**OPENING DRAW****GAME OVERVIEW**

- Virginia competes in its 90<sup>th</sup> all-time NCAA Tournament game when it travels to eighth-seeded Brown on Saturday (May 14) for the First Round of the 2022 NCAA Tournament. Opening faceoff is set for 7:30 p.m. on ESPNU.
- The Cavaliers are ranked No. 4 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 3 in the *Inside Lacrosse* media poll, while Brown is seventh in the coaches poll and fifth in the media poll.

**THE SERIES VS. BROWN**

- Virginia leads the all-time series against the Bears, 12-3.
- The two teams met in 2019 (at UVA) and 2020 (at Brown) with both teams winning at home, 14-13.
- The Cavaliers and Brown met once before in the NCAA Tournament in the 1995 quarterfinals in Charlottesville as UVA knocked off the then-seventh seeded Bears, 16-13. Doug Knight became the first UVA player to score a program-record six goals in a single NCAA Tournament game.

**VIRGINIA THE NCAA TOURNAMENT**

- Saturday's game marks Virginia's 41<sup>st</sup> all-time appearance in the NCAA Tournament and 90<sup>th</sup> NCAA Tournament game.
- Only Johns Hopkins (47) and Maryland (44) have been to the tournament more times than UVA.
- The Cavaliers are 56-33 (.629) all-time in NCAA Tournament games and have won their last eight, dating back to 2019.
- Only Johns Hopkins (71), Maryland (66) and Syracuse (65) have more NCAA Tournament wins than Virginia.

**NUMBERS TO KNOW****3**

Virginia is seeking to become just the third NCAA men's lacrosse program to win three consecutive national titles in 2022, which would put itself in a category with Princeton (1996-98) and Johns Hopkins (1978-80).

**8**

Having claimed national championships in consecutive opportunities (2019 & '21), Virginia has won its last eight NCAA Tournament contests and have out-scored its opponents 114-84, a 3.75 average margin of victory.

**15**

With its most recent game against Lafayette on April 28, the Cavaliers will look to take advantage 15 consecutive days off until its First Round matchup at Brown (May 14).

## THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

### UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

### UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

### THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

### UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

### WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

UVA – BROWN CONNECTIONS

- UVA head coach Lars Tiffany is a 1990 graduate of Brown. He was a two-time captain and three-year starter for former UVA and Brown head coach, Hall of Famer Dom Starsia.
- As a Brown student-athlete, Tiffany played on two Bears teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament (1987 & 1990). He was Co-MVP of the Brown squad that captured its first-ever NCAA playoff victory in 1990 (12-9 vs. UMass).
- Tiffany was the head coach at Brown for 10 years (2007-16), guiding the Bears to three Ivy League championships, three NCAA appearances and the 2016 Final Four. Tiffany left Providence with a 95-56 record as the head coach of Brown. He brought Brown assistant coaches Kip Turner (UVA alum) and Sean Kirwan with him to Charlottesville.
- Virginia assistant coach and offensive coordinator Sean Kirwan is a 2012 graduate of Tufts in Boston. While at Tufts, Kirwan won a 2010 NCAA DIII title as a player and later as an assistant coach helped Tufts win an NCAA DIII title in 2014. Both those NCAA DIII titles came with Mike Daly as the Tufts head coach. Daly is now in his third season as the Brown head coach, replacing current UVA head coach Lars Tiffany. Daly won three NCAA DIII titles at Tufts (2010, 2014, 2015).

## LAST TIME OUT

- Virginia will look to take advantage of 15 days off since it last played.
- The Cavaliers defeated Lafayette (April 28), 20-10, at Klöckner Stadium on Senior Night.
- Against the Leopards, **Matt Moore** posted a season-high eight points (2g, 6a) to pass Steele Stanwick on Virginia's all-time points list.
- Goalie **Miles Thompson**, who got the nod as starting netminder, earned his first career win after totaling 13 saves in 52:48 of action.

## THE NIGHT TIME IS THE RIGHT TIME

- With Saturday's 7:30 p.m. start time from Stevenson-Pincince Field, Virginia will look to improve to 4-0 this season in night contests.
- The Cavaliers won at North Carolina and at home against Quinnipiac and Lafayette in night contests.
- Virginia was originally scheduled to play at 8 p.m. at Duke, but the game was moved to 1 p.m. due to threatening storms in the Durham area.

