QUICK KICKS

- UVA is a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament for the second time in the last three seasons.
- Virginia is coming off a 6-0 victory over High Point in the opening round last weekend after scoring four goals in the first half against the Panthers in that outing.
- When UVA faces Milwaukee in the second round it marks back-to-back games against conference champions to open NCAA Tournament play for the Cavaliers this season.
- The Cavaliers are looking to advance to the Sweet 16 for the 16th time in the last 17 seasons when Virginia faces off against Milwaukee. UVA had a streak of 14 straight Sweet 16s snapped in 2019.
- Three players had career firsts in the NCAA opening win against High Point. **Sarah Brunner** and **Kira Maguire** hit their first collegiate goals, while **Brianna Jablonowski** had her first collegiate assist.
- **Diana Ordoñez** hit her 16th goal of the season in the win over High Point and has 43 career goals.
- Her 16 goals this season passes her freshman total and is tied for seventh most in a season at UVA.
- **Ordoñez** remains fifth in active D1 players in career points/game (1.63) and goals/game (0.72).
- She has hit a goal in four of the last five games for the Cavaliers down the stretch this season.
- **Laurel Ivory** picked up her 67th career victory vs. HPU and is two shy of tying the UVA record (69).
- **Lia Godfrey** remains fifth among active D1 players in assists per game (0.51) for her career.
- The Hoos had seven players earn All-ACC honors this year - marking the second time in the last three years UVA has had at seven selections to the annual team voted on by league coaches.
- **Diana Ordoñez** was named ACC Offensive Player of the Year to mark the seventh time a Cavalier has been named the ACC Player of the Year or ACC Offensive Player of the Year.
- **Steve Swanson** was named the ACC Coach of the Year for the third time (2013, 2015, 2021).

THE SERIES WITH MILWAUKEE

- Virginia and Milwaukee have faced one time in program history, a 1995 meeting in the UVA Invitational at Klöckner Stadium
- The Hoos picked up a 5-2 victory in that meeting against the Panthers, building a 4-0 lead on Milwaukee
- Kristen DeMillio had a brace in that game with both of her goals coming off Diana Padula assists
- Caryn Weigand and Annemarie Murphy also had goals in that game for the Cavaliers

THE SERIES WITH ALABAMA

- UVA and Alabama have met once before with the teams facing off in the 2014 season in Tuscaloosa
- The Cavaliers won that meeting 3-0 behind goals from Alexis Shaffer, Emily Sonnett and Danielle Colaprico
- It was part of a 10-game win streak to start the season in a year the Cavaliers advanced to the finals at the College Cup

THE SERIES WITH BYU

- Virginia and BYU have met twice in the history of the programs with the Cavaliers winning both meetings with the Cougars
- UVA won the first meeting 3-2 in overtime in the 2001 season and it would be 20 years before the teams would face off again
- Last season the teams met again, facing each other in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in Cary, N.C.
- Virginia won that meeting 2-0 behind a brace from forward Alexa Spaanstra as the forward scored in each half
- Laurel Ivory tallied a career-high 11 saves on a career-high 19 shots faced in the shutout to pick up her 50th career victory

CAVALIERS CLINCH ACC REGULAR-SEASON FOR THIRD TIME

- UVA clinched at least a share of the ACC regular-season title on when the Cavaliers beat Miami 6-1 at home on Oct. 24
- The Cavalier win combined with a Florida State loss at Duke pushed Virginia to the top of the ACC standings
- Virginia then clinched sole possession of the championship with a 1-1 draw at No. 3 FSU in the regular-season finale
- UVA last won the ACC regular-season title in the 2015 season when the Hoos went 9-1-0 in the ACC that season
- Virginia also won the ACC regular-season title in the 2013 season when the Cavaliers went 13-0-0

