Virginia at NCAA Championships

Series History: Virginia makes its 42nd NCAA appearance
 Last Season: Louie Hayes became 17th UVA All-American
 Of Note: UVA has eight qualifiers for second straight year



4-6, 1-4 ACC

QUICK SHOTS

- Virginia enters the tournament with seven wrestlers ranked in the latest InterMat individual rankings
- **Jay Aiello** leads the way as the highest-ranked Cavalier at No. 15 at 197 pounds and he is one of two wrestlers in the top 20 for the Cavaliers with Justin McCoy (165) at No. 16
- **Aiello** returned to action in a tri-dual at Northwestern in December after missing the early part of the season following his bronze-medal outing at 97kg at the U23 World Games in Serbia in November
- **Justin McCoy** (165) stormed through the season with one loss to No. 21 Thomas Bullard of NC State. His second loss came to No. 14 Jake Wentzel in the ACC Championship final
- **Jake Keating** (157) saw his first action at the MatMen open when he claimed a third-place finish before jumping back into the lineup for the Hoos in January
- **Brian Courtney** has built a 13-6 record this season and his six losses have all come in decisions against top-21 wrestlers - including two vs. top 10 wrestlers. He defeated No. 10 Jaime Hernandez.
- **Michael Battista** (184) built his resume with an 11-match win streak that was snapped vs. UNC and included three wins over nationally-ranked foes - highlighted by No. 16 Caleb Hopkins of Campbell
- **Quinn Miller** (285) closed the regular-season strong with four straight wins and a 3-2 mark in ACC duals that included a win over No. 14 Nathan Traxler of Virginia Tech in the regular-season finale

THE CAVALIERS IN THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

- UVA makes its 35th consecutive appearance in the NCAA Championships in 2019
- The Cavaliers' best finish under head coach Steve Garland is 15th in 2010 and 2017
- The best finish all-time for UVA came in its first appearance - a 10th-place finish in 1957
- UVA has had four finalists - Henry Jordan (1957 - HWT), Steve Garland (2000) - 125, George DiCamillo (2017 - 141) and Jack Mueller (2019 - 125).
- In addition to his finals appearance in 2019, Mueller also advanced to the semifinals in the 2017 NCAA Championships and took a sixth-place finish after having to medically withdraw
- All-time, UVA has had 17 wrestlers garner All-America honors. Three of them earned the honor multiple times with Chris Henrich, Nick Sulzer and Jack Mueller all being three-time All-Americans.

HOOS HEADING TO DETROIT

- Virginia has eight wrestlers headed to Detroit for the NCAA Championships one earning his fourth bid, two with their third, three earning their second consecutive bid and two making their first entry
- Jay Aiello (197) earned his fourth consecutive bid to become the 13th four-time qualifier in UVA history
- Justin McCoy (165) and Quinn Miller (285) earned third straight bids. It's McCoy's first at 165.
- Brian Courtney (133), Jake Keating (157), Patrick McCormick (125) all earned a second-straight bid.
- Michael Battista (184) and Dylan Cedeno (141) both earned their first NCAA Championship berths.

VIRGINIA AT THE ACC CHAMPIONSHIPS ALL TIME

- UVA has won five ACC Championships – 1974, 1975, 1977, 2010 and 2015.
- Virginia finished second at the 2012 and 2013 ACC Championships.
- The five ACC Championships is third most of current members of the league behind UNC and NC State.
- UVA has finished runner-up 22 times, giving the Hoos 27 finishes in the top two in the league all-time.

CEDENO FINDS A GROOVE AT ACC CHAMPIONSHIPS

- Dylan Cedeno saw limited action in the regular-season, but found a groove in the ACC Championships
- The sophomore battled in a tough 1-0 loss to Collin Gerardi of Virginia Tech before hitting his stride
- In his second matchup, he turned in a dominant performance to knock out sixth-ranked Kizhan Clarke of UNC 5-0
- He then got a rematch with Gerardi in the third-place match, taking that bout 7-5 to earn his NCAA bid
- The performances come on the heels of a solid outing as a freshman when he went 6-1 in the COVID limited season

