OPENING DRAW

GAME OVERVIEW

- No. 5/6 Virginia travels to Syracuse on Saturday (April 23) for its ACC regular-season finale.
- Opening faceoff is slated for 4 p.m. as Drew Carter (play-by-play) and Paul Carcaterra (analyst) will have the call on ESPNU.
- The two teams squared off in Charlottesville on Feb. 26 in UVA's first ACC game of the season. The Cavaliers handed Syracuse its largest defeat in series history, 20-11.

SERIES HISTORY

- Syracuse leads the all-time series 20-19 and are winners of six of the last nine contests against UVA. The Orange also lead the all-time series in the Carrier Dome, 9-5.
- In the two teams 39 contests against each other dating back to 1938, Virginia and Syracuse have been separated by just three goals (SU: 510, UVA: 507) entering Saturday's matchup.
- Prior to UVA's win over the Orange earlier this season, Syracuse won both regular-season matchups in 2021, including a 20-10 victory at the Carrier Dome which was UVA's worst loss in series history.
- Entering the 2021 season, the series was tied, 18-18, and so was the all-time score, 466-466, before the Orange swept both games last season.
- Prior to 2021, the previous five games in the series were decided by one goal, three of which were won by Syracuse.

LAST TIME OUT

- Ten different Cavaliers, including **Xander Dickson** (5 goals), found the back of the net as UVA downed Quinnipiac 21-9 in a night game at Klöckner Stadium on Saturday, April 16.
- In its first-ever matchup with the Bobcats, Virginia won its 16th straight game immediately following a loss (in the same season) after suffering a 17-8 defeat to then-No. 13/14 Duke in Durham, N.C.
- The Cavaliers' 21 goals scored tied its season high. Defensively, UVA forced 18 QU turnovers as the Bobcats finished the game 12-20 on clear attempts.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

3

Virginia is seeking to become just the third NCAA men's lacrosse program to win three consecutive national titles in 2022, which would put itself in a category with Princeton (1996-98) and Johns Hopkins (1978-80).

Graduate attackman Matt Moore needs just 14 points to become the all-time points leader in program history. Moore currently has 256 career points (135 goals & 121 assists). Steele Stanwick currently holds the program record, with 269 career points.

With a win over Syracuse on Saturday, Virginia would clinch a share of its 19th ACC title in program history. The Cavaliers enter Saturday's contest with a 4-1 record in ACC play.

THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

MORE ON THE SYRACUSE SERIES

- The two schools battled only three times between 1938-93, but have met at least once each season between 1994 and 2019 before COVID-19 snapped the streak in 2020.
- The regular-season series began in 1995.
- The two schools have also met six times in the NCAA Tournament since 1995.
- The 2018 season was the first time UVA and Syracuse met in the ACC Tournament, an 11-10 win for UVA in the semifinals.
- The Orange won in overtime, 9-8, in the 2003 at the Dome. It was the first time in the series that neither team scored in the double figures.
- Another heartbreaking UVA loss saw the Orange pull out a dramatic come-from-behind 12-11 double overtime win in the semifinals of the 2008 NCAA Tournament on the way to capturing the national championship.
- The 2008 Syracuse NCAA win ended Virginia's five-game series winning streak, the longest by either team in the series.
- Both teams are known for their high-scoring offenses, but since 1999 Virginia (2003/06/06/14/19/22) and Syracuse (2002/03/04/06/15/21) have scored at least 15 goals six times each in the series.
- Virginia's loss in 2011 snapped a three-game win streak in the Dome over Syracuse, a feat boasted by no other opponent of the Orange.
- The 2014 meeting at Klöckner Stadium between UVA and Syracuse, James Pannell scored a career high seven goals in a 17-12 UVA triumph. It was Syracuse's first-ever ACC game.

A WIN OVER THE ORANGE WOULD...

- Guarantee Virginia at least a share of its 19th ACC championship – UVA's second under head coach **Lars Tiffany**, who guided the Cavaliers to their most recent ACC title in 2019 during his third year as UVA head coach.
- Improve Virginia's record to 10-3 overall and 5-1 in ACC play, which would tie for its best overall record through its first 13 games since 2012 and best win percentage in ACC play since going 2-0 in conference games in 2006 when UVA went 17-0 overall en route to winning its sixth national championship.
- Tie the all-time series, 20-20, with Syracuse and improve UVA's all-time record at the Carrier Dome to 6-9.
- Give Tiffany his sixth career conference championship having won four Ivy League titles, including outright champion status in 2016, as head coach at Brown University (2007-16).

