COMMONWEALTH CLASH SET FOR SATURDAY

- The third time's a hopefully a charm for the 2020 Commonwealth Clash which was originally set for Nov. 28, then moved to Sept. 19 and finally rescheduled for Saturday.
- This rivalry dates back to 1895 and the 102nd incarnation of the series will take place in December for the first time.
- Tech has won 19 of the last 21 games in the series and is seeking to reclaim the Commonwealth Cup after UVA snapped a 15-game VT winning streak in 2019.
- UVA hasn't won in Blacksburg since posting a 36-32 victory (11/28/98) and hasn't recorded back-to-back wins vs. Tech since 1997-98. The only two players on the current VT roster born prior to 1997 are grad students Justus Reed & Tyrell Smith.
- The Hokies have won 10 straight home games vs. UVA dating back a 42-21 Tech win led by QB Michael Vick (11/25/00).
- Tech owns a 4-0 record under Justin Fuente in regular season home finales (Senior Day games), owning a 121-44 scoring edge in wins vs. UVA (11/26/16), Pitt (11/18/17), Marshall (12/11/18) and Pitt (11/23/19).
- UVA is coming off a 43-32 win vs. BC (12/5).

KEY SCORING STATS ON HOKIES, CAVALIERS

- The last three VT-UVA contests have been close contests Tech holding a slim 74-70 scoring edge.
- Tech owns a 32-4 mark under Fuente when leading at half.
- Tech has led at the half in all four of its wins in 2020, outscoring those foes by a 79-38 margin in the first half.
- VT is 27-7 when scoring 30+ points under Fuente and 13-1 when scoring 40+ points.
- Tech has produced four 40-point games in 2020. Since joining the ACC in 2004, the Hokies are 25-2 in ACC play when scoring 40 points or more.
- UVA is 7-23 under Mendenhall when allowing 30+ points, including a 1-10 mark in ACC road games.
- VT is 32-2 when holding foes to 21 points or fewer dating back to the start of the 2015 season (6-1 in 2019).
- Virginia is 2-22 under Mendenhall when scoring 21 points or fewer, including seven straight losses.
- VT has won 25 straight games when limiting foes to 17 points or fewer.
- UVA is 1-15 under Mendenhall when scoring 17 points or fewer. Lone win was 16-13 vs. Miami (10/13/18).

HERBERT IS TECH'S 14TH 1,000-YARD RUSHER

- RB Khalil Herbert has an ACC-high 1,020 rush yards, making him VT's first 1,000-yard rusher since RB Travon McMillian (1,043 in 2015).
- He needs 111 rushing yards to move into the top 10 of Tech's all-time single-season rushing performances.
- Herbert is the first 1,000-yard rusher that Fuente has enjoyed in nine seasons as an FBS head coach.
- Fuente's previous single-season rushing leader was RB Brandon Hayes (949 yards) for Memphis in 2014.

TURN UP THE JUICE, RB KHALIL HERBERT

- RB Khalil "Juice" Herbert is averaging 162.9 all-purpose ypg, the top ACC mark. His 1,629 all-purpose yards lead all FBS players, while his 162.9 ypg average leads the ACC and ranks third among all Power Five players with a minimum of five games played.
- Herbert's 357 all-purpose yards at Duke (10/3) remain the highest single-game Power Five total in the nation this season. The next-closest performance was 310 yards by Colorado's Jarek Broussard at Arizona (12/5).
- He owns five 100-yard rushing games and leads the nation among players with five or more games, averaging yards per carry.
- The last VT player with four or more 100-yard games in a season was RB David Wilson (10 in 2011).
- Herbert leads active ACC players, averaging 102.0 rushing ypg. Louisville's Javian Hawkins (102.8 ypg) has opted out.

WELCOME TO #SACKSBURG

- Tech is tied for fourth in the nation with 32.0 sacks. That total is just 6.0 shy of VT's 38.0 sacks accumulated through 13 games in 2019.
- VT has registered 6.0 or more sacks in three games in 2020.
- VT is 21-7 under Fuente when registering 3.0 or more sacks.
- DE Amare Barno (who switched positions from linebacker in fall camp) is tied for second in the ACC with 14.0 TFL. Pitt's Rashad Weaver (14.5) leads the conference. Barno leads Tech with a pair of forced fumbles.
- DE Justus Reed has a team-high 6.5 sacks to tie for fifth in the ACC, while Barno has 5.5 to tie for 10th in the conference.
- CB Chamarrí Conner leads Tech and ranks seventh in the ACC with 76 total tackles.
- UVA & Clemson have each allowed an ACC-low 16.0 sacks.

