginia holds a 3-1 advantage over the Cardinals in Charlottesville, winning 27-3 in Louisville's last visit during the 2018 campaign. The Cardinals played their first ACC road game in the league in 2014 — a 23-21 win for the Cavaliers.
- ◆ Louisville's only win at Virginia came in 2016 when Lamar Jackson hit Jaylen Smith with a touchdown pass in the closing seconds for a 32-25 win.
- ◆ The Cardinals hold a 4-0 lead over the Cavaliers in Louisville.
- ◆ Head coach Scott Satterfield is 1-0 against Virginia after a 28-21 win at home last season.

LAST TIME VERSUS VIRGINIA TECH

- ◆ Micale Cunningham and Javian Hawkins accounted for two touchdowns apiece, including one each in the fourth quarter, and Louisville made a final defensive stand to hold off Virginia 28-21 on Saturday.
- ◆ The Cardinals (5-3, 3-2 Atlantic Coast Conference) converted a late third-quarter fumble recovery into Cunningham's 25-yard scoring run with 14:22 remaining for a 21-14 lead. Hawkins added a 17-yard TD with 2:46 left for a two-touchdown cushion that proved critical as the Cavaliers (5-3, 3-2) made a last charge.
- ◆ Bryce Perkins' 4-yard scoring pass to Tavares Kelly made it 28-21 with 21 seconds left, and Virginia recovered the onside kick two seconds later at the Louisville 41. The Cavs managed just one more yard, and Perkins' deep pass to the end zone fell incomplete in the rain as time expired.
- ◆ Cunningham's shovel pass to Tutu Atwell went for a 77-yard TD and a 7-7 tie. Hawkins also had a 2-yard TD run as the Cardinals outgained Virginia 360-311 on a cool, soggy day. With the Cardinals' 2016 Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback Lamar Jackson in attendance for homecoming, Louisville moved within a game of becoming bowl eligible after finishing 2-10 last season.
- ◆ Virginia's Wayne Taulapapa rushed for two touchdowns while Perkins completed 24 of 41 passes for 233 yards with an interception. But the Cavs lost for the third time in four games and missed a chance to stay firmly atop the ACC's Coastal Division.

LOUISVILLE IN THE RANKINGS

- ◆ Louisville has played 107 games while being ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 (Top 20 prior to 1989). Louisville is 79-28-0 in those games (.752).
- ◆ The Cardinals will be facing their fourth ranked opponent on the season, losing the first games by a total of 21 points — 47-34 to No. 17 Miami; 23-20 to No. 21 Pitt and 12-7 to No. 4 Notre Dame. It's only the third time in school history that the Cardinals have played four ranked opponents in a season — 1993 and 2006.
- ◆ The Cardinals have played 22 games in its football history when UofL and the opponent were both ranked in the Top 25. Louisville has a record of 8-14 in those games, including 3-2 at home. The Cardinals are 3-10 in regular season games when both teams are ranked in the Top 25.
- ◆ Head coach Scott Satterfield is 3-12 all-time versus ranked opponents, going 2-7 at Appalachian State and 1-5 at Louisville. The Cardinals have faced three ranked opponents this season, losing to No. 17 Miami 47-34, falling 23-20 to No. 21 Pittsburgh, and 12-7 to No. 4 Notre Dame.
- ◆ The Cardinals cracked the Associated Press Poll for the first time since Oct. 1, 2017 before dropping out of the polls after a 39-25 loss to NC State.
- ◆ Louisville's record against teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 (Top 20 prior to 1989) at game time is 17-59-1 (.233). This includes records of 8-16-0 (.333) at home, 4-35-1 (.118) at road sites, 0-2 (.000) at non-bowl game neutral sites, 5-8 (.385) at all neutral sites, and 6-26-1 (.197) against teams ranked in the top 10. Louisville is 4-16 against teams ranked in the top five of the polls.

CARDINALS HISTORY IN ACC

- ◆ The Cardinals are 3-4 all-time in ACC openers after the loss to Miami, including a 1-2 mark at home. Louisville defeated Miami 31-13 in its first league game in 2014, but dropped a game to Clemson to open the 2015 league schedule.
- ◆ The Cardinals are 11-16 on the road since joining the league in 2014, but have lost their last three league games on the road. The Cardinals are 16-11 at home since becoming members seven years ago.
- ◆ The Cardinals are 27-27 in their seven years in the ACC.

NOTING THE VIRGINIA TECH GAME

- ◆ Louisville went over 500 yards of offense for the second consecutive game, finishing with 548 in the loss. The Cardinals have totaled over 500 yards in back-to-back games for the second time under Scott Satter-

- ♦ UofL outgained Virginia Tech 548-466 despite the loss. The Cardinals have outgained the opposition in three of the five losses this season
- ♦ Louisville averaged 8.4 yards per play on Saturday, one week after averaging 9.3 per play against Florida State. The Cardinals have amassed 1,117 yards of offense over the last two weeks, averaging 8.9 yards per play.
- ♦ The Cardinals entered the day tied for the national lead with five plays of 60 yards or more and were tied for second with two plays of 70 or more. Louisville hit on touchdowns of 82 and 90 yards to add to both totals on Saturday.
- ♦ The Louisville defense registered three sacks in the loss, its fourth game this season with at least three sacks.
- ♦ Louisville allowed just one third-down conversion on Saturday (1-of-7), the fewest third down conversions allowed by the Cardinals since the 2016 season opener against Charlotte (0-for-13).

- ♦ With his 82-yard touchdown pass to Fitzpatrick, he became the first Louisville quarterback to have four touchdown passes of at least 75 yards in his career.
- ♦ Running back **Javian Hawkins** rushed for 129 yards and a touchdown, while catching five passes for 42 yards and a score versus Virginia Tech. Hawkins moved into 10th place on Louisville's career rushing list with 2,355 yards, passing Victor Anderson. The reception was tied for the ninth-longest passing play in program history. With the touchdown, he moved into fifth all-time at Louisville with 20 career scoring receptions.

- ◆ Five of Satterfield's assistants never coached with him until coming to Louisville in 2019 — Cort Dennison, Norval McKenzie, Gunter Brewer, ShaDon Brown, and Nicholson.

