Series History: Virginia leads all-time 4-2-1

Last Meeting: Virginia won 4-0 at Klöckner in 2013

QUICK KICKS

- After starting the season ranked year nationally, the Hoos moved to No. 3 following a pair of wins in the first week of competition and remained there this week after wins over GMU and GW.
- Lia Godfrey** and **Spaanstra** were also joined by **Haley Hopkins** on the Hermann Trophy Watch List.
- The Cavaliers continue to play a challenging schedule, facing six teams ranked in the preseason top 12 by the United Soccer Coaches and all three other semifinalists from the 2020 College Cup. All three games against 2020 NCAA semifinalists come on the road or at a neutral site.
- UVA returns almost all of its offensive production from last season with 95 percent of its goal production returning (38-of-40 goals) and 31-of-34 assists from last season.
- Virginia is coming off its third College Cup appearance in the last eight seasons after advancing to the national semifinal a year ago. UVA also advanced to the College Cup in 1991, 2013 and 2014.
- In the last outing, **Rebecca Jarrett** turned in a career performance with five points after delivering a brace and an assist. She hit the game-winning goal and tied a career high in goals with the brace.
- The Cavaliers conceded a goal for the first time this season against GW, bringing the shutout streak to an end at 776 minutes dating back to last season's NCAA Tournament opener.
- Laurel Ivory's** part of that shutout streak consisted of 665:06 minutes without allowing a goal to mark the fourth-longest streak. She has two of the top four shutout streaks in UVA history.
- Ivory** is also second all-time in career shutouts with 34 solo shutouts for her career at UVA.
- UVA has had eight players score goals and eight players with assists through four games to date.
- Virginia will continue to play in Harrisonburg on Sunday when the Cavaliers take on host JMU in a 3 p.m. contest at Sentara Park.

WHO'S BACK FOR THE HOOS?

- UVA returns 17 letterwinners and seven starters from last year's squad that advanced to a 26th straight NCAA Tournament
- Back are five players who earned post-season honors from the ACC - forward **Alexa Spaanstra** earned first team honors, while forwards **Rebecca Jarrett** and **Diana Ordoñez**, and midfielder **Lia Godfrey** were second team honorees. **Samar Guidry** earned All-Freshman team honors along with Godfrey.
- Godfrey also earned All-America honors to lead a group of players to earn honors from the United Soccer Coaches
- In addition to Godfrey, Ordoñez and Spaanstra were both All-Region selections by the United Soccer Coaches last season
- UVA returners contributed 38-of-40 goals scored (95%) a year ago and 31-of-34 assists (91%)
- Among those are the top five goal scorers - Ordoñez (12), Spaanstra (10), Jarrett (4), Godfrey (4) and **Claire Constant** (3) and the top assist leaders - Godfrey (9), Ordoñez (5), Lizzy Sieracki (4) and Jarrett (3).

HOOS WELCOME SIX FRESHMEN FOR 2021

- The Cavaliers brought in six freshmen as part of the 2021 newcomer class to Grounds this fall
- Among those players were three ranked in the top 200 nationally by Top Drawer Soccer - midfielder Madeline Simpson (No. 49), defender Kiki Maki (No. 170) and midfielder Charlotte McClure (No. 186)
- Also part of the class is forward Degen Miller who was named the Colorado Gatorade Player of the Year after tallying 43 goals and 16 assists as a senior
- A pair of goalkeepers round out the freshman crop with Camryn Miller who earned Regional Player of the Year honors and Ally Reynolds who earned Top Drawer Soccer DA Playoff standout recognition

ALL-AMERICAN TRANSFER JOINS CAVALIER PROGRAM

- In addition to the six freshmen, the Cavaliers also added a grad transfer with two-time All-American forward Haley Hopkins
- Hopkins comes to the Virginia program with two years of eligibility remaining after graduating from Vanderbilt
- She finished her career with 34 goals - second all-time on the career goal scoring list for in Commodore program history
- Of her 34 goals, 14 were game-winning goal and she added 12 assists for a total of 80 points in her career
- Hopkins was named the Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year in 2018 and earned All-America honors in 2018 and this past season.