COMMONWEALTH CLASH TALE OF THE TAPE

- Virginia Tech is 19-2 in its last 21 games vs. UVA. The next-closest team in terms of in-state dominance over an in-state FBS rival over that span is Oklahoma (17-4 vs. Oklahoma State).
- Tech is 15-1 in its last 16 meetings with UVA. Here is a look at the cumulative stats in the series dating back to 2004.

TECH PILING UP RUSHING TDS, YARDS

- VT already has 25 rushing TDs after scoring 22 in 13 games 2019. That figure is tied for third in the ACC with Clemson. Only Notre Dame (30) and UNC (29) have more in the conference.
- The most rushing TDs that Tech has scored in the Fuente era were 27 in 2016. Tech hasn't scored 30 rushing TDs in a single season since posting 30 in 2010.
- Tech is 13-2 with three or more rushing TDs under Fuente, including a 4-1 mark in 2020.
- VT registered ZERO games with 300+ net rushing yards from 2011-19. Tech has THREE such games in 2020 with 314 vs. NC State (9/26), 324 at Duke (10/3) and 350 vs. BC (10/17).
- VT owns five 250-yard rushing games in 2020. Tech owns an 11-2 mark under Fuente when rushing for 250+ yards, including a 4-1 record in 2020.
- Among teams playing at least five games, Tech ranks fourth in the FBS, averaging 5.58 yards per carry. The VT single-season record is 5.28 yards per carry, set in 2003.

TURNOVER STATS ON HOKIES, CAVS

- In four wins Tech is +8 (11 takes/3 gives) in turnover margin and +40 in points off turnovers.
- In six losses, Tech is -6 (4 takes/10 gives) and -14 in points off turnovers. UVA is even on the season (17 takes/17 gives).
- Tech is 13-2 under Fuente when forcing two or more INTs.
- S Divine Deablo is tied for the ACC lead with three INTs.

MORE TIDBITS ON TECH VS. UVA

- VT leads the ACC in rushing offense (238.9 ypg), while UVA ranks fourth in rushing defense (125.9 ypg).
- Tech ranks seventh in the ACC in total offense (438.4 ypg), while UVA ranks eighth (434.6 ypg).
- Tech K Brian Johnson owns three made FGs of 50+ yards in 2020, the best total by any VT kicker dating back to 1987.

FIRST FIVE SEASONS AT VT FOR JUSTIN FUENTE

- Head coach Justin Fuente produced a 37-24 (.607) record in his first five seasons with the Hokies* (through 8 games in 2020)
- Fuente is the only coach in Tech history to register three seasons with eight or more wins in his initial four campaigns in Blacksburg.

YOUTH IS SERVED ON TECH'S O-LINE

- Out of a total of 65 possible starts on Tech's offensive line in 2019, exactly ZERO were made by seniors.
- In fact, 90.8% of Tech's O-line starts (59 of 65) were made by underclassmen in 2019. Redshirt Juniors had the other five starts - Austin Cannon (3), Zachariah Hoyt (2) and T.J. Jackson (1).
- Only 28 true freshman FBS offensive linemen played more than 500 snaps in 2019. Tech boasted two of them in Doug Nester and Bryan Hudson.
- Tech's starting lineup on the offensive line over the last four games of the 2019 regular season consisted of the following: LT Christian Darrisaw (Soph.), LG Lecitus Smith (R-Soph.), C Bryan Hudson (Fresh.), RG Doug Nester (Fresh.) and RT Luke Tenuta (R-Fresh.).

PREP QBS EXCEL IN NEW POSITIONS FOR VT

• Virginia Tech has a long tradition of converting talented high school QBs to new positions and having them excel for the Hokies, including these three key players for Tech in 2020.

TE JAMES MITCHELL - BIG STONE GAP, VA

- Versatile performer who posted four TDs on five rushing attempts in 2019.
- Also caught 21 receptions for 361 yards with two TDs.