SATTERFIELD NAMES FIVE CAPTAINS

- ◆ Head coach Scott Satterfield tabbed captains for the 2020 season, picking three players on offense and a pair on defense. Quarterback **Micale Cunningham**, wide receiver **Dez Fitzpatrick**, and tight end **Marshon Ford** were named on offense.
- ◆ Linebackers **C.J. Avery** and **Dorian Ethridge** were picked as the leaders of the defense.

THE ONLY ONE

- ◆ Running back **Javian Hawkins** has been one of the best big-play backs in the nation over the last couple of seasons, and it's definitely been on display in 2020. With his 90-yard run right before the half against Virginia Tech, Hawkins became the only player in the country with three runs of 70 or more yards this season. Including his 90-yard run, he also added a 75-yard score versus Pitt and a 70-yarder in a win over Florida State.
- ◆ Entering this weekend, Hawkins is third in the country with 22 runs of 10+ yards and owns 65 of them over the last two seasons. He also stands fourth nationally with eight rushes of 20+ yards and tied for 3rd with four rushes of 30+ yards and three of 40+. Over the last two seasons, Hawkins owns 13 rushes for 30 or more yards and 11 of 40 or more.
- ◆ Hawkins is tied for first nationally with three rushes of 60 or more yards and has four of them in the last 20 games.
- ◆ The Titusville, Fla., native is ranked 20th with an average of 5.97 yards per carry.

2,000-YARD RUSHER AND A PAIR OF 2,000-YARD RECEIVERS

- ◆ The Cardinals have a ton of firepower on offense, and it's evident by having a running back who has rushed for over 2,000 yards and a pair of receivers who have reached the 2,000-yard plateau as well. Running back **Javian Hawkins** has rushed for 2,355 yards and scored 16 touchdowns in just 24 career games, while wide receiver **Tutu Atwell** has caught 134 passes for 2,210 yards and 19 touchdowns and **Dez Fitzpatrick** has added 133 receptions for 2,199 yards and 20 touchdowns.
- ◆ The trio has combined to record 6,764 yards and 58 touchdowns while in a UofL uniform. Hawkins has averaged 98.1 yards per game in his career, recording 12 100-yard games during his career. Atwell, who has played in 31 career contests, has averaged 71.3 yards per game during his career, while Fitzpatrick has averaged 48.9 yards per game.

THE NUMBER IS 30

- ◆ In his seven seasons as a head coach, Scott Satterfield's teams are 50-5 when scoring 30 or more points after losing to Virginia Tech 42035. The Cardinals dropped a 47-34 decision to Miami on Sept. 19 — the first loss when scoring 30 or more points since a 45-38 decision at No. 9 Penn State in 2018 when Satterfield was at Appalachian State. Satterfield's teams have won 38 of the last 42 games when his team's score 30 or more points in a game.

giving Satterfield the eighth-straight season with a 1,000-yard rusher. The sophomore, with 820 yards and four games remaining, is on pace to make it eight years in a row.

- ◆ Including Hawkins in 2019, Satterfield's Appalachian State teams accomplished the feat in consecutive years from 2013-2018. Before taking the Louisville job, Darrynton Evans ran for 1,197 yards in 2018. Jalin Moore did it in back-to-back seasons in 2016 and 2017.
- ◆ Marcus Cox was a four-time 1,000-yard rusher for Satterfield, achieving the feat in 2013-2016. Satterfield produced two 1,000-yard rushers in 2016.
- ◆ Satterfield's six FBS seasons of producing a 1,000-yard rusher is second to Navy's Ken Niumatalolo and is tied with Utah's Kyle Whittingham.
- ◆ In his first five seasons as an FBS head coach, Satterfield's teams ranked in the top 25 in rushing all five seasons — averaging over 200 yards in all five years.
- ◆ In his final season at Appalachian State, the Mountaineers averaged 240.38 yards per game to finish 14th nationally, totaling 31 scores on the ground.

NEW LINE, WHO DIS

- ◆ After the departure of offensive linemen Mekhi Becton and Tyler Haycraft, the Louisville' offensive line has a new look, but still has some familiar faces. Guard **Caleb Chandler** has started 20-straight games dating back to the 2019 campaign. Bell is the elder statesmen of the unit having started 30 games during his career.
- ◆ Center **Cole Bentley**, who took over during the latter part of the season, has started 13 consecutive contests going back to last season. The senior is second on the line with 29 starts.
- ◆ Sophomore **Adonis Boone** started two games in place of Becton last season and opened the season with seven starts in 2020. Redshirt freshman **Renato Brown** has made six starts, and graduate transfer **Cameron DeGeorge** made his first Louisville start at tackle versus Georgia Tech and now has made three-straight starts at guard.

SCORING STREAK EXTENDED

- ◆ The Cardinals extended their scoring streak to 257 games with 42 points versus Virginia Tech.
- ◆ Louisville has not been shut out in 257 games, which marks the 11th-longest scoring streak in the country, the shut out coming in a 32-0 defeat at Florida State in 2000. The Cardinals own the second-longest streak in the ACC behind Virginia Tech.

FATHER-SON; FITZPATRICK BROTHERS

- ◆ The Cardinals have kept it in the family, with the signing of **Christian Fitzpatrick** and **Josh Minkins, Jr.** Christian is the younger brother of **Dez Fitzpatrick**, who is one of UofL's top receivers. An early enrollee, Christian played at Southfield A&T High, where he was ranked the No. 71 receiver nationally. Christian caught 33 passes for 611 yards and 10 touchdowns as a senior.
- ◆ Minkins, Jr., was a standout safety at Ballard High School and was the No. 41 safety in the country. An all-district performer, Minkins was the 11th-ranked player in the state of Kentucky. Minkins, Sr., was a star cornerback for the Cardinals from 2000-03. He totaled 61 tackles as a senior in 2003, guiding the Cardinals to a 9-4 record and a berth in the GMAC Bowl.

HISTORY LESSON

- ◆ The 2020 season marks the 102st season of intercollegiate football at Louisville. It is the 75th-consecutive year in which Louisville has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1917-20 and 1943-45. The Cardinals own an all-time record of 522-423-17.

