OPENING DRAW

GAME OVERVIEW

- No. 2 Virginia (7-1) travels to Richmond (5-3) on Saturday (April 2) for noon contest from Robins Stadium.
- Saturday's game is set to be broadcast on NBC Sports Washington and stream on ESPN+ (subject to blackout).

THE SERIES VS. RICHMOND

- Virginia leads the all-time series, 7-0, including three wins at Robins Stadium.
- In the last meeting, the Cavaliers won 18-10 on April 2, 2021 at Klöckner Stadium after **Connor Shellenberger** set a series-record seven points with four goals and three assists.
- **Matt Moore** (3g, 3a), **Petey LaSalla** (12 GBs, 19-of-27 FO) and Jared Connors (5 GBs, 4 CTs) were also dominant in 2021 matchup for the Hoos.
- UVA and UR last played at Robins Stadium in 2017, when the Cavaliers squeaked out an 8-7 win.
- With the launch of the Spiders' program in 2014, UVA and Richmond squared off in the UR's first-ever game on Feb. 8, 2014.

LAST TIME OUT

- The Cavaliers defeated No. 12/10 Notre Dame 12-8 at Klöckner Stadium after **Connor Shellenberger** (3g, 2a) posted his 12th straight game with at least five points and first-year goalie **Matthew Nunes** made 14 saves and only allowed five UND goals in 58:22 of action.
- With the over the Fighting Irish, UVA remains the only unbeaten ACC team in conference play this season.
- Notre Dame's eight goals are its fewest in a single game since UVA defeated the Irish 10-4 in the 2019 ACC Championship game, which was also held at Klöckner Stadium.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

Virginia is seeking to become just the third NCAA men's lacrosse program to win three consecutive national titles in 2022, which would put itself in a category with Princeton (1996-98) and Johns Hopkins (1978-80).

Virginia has won all seven meetings against the Spiders in series history, including the last four under head coach Lars Tiffany.

Graduate attackman Matt Moore needs just 19 points to become the all-time points leader in program history. Moore currently has 251 career points (131 goals & 120 assists). Steele Stanwick currently holds the program record with 269 career points.

THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

MORE ON THE RICHMOND SERIES

- Saturday marks the eighth meeting between Virginia and Richmond in men's lacrosse.
- UVA owns a 7-0 all-time record in the series that was first contested in 2014.
- The 2014 meeting was UR's very first NCAA Division-I men's lacrosse game in program history.
- James Pannell scored two of his game-high four goals late in the fourth quarter and the UVA defense held on for a narrow 13-12 win over the eventual Atlantic Sun champions.
- In 2015 at Klöckner Stadium, Virginia used five goals from Owen Van Arsdale, four from Ryan Tucker and three from Greg Coholan to cruise to a 14-7 triumph over the Spiders.
- Behind 12 saves from goalie Matt Barrett, the Cavaliers recorded their first shutout (9-0) since 2007 when UVA and Richmond met in 2016 at Robins Stadium. AJ Fish, Matt Emery and Ryan Lukacovic all scored two goals to help the winning effort.
- In 2017 at Robins Stadium, Virginia trailed, 7-6, with 1:56 left, but the Cavaliers scored a man-up goal from Dox Aitken and after UVA won the ensuing faceoff, Ryan Conrad found Jared Conners with 57 seconds left for the game-winning score.
- Because UVA made back-to-back trips to Robins Stadium in 2016 and 2017, UVA and the Spiders met at Klöckner Stadium in Charlottesville for both the 2018 and 2019 seasons.
- After the onset of COVID-19 forced the cancellation of the originally-scheduled 2020 meeting, UVA and Richmond rekindled the series in 2021.

VIRGINIA VS. THE COMMONWEALTH OF VIRGINIA

- UVA enters Saturday's contest with Richmond with a 114-19-2 all-time record against opponents from the Commonwealth.
- Virginia has won 73 games in a row against opponents from the Commonwealth of Virginia. The last loss was to Washington & Lee on April 23, 1977 when the Generals were an NCAA Division-I institution in men's lacrosse.
- For the 16th year out of 17, UVA is facing an opponent from the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- From 2006-16 UVA played VMI every season, while adding Richmond to the annual schedule with the beginning of the Spiders' program in 2014.
- UVA did not play a Commonwealth team in 2020 before the pandemic halted the season. Richmond and VMI were both on UVA's schedule that was eventually canceled due to COVID-19.