GUNNING FOR AN ACC TITLE

- Virginia currently has 18 ACC championships, including 11 titles (1962, 1964, 1969, 1970, 1971, 1975, 1980, 1983, 1984, 1985 and 1986) prior the ACC establishing a tournament from 1989-2019 to determine the champion.
- Virginia has won six ACC Tournament championships: 1997, 1999, 2000, 2003, 2006 and 2010.
- From 1989-2019, Virginia won 14 regular-season titles (1990, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2006, 2009, 2010, 2012 and 2019), more than any other ACC School.
- In the last ACC Tournament, which was held in 2019, UVA defeated Notre Dame 10-4 in the finals at Klöckner Stadium.

LARS-TIFFANY-COACHED TEAMS RESPOND AFTER A LOSS

- After suffering its third loss of the season at then-No. 13/14 Duke (April 14), UVA won its 16th straight game (vs. Quinnipiac) immediately following a loss (in the same season), a streak that began on March 6, 2018.
- Virginia is 20-2 all-time under **Lars Tiffany** in games following a loss (in the same season).
- Tiffany's only pair back-to-back losses (in the same season) at UVA were in his first year as head coach in 2017.

VIRGINIA IS UNDEFEATED WHEN...

- The Cavaliers are 9-0 when leading after three quarters. UVA has combined to out-score its opponents 151-98 in the first three periods this season, which is an average lead of 4.4 goals entering the fourth period.
- The Cavaliers are 8-0 when leading at halftime.
- Virginia is 9-0 when dishing out more assists than its opponent. In the Cavaliers' nine wins this season, UVA has 82 assists compared to its opponents' 37. See chart on page 6.

CONNOR SHELLENBERGER IS ELITE

- **Connor Shellenberger** is currently third in the nation and leads the ACC in assists (3.08/gm). He is eighth nationally in points (5.25/gm), good for second in the ACC.
- Shellenberger has posted at least one point in all 30 career games and has recorded multiple assists 30 career games, including 11 of UVA's 12 games in 2022.
- Shellenberger has dished out at least one assist in 29 of his 30 career games.
- Shellenberger had a streak of at least five points in 12 consecutive games, over the course of 383 calendar days. Shellenberger had his 12-game streak with at least five points snapped at Richmond (April 2).
- Shellenberger, Chris Gray (UNC) and Asher Nolting (High Point) are the only three active Division-I players averaging at least 2.1 goals per game and 2.6 assists per game for their careers.

HOOS IN THE NATIONAL STATISTICAL RANKINGS

- Virginia is currently third in the nation ground balls (38.83/gm) and opponent clear percentage (.754), seventh in scoring offense (15.08/gm), eighth in points (23.50/gm) and turnovers (14.67/gm), ninth in winning percentage (.750), 11th in assists (8.42/gm) and 15th in scoring margin (3.58/gm).
- In addition to Shellenberger (see above), **Petey LaSalla** is fifth in faceoff winning percentage (.624). **Cole Kastner** is sixth in caused turnovers (2.33/gm). **Matthew Nunes** is 22nd in goals-against (10.74/gm) and **Payton Cormier** is 23rd in goals (3.00/gm).

KASTNER, SHELLENBERGER NAMED TEWAARATON NOMINEES

- Cole Kastner and Connor Shellenberger were named two of 25 Tewaaraton Foundation Award nominees, as was announced on April 21.
- UVA was one of just four D-I men's programs to have multiple nominees.
- Virginia and Syracuse are the only men's lacrosse programs in the nation with three Tewaaraton Trophy Award winners all-time.
- Chris Rotelli (2003), Matt Ward (2006) and Steele Stanwick (2011) were honored under the guidance of former Virginia head coach Dom Starsia.

MATT MOORE MOVING UP IN THE VIRGINIA RECORD BOOKS

- Graduate attackman Matt Moore currently has 256 career points with 135 goals and 121 assists.
- With two regular-season games remaining in 2022, Moore is averaging 3.44 points per game.

