SEMINOLES PLAY FINAL ACC ROAD GAME OF SEASON AT VIRGINIA

Florida State, which has won three of its last four games against Virginia, travels to play the Cavaliers at John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville, Va., on February 26, 2022. The game is set for 4:00 p.m. The Seminoles most recently defeated the Cavaliers by an 81-60 margin on February 15, 2021 in Tallahassee in the only meeting between the two teams last season. Following Saturday's game at Virginia, the Seminoles close out their home schedule with two games -- one on March 2 against Notre Dame and its final game of the regular season against NC State on March 5. The Seminoles' game against the Wolfpack is Florida State's annual Senior Day celebration.

HAMILTON, FLORIDA STATE WITH TWO NATIONAL HISTORICAL RECORDS

...Under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have won a NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The streak began with a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 and continued on January 18, 2022 with their 79-78 overtime win over Duke;

...Speaking to the ability of Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and how he develops talent, Hamilton has now won an NCAA record 55 games over ranked teams while his teams were unranked. Hamilton's 55th win over a ranked team as the coach of an unranked team came as a 79-78 overtime win over No. 5 Duke on January 18.

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 391 career wins and ranked fifth in ACC history with 174 career ACC wins at Florida State.

HAMILTON TO BE INDUCTED INTO FLORIDA STATE HALL OF FAME

The Florida State University's Athletics Hall of Fame will induct nine new members on Friday, April 8, including men's basketball coach Leonard Hamilton and All-Americans from six different sports. Hamilton, who is the Seminoles' all-time winningest basketball coach and currently the fifth all-time winningest coach in ACC history, will be inducted along with one of his former players in star point guard Toney Douglas.

FLORIDA STATE'S SUCCESS AGAINST VIRGINIA

Beginning with a 69-62 win over Virginia on January 17, 2016 in Tallahassee, Florida State is one of only two teams in the ACC with a winning record against Virginia since the start of the 2015-16 season.

PRIETO NAMED TO THE ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT MEN'S BASKETBALL TEAM

Redshirt senior Harrison Prieto, who earned a double double of 13 points and 13 rebounds against Wake Forest on February 5, has been named to the 2022 Academic All-District 4 Men's Basketball team as selected by the College Sports Information Directors (CoSIDA) of America. The 2021-22 Academic All-District Men's Basketball recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the court and in the classroom. Prieto earned a 3.61 GPA as an undergraduate in Meteorology and holds a 3.58 GPA as a graduate student.

SEMINOLES' COLLEGE BASKETBALL RECORD OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State defeated Duke, 79-70, in overtime on January 18 in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of the their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Florida State has defeated 11 teams during their overtime streak and are 2-0 in OT games this year.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Virginia and gain its sixth victory over the Cavaliers since the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles are 3-1 against Virginia in Tallahassee, 1-2 against the Cavaliers in Charlottesville and 1-0 in the ACC Tournament in last six seasons. Saturday's meeting is the first between the two teams this season;

...Defeat Virginia and win its fourth ACC road game of the season. The Seminoles have won at NC State (January 1), at Syracuse (January 15) and at Miami (January 22);

...Defeat Virginia and win its eighth ACC game of the season for the school-record 14th consecutive season. The Seminoles have won at least eight ACC games each season since the 2008-09 season.

ACC BLOWOUTS ACCORDING TO FLORIDA STATE HEAD COACH LEONARD HAMILTON

Florida State enters Saturday's game at Virginia with five one-point victories this season – 81-80 over Boston University (November 24), 65-64 over Miami (January 11), 79-78 over No. 5 Duke (January 18), 61-60 at Miami (January 22) and 81-80 over Clemson (February 15). The Seminoles' five one-point wins are the most by any team in the nation. The Seminoles are the third team in the ACC since 1980 with at least four one point wins in a season – joining Duke in 1981-82 and Maryland in 1982-83.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S ONE POINT VICTORIES OVER MIAMI

With its 65-64 (January 11) and 61-60 (January 22) wins over Miami, Florida State is only the fifth team in ACC history to earn multiple one-point victories over the same ACC opponent in the same season.

SEMINOLES WITH 10 STEALS AGAINST BOSTON COLLEGE; HOLD ACC STEALS LEAD

With 10 steals against Boston College on Monday night in Chestnut Hill, Florida State enters Saturday's game against Virginia as the ACC steals leader with an 8.9 steals per game average. The Seminoles' 10 steals against the Eagles marked the third time this season they have earned double digit steals in ACC play and the ninth time overall this season that they have earned 10 or more steals in a game.

Florida State made 13 of 15 free throws (.867 percent) against Boston College and are shooting nearly 80 percent from the free throw line in the last three games. The Seminoles enter Saturday's game against Virginia having shot 80 percent or better from the line nine times this season with their season high free throw shooting percentage of .882 (15 of 17) coming against Virginia Tech on January 29 in Tallahassee.

