### QUICK KICKS

- UVA jumped up to No. 2 in the rankings following wins over No. 2 Duke and NC State last week.
- The win over Duke was the third win over a top-15 team for Virginia through the first 10 games.
- Diana Ordoñez** was named ACC Co-Offensive Player of the Week on Tuesday after hitting the game winner vs. No. 2 Duke and assisting on the game-winning goal at NC State.
- Ordoñez** entered the week ranked fourth in active D1 players in points per game for her career (1.64) and in goals per game (0.72). She has a goal or assist in five of the last six games.
- Talia Staude** was named the Top Drawer Soccer National Player of the Week after hitting the game-winning goal at NC State. It was her second career goal and first career game winner.
- Staude's** 90th minute GWG was the first for UVA since Brianna Westrup's vs. Bucknell (8/23/18)
- Alexis Theoret** tallied her first career assists on game winners in both games last week
- Laurel Ivory** is second all-time in career shutouts at UVA with 38 solo shutouts for her career. The win vs. Santa Clara moved her into second all-time in wins at UVA and she has 60 wins in goal.
- Ivory** is also the the NCAA active leader in career shutouts across all divisions with her 38 shutouts.
- Lia Godfrey** and **Alexa Spaanstra** are joined by **Haley Hopkins** on the Hermann Trophy Watch List.
- Godfrey** leads UVA in assists (6) and is over halfway to her ACC-leading assist total from last year. She has recorded a goal or an assist in six of the last eight matches after an assist at Wake Forest.
- Godfrey** and **Ordoñez** are among the ACC leaders offensively with Godfrey second in assists and third in assists per game (0.55). Ordoñez is second in goals (9) and goals per game (0.82).
- Virginia was named a recipient of the United Soccer Coaches Team Academic Award for the 12th consecutive season when the team award winners were announced last week.

**WHO'S BACK FOR THE HOOS?**

- UVA returns 17 letterwinners and seven starters from last year's squad that advanced to a 26th straight NCAA Tournament
- Back are five players who earned post-season honors from the ACC - forward **Alexa Spaanstra** earned first team honors, while forwards **Rebecca Jarrett** and **Diana Ordoñez**, and midfielder **Lia Godfrey** were second team honorees. **Samar Guidry** earned All-Freshman team honors along with Godfrey.
- Godfrey also earned All-America honors to lead a group of players to earn honors from the United Soccer Coaches
- In addition to Godfrey, Ordoñez and Spaanstra were both All-Region selections by the United Soccer Coaches last season
- UVA returners contributed 38-of-40 goals scored (95%) a year ago and 31-of-34 assists (91%)
- Among those are the top five goal scorers - Ordoñez (12), Spaanstra (10), Jarrett (4), Godfrey (4) and **Claire Constant** (3) and the top assist leaders - Godfrey (9), Ordoñez (5), Lizzy Sieracki (4) and Jarrett (3).

**HOOS WELCOME SIX FRESHMEN FOR 2021**

- The Cavaliers brought in six freshmen as part of the 2021 newcomer class to Grounds this fall
- Among those players were three ranked in the top 200 nationally by Top Drawer Soccer - midfielder Madeline Simpson (No. 49), defender Kiki Maki (No. 170) and midfielder Charlotte McClure (No. 186)
- Also part of the class is forward Degen Miller who was named the Colorado Gatorade Player of the Year after tallying 43 goals and 16 assists as a senior
- A pair of goalkeepers round out the freshman crop with Camryn Miller who earned Regional Player of the Year honors and Ally Reynolds who earned Top Drawer Soccer DA Playoff standout recognition

**ALL-AMERICAN TRANSFER JOINS CAVALIER PROGRAM**

- In addition to the six freshmen, the Cavaliers also added a grad transfer with two-time All-American forward Haley Hopkins
- Hopkins comes to the Virginia program with two years of eligibility remaining after graduating from Vanderbilt
- She finished her career with 34 goals - second all-time on the career goal scoring list for in Commodore program history
- Of her 34 goals, 14 were game-winning goal and she added 12 assists for a total of 80 points in her career
- Hopkins was named the Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year in 2018 and earned All-America honors in 2018 and this past season.