IVORY AND CAVALIERS' EXTENDED SHUTOUT STREAK SNAPPED AGAINST GEORGE WASHINGTON

- The Hoos entered the 2021 season riding a shutout streak after posting four clean sheets on a run to the NCAA semifinal
- Laurel Ivory and UVA posted 459:35 scoreless minutes dating back to the NCAA opener against SIUE to close the year
- After shut outs in the first three games, the Hoos have went 776:41 minutes between goals surrendered
- That stretch of 776:41 was the third longest in program history and passed the last stretch of 775:01 set in 2019
- Ivory's streak of 665:06 shutout minutes is fourth all-time at UVA - Ivory has three of the top eight performances
- The fifth-year keeper also holds the second longest shutout streak with 775:01 minutes set in the 2019 season

UP NEXT FOR THE HOOS

- Following the pair of games at JMU this week, the Cavaliers will return home to face No. 7 Penn State and Oklahoma
- UVA will face the Nittany Lions at 8 p.m. on Thursday before facing the Sooners at noon on Sunday afternoon
- Also playing at Klöckner during the week will be NC State who will also face Penn State and Oklahoma

HOOS PICKED TO FINISH THIRD IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

- The Cavaliers were picked to finish third in the ACC in a preseason vote of league coaches this season
- Virginia received one first place vote and tallied 148 points - picked behind Florida State and North Carolina
- Florida State was picked to claim the league title, while North Carolina was picked to finish second
- The Cavaliers finished third in the ACC regular-season standings a year ago and advanced to the College Cup

PRESEASON ALL-ACC HONOREES

- UVA had sophomore midfielder **Lia Godfrey** and senior forward **Alexa Spaanstra** named to the preseason All-ACC team
- Spaanstra was a first team All-ACC selection a year ago and was named an All-Region selection
- Godfrey earned All-America honors and was the ACC Freshman of the Year last season after leading the league in assists (9)
- The preseason All-ACC team was made up of 11 players and featured players from five different teams

IVORY CLIMBING THE RANKS IN THE RECORD BOOK

- In her fifth season, goalkeeper Laurel Ivory is already working her way into the history books at UVA
- Currently, Ivory is second all-time at UVA in shutouts with 34 solo shutouts in her career
- With 55 wins, Ivory is tied for second all-time in victories as a keeper at UVA - she has a 55-15-11 record for her career

CAVALIERS RESPOND WELL AFTER A LOSS UNDER SWANSON

- Responding after a loss has been a trend for the Cavaliers throughout Steve Swanson's tenure at UVA
- Throughout the 21 seasons under Swanson, Virginia holds a 59-8-13 record in matches following a loss
- The number does not include season-ending losses where the next match would be part of a new season

THE HOOS IN OVERTIME IN THE SWANSON ERA

- The Cavaliers are no stranger to overtime having gone past regulation five times last season with a 2-0-3 mark
- Virginia has gone to extra time in 86 matches during the Steve Swanson era with a 23-12-51 record in those matches
- In those 51 draws, 15 have come in the postseason with the Cavaliers surviving shootouts in five of those 15 matches

HOOS EARN UNITED SOCCER COACHES TEAM ACADEMIC AWARD FOR 11TH CONSECUTIVE YEAR

- The Cavaliers were named a recipient of the Team Academic Award by the United Soccer Coaches for the 2020 season
- It marked the 11th consecutive season for the Hoos to receive the award from the coaches organization
- Teams must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 to be named as a recipient of the award each season

SWANSON HITS THE 400 CAREER COACHING WIN MILESTONE TO PUT HIM AMONG ELITE COMPANY

- UVA head coach Steve Swanson hit a rare milestone vs. NC State (10/25/18), hitting the 400 career win mark
- As a head coach, Swanson holds a 437-161-62 record through stops at Dartmouth, Stanford and Virginia
- Currently only 11 D1 coaches have hit the 400 win milestone with seven of them currently active
- Swanson is one of only nine coaches who has recorded 400 wins all at a D1 institution
- In his coaching career, he has taken all three teams to league titles and the NCAA Tournament