WR TAYVION ROBINSON - VIRGINIA BEACH, VA

- Speedy receiver & return man tied for second on VT with 31 catches, adding 404 receiving yards with one TD in 2019.
- Had a team-high 13 punt returns for 185 yards (14.1 avg.), as well as 11 rushes for 132 yards in 2019.
- Robinson earned PFF College All-Freshman First Team honors as a punt returner in 2019.

S DIVINE DEABLO - WINSTON-SALEM, N.C.

- Began his Tech career as a wide receiver before switching to defensive back.
- Owns 24 career starts at defensive back for Tech.
- Finished second on the squad with 84 total tackles (42 solo). Also posted 4.5 TFL, an INT and returned a fumble for a 98-yard TD at Notre Dame (11/2/19).

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. – Brian Delaney connected on a 48-yard field goal with 1:23 left to play, and Virginia defensive lineman Eli Hanback recovered a Virginia Tech fumble in the end zone with a minute to go to lift the Cavaliers to a 39-30 victory over the Hokies in this year's Commonwealth Clash played at Scott Stadium.

With the loss, the Hokies fell to 8-4 overall on the season, 5-3 in the ACC and saw their 15-game winning streak over the Cavaliers come to an end. Virginia moved to 9-3 overall, 6-2 in the ACC and won the league's Coastal Division for the first time.

The Hokies led 30-27 after Brian Johnson drilled a career-long 47-yard field goal with 10:58 remaining, but Virginia answered on its ensuing possession, tying the game on Delaney's 25-yard field goal with 7:35 to go.

Tech then drove into Virginia territory on its next possession, but the drive ended when UVA's Noah Taylor intercepted a Hendon Hooker pass at the Virginia 35 with less than 5 minutes remaining. The Cavaliers converted that turnover into Delaney's 48-yard field goal to take a 33-30 lead.

The Hokies' next possession was a mess. Hooker was sacked on the first two plays of the drive, leaving the Hokies with a third-and-21 from the Tech 7. On the next play, Virginia defensive lineman Mandy Alonso sacked Hooker, stripping him of the ball, and Hanback recovered the ball in the end zone for the touchdown with 61 seconds left, all but sealing the game.

The Hokies finished with 483 yards of offense and were led by Hooker, who completed 18 of 30 passes for 311 yards, with a touchdown and two interceptions. He also rushed for 44 yards.

Virginia quarterback Bryce Perkins led the Cavaliers, accounting for 475 yards of offense. He threw for 311 and rushed for 164.

- Virginia Tech and Virginia have met 101 times previously with the Hokies winning 58 times, the Cavaliers winning 39 times and five games have ended in a tie (last in 1977).
- The series has seen 23 games played at a neutral location, with the most recent coming in 1963 in Roanoke. Each of the last 56 meetings have been on campus.
- Tech has won 19 of the last 21 meetings dating back to the 2003 season, representing the best streak in an annually contested rivalry game in college football.

2016 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

- The consensus 2016 ACC Coach of the Year, Fuente was also named the top first-year FBS head coach in the nation by the Football Writers Association of America, sharing that honor with USC's Clay Helton.
- Tech finished the 2016 season ranked No. 16 in both the AP Poll and the Coaches Poll, marking the highest final mark for the Hokies since 2010 (No. 16 AP, No. 15 Coaches).
- Virginia Tech, Penn State, Colorado, West Virginia and Western Michigan all finished in the AP Top 25 after getting zero votes in the AP Preseason Poll.
- Tech's 10 wins were the team's most since 2011 and the most ever by a first-year Virginia Tech head coach, surpassing the previous mark of nine wins by C.P. Miles in 1905.