VIRGINIA VS. THE SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

- The Southern Conference is in its eighth season as a men's lacrosse conference.
- Virginia 37-2 is all-time against current members of the Southern Conference.
- The Cavaliers are 5-2 against High Point, 7-0 against Richmond and 25-0 against VMI.
- There are three current SoCon opponents UVA has never played: Hampton, Jacksonville and Mercer.
- On Feb 5, 2021, the ASUN (formerly the Atlantic Sun Conference) announced a partnership with the SoCon that beginning in 2022 Air Force and Bellarmine, both former members of the SoCon, would compete in the renewed ASUN for men's lacrosse. The move allowed both the SoCon and the ASUN to receive one automatic bid each to the NCAA Tournament with both conferences meeting the NCAA's six-team minimum to receive an AQ.

VIRGINIA'S BEST START SINCE 2012

- With an overall record of 7-1 (.875), Virginia is off to its best start under head coach Lars Tiffany and is currently tied for third in the nation in winning percentage.
- The last time UVA won at least seven of its first eight games was in 2012 under former head coach Dom Starsia when the Cavaliers started the season 8-0.
- Prior to its loss to top-ranked Maryland, Virginia was one of just four unbeaten teams in the nation.

LARS-TIFFANY-COACHED TEAMS RESPOND AFTER A LOSS

- With its 12-8 win over Notre Dame, Virginia is now 18-2 under Lars Tiffany in games following a loss (in the same season).
- Also with its win over the Fighting Irish, the Cavaliers have now won 14 straight games following a loss, a streak that began on March 6, 2018 following a 12-11 defeat to Syracuse two days prior.
- Tiffany's only pair back-to-back losses were in his first year as head coach in 2017.

MORE ON THE NOTRE DAME WIN

- In the Cavaliers' 12-8 win over Notre Dame, Virginia held the Fighting Irish scoreless for 26:49, the longest scoring drought by a UVA opponent this season. See more on UVA opponent scoring droughts on page 7.
- The victory was Lars Tiffany's 50th conference win of his career. Tiffany now has a career record of 50-42 in conference matchups, including 9-12 against ACC foes as UVA head coach, 33-27 against Ivy League opponents as Brown head coach and went 8-3 against the America East while at Stony Brook.
- UVA has now won its last four contests against the Fighting Irish and leads the all-time series, 9-8.

CONNOR SHELLENBERGER IS ELITE

- **Connor Shellenberger** is currently third in the nation in points (6.25/gm), fourth in assists (3.62/gm) and fifth in shot percentage (.525).
- Shellenberger, who has posted at least one point in all 26 career games, has also tallied at least five points in his last 12 games, dating back to the Cavaliers' NCAA Tournament first round matchup against Bryant (May 16, 2021).
- Shellenberger has recorded multiple assists in 21 of his 26 career games, including all eight of UVA's games so far this season.
- Shellenberger has dished out at least one assist in 25 of his 26 career games.
- He is the only player in Division-I averaging at least 2.6 goals per game and 3.6 assists per game.
- Shellenberger and North Carolina attackman Chris Gray are the only two active Division-I players averaging at least 2.2 goals per game and 2.7 assists per game for their careers.

HOOS IN THE NATIONAL STATISTICAL RANKINGS

- Virginia is currently second in the nation ground balls (38.25/gm), fourth in points (25.00/gm), fifth in shot percentage (.345), sixth in opponent clear percentage (.764) and seventh in assists (9.00/gm) and scoring margin (+4.62/gm).
- In addition to Shellenberger (see above), **Cole Kastner** is third in caused turnovers (3.00/gm). **Matthew Nunes** is 16th in goals-against (10.44/gm) and save percentage (.542). **Xander Dickson** is 20th in shot percentage (.447) and **Payton Cormier** is 21st in goals (3.12/gm).

NUNES GARNERS ACC, USILA WEEKLY DISTINCTION

- After allowing just five goals in 58:22 of game time and saving 14 Notre Dame shots, first-year goalie **Matthew Nunes** was named the ACC's Defensive Player of the Week and was selected to the USILA's Team of the Week.
- Nunes was also the ACC Defensive Player of the Week on Feb. 15 after making a season-best 16 saves in Virginia's 11-10 win over High Point.

FOUR CAVALIERS NAMED IL MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- **Connor Shellenberger** (First Team), **Cole Kastner** (First Team), **Grayson Sallade** (HM) and **Cade Saustad** (HM) were named Midseason All-Americans by *Inside Lacrosse*, the organization announced March 31.