ORDOÑEZ, SWANSON HEADLINE ALL-ACC HONORS FOR THE HOOS

- Diana Ordoñez was named ACC Offensive Player of the Year and Steve Swanson Coach of the Year to headline UVA's award winners
- The Hoos had seven players earn spots on All-ACC team with Lia Godfrey joining Ordoñez as All-ACC first team selections
- Three players were named to the second team with Samar Guidry, Laurel Ivory and Alexa Spaanstra all recognized
- Haley Hopkins and Taryn Torres rounded out the honorees with spots on the third team for the Cavaliers
- Spaanstra is a four-time All-ACC honoree, while Torres was recognized for the fourth time in her five-year UVA career
- Ordoñez is the first player to get Offensive Player of the Year honors since midfielder Alexis Shaffer in the 2016 season

HOOS PICKED TO FINISH THIRD IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

- The Cavaliers were picked to finish third in the ACC in a preseason vote of league coaches this season
- Virginia received one first place vote and tallied 148 points - picked behind Florida State and North Carolina
- Florida State was picked to claim the league title, while North Carolina was picked to finish second
- The Cavaliers finished third in the ACC regular-season standings a year ago and advanced to the College Cup

PRESEASON ALL-ACC HONOREES

- UVA had sophomore midfielder **Lia Godfrey** and senior forward **Alexa Spaanstra** named to the preseason All-ACC team
- Spaanstra was a first team All-ACC selection a year ago and was named an All-Region selection
- Godfrey earned All-America honors and was the ACC Freshman of the Year last season after leading the league in assists (9)
- The preseason All-ACC team was made up of 11 players and featured players from five different teams

IVORY CLIMBING THE RANKS IN THE RECORD BOOK

- In her fifth season, goalkeeper Laurel Ivory is closing in on the top spots in the history books at UVA
- Currently, Ivory is second all-time at UVA in shutouts with 41 solo shutouts in her career
- With 67 wins, Ivory is second all-time in victories as a keeper at UVA - she has a 67-16-13 record for her career

CAVALIERS RESPOND WELL AFTER A LOSS UNDER SWANSON

- Responding after a loss has been a trend for the Cavaliers throughout Steve Swanson's tenure at UVA
- Throughout the 22 seasons under Swanson, Virginia holds a 61-8-13 record in matches following a loss
- The number does not include season-ending losses where the next match would be part of a new season

THE HOOS IN OVERTIME IN THE SWANSON ERA

- The Cavaliers are no stranger to overtime having gone past regulation five times last season with a 2-0-3 mark
- Virginia has gone to extra time in 87 matches during the Steve Swanson era with a 23-12-53 record in those matches
- In those 53 draws, 15 have come in the postseason with the Cavaliers surviving shootouts in five of those 15 matches

HOOS EARN UNITED SOCCER COACHES TEAM ACADEMIC AWARD FOR 12th CONSECUTIVE YEAR

- The Cavaliers were named a recipient of the Team Academic Award by the United Soccer Coaches for the 2020-21 season
- It marks the 12th consecutive season for the Hoos to receive the award from the coaches organization
- Teams must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 to be named as a recipient of the award each season

SWANSON HITS THE 400 CAREER COACHING WIN MILESTONE TO PUT HIM AMONG ELITE COMPANY

- UVA head coach Steve Swanson hit a rare milestone vs. NC State (10/25/18), hitting the 400 career win mark
- As a head coach, Swanson holds a 450-163-64 record through stops at Dartmouth, Stanford and Virginia
- Currently only a handful of D1 coaches have hit the 400 win milestone with seven of them currently active
- Swanson is one of only nine coaches who has recorded 400 wins all at a D1 institution
- In his coaching career, he has taken all three teams to league titles and the NCAA Tournament

SWANSON GRABS HIS 300TH WIN AS UVA HEAD COACH

- Head Coach Steve Swanson picked up his 300th wins as the head coach of the Cavaliers vs. Liberty (8/25/19)
- Currently, Swanson holds a 346-100-53 record as UVA head coach and is 138-48-22 in ACC matches
- He has 21 consecutive winning seasons at Virginia and 29 overall as a head coach
- Swanson has taken his teams to 23 consecutive NCAA Tournaments with Virginia's inclusion last season