- Fuente was named Virginia Tech's head coach on Nov. 29, 2015 after orchestrating a dramatic resurrection of the football fortunes at the University of Memphis.
- The Hokies enter their fifth season under Fuente, who has compiled a 37-26 record in Blacksburg.
- The only other active ACC head coach that can top Fuente's 33 wins in his first three seasons at an ACC school is Clemson's Dabo Swinney (36).
- Since Fuente arrived in Blacksburg in 2016, the only ACC schools with more wins are Clemson (55)
- Tech extended its streak of consecutive bowl appearances to 27 straight seasons in 2019 under Fuente, the longest active streak in the nation and third-longest streak all-time in NCAA history.
- The Hokies have finished in the Top 25 twice in Fuente's four seasons at the helm in Blacksburg.
- Tech finished the 2016 season ranked No. 16 in both the AP Poll and the Coaches Poll and concluded the 2017 season at No. 24 in the AP Top 25 and No. 25 in the Coaches Poll.
- The Hokies own a 27-7 mark under Fuente when scoring 30+ points and are 32-4 when leading at halftime.
- Fuente's reputation for exemplary work with the offense and quarterbacks was once again on display in 2019. Despite utilizing a fourth different primary quarterback for a fourth straight year, QB Hendon Hooker helped jumpstart Tech's season by winning his first six collegiate starts for the Hokies..
- The Hokies have produced the top three passing seasons in school history since Fuente and offensive coordinator Brad Cornelsen arrived at Tech - 2016 (261.4 ypg), 2018 (253.8 ypg) and 2017 (239.5 ypg).
- Despite not entering the starting lineup until the season's third contest in 2018, QB Ryan Willis threw 24 TDs, a mark that tied as the second-best in school history.
- The Hokies finished the 2017 season fourth in the FBS in scoring defense (14.8 ppg) and posted an FBS-best three shutouts, while only Michigan (26.1%) held foes to a lower third-down conversion rate than VT (25.2).

- Virginia Tech has continued its special teams success under Fuente and special teams coordinator, James Shibest. The Hokies blocked a pair of punts that were recovered for TDs in 2018. Tech also ranked sixth among FBS squads in 2018, permitting 350 combined punt and kickoff return yards.
- Virginia Tech, LSU and Georgia were the only three Power Five teams to rank in the NCAA's top 10 in both Red Zone Offense and Red Zone defense in 2019. Tech led the ACC in both categories in 2019.
- The Hokies are 26-1 when holding foes to 21 points or fewer. Tech was 6-1 in such games during the 2019 season.

BLACKSBURG — Virginia Tech scored on five of its eight first-half possessions, and Quincy Patterson II accounted for three touchdowns off the bench to carry the No. 20 Hokies to a 45-24 victory over NC State in an ACC game at Lane Stadium on Saturday night.

Despite playing without 23 players and four coaches because of coronavirus issues and injuries — including starting quarterback Hendon Hooker — the Hokies got off to a quick start in a season opener delayed by two weeks because of two COVID-related postponements. Tech took advantage of an NC State defense missing three starters out with injuries, jumping out to a 17-0 lead in the first quarter and never looking back.

The Hokies scored on their first three possessions, getting a 46-yard field goal from Brian Johnson and touchdown runs of 37 yards from Khalil Herbert and 8 yards from Raheem Blackshear.

In the second quarter, Patterson came on in relief of starter Braxton Burmeister, who injured his right (throwing) hand while being sacked with 11 minutes left in the first half. Patterson threw touchdown passes on the Hokies' final two drives of the half — a 15-yard strike to Tayvion Robinson and a 16-yard score to James Mitchell — and the Hokies took a 31-10 lead at halftime. He also scored on a 1-yard run in the fourth quarter.

Burmeister returned to the game in the second half, and both he and Patterson combined to played well at the position. Patterson completed 4 of 6 for 75 yards and the two scores, while Burmeister completed 7 of 11 for 106 yards.

Herbert paced the Hokies' efficient ground game, rushing for 104 yards on just six carries. Tech finished with 495 total yards — 314 on the ground.

Tech's defense played a tremendous game as well, holding NC State to just 386 yards and registering six sacks. Devin Leary threw for 165 yards and a score to lead the Wolfpack (1-1, 1-1).

DURHAM, N.C. — Khalil Herbert ran for 208 yards and two touchdowns, Braxton Burmeister accounted for three scores, and undermanned Virginia Tech outlasted Duke 38-31 in an ACC game played Saturday evening at Wallace Wade Stadium.

With the victory, the Hokies — who played without 21 players and two coaches — moved to 2-0 on the season, 2-0 in the ACC. Duke fell to 0-4, 0-4 in league play, and lost to Tech for the ninth consecutive time in Durham.

For the second consecutive week, the Hokies played with a limited roster. A week ago, Tech was missing 23 players in its victory over NC State.

"A majority of what we dealt with last week was offensively," Tech coach Justin Fuente said. "We had a large number of guys out, but a large number of those guys that played had not practiced very much — but you have a little more control over it on offense. What really scares you is on the defensive side of the ball when your numbers start to get low at a particular position."

