### OPENING DRAW

#### GAME OVERVIEW

- No. 2 Virginia (4-0) returns to Klöckner Stadium to host No. 14/15 Johns Hopkins (3-2) in a clash for the Doyle Smith Cup.
- Opening faceoff is set for 1 p.m. on ACC Network Extra.

#### SEASON OVERVIEW

- The 2022 season marks the 93rd season for the Virginia men's lacrosse program, which boasts an all-time record of 679-376-1.
- Virginia is seeking its third consecutive national championship, having won titles in 2019 and 2021. No national championship was held in 2020 after the NCAA announced on March 12, 2020 that it had canceled all remaining winter and spring championships due to the onset of COVID-19.
- The Cavaliers are also seeking to become just the third program in NCAA in Division-I men's lacrosse history to capture three consecutive NCAA titles. Only Princeton (1996-98) and Johns Hopkins (1978-80) have won three straight NCAA championships. Syracuse won NCAA titles from 1988-90, but the 1990 championship was later vacated by the NCAA.

#### LAST TIME OUT

- Virginia handed then-No. 9 Syracuse its largest defeat in series history, 20-11, at Klöckner Stadium.
- The Cavaliers led 8-1 at the end of the first quarter after Syracuse's lone goal of the period was bookended by a pair of 4-0 runs by UVA.
- With his first faceoff victory against the Orange, Petey LaSalla (19-28 FO), the reigning ACC Defensive Player of the Week, became the program's all-time leader in career faceoff wins.
- Connor Shellenberger (3 goals, 4 assists) Matt Moore (3 goals), Payton Cormier (3 goals) and Griffin Schutz (3 goals) all notched hat tricks against Syracuse.

### NUMBERS TO KNOW

3

Virginia is seeking to become just the third NCAA men's lacrosse program to win three consecutive national titles in 2022, which would put itself in a category with Princeton (1996-98) and Johns Hopkins (1978-80).

35

Graduate attackman Matt Moore needs just 35 points to become the all-time leading point leader in program history. Moore currently has 235 points (124 goal & 111 assists). Steele Stanwick currently holds the program record with 269 points.

95

Virginia and Johns Hopkins are meeting for the 95th time, dating back to the first-ever matchup between the two teams in 1904. The Cavaliers have played more games (95) than anyone else in program history.

## THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

### UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

**Grounds:** The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

**First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year:** Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

**Commonwealth:** Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

### UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

### THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

### UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

### WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

**THE CLASH FOR THE DOYLE SMITH CUP**

- Upon the Doyle Smith Cup's inaugural matchup in 2006, Virginia and Johns Hopkins joined together to honor E. Doyle Smith, Jr., for his lifetime of contributions to the lacrosse programs at both schools and on the national level with the annual winner laying claim to the cup.
- Smith served as team manager and statistician for Johns Hopkins under coach Bob Scott from 1963-1968.
- He enrolled at UVA to pursue a doctorate in the fall of 1968, and became the University's first full-time assistant sports information director, a position he held for 31 years until his retirement in 1999, serving as the lacrosse team's publicist for four head coaches—Buddy Beardmore, Glenn Thiel, Jim Adams and Dom Starsia.
- On the national level, Smith was one of the nation's foremost authorities on the sport as his name is synonymous with the game's history and record keeping.
- He is credited with writing the original manuscript that later became the framework for the current NCAA statisticians' manual for men's lacrosse.
- He served as the information director compiling the weekly rankings and statistics for the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) from 1973-95 and twice received its Man of the Year Award. The USILA media award bears his name.
- In 2000, he was elected to the US Lacrosse Hall of Fame and is believed to be the only individual inducted who never played or coached the game at some level.
- Smith passed away in June 2004, not long after the 2004 national championship game.
- Virginia currently leads Hopkins 8-6 in Doyle Cup Smith meetings since the inaugural matchup in 2006.