**IVORY AND CAVALIERS' EXTENDED SHUTOUT STREAK SNAPPED AGAINST GEORGE WASHINGTON**

- The Hoos entered the 2021 season riding a shutout streak after posting four clean sheets on a run to the NCAA semifinal
- Laurel Ivory and UVA posted 459:35 scoreless minutes dating back to the NCAA opener against SIUE to close the year
- After shut outs in the first three games, the Hoos went 776:41 minutes between goals surrendered
- That stretch of 776:41 was the third longest in program history and passed the last stretch of 775:01 set in 2019
- Ivory's streak of 665:06 shutout minutes is fourth all-time at UVA - Ivory has three of the top eight performances
- The fifth-year keeper also holds the second longest shutout streak with 775:01 minutes set in the 2019 season

## UP NEXT FOR THE HOOS

- Virginia will continue a four-game road trip next week when the Cavaliers travel to face Boston College and Syracuse
- The matches will be streamed on ACCNX with the Hoos facing BC on Thursday (Oct. 7) and Syracuse on Sunday (Oct. 10)
- It closes a stretch of four straight road matches for the Cavaliers as UVA plays five-of-six on the road to start ACC play

## HOOS PICKED TO FINISH THIRD IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

- The Cavaliers were picked to finish third in the ACC in a preseason vote of league coaches this season
- Virginia received one first place vote and tallied 148 points - picked behind Florida State and North Carolina
- Florida State was picked to claim the league title, while North Carolina was picked to finish second
- The Cavaliers finished third in the ACC regular-season standings a year ago and advanced to the College Cup

## PRESEASON ALL-ACC HONOREES

- UVA had sophomore midfielder **Lia Godfrey** and senior forward **Alexa Spaanstra** named to the preseason All-ACC team
- Spaanstra was a first team All-ACC selection a year ago and was named an All-Region selection
- Godfrey earned All-America honors and was the ACC Freshman of the Year last season after leading the league in assists (9)
- The preseason All-ACC team was made up of 11 players and featured players from five different teams

## IVORY CLIMBING THE RANKS IN THE RECORD BOOK

- In her fifth season, goalkeeper Laurel Ivory is also in on the top spots in the history books at UVA
- Currently, Ivory is second all-time at UVA in shutouts with 38 solo shutouts in her career
- With 60 wins, Ivory is second all-time in victories as a keeper at UVA - she has a 60-16-11 record for her career

## CAVALIERS RESPOND WELL AFTER A LOSS UNDER SWANSON

- Responding after a loss has been a trend for the Cavaliers throughout Steve Swanson's tenure at UVA
- Throughout the 22 seasons under Swanson, Virginia holds a 60-8-13 record in matches following a loss
- The number does not include season-ending losses where the next match would be part of a new season

## THE HOOS IN OVERTIME IN THE SWANSON ERA

- The Cavaliers are no stranger to overtime having gone past regulation five times last season with a 2-0-3 mark
- Virginia has gone to extra time in 86 matches during the Steve Swanson era with a 23-12-51 record in those matches
- In those 51 draws, 15 have come in the postseason with the Cavaliers surviving shootouts in five of those 15 matches

## HOOS EARN UNITED SOCCER COACHES TEAM ACADEMIC AWARD FOR 12th CONSECUTIVE YEAR

- The Cavaliers were named a recipient of the Team Academic Award by the United Soccer Coaches for the 2020-21 season
- It marks the 12th consecutive season for the Hoos to receive the award from the coaches organization
- Teams must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 to be named as a recipient of the award each season

## SWANSON HITS THE 400 CAREER COACHING WIN MILESTONE TO PUT HIM AMONG ELITE COMPANY

- UVA head coach Steve Swanson hit a rare milestone vs. NC State (10/25/18), hitting the 400 career win mark
- As a head coach, Swanson holds a 442-162-62 record through stops at Dartmouth, Stanford and Virginia
- Currently only a handful of D1 coaches have hit the 400 win milestone with seven of them currently active
- Swanson is one of only nine coaches who has recorded 400 wins all at a D1 institution
- In his coaching career, he has taken all three teams to league titles and the NCAA Tournament

## SWANSON GRABS HIS 300TH WIN AS UVA HEAD COACH

- Head Coach Steve Swanson picked up his 300th wins as the head coach of the Cavaliers vs. Liberty (8/25/19)
- Currently, Swanson holds a 337-99-51 record as UVA head coach and is 133-48-20 in ACC matches
- He has 21 consecutive winning seasons at Virginia and 29 overall as a head coach
- Swanson has taken his teams to 23 consecutive NCAA Tournaments with Virginia's inclusion last season