LOSING THE GAMES THIS YEAR

- ◆ Last season, the Cardinals were able to win eight games by winning four games decided by 10 points or less. This season, the Cardinals are off to a 2-5 start because they have dropped three games decided by seven points or less. They also held a 27-26 lead over Georgia Tech with 11 minutes remaining before falling by double digits.
- ◆ In 2019, the Cardinals were a perfect 4-0 in games decided by 10 points or less, including a 2-0 record in three-point games — defeating Boston College 41-39 and winning at Wake Forest 62-59.
- ◆ The 2020 campaign has been a different story as the Cardinals lost a 23-20 decision at Pitt and a 12-7 game at Notre Dame — a pair of ranked opponents.

DRIVING FORWARD

- ◆ The Cardinals offense was clicking on all cylinders in the first half in the win over Florida State. UofL scored on their first five possessions — scoring on drives of 77, 70, 94, 68, and 65 yards. Louisville was able to score four touchdowns on 18 total plays.

- The Cardinals scored a field goal on the fifth drive and also missed a scoring opportunity by missing a long field goal.
- In the first half, the Cardinals totaled 410 yards of total offense, averaging 13.2 yards per play. **Javian Hawkins** rushed for 115 yards and two scores and wide receiver **Tutu Atwell** caught three passes for 129 yards and a touchdown in the first half.
- Against Virginia Tech, after scoring on only two of their eight drives, the Cardinals closed the game by scoring on three-straight possessions — reaching the endzone on drives of 82, 75, and 76 yards. The Cardinals recorded 316 yards of offense in the second half.

CARDINALS PLACE TWO ON REESE'S SENIOR BOWL TOP 250

- Wide receiver **Dez Fitzpatrick** and outside linebacker **Rodjay Burns** have all been named to the 2021 Reese's Senior Bowl Top 250 watch list.
- Fitzpatrick, a redshirt senior, enters his final season looking to build upon numbers that are approaching UofL's career top-10 lists. The native of Farmington, Hills, Mich., has caught 111 passes for 1,756 yards and 18 touchdowns, which is tied for sixth all-time.
- The 6-foot-2 receiver caught 35 passes for 635 yards and six touchdowns last season, recording a season high 133 yards and a touchdown versus Florida State. As a redshirt freshman in 2017, Fitzpatrick caught 45 passes for 699 yards and nine touchdowns.
- A Louisville native, Burns made a successful switch to linebacker after starting as a cornerback in 2018. Last season, Burns finished second on the team with 83 tackles and returned a fumble for a touchdown in a win over Western Kentucky.
- The former transfer from Ohio State recorded a career high 16 tackles and added an interception in a win over Wake Forest. Burns also registered a pair of sacks and led the team with 11.0 tackles for loss.

CARDINAL DEBUTS

- After seven games, 19 Cardinals have played in their first games at Louisville. Here are the players who have made their debuts with the Cardinals: **Yaya Diaby**, **Kei'Trel Clark**, **Desmond Daniels**, **Jamel Starks**, **Brock Travelstead**, **K.J. Cloyd**, **Logan Lupo**, **Cameron DeGeorge**, **Jordan Watkins**, **Dez Melton**, **Ja'Darien Boykin**, **Lovie Jenkins**, **Roscoe Johnson**, **Josh Lifson**, **Dezmond Tell**, **Greedy Vance**, **Gergory DeRosiers**, **Colton Burns**, **Josh Minkins** and **Kameron Wilson**.
- The Cardinals have had 11 true freshmen play this season after the first seven contests in Starks, Tell, Travelstead, Watkins, Boykin, Jenkins, Lifson, Daniels, Vance, and Wilson.
- Among the 19 newcomers, five made their first starts in defensive end **YaYa Diaby**, defensive tackle **Dezmond Tell**, offensive lineman **Cameron DeGeorge** and cornerback **Kei-Trel Clark**. **Roscoe Johnson** started his first game against Virginia Tech.
- Returnees **Renato Brown**, **Isaac Martin** and **Justin Marshall** have made their initial starts at Louisville this season. **Ramon Puryear** made his first career start against Virginia Tech.

GO FOR IT

- While the Cardinals have struggled on third down, converting at 40.8 percent, it's given them an opportunity to go for it on fourth down. Louisville is 10-of-17 on fourth down this season, which is tied for eighth nationally for attempts.
- The Cardinals are ranked 49th nationally by converting 58.8 percent of their fourth down tries. In the last four games, the Cardinals have converted 7-of-10 attempts, including 2-for-4 in the loss to Virginia Tech.
- Third down has been a problem for the Cardinals this season, ranking 52nd in the country. The Cardinals have 86 attempts on third down, which is the 22nd most in the country.
- After going 1-of-11 on third down in a loss to Pitt, the Cardinals rebounded by going 9-of-17 against Georgia Tech.

1,000-YARDS

- Running back **Javian Hawkins** and wide receiver **Tutu Atwell** each went over the 1,000-yards last season, giving the Cardinals a 1,000-yard rusher and receiver for the first time since 1999. Hawkins became the first running back since 2010 to rush for over 1,000 yards when he totaled 1,525 yards last year. Lamar Jackson was the last player to record back 1,000-yard rushing seasons. The last running back to accomplish the feat was Calvin Prince in 1976 and 1977.
- Atwell set the school's single-season receiving yard mark with 1,276 yards — the first receiver to reach 1,000-yards since Harry Douglas totaled 1,159 in 2007. Atwell is looking to become the first wideout to record back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons since Douglas did it in 2006 and 2007.

- ♦ The Cardinals have only had 1,000-yard rushers and receivers in consecutive seasons once in school history, which came in 1998 and 1999. Arnold Jackson was a 1,000-yard receiver in 1998 and 1999, while Frank Moreau ran for 1,289 yards in 1999 and Leroy Collins rushed for 1,134 yards in 1998.