HOOS CONTINUE STRONG PRESENCE IN PROFESSIONAL RANKS ON NWSL ROSTERS

- UVA has a strong presence in professional soccer in the U.S. with 11 players appearing on NWSL rosters this season
- Becky Sauerbrunn now competes with the Portland Thorns after being traded by the Utah Royals
- Orlando features second-year players Courtney Petersen and Phoebe McClemon. Petersen was a first-round pick of the Pride in 2019.
- Chicago boasts four players in Morgan Gautrat, Danielle Colaprico, Makenzy Doniak and Zoe Morse.
- Kristen McNabb continues to compete for OL Reign in Seattle, while Brittany Ratcliffe was picked up by North Carolina.
- Veronica Latsko remains with the Houston Dash, while Emily Sonnett is with the Washington Spirit.
- Virginia is one of only three schools to have a player taken in every NWSL Draft

HOPKINS, ORDOÑEZ TALLY BRACES IN 2021 OPENER

- Grad transfer Haley Hopkins made an immediate impact for the Hoos with a brace in the season opener vs. Richmond
- She wasn't the only player to find the net twice as Diana Ordoñez also tallied a brace in the win over the Spiders
- It was the 11th multiple goal game of Hopkins' career, while it was the seventh for Ordoñez

SOPHOMORES GET INVOLVED IN OFFENSIVE ACTION IN OPENER AS YEAR TWO BEGINS

- Sophomore defenders Samar Guidry and Laney Rouse continue to grow in the UVA system as year two kicks off for the Hoos
- Guidry found the net for the first time, scoring an unassisted goal in the second half against the Spiders in the opener
- Rouse also got in on the offensive action, delivering a cross to Hopkins that was headed in for Rouse's first career assist
- The pair started the match against the Spiders on the backline for the Cavaliers
- Sophomore Sarah Brunner also tallied her first career assist when she connected with Cam Lexow for a goal vs. Richmond

HOOS HAVE A PRESENCE IN TOP DRAWER SOCCER PRESEASON TOP 100

- Virginia had several players ranked among the top 100 in the preseason by Top Drawer Soccer with six making the list
- Alexa Spaanstra led the list, coming in at No. 20 in the ranking after earning All-ACC and All-Region honors a year ago
- Rebecca Jarrett was ranked No. 23 after earning All-ACC honors and All-Region honors and being named to the College Cup All-Tournament team a year ago
- ACC Freshman of the Year Lia Godfrey came in at 34 on the list after picking up All-America honors in her freshman season
- Talie Staude (43), Haley Hopkins (49) and Diana Ordoñez (86) rounded out the Cavaliers among the top 100 players

- The Hoos had three players named to the MAC Hermann Trophy watch list for the second time in three seasons this year
- Sophomore Lia Godfrey, grad transfer Haley Hopkins and senior Alexa Spaanstra were all tabbed for the watch list
- Spaanstra is on the list for the third time, as is Hopkins, while Godfrey is on the list for the second season
- Virginia's Morgan Brian won the award twice in her career, taking the honor in 2013 and 2014
- Several other UVA players have been finalists for the award, including Emily Sonnett (2015), Caroline Miller (2012) and current UCLA head coach Amanda Cromwell (1991)

GUIDRY NAMED TO TOP DRAWER SOCCER TEAM OF THE WEEK FOLLOWING OPENERS

- Sophomore defender Samar Guidry was named to the Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week on Aug. 23
- Guidry scored her first collegiate goal in the opener and assisted on the game winner at No. 12 West Virginia
- Guidry was joined by Diana Ordoñez and Rebecca Jarrett who earned honorable mention recognition in the first week

