The Game

- Johns Hopkins (3-2) heads south for the second of two straight on the road in ACC territory as the Blue Jays head to Charlottesville to take on second-ranked Virginia (4-0). Faceoff on Saturday, March 5 is set for 1 pm.
- The teams will be playing for the Doyle Smith Cup for the 15th time. The history of the cup and its origin can be found on page 2.

Last Time Out

- Johns Hopkins went on the road for the third time in four games and fell at 10th-ranked North Carolina, 15-10, last Sunday.
- Virginia improved to 4-0 on the year and ran its winning streak to eight with a 20-11 win at home in its ACC-opener last Saturday against Syracuse.

The Facts

- This is the 135th season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.
- Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 1,000-357-15 (.734).
- JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 29 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

First to 1,000

- Johns Hopkins became the first men's lacrosse program in history to reach 1,000 all-time victories with an 11-10 win over Loyola (2-19-22).
- With the win (and subsequent results), the Blue Jays are 1,000-357-15 all-time and sit 75 wins ahead of Syracuse on the all-time victories list among Division I men's lacrosse programs.

Things to Know - Virginia

- The two-time defending national champion Cavaliers welcome Johns Hopkins to Klockner Stadium for the 95th all-time meeting in series history.
- Virginia is 4-0 on the year with lopsided victories against Air Force (21-11), Towson (18-9) and Syracuse (20-11) and a one-goal win against High Point (11-10).
- The NCAA charts statistical rankings in 15 different categories; the Cavaliers rank in the top 10 in the nation in 11 of the 15. They lead the nation in ground balls per game (43.5) and rank second in opponent clearing percentage (.691) and fourth in scoring offense (17.5).
- UVA has generally put its games away in the second and third quarters this season. The Cavaliers and their opponents have both scored 22 goals in the first and fourth quarters combined, but UVA holds a decisive 48-19 scoring margin in the second and third quarters combined.
- Virginia has led the nation in ground balls per game in each of the last four full seasons.

Cavaliers to Watch

Petey LaSalla (Sr. • FO)

- One of the top faceoff specialists in the nation. Has won 57-of-89 (.640) faceoffs this season with 27 ground balls to his credit. Ranks sixth in the nation in FO win percentage and 23rd in ground balls per game (6.75).
- Has won 623-of-1,024 (.608) faceoffs in his career with 23 goals, nine assists and 304 ground balls to his credit.

Cade Saustad (Jr. • D)

- Headliner on a deep, aggressive Virginia defense. Has started all four games this season and has 11 ground balls and six caused turnovers.
- Honorable Mention USILA All-American in 2021, Saustad has 95 GBs and 36 CTs in his career.

Connor Shellenberger (So. • A)

- A leading candidate for the Tewaaraton Award as he paces the potent Cavalier offense with eight goals and 17 assists through four games.
- After redshirting in 2020, burst on the scene last year with 37 goals and 42 assists for 79 points en route to earning First Team USILA All-America honors. Was the Most Outstanding Player of the 2021 NCAA Tournament with 14 goals and 10 assists in four games.

Oh Captain, My Captain

- Senior attackman **Joey Epstein** and graduate student defenseman **Jack Lyne** were selected into a vote of their teammates to serve as co-captains for the 2022 season.
- Epstein is in his third season as a captain and joins **Greg Raymond '05** as the only players in program history to serve as a captain three times (dating back to 1950).
- Lyne is in his second season as a captain and is the 14th two-time captain in school history (dating back to 1950).

On This Date

- This week's game at Virginia will be the eighth all-time for Johns Hopkins on March 5.
- The Blue Jays are 4-3 all-time on this date and have won their last two and four of the last five games they've played on March 5.

Series History

- This week's game will be the 95th game in a series that dates to a 9-0 Johns Hopkins win in 1904.
- JHU leads the all-time series 61-32-1 and has won two of the last three and seven of the last 11 against the Cavaliers.
- Since 2012, the visiting team has won five of nine games played on campus (one neutral site game in that time).