FOUR CAVALIERS NAMED IL MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Connor Shellenberger (First Team), Cole Kastner (First Team), Grayson Sallade (HM) and Cade Saustad (HM) were named Midseason All-Americans by *Inside Lacrosse*, the organization announced March 31.

LARS TIFFANY AGREES TO CONTRACT EXTENSION THROUGH 2026

- Virginia men's lacrosse coach Lars Tiffany signed a contract extension through the 2026 season, director of athletics Carla Williams announced on March 28, 2022.
- Tiffany, who is currently in his sixth season as UVA head coach, guided the Cavaliers to back-to-back national championships in 2019 and 2021. With no NCAA Championship held in 2020 due to COVID-19, UVA's 2021 title marked the first time in program history that UVA won back-to-back national championships and became just the seventh NCAA Division-I men's lacrosse program to win consecutive national titles.

VIRGINIA IN THE POLLS

- No. 5 Virginia has been ranked in the top 5 of the USILA Coaches poll in 309 weeks all-time.
- UVA has been ranked in the top 10 in 463 polls all-time, including in the most recent edition of the poll.
- UVA has been ranked No. 1 in the nation in 71 all-time polls, including in the 2022 preseason poll and the Feb. 7 edition of the poll.
- The USILA Poll began in 1973.

ON THE HORIZON

- Virginia returns to Klöckner Stadium on Thursday (April 28) to close out the regular season when it hosts Lafayette for Senior Night.
- Opening faceoff of the inaugural matchup between UVA and the Leopards is set for 6 p.m. on ACC Network.
- Prior to the start of Thursday's game, UVA will recognize all 14 of its fourth and fifth-year student-athletes.

THE CAVALIERS AT KLÖCKNER STADIUM

- Virginia owns a 165-43 (.793) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 7-0 mark in 2022, and has won 21 of its last 25 games played at the historic edifice.
- The Cavaliers' average margin of victory in their last 25 games at Klöckner Stadium is 5.12 goals.
- Virginia is 39-11 (.780) all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach Lars Tiffany.
- UVA is also 13-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- Lacrosse debuted in Klöckner Stadium in 1993.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- In 2021, Virginia led the nation with 41.94 ground balls per game.
- Entering 2022, UVA has led the nation in ground balls eight of the last 13 years, including the last five seasons under Lars Tiffany.
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the top-5 nationally in ground balls per game 12 times over the last 13 seasons.
- The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.
- Lars-Tiffany-coached teams have led the nation in ground balls in seven straight seasons, including the 2015 and 2016 seasons at Brown.

PETEY LASALLA: THE NATION'S DEADLIEST FACEOFF SPECIALIST

- With 717 career faceoff wins, **Petey LaSalla** is currently second among all active Division-I players.
- LaSalla is the only player in all of college lacrosse with at least 717 career wins at the center-X and 24 career goals.
- With 10 career assists, he's also is the only player in the nation with at least 694 career faceoff victories and 34 career points.
- Virginia is 17-3 (.850) all-time when LaSalla scores a goal, including 4-0 in 2022, and 22-5 (.815) all-time when registering at least one point.
- LaSalla won the first eight faceoffs of the game in UVA's 19-8 route over Johns Hopkins (March 5), and finished the contest 9-of-10, setting his single-game career high in faceoff win percentage. LaSalla tied that career best mark (9-of-10) at Richmond (April 2) before exiting the game with an upper-extremity injury.

- Virginia attackmen **Matt Moore** and **Connor Shellenberger** were both named to *Inside Lacrosse's* Preseason Tewaaraton Top 10 Watch List.
- The Cavaliers were the only program that had two preseason national player-of-the-year candidates.
- In 2021, Moore and Shellenberger combined for 70 goals and 76 assists, which accounted for 35 percent of the Cavaliers' point production.
- Shellenberger was named the Most Outstanding Player of the 2021 NCAA Tournament and a USILA First Team All-American, while Moore was tabbed a Third Team All-American.