## THIRD TIME UNSEED

- For just the third time out of Virginia's 41 NCAA Tournament appearances, Virginia is unseeded in this year's NCAA Tournament.
- The Cavaliers were unseeded in 1988 and ultimately fell in the semifinals to Cornell in Syracuse, N.Y.
- The last time Virginia was unseeded was in 2018 when it fell 14-12 to Loyola (Md.) in Baltimore, Md.

## LONELY AT THE TOP

- This year, the Cavaliers are the only ACC team in tournament, which marks the first time since 1975 that only one ACC team made the big dance.
- Virginia finished the regular season 9<sup>th</sup> in RPI and earned a share of the 2022 ACC championship.
- Notre Dame, which fell in the lone matchup of the season to UVA at Klöckner Stadium, tied the Cavaliers in the ACC standings with 5-1 record in conference matchups.

## 20-20-20

- For the first time since 1982, Virginia has posted at least 20 goals in three consecutive games.
- In their last three games, the Cavaliers won 21-9 vs. Quinnipiac (April 16), 21-15 at Syracuse (April 23) and 20-10 vs. Lafayette (April 28).
- In 1982, UVA defeated Washington & Lee 22-8 (April 18), Navy 26-15 (April 24) and Virginia Tech 27-1 (April 27).

## LARS TIFFANY AT STEVENSON-PINCINCE FIELD

- Virginia head coach **Lars Tiffany**, who was head coach at Brown from 2007-16, has an all-time record of 43-23 (.652) at Stevenson-Pincince Field.
- He is 0-1 as UVA head coach at Stevenson-Pincince Field after the Cavaliers fell 14-13 in what ended up being the 2020 finale due to the onset of COVID-19.

## SHELLENBERGER NAMED TEWAARATON AWARD FINALIST

- On May 12, **Connor Shellenberger** was named one of five Tewaaraton Award finalists.
- Shellenberger's recognition as a finalist marks the 11<sup>th</sup> instance in program history.
- Other UVA finalists include: Steele Stanwick (2011-12), Ken Clausen (2010), Danny Glading (2009), Ben Rubeor (2007-08), Kyle Dixon (2006), Matt Ward (2006), Chris Rotelli (2003) and Conor Gill (2002).
- Stanwick (2011), Ward (2006) and Rotelli (2003) were recipients of the award.
- Virginia and Syracuse are the only schools in the nation to have three recipients of the award. Only Duke (13) and Syracuse (12) have had more finalists than UVA (11).

## CAVALIERS DOMINATE ACC AWARDS; FIVE EARN ALL-ACC HONORS

- **Cole Kastner** (Defensive Player of the Year), **Matthew Nunes** (Freshman of the Year) and **Lars Tiffany** (Coach of the Year) claimed three of the four possible ACC postseason awards, the league office announced May 12.
- In addition to Kastner, **Connor Shellenberger**, **Matt Moore**, **Jeff Conner** and **Petey LaSalla** earned All-ACC honors.
- UVA's five All-ACC selections tied for a league best with Duke.
- The award was Tiffany's second of his career, having also won it in 2019.
- Kastner is the first UVA defensive player to garner player-of-the-year honors since Mark Koontz did so in 2002.
- Nunes is just the second goalie in UVA history earned ACC freshman-of-the-year honors, which Tillman Johnson achieved in 2001.



MOORE SELECTED NO. 4 BY ARCHERS IN 2022 PLL DRAFT

- On May 10, Virginia attackman **Matt Moore** was selected No. 4 overall by the Archers in the 2022 PLL Draft. Moore will link up with former UVA teammate Jared Conners, who is a currently a member of the Archers' roster.
- Virginia has the most first round picks among any collegiate program in PLL history with four since the league's inception in 2018 and is the only program to have at least one first round selection each of the first four drafts.
- Virginia's 26 professional lacrosse (PLL & MLL) first round draft picks are also the most of any school in the nation.
- UVA's 62 overall professional lacrosse draft picks is No. 3 among the college ranks.