SIX CAVALIERS ASCEND THE PODIUM AT ACC CHAMPIONSHIPS

- Dylan Cedeno wasn't the only Cavalier to lock up his spot in the NCAA Championships by placing on March 6
- In all, six members of the team placed with Justin McCoy leading the way with a runner-up finish at 165 pounds
- The other five wrestlers all took third place in order to secure their spot in Detroit by the end of the night
- Patrick McCormick (125), Cedeno (141), Jake Keating (157), Jay Aiello (197) and Quinn Miller (285) all took third

AIELLO CLAIMS BRONZE AT U23 WORLD GAMES IN SERBIA

- Jay Aiello became the first Virginia wrestler to medal on the international stage when he took bronze at the U23 World Games in Serbia back in November at 97kg
- Aiello won his first two matches to advance to the semifinals before falling to eventual gold-medal winner
- Due to his time with the US team abroad, Aiello missed the early portions of the season as he competed and then worked to cut weight back to 197 pounds after returning to Virginia
- Aiello missed the duals with American, Maryland and Campbell before returning to the lineup right before the new year with his appearance at the tri-dual with No. 24 Northwestern and SIUE

AIELLO NAMED ACC WRESTLER OF THE WEEK

- Jay Aiello was named ACC Wrestler of the Week by the ACC office on January 18 after a 4-0 week at Virginia Duals
- Aiello posted a trio of bonus-point victories, including a pair of first period pins and a tech fall to start the week
- He closed with a 6-1 decision over All-American and 2021 NCAA semifinalist No. 11 Jake Woodley of Oklahoma

COURTNEY NAMED ACC WRESTLER OF THE WEEK

- Brian Courtney was named ACC Wrestler of the Week by the league office on February 1 after the dual with UNC
- Courtney went 2-0 with a pair of sudden-victory decisions on the day - including his dual bout and an extra match
- He defeated No. 10 Jaime Hernandez in the dual before taking down Joe Heilmann in his extra match after the dual

ALL-AMERICA COACHING STAFF FOR THE HOOS

- Virginia's coaching staff consists of four All-Americans, including a pair of NCAA finalists and an NCAA Champion.
- Head coach Steve Garland was the national runner-up at 125 pounds in 2000.
- Associate head coach Travis Paulson was a three-time All-American at Iowa State.
- Assistant coach Trent Paulson was a three-time All-American at Iowa State and 2007 NCAA Champion. Trent was also a World Team member in 2009.
- Volunteer assistant coach Jack Mueller is a Virginia alum who was an NCAA finalist in 2019 at 125 pounds and was a three-time All-American

HOOS SIGN HERALDED CLASS FOR 2022

- The Cavaliers signed a 10-man recruiting class for the 2022 season it was announced back in November
- Six of the members of the class were ranked in the top 100 nationally on FloWrestling's Big Board
- Set to join the Cavaliers by rank are Kyle Montaperto (No. 47), Jack Giofre (No. 57), Michael Giofre (No. 64), Garrett Grice (No. 81), Robert Avila (No. 92) and Griffin Gammel (No. 98)
- The incoming crew - which added two more in recent weeks with RJ May and Cooper Rudolph - have claimed nine state individual championships this season which is the most of any recruiting class in the nation

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH STEVE GARLAND AT A GLANCE ...

- Head coach Steve Garland is in his 16th year at the helm of his alma mater.
- He is the winningest coach all-time in the Virginia wrestling program, passing George Edwards with a win over Southern Virginia (11/2/20)
- His UVA wrestlers have won 14 All-America honors and 18 individual ACC titles.
- Garland guided UVA to six straight top-30 finishes at the NCAA Championships (2000-15) marking the first time UVA recorded six straight NCAA top-30 finishes in program history.
- The 2010 ACC Coach of the Year, Garland led Virginia to an ACC championship and a 15th-place finish at NCAAs in 2010 (UVA's best NCAA finish since 1957) and matched that 15th-place finish in 2017.
- He is an alum of the program and was the NCAA runner-up at 125 pounds in 2000 and the 1997 ACC champ at 126 pounds.