JARRETT FOLLOWS UP WITH TOP DRAWER TEAM OF THE WEEK HONORS AFTER WEEK TWO

- Senior forward Rebecca Jarrett earned recognition from Top Drawer Soccer after her performance in week two
- Jarrett tallied six points on the week after tallying a pair of goals and a pair of assists on the week
- She assisted on the second goal in Virginia's 2-0 win at George Mason in the first game of the week
- Jarrett tied a career high with two goals and set a career high with five points in the win over George Washington
- One of Jarrett's goals in the George Washington win proved to be the game-winning goal in the 6-1 victory

CONSTANT NAMED ACC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK IN WEEK THREE

- Senior defender Claire Constant was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week following week three's games
- Constant helped UVA post a pair of shutouts over defending NCAA Champions Santa Clara and JMU
- The defender broke up several scoring opportunities for the Broncos in the win over ninth-ranked Santa Clara
- She also helped the defense limit the Dukes to two shots - none on goal - in the 2-0 victory over the Dukes

VIRGINIA HAS STRONG TIES WITH US SOCCER

- The Virginia women's soccer program has strong ties historically with US Soccer
- Current head coach Steve Swanson assisted with the USWNT and previously served as head coach of the U20 team that won the 2012 Women's World Cup
- A total of 11 players have been called up to the USWNT through the program's history, including ACC Network commentators Angela Hucles and Lori Lindsey

PAIR OF FORMER HOOS WIN OLYMPIC BRONZE

- Two former members of the UVA women's soccer program were on recent rosters with the USWNT: Becky Sauerbrunn ('07) and Emily Sonnett ('15)
- The pair helped the United States claim a bronze medal in the Tokyo Olympics this past summer
- consecutive FIFA Women's World Cup in 2019

SEVERAL FORMER HOOS COMPETE WITH USWNT

- Three Cavaliers helped the USWNT claim consecutive FIFA Women's World Cup championships when the US claimed the 2019 title in France
- Brian and Sauerbrunn were also part of the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup title in Canada
- Danielle Colaprico, the 2014 ACC Midfielder of the Year, was called up for the USWNT in competition with Portugal and Scotland played in November of 2018

OTHER HOOS WITH US SOCCER ON WORLD STAGE

- Rebecca Jarrett and Alexa Spaanstra represented the US in the Concacaf Cup to help the US qualify for the U20 Women's World Cup before it was canceled.
- Fellow Cavaliers Diana Ordoñez and Talia Staude were part of the Nike Friendlies with the US Team in preparation for the Concacaf Cup along with new freshman Lia Godfrey.

FOUR HOOS REPRESENT THE U.S. IN FRANCE AT 2018 FIFA U20 WOMEN'S WORLD CUP

- Four current members of the UVA women's soccer team represented the U.S. at the 2018 U20 Women's World Cup in France
- Zoe Morse, Laurel Ivory, Taryn Torres and Alexa Spaanstra all earned spots on the U20 roster in '18
- Ivory started all three games of pool play for the U.S. team that went 1-1-1 vs. Japan, Paraguay and Spain

OTHER CONNECTIONS

- Current assistant Jaime Frias joined the Hoos after a stint with US Soccer in player development
- Former head coach Lauren Gregg was head coach of the USWNT from 1997-2000
- Former head coach April Heinrichs coached the USWNT from 2000-2004 and played on the first Women's World Cup Championship team in 1991

ORDOÑEZ NAMED ACC CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Forward Diana Ordoñez was named the ACC Co-Offensive Player of the Week by the league after week five of competition
- Ordoñez hit the game-winning goal for Virginia in a 1-0 victory over No. 2 Duke in the Thursday night game
- She then assisted on the game-winning goal in the 90th minute of Virginia's win at NC State on Sunday afternoon

STAUE NAMED TOP DRAWER SOCCER PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Virginia defender Talia Staude also picked up weekly honors after the Cavaliers' wins over No. 2 Duke and NC State
- Staude was named the national Player of the Week by Top Drawer Soccer and on the publication's Team of the Week
- She played the full 90 minutes in both games and helped limit the Blue Devils to three shots on goal in the 1-0 victory
- Sunday against NC State, she hit the game-winning goal in the 90th minute - her first game winner in her UVA career
- Her 90th minute game-winning goal was the first for UVA since Brianna Westrup vs. Bucknell on August 26, 2018