MOORE'S EXPERIENCE IN THE TOURNAMENT

- **Matt Moore** enters this year's NCAA Tournament with nine career postseason appearances, all of which he started in.
- Moore leads all active Cavaliers with 20 goals and 17 assists in NCAA Tournament games for his career.
- He became UVA's all-time point leader after posting eight points in UVA's 2022 regular-season finale, a 20-10 victory over Lafayette (April 28).

USA LACROSSE MAGAZINE ALL-AMERICANS ANNOUNCED

- Cole Kastner (2<sup>nd</sup>), Connor Shellenberger (3<sup>rd</sup>) and Petey LaSalla (HM) earned *USA Lacrosse Magazine* All-American honors on May 10.
- The award is the first of Kastner's career. Shellenberger was a First-Team selection in 2021, while LaSalla was named to the Third Team.

2022 ACC CHAMPIONS

- With its win at Syracuse (April 23), Virginia now has 19 ACC championships, including two (2019 & 2022) under **Lars Tiffany**.
- The Cavaliers won 11 titles (1962, 1964, 1969, 1970, 1971, 1975, 1980, 1983, 1984, 1985 and 1986) prior the ACC establishing a tournament from 1989-2019 to determine the champion.
- Virginia has won seven ACC Tournament championships: 1997, 1999, 2000, 2003, 2006, 2010 and 2019.
- In the last ACC Tournament, which was held in 2019, UVA defeated Notre Dame 10-4 in the finals at Klöckner Stadium.
- From 1989-2019, Virginia won 14 regular-season titles (1990, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2006, 2009, 2010, 2012 and 2019), more than any other ACC School.

VIRGINIA IS UNDEFEATED WHEN...

- The Cavaliers are 11-0 when leading after three quarters. UVA has combined to out-score its opponents 183-114 in the first three periods this season, which is an average lead of 4.9 goals entering the fourth period.
- The Cavaliers are 10-0 this season when leading at halftime.
- Virginia is 11-0 when dishing out more assists than its opponent. In the Cavaliers' 11 wins this season, UVA has 108 assists compared to its opponents' 49. See chart on page 6.

## CONNOR SHELLENBERGER IS ELITE

- **Connor Shellenberger** is currently fifth in the nation and second in the ACC in assists (2.86/gm). He is 11<sup>th</sup> nationally in points (4.86/gm), also good for third in the ACC.
- Shellenberger has posted at least one point in all 32 career games and has recorded multiple assists 31 career games, including 12 of UVA's 14 games this season.
- He has dished out at least one assist in 30 of his 32 career games.
- Shellenberger had a streak of at least five points in 12 consecutive games, over the course of 383 calendar days. He had his 12-game streak with at least five points snapped at Richmond (April 2).
- Shellenberger and Pat Kavanagh (Notre Dame) are the only active Division-I players averaging at least 2.0 goals per game and 2.6 assists per game for their careers.

## HOOS IN THE NATIONAL STATISTICAL RANKINGS

- Virginia currently leads the nation in ground balls (39.14/gm), is third in points (24.93/gm) and scoring offense (15.86/gm), fourth in opponent clear percentage (.766), fifth in assists (9.07/gm) and shot percentage (.332), sixth in man-up offense (.500) and win percentage (.786), eighth in scoring margin (4.21/gm) and turnovers (14.43), 12<sup>th</sup> in clear percentage (.884) and faceoff win percentage (.566), 14<sup>th</sup> in caused turnovers (9.14/gm) and 15<sup>th</sup> in man-down defense (.694).
- In addition to Shellenberger (see above), **Cole Kastner** is seventh nationally in caused turnovers (2.00/gm). **Petey LaSalla** is seventh in faceoff win percentage (.614) and 20<sup>th</sup> in ground balls (6.86/gm). **Payton Cormier** is 13<sup>th</sup> in goals (3.07/gm). **Matt Moore** is 20<sup>th</sup> in assists and **Matthew Nunes** is 25<sup>th</sup> in goals-against (11.12/gm).

## VIRGINIA IN THE POLLS

- No. 4 Virginia has been ranked in the top 5 of the USILA Coaches poll in 311 weeks all-time.
- UVA has been ranked in the top 10 in 465 polls all-time, including in the most recent edition of the poll.
- UVA has been ranked No. 1 in the nation in 71 all-time polls, including in the 2022 preseason poll and the Feb. 7 edition of the poll.
- The USILA Poll began in 1973.