LARS TIFFANY AGREES TO CONTRACT EXTENSION THROUGH 2026

- Virginia men's lacrosse coach **Lars Tiffany** has signed a contract extension through the 2026 season, director of athletics Carla Williams announced on March 28.
- Tiffany, who is currently in his sixth season as UVA head coach in 2022, guided the Cavaliers to back-to-back national championships in 2019 and 2021. With no NCAA Championship held in 2020 due to COVID-19,

UVA's 2021 title marked the first time in program history that UVA won back-to-back national championships and became just the seventh NCAA Division-I men's lacrosse program to win consecutive national titles.

VIRGINIA IN THE POLLS

- No. 2 Virginia has been ranked in the top 5 of the USILA Coaches poll in 308 weeks all-time, including in the most recent edition of the poll.
- UVA has been ranked in the top 10 in 460 polls all-time, including in the most recent edition of the poll.
- UVA has been ranked No. 1 in the nation in 71 all-time polls, including in the 2022 preseason poll and the Feb. 7 edition of the poll.
- The USILA Poll began in 1973.

ON THE HORIZON

- Virginia returns to Klöckner Stadium to host North Carolina (presented by UVA Health) on Saturday, April 9.
- Opening faceoff is set for 4 p.m. on ESPNU.
- Virginia will honor its 1972 and 2011 national championship teams at halftime.
- The 1972 squad is celebrating its 50th anniversary of winning the program's first-ever NCAA championship.
- The 2011 team was slated to be recognized last season, but due to COVID-19 protocols, it was postponed to this year.

MATT MOORE MOVING UP IN THE VIRGINIA RECORD BOOKS

- With two assists in Virginia's 12-8 win over Notre Dame, **Matt Moore** is now in sole possession of second on UVA's all-time career points list.
- Moore currently has 251 career points with 131 goals and 120 assists.
- In 2022, Moore is averaging 3.71 points per game, and with six regular-season games remaining, he is on pace to shatter Steele Stanwick's program record of 269 career points.

MATT MOORE'S 18-GAME GOAL STREAK SNAPPED

- **Matt Moore's** 18-game goal streak came to an end against Notre Dame.
- During the streak, which began on March 11, 2021, Moore amassed 36 goals.
- Before it came to an end, Moore's 18-game goal streak was the seventh-longest scoring streak in all of Division-I men's lacrosse.

UVA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER STADIUM

- Virginia owns a 163-43 (.791) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 5-0 mark in 2022 and are winners of 21 of the last 25 games played in the historic edifice. UVA is also 13-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- Virginia is 35-11 all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach Lars Tiffany.
- Lacrosse debuted in Klöckner Stadium in 1993.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- In 2021, Virginia led the nation with 41.94 ground balls per game.
- Entering 2022, UVA has led the nation in ground balls eight of the last 13 years, including the last five seasons under **Lars Tiffany**.
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the top-5 nationally in ground balls per game 12 times over the last 13 seasons.
- The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.
- Lars-Tiffany-coached teams have led the nation in ground balls in seven straight seasons, including the 2015 and 2016 seasons at Brown.

HEAD COACH LARS TIFFANY

Lars Tiffany is in his sixth season as head coach of the Virginia men's lacrosse program after being named its 17th head coach on June 21, 2016.

Last season, Tiffany guided fourth-seeded Virginia to its seventh NCAA title after a 17-16 triumphant victory over third-seeded Maryland at Rentschler Field (East Hartford, Conn.) on May 31. With no NCAA Tournament held in 2020 due to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19), UVA's 2021 title marked the first time in men's lacrosse program history it won back-to-back national championships, having done so in 2019. Under the direction of Tiffany in 2021, Virginia became just the seventh men's lacrosse program in Division-I history to win back-to-back national championships and the first D-I men's lacrosse program to win six straight games in the NCAA finals (1999, 2003, 2006, 2011, 2019 and 2021). Tiffany and the Cavaliers are currently riding an eight-game winning streak in NCAA tournament games, which is also a program record.

For the fourth consecutive season (excluding 2020 due to COVID-19), Tiffany and the Cavaliers were the NCAA D-I statistical champions in ground balls per game (41.94), Virginia also finished in the top-10 nationally in several other statistical categories, including: third in goals scored per game (14.61), fifth in points per game (23.00) and opponent clear percentage (.798), sixth in shot percentage (.338) and winning percentage (.778), and tenth in assists per game (8.39) and faceoff winning percentage (.606). In addition to ground balls per game and opponent clear percentage, the Cavaliers led the ACC in caused turnovers per game (8.72) and saves per game (13.50).

