QUICK KICKS

- Virginia posted an 8-3-1 record in the fall, finishing third in the standings with a 5-2-1 ACC mark.
- The Hoos advanced to the semifinals of the ACC Tournament before falling to then No. 1 UNC.
- Midfielder **Lia Godfrey** was named the ACC Freshman of the Year.
- Five players earned All-ACC honors with **Alexa Spaanstra** named to the first team. Godfrey, **Rebecca Jarrett** and **Diana Ordoñez** were named to the second team. **Samar Guidry** and Godfrey were named All-Freshman honorees.
- The 12 games played in the fall counted toward selection for the NCAA Tournament this spring.
- **Alexa Spaanstra** notched at least a point in five straight matches after returning to action against Louisville (10/15) with five goals and two assists in that time to close the fall schedule
- **Rebecca Jarrett** is the only player to start all 12 games for the Cavaliers in the fall season and has scored in three of the last six matches with goals vs. Boston College, Syracuse and George Mason
- The Hoos have started 13 different lineups through the 16 matches played in the 2020-21 season
- **Diana Ordoñez** vaulted to the team lead in points (22) after tallying at least one point in seven of the last 11 matches with eight goals and four assists in that span.
- Ordoñez tallied a hat trick against Louisville - only the fifth in ACC Tournament history and the first since the 2004 ACC Tournament. She is only the second non-UNC player to accomplish the feat.
- Virginia has played three spring matches, going 2-1 with the most recent coming at West Virginia.
- The Cavaliers have never faced SIUE on the soccer pitch in the history of the program.
- Should the Cavaliers advance past the first round, it will set up only the second ever meeting between Virginia and BYU with the last being a home match for UVA in the 2001 season.

GODFREY NAMED ACC FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

- Midfielder Lia Godfrey was named the ACC Freshman of the Year following the completion of the fall schedule
- Godfrey is the fourth Cavaliers named to the honor since it's inception in the 1991 season
- She joins Becky Sauerbrunn (2003), Jess Rostedt (2005) and Morgan Brian (2011) in earning the distinction

PAIR OF CAVALIERS SELECTED IN NWSL DRAFT

- Two Cavaliers were taken in the 2021 NWSL Draft as Alissa Gorzak and Taryn Torres both had their names called
- Gorzak was selected by the Chicago Red Stars while Torres was taken by Gotham FC (formerly Sky Blue)
- Torres elected to return for the spring and the fall 2021 season, while Gorzak in her fifth year already elected to join Chicago
- Virginia is one of three schools to have a player taken in every year of the NWSL Draft
- The Cavaliers also have a pair of players who were taken first overall in Morgan Brian (2015) and Emily Sonnett (2016)

STAUDE NAMED DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK AFTER SPRING OPENER

- Talia Stauder was named ACC Defensive Player of the Week following the spring opener against George Mason
- Stauder helped the Cavaliers post a shutout and added an assist when she connected with Rebecca Jarrett

SPAANSTRA NAMED ACC CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOLLOWING LOUISVILLE, FSU MATCHES

- Junior forward **Alexa Spaanstra** was named ACC Co-Offensive Player of the Week following matches with Louisville and FSU
- Spaanstra returned to action against No. 13 Louisville after missing three matches with injury and scored both UVA goals
- The forward hit a PK against FSU to spark a rally as the Hoos would come back to tie the match at 3-3 after the early deficit

CONSTANT COLLECTS WEEKLY HONORS FROM THE ACC AND TOP DRAWER SOCCER

- Junior defender Claire Constant was named ACC Co-Defensive Player of the Week following the UVA win at Virginia Tech
- Constant hit her first career game-winner with a golden goal in the 94th minute off a corner kick from Lia Godfrey
- In addition to the ACC honor, Constant was also named to the Top Drawer Soccer team of the week for her performance

JARRETT TWICE NAMED TO TOP DRAWER SOCCER TEAM OF THE WEEK

- Junior forward Rebecca Jarrett has twice been named to the Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week this season
- Jarrett first earned the recognition on Oct. 6 after a pair of assists and a goal in the Hoos' 3-0 win over Miami
- She earned it a second time on Nov. 3 after two goals and an assist in wins at Boston College and Syracuse

GODFREY NAMED TO TOP DRAWER SOCCER TEAM OF THE WEEK FOLLOWING SEASON OPENER

- Freshman midfielder **Lia Godfrey** was named to the Top Drawer Soccer team of the week following the season opener
- Godfrey assisted on what proved to be the game-winning goal, connecting with **Alex Spaanstra** on a corner kick
- She then added her own goal minutes later when she scored on a **Cam Lexow** pass from **Ashlynn Serepca** for the 3-0 lead

WHO'S BACK FOR THE HOOS?