SWANSON GRABS HIS 300TH WIN AS UVA HEAD COACH

- Head Coach Steve Swanson picked up his 300th wins as the head coach of the Cavaliers vs. Liberty (8/25/19)
- Currently, Swanson holds a 331-98-51 record as UVA head coach and is 130-48-20 in ACC matches
- He has 21 consecutive winning seasons at Virginia and 29 overall as a head coach
- Swanson has taken his teams to 23 consecutive NCAA Tournaments with Virginia's inclusion last season

HOOS CONTINUE STRONG PRESENCE IN PROFESSIONAL RANKS ON NWSL ROSTERS

- UVA has a strong presence in professional soccer in the U.S. with 10 players appearing on NWSL rosters this season
- Becky Sauerbrunn now competes with the Portland Thorns after being traded by the Utah Royals
- Orlando features second-year players Courtney Petersen and Phoebe McClemon. Petersen was a first-round pick of the Pride in 2019. The Orlando Pride traded Emily Sonnett to the Washington Spirit in the off-season.
- Kristen McNabb continues to compete for Reign OC in Seattle.
- Virginia is one of only three schools to have a player taken in every NWSL Draft

HOPKINS, ORDOÑEZ TALLY BRACES IN 2021 OPENER

- Grad transfer Haley Hopkins made an immediate impact for the Hoos with a brace in the season opener vs. Richmond
- She wasn't the only player to find the net twice as Diana Ordoñez also tallied a brace in the win over the Spiders
- It was the 11th multiple goal game of Hopkins' career, while it was the seventh for Ordoñez

SOPHOMORE GET INVOLVED IN OFFENSIVE ACTION IN OPENER AS YEAR TWO BEGINS

- Sophomore defenders Samar Guidry and Laney Rouse continue to grow in the UVA system as year two kicks off for the Hoos
- Guidry found the net for the first time, scoring an unassisted goal in the second half against the Spiders in the opener
- Rouse also got in on the offensive action, delivering a cross to Hopkins that was headed in for Rouse's first career assist
- The pair started the match against the Spiders on the backline for the Cavaliers
- Sophomore Sarah Brunner also tallied her first career assist when she connected with Cam Lexow for a goal vs. Richmond

HOOS HAVE A PRESENCE IN TOP DRAWER SOCCER PRESEASON TOP 100

- Virginia had several players ranked among the top 100 in the preseason by Top Drawer Soccer with six making the list
- Alexa Spaanstra led the list, coming in at No. 20 in the ranking after earning All-ACC and All-Region honors a year ago
- Rebecca Jarrett was ranked No. 23 after earning All-ACC honors and All-Region honors and being named to the College Cup All-Tournament team a year ago
- ACC Freshman of the Year Lia Godfrey came in at 34 on the list after picking up All-America honors in her freshman season
- Talie Staude (43), Haley Hopkins (49) and Diana Ordoñez (86) rounded out the Cavaliers among the top 100 players

GODFREY, HOPKINS & SPAANSTRA NAMED TO HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- The Hoos had three players named to the MAC Hermann Trophy watch list for the second time in three seasons this year
- Sophomore Lia Godfrey, grad transfer Haley Hopkins and senior Alexa Spaanstra were all tabbed for the watch list
- Spaanstra is on the list for the third time, as is Hopkins, while Godfrey is on the list for the second season
- Virginia's Morgan Brian won the award twice in her career, taking the honor in 2013 and 2014
- Several other UVA players have been finalists for the award, including Emily Sonnett (2015), Caroline Miller (2012) and current UCLA head coach Amanda Cromwell (1991)

GUIDRY NAMED TO TOP DRAWER SOCCER TEAM OF THE WEEK FOLLOWING OPENERS

- Sophomore defender Samar Guidry was named to the Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week on Aug. 23
- Guidry scored her first collegiate goal in the opener and assisted on the game winner at No. 12 West Virginia
- Guidry was joined by Diana Ordoñez and Rebecca Jarrett who earned honorable mention recognition in the first week

JARRETT FOLLOWS UP WITH TOP DRAWER TEAM OF THE WEEK HONORS AFTER WEEK TWO

- Senior forward Rebecca Jarrett earned recognition from Top Drawer Soccer after her performance in week two
- Jarrett tallied six points on the week after tallying a pair of goals and a pair of assists on the week
- She assisted on the second goal in Virginia's 2-0 win at George Mason in the first game of the week
- Jarrett tied a career high with two goals and set a career high with five points in the win over George Washington
- One of Jarrett's goals in the George Washington win proved to be the game-winning goal in the 6-1 victory

