**FOR OPENERS**

- UVA begins its 116th season of men's basketball, sporting a 1,655-1,175 (.585) all-time record.
- UVA is 21-1 in its last 22 season-opening games, including a 48-34 win at Syracuse last season.
- Virginia has a seven-game winning streak on opening night and is 10-1 in season openers under head coach Tony Bennett.
- The lone opening-night loss under Bennett came at George Mason (63-59) to begin the 2012-13 campaign.
- The Cavaliers are 93-22 all-time in 115 season-opening games.
- UVA is 141-38 (.788) in non-conference action under Bennett.

**CAVALIERS RETURN TO MOHEGAN SUN**

- Virginia is 2-0 all-time at Mohegan Sun Arena, capturing its seventh straight November tournament championship last season with wins over UMass (58-46) and Arizona State (48-45).

**UVA RANKED NO. 4 IN PRESEASON RANKINGS**

- Virginia is ranked No. 4 in the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' preseason polls.
- UVA is ranked in the AP preseason top-5 for the third time in school history (No. 1 in 1982-83 and No. 5 in 2018-19).
- The Cavaliers have been ranked in the AP preseason top-10 for the eighth time in school history (No. 8 in 1980-81, No. 7 in 1981-82, No. 1 in 1982-83, No. 9 in 2014-15, No. 6 in 2015-16, No. 8 in 2016-17, No. 5 in 2018-19 and No. 4 in 2020-21.)
- UVA has been ranked in the top 25 in the preseason rankings in nine of the past 10 seasons.

**VIRGINIA PICKED FIRST IN THE ACC**

- Virginia was selected first in the ACC Operation Basketball 2020-21 Preseason Poll.
- The Cavaliers were named the Preseason ACC favorite for the first time since 1982-83 and second time in the 52-year history of the league poll.
- Virginia was followed Duke, Florida State, North Carolina and Louisville in the top five.
- ACC preseason voters selected Syracuse sixth, followed by Miami, NC State, Georgia Tech and Clemson. Virginia Tech was picked 11th, while Notre Dame, Pitt, Boston College and Wake Forest rounded out the voting.
- The Cavaliers have finished at or higher than their predicted finish in 11 of the last 12 seasons.

**ALL-TIME VS. TOWSON**

- UVA is 6-0 all-time against Towson in the series that dates back to 1985-86.
- The Cavaliers have won all six of the meetings in Charlottesville, including a 73-42 win at John Paul Jones Arena to start the 2018-19 season.
- Virginia head coach Tony Bennett is 2-0 all-time vs. Towson.

**LAST TIME VS. THE TIGERS**

- Ty Jerome drilled six 3-pointers en route to a game-high 20 points in then-No. 5 Virginia's 73-42 win over Towson on Nov. 6, 2018.
- De'Andre Hunter added 13 points and 10 rebounds for his second career double-double and Braxton Key had seven points and nine rebounds in his UVA debut.
- Tobias Howard led the Tigers with 10 points.
- Kihei Clark had a game-high six assists in his collegiate debut.
- Virginia shot 48.1 percent from the floor and canned 10 3-pointers.

**UVA VS. THE COLONIAL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION**

- UVA is 96-30 all-time vs. current members of the CAA (55-26 vs. William & Mary, 10-0 vs. James Madison, 10-2 vs. Delaware, 6-0 vs. Elon, 6-0 vs. Towson, 4-0 vs. UNCW, 2-0 vs. Drexel, 1-0 vs. Charleston and 1-2 vs. Hofstra).
- The Cavaliers defeated UNCW and current NC State head coach Kevin Keatts in the first round of the 2017 NCAA Tournament.
- Tony Bennett is 11-1 all-time vs. the CAA as head coach at Virginia (3-0 vs. James Madison, 3-0 vs. William & Mary, 2-0 vs. UNCW, 2-0 vs. Towson, 1-0 vs. Drexel and 0-1 vs. Delaware).

**HAUSER AND CLARK EARN PRESEASON ALL-ACC HONORS**

- Sam Hauser was named to the preseason All-ACC first team, while Kihei Clark was named to the second team.
- Hauser was joined on the first team by preseason ACC Player of the Year Garrison Brooks (North Carolina), Scottie Barnes (Florida State), Jalen Johnson (Duke), Aamir Simms (Clemson) and Chris Lykes (Miami).
- Clark was joined on the preseason All-ACC second team by David Johnson (Louisville), Jose Alvarado (Georgia Tech), M.J. Walker (Florida State) and Wendell Moore Jr. (Duke).

**VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT**

- Three-time National and four-time ACC Coach of the Year Tony Bennett has a 277-96 (.743) mark in 11 seasons at Virginia and 346-129 (.728) career mark in 14 seasons.
- Bennett led the Cavaliers to their eighth straight season with 23 or more wins in 2019-20.
- Bennett also led UVA to a 15-5 mark and second-place ACC finish.
- In 2018-19, Bennett led the Cavaliers to their first NCAA national championship, a share of their ninth ACC regular-season title and school-record 35 wins.
- Bennett became the 80th active Division I head coach to win his 300th career game against Marshall on Dec. 31, 2018.
- Bennett was named the USBWA Henry Iba National Coach of the Year for the third time in 2018 to rank second all-time behind legendary John Wooden, who captured the award six times.
- He has led UVA to outright ACC regular-season and tournament championships in the same season two times (2014 and 2018).
- Bennett guided UVA to six straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 2014-19 for the first time in school history and has led UVA to 29 or more wins in five of the past seven seasons.
- Bennett is the sixth coach in ACC history to win at least three outright ACC regular-season titles (Frank McGuire, Vic Bubas, Dean Smith, Mike Krzyzewski and Roy Williams).
- Bennett has led UVA to a school-best 16 or more ACC wins in four of the last six seasons and a school-record eight straight seasons with 11 or more ACC wins.
- He has led UVA to a school-best nine straight 20-win seasons.
- Bennett guided UVA to a school-record 89 wins over three seasons two times (2014-16, 2017-19 & 2018-20).
- Bennett led UVA to nine consecutive postseason appearances (2012-19) and six consecutive NCAA tournaments (2014-19).
- Bennett led the Cavaliers to 30 wins in back-to-back seasons two times (2014-2015 and 2018-19).
- UVA is 136-58 (.701) in ACC play (77-20 at home & 59-38 away), 157-29 (.844) at home and 141-38 (.788) in non-conference action (79-7 at JPJ) under Bennett.
- Bennett ranks fifth all-time in winning percentage at .701, among ACC head coaches with 100 or more ACC regular-season wins.

**HOO ARE THESE CAVALIERS?**

- Kihei Clark, Sam Hauser and Jay Huff headline Virginia's top returnees from last season's 23-7 team, which finished second in the ACC (15-5) and ended the season on an eight-game winning streak before the season was canceled due to COVID-19.
- Clark started all 30 games and averaged 10.8 points and team-high 5.9 assists en route to All-ACC third-team honors.
- Hauser makes his UVA debut after sitting out last season after transferring from Marquette.
- The 6-8 sharpshooter averaged 14.9 points and 7.2 rebounds en route to All-BIG EAST second-team honors as a junior in 2018-19.
- Hauser shot 45.9 percent from the field, 40.2 percent from 3-point range and led the BIG EAST in free throw percentage at 92.4 percent.
- Huff tallied 8.5 points and 6.2 rebounds and a team-high 61 blocks. Huff recorded a career-high 17 points at Georgia Tech and Miami, and had 16 multi-block games.
- Tomas Woldetensae, Kody Statmann, Casey Morsell, Francisco Caffaro, Justin McKoy and redshirt freshman Kadin Shedrick also return.
- Woldetensae started the last 14 games and made a team-high 52 3-pointers, including seven at Wake Forest and Louisville, and six at North Carolina.
- Morsell scored a career-high 19 points against Arizona State to earn Air Force Reserve Tip-Off All-Tournament honors, while Statmann had career highs in points (11) at Boston College and rebounds (8) against Virginia Tech.
- Caffaro played 20 games, contributing 10 points and seven rebounds against North Carolina.
- McKoy chipped in six points on 3 of 3 shooting off the bench at Purdue and four points and five rebounds vs. North Carolina.
- Shedrick makes his UVA debut after redshirting the 2019-20 season.

**OUR DEFENSE NEVER RESTS**

- UVA captured its sixth NCAA scoring defense title after limiting opponents to 52.4 points per game in 2019-20.
- UVA limited 12 opponents to fewer than 50 points, one opponent (Duke) to 50 points and four foes to fewer than 40 points.

- The Cavaliers limited five opponents (Syracuse, JMU, Columbia, Maine and Virginia Tech) to fewer than 50 points, 29 percent or less field goal shooting and 29 percent or less 3-point shooting.
- UVA held 23 opponents below 41 percent from the field.
- The Cavaliers forced 27 shot clock violations and outrebounded 22 opponents.
- Bennett-coached teams have led the nation in scoring defense seven times and finished in the top-five nationally in 11 of 14 seasons.

**WATCH ME NOW**

- Kihei Clark (Bob Cousy Award), Sam Hauser (Julius Erving Award) and Jay Huff (Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award) were named to Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame preseason award top-20 watch lists.
- The Cousy Award honors the nation's top point guard, while the Erving Award honors the top small forward and Abdul-Jabbar the top center.
- Clark was named to the Cousy Award top-20 watch list last season.
- Hauser was one of 50 players named to the preseason watch list for the 2021 Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Watch List for Men's Player of the Year.
- Hauser was one of 20 players named to the preseason watch list for the 2021 NABC Division I Player of the Year.

**2019-20 IN REVIEW**

- Virginia finished the season with a 23-7 overall record and tied for second in the ACC with a 15-5 record.
- The 2020 ACC and NCAA tournaments were canceled due to the coronavirus.
- The Cavaliers won 23 or more games for the eighth consecutive season.
- UVA won 15 or more league games for the third straight season and fifth overall.
- UVA finished the season on an eight-game winning streak.
- The Cavaliers captured the Air Force Reserve Tip-Off Tournament title with a 48-45 win over Arizona State on Nov. 24 and have captured seven straight November tournament championships (Emerald Coast Classic, Charleston Classic, Barclays Center Classic, Corpus Christi Challenge, NIT Season Tip-Off, Battle 4 Atlantis and Air Force Reserve Tip Off Tournament).

**RECORDS WATCH**

- Jay Huff ranks 11th at Virginia in career blocks with 100.
- Huff needs three blocked shots to pass Darion Atkins (102 blocked shots from 2012-15) for 10th on the list.
- Huff's 61 blocked shots in 2019-20 led the team and rank seventh on UVA's all-time single-season list.