- UVA returns 17 letterwinners and seven starters from last year's squad that advanced to a 26th straight NCAA Tournament
- Back are four players who earned post-season honors from the ACC - forward **Diana Ordoñez**, and midfielders **Alexa Spaanstra** and **Taryn Torres** were all second-team selections. Goalkeeper **Laurel Ivory** was a third-team selection
- Ordoñez was also an ACC All-Freshman Team selection for the Cavaliers last season
- Torres and Spaanstra were both All-Region selections by the United Soccer Coaches last season
- Defender **Talia Staudé** and Ordoñez were both named Top Drawer Soccer Best XI Freshman Team selections
- UVA returners contributed 45-of-63 goals scored (71%) a year ago and 44-of-52 assists (82%)
- Among those are four of the top five goal scorers - Ordoñez (15), **Ashlynn Serepca** (7), **Sydney Zandi** (5) and **Rebecca Jarrett** (5) and four of five of the top assist leaders - Spaanstra (12), Jarrett (8), **Anna Sumpter** (6) and Ordoñez (4)

ORDOÑEZ PICKS UP WHERE SHE LEFT OFF, KEEPS SCORING FOR THE HOOS IN OPENER

- **Diana Ordoñez**, who is the top returning goal scorer in the ACC, scored the opening goal of UVA's match with Virginia Tech
- She picked up right where she left off and has now scored in three of her last four matches played dating back to last season
- Ordoñez scored in the ACC Championships vs. North Carolina (11/10) and NCAA second round vs. Washington State (11/22)

NEWCOMERS MAKE IMPACT IN CAVALIER DEBUTS

- Members of the highly-touted recruiting class made an impact for the Hoos in the opening game against Virginia Tech
- **Lia Godfrey** assisted on the game-winning goal and added a goal of her own in the closing minutes of the game for her debut
- Defender **Samar Guidry** assisted on the opening goal of the game as she connected with Ordoñez and played 83 minutes
- **Laney Rouse** played 47 minutes along the backline, while **Alexis Theoret** played 32 minutes in the midfield for the Hoos
- Purdue transfer **Sarah Clark** made the start on the back line and played 43 minutes in helping anchor the UVA defense

HOOS PICKED TO FINISH THIRD IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

- The Cavaliers were picked to finish third in the ACC in a preseason vote of league coaches this season
- Virginia received two first place votes and tallied 113 points - picked behind North Carolina and Florida State
- North Carolina was picked to repeat as regular-season champions, while Florida State was picked to finish second
- The Cavaliers finished third in the ACC regular-season standings a year ago and advanced to the finals at the ACC Tournament

PRESEASON ALL-ACC HONOREES

- UVA had sophomore forward **Diana Ordoñez** and junior forward **Alexa Spaanstra** named to the preseason All-ACC team
- Both players were All-ACC second team selections a year ago and named to the ACC Championships All-Tournament Team
- Ordoñez tied for the ACC lead in goals scored last season (15) while Spaanstra was second in the ACC in assists (12)
- The preseason All-ACC team was made up of 11 players and featured players from five different teams
- North Carolina and Florida State each had three players selected, UVA and Louisville had two and Duke had one player

CAVALIERS SET TO PLAY ABBREVIATED SCHEDULE IN THE FALL

- Virginia is set to play an abbreviated schedule this fall made up of 11 contests which all come against ACC teams
- The Cavaliers will play an eight-game conference schedule with three matches designated as non-conference contests
- UVA's two matches against Virginia Tech and a road trip to North Carolina will not count in the ACC standings this season
- The eight-game ACC schedule will feature four home games and four road games
- Virginia will play seven matches against teams that went to the NCAA Tournament in the 2019 season in this schedule
- Of those seven contests, four come on the road at Clemson, Duke, North Carolina and Virginia Tech- the home opponents in that group are FSU, Louisville and Virginia Tech