CUNNINGHAM CONTINUES HIS PROGRESSION

- ♦ Quarterback **Malik Cunningham** continues to get the ball into the end zone through the air. Dating back to last season, Cunningham has tossed a touchdown pass in 13-straight games, throwing for 30 touchdowns during that span.
- ♦ The redshirt junior ranks 11th in the nation and is second the ACC in touchdown passes with 15 after throwing three touchdown passes the loss to Virginia Tech. He moved into a tie for seventh place on the school's list for career touchdown passes with 38.
- ♦ With his 82-yard touchdown pass to **Dez Fitzpatrick**, he became the first Louisville quarterback to have four touchdown passes of at least 75 yards in his career..
- ♦ With five touchdowns in the last two games, Cunningham moved into a sixth-place tie with Lenny Lyles with 52 career touchdowns responsible for.
- ♦ The 6-foot-3 Cunningham recorded the third 300-yard passing game of the season and his career, becoming the 12th Louisville quarterback with at least three games of 300 yards. The redshirt junior became the 14th Louisville quarterback to surpass 4,000 passing yards for his career with 4,354 yards.
- ♦ Cunningham has recorded 12 multi-passing touchdown games in his career and five with at least three touchdown passes after tossing three against Virginia Tech. The 6-foot-1 signal caller needs six touchdowns throw to Jay Gruden for sixth place all-time with 44 touchdown passes.
- ♦ The native of Montgomery, Ala., ranks ninth in the country with 70 completions of 10 or more yards and eighth with 28 completions of over 20 yards. He is tied for second in the country with four completions of better than 60 yards.
- ♦ Set to make his 22nd career start, Cunningham ranks 26th in the nation in total offense with 280.9 yards per game and is 10th with 1,746 passing yards. He became the ninth player in school history with 5,000 or more yards of total offense with 5,483, which is eighth in school history.
- ♦ Since taking over as the starter against Western Kentucky in 2019, Cunningham has thrown for 3,779 and 37 touchdowns in a span of 21 games.
- ♦ As a starter under Scott Satterfield, Cunningham owns an 9-9 record and is 9-12 overall.
- ♦ Last season, Cunningham led the country in passing yards per completion in 2019 at 18.4 yards per reception.
- ♦ The native of Montgomery, Ala., set the school record for passing efficiency at 194.45 and would have finished second nationally, but didn't have enough passing attempts to meet NCAA standards. He led the nation in passing yards per completion at 18.44 yards and was tops in passing completions of 70 and 80 yards.
- ♦ Cunningham rushed for 50 yards and two touchdowns versus Georgia Tech, giving him his first multi-touchdown game during his career.
- ♦ In 28 career games, Cunningham stands second in school history for rushing yards by a quarterback with 1,159 yards and is second in the school's record book with 14 rushing touchdowns. He led the Cardinals in rushing during the 2018 campaign with 497, which is the fourth-highest total by a quarterback in school history. In 2019, Cunningham finished as the team's third-leading rusher with 482 yards and six touchdowns. His 487 yards were the fifth most in a season, and his six scores were tied for sixth for the most rushing scores by a quarterback in a season.

ATWELL PLAYING BIG

- ♦ Wide receiver **Tutu Atwell** might be small in stature, but he's making a case to be one of the most productive wide receivers in school history. In three seasons, Atwell has caught 134 passes for 2,210 yards and 19 touchdowns. Atwell moved into ninth on Louisville's career receiving yards list after catching eight passes for 78 yards versus Virginia Tech. It marked the sixth time in his career that he caught eight or more passes in a game.
- ♦ The 5-foot-9, 165-pound receiver had his best first half in the win over Florida State. He caught three passes for 129 yards and a score in the 48-16 win. He helped the Cardinals score their first touchdown when he caught a 66-yard pass.
- ♦ He's caught five or more passes in a game 15 times in 31 games, and has caught a pass in 26-straight games.
- ♦ Atwell leads the team with 40 catches for 528 yards and five scores through six games. The speedster is 16th nationally in receiving yards and 18th with five receiving touchdowns. The native of Miami is tied for sixth in the country with two receptions of 50 or more yards.
- ♦ With 129 yards against Florida State, Atwell became the seventh UofL player with 10 or more 100-yard receiving games in a career, and is one away from tying J.R. Russell for third-place all-time in school history.
- ♦ Last season, Atwell led the Atlantic Coast Conference in receiving yards with a school record 1,276 yards and was second with 12 touchdown receptions.
- ♦ The native of Miami, Fla., also knotted the school record with seven 100-yard receiving games and led the nation with four receptions of 70 or more yards — all resulting in touchdowns. He scored from 90 yards versus Syracuse, and added touchdown receptions of 80, 77 and 74 yards last year.
- ♦ A first-team All-American, Atwell closed the season with a career high nine receptions for 147 yards in the 2019 Music City Bowl win over Mississippi State and registered a career best 152 receiving yards in a win over Syracuse last season. The speedster recorded his first three-touchdown game in a 38-21 win over Western Kentucky last year.

HAWKINS RECORDS 12TH 100-YARD GAME

- ♦ Running back **Javian Hawkins** set the school's single-season mark for rushing yards by a running back by totaling 1,525 yards in his first full season, and is continuing to add to those numbers. Hawkins moved into 10th place on Louisville's career rushing list with 2,355 yards, passing Victor Anderson.
- ♦ Hawkins is just 178 yards from becoming the first running back to rush for consecutive 1,000-yard seasons since Calvin Prince did it in 1977 and 1976.
- ♦ The native of Titusville, Fla., rushed for 129 yards and a touchdown, while catching five passes for 42 yards and a score versus Virginia Tech. Hawkins recorded his 12th career 100-yard rushing game, moving him into a tie with Howard Stevens for third-most in Louisville history.
- ♦ Hawkins ran for 174 yards and three touchdowns on 16 carries against Florida State—the 11th 100-yard game of his career and the fifth 150-yard game. The 11 100-yard games was tied with Frank Moreau and Lenny Lyles for fourth all-time at Louisville, while the five 150-yard contests is fifth all-time.
- ♦ Hawkins rushed for 164 yards on 27 carries versus Miami, becoming the ninth player in UofL history to record three games of at least 150 rushing yards. It was the ninth 100-yard rushing game of his career. The 164 rushing yards were the third-highest total in his 19 career games and his 27 carries were one shy of his career high of 28 set

against Virginia last year.