Playing for the Doyle Smith Cup

Johns Hopkins and Virginia will play for the Doyle Smith Cup for the 15th time this week. Virginia has won the cup nine times in the first 14 years it has been presented. Six of the first 14 games played for the cup have gone to overtime and eight have been decided by one goal.

The Doyle Smith Cup is presented annually to the winner of the regular season game between Johns Hopkins and Virginia in honor of JHU graduate **Doyle Smith**.

Smith served as team manager and statistician for Johns Hopkins under head coach **Bob Scott** from 1963-1968. He graduated Phi Beta Kappa in 1966 and earned a masters degree in 1968. He received the H Club Cup for contributions to athletics at Johns Hopkins.

He worked as an assistant sports information director at the University of Virginia from 1968 until his retirement in 1999, serving as the lacrosse team's statistician for four head coaches--**Buddy Beardmore, Glenn Thiel, Jim Adams and Dom Starsia**.

On the national level, Smith is credited with the standardization of game statistics. He was the Information Director for the U.S. Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) and twice received their Man of the Year Award. The USILA media award bears his name. In 2000 he was elected to the US Lacrosse Hall of Fame as the first and only non-player and coach ever selected.

Smith passed away in June 2004 and the cup made its debut less than two years later.

- Johns Hopkins is 133-94-2 (.585) all-time against current ACC members.
- Johns Hopkins has played 52 all-time NCAA Tournament games against current ACC teams. The Blue Jays are 28-24 all-time in the NCAAs against the five teams currently competing in the ACC.

Quite A Stretch

- The Blue Jays are in the midst of a four-game stretch that will see them play three games against teams ranked in the top 10 in the nation, including two against teams currently in the top three. In succession, and using this week's USILA Poll as a reference, the four-game run includes games at Georgetown (3rd), at home against Loyola (NR) and back-to-back road games at North Carolina (8th) and Virginia (2nd). A week after playing the Cavaliers, the Blue Jays will also host Syracuse (14th).
- Again using this week's USILA Poll as a reference, the Blue Jays will play 10 teams ranked in the top 20 in the nation, including each of the top five, six of the top eight and seven of the top 17, during the 2022 season.

Lacrosse's All-Time Winningest Program

- Johns Hopkins enters this week's games with an all-time record of 1,000-357-15 to rank as the all-time winningest program in college lacrosse history.
- With the win against Loyola on February 19, Johns Hopkins became the first men's college lacrosse program to reach 1,000 all-time wins.

Blue Jays Hit for Milliman-Era-High 18 at Towson

- Johns Hopkins scored 18 goals in an 18-12 win at Towson on February 11. The 18 goals are the most the Blue Jays have scored under head coach **Peter Milliman**. Previously, the most goals JHU had scored since Milliman's arrival prior to the 2021 season was 15 at Penn State in the Big Ten Quarterfinals last season.
- The 18 goals are also the most for Johns Hopkins since March 10, 2018, when the Blue Jays topped Syracuse, 18-7, in the Carrier Dome.

It's Been a While

- With 18 goals and 12 assists in the 18-12 win at Towson, the Blue Jays totaled 30 points in a game for the first time since May 4, 2019, when JHU had 17 goals and 13 assists for 30 points in an 18-17 overtime loss against #1 Penn State in the Big Ten Championship game.

Balance on Offense

- While it's still early, the Blue Jays feature a balanced scoring unit through the first five games of the season.
- Johns Hopkins has six players with eight or more points, 11 players with at least two goals and six players with two or more assists.
- In all, 14 different players have already scored at least one goal and 15 players have at least one point to their credit through five games.