**SLOW STARTS, STRONG FINISHES**

- In its first three games, Virginia did not lead at the end of the first period and was out-scored 9-3 by its opponents.
- However, after grasping an 8-1 lead at the end of the first in its most recent win over Syracuse, UVA has now out-scored its opponents 11-10 in opening periods.
- Despite three slow starts, the Cavaliers are 4-0 in large due to out-scoring their opponents by a combined margin of 48-19 in second and third periods.
- Overall, Virginia leads its 2022 foes in scoring 70-41, producing a 7.25 average margin of victory.

**CONNOR SHELLENBERGER, THE NATION'S LEADER IN ASSISTS**

- Connor Shellenberger is currently tied for first in assists per game (4.25).
- Shellenberger has posted at least three assists in all four games so far this season, including five in back-to-back games against Air Force (Feb. 5) and High Point (Feb. 13) to open the season.
- Shellenberger has also tallied at least five points in his last eight games, dating back to the Cavaliers' NCAA Tournament first round matchup against Bryant (May 16, 2021).
- Shellenberger has dished out at least one assist in 21 of his 22 career games.

**HOOS IN THE NATIONAL STATISTICAL RANKINGS**

- Virginia is currently leading the nation in ground balls (43.50/gm), second in opponent clear percentage (.691), fourth in scoring offense (17.50/gm) and points (27.50/gm), fifth in assists (10.00/gm) and man-down defense (.846), sixth in faceoff win percentage (.615), scoring margin (7.25/gm) and turnovers (14.00/gm), eighth in shot percentage (.355) and 10<sup>th</sup> in caused turnovers (10.25/gm).
- In addition to Shellenberger being tied for first in assists, Cole Kastner is second in caused turnovers (3.50/gm), Petey LaSalla is sixth in faceoff winning percentage (.640), Shellenberger is sixth in points (6.25/gm) and Matthew Nunes is 15<sup>th</sup> in goals against (9.88/gm).

**LASALLA GARNERS ACC, USILA ACC WEEKLY HONORS**

- Faceoff specialist Petey LaSalla was named the ACC's Defensive Player of the Week in addition to being tabbed a USILA Division-I Team-of-the-Week selection, as was announced March 1.
- LaSalla went 19-of-28 at the faceoff-X in Virginia's ACC opener, a 20-11 win over then-No. 9 Syracuse (Feb. 26) at Klöckner Stadium.
- With his first faceoff victory of the game – also the 605<sup>th</sup> of his career – LaSalla became Virginia's all-time leader in career faceoff wins.

**UVA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER STADIUM**

- Virginia owns a 161-43 (.789) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 3-0 mark in 2022 and are winners of 21 of the last 25 games played in the historic edifice. UVA is also 13-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.



- Virginia is 34-11 all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach Lars Tiffany.
- Lacrosse debuted in Klöckner Stadium in 1993.

- No. 2 Virginia has been ranked in the top five of the USILA Coaches poll in 304 weeks all-time, including in the most recent edition of the poll.

**VIRGINIA, MARYLAND SET FOR '21 TITLE REMATCH AT AUDI FIELD**

- On Feb. 22, Big Ten Network announced it would broadcast a rematch of the 2021 national championship between Virginia and Maryland at Audi Field (Washington D.C.) on Saturday, March 19 at 3 p.m.
- BTN's men's lacrosse coverage is led by Joe Beninati (play-by-play) and Mark Dixon (analyst).
- This year's rematch between Virginia and the Terrapins marks the first Division-I men's lacrosse game in Audi Field history.
- Virginia and Maryland's men's soccer teams have gone head-to-head at Audi Field three times (2018-19, 21).
- The three-game event also features Catholic vs. Hampden-Sydney (noon) and Duke vs. Towson (6 p.m.)

**ON THE HORIZON**

- Virginia travels to North Carolina for its first ACC road contest of the season on Thursday, March 10.
- Opening faceoff from Dorrance Field is set for 8 p.m. on ACC Network.