...Has scored 44 points and is averaging 14.7 points scored per game. He totaled his career-high of 28 points in the Seminoles 81-80 victory over Clemson on February 15 in Tallahassee;
 ...Has pulled down seven rebounds (2.3 rpg) and has been credited with eight assists (2.7 spg). He totaled four rebounds at North Carolina on February 12 and four assists each against North Carolina and Clemson on February 15;
 ...Is shooting .433 from the floor and .375 from the free throw line;

EVANS FROM THE FREE THROW LINE FOR HIS CAREER

Redshirt senior RayQuan Evans enters Saturday's game against Virginia with a near-career-high .839 free throw shooting percentage. His efforts from the free throw line this season have helped him raise his career-free throw shooting percentage to .815 percent – including .843 percent (86 of 102) in the last two seasons. Evans is making a career-high average of better than two free throws a game this season after making 12 of 13 attempts from the line in Florida State's victory over Clemson on February 15.

FLORIDA STATE VS. VIRGINIA – THE LAST MEETING

M.J. Walker scored 17 points and No. 16 Florida State built a big first-half lead, beating No. 7 Virginia 81-60 in a showdown between the top two teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference on February 15, 2021 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. RaiQuan Gray had 15 points as the Seminoles handed 2019 national champion Virginia its worst ACC loss in four years. Walker made five of Florida State's season-high 13 3-pointers on 24 attempts (54 percent). Gray scored in double figures for the seventh straight game. Florida State has won 24 consecutive ACC home games dating to a victory over Clemson on Jan. 22, 2019. Trey Murphy III had 13 points and Kihei Clark added 12 in the second half for Virginia, which had won four in a row. Florida State has taken four of the last five meetings at home. The Seminoles shot a robust 29 of 58 (50 percent) from the floor against one of the nation's stingiest defensive programs. Florida State jumped on the Cavaliers early. Gray and Walker had nine points apiece as the Seminoles went 6 of 10 from 3-point range on the way to a stunning 45-25 halftime lead. Murphy's 3-pointer closed the deficit to 48-41 with 14:24 left, but the Cavaliers couldn't cut into the lead any further.

.889 Redshirt Senior Tanor Ngos is shooting .889 from the free throw line (eight of nine) in the last three games. He was a perfect four of four from the free throw line in Florida State's victory over Clemson.

1 Redshirt sophomore Cam'Ron Fletcher earned his first career double double of 16 points and 10 rebounds in Florida State's game at North Carolina on February 12.

1 Freshman Jalen Warley enters Saturday's game against Virginia as Florida State's leader in assists with 68 and a 2.5 assists per game average.

3 Redshirt senior Tanor Ngom totaled his career-high of three steals against Boston College on Monday in Chestnut Hill. He had earned one steal (against Boston University) in his first 15 games of the season.

4 Redshirt sophomore Cam'Ron Fletcher has totaled four double figure scoring games in the last four games (15.3 ppg) after totaling five double figure scoring games in his first 23 games as a Seminole (5.5 ppg).

7 Redshirt senior Harrison Prieto has played in double figure minutes in each of the last seven games (122 minutes / 17.4 mpg). He played a total of 70 minutes in the first five seasons of his career at Florida State (2.6 mpg).

8 Redshirt senior Justin Lindner has a single-season career-high tying eight assists in eight games played this season.

27 Freshman John Butler and redshirt sophomore Cam'Ron Fletcher are the only two Seminoles who have played in all 27 games for Florida State this season.

Butler is looking to become the second freshman in the last three seasons to lead Florida State in blocked shots. Patrick Williams, the No. 4 overall pick in the 2020 NBA Draft by the Chicago Bulls, led the Seminoles in blocked shots in his only season in Tallahassee.

PRIETO IN DOUBLE FIGURE MNUTES PLAYED

Redshirt senior Harrison Prieto has played in double figure minutes (122 total minutes) in each of the last seven games and averages 17.4 minutes played per game since earning 16 minutes of playing time at Clemson on February 2. He had played in double figures minutes (10 against Wake Forest on January 8, 2020) only once in his career prior to this season. Prieto has played in double figure minutes in seven consecutive and 10 games this season.

John Butler Quickly Coming Of Age For Florida State

In 2020, the 51st best recruit in the nation signed to play men's basketball for Florida State for the 2021-2022 season. At 7 feet tall with a 7'3 wingspan, you may spot the freshman playing defense as a shot blocker.

He scored his career high of 14 points and assisted the team in defeating Duke in a 79-78 overtime victory in January. He continues to use his offensive skill set to help the Seminoles succeed.

But who is John Butler?

Butler began playing basketball at the young age of four-years old, but feels like he has been playing "since [he] was born."

"Basketball was in my head at a very young age," said Butler.