MATTHEW NUNES & GRIFFIN SCHUTZ NAMED IL'S TOP PROSPECTS

- Virginia first years **Matthew Nunes** (G) and **Griffin Schutz** (A/M) were both No. 1 incoming freshmen in the nation at their respective positions, according to *Inside Lacrosse*.
- In addition to being tabbed the No. 1 overall attackman in his class, Schutz was crowned the No. 1 overall prospect. Schutz will likely see time as an offensive midfielder in 2021 with the starting attack solidified for the Cavaliers.
- With the departure of 2021 starting goalie Alex Rode, Nunes will become the first true freshman to start a season under the direction of head coach **Lars Tiffany** in his 18 years of experience as head coach.

NUNES, SAUSTAD GARNER WEEKLY HONORS

- On April 12, Virginia goalie **Matthew Nunes** (14 saves) was named the ACC's Co-Defensive Player of the Week and defenseman **Cade Saustad** (2 GBs, 2 CTs) was named to USILA's Team of the Week.
- Both Nunes (14 saves) and Saustad helped hold North Carolina to just four goals in UVA's second win over the Tar Heels (April 9).
- Nunes' award marked his third ACC weekly recognition of the season, the most among any player in the ACC.

NUNES GARNERS ACC, USILA WEEKLY DISTINCTION

- After allowing just five goals in 58:22 of game time and saving 14 Notre Dame shots, first-year goalie **Matthew Nunes** was named the ACC's Defensive Player of the Week and was selected to the USILA's Team of the Week.
- Nunes was also the ACC Defensive Player of the Week on Feb. 15 after making a season-best 16 saves in Virginia's 11-10 win over High Point.

SHELLENBERGER, KASTNER SWEEP ACC WEEKLY HONORS

- For their performance at UNC, Virginia attackman **Connor Shellenberger** and defenseman **Cole Kastner** were named the ACC's Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week, respectively, on March 15.

HEAD COACH LARS TIFFANY

Lars Tiffany is in his sixth season as head coach of the Virginia men's lacrosse program after being named its 17th head coach on June 21, 2016.

Last season, Tiffany guided fourth-seeded Virginia to its seventh NCAA title after a 17-16 triumphant victory over third-seeded Maryland at Rentschler Field (East Hartford, Conn.) on May 31. With no NCAA Tournament held in 2020 due to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19), UVA's 2021 title marked the first time in men's lacrosse program history it won back-to-back national championships, having done so in 2019. Under the direction of Tiffany in 2021, Virginia became just the seventh men's lacrosse program in Division-I history to win back-to-back national championships and the first D-I men's lacrosse program to win six straight games in the NCAA finals (1999, 2003, 2006, 2011, 2019 and 2021). Tiffany and the Cavaliers are currently riding an eight-game winning streak in NCAA tournament games, which is also a program record.

For the fourth consecutive season (excluding 2020 due to COVID-19), Tiffany and the Cavaliers were the NCAA D-I statistical champions in ground balls per game (41.94), Virginia also finished in the top-10 nationally in several other statistical categories, including: third in goals scored per game (14.61), fifth in points per game (23.00) and opponent clear percentage (.798), sixth in shot percentage (.338) and winning percentage (.778), and tenth in assists per game (8.39) and faceoff winning percentage (.606). In addition to ground balls per game and opponent clear percentage, the Cavaliers led the ACC in caused turnovers per game (8.72) and saves per game (13.50).

Tiffany and his staff also guided nine USILA All-American selections in 2021, including Jared Conners, who was named the nation's most outstanding midfielder and a First Team All-American. In addition to Conners, Connor Shellenberger (1st), Petey LaSalla (2nd), Matt Moore (2nd), Kyle Kology (3rd), Payton Cormier (HM), Cade Saustad (HM), Alex Rode (HM) and Dox Aitken (HM) were all named USILA All-Americans. Virginia's nine All-American selections tied for the most by a single team in the nation in 2021. Shellenberger was also named the Most Outstanding Player of the 2021 NCAA Tournament, while Conners, LaSalla, Moore, Saustad and Rode were tabbed all-tournament selections.

Virginia was 4-2 during the 2020 season before it canceled by the NCAA on March 12 due to COVID-19. The shortened 2020 season saw Michael Kraus become just the fourth Cavalier to reach the 100-goal, 100-assist mark for a career.