HOOS BATTLE WITH VIRGINIA TECH IN COMMONWEALTH CLASH

- The battle with No. 7 Virginia Tech was a close one decided by five points or fewer for the third straight year
- Virginia won four of the six weight classes, but got a pin by Jay Aiello as one of the big wins on the night
- Quinn Miller also came up big, downing No. 14 Nathan Traxler to hand him his first ACC loss and only second overall

KEATING PICKS UP BIG WIN IN DUAL AT NO. 4 NC STATE

- Jake Keating picked up a big individual win as the bright spot in the Cavaliers' dual at No. 4 NC State
- Keating downed No. 10 Ed Scott to give the Hoos the only individual win of the dual
- It was the second straight year Keating defeated a top-10 wrestler in the dual with the Pack after he defeated then No. 10 Thomas Bullard at 157 last season

DUAL WITH UNC COMES DOWN TO CRITERIA

- Virginia's second ACC outing was a tight dual against No. 24 North Carolina that awarded to UNC 17-16 on criteria
- The teams each one five weight classes with each side recording a major decision to tie at 16-16 for the night
- UNC scored 53 total points to 45 for the Cavaliers in the dual giving the Tar Heels the dual victory
- UVA got wins from Brian Courtney (133), Justin McCoy (165), Jay Aiello (197), Quinn Miller (285) and Patrick McCormick (125) in the dual - including the major decision from Aiello to keep the Cavaliers in the match
- Virginia won the final three weight classes (197, 285 and 125) to tie the match and send it to criteria

IN THE OPENER VS. NO. 18 PITTSBURGH

- Virginia went on the road to kick off the ACC slate, traveling to face No. 18 Pittsburgh in the conference opener
- The Hoos held the lead after five weight classes and the dual was tied 10-10 following the sixth weight class.
- Pitt won five straight down the stretch to close out the dual and take the victory
- UVA got wins from Jarod Verkleeren (149), Justin Phillips (174) and Michael Battista (184) in the dual
- The Hoos were without starters Brian Courtney (133), Dylan Cedeno (141) and Justin McCoy (165) for the meet

THE HOOS AT TRI-DUAL WITH SIUE AND NO. 24 NORTHWESTERN

- When the Midlands were canceled, UVA agreed to replace it with a tri-dual against SIUE and No. 24 Northwestern
- Virginia was dominant in the day's first dual, defeating SIUE by a score of 34-3
- The Hoos then battled down to the wire with the hosting Wildcats in a dual won 18-16 by Northwestern
- The Wildcats used a late takedown at 133 pounds from No. 9 Chris Cannon over No. 13 Brian Courtney for victory
- A pin by No. 4 Yahya Thomas at 149 pounds helped provide the boost the Wildcats needed to get over the hump

THE HOOS BATTLE CAMPBELL IN TIGHT DUAL TO OPEN HOME SCHEDULE

- Virginia opened its home schedule against Campbell at the Aquatic and Fitness Center on November 20
- The Hoos and Camels battled to a tie through the first eight weight classes before Campbell pulled away for victory
- The win was the first ever by Campbell in the series with the Cavaliers

VIRGINIA DOMINATES IN BACK-TO-BACK DUALS TO OPEN 2021-22 CAMPAIGN

- Virginia opened the season in back-to-back road duals, competing at American and Maryland to start the season
- UVA won eight weight classes in the dual against American to take the 33-6 victory
- Virginia then won its dual in the second weekend 24-9 over Maryland, winning seven weight classes vs. the Terps

CAVALIERS HAVE SUCCESS IN OPEN TOURNAMENTS

- Virginia wrestlers have had success in open tournaments this season with multiple placewinners all year
- The Hoos had 10 placewinners at the Southeast Open - including 133 pound champion Erik Roggie in the freshman/sophomore bracket
- UVA had 10 placewinners again at the Mat Town Open - including champions Jon Errico (157), Justin McCoy (165), Justin Phillips (174) and Michael Battista (184)
- Four Hoos placed at the Lehman Open hosted by Franklin and Marshall to kick off 2022 the first weekend in January
- Eight wrestlers placed at the Appalachian Open last weekend, including 197-pound champion Colden Dorfman