This was on account of both Butler's parents playing basketball and being big fans of the sport. They played a large role in his success. His mom played at South Carolina and his dad is a long-time, successful high school coach. Butler played for his dad, John Butler Sr., at Christ Church Episcopal where he was named the 2021 Class 2A Boys Player of the Year and an All-State First-Team selection by the South Carolina Basketball Coaches Association.

His parents inspired and guided him along the way, but Butler learned to fall in love with the game on his own.

"I started playing on my own and it was my own self-motivation to keep doing what I was doing," Butler said.

Following his incredible high school success, Butler chose to continue his playing career at Florida State over Baylor, Georgia Tech, Alabama, South Carolina, Vanderbilt, and Wake Forest.

"Florida State had a different culture," said Butler. "Everybody was so caring and wanted everybody else to succeed so badly. The coaching staff gives off all that energy. I felt like I needed to be a part of the culture at Florida State."

Being a freshman can certainly be a challenge, but being a freshman and playing major college basketball is an incredible challenge for any player.

"It took a lot of adjusting," said Butler. "The seniors are all good role models on and off the basketball court."

John Butler has been a sponge since the day he walked on campus in May," said senior Malik Osborne. "I've been able to mentor him on the court and he relies on me to be a dependable resource who he can ask about anything. I see John as a future All-ACC player and with professional capabilities. I really feel that he going to become a KD (Kevin Durant) type of player that can score from all three levels, and who can defend every position on the floor."

Butler learns from the seniors on a daily basis and will carry on their advice during his career as a Seminole.

During his early season adjustment period, he realized that playing basketball for Florida State means the same for him and the veterans.

"We all know how to play basketball and we all respect each other so much," said Butler. "I can bounce ideas off them without feeling like I am stepping out of my place."

Butler has learned that everyone is accepting and he welcomes new ideas on various aspects and situations on the court.

Throughout the season, he has made a lot of improvement vocally and learned he can use his voice in addition to his talent to have an impact on the team as a first-year player.

"Instead of sitting back and letting the veterans do what they do, I took a step forward in leading the team along with them," Butler said.

Besides being a vocal leader, Butler also actively leads the team with play during games. He is quick and nimble in making judgements based on how his opponents play.

"I feel like I have been playing for so long I have a good IQ for the game," said Butler.

He uses his IQ understand the game, make the right reads and right passes, and recognize the defensive and offensive strategies from his opponents.

At 7-1, Butler has always been tall, but as he has gotten older, he has gotten used to his height.

"I am now more understanding of it and I enjoy being 7 feet," said Butler. Although Butler does attract a lot of attention, he has gotten past the pressure of performing in front of a crowd. Because he has been playing for so long, he no longer feels the pressure.

"I love playing basketball and am used to it."

Before every game, Butler enjoys listening to music. He is a big music guy and likes to listen to up-beat music to get his energy up, and prepare himself to be mentally ready to play. It helps him clear his mind and get focused before he is on the court.

After each game, he likes to submerge in the cold tub. Good or bad, he likes to keep his post-game ritual the same for recovery.

Butler's biggest influences as he develops his playing style include Brandon Ingram, Jayson Tatum, Kevin Durant, and many other NBA players.

In his free time, Butler enjoys watching their films to help improve his game. He also enjoys watching NFL football and is a proud Bengals fan. Off the court, basketball influences Butler's life in many ways.

"It teaches you how to work with bosses and coaches," said Butler. It teaches you teamwork, and how to communicate. It also helps you realize how to be part of a program for everyone to succeed together," said Butler.

Some of the best advice Butler has ever received is from Florida State's head coach, Leonard Hamilton.

"Coach Ham has a lot of slogans," said Butler. "My favorite is 'do everything you do with all your heart and all your soul' and 'If I succeed I succeed or if I fail, I gave everything I had.'"

Hamilton has certainly been impressed with Butler during the first year of his collegiate career.

“There is no doubt that John Butler is growing up in front of our eyes,” said Hamilton. “There’s not another seven foot player in the country that’s being asked to do what we are asking him to do. He has a tremendous amount of adjustment to make in terms of guarding the ball full court, moving the ball down court, moving the ball in transition, and switching on all five positions.

Hamilton often references his performance in the Seminoles’ victory over Duke in the first meeting between the two teams this season.

“John shot the ball well from the perimeter, did a great job containing the dribble, and with his length, size and wingspan, I think made a big difference in them (Duke) not making some of the plays they normally make.”

Hamilton knows there will be many more performances like that, as Butler continues to grow in Florida State’s program.

Tucker Center. Caleb Mills led the Seminoles with 18 points, while Butler added a career-high 14. The Seminoles outscored the Blue Devils by a 12-11 margin in the overtime period to win their 13th consecutive overtime game. The Seminoles' overtime winning streak dates back to a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018. Florida State has defeated 11 different teams during the overtime streak with its win over Duke marking its first over the Blue Devils during the streak.