## ON THE HORIZON

- The winner of Virginia-Brown will face the winner top-seeded Maryland and Vermont, which square off in College Park on Sunday (May 15) at noon in the quarterfinals.
- The quarterfinals matchup between the aforementioned teams will be held at Ohio Stadium next Sunday (May 22) at either noon or 2:30 p.m. on ESPN.

## LARS TIFFANY AGREES TO CONTRACT EXTENSION THROUGH 2026

- Virginia men's lacrosse coach **Lars Tiffany** signed a contract extension through the 2026 season, director of athletics Carla Williams announced on March 28, 2022.
- Tiffany, who is currently in his sixth season as UVA head coach, guided the Cavaliers to back-to-back national championships in 2019 and 2021. With no NCAA Championship held in 2020 due to COVID-19, UVA's 2021 title marked the first time in program history that UVA won back-to-back national championships and became just the seventh NCAA Division-I men's lacrosse program to win consecutive national titles.

## THE CAVALIERS AT KLÖCKNER STADIUM

- Virginia owns a 166-43 (.794) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 8-0 mark in 2022, and has won 21 of its last 25 games played at the historic edifice.
- The Cavaliers' average margin of victory in their last 25 games at Klöckner Stadium is 5.36 goals.
- Virginia is 40-11 (.780) all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach Lars Tiffany.
- UVA is also 13-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- Lacrosse debuted in Klöckner Stadium in 1993.

## VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- In 2021, Virginia led the nation with 41.94 ground balls per game.
- Entering 2022, UVA has led the nation in ground balls eight of the last 13 years, including the last five seasons under **Lars Tiffany**.
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the top-5 nationally in ground balls per game 12 times over the last 13 seasons.
- The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.
- Lars-Tiffany-coached teams have led the nation in ground balls in seven straight seasons, including the 2015 and 2016 seasons at Brown.

PETEY LASALLA: THE NATION'S DEADLIEST FACEOFF SPECIALIST

- With 752 career faceoff wins, **Petey LaSalla** is currently second among all active Division-I players.
- LaSalla is the only player in all of college lacrosse with at least 752 career wins at the center-X and 26 career goals.
- With 11 career assists, he's also is the only player in the nation with at least 752 career faceoff victories and 37 career points.
- Virginia is 18-3 (.857) all-time when LaSalla scores a goal, including 5-0 in 2022, and 23-5 (.821) all-time when registering at least one point.
- He set a career high with three points on two goals and one assist in Virginia's ACC-championship clinching game at Syracuse (April 23).
- LaSalla won the first eight faceoffs of the game in UVA's 19-8 route over Johns Hopkins (March 5), and finished the contest 9-of-10, setting his single-game career high in faceoff win percentage. LaSalla tied that career best mark (9-of-10) at Richmond (April 2) before exiting the game with an upper-extremity injury.

- Virginia first years **Matthew Nunes** (G) and **Griffin Schutz** (A/M) were both No. 1 incoming freshmen in the nation at their respective positions, according to Inside Lacrosse.
- In addition to being tabbed the No. 1 overall attackman in his class, Schutz was crowned the No. 1 overall prospect. Schutz will likely see time as an offensive midfielder in 2021 with the starting attack solidified for the Cavaliers.
- With the departure of 2021 starting goalie Alex Rode, Nunes will become the first true freshman to start a season under the direction of head coach **Lars Tiffany** in his 18 years of experience as head coach.

- Nunes was also the ACC Defensive Player of the Week on Feb. 15 after making a season-best 16 saves in Virginia's 11-10 win over High Point.

**SHELLENBERGER, KASTNER SWEEP ACC WEEKLY HONORS**

- For their performance at UNC, Virginia attackman **Connor Shellenberger** and defenseman **Cole Kastner** were named the ACC's Co-Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week, respectively, on March 15.

- Faceoff specialist **Petey LaSalla** was named the ACC's Defensive Player of the Week in addition to being tabbed a USILA Division-I Team-of-the-Week selection, as was announced March 1.
- LaSalla went 19-of-28 at the faceoff-X in Virginia's ACC opener, a 20-11 win over then-No. 9 Syracuse (Feb. 26) at Klöckner Stadium.