The 2019 season was a special one for Tiffany as he brought both NCAA and ACC titles to Charlottesville. Virginia tied a program record with 17 wins in 2019 as the Cavaliers finished 17-3, winning their first NCAA title since 2011 and first ACC title since 2010.

Virginia's offense hummed all season, finishing No. 7 in the country in three key categories: scoring offense per game (14.10), assists per game (8.60) and points per game (22.70). Virginia also finished No. 4 in the nation in scoring margin per game (3.85). Leading the way was Moore, who became the first player in program history to record 40+ goals and 40+ assists in the same season. Moore finished No. 1 in the ACC and No. 8 in the nation with 89 points (46-43). Dox Aitken, a First Team USILA All-American for the second-straight season, broke his own single-season UVA record for points by a midfielder (52). Aitken also became the only midfielder in program history to reach 100 goals for a career. Ian Laviano led the ACC and was No. 9 in the nation with 51 goals, which ranks No. 4 all-time at UVA on the single-season ledger.

Ryan Conrad, a First Team USILA All-American, was named the Senior CLASS Award winner for 2019, the second student-athlete to win the coveted award under Tiffany (Brown's Jack Kelly, 2016). Conrad, a two-time captain, was MVP of the ACC Tournament and named to the NCAA All-Tournament team. He finished the year with 31 goals and 18 assists, which places him tied for No. 3 all-time at UVA in single-season points by a midfielder.

UVA was one of the nation's most feared riding teams. UVA's opponents cleared at .711 percent for the season, which ranked No. 2 in the nation behind Cleveland State's .707 percent. UVA was also one of two programs to have a top 20 offense and defense, as the Cavaliers limited opponents to 10.25 goals per game, while scoring 14.10 per game. The scoring margin of 3.85 goals per game ranked No. 4 nationally and No. 1 in the ACC.

For the third year in a row, Tiffany's Cavaliers team ranked No. 1 nationally in ground balls (41.55) in 2019. Defensively in 2018, Virginia led the nation with 38.0 ground balls per game and in 2017 averaged 43.33 ground balls per game, averaging nearly seven more ground balls per game than No. 2 Brown (36.56). Tiffany's old program. Prior to Tiffany coming to UVA, his Brown squad in 2016 led the nation in ground balls as Tiffany's staff three years in a row has led the nation's best team on the ground. Goalie Rode was named Most Outstanding Player of the 2019 NCAA Tournament after going 4-0 with 43 saves between the pipes. Rode recorded 18 saves against Duke in the NCAA semifinal round and posted 13 saves against Yale in the NCAA final. Then-freshman LaSalla was stellar all season at the faceoff X, including going a perfect 6-of-6 in overtime periods. LaSalla, a College Crosse (SB Nation) Freshman All-American (1st), finished No. 1 in the ACC with 100 ground balls. He also was No. 2 in the ACC and No. 21 in the nation with a .587 faceoff winning percentage. LaSalla's 216 faceoff wins rank No. 2 in UVA's single-season record book.

In 2018, Tiffany's Cavaliers were No. 5 nationally in assists (7.72), No. 7 in points per game (20.33) and No. 7 in scoring offense (12.61). Michael Kraus became the third Cavalier in program history to reach 80 points in a season, finishing with 83, ranking No. 8 nationally. First Team All-American midfielder Aitken first set a midfielder program record with 51 points in 2018.

During Tiffany's first season on Grounds his Cavalier offense finished No. 1 in the ACC and No. 3 in the nation in three offensive categories: goals per game (14.40), assists per game (9.13) and points per game (23.53). Aitken shattered UVA's freshmen midfielder record of 29 goals and 40 points. Aitken broke the goals record in eight games. Attackman Kraus was named ACC Freshman of the Year and was the only rookie on the All-ACC team after leading UVA with 34 goals and 56 points.

Tiffany came to Virginia with 12 years of head coaching experience. He spent 10 years at Brown, his alma mater. He led the Bears to Championship Weekend in Philadelphia in 2016 behind a 16-3 record. The 16 wins in 2016 was a program record for the Bears. Brown's offense was potent in 2016, leading the nation with 16.32 goals per game. Under Tiffany's tutelage, nine Brown Bears earned All-America honors in 2016, while Dylan Molloy was the recipient of the 2016 Tewaaraton Trophy and was named by the USILA its most outstanding player and attackman of the year. Brown goalie Jack Kelly was named the nation's most outstanding goalie and the winner of the 2016 Senior CLASS award for men's lacrosse.