- ♦ Hawkins sits third in the nation in rushing and leads the ACC with 822 yards and eighth with an average of 117.1 yards per game. He's averaging 19.0 attempts per game, which ranks 22nd nationally, and also is fourth in the country with eight rushes of 20 or more yards. His 90-yard touchdown run on the final play of the first half was the third-longest rush in program history and the longest since Howard Stevens had a 91-yard run in 1971. Hawkins is the only player in the country with three rushes of at least 70 yards this season.
- ♦ Of the 12 100-yard games in Hawkins' career, nine have come at Cardinal Stadium. He's only had three 100-yard rushing game on the road.
- ♦ The native of Titusville, Fla., has rushed for more than 100 yards in three of his six career games against ranked opponents, also doing so in 2019 against No. 9 Notre Dame (122 yards) and No. 3 Clemson (129 yards).
- ♦ Last season, Hawkins totaled the most yards by a running back since 2010 when Bilal Powell closed the year with 1,405. Howard Stevens rushed for 1,42 yards in 1971, which is the second-most yards by a running in UofL history.
- ♦ Hawkins finished third in the ACC in rushing and tying for the league lead with eight 100-yard rushing games – the most in school history by a running back and second behind Jackson's school record of 10.
- ♦ The 5-foot-9 running back started 12 games and grabbed ACC Rookie and Running Back of the Week honors twice during his first full season. He rushed for 233 yards – the second most in the ACC this season – in a win over Syracuse. It was the first 200-yard rushing game by a Cardinal since Lamar Jackson had 226 against Texas A&M on Dec. 30, 2015 and the most rushing yards by a Cardinal since Anthony Allen rushed for 275 against Middle Tennessee on Sept. 6, 2007.
- ♦ Hawkins finished eighth in the country in rushing yards and was one of only eight players with 1,500 rushing yards last season. He averaged 117.3 yards per game, which ranked seventh in the country.

FITZPATRICK HAS HUGE GAME

- ♦ Wide receiver **Dez Fitzpatrick** put on a display in the loss to Virginia Tech on Saturday. The senior went for a career-high 158 yards on five catches in the 42-35 loss to the Hokies. It was Fitzpatrick's second 100-yard game this season — the first since totaling 110 yards in the opener versus Western Kentucky.
- ♦ Fitzpatrick's 82-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter was the longest catch of his career and was tied for the ninth-longest passing play in program history. With the touchdown, he moved into fifth all-time at Louisville with 20 career scoring receptions.
- ♦ His 31.6-yards-per-catch average vs. Virginia Tech is the highest ever in a game by a Louisville player with five or more receptions.
- ♦ Fitzpatrick is third on the team with 22 receptions for 443 yards and two touchdowns after his huge performance against Virginia Tech. He ranks 17th in the country by averaging 20.1 yards per catch.
- ♦ Fitzpatrick got his senior season started on the right foot against Western Kentucky. The fifth-year senior caught four passes for 110 yards, including a 70-yard touchdown score in the third quarter — his 19th career scores, which ties him for fifth on the school's all-time list.
- ♦ Fitzpatrick owns 19 catches of 10 or more yards, and is 36th in the nation with 443 receiving yards.
- ♦ Last season, Fitzpatrick finished second on the team with 35 receptions for 635 yards and six scores. He averaged 18.1 yards a reception (33rd in the nation), which includes the 74-yard touchdown reception versus Florida State on Sept. 21.
- ♦ The 110 yards receiving was the sixth 100-yard game of his career, the fourth time in the last 11 games. He needs two more to tie for ninth in school history.
- ♦ Last season, Fitzpatrick finished second on the team with 35 receptions for 635 yards and six scores. He averaged 18.1 yards a reception (33rd in the nation), which includes the 74-yard touchdown reception versus Florida State on Sept. 21.
- ♦ In a three-game streak of recording 100 yards receiving last year, Fitzpatrick caught seven passes for 133 yards and one score against Florida State on Sept. 21, which was just one yard short of tying his career high of 134 yards receiving, which occurred in a loss to NC State during the 2017 season. In the win over Boston College on Oct. 5, Fitzpatrick caught five passes for 108 yards and a score in the 41-39 win. He went over the century mark versus Wake Forest on Oct. 12, catching five passes for 125 yards and two scores. Fitzpatrick was the first Louisville player with three straight 100-yard receiving games since DeVante Parker did it vs. NC State, Florida State, and Boston College in 2014.
- ♦ With a touchdown reception versus NC State, Fitzpatrick moved into a tie for sixth place in school history with 18 touchdown receptions - tying Deion Branch (2000-01).

- ♦ In his four seasons, Fitzpatrick has caught 133 passes for 2,199 yards and 20 touchdowns in his career — becoming the 23rd player in school history with 100 receptions and the 14th with over 2,000 yards . He needs six yards and 19 receptions to crack the school's top-10 list for career receiving yards and receptions.

WHAT A MONTH

- ♦ The Cardinals went a disappointing 1-3 in the month of October, but quarterback **Malik Cunningham** blossomed. The junior quarterback completed 66.7 percent of his throws for 989 yards and eight touchdowns during the month of October.
- ♦ In a loss to No. 4 Notre Dame, Cunningham completed 16-of-19 passes for 132 yards and one score in a 12-7 loss to the Fighting Irish. In a win over Florida State, the junior went 16-of-24 for 278 yards and a pair of scores in a 48-16 victory over the Seminoles.
- ♦ Despite a loss to Virginia Tech last Saturday, Cunningham closed out the day 23-for-35 for a career-high 350 yards and three touchdowns. He became the 14th Louisville quarterback to surpass 4,000 passing yards for his career.
- ♦ He recorded the third 300-yard passing game of the season and his career, becoming the 12th Louisville quarterback with at least three games of 300 yards.
- ♦ Cunningham moved into seventh place on Louisville's career touchdown passes list with 38, tied with Stefan LeFors and Jeff Brohm.