Quick Starts

- Johns Hopkins has gotten off to a quick start in each of its first five games this season.
- The Blue Jays have scored a total of 19 first-quarter goals in five games with 4 against Jacksonville, 5 against Towson, 5 against Georgetown, 3 against Loyola and 2 at North Carolina.
- More than 32% of the 58 goals JHU has scored in their five games have come in the first quarter (19-of-58) and 60.3% of their goals (35-of-58) have come in the first half.
- The 12 goals Johns Hopkins scored in the first half of their 18-12 win at Towson on February 11 are the most in a half for the Blue Jays since March 24, 2018, when they scored 13 in the second half of a 15-13 win at Virginia.

In Case We Get To Overtime

- Johns Hopkins is 38-28 (.576) all-time in overtime. In their last overtime game, the Blue Jays topped Mount St. Mary's, 13-12, in what proved to be their last game of the 2020 season.

- Johns Hopkins has won eight of its last 12 overtime games.

One-Goal Wonders

- Johns Hopkins is 133-86 (.607) all-time in one-goal games. The Blue Jays topped Loyola, 11-10, in their most recent one-goal game on Feb. 19, 2022.

- The Blue Jays are 8-4 in their last 12 one-goal games.

Phillips Wearing #19

The number 19 was assigned to **Jeremy Huber** in the fall of 2014; less than two weeks prior to the start of what would have been Huber's freshman year in 2015, he passed away suddenly from complications from pneumonia. Hopkins kept Huber on its roster through the 2018 season, when he would have been a senior, and nobody else wore #19 from 2015-18.

After the 2018 season ended, the coaching staff met with members of the senior class (Huber's classmates) and discussed issuing the number to a returning player in 2019 who best exemplified Huber. By a vote of the graduating seniors in 2018, **Robert Kuhn** was selected to be the first player to wear #19 after Huber. **Forry Smith** was then chosen by the 2019 seniors to wear #19 in 2020.

Head coach **Peter Milliman** and his staff worked closely with the Huber family and members of Jeremy's class to chart a course for the issuing of #19 moving forward. Those three groups determined that a freshman would be selected annually to wear the number; for the 2022 season, midfielder **Stuart Phillips** was selected and will join Kuhn and Smith on the list of individuals who have worn the #19 since Huber's passing.



Extra-Extra

- JHU has converted on 6-of-15 (.400) extra-man chances through five games with two EMO goals in each of their three wins (Jacksonville, Towson, Loyola).
- Five different players have scored extra-man goals on the year - **Garrett Degnon, Joey Epstein, Brendan Grimes, Jack Keogh, Johnathan Peshko** - and two players, **Connor DeSimone** and Keogh, have combined for six EMO assists.
- Johns Hopkins converted on 15-of-35 (.429) extra-man chances in 2021 to finish tied for 12th nationally in extra-man offense.
- Epstein is JHU's career active leader in EMO goals with 13, while Degnon has eight to his credit.
- The Blue Jays' 42.9% conversion percentage last season marked the eighth time since 2012 that Hopkins has finished the season at better than 40% on extra-man.

Defensive Notes of Interest

- The Blue Jay defense held Jacksonville to eight goals in the season-opening win. A year ago, the Blue Jays held the opposition to less than 10 goals just three times in 13 games.
- The performance against the Dolphins continued a trend dating back to last season. Entering the Big Ten Tournament, JHU was allowing an average of 12.9 goals per game and ranked 52nd in the nation in scoring defense. The Blue Jays then held their three tournament opponents to a total of just 29 goals (9.7 goals/game) to jump 11 spots nationally in scoring defense.
- In the last eight games dating back to last season, JHU has allowed a total of 90 goals (11.3 goals/game).

Blue Jay Defense Disruptive in Opener

- Johns Hopkins was credited with 11 caused turnovers in the 11-8 season-opening win against Jacksonville and the Blue Jays have totaled 34 CTs through five games.
- The 11 caused turnovers for the Blue Jays mark the 16th time in school history that JHU has had 10 or more caused turnovers in a game (CTs became an official stat in 2009).
- The 11 caused turnovers were three shy of the JHU single-game record of 14 set against Loyola in 2014.