Tiffany returned his alma mater to national prominence with Ivy League regular season titles in 2008, 2010, 2015 and 2016 and NCAA Championship berths in 2009, 2015 and 2016. Tiffany was named the New England Coach of the Year in 2008, 2009, 2015 and 2016 and earned Ivy League Coach of the Year honors in 2015 and 2016.

Tiffany guided his 2015 team to the number one seed in the Ivy League Tournament, an Ivy League championship and NCAA Tournament berth, changing the landscape of college lacrosse with a unique fast break offense that scored 237 goals, averaging 13.94 goals per game, fifth best in the nation.

Since taking over the Brown program in 2007, Tiffany transformed the program from one that was winless in the Ivy League in 2006 into one of the preeminent teams in the Ivy League and the nation.

Tiffany guided Brown to its second Ivy League Championship under his watch in 2010, while also earning a berth in the first-ever Ivy League Playoffs. His team also posted back-to-back winning seasons in 2013 and 2014.

In 2009, Tiffany coached Brown to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1997, before falling in overtime to Johns Hopkins in the NCAA First Round. His 2009 team posted a 12-4 record and was ranked as high as eighth nationally during the season, finishing the season as the 11th ranked squad in the nation.

Tiffany's 2008 squad captured the Ivy League title with a 5-1 league mark, posting an 11-3 record to earn the most wins at Brown since 1994. Brown, the number one ranked team in New England, finished 13th nationally in the final USILA coaches poll, with just six teams in the nation winning more games than the Bears.

In his first season at the helm of the Brown team, Tiffany turned the fortunes of the program in the right direction, guiding the Bears to a 7-7 record in 2007, and a national ranking as high as 18th.

Tiffany came to Brown from Stony Brook, where he was the head lacrosse coach in 2005 and 2006, posting an 18-13 overall mark. His 2006 squad finished second in America East with a 4-1 league mark and was ranked in the Top 20 in two weeks. In 2005, Tiffany's Seawolves appeared in the Top 20 for the first time ever, and were ranked as high as 14th nationally. Tiffany, the 2005 America East Coach of the Year, led Stony Brook to wins over Penn State and Rutgers, as his Seawolves boasted the number-one ranked man-up unit in Division I.

Tiffany arrived at Stony Brook after successful stints at Penn State, Dartmouth, Washington & Lee and LeMoyne. He spent his four years at Penn State (2000-2004) as the top assistant under head coach Glenn Thiel, and was involved in all facets of the lacrosse program as the team's defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator. Tiffany's defensive units were outstanding during his four years, and in 2002, the Nittany Lions led the nation in man-down defense.

Prior to coaching at Penn State, Tiffany was an assistant coach at Dartmouth College, where he spent the 1999 and 2000 seasons under head coach Rick Sowell. In his two seasons as defensive coordinator, the Big Green's goals allowed per game in Ivy League contests dropped from 15.3 to 9.0. Dartmouth earned its first share of the Ivy League title and a berth in the NCAA tournament in 2003.

Tiffany was an assistant coach from 1997-98 at Washington & Lee University. In 1998, the Generals went 13-3 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament while finishing fifth in the USILA Division III national rankings.

Tiffany began his collegiate coaching career at LeMoyne College, where he served as an assistant coach of men's lacrosse and co-head coach of the women's lacrosse program from 1994-96. A native of LaFayette, N.Y., Tiffany graduated from LaFayette High School where he lettered in football, basketball and lacrosse. Upon graduation from Brown, he taught biology and coached lacrosse and football at the Robert Louis Stevenson School in Pebble Beach, Calif., from 1990-94.

A 1990 graduate of Brown, Tiffany was a two-time team captain and starter on defense for three years. Tiffany played for former Virginia head coach **Dom Starsia** at Brown. A Biology concentrator, Tiffany played on two Brown teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament (1987 & 1990). He was Co-MVP of the Brown squad that captured its first-ever NCAA playoff victory in 1990 (12-9 vs. UMass). Tiffany capped his career by playing in the North-South Senior All-Star game.