NCAA COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS STRUCTURE FOR CHAMPIONSHIPS AND SPRING SEASON

- The current recommendation is for brackets to be filled at 75 percent (48 teams) instead of the usual 64 teams
- Fall contests are to be counted toward selection for the championships in the spring when resumes are considered
- The spring season will be played Feb. 3 - April 17 with NCAA Tournament selections to be made on April 19
- The College Cup is set to be conducted May 13-17 and the tournament field will have 31 automatic bids and 17 at-large

IVORY CLIMBING THE RANKS IN THE RECORD BOOK

- In her third season, goalkeeper Laurel Ivory is already working her way into the history books at UVA
- Currently, Ivory is fourth all-time in shutouts with 29 solo shutouts in her career
- With 48 wins, Ivory is third all-time in victories as a keeper - she has a 48-15-10 record for her career

CAVALIERS RESPOND WELL AFTER A LOSS UNDER SWANSON

- Responding after a loss has been a trend for the Cavaliers throughout Steve Swanson's tenure at UVA
- Throughout the 20 seasons under Swanson, Virginia holds a 59-8-13 record in matches following a loss
- The number does not include season-ending losses where the next match would be part of a new season

THE HOOS IN OVERTIME IN THE SWANSON ERA

- The Cavaliers are no stranger to overtime having gone past regulation four times this season with a 2-0-2 mark
- Virginia has gone to extra time in 85 matches during the Steve Swanson era with a 23-12-50 record in those matches
- In those 50 draws, 14 have come in the postseason with the Cavaliers surviving shootouts in five of those 14 matches

PENALTY KICKS, SET PIECES PROVE COSTLY FOR THE CAVALIER DEFENSE IN 2020

- Penalty kicks and set pieces have proven costly for the Cavalier defense this season when it comes to goals allowed
- For the most part, the UVA defense has done its job by limiting opponents to 103 shots this season - 58 on frame
- Virginia has also allowed 20 goals through the season with five of them coming off penalty kicks
- The Hoos have surrendered a goal from PK vs. Virginia Tech (9/12), at Clemson (9/20), Pitt (10/1) at Syracuse (11/1) and vs. UNC in the ACC Tournament semifinals
- Virginia has allowed an additional 10 goals off set pieces making 15 of the 20 goals allowed coming from set pieces

CAVALIER OFFENSE APPLYING PRESSURE BUT LOOKING TO CONVERT MORE CHANCES

- The Virginia offense has kept the pressure on its opponents in 2020, managing a 282-to-103 edge in shots so far
- Of the 282 shots managed so far this season, the Cavaliers have put 124 on frame with 94 of them saved
- UVA has 20 shots in six games - vs Virginia Tech (21), at Virginia Tech (27), Pitt (30), Louisville (24 & 21), and Syracuse (23)
- Despite the high-pressure offense yielding chances, the Hoos have only converted for 31 goals this season
- The 282 shots is tops in the ACC this season and the 17 shots per game tops the ACC (7.75 on goal per game is second)

HOOS EARN UNITED SOCCER COACHES TEAM ACADEMIC AWARD FOR 11TH CONSECUTIVE YEAR

- The Cavaliers were named a recipient of the Team Academic Award by the United Soccer Coaches last week
- It marks the 11th consecutive season for the Hoos to receive the award from the coaches organization
- Teams must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 to be named as a recipient of the award each season

SWANSON HITS THE 400 CAREER COACHING WIN MILESTONE TO PUT HIM AMONG ELITE COMPANY

- UVA head coach Steve Swanson hit a rare milestone vs. NC State (10/25/18), hitting the 400 career win mark
- As a head coach, Swanson holds a 429-161-61 record through stops at Dartmouth, Stanford and Virginia
- Currently only 11 D1 coaches have hit the 400 win milestone with eight of them currently active
- Swanson is one of only nine coaches who has recorded 400 wins all at a D1 institution
- In his coaching career, he has taken all three teams to league titles and the NCAA Tournament

