- · Virginia's final three matches of the season are against conference opponents.
- The Cavaliers most recently defeated Boston College, 2-1, in ACC play.
- UVA finished its nonconference schedule on Monday, falling in overtime to Denver, 2-1.

- Graduate student Daniel Wright became the seventh different player to score a goal for UVA this season.
- · Freshman Paul Wiese recorded his team-high fifth assist on the goal and sophomore Leo Afonso had his first assist of the season.
- · Goalkeeper Holden Brown leads the ACC in saves (53), Wiese ranks second in the ACC in total assists and Afonso is ninth in the ACC in goals (5).
- · Three players have recorded a brace for UVA this season: Andreas Ueland (High Point), Kome Ubogu (VCU) and Leo Afonso (Boston College).
- The Cavaliers are 4-0 when scoring two or more goals in a game.

### **FANTASTIC FRESHMEN**

- · Seven freshmen have made starts for Virginia this season and 22 of UVA's 46 points are from freshmen.
- Paul Wiese and Asparuh Slavov have started every match.
- · Kome Ubogu has scored three goals, which is second most on the team.
- · Wiese leads the team with five assists.
- · Slavov scored his first collegiate goal against Virginia Tech, Michael Tsicoulias scored his first collegiate goal against Maryland and Ank Nibogora's first collegiate goal was the game-winner vs. Western Michigan.

# **AFONSO PROVIDES SPARK**

- · Sophomore forward Leo Afonso has scored three goals in UVA's last two matches, including his first collegiate brace in the win over Boston College.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$  Afonso scored four goals in UVA's two preseason exhibition matches.
- He currently leads UVA with 11 points on five goals and one assist.
- Afonso ranks ninth in the ACC in goals and is fifth in shots on goal per game (1.33).

# **UBOGU'S BRACE**

- · Ubogu had a career night on Tuesday when he scored his first collegiate goal, recorded his first collegiate brace and added an assist.
- · Ubogu entered the match against VCU in the 65th minute and just four minutes later scored the first goal for the

- Two minutes later Ubogu had his second career goal when freshman Ank Nibogora played the ball forward and Ubogu tapped the ball just past the diving VCU keeper to give UVA the lead.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$  Ubogu assisted Tsicoulias' goal in the 81st minute.

## **DEFENDERS DO IT ALL**

- Two of the top scorers for the Cavaliers come from the defensive line.
- Andreas Ueland is third on the team with five points on two goals and one assist.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$  Paul Wiese has five assists, to be tied for third on the team with five points.
- Keeper Holden Brown leads the ACC in total saves (49) and goalie minutes played (1251:59).

## THE SERIES

- This will be the 76th meeting between Virginia and NC State.
- The Cavaliers hold a 49-17-9 lead in the all-time series and are 19-4-3 under head coach George Gelnovatch.
- UVA and NC State are tied in the series in games played in Raleigh, 14-14-5.
- · Virginia has won five of the last seven, with two ties in that span.
- The last game in Raleigh was a 0-0 tie in double overtime on Oct. 13, 2017. UVA won the last meeting, 2-0 on Sept. 20, 2019. The teams did not meet in the 2020-21 season.

# **ABOUT NC STATE**

- NC State is coming off a 4-0 win over High Point on Tuesday (Oct. 12).
- The Wolfpack have outscored their opponents 22-15.
- Kuda Muskwe leads the team with 10 points (4 goals, 2 assists) and Luke Hille has nine points (4 goals, 1 assist).
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$  NC State has 11 different players that have scored goals this season.
- Goalkeeper Leon Krapf is second in the ACC in goalie minutes played and fifth in total saves 33.

# NCAA ISSUES RED CARD CORRECTION FOR DANIEL WRIGHT

Virginia will have Daniel Wright available for Friday's match after a misidentification occurred on the second yellow awarded to him at the end of the first half against Maryland, forcing Virginia to play a man down in the second half.

- Per the NCAA "It is clear that a player misidentification occurred involving UVA #23, Daniel Wright. Mr. Wright was issued a caution at 14:18. He was issued a second caution at 43:58 accompanied by the mandatory red card. The foul at 43:58 was actually committed by UVA #22 Michael Tsicoulias. The second caution and red card assessed against No. 23 Daniel Wright are rescinded and Mr. Wright is eligible to participate in Virginia's next game."

## **TEAM CAPTAINS**

Head coach George Gelnovatch announced that junior Andreas Ueland and sophomore Leo Afonso will serve as

team captains in 2021. Ueland was named to the ACC Preseason Watch List and is one of two players remaining from the 2019 Virginia College Cup squad.

## **ROSTER MAKEUP**

- Virginia returns 17 letterwinners from a year ago and welcomes a recruiting class of 13 to Charlottesville for 2021.
- Virginia returns five of its six top goal scorers from a year ago including junior Kevin Ogudugu who led the team with seven points (3g, 1a).
- The 19 UVA goals last season were scored by 12 different players, nine of those goal scorers are back in 2021.

# **HEAD COACH GEORGE GELNOVATCH**



George Gelnovatch enters his 26th season as the head coach of the Virginia men's soccer program. The longest tenured head coach in program history, Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of national championships in 2009 and 2014 as well as six NCAA College Cup appearances and 24-consecutive berths in the NCAA tournament.

Gelnovatch became the program's all-time leader in wins on August 25, 2017 with a 3-2 double-overtime victory over Villanova, surpassing his UVA mentor Bruce Arena for the program record in wins with 296. He reached the 300-win plateau on Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech, becoming just the fourth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to win 300 career matches.

A former Cavalier soccer All-American and assistant coach. Gelnovatch has guided Virginia to five ACC tournament titles.

three regular-season ACC championships and a record of 345-139-59 (.690) during his tenure as UVA head coach. Over the course of his 30 years as an assistant and head coach at Virginia, he has been a part of all seven of the Cavaliers' national championships.

Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I men's soccer history to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA tournament. He is one of just eight coaches in the Division I men's soccer annals to take 20 teams to the tournament and one of only four active coaches to do so.

Going into 2021, Gelnovatch ranked as the 10th-winningest active head coach in Division I college soccer, with a .690 career winning percentage. He stood 10th in career wins among current head coaches. Among Division I coaches all-time, he ranked 33rd in career wins and 42nd in career winning percentage. These figures are even more striking when considering Gelnovatch's teams play one of the nation's toughest schedules on a yearly basis.

Virginia has won at least 15 games in a season 10 times under Gelnovatch, including 2019 when it won 21 games the second most in the history of the program en route to an ACC Coastal Division Championship, an ACC Tournament crown and a Runner-Up finish in the NCAA College Cup.

Gelnovatch has developed a number of Major League Soccer players during his UVA tenure, with 30 players going in MLS drafts and 12 in the MLS Supplemental Draft, while eight signed Project-40/Generation Adidas contracts and Jordan Allen (2014), Derrick Etienne (2015), Scott Thomsen (2015) and Aboubacar Keita (2018) each signed MLS Homegrown contracts. Jason Moore (1999) and Alecko Eskandarian (2003) were selected No. 1 in the MLS Draft, as 13 Cavaliers have been picked in the first round of the various MLS drafts.

Gelnovatch was named the 10th coach of the Virginia program on Jan. 3, 1996, after Bruce Arena announced he would end his 18-year career at the helm of UVA soccer to become head coach and assistant general manager of Major League Soccer's D.C. United.
