

**No. 13 Ohio 62, No. 4 Seed Virginia 58**  
**Saturday, March 20, 2021**

**Team Notes**

- Virginia (18-7) made its seventh consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance
- UVA won 18 or more games for the 10th straight season
- The Cavaliers shot a season-low 35 percent (21 of 60) from the field
- Ohio owned a 21-15 first-half rebound advantage
- Ohio outrebounded Virginia 38-29
- UVA forced its 19th shot clock violation
- UVA's three turnovers marked a season low
- Ohio used a 10-0 run to gain a 47-40 lead
- UVA started the second half on a 10-4 run
- The Cavaliers shot 35.7 percent (10 of 28) in the opening half and led 28-27 at halftime
- UVA limited Ohio to 10 of 28 shooting, including 4 of 15 from 3-point range, in the first half
- UVA is 1-3 all-time vs. Ohio
- UVA is 3-4 all-time vs. current MAC members
- UVA finished 2-3 on neutral courts in 2020-21

**NCAA Tournament Notes**

- The Cavaliers are 35-23 all-time in the NCAA Tournament
- UVA is 12-7 in the NCAA round of 64
- UVA is 4-3 as a No. 4 seed in the NCAA Tournament (3-1 in 1995, 1-1 in 2007 and 0-1 in 2021)
- Virginia head coach Tony Bennett is 16-9 in 10 NCAA tournaments, including a 13-7 record in eight NCAA tournaments at UVA
- UVA's three turnovers marked an NCAA Tournament low

**Player Notes**

- Double Figure Scorers: Sam Hauser (15), Trey Murphy III (12)
- Hauser finished his career with 1,682 points (400 in one season at Virginia)
- Hauser had a team-high nine rebounds
- Hauser reached double figures in 23 games
- Murphy III reached double figures for the 17th time
- Huff (4 blocked shots) recorded his 19th multi-block game (46th career)
- Reece Beekman matched a career high with two blocked shots
- Hauser, Murphy, and Kihei Clark led UVA with six points each in the first half
- Casey Morsell had five of his seven points in the first half