"There's no punting on defense. You can't escape it. You can't get off the field. In my opinion, that's where it can become dangerous if you're in a situation where you so thin some place that you can envision a scenario where you're in serious jeopardy out there because you can't get off the field. We weren't to that point, quite. In my opinion, we were close, and that scares you."

Tech's offense certainly aided the defense, holding the ball for more than 34 minutes behind Herbert, whose 208 yards rushing were the seventh-most ever by a Tech running back in a single game and the most since Darren Evans set the school record with a 253-yard performance against Maryland in 2008.

"Just helping the team out and coming out with a win is really the big thing," Herbert said. "We had to fight for this one, so just helping the team win and winning the game is the best part about it."

The Hokies finished with 324 yards rushing — their second-best performance in an ACC game. A week ago, Tech rushed for 314 yards in its 45-24 victory over NC State.

Duke grabbed a 14-10 lead on Deon Jackson's 10-yard run early in the third quarter, but Burmeister guided Tech on long scoring drives. He scored on a 2-yard run with 9:17 left that gave the Hokies the lead for good, and on Tech's next possession, he led the Hokies on a 94-yard march that ended with his 14-yard touchdown run that gave the 24-14 lead.

The Blue Devils twice cut the Tech lead to three points in the fourth quarter, but each time, Herbert answered. The graduate transfer from Kansas scored on a 23-yard run with 9:58 to give Tech a 31-21 lead and then iced the game with a 60-yard run that gave the Hokies a 38-28 lead with 2:20 remaining.

Burmeister didn't play his best — he turned the ball over twice and completing just 9 of 25 attempts — but he accounted for three scores. He rushed for the two touchdowns and threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to James Mitchell in the first quarter.

Playing without several starters in the secondary, Tech's defense held Duke to 410 yards. That group also had an interception and sacked Duke quarterback Chase Brice seven times.

CHAPEL HILL, NC — Michael Carter rushed for a career-high 214 yards, Javonte Williams added another 169 on the ground, and No. 8 North Carolina rolled to a 56-45 ACC victory over No. 19 Virginia Tech on Saturday afternoon at Kenan Stadium.

The loss marked the first of the season for the Hokies, who fell to 2-1 overall, 2-1 in the ACC. North Carolina moved to 3-0 overall, 3-0 in league play.

North Carolina sprinted out to a 21-0 first-quarter lead thanks in part to two Williams touchdown runs and never looked back. Carter had two touchdown runs in the second half, including a 62-yarder that all but iced the game with 8:49 remaining.

The Tar Heels finished with 399 yards rushing on a day in which the Hokies played without both of their starting safeties (undisclosed reasons).

The Hokies were down 42-17 after Carter scored on a 16-yard run with 7:14 remaining in the third quarter, but Tech made a game of it, scoring touchdowns on three consecutive possessions. The Hokies cut the lead to 42-37 on a 33-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Hendon Hooker to receiver Tayvion Robinson with 15 seconds left in the third quarter. Tech went for two points to create a one-possession game, but Hooker's pass to James Mitchell was broken up, leaving the Hokies down by just five.

But North Carolina answered on its ensuing possession. The Tar Heels marched 75 yards in just six plays and scored on quarterback Sam Howell's 12-yard touchdown pass to Dazz Newsome. The extra point gave the Tar Heels a 49-37 lead with 12:37 remaining.

The Hokies punted on their next possession, and Carter then delivered the dagger. On the fourth play of the drive, he burst up the right sideline and scored to give the Tar Heels a 56-37 lead.

Tech finished with 495 yards of offense. Khalil Herbert again led the way, rushing for 138 yards and two touchdowns. Hooker completed 7 of 13 for 136 yards and two touchdowns.

BLACKSBURG, VA — Hendon Hooker ran for a career-high 164 yards and three touchdowns and threw for a score in No. 23 Virginia Tech's 40-14 victory over Boston College.

Khalil Herbert added 143 yards rushing for the Hokies (3-1, 3-1 Atlantic Coast Conference). They ran for 350 yards in bouncing back from a road loss to North Carolina.