CAVALIER CONNECTIONS WITH US SOCCER

VIRGINIA HAS STRONG TIES WITH US SOCCER

- The Virginia women's soccer program has strong ties historically with US Soccer
- Current head coach Steve Swanson assisted with the USWNT and previously served as head coach of the U20 team that won the 2012 Women's World
- A total of 11 players have been called up to the USWNT through the program's history, including ACC Network commentators Angela Hucles and Lori Lindsey

PAIR OF FORMER HOOS WIN OLYMPIC BRONZE

- Two former members of the UVA women's soccer program were on recent rosters with the USWNT: Becky Sauerbrunn ('07) and Emily Sonnett ('15)
- The pair helped the United States claim a bronze medal in the Tokyo Olympics this past summer
- consecutive FIFA Women's World Cup in 2019

SEVERAL FORMER HOOS COMPETE WITH USWNT

- Three Cavaliers helped the USWNT claim consecutive FIFA Women's World Cup championships when the US claimed the 2019 title in France
- Brian and Sauerbrunn were also part of the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup title in Canada
- Danielle Colaprico, the 2014 ACC Midfielder of the Year, was called up for the USWNT in competition with Portugal and Scotland played in November of 2018

OTHER HOOS WITH US SOCCER ON WORLD STAGE

- Rebecca Jarrett and Alexa Spaanstra represented the US in the Concacaf Cup back in the spring to help the US qualify for the U20 Women's World Cup
- Fellow Cavaliers Diana Ordoñez and Talia Staude were part of the Nike Friendlies with the US Team in preparation for the Concacaf Cup along with new freshman Lia Godfrey.

FOUR HOOS REPRESENT THE U.S. IN FRANCE AT 2018 FIFA U20 WOMEN'S WORLD CUP

- Four current members of the UVA women's soccer team represented the U.S. at the 2018 U20 Women's World Cup in France
- Zoe Morse, Laurel Ivory, Taryn Torres and Alexa Spaanstra all earned spots on the U20 roster in '18
- Ivory started all three games of pool play for the U.S. team that went 1-1-1 vs. Japan, Paraguay and Spain

OTHER CONNECTIONS

- Current assistant Jaime Frias joined the Hoos after a stint with US Soccer in player development
- Former head coach Lauren Gregg was head coach of the USWNT from 1997-2000
- Former head coach April Heinrichs coached the USWNT from 2000-2004 and played on the first Women's World Cup Championship team in 1991

HOOS SET SCORING STANDARD NATIONALLY SINCE 2011

- Virginia has had a high-powered offense under head coach Steve Swanson, but especially since 2011
- Over the past 10 seasons, UVA leads the nation as one of two teams to score 600 goals in that span
- The Hoos are also one of only five teams to have score more than 500 goals in that span as well
- Virginia led the nation in goals scored in 2014 with 88 goals on the way to an NCAA runner-up finish
- UVA also led the nation in goals scored with 78 goals scored throughout the 2013 campaign

THE SERIES WITH SANTA CLARA

- Virginia and Santa Clara have faced each other seven times with the Cavaliers leading the series 4-2-1
- The teams first met in the 1991 season, a 1-0 victory for the Hoos at Santa Clara
- Virginia won the last meeting between the teams, a 4-0 victory at Klöckner Stadium in the 2013 season
- This will be the second neutral site meeting after won the first in the 2000 season in a tournament at Stanford

THE SERIES WITH JMU

- Virginia and JMU will meet for the 25th time when they face each other on Sunday afternoon
- The Cavaliers lead the all-time series with the Dukes 21-1-2
- Virginia has won nine consecutive matches in the series and is 9-1-0 in the last 10 meetings
- The last meeting between the teams came in the 2012 season and was a 4-1 victory for the Cavaliers
- Virginia leads the series 6-1-1 in road games in the series

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

- Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.
- First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process. This tends to be used less in athletic eligibility references.
- Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

- Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."
- Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.
- Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

- The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS: ORANGE AND BLUE

- Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.
- One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAHOOWA

- The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.
- Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."











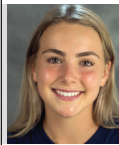