STAUE, ZANDI GET INVOLVED IN OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION AT NC STATE

- Midfielder Sydney Zandi and defender Talia Staude got involved in the offensive production for the Hoos at NC State
- Sydney Zandi scored the opening goal for the Hoos marking her first goal since the 2019 NCAA Tournament opener vs. Radford
- Staude then secured the win for the Hoos when she hit the game-winning goal in the 90th minute of play
- It was Staude's second career goal and the first game-winning goal of her Virginia career
- With the duo getting in on the action, UVA now has 11 players who have tallied goals and 11 players who have assists

CAVALIERS EXPLODE FOR BURST OF GOALS AT SYRACUSE

- The Virginia offense exploded for a burst of goals at Syracuse - scoring five goals in under 12 minutes
- Haley Hopkins started the scoring off a service from Lia Godfrey in the 55th minute
- Hopkins would notch two goals and an assist in a seven minutes stretch as part of the flurry for goals
- Godfrey would also add a goal in that stretch when Hopkins found her in the 61st minute to put UVA up 3-0
- Four different players scored goals in that flurry of offensive output while a different player assisted on each of the five goals

SPAANSTRA NAMED ACC CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Alexa Spaanstra was named ACC Co-Offensive Player of the Week after a goal and assist in a win over No. 17 Notre Dame
- Spaanstra started the scoring for the Hoos with a goal in the 82nd minute for her sixth goal of the season
- She followed it up with an assist on what proved to be the game-winning goal 37 seconds later - connecting with Hopkins
- Spaanstra played the full 90 minutes in the win over the Irish and kept the Hoos as one of two unbeaten teams in ACC play

ORDOÑEZ NAMED ACC CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOR SECOND TIME IN 2021

- Diana Ordoñez was named ACC Co-Offensive Player of the Week for the second time this season on Oct. 26
- Ordoñez tallied seven points with three goals and an assist in wins over Louisville and Miami
- The wins kept Virginia unbeaten in ACC play and clinched UVA at least a share of the ACC regular-season championship

ORDOÑEZ BREAKING INTO THE RECORD BOOK IN YEAR THREE AS A HOO

- Diana Ordoñez is climbing up the UVA offensive record books, breaking into the top 10 in goals scored in her third season
- Currently, she has 43 goals tied for fourth all-time at UVA to match a mark set by Lindsay Gusick (2001-04)
- Ordoñez is 8th in UVA history in career points as she currently holds 98 points for her career
- She is also in the top 10 in: career game-winning goals (6th - 14) and career multiple-goal games (4th - 10)
- Ordoñez is tied for first all-time in game-winning goals in a season with seven so far this year matching Gusick (2001)

SPAANSTRA ALSO CLIMBING IN THE OFFENSIVE RECORDS

- Alexa Spaanstra is another Cavalier making her way up the career record books at Virginia with Ivory and Ordoñez
- Spaanstra moved into a tie for seventh in career assists at UVA against Miami and currently has 28 for her career
- She also is tied for eighth all-time at UVA in game-winning assists with nine - matching a mark held by Tracy DiMillo
- Spaanstra has 86 career points and is closing in on the top 10 all-time in career points for the Cavaliers

HOOS SET SCORING STANDARD NATIONALLY SINCE 2011

- Virginia has had a high-powered offense under head coach Steve Swanson, but especially since 2011
- Over the past 11 seasons, UVA leads the nation as one of two teams to score 600 goals in that span
- The Hoos are also one of 10 teams to have scored more than 500 goals in that span as well
- Virginia led the nation in goals scored in 2014 with 88 goals on the way to an NCAA runner-up finish
- UVA also led the nation in goals scored with 78 goals scored throughout the 2013 campaign