Tiffany and his staff also guided nine USILA All-American selections in 2021, including Jared Conners, who was named the nation's most outstanding midfielder and a First Team All-American. In addition to Conners, Connor Schellenberger (1st), Petey LaSalla (2nd), Matt Moore (2nd), Kyle Kology (3rd), Payton Cormier (HM), Cade Saustad (HM), Alex Rode (HM) and Dox Aitken (HM) were all named USILA All-Americans. Virginia's nine All-American selections tied for the most by any team in the nation in 2021. Schellenberger was also named the Most Outstanding Player of the 2021 NCAA Tournament, while Conners, LaSalla, Moore, Saustad and Rode were tabbed all-tournament selections.

Virginia was 4-2 during the 2020 season before it canceled by the NCAA on March 12 due to COVID-19. The shortened 2020 season saw Michael Kraus become just the fourth Cavalier to reach the 100-goal, 100-assist mark for a career.

The 2019 season was a special one for Tiffany as he brought both NCAA and ACC titles to Charlottesville. Virginia tied a program record with 17 wins in 2019 as the Cavaliers finished 17-3, winning their first NCAA title since 2011 and first ACC title since 2010.

Virginia's offense hummed all season, finishing No. 7 in the country in three key categories: scoring offense per game (14.10), assists per game (8.60) and points per game (22.70). Virginia also finished No. 4 in the nation in scoring margin per game (3.85). Leading the way was Moore, who became the first player in program history to record 40+ goals and 40+ assists in the same season. Moore finished No. 1 in the ACC and No. 8 in the nation with 89 points (46-43). Dox Aitken, a First Team USILA All-American for the second-straight season, broke his own single-season UVA record for points by a midfielder (52). Aitken also became the only midfielder in program history to reach 100 goals for a career. Ian Laviano led the ACC and was No. 9 in the nation with 51 goals, which ranks No. 4 all-time at UVA on the single-season ledger.

Ryan Conrad, a First Team USILA All-American, was named the Senior CLASS Award winner for 2019, the second student-athlete to win the coveted award under Tiffany (Brown's Jack Kelly, 2016). Conrad, a two-time captain, was MVP of the ACC Tournament and named to the NCAA All-Tournament team. He finished the year with 31 goals and 18 assists, which places him tied for No. 3 all-time at UVA in single-season points by a midfielder.

UVA was one of the nation's most feared riding teams. UVA's opponents cleared at .711 percent for the season, which ranked No. 2 in the nation behind Cleveland State's .707 percent. UVA was also one of two programs to have a top 20 offense and defense, as the Cavaliers limited opponents to 10.25 goals per game, while scoring 14.10 per game. The scoring margin of 3.85 goals per game ranked No. 4 nationally and No. 1 in the ACC.

For the third year in a row, Tiffany's Cavaliers team ranked No. 1 nationally in ground balls (41.55) in 2019. Defensively in 2018, Virginia led the nation with 38.0 ground balls per game and in 2017 averaged 43.33 ground balls per game, averaging nearly seven more ground balls per game than No. 2 Brown (36.56), Tiffany's old program. Prior to Tiffany coming to UVA, his Brown squad in 2016 led the nation in ground balls as Tiffany's staff three years in a row has led the nation's best team on the ground. Goalie Rode was named Most Outstanding Player of the 2019 NCAA Tournament after going 4-0 with 43 saves between the pipes. Rode recorded 18 saves against Duke in the NCAA semifinal round and posted 13 saves against Yale in the NCAA final. Then-freshman LaSalla was stellar all season at the faceoff X, including going a perfect 6-of-6 in overtime periods. LaSalla, a College Crosse (SB Nation) Freshman All-American (1st), finished No. 1 in the ACC with 100 ground balls. He also was No. 2 in the ACC and No. 21 in the nation with a .587 faceoff winning percentage. LaSalla's 216 faceoff wins rank No. 2 in UVA's single-season record book.

In 2018, Tiffany's Cavaliers were No. 5 nationally in assists (7.72), No. 7 in points per game (20.33) and No. 7 in scoring offense (12.61). Michael Kraus became the third Cavalier in program history to reach 80 points in a season, finishing with 83, ranking No. 8 nationally. First Team All-American midfielder Aitken first set a midfielder program record with 51 points in 2018.

During Tiffany's first season on Grounds his Cavalier offense finished No. 1 in the ACC and No. 3 in the nation in three offensive categories: goals per game (14.40), assists per game (9.13) and points per game (23.53). Aitken shattered UVA's freshmen midfielder record of 29 goals and 40 points. Aitken broke the goals record in eight games. Attackman Kraus was named ACC Freshman of the Year and was the only rookie on the All-ACC team after leading UVA with 34 goals and 56 points.