TURNOVERS A BIG PROBLEM

- ♦ The Cardinals have a huge problem — turning the football over. Through seven games, the Cardinals have turned the ball over 15times, an average of 2.1 per game. Louisville didn't turn the ball over against Notre Dame — the first game this season without a turnover. The Cardinals threw three interceptions in the loss to Virginia Tech on Saturday, resulting in 10 points.
- ♦ The Cardinals rank 99th out of 103 teams in turnovers lost with 15. In the Cardinals' five losses this season, they have turned the football over 12 times.
- ♦ Louisville fumbled three times in the loss to Georgia Tech, which resulted in 19 Yellow Jacket points. Teams have turned those turnovers into 39 points in the first seven games.
- ♦ The Cardinals fumbled three times in the loss to Georgia Tech, which resulted in 19 Yellow Jacket points and 47-26 loss after entering the fourth quarter with a lead.
- ♦ In the five losses, the Cardinals turned the ball over 12 times — three in losses to Miami, Pitt ,Georgia Tech, and Virginia Tech. The Cardinals have thrown eight interceptions already this season, which is just one short of matching the total from the entire 2019 campaign. Louisville fumbled 10 times all of last season, four short of the six already through the first seven games.
- ♦ Against Georgia Tech, Louisville lost three fumbles in a game for only the second time since 2001. The other time was in a 44-12 win vs. Wake Forest on Nov. 12, 2016.

FORD MOVES INTO FOURTH AMONG TIGHT ENDS WITH 12 TD

- ♦ Tight end **Marshon Ford** has blossomed in his second season with the Cardinals. Ford is third on the team with 20 receptions for 226 yards and is tied for the team lead with five touchdowns. He matched his 2019 output for receptions with 20 and is just 66 yards short of tying his yard total from a year ago. He set career highs with five catches for 89 yards and a touchdown in a loss to Georgia Tech.

- ♦ With a touchdown reception versus Virginia Tech, Ford has a touchdown catch in five of the seven games this season and has moved into fourth place all-time at Louisville for touchdown catches by a tight end with 12.
- ♦ Ford is tied for first in the Atlantic Coast Conference among tight ends with five touchdowns, while is fourth with his 20 catches. NC State's Cary Angeline joins Ford in the league lead with five touchdown receptions, while Boston College's Hunter Long has 41 receptions to pace the league.
- ♦ His one-yard TD reception in the first quarter against Notre Dame was his 11th touchdown reception of his career, tying him for fourth all-time among tight ends at UofL. Ford owns only 38 career receptions, and 11 have reached the end zone. He scored late in the game on a four-yard reception versus Miami and put the Cardinals up 28-7 when he scored from two yard out against Western Kentucky.

- ♦ The tight end made the most of his receptions last season, scoring seven touchdowns on only 20 receptions. Ford, a local product from Ballard High, caught 20 passes for 292 yards. He led the ACC in receiving touchdowns by a tight end, besting Syracuse's Aaron Hackett, who had six touchdown receptions.
- ♦ Ford closed his first season in dramatic fashion, catching three passes for 53 yards and a pair of touchdowns in a 38-28 win over Mississippi State in the 2019 Music City Bowl. It was his third multiple touchdown game of the season.
- ♦ In the win over NC State on Nov. 16 last season, Ford caught three passes for 52 yards and two touchdowns — the second multiple touchdown game this season. He also scored twice versus Eastern Kentucky.

UNDER SATTERFIELD

- ♦ In 20 games under Scott Satterfield, Louisville has scored over 40 points five times and has posted an 5-0 record when doing so.
- ♦ Louisville has gone over 500 yards of total offense in eight games under Satterfield and over 600 yards twice.
- ♦ Louisville has two 300+ yard rushing games in the Satterfield era, both coming in 2019.
- ♦ Louisville has had a player rush for over 100 yards 12 times under Satterfield, going 6-6 in those contests.
- ♦ Louisville has had six 300+-yard passing games during the Satterfield era.

NOT THE NORM

- ♦ Head coach Scott Satterfield has brought an explosive offense to Louisville in short period of time that's why the loss at Pitt was so puzzling. The Cardinals were held to 223 yards of total offense — a low in the Satterfield era. It was only the third time in 20 games that the Cardinals were held to less than 300 yards of offense in a game.
- ♦ Since taking the reins of the program in 2019, the Cardinals have been limited to less than 400 yards of offense just seven times and less than 350 yards on five occasions.
- ♦ Under Satterfield's guidance, the Cardinals have averaged 31.7 points per game and 447.2 yards of total offense during that 20 game time period.
- ♦ The 107 yards passing in the loss to Pittsburgh equaled the total the Cardinals had in a loss versus No. 3 Clemson last season.

RUN THE ROCK

- ♦ Satterfield brings a run first attitude to the UofL program, and the stats have shown that to be the case in the first two seasons. Satterfield's rushing prowess has been evident through 20 games as the Cardinals have averaged 193.9 yards per ground per game after rushing for 198 yards against Virginia Tech. The Cardinals have rushed for over 200 yards 10 times in a game under Satterfield.
- ♦ The 242 were the fourth yards on the ground were the second-lowest mark in the Satterfield's tenure and the most since running for 370 yards in a win over Syracuse last season.
- ♦ The Cardinals have rushed for at least 110 yards in 18 of the 20 games since Satterfield took over the offense.

TURNER TAKES OVER

- ♦ The Cardinals have been blessed with many great kickers, and a void was left with the graduation of Blanton Creque. Walk-on **James Turner** has stepped in after six games to pick up the slack. A native of Saline, Mich., is a perfect 25-for-25 on points-after-touchdowns and is 6-for-8 on field-goal attempts connecting on two field goals in the win over Florida State.
- ♦ The sophomore booted a pair of field goals for the third time this season, hitting two against the Seminoles, two a in the loss to Pitt and a pair versus Miami.
- ♦ Turner ranks 62nd nationally with an average of 0.86 field goals per game and stands 40th with a 75.0 field goal percentage. Turner is also fifth in the nation for most PATs made without a miss at 26.
- ♦ He opened the scoring against Miami when he booted a 40-yard field goal to put the Cardinals up 3-0. He added a 22-yard field goal in the second quarter to trim the Hurricanes' lead to 14-6.
- ♦ Entering the Virginia Tech contest, Turner is 19th in the nation in most extra points made without a miss.
- ♦ He also executed Louisville's first on-side kick recovery since the Belk Bowl loss to NC State in 2011.