Roster Breakdown

- The Blue Jays' 51-man roster includes nine graduate students, nine seniors, nine juniors, 13 sophomores and 11 freshmen.
- Johns Hopkins' 2022 roster includes players from 13 different states and five players from Canada.
- By state, the Blue Jays hail from New York (12), Maryland (11), Pennsylvania (4), Massachusetts (4), New Jersey (3), Virginia (3), Florida (2), Connecticut (2), Ohio (1), Georgia (1), Delaware (1), Utah (1), Texas (1).

First Seven vs. Last Seven

• Johns Hopkins posted a 2-5 record in its first seven games of the 2021 season under head coach **Peter Milliman** and a 5-6 record in its last 11 under Milliman. After having no fall (2020) practice due to COVID in his first year and a limited preseason, the early results may not have been surprising as the team worked to improve under a new staff. A look inside the numbers shows a team that turned the corner after the seventh game in 2021:

Noting Head Coach Peter Milliman



- Named the 23rd head coach in Johns Hopkins history on April 27, 2020.
- After not meeting his full team in person until six weeks before the first game of the 2021 season, led the Blue Jays to a 4-9 record in his first year. Team showed great progress through the season and, as the number six seed, made a run to the Big Ten Tournament title game to become the first number six seed in Division I college lacrosse history to advance to a league championship game.
- One of three active Big Ten head coaches with previous head coaching experience in the Ivy League as he joins Penn State's Jeff Tambroni (Cornell) and Maryland's John Tillman (Harvard).

• In ninth season as a head coach at the collegiate level with four seasons at Pfeiffer (2009-12) and three seasons at Cornell (2018-20).

• Has a career coaching record of 72-47 (.605), including a 28-10 mark at Cornell.

• Led Cornell to the 2018 Ivy League Tournament title and a trip to the NCAA Quarterfinals that year.

• In 2+ seasons as the head coach at Cornell, guided the Big Red to two wins against teams ranked number one in the nation at the time of the game and three against teams ranked in the top two.

• Developed a Cornell offense that was among the most prolific in the nation over his last two years. Cornell finished fifth in the nation in scoring offense in 2019 (14.3 gpg) and the Big Red led the nation in scoring offense (18.4) when the 2020 season ended.

• Coached five games against Big Ten teams while serving as the head coach at Cornell. Posted a 3-2 record in those five games, including wins over Ohio State (17-16) and Penn State (18-17) during the COVID-shortened 2020 season.

• Played collegiately at Gettysburg College and finished his career at GC ranked second in school history in points (232), fifth in goals (138) and third in assists (94). Remains one of just three players in Bullet history with more than 125 goals and 90 assists.

• Wife, Megan, played college lacrosse at York (PA) and serves as the head girl's lacrosse coach at the Friends School in Baltimore (Friends is located less than two miles from the Johns Hopkins campus on Charles Street).

- The home team has won 13 of the last 22 meetings played at a campus site.
- JHU has won seven of the last 11 meetings.
- The last 10 meetings at Johns Hopkins have been decided by a total of just 16 goals. Included are seven, one-goal games and a pair of two-goal games.
- Virginia has won 11 of last 16 games between the two teams in Charlottesville. Prior to the 11-10 win in overtime in 2012, JHU's last win at UVA came in 1998 ... Hopkins has since won three more times at UVA (2014 & 2015 NCAA, 2018).
- Virginia defeated Johns Hopkins, 9-8, in four overtimes in 2001. That game ranks as the longest in Johns Hopkins history.
- 12 of the last 27 games between the two teams have been decided by one goal. In all there have been 21 one-goal games between the Blue Jays and the Cavaliers.
- Johns Hopkins and Virginia have met 16 times in the NCAA Tournament with the Blue Jays winning 10 of the 16. Three of the meetings have come in the national championship game with UVA grabbing NCAA titles in 1972 and 2003 and JHU winning in 1980.
- The 16 games JHU and UVA have played in the NCAAs are the most any two teams have met in tournament history.