**NUNES NAMED ACC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

- Virginia first-year Matthew Nunes was named the ACC's Defensive Player of the Week on Feb. 15.
- Nunes turned in 16 saves in UVA's 11-10 win over High Point.
- The Woodlands, Texas native stopped a Panther shot with 20 seconds left in the contest to effectively seal the win for the Cavaliers.

**THREE CAVALIERS NAMED TO TEWAARATON WATCH LIST**

- Virginia's Petey LaSalla, Matt Moore and Connor Shellenberger were named to the Tewaaraton Watch List, the foundation announced Feb. 10.
- The award annually honors the top male and female college lacrosse player in the United States. The selection committees are made up of premier collegiate coaches and are appointed annually by The Tewaaraton Foundation.

**VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE**

- In 2021, Virginia led the nation with 41.94 ground balls per game.
- Entering 2022, UVA has led the nation in ground balls eight of the last 13 years, including the last five seasons under Lars Tiffany.
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the top-5 nationally in ground balls per game 12 times over the last 13 seasons.
- The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.
- Lars-Tiffany-coached teams have led the nation in ground balls in seven straight seasons, including the 2015 and 2016 seasons at Brown.

# HEAD COACH LARS TIFFANY

Lars Tiffany is in his sixth season as head coach of the Virginia men's lacrosse program after being named its 17th head coach on June 21, 2016.

Last season, Tiffany guided fourth-seeded Virginia to its seventh NCAA title after a 17-16 triumphant victory over third-seeded Maryland at Rentschler Field (East Hartford, Conn.) on May 31. With no NCAA Tournament held in 2020 due to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19), UVA's 2021 title marked the first time in men's lacrosse program history it won back-to-back national championships, having done so in 2019. Under the direction of Tiffany in 2021, Virginia became just the seventh men's lacrosse program in Division-I history to win back-to-back national championships and the first D-I men's lacrosse program to win six straight games in the NCAA finals (1999, 2003, 2006, 2011, 2019 and 2021). Tiffany and the Cavaliers are currently riding an eight-game winning streak in NCAA tournament games, which is also a program record.

For the fourth consecutive season (excluding 2020 due to COVID-19), Tiffany and the Cavaliers were the NCAA D-I statistical champions in ground balls per game (41.94), Virginia also finished in the top-10 nationally in several other statistical categories, including: third in goals scored per game (14.61), fifth in points per game (23.00) and opponent clear percentage (.798), sixth in shot percentage (.338) and winning percentage (.778), and tenth in assists per game (8.39) and faceoff winning percentage (.606). In addition to ground balls per game and opponent clear percentage, the Cavaliers led the ACC in caused turnovers per game (8.72) and saves per game (13.50).

Tiffany and his staff also guided nine USILA All-American selections in 2021, including Jared Conners, who was named the nation's most outstanding midfielder and a First Team All-American. In addition to Conners, Connor Schellenberger (1st), Petey LaSalla (2nd), Matt Moore (2nd), Kyle Kology (3rd), Payton Conner (HM), Cade Staustad (HM), Alex Rode (HM) and Dox Aitken (HM) were all named USILA All-Americans. Virginia's nine All-American selections tied for the most by any team in the nation in 2021. Schellenberger was also named the Most Outstanding Player of the 2021 NCAA Tournament, while Conners, LaSalla, Moore, Staustad and Rode were tabbed all-tournament selections.

Virginia was 4-2 during the 2020 season before it canceled by the NCAA on March 12 due to COVID-19. The shortened 2020 season saw Michael Kraus become just the fourth Cavalier to reach the 100-goal, 100-assist mark for a career.

The 2019 season was a special one for Tiffany as he brought both NCAA and ACC titles to Charlottesville. Virginia tied a program record with 17 wins in 2019 as the Cavaliers finished 17-3, winning their first NCAA title since 2011 and first ACC title since 2010.