DEFENSE TAKES A HIT

- ◆ The Cardinals' defense took a major hit prior to the loss at Virginia Tech. The Cardinals played the game without eight players who saw a majority of the time on that side of the football. The Cardinals were missing four starters, three coming on the defensive line in **Tabarius Peterson**, **Yaya Diaby**, and **Dayna Kinnaird**.
- ◆ Louisville was also without its top play maker on defense in **Monty Montgomery**, who leads the Cardinals in sacks with 4.0 and owns 7.5 tackles for loss.
- ◆ Starting safety **Isaiah Hayes** — a starter in the first six games — has recorded 25 tackles this season and one pass break-up.
- ◆ Defensive linemen **Malik Clark**, **Ja'Darien Boykins** and **Micah Bland** were also held out. The Cardinals started a walk-on on the defensive line in **Ramon Puryear**.

GOLDWIRE PUTS TOGETHER POSITIVE STREAK

- ◆ Defensive tackle **Jared Goldwire** is getting better as his senior season pushes on. Goldwire has recorded 17 tackles over the last four games, equaling his career high with six tackles against Georgia Tech and Notre Dame. He registered six stops in the loss at Notre Dame and recorded six tackles at Georgia Tech, and also was credited with five solo stops. It was his best two performances since registering five tackles in a win over NC State late in the season.
- ◆ Goldwire's block of Georgia Tech's extra point is Louisville's first block of an opponent's PAT attempt since blocking one vs. Clemson on Sept. 16, 2017.
- ◆ The senior, who recorded a career high 26 stops in 2018, already owns 23 tackles after six games. The 6-foot-6 nose tackle also owns 3.0 tackles for loss, which is tops among the defensive linemen, and has recorded 1.0 sacks.

ETHERIDGE SAVING BEST FOR LAST

- ◆ **Dorian Etheridge** has been the leader of the defense over the last four seasons, and he's off to a good start for the 2020 campaign. The senior second on the team with 35 tackles and owns the team lead in tackles for loss with 9.0.
- ◆ Etheridge has recorded at least seven tackles in three of the first seven games, tallying a season best eight tackles in the season opener versus Western Kentucky.
- ◆ After the firsts even weeks, Etheridge ranks 11th in the country in tackles for loss with 9.0. He recorded a career high 3.5 tackles for loss against Western Kentucky in the season opener and matched that in the loss at Pittsburgh.
- ◆ In the loss to Miami, Etheridge recorded seven tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss.
- ◆ The native of Charleston, W. Va., has registered 243 tackles in 41 games. He closed 2019 with 70 tackles and also has 8.0 tackles for loss.
- ◆ In the last four games of the 2019 season, Etheridge posted double-digit tackle totals in back-to-back games for the first time in his career, recording 30 stops in the last four games. He recorded a season high 12 tackles versus Syracuse on Nov. 23 after being credited with 11 tackles and his first career interception in the win over NC State on Nov. 16.
- ◆ Etheridge had five games of seven or more tackles during his junior season.
- ◆ He opened the 2019 season with three tackles and recovered a fumble in the loss to the Irish, while being credited with seven tackles and one for a loss in the win over Eastern Kentucky.
- ◆ The 2018 campaign saw him miss a pair of games, totaling 55 tackles and 4.0 tackles for loss. As a true freshman in 2017, Etheridge was named a freshman All-American after leading the team with 83 tackles, including a career best 14 stops versus Boston College.
- ◆ In his career, Etheridge has recorded five games of 10 or more tackles.

SENIOR LINEBACKER JUST MAKES PLAYS

- ◆ Not only has linebacker **C.J. Avery** been one of the team's top tackler's over the last couple seasons, he's been the one who has recorded the most interceptions. Avery recorded his third career interception in the loss to Pitt on Sept. 26. It was the first pick for the Cardinals during the 2020 campaign. The native of Grenada, Miss., led the team with a pair of interceptions during the 2018 season.
- ◆ Avery owns the team lead in tackles with 50 after recording 22 stops in the last two games. He recorded a season best 12 in the win over Florida State and was credited with 10 against Virginia Tech — the fifth double-digit tackle games of his career. He ranks 12th in the ACC with an average of 7.3 stops per game. He also recorded a sack in the win over Florida State and added one versus Virginia Tech.
- ◆ The 2019 season showed what Avery is capable of after leading the team in tackles with a career best 93 stops in 13 games as a starter. He opened the year with three tackles in the win over Western Kentucky

and followed with a team high 10 stops against Miami.

- ♦ Avery registered six or more tackles in 10 of the 13 games in 2019 after closing the season with nine tackles in two of the three final games of the season. He recorded a season high 13 tackles and a pass break-up in the win over Wake Forest and had nine stops on Sept. 21 in a loss at Florida State.
- ♦ In 2018, Avery finished second on the team in tackles last year despite missing three games. He recorded a career high 15 tackles in a loss to Boston College and seven against Wake Forest.
- ♦ The native of Grenada, Miss., has recorded 221 tackles and 5.5 sacks in 42 career contests.

YEAST REBOUNDS FROM SEASON-ENDING INJURY

- ♦ Safety **Russ Yeast** was having a career season before a severe leg injury sidelined him for the final two games of the season. The senior recorded a career high 61 tackles and totaled his first interception last season. ♦
- ♦ His senior season was in question after his long recovery process, but the fourth-year senior is off to a solid start. He is tied for fourth on the team in tackles with 32 and has forced and recovered a fumble in three starts at safety. He recorded a season high seven tackles in the 23-20 loss at Pittsburgh on Sept. 26 and equaled that total in the loss to Virginia Tech.
- ♦ He opened up his final season by making a couple of keys plays in the win over Western Kentucky. Yeast recorded three tackles, but forced and recovered a fumble deep Louisville territory that stopped a potential scoring drive. He registered five more stops in the loss to Miami.
- ♦ Yeast, who transitioned from cornerback last season, recorded three games with seven or more tackles and picked off Trevor Lawrence last season to stop a potential scoring drive. Yeast was credited with a career high 11 tackles in a win over Boston College and had eight stops in a loss at Florida State.
- ♦ The product of Center Grove High totaled 23 tackles in 12 games as a freshman in 2017.