## HOOS CONTINUE STRONG PRESENCE IN PROFESSIONAL RANKS ON NWSL ROSTERS

- UVA has a strong presence in professional soccer in the U.S. with 11 players appearing on NWSL rosters this season
- Becky Sauerbrunn now competes with the Portland Thorns after being traded by the Utah Royals
- Orlando features second-year players Courtney Petersen and Phoebe McClernon. Petersen was a first-round pick of the Pride in 2019.
- Chicago boasts four players in Morgan Gautrat, Danielle Colaprico, Makenzy Doniak and Zoe Morse.
- Kristen McNabb continues to compete for OL Reign in Seattle, while Brittany Ratcliffe was picked up by North Carolina.
- Veronica Latsko remains with the Houston Dash, while Emily Sonnett is with the Washington Spirit.
- Virginia is one of only three schools to have a player taken in every NWSL Draft

## HOPKINS, ORDOÑEZ TALLY BRACES IN 2021 OPENER

- Grad transfer Haley Hopkins made an immediate impact for the Hoos with a brace in the season opener vs. Richmond
- She wasn't the only player to find the net twice as Diana Ordoñez also tallied a brace in the win over the Spiders
- It was the 11th multiple goal game of Hopkins' career, while it was the seventh for Ordoñez

**SOPHOMORES GET INVOLVED IN OFFENSIVE ACTION IN OPENER AS YEAR TWO BEGINS**

- Sophomore defenders Samar Guidry and Laney Rouse continue to grow in the UVA system as year two kicks off for the Hoos
- Guidry found the net for the first time, scoring an unassisted goal in the second half against the Spiders in the opener
- Rouse also got in on the offensive action, delivering a cross to Hopkins that was headed in for Rouse's first career assist
- The pair started the match against the Spiders on the backline for the Cavaliers
- Sophomore Sarah Brunner also tallied her first career assist when she connected with Cam Lexow for a goal vs. Richmond

**HOOS HAVE A PRESENCE IN TOP DRAWER SOCCER PRESEASON TOP 100**

- Virginia had several players ranked among the top 100 in the preseason by Top Drawer Soccer with six making the list
- Alexa Spaanstra led the list, coming in at No. 20 in the ranking after earning All-ACC and All-Region honors a year ago

- Sophomore defender Samar Guidry was named to the Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week on Aug. 23
- Guidry scored her first collegiate goal in the opener and assisted on the game winner at No. 12 West Virginia
- Guidry was joined by Diana Ordoñez and Rebecca Jarrett who earned honorable mention recognition in the first week

**JARRETT FOLLOWS UP WITH TOP DRAWER TEAM OF THE WEEK HONORS AFTER WEEK TWO**

- Senior forward Rebecca Jarrett earned recognition from Top Drawer Soccer after her performance in week two
- Jarrett tallied six points on the week after tallying a pair of goals and a pair of assists on the week
- She assisted on the second goal in Virginia's 2-0 win at George Mason in the first game of the week
- Jarrett tied a career high with two goals and set a career high with five points in the win over George Washington
- One of Jarrett's goals in the George Washington win proved to be the game-winning goal in the 6-1 victory

- The Virginia women's soccer program has strong ties historically with US Soccer
- Current head coach Steve Swanson assisted with the USWNT and previously served as head coach of the U20 team that won the 2012 Women's World Cup
- A total of 11 players have been called up to the USWNT through the program's history, including ACC Network commentators Angela Hucles and Lori Lindsey

**PAIR OF FORMER HOOS WIN OLYMPIC BRONZE**

- Two former members of the UVA women's soccer program were on recent rosters with the USWNT: Becky Sauerbrunn ('07) and Emily Sonnett ('15)
- The pair helped the United States claim a bronze medal in the Tokyo Olympics this past summer
- consecutive FIFA Women's World Cup in 2019

**SEVERAL FORMER HOOS COMPETE WITH USWNT**

- Three Cavaliers helped the USWNT claim consecutive FIFA Women's World Cup championships when the US claimed the 2019 title in France
- Brian and Sauerbrunn were also part of the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup title in Canada
- Danielle Colaprico, the 2014 ACC Midfielder of the Year, was called up for the USWNT in competition with Portugal and Scotland played in November of 2018

**OTHER HOOS WITH US SOCCER ON WORLD STAGE**

- Rebecca Jarrett and Alexa Spaanstra represented the US in the Concacaf Cup to help the US qualify for the U20 Women's World Cup before it was canceled.
- Fellow Cavaliers Diana Ordoñez and Talia Staude were part of the Nike Friendlies with the US Team in preparation for the Concacaf Cup along with new freshman Lia Godfrey.