GODFREY LEAVING HER MARK AT UVA IN SOPHOMORE CAMPAIGN

- Lia Godfrey is leaving her mark on the Virginia program in her second year with the Cavaliers
- Godfrey enters the week ranked 10th nationally in assists (12) and was tied for ACC lead at the end of the regular season
- The sophomore has 8 game-winning assists for her career, putting her in a tie for 10th all-time at UVA in two seasons
- She is also closing in on the top 10 at UVA in assists as her 21 through two seasons is two shy of tying for 10th all-time
- Godfrey's 12 assists this season is tied for 8th most in a single-season, matching a mark by Alexa Spaanstra in 2019

WHO'S BACK FOR THE HOOS?

- UVA returns 17 letterwinners and seven starters from last year's squad that advanced to a 26th straight NCAA Tournament
- Back are five players who earned post-season honors from the ACC - forward **Alexa Spaanstra** earned first team honors, while forwards **Rebecca Jarrett** and **Diana Ordoñez**, and midfielder **Lia Godfrey** were second team honorees. **Samar Guidry** earned All-Freshman team honors along with Godfrey.
- Godfrey also earned All-America honors to lead a group of players to earn honors from the United Soccer Coaches
- In addition to Godfrey, Ordoñez and Spaanstra were both All-Region selections by the United Soccer Coaches last season
- UVA returners contributed 38-of-40 goals scored (95%) a year ago and 31-of-34 assists (91%)
- Among those are the top five goal scorers - Ordoñez (12), Spaanstra (10), Jarrett (4), Godfrey (4) and **Claire Constant** (3) and the top assist leaders - Godfrey (9), Ordoñez (5), Lizzy Sieracki (4) and Jarrett (3).

HOOS WELCOME SIX FRESHMEN FOR 2021

- The Cavaliers brought in six freshmen as part of the 2021 newcomer class to Grounds this fall
- Among those players were three ranked in the top 200 nationally by Top Drawer Soccer - midfielder Madeline Simpson (No. 49), defender Kiki Maki (No. 170) and midfielder Charlotte McClure (No. 186)
- Also part of the class is forward Degen Miller who was named the Colorado Gatorade Player of the Year after tallying 43 goals and 16 assists as a senior
- A pair of goalkeepers round out the freshman crop with Camryn Miller who earned Regional Player of the Year honors and Ally Reynolds who earned Top Drawer Soccer DA Playoff standout recognition

ALL-AMERICAN TRANSFER JOINS CAVALIER PROGRAM

- In addition to the six freshmen, the Cavaliers also added a grad transfer with two-time All-American forward Haley Hopkins
- Hopkins comes to the Virginia program with two years of eligibility remaining after graduating from Vanderbilt
- She finished her career with 34 goals - second all-time on the career goal scoring list for in Commodore program history
- Of her 34 goals, 14 were game-winning goal and she added 12 assists for a total of 80 points in her career
- Hopkins was named the Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year in 2018 and earned All-America honors in 2018 and this past season.

IVORY AND CAVALIERS' EXTENDED SHUTOUT STREAK SNAPPED AGAINST GEORGE WASHINGTON

- The Hoos entered the 2021 season riding a shutout streak after posting four clean sheets on a run to the NCAA semifinal
- Laurel Ivory and UVA posted 459:35 scoreless minutes dating back to the NCAA opener against SIUE to close the year
- After shut outs in the first three games, the Hoos went 776:41 minutes between goals surrendered
- That stretch of 776:41 was the third longest in program history and passed the last stretch of 775:01 set in 2019
- Ivory's streak of 665:06 shutout minutes is fourth all-time at UVA - Ivory has four of the top eight performances
- The fifth-year keeper also holds the second longest shutout streak with 775:01 minutes set in the 2019 season