SWANSON GRABS HIS 300TH WIN AS UVA HEAD COACH

- Head Coach Steve Swanson picked up his 300th wins as the head coach of the Cavaliers vs. Liberty (8/25/19)
- Currently, Swanson holds a 324-98-50 record as UVA head coach and is 130-48-20 in ACC matches
- He has 20 consecutive winning seasons at Virginia and 29 overall as a head coach
- Swanson has taken his teams to 23 consecutive NCAA Tournaments with Virginia's inclusion this season

HOOS CONTINUE STRONG PRESENCE IN PROFESSIONAL RANKS ON NWSL ROSTERS

- UVA has a strong presence in professional soccer in the U.S. with 12 players appearing on NWSL rosters last summer
- Last summer five Hoos played on teams in the NWSL Challenge Cup finals with Veronica Latsko playing for the tournament-champion Houston Dash, while Morgan (Brian) Gautrat, Danielle Colaprico, Makenzy Doniak and Zoe Morse competed for Chicago
- Becky Sauerbrunn now competes with the Portland Thorns after being traded by the Utah Royals last season
- Orlando features second-year players Courtney Petersen and Phoebe McClernon. Petersen was a first-round pick of the Pride in 2019. The Orlando Pride traded Emily Sonnett to the Washington Spirit in the off-season.
- Kristen McNabb continues to compete for Reign OC in Seattle.

VIRGINIA HAS STRONG TIES WITH US SOCCER

- The Virginia women's soccer program has strong ties historically with US Soccer
- Current head coach Steve Swanson assisted with the USWNT and previously served as head coach of the U20 team that won the 2012 Women's World
- A total of 11 players have been called up to the USWNT through the program's history, including ACC Network commentators Angela Hucles and Lori Lindsey

THREE FORMER HOOS COMPETE WITH USWNT

- Three former members of the UVA women's soccer program are on recent rosters with the USWNT: Morgan Brian ('14), Becky Sauerbrunn ('07) and Emily Sonnett ('15)
- The trio helped the United States claim a second consecutive FIFA Women's World Cup in 2019
- Danielle Colaprico, the 2014 ACC Midfielder of the Year, was called up for the USWNT in competition with Portugal and Scotland played in November of 2018

OTHER HOOS WITH US SOCCER ON WORLD STAGE

- Rebecca Jarrett and Alexa Spaanstra represented the US in the Concacaf Cup back in the spring to help the US qualify for the U20 Women's World Cup
- Fellow Cavaliers Diana Ordoñez and Talia Staude were part of the Nike Friendlies with the US Team in preparation for the Concacaf Cup along with new freshman Lia Godfrey.

FOUR HOOS REPRESENT THE U.S. IN FRANCE AT 2018 FIFA U20 WOMEN'S WORLD CUP

- Four current members of the UVA women's soccer team represented the U.S. at the 2018 U20 Women's World Cup in France
- Zoe Morse, Laurel Ivory, Taryn Torres and Alexa Spaanstra all earned spots on the U20 roster in '18
- Ivory started all three games of pool play for the U.S. team that went 1-1-1 vs. Japan, Paraguay and Spain

OTHER CONNECTIONS

- Current assistant Jaime Frias joined the Hoos after a stint with US Soccer in player development
- Former head coach Lauren Gregg was head coach of the USWNT from 1997-2000
- Former head coach April Heinrichs coached the USWNT from 2000-2004 and played on the first Women's World Cup Championship team in 1991

JARRETT TIES CAREER PERFORMANCE AGAINST HURRICANES

- Rebecca Jarrett tied a career performance in the Hoos' 3-0 win over Miami this season
- The forward tallied four points with two assists and a goal against the Hurricanes
- The four points ties a career mark she set against William & Mary in the 2019 season
- The two assists tied a career high set against No. 15 Georgetown in the 2019 season
- It marks the second straight season Jarrett has delivered two assists against Miami
- She was named to the Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week (10/6) for her performance