Tech played without more than 20 players in wins over NC State and Duke and without 15 in the loss to the Tar Heels — and missed coaches in all of those games. But only two starters were out against the Eagles (one because of an injury), all the coaches were available, and Hooker looked comfortable in his first start of the season.

It all added up to the Hokies' best performance of the season.

"Just awfully proud of our coaches and players bouncing back," Virginia Tech coach Justin Fuente said. "It was kind of cool to have all our coaches on the sideline and in the booth today for the first time. Hopefully, we'll continue to get some of our guys back as we go through the season."

"I think it's pretty obvious what the story tonight was — creating turnovers on defense and rushing the ball on offense ... Happy to get the win."

Virginia Tech scored off of four of BC's five turnovers to pull away. The Eagles (3-2, 2-2) turned it over three times in the first half alone, with the most damaging coming when quarterback Phil Jurkovec overthrew an open Jaalen Gill deep in Virginia Tech territory. Devin Taylor intercepted the pass for the Hokies, and Hooker's 29-yard touchdown pass to Herbert made it 17-7.

Boston College cut it to 17-14 on a touchdown pass from Jurkovec to Hunter Long with 7:11 left in the third quarter, but the Hokies scored the final 24 points — 17 of those off BC turnovers.

Jurkovec threw for 345 yards and two touchdowns, but he also turned the ball over three times.

WINSTON SALEM, NC — An inability to convert in the red zone, three turnovers, and 10 penalties hurt No. 19 Virginia Tech on Saturday, and the Hokies fell 23-16 to Wake Forest in an ACC game at Truist Field.

With the loss, the Hokies fell to 3-2 overall on the season, 3-2 in ACC play. Wake Forest won its third consecutive game, moving to 3-2 overall, 2-2 in league play. "It's obviously my responsibility to get our team out there playing well," Tech coach Justin Fuente said. "We made uncharacteristic mistakes. I don't remember the last time we had that many penalties. We turned the football over. We were poor in the red zone. We weren't very good on third down. Just disappointed. We should have done a better job."

Tech fell behind 10-0 in the first quarter and never led in this one. The Hokies did tie the game at 10 in the second quarter on a Brian Johnson field goal and a 39-yard touchdown pass from Hendon Hooker to James Mitchell with 8:40 left in the first half.

But the Demon Deacons responded with a 17-play, 75-yard drive that ended with Kenneth Walker III's 6-yard touchdown run with 1:31 left in the half and gave them the lead for good. Wake Forest then made arguably the biggest play of the game on the ensuing possession, when — with the Hokies driving — Nick Anderson intercepted a Hooker pass with 4 seconds left to end the half.

The Anderson interception was emblematic of the Hokies' struggles in the red zone. Tech made four trips inside the Wake Forest 20, but only converted those into two Johnson field goals.

"We turned the ball over," Fuente said when asked about the cause of the red zone problems. "They play a little bit of a bend-but-don't break defense, but they came out and challenged us a little more on the outside. We didn't really make any big plays, I thought, in the passing game. We ran the ball still OK [223 yards rushing] against a pretty loaded box, but we really didn't make very many plays, I feel like, throwing the ball. You can look at the passing yards."

"I don't know. We just weren't very effective down there. We had very few chunk plays, and we turned the ball over. That's what you get."

In the fourth quarter, Wake Forest pushed its lead to 23-13 on a field goal by Nick Sciba with 11:05 remaining, but the Hokies cut the lead to 23-16 on a 54-yard field goal by Johnson with 2:38 to go.

Tech got a stop on the ensuing possession, but Wake Forest downed its punt at the Tech 2, and the Hokies' drive ended with Hooker's third interception of the game — all by Anderson.

Tech finished with 433 yards and outgained Wake Forest (346), but just couldn't capitalize because of all the mistakes. Hooker completed 17 of 33 for 223 yards, with the touchdown and three interceptions. Khalil Herbert rushed for 64 yards on 14 carries.

Christian Beal-Smith led Wake Forest with 129 yards rushing. The Demon Deacons finished with 236 yards on the ground.

LOUISVILLE — After suffering through arguably the worst game of his career in the Virginia Tech football team's loss at Wake Forest, Hendon Hooker responded with arguably his best.

Hooker rushed for three touchdowns, and he completed 10 of 10 for 183 yards to lift the Hokies to a 42-35 victory over Louisville on Saturday in an ACC game played at Cardinals Stadium.