Virginia's offense hummed all season, finishing No. 7 in the country in three key categories: scoring offense per game (14.10), assists per game (8.60) and points per game (22.70). Virginia also finished No. 4 in the nation in scoring margin per game (3.85). Leading the way was Moore, who became the first player in program history to record 40+ goals and 40+ assists in the same season. Moore finished No. 1 in the ACC and No. 8 in the nation with 89 points (46-43). Dox Aitken, a First Team USILA All-American for the second-straight season, broke his own single-season UVA record for points by a midfielder (52). Aitken also became the only midfielder in program history to reach 100 goals for a career. Ian Laviano led the ACC and was No. 9 in the nation with 51 goals, which ranks No. 4 all-time at UVA on the single-season ledger.

Ryan Conrad, a First Team USILA All-American, was named the Senior CLASS Award winner for 2019, the second student-athlete to win the coveted award under Tiffany (Brown's Jack Kelly, 2016). Conrad, a two-time captain, was MVP of the ACC Tournament and named to the NCAA All-Tournament team. He finished the year with 31 goals and 18 assists, which places him tied for No. 3 all-time at UVA in single-season points by a midfielder.

UVA was one of the nation's most feared riding teams. UVA's opponents cleared at .711 percent for the season, which ranked No. 2 in the nation behind Cleveland State's .707 percent. UVA was also one of two programs to have a top 20 offense and defense, as the Cavaliers limited opponents to 10.25 goals per game, while scoring 14.10 per game. The scoring margin of 3.85 goals per game ranked No. 4 nationally and No. 1 in the ACC.

For the third year in a row, Tiffany's Cavaliers team ranked No. 1 nationally in ground balls (41.55) in 2019. Defensively in 2018, Virginia led the nation with 38.0 ground balls per game and in 2017 averaged 43.33 ground balls per game, averaging nearly seven more ground balls per game than No. 2 Brown (36.56). Tiffany's old program. Prior to Tiffany coming to UVA, his Brown squad in 2016 led the nation in ground balls as Tiffany's staff three years in a row has led the nation's best team on the ground. Goalie Rode was named Most Outstanding Player of the 2019 NCAA Tournament after going 4-0 with 43 saves behind the pipes. Rode recorded 18 saves against Duke in the NCAA semifinal round and posted 13 saves against Yale in the NCAA final. Then-freshman LaSalla was stellar all season at the faceoff X, including going a perfect 6-of-6 in overtime periods. LaSalla, a College Crosse (SB Nation) Freshman All-American (1st), finished No. 1 in the ACC with 100 ground balls. He also was No. 2 in the ACC and No. 21 in the nation with a .587 faceoff winning percentage. LaSalla's 216 faceoff wins rank No. 2 in UVA's single-season record book.

In 2018, Tiffany's Cavaliers were No. 5 nationally in assists (7.72), No. 7 in points per game (20.33) and No. 7 in scoring offense (12.61). Michael Kraus became the third Cavalier in program history to reach 80 points in a season, finishing with 83, ranking No. 8 nationally. First Team All-American midfielder Aitken first set a midfielder program record with 51 points in 2018.

During Tiffany's first season on Grounds his Cavalier offense finished No. 1 in the ACC and No. 3 in the nation in three offensive categories: goals per game (14.40), assists per game (9.13) and points per game (23.53). Aitken shattered UVA's freshmen midfielder record of 29 goals and 40 points. Aitken broke the goals record in eight games. Attackman Kraus was named ACC Freshman of the Year and was the only rookie on the All-ACC team after leading UVA with 34 goals and 56 points.

Tiffany came to Virginia with 12 years of head coaching experience. He spent 10 years at Brown, his alma mater. He led the Bears to Championship Weekend in Philadelphia in 2016 behind a 16-3 record. The 16 wins in 2016 was a program record for the Bears. Brown's offense was potent in 2016, leading the nation with 16.32 goals per game. Under Tiffany's tutelage, nine Brown Bears earned All-America honors in 2016, while Dylan Molloy was the recipient of the 2016 Tewaaraton Trophy and was named by the USILA its most outstanding player and attackman of the year. Brown goalie Jack Kelly was named the nation's most outstanding goalie and the winner of the 2016 Senior CLASS award for men's lacrosse.