WHITE MAKES MOST OF OPPORTUNITIES IN GOAL

- Redshirt freshman Cayla White has been called into action three times this season and made the most of her chances
- In her first career, start she posted six saves at Virginia Tech and posted a shutout of the Hokies
- White made her second start against Miami and played 72 minutes in the shutout of the Hurricanes
- She drew her third start in the outing against No. 13 Louisville and posted the shutout with two saves against the Cardinals
- It took until her fourth start for White to surrender a goal when Syracuse scored off two set pieces, though she got the win
- The start against the Hokies was her first game in two years as she missed her senior season of high school due to injury and redshirted last season for the Cavaliers

GODFREY CREATING CHANCES TO MAKE HER MARK FOR THE HOOS

- Freshman midfielder Lia Godfrey has had a solid debut season and created chances to make her mark for the Hoos early
- Godfrey is tied for second in the ACC in shots (38) with Ordoñez and is third in shots per game (3.45)
- The freshman is second in the ACC in shots on goal per game (1.91) and second in total shots on goal (21) this season
- Godfrey made an immediate impact with goals vs. Virginia Tech and Duke in the first two matches as a Cavalier
- The freshman also assisted on both game winners vs. Virginia Tech and on a goal in the win over Miami
- In the regular-season finale, Godfrey tallied a career-high four points with a goal and two assists at Syracuse
- In the last outing, Godfrey assisted on the game-winning goal as she connected with Diana Ordoñez

ORDOÑEZ TURNS IN ACC TOURNAMENT'S FIRST HAT TRICK SINCE 2004 IN QUARTERFINAL

- Sophomore forward Diana Ordoñez turned in a hat trick in the quarterfinals against Louisville, scoring UVA's first three goals
- The hat trick was the first for a player at the ACC Tournament since the 2004 season when it was done by UNC's Anne Morrell
- Ordoñez became only the fifth player to tally a hat trick in the ACC Tournament and the second non-UNC player to do so

JARRETT WORKS TO HELP FEED AMERICA DURING PANDEMIC

- Rebecca Jarrett spent time during the summer putting her skills as a graphic designer to work to help people
- The junior designed T-shirts that she sold on Instagram to help raise funds for Feeding America
- Through two rounds of sales, Jarrett raised more than \$800 to donate to the organization's COVID relief efforts

HOOS SET SCORING STANDARD NATIONALLY SINCE 2011

- Virginia has had a high-powered offense under head coach Steve Swanson, but especially since 2011
- Over the last 10 seasons, UVA leads the nation as the one of only five teams with at least 500 goals in that span
- Virginia led the nation in goals scored in 2014 with 88 goals on the way to an NCAA runner-up finish
- UVA also led the nation in goals scored with 78 goals scored throughout the 2013 campaign
- UVA was in the top five nationally last season in goals scored (63), ranking fifth in goals scored with two of the top goal scorers in the nation as Meghan McCool and Diana Ordoñez tied for 19th nationally in goals scored (15)

A LOOK BACK AT THE 2019 SEASON
CAVALIERS PUT STOUT DEFENSE ON PITCH IN 2019

- The Cavaliers played stout defense in 2019 that went beyond just posting 14 shutouts to date this season
- On four occasions last season the Cavaliers limited teams to one shot or fewer - including holding UC Irvine to no shots
- The Hoos limited Liberty (8/25), Minnesota (9/8) and Notre Dame (10/20) to only one shot each and none on goal
- In addition, the Cavaliers also held Miami (10/4) and No. 12 Louisville (10/24) to only two shots with one coming on goal

LIMITED SHOT PRODUCTION LED TO SHUTOUT STREAK IN CONFERENCE PLAY IN 2019 - THE LONGEST SINCE 2013

- UVA posted a seven-match shutout streak from a 1-1 draw at Wake (9/20) through a win over #12 Louisville (10/24) in 2019
- UVA held teams to six shots or fewer in six of nine ACC matches with NC State (13) and FSU (14) the only in double digits
- The seven straight ACC shutouts was a first in UVA history - the previous best was six straight in 2013 (10/13-31)
- Virginia went a perfect 12-0 in ACC play that 2013 season and the Cavaliers shutout nine ACC opponents that year

ORDOÑEZ SCORES IN FIRST FIVE MATCHES FOR UVA TO MATCH DONIAK IN FEAT

- Freshman **Diana Ordoñez** scored in all five matches to start the season, tallying nine goals through those first five games
- She was only the second player to score in each of her first five matches of a Cavalier career
- Makenzy Doniak was the first player to score in her first five matches, accomplishing the feat in the 2012 season
- Doniak tallied six goals through those five matches in her debut season in the Orange and Blue