MONTY PYTHON

- ♦ Reserve linebacker **Monty Montgomery** continues to be a play maker off the bench for the Cardinals, and that was on display against No. 4 Notre Dame. Coming off the bench, Montgomery turned in a career-best day versus Notre Dame, piling up a team-best 13 tackles in addition to a pair of sacks. The 11 solo tackles were the most by a UofL player since Trumaine Washington totaled 11 in 2015.
- ♦ It was the third multi-sack game for Montgomery in his 19 games with the Cardinals. In 19 career games with the Cardinals, Montgomery has recorded 9.0 sacks, leading the team with 4.0 this year and 5.0 in 2019.
- ♦ The native of Norcross, Ga., ranks sixth in the ACC and 89th nationally with an average of 0.67 sacks per game. The junior stands second on the team with 32 tackles after six games, which more than he had all of last season.

KNOCK IT DOWN

- ♦ The Cardinals were all over the field in the passing game in the 48-16 win over Florida State. The Seminoles completed just 14 of 41 passes in their 48-16 defeat. Louisville's 12 pass breakups set a new school record for a single game. The previous record was 10 on three occasions, most recently in a 62-59 win at Wake Forest on Oct. 12, 2019.
- ♦ **Anthony Johnson** is the first player in Louisville history to break up a pass on three consecutive plays, doing so on Florida State's final three offensive plays of the game.
- ♦ Cornerback **Kei'Trel Clark** is third in the nation with seven pass breakups, while linebacker **C.J. Avery** and cornerback **Chandler Jones** each have three.
- ♦ Louisville's defense is tied for sixth in the nation in pass breakups with 28.

NO PASS THROUGH

- ♦ The Cardinals have been solid this season against the pass, and that was evident again in the win over Florida State. Louisville enters the weekend ranked 25th nationally in pass defense allowing just 194.6 yards per game.
- ♦ Florida State threw for only 141 yards — the third opponent to pass for less than 200 yards in a game this season and the second in a row. Louisville held Notre Dame to 106 yards passing in a 12-7 loss on Oct. 17.
- ♦ Chubby Purdy sets a UofL opponent record for most passes in a game without a completion, going 0-9. Florida State's 34% completion percentage (14-41) is the lowest by a Power Five opponent since Florida State completed 33% of its passes (8-24) in a 63-20 loss to UofL in 2016. This was only the third game since 2000 involving at least one FBS team in which a player attempted 9 or more passes without a completion.
- ♦ The Seminoles averaged just 3.4 yards per pass attempt.
- ♦ Teams are completing just 53.6 percent of their passes, which ranks 11th in the country.

**HEAD COACH SCOTT SATTERFIELD****SECOND SEASON AT LOUISVILLE (10-10) • EIGHTH SEASON OVERALL (60-34)**

In his seven years as a head coach, Scott Satterfield has illustrated throughout his career that he's a winner.

That's evident by the last five seasons where Satterfield has guided his teams to 48 wins and three conference titles, which ranks seventh best nationally among active coaches.

Satterfield's six-game turnaround in his first season at Louisville was tops among Power 5 programs. He also became only the second ACC coach to take a winless team in the league and win five games the following year. He was named the school's first ACC Coach of the Year for his efforts, and became only the school's second first-year coach to win eight or more games.

Taking over a team that won two games the previous year, Satterfield led the Cardinals to an 8-5 record that culminated with a win over Mississippi State in the Music City Bowl.

On the field, the Cardinals snapped a nine-game league losing streak with a win over Boston College and won on the road versus a ranked opponent for the first time since 2011 with a 62-59 win over Boston College.

Individually, a pair of Cardinals posted the best statistical seasons in school history in running back Javian Hawkins and wide receiver Tutu Atwell. The duo became only the third players to record 1,000-yard rushing and receiving seasons in the same year. Hawkins broke the school record for rushing yards by a running back and a freshman in school history with 1,525 yards, which included eight 100-yard rushing games.

Hosting the first Sun Belt Conference Championship Game in league history, Appalachian State won 30-19 against Louisiana to claim its third straight league title and earn an automatic bid to face Middle Tennessee of Conference USA in the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl.

In 23 seasons at Appalachian State, including five as a quarterback (1991-95) and 12 as an assistant coach (1998-2008, 2012), the Mountaineers secured three NCAA Division I FCS national titles and 11 conference championships.

In his final season at Appalachian State, the

Mountaineers were 10-2 and captured the East Division title behind a 7-1 league record. The team has compiled five straight wins heading into its bowl appearance, outscoring opponents 157-60.

In 2017, Appalachian State registered a 9-4 mark that included a 7-1 record within the league and a 34-0 win over Toledo in the Dollar General Bowl. The Mountaineers ranked among the top 20 teams nationally in fewest sacks allowed (No. 2 with eight), first downs allowed (No. 20 with 222), fewest passes picked off by opposing defenses (No. 8 with six), defensive interceptions (No. 12 with 18), sacks per game (No. 17 with 2.92), and turnover margin (No. 11 with 0.92).

The Mountaineers completed a 10-win season in 2016, winning nine of their last 10 contests to finish at 10-3 overall – capped by a 31-28 win over Toledo in the Camellia Bowl. The Mountaineers' two losses came at the hands of ranked opponents, opening the season with a 20-13 overtime loss to No. 9 Tennessee and a defeat to No. 25 Miami two weeks later.

The 2015 season, saw Satterfield's team post an 11-2 record. It was the highest win total by an FBS program in its first season of bowl eligibility after completing the transition. The Mountaineers ranked among the Sun Belt's top two in 19 of the league's 33 statistical categories.

Satterfield spent the first 11 seasons of his professional career in Boone, coaching the Mountaineers' wide receivers (1998), running backs (1999-02) and quarterbacks (2003-08). He was an integral part of Appalachian State's transition from a Power-I to a Spread offense in 2004.

Prior to his return to Appalachian State as the assistant head coach and offensive coordinator in 2012, Satterfield spent one season as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Toledo (2009) and two as the offensive coordinator at Florida International (2010-11).

Satterfield, a native of Hillsborough, NC, is married to the former Beth Burluson, a star on the Appalachian State track team in the mid-90's. They have a daughter, Alli, and two sons, Bryce and Isaac.