With the win, the Hokies moved to 4-2 overall, 4-2 in the ACC. Louisville fell to 2-5, 1-5 in league play.

Behind Hooker, the Hokies jumped all over the Cardinals right from the start, opening a 21-0 lead and then they scored on four consecutive possessions in the second half to pull away.

"Awfully proud of our guys — congratulations to our players and our staff," Tech coach Justin Fuente said. "Great response today. It wasn't always pretty, but we found a way to get the job done."

Louisville — missing six defensive linemen for undisclosed reasons — cut Tech's lead to 42-35 on a 16-yard touchdown pass from Malik Cunningham to Javian Hawkins with a minute left in the game. But the Hokies recovered the onside kick and ran out the clock for the victory.

Tech's offense put together an impressive performance, amassing 466 yards in the game. Tech rushed for more than 200 yards for the sixth consecutive game, did not turn the ball over, and scored on all five of its red-zone opportunities.

Tech, which scored on seven of 11 possessions the game, started quickly, needing only five plays on its first possession — all runs — to get in the end zone. Hooker's 6-yard touchdown run, and Brian Johnson's extra point gave the Hokies a 7-0 lead less than five minutes into the game.

Hooker added two more touchdown runs on back-to-back possessions spanning the first and second quarters. A Devin Taylor interception led to Hooker's 3-yard scoring run, and early in the second quarter — with the Hokies facing a fourth-and-goal from the 1 — Hooker scored to give the Hokies a 21-point lead.

Louisville scored the final 14 points of the first half to cut the lead to 21-14 at halftime, with the big play coming on a 90-yard run by Javian Hawkins on the final play of the half.

But Tech answered on the first possession of the second half, sparking a dominant second-half performance by the offense. A 63-yard drive ended with Tré Turner scoring on a 1-yard run, and Johnson's extra point gave Tech a 28-14 lead with 11:15 left in the third quarter.

Herbert rushed for 147 yards on 21 carries for the Hokies, who rushed for 283 yards. Turner caught four passes for 71 yards.

Cunningham paced the Cardinals by throwing for a career-high 350 yards and three touchdowns, but was intercepted the three times.

BLACKSBURG — Alex Barbir's 51-yard field goal with 1 second remaining overshadowed a great game by Virginia Tech quarterback Hendon Hooker and propelled No. 25 Liberty to a 38-35 upset of the Hokies in a nonconference game Saturday at Lane Stadium.

With the loss, Tech fell to 4-3 overall. Liberty moved to 7-0 and extended its winning streak to eight consecutive games going back to last season.

Barbir's kick punctuated a wild ending for the Flames, who rallied from a 20-14 halftime deficit and moved to 7-0 for the first time in program history.

Barbir had a 59-yard attempt blocked with 8 seconds left, and Tech's Jermaine Waller returned it to the end zone for what appeared to be the game-winning score for the Hokies. But officials ruled that Virginia Tech had called a timeout before the attempt.

"I've always done this," Virginia Tech coach Justin Fuente said. "I don't believe in waiting till the last second to call a timeout in those situations because I don't like ever letting the kicker a free swing at it. I hollered timeout, and I guess I waited too long. That's what I told the team — it's on me."

Liberty then elected to go for it on fourth-and-6 from the Virginia Tech 41. Malik Willis found CJ Yarbrough for an 8-yard gain at the Virginia Tech 33 with 5 seconds left, allowing Barbir to come out for a shorter 51-yard attempt, which he drilled.

Hooker paced Virginia Tech, throwing for 217 yards and three touchdowns and rushing for 156 yards and a touchdown. His 12-yard touchdown pass to Tré Turner with 52 seconds remaining tied the game at 35, setting up the wild ending. He also threw touchdown passes of 3 yards to Nick Gallo and 9 yards to Kaleb Smith.

Tech finished with 418 yards of offense.

BLACKSBURG — Hendon Hooker accounted for 260 yards and a touchdown, but it wasn't enough as No. 9 Miami rallied from a double-digit, third-quarter deficit to beat the Hokies 25-24 in an ACC game played Saturday afternoon at Lane Stadium.

With the loss, the Hokies fell to 4-4 on the season, 4-3 in ACC play. Miami, which won its fourth straight game, moved to 7-1 overall, 6-1 in league play.