SPAANSTRA TURNS IN RARE PERFORMANCE WITH FOUR ASSISTS AGAINST LIBERTY

- Sophomore **Alexa Spaanstra** hit rarified air for a Cavaliers with a four-assist match in the win over Liberty
- She assisted on four of the six goals scored by the Cavaliers - including the first four goals scored by UVA
- The two goals without an assist from Spaanstra were a PK and the final goal of the game scored by Ordoñez
- The four assists was the most by a UVA player since a five-assist game from Morgan Brian vs. High Point in 2014
- It's also only the third time a UVA player has tallied four or more assists in a game, the other time being a four-assist performance from Wendy Hartwig vs. UMBC in the 1995 season
- Spaanstra's five assists was the most by any player in the nation during the opening weekend of competition

ZANDI DELIVERS QUICK STRIKE FOR GAME-WINNER AT NO. 8 PENN STATE

- Junior midfielder Sydney Zandi delivered a quick strike on the game-winner at No. 8 Penn State last season
- Her goal came 0:26 seconds after Penn State scored the equalizer in the 85th minute of play
- Zandi's goal was tied for second-fastest answering goal in UVA history, matching Jen Redmond vs. Wake in 2006
- The fastest answering goal in program history was in 0:19 seconds by Lori Lindsey vs. Duke in the 2001 season

CAVALIERS EARN UNITED SOCCER COACHES TEAM ACADEMIC AWARD

- The Cavaliers were recognized by the United Soccer Coaches last season as a Team Academic Award winner
- To earn the recognition the team GPA must be a 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale for all rostered members
- It was the 10th consecutive season for the Cavaliers to be recognized with the academic honor

A PROGRAM RECORD SEVEN CAVALIERS NAMED TO ALL-ACC TEAMS

- Seven Cavaliers were named as All-ACC selections this season setting a new UVA mark for selections in a season
- Meghan McCool earned All-ACC first team honors as the only player from UVA selected to the first team
- Five earned second-team honors - Phoebe McClernon, Diana Ordoñez, Courtney Petersen, Alexa Spaanstra and Taryn Torres
- Junior goalkeeper Laurel Ivory was named to the All-ACC third team
- In addition to All-ACC honors, Diana Ordoñez was named to the ACC All-Freshman Team

FOUR HOOS NAMED TO ACC CHAMPIONSHIPS ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

- Four players earned All-Tournament honors after helping Virginia advance to the ACC Championships finals in 2019
- Rebecca Jarrett (F), Diana Ordonez (F), Alexa Spaanstra (M) and Zoe Morse (D) were recognized with the honor

MCCOOL NAMED ALL-AMERICAN TO LEAD CAVALIERS IN UNITED SOCCER COACHES HONORS

- Senior Meghan McCool became the most recent All-American for UVA as a third team selection by United Soccer Coaches
- It was the 18th season under Steve Swanson for a player to earn All-America honors from the coaches' association
- In all, 25 different players have earned All-America honors from the coaches organization for 41 total All-America selections
- A pair of Hoos earned All-Region honors as McCool was joined by Zoe Morse who earned second-team honors

MCCOOL'S ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA HONOR LEADS HOOS IN RECOGNITION OF ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- Meghan McCool also earned recognition for her academic endeavors when she was named a CoSIDA Academic All-American
- McCool was a second team honoree by CoSIDA and a second-team Scholar All-American by the United Soccer Coaches
- Five players earned Academic All-District honors as Alexa Spaanstra, Rebecca Jarrett, Zoe Morse and Anna Sumpter earned recognition from CoSIDA
- Morse also joined McCool in earning recognition from the United Soccer Coaches with Scholar All-Region honors
- A UVA record eight players earned All-ACC Academic Team honors, leading the league in the category as the five CoSIDA All-District honorees were joined by Laurel Ivory, Talie Staude and Taryn Torres on the league's academic team