THEORET SETTLES INTO MIDFIELD ROLE AS SOPHOMORE

- Sophomore Alexis Theoret has settled into her role at midfield as one of the first players off the bench for the Cavaliers
- Earlier this year, Theoret got her first collegiate assists on game winners vs. No. 2 Duke and at NC State in the same week
- She finally broke into the scoring column vs. Louisville, answering the Cards' score with her own goal 1:10 later for a 3-1 lead
- She added to that with a goal in the NCAA Tournament opener against High Point in UVA's 6-0 victory
- Theoret has played 823 minutes this season for the most minutes for any non-starter in the 2021 campaign for UVA
- In 16 games as a freshman, Theoret tallied 453 minutes and managed two shots in that time

HOOS SCORE IN BUNCHES DOWN THE STRETCH IN REGULAR SEASON

- Virginia was not only been a prolific offense down the regular-season stretch, but the Hoos scored goals in bunches
- The flurry of goal scoring began at Boston College when Alexa Spaanstra scored a pair of goals in a three-minute stretch
- Virginia continued that with five goals in just under 12 minutes in the next outing against Syracuse in a 5-0 win
- The Hoos again had an offensive burst against No. 17 Notre Dame with two goals in 37 seconds to notch the 2-1 win
- Against Miami, the Hoos racked up six goals in a 26 minute span - including braces from Haley Hopkins and Diana Ordoñez

UVA IN THE ACC CHAMPIONSHIPS

- Virginia holds a 24-25-9 all-time record in the ACC Championships
- The Hoos have won the ACC Championships twice in program history - 2004 and 2012
- In its nine draws, the Cavaliers have only twice advanced on PKs, once being the 2004 title

UVA WINS THE ACC CHAMPIONSHIP IN 2004, 2012

- UVA won the ACC Championship for the first time in the 2004 season over UNC by shootout
- The Cavaliers claimed the title 5-4 on PKs after playing the Tar Heels to a 1-1 draw
- Lindsay Gusick scored the goal for UVA off a Sarah Huffman assist in the 24th minute
- Virginia won its second ACC Championship in the 2012 season with a 4-0 win over Maryland
- UVA got goals from Morgan Brian, Makenzy Doniak, Gloria Douglas and Caroline Miller

VIRGINIA IN THE ACC CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS

- The Cavaliers have now advanced to the ACC Tournament finals eight times in program history
- Virginia is 1-5-2 all-time in the championship match of the ACC Tournament heading into Sunday
- The Hoos first advanced to the ACC Tournament Championship in 1990, falling to UNC
- Virginia has advanced to the finals in 1990, 2004, 2005, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2019 and now 2021

VIRGINIA TOUGH TO BEAT IN OVERTIME IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

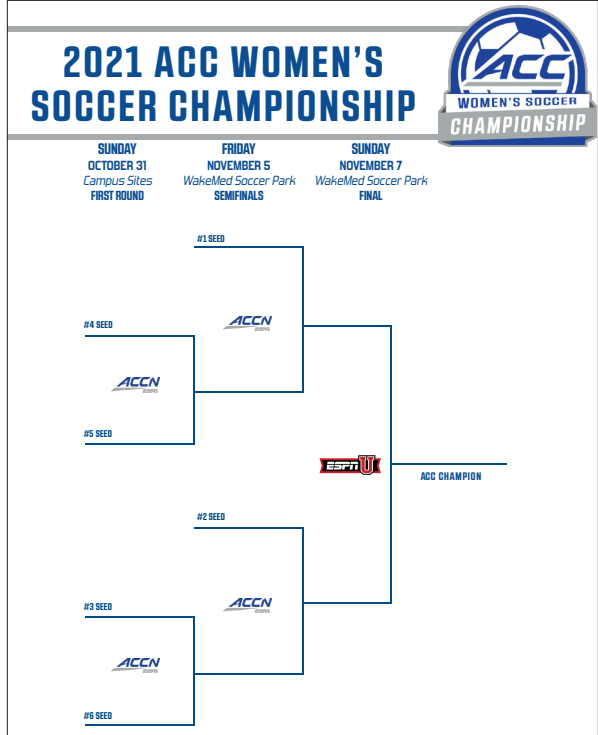
- The Cavaliers have been strong in matches that head to overtime in the history of the ACC Tournament
- UVA has played 13 matches that have gone to overtime with a 3-1-9 record in overtime matches
- The Cavaliers' only outright loss in overtime in the ACC Championships came in the 2019 final against UNC
- Virginia's three overtime wins have come against Duke (2001), Wake Forest (2008) and Florida State (2019)
- The Cavaliers have forced a shootout in nine instances when heading to overtime at the ACC Tournament