Tech was in great shape in the third quarter, taking a 24-13 lead on a 38-yard field goal by Brian Johnson with 6:14 left in the quarter. But the 'Canes scored the game's final 12 points and held the Hokies scoreless on their final five possessions.

Miami quarterback D'Eriq King guided the 'Canes on two long second-half scoring marches. A 13-play, 75-yard drive ended with Cam'Ron Harris' 6-yard touchdown run. The 'Canes failed on a two-point conversion attempt, but they cut the lead to 24-19 with 1:27 left in the third quarter.

Roughly 10 minutes later, Miami put together a 10-play, 82-yard drive that ended with King throwing a dart to Mark Pope on a quick slant for a 36-yard touchdown. Miami again went for two points and failed, but the 'Canes grabbed a 25-24 lead with 5:59 left in the game — their first lead.

But Tech just couldn't get into scoring position after that. The Hokies' next two drives ended with an interception and a punt, and on their final drive of the game, they only got to their 43 before being forced to rely on multiple laterals on the game's final play. Jaelan Phillips and Gurvan Hall Jr. tackled Hooker near the Miami sideline to end the game.

King, who rushed for a 10-yard touchdown in the second quarter, completed 24 of 38 for Miami, which amassed 386 yards.

Hooker paced Virginia Tech, throwing for 201 yards and rushing for 59 yards and a touchdown.

PITTSBURGH — Pittsburgh outscored Virginia Tech 24-0 in the second half and the Panthers rolled, knocking off the Hokies 47-14 in an ACC game played Saturday evening at Heinz Field.

The Hokies lost their third consecutive game and fell to 4-5 overall, 4-4 in the ACC. Pittsburgh moved to 5-4 overall, 4-4 in league play and beat the Hokies for the sixth time in the past seven meetings between the two programs at Heinz Field.

Tech trailed 23-14 at halftime, but on its first drive of the second half, quarterback Hendon Hooker threw an interception. The Panthers capitalized, scoring on a 53-yard field goal by Alex Kessman that made the score 26-14 with 12:25 left in the third quarter.

Unfortunately, the turning point in the game occurred on the Hokies' next possession. Tech drove all the way to the Pittsburgh 1, but couldn't get in the end zone on three straight plays, turning the ball over on downs. Four plays later, Pittsburgh quarterback Kenny Pickett threw a 64-yard touchdown pass to DJ Turner that pushed the lead to 33-14 with 8:43 left in the third quarter. The Hokies never recovered.

Hooker led the Hokies, completing 13 of 22 for a season-high 260 yards, with two touchdowns and an interception. Khalil Herbert led Tech on the ground, rushing for 72 yards.

Pickett completed 35 of 52 for 404 yards, with two touchdowns and an interception. Turner caught 15 passes for 184 yards and a touchdown.

BLACKSBURG — Facing fourth-ranked Clemson Saturday night, Virginia Tech football battled all the way up until midway through the third quarter, then the Tigers scored 28 unanswered to go on to win 45-10 in Lane Stadium.

Tech (4-6, 4-5 ACC) was in it at the five-minute mark in the third quarter, driving at its own 20, following a clutch interception by safety Divine Deablo in the end zone off of preseason ACC Player of the Year Trevor Lawrence, but shot itself in the foot with a fumble, which led to a Tiger score two plays later.

The Hokies never recovered, going three and out on their next drive and then fumbling on their ensuing possession, which resulted in a scoop and score by Clemson's Derion Kenrick (66 yards) to put the game away.

Playing three quarterbacks due to injuries during the game, Tech never found its rhythm in the second half, resulting in 119 yards of offense in the third and fourth frames. Clemson (9-1, 8-1), which has league five years in a row, kicked it in gear the last 20 minutes and scored 28 points alone during that time frame.

There were some bright spots for the Hokies, though, as running back Khalil "Juice" Herbert rushed for 96 yards and had a touchdown, Tech's lone of the day. Kicker Brian Johnson banged in a 54-yard field goal, becoming the first Virginia Tech kicker to make three or more 50-yard field goals in a single season, and the defense held Lawrence to 12-of-22 passing for a season-low 195 yards (min. 10 attempts).

Tech will be back in action next Saturday, Dec. 12 in Lane Stadium to take on in-state rival Virginia (5-4, 4-4). The game time and network have not been selected yet.