Tiffany returned his alma mater to national prominence with Ivy League regular season titles in 2008, 2010, 2015 and 2016 and NCAA Championship berths in 2009, 2015 and 2016. Tiffany was named the New England Coach of the Year in 2008, 2009, 2015 and 2016 and earned Ivy League Coach of the Year honors in 2015 and 2016.

Tiffany guided his 2015 team to the number one seed in the Ivy League Tournament, an Ivy League championship and NCAA Tournament berth, changing the landscape of college lacrosse with a unique fast break offense that scored 237 goals, averaging 13.94 goals per game, fifth best in the nation.

Since taking over the Brown program in 2007, Tiffany transformed the program from one that was winless in the Ivy League in 2006 into one of the preeminent teams in the Ivy League and the nation.

Tiffany guided Brown to its second Ivy League Championship under his watch in 2010, while also earning a berth in the first-ever Ivy League Playoffs. His team also posted back-to-back winning seasons in 2013 and 2014.

In 2009, Tiffany coached Brown to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1997, before falling in overtime to Johns Hopkins in the NCAA First Round. His 2009 team posted a 12-4 record and was ranked as high as eighth nationally during the season, finishing the season as the 11th ranked squad in the nation.

Tiffany's 2008 squad captured the Ivy League title with a 5-1 league mark, posting an 11-3 record to earn the most wins at Brown since 1994. Brown, the number one ranked team in New England, finished 13th nationally in the final USILA coaches poll, with just six teams in the nation winning more games than the Bears.

In his first season at the helm of the Brown team, Tiffany turned the fortunes of the program in the right direction, guiding the Bears to a 7-7 record in 2007, and a national ranking as high as 18th.

Tiffany came to Brown from Stony Brook, where he was the head lacrosse coach in 2005 and 2006, posting an 18-13 overall mark. His 2006 squad finished second in America East with a 4-1 league mark and was ranked in the Top 20 in two weeks. In 2005, Tiffany's Seawolves appeared in the Top 20 for the first time ever, and were ranked as high as 14th nationally. Tiffany, the 2005 America East Coach of the Year, led Stony Brook to wins over Penn State and Rutgers, as his Seawolves boasted the number-one ranked man-up unit in Division I.

Tiffany arrived at Stony Brook after successful stints at Penn State, Dartmouth, Washington & Lee and LeMoyne. He spent his four years at Penn State (2000-2004) as the top assistant under head coach Glenn Thiel, and was involved in all facets of the lacrosse program as the team's defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator. Tiffany's defensive units were outstanding during his four years, and in 2002, the Nittany Lions led the nation in man-down defense.

Prior to coaching at Penn State, Tiffany was an assistant coach at Dartmouth College, where he spent the 1999 and 2000 seasons under head coach Rick Sowell. In his two seasons as defensive coordinator, the Big Green's goals allowed per game in Ivy League contests dropped from 15.3 to 9.0. Dartmouth earned its first share of the Ivy League title and a berth in the NCAA tournament in 2003.

Tiffany was an assistant coach from 1997-98 at Washington & Lee University. In 1998, the Generals went 13-3 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament while finishing fifth in the USILA Division III national rankings.

Tiffany began his collegiate coaching career at LeMoyne College, where he served as an assistant coach of men's lacrosse and co-head coach of the women's lacrosse program from 1994-96. A native of LaFayette, N.Y., Tiffany graduated from LaFayette High School where he lettered in football, basketball and lacrosse. Upon graduation from Brown, he taught biology and coached lacrosse and football at the Robert Louis Stevenson School in Pebble Beach, Calif., from 1990-94.

He was Co-MVP of the Brown squad that captured its first-ever NCAA playoff victory in 1990 (12-9 vs. UMass). Tiffany capped his career by playing in the North-South Senior All-Star game.