**FOUR HOOS REPRESENT THE U.S. IN FRANCE AT 2018 FIFA U20 WOMEN'S WORLD CUP**

- Four current members of the UVA women's soccer team represented the U.S. at the 2018 U20 Women's World Cup in France
- Zoe Morse, Laurel Ivory, Taryn Torres and Alexa Spaanstra all earned spots on the U20 roster in '18
- Ivory started all three games of pool play for the U.S. team that went 1-1-1 vs. Japan, Paraguay and Spain

**OTHER CONNECTIONS**

- Current assistant Jaime Frias joined the Hoos after a stint with US Soccer in player development
- Former head coach Lauren Gregg was head coach of the USWNT from 1997-2000
- Former head coach April Heinrichs coached the USWNT from 2000-2004 and played on the first Women's World Cup Championship team in 1991

**ORDOÑEZ NAMED ACC CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

- Forward Diana Ordoñez was named the ACC Co-Offensive Player of the Week by the league after week five of competition
- Ordoñez hit the game-winning goal for Virginia in a 1-0 victory over No. 2 Duke in the Thursday night game
- She then assisted on the game-winning goal in the 90th minute of Virginia's win at NC State on Sunday afternoon

**STAUE NAMED TOP DRAWER SOCCER PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

- Virginia defender Talia Staue also picked up weekly honors after the Cavaliers' wins over No. 2 Duke and NC State
- Staue was named the national Player of the Week by Top Drawer Soccer and on the publication's Team of the Week
- She played the full 90 minutes in both games and helped limit the Blue Devils to three shots on goal in the 1-0 victory
- Sunday against NC State, she hit the game-winning goal in the 90th minute - her first game winner in her UVA career

**STAUE, ZANDI GET INVOLVED IN OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION AT NC STATE**

- Midfielder Sydney Zandi and defender Talia Staue got involved in the offensive production for the Hoos at NC State
- Sydney Zandi scored the opening goal for the Hoos marking her first goal since the 2019 NCAA Tournament opener vs. Radford
- Staue then secured the win for the Hoos when she hit the game-winning goal in the 90th minute of play
- It was Staue's second career goal and the first game-winning goal of her Virginia career
- With the duo getting in on the action, UVA now has 11 players who have tallied goals and 11 players who have assists

**HOOS SET SCORING STANDARD NATIONALLY SINCE 2011**

- Virginia has had a high-powered offense under head coach Steve Swanson, but especially since 2011
- Over the past 10 seasons, UVA leads the nation as one of two teams to score 600 goals in that span
- The Hoos are also one of only nine teams to have score more than 500 goals in that span as well
- Virginia led the nation in goals scored in 2014 with 88 goals on the way to an NCAA runner-up finish
- UVA also led the nation in goals scored with 78 goals scored throughout the 2013 campaign

**THE SERIES WITH NORTH CAROLINA**

- Virginia and North Carolina meet for the 48th time when the teams face off on Sunday afternoon
- The Tar Heels lead the all-time series 39-4-4 with a commanding start after the series began in 1995
- The Cavaliers picked up the first win in the series in the 2011 season, a 1-0 double overtime win at North Carolina
- Three of Virginia's four wins have come in Chapel Hill with the fourth coming in the 2014 ACC Tournament semifinal
- The series sits at 4-4-2 in the last 10 meetings, though North Carolina has won four straight in the series

**UNIQUELY UVA**

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

- Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.
- First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process. This tends to be used less in athletic eligibility references.
- Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

**UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES**

- Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."
- Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.
- Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

**THE CAVALIER MASCOT**

- The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

**UNIVERSITY COLORS: ORANGE AND BLUE**

- Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.
- One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

**WAHOOWA**

- The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.
- Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

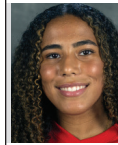