HOOS CLAIM TOP SEED FOR THIRD TIME IN PROGRAM HISTORY

- The Cavaliers are the top seed in the ACC Tourney for the third time in program history (2013, 2015, 2021)
- UVA advanced to the semifinals in that 2013 season and advanced to the finals in the 2015 season

A DEEPER LOOK AT VIRGINIA IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

- Virginia holds a 48-28-8 record in matches played in the NCAA Tournament all-time
- That record is impressive in the Swanson era with a 45-17-7 mark under his leadership
- The Cavaliers have out-scored foes 179-to-89 in NCAA Tournament matches
- That score margin is more pronounced under Swanson coming in at 166-to-64 all-time

HOOS HAVE BEEN A MAINSTAY IN THE POSTSEASON WITH A STRETCH OF DEEP NCAA RUNS

- The Hoos have been a mainstay in the NCAA Tournament with 33 appearances overall and 27 straight berths
- The 33 appearances is second all-time, while the 27 straight appearances is the second longest active streak
- Only North Carolina has more appearances (39) having made every single tournament in NCAA history
- Virginia had an active streak of 14 consecutive appearances in the Sweet 16 until last season's loss to eventual College Cup participant Washington State in the second round
- The appearance in the Sweet 16 was the 15th in the last 16 years for the Cavaliers
- Virginia has made seven appearances in the quarterfinals under head coach Steve Swanson - also making it in 2001, 2005, 2011 2013, 2014, 2015.
- The Hoos advanced to the College Cup in the 2013 and 2014 season - making the finals appearance in 2014
- UVA also advanced to the quarterfinals in 1991 when Virginia went on to make its first semifinal appearance
- This is the fourth overall appearance in a semifinal match and third under head coach Steve Swanson



CAVALIERS PLAYING IN A STOUT POD FOR SECOND AND THIRD ROUND ACTION

- The Hoos are playing in a stout pod statistically with BYU and Milwaukee as the nation's top two offenses.
- The Cavaliers make it three of the top 10 goal scoring teams in the nation in action on Thursday at Klöckner.
- Defensively, the Panthers and Hoos are two of the top 10 nations in shutouts with 19 and 12, respectively.
- Virginia has conceded only 12 goals this season - four in one game - while Milwaukee has allowed only six.
- Alabama advanced by knocking off Clemson in the first round, picking up the program's first NCAA victory.

RECAPPING THE 2020 SEASON'S RUN TO THE COLLEGE CUP

- The Hoos advanced to the College Cup for the third time under Steve Swanson in the 2020 NCAA Tournament
- UVA opened the NCAA Tournament with a 3-1 win over SIUE behind an Alexa Spaanstra brace to spark a rally
- Virginia posted three consecutive shutouts on the run to the College Cup and a semifinal matchup vs. FSU
- A second Spaanstra brace led the Cavaliers to a 2-0 upset over No. 12 seed BYU in the second round
- Virginia then got a hat trick from Diana Ordoñez in the Sweet 16 to take down Rice for an Elite Eight berth
- Lizzy Sieracki hit the lone goal for the Hoos in a 1-0 victory over No. 4 seed TCU to earn the semifinal spot

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

- Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.
- First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process. This tends to be used less in athletic eligibility references.
- Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

- Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."
- Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.
- Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

- The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS: ORANGE AND BLUE

- Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.
- One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAHOOWA

- The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.
- Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

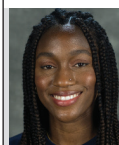