UVA IN THE ACC CHAMPIONSHIPS

- Virginia holds a 23-24-9 all-time record in the ACC Championships
- The Hoos have won the ACC Championships twice in program history - 2004 and 2012
- In its nine draws, the Cavaliers have only twice advanced on PKs, once being the 2004 title
- Last season, the Cavaliers advanced to the title match and fell to North Carolina 2-1 in double overtime

UVA WINS THE ACC CHAMPIONSHIP IN 2004, 2012

- UVA won the ACC Championship for the first time in the 2004 season over UNC by shootout
- The Cavaliers claimed the title 5-4 on PKs after playing the Tar Heels to a 1-1 draw
- Lindsay Gusick scored the goal for UVA off a Sarah Huffman assist in the 24th minute
- Virginia won its second ACC Championship in the 2012 season with a 4-0 win over Maryland
- UVA got goals from Morgan Brian, Makenzy Doniak, Gloria Douglas and Caroline Miller

VIRGINIA IN THE ACC CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS

- The Cavaliers have advanced to the ACC Tournament finals seven times in program history
- Virginia is 1-4-2 all-time in the championship match of the ACC Tournament
- The Hoos first advanced to the ACC Tournament Championship in 1990, falling to UNC
- Virginia has advanced to the finals in 1990, 2004, 2005, 2012, 2014, 2015 and 2019

VIRGINIA TOUGH TO BEAT IN OVERTIME IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

- The Cavaliers have been strong in matches that head to overtime in the history of the ACC Tournament
- UVA has played 13 matches that have gone to overtime with a 3-1-9 record in overtime matches
- The Cavaliers' only outright loss in overtime in the ACC Championships came in the 2019 final against UNC
- Virginia's three overtime wins have come against Duke (2001), Wake Forest (2008) and Florida State (2019)
- The Cavaliers have forced a shootout in nine instances when heading to overtime at the ACC Tournament

VIRGINIA IN THE SEMIFINALS AT THE ACC TOURNAMENT

- The Hoos have made 22 appearances in the ACC Tournament semifinals, going 6-13-3 in those matches
- Virginia did not advance in any of the matches that were draws - 2001 vs. FSU, 2007 vs. UNC and 2008 vs. VT
- This marked the fourth consecutive year for Virginia to advance to the semifinal round of the ACC Tournament
- UVA has advanced to the semifinals of the ACC Tournament nine of the last 10 seasons dating back to 2011
- The 2016 season was the only time in the last 10 years UVA has not advanced to at least the semifinal round

A DEEPER LOOK AT VIRGINIA IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

- Virginia has made 33 total appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including 27 consecutive appearances
- The 27 consecutive berths is the second longest active streak behind North Carolina
- Virginia holds a 44-28-7 record in matches played in the NCAA Tournament all-time
- That record is impressive in the Swanson era with a 41-17-6 mark under his leadership
- The Cavaliers have out-scored foes 167-to-88 in NCAA Tournament matches
- That score margin is more pronounced under Swanson coming in at 154-to-63 all-time

VIRGINIA IN THE SERIES WITH SIUE

- Virginia and SIU-Edwardsville have never met on the pitch in the history of the two programs

SHOULD THE CAVALIERS ADVANCE TO THE SECOND ROUND

- Should Virginia pick up the win in the first-round, the 12th-seeded BYU Cougars await the Cavaliers
- Virginia and BYU have met once before with the teams playing in the 2001 season at Klöckner Stadium
- The Cavaliers won that meeting by a score of 3-2 in overtime on October 4 of the 2001 season

HOOS HAVE BEEN A MAINSTAY IN THE POSTSEASON WITH A STRETCH OF DEEP NCAA RUNS

- The Hoos have been a mainstay in the NCAA Tournament with 33 appearances overall and 27 straight berths
- The 33 appearances is second all-time, while the 27 straight appearances is the second longest active streak
- Only North Carolina has more appearances (39) having made every single tournament in NCAA history
- Virginia had an active streak of 14 consecutive appearances in the Sweet 16 until last season's loss to eventual College Cup participant Washington State in the second round

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

- Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.
- First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process. This tends to be used less in athletic eligibility references.
- Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

- Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."
- Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.
- Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

- The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS: ORANGE AND BLUE

- Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.
- One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAHOOWA

- The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.
- Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."