Tiffany came to Virginia with 12 years of head coaching experience. He spent 10 years at Brown, his alma mater. He led the Bears to Championship Weekend in Philadelphia in 2016 behind a 16-3 record. The 16 wins in 2016 was a program record for the Bears. Brown's offense was potent in 2016, leading the nation with 16.32 goals per game. Under Tiffany's tutelage, nine Brown Bears earned All-America honors in 2016, while Dylan Molloy was the recipient of the 2016 Tewaaraton Trophy and was named by the USILA its most outstanding player and attackman of the year. Brown goalie Jack Kelly was named the nation's most outstanding goalie and the winner of the 2016 Senior CLASS award for men's lacrosse.

Tiffany returned his alma mater to national prominence with Ivy League regular season titles in 2008, 2010, 2015 and 2016 and NCAA Championship berths in 2009, 2015 and 2016. Tiffany was named the New England Coach of the Year in 2008, 2009, 2015 and 2016 and earned Ivy League Coach of the Year honors in 2015 and 2016.

Tiffany guided his 2015 team to the number one seed in the Ivy League Tournament, an Ivy League championship and NCAA Tournament berth, changing the landscape of college lacrosse with a unique fast break offense that scored 237 goals, averaging 13.94 goals per game, fifth best in the nation.

Since taking over the Brown program in 2007, Tiffany transformed the program from one that was winless in the Ivy League in 2006 into one of the preeminent teams in the Ivy League and the nation.

Tiffany guided Brown to its second Ivy League Championship under his watch in 2010, while also earning a berth in the first-ever Ivy League Playoffs. His team also posted back-to-back winning seasons in 2013 and 2014.

In 2009, Tiffany coached Brown to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1997, before falling in overtime to Johns Hopkins in the NCAA First Round. His 2009 team posted a 12-4 record and was ranked as high as eighth nationally during the season, finishing the season as the 11th ranked squad in the nation.

Tiffany's 2008 squad captured the Ivy League title with a 5-1 league mark, posting an 11-3 record to earn the most wins at Brown since 1994. Brown, the number one ranked team in New England, finished 13th nationally in the final USILA coaches poll, with just six teams in the nation winning more games than the Bears.

In his first season at the helm of the Brown team, Tiffany turned the fortunes of the program in the right direction, guiding the Bears to a 7-7 record in 2007, and a national ranking as high as 18th.

Tiffany came to Brown from Stony Brook, where he was the head lacrosse coach in 2005 and 2006, posting an 18-13 overall mark. His 2006 squad finished second in America East with a 4-1 league mark and was ranked in the Top 20 in two weeks. In 2005, Tiffany's Seawolves appeared in the Top 20 for the first time ever, and were ranked as high as 14th nationally. Tiffany, the 2005 America East Coach of the Year, led Stony Brook to wins over Penn State and Rutgers, as his Seawolves boasted the number-one ranked man-up unit in Division I.

Tiffany arrived at Stony Brook after successful stints at Penn State, Dartmouth, Washington & Lee and LeMoyne. He spent his four years at Penn State (2000-2004) as the top assistant under head coach Glenn Thiel, and was involved in all facets of the lacrosse program as the team's defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator. Tiffany's defensive units were outstanding during his four years, and in 2002, the Nittany Lions led the nation in man-down defense.

Prior to coaching at Penn State, Tiffany was an assistant coach at Dartmouth College, where he spent the 1999 and 2000 seasons under head coach Rick Sowell. In his two seasons as defensive coordinator, the Big Green's goals allowed per game in Ivy League contests dropped from 15.3 to 9.0. Dartmouth earned its first share of the Ivy League title and a berth in the NCAA tournament in 2003.

Tiffany was an assistant coach from 1997-98 at Washington & Lee University. In 1998, the Generals went 13-3 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament while finishing fifth in the USILA Division III national rankings.

Tiffany began his collegiate coaching career at LeMoyne College, where he served as an assistant coach of men's lacrosse and co-head coach of the women's lacrosse program from 1994-96. A native of LaFayette, N.Y., Tiffany graduated from LaFayette High School where he lettered in football, basketball and lacrosse. Upon graduation from Brown, he taught biology and coached lacrosse and football at the Robert Louis Stevenson School in Pebble Beach, Calif., from 1990-94.

A 1990 graduate of Brown, Tiffany was a two-time team captain and starter on defense for three years. Tiffany played for former Virginia head coach **Dom Starsia** at Brown. A Biology concentrator, Tiffany played on two Brown teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament (1987 & 1990). He was Co-MVP of the Brown squad that captured its first-ever NCAA playoff victory in 1990 (12-9 vs. UMass). Tiffany capped his career by playing in the North-South Senior All-Star game.