**MOORE, SALLADE & SAUSTAD NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS**

- On Aug. 2, 2021, Virginia men's lacrosse head coach **Lars Tiffany** announced that short-stick defensive midfielder **Grayson Sallade**, attackman **Matt Moore** and **Cade Saustad** were selected team captains for the 2022 season.
- "Serving others and sacrificing for the betterment of the team define the three men who will be our team captains this year," Tiffany said. "They have had fantastic role models to look up to during their UVA career, and Grayson Sallade, Matt Moore and Cade Saustad are now prepared to share themselves physically, emotionally and verbally with their own caring and unselfish styles that distinguish them."
- "This is a self-aware and reflective trio that truly is willing to provide whatever UVA Lacrosse needs. What I have already witnessed from Grayson, Matt and Cade with our summer reading and discussions makes me even more excited for our future than I already was, and eager to witness their leadership first-hand."



HEAD COACH LARS TIFFANY

Lars Tiffany is in his sixth season as head coach of the Virginia men's lacrosse program after being named its 17th head coach on June 21, 2016.

Last season, Tiffany guided fourth-seeded Virginia to its seventh NCAA title after a 17-16 triumphant victory over third-seeded Maryland at Rentschler Field (East Hartford, Conn.) on May 31. With no NCAA Tournament held in 2020 due to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19), UVA's 2021 title marked the first time in men's lacrosse program history it won back-to-back national championships, having done so in 2019. Under the direction of Tiffany in 2021, Virginia became just the seventh men's lacrosse program in Division-I history to win back-to-back national championships and the first D-I men's lacrosse program to win six straight games in the NCAA finals (1999, 2003, 2006, 2011, 2019 and 2021). Tiffany and the Cavaliers are currently riding an eight-game winning streak in NCAA tournament games, which is also a program record.

For the fourth consecutive season (excluding 2020 due to COVID-19), Tiffany and the Cavaliers were the NCAA D-I statistical champions in ground balls per game (41.94), Virginia also finished in the top-10 nationally in several other statistical categories, including: third in goals scored per game (14.61), fifth in points per game (23.00) and opponent clear percentage (.798), sixth in shot percentage (.338) and winning percentage (.778), and tenth in assists per game (8.39) and faceoff winning percentage (.606). In addition to ground balls per game and opponent clear percentage, the Cavaliers led the ACC in caused turnovers per game (8.72) and saves per game (13.50).

Tiffany and his staff also guided nine USILA All-American selections in 2021, including Jared Conners, who was named the nation's most outstanding midfielder and a First Team All-American. In addition to Conners, Connor Shellenberger (1st), Petey LaSalla (2nd), Matt Moore (2nd), Kyle Kology (3rd), Payton Cormier (HM), Cade Saustad (HM), Alex Rode (HM) and Dox Aitken (HM) were all named USILA All-Americans. Virginia's nine All-American selections tied for the most by any team in the nation in 2021. Shellenberger was also named the Most Outstanding Player of the 2021 NCAA Tournament, while Conners, LaSalla, Moore, Saustad and Rode were tabbed all-tournament selections.

Virginia was 4-2 during the 2020 season before it canceled by the NCAA on March 12 due to COVID-19. The shortened 2020 season saw Michael Kraus become just the fourth Cavalier to reach the 100-goal, 100-assist mark for a career.

The 2019 season was a special one for Tiffany as he brought both NCAA and ACC titles to Charlottesville. Virginia tied a program record with 17 wins in 2019 as the Cavaliers finished 17-3, winning their first NCAA title since 2011 and first ACC title since 2010.

Virginia's offense hummed all season, finishing No. 7 in the country in three key categories: scoring offense per game (14.10), assists per game (8.60) and points per game (22.70). Virginia also finished No. 4 in the nation in scoring margin per game (3.85). Leading the way was Moore, who became the first player in program history to record 40+ goals and 40+ assists in the same season. Moore finished No. 1 in the ACC and No. 8 in the nation with 89 points (46-43). Dox Aitken, a First Team USILA All-American for the second-straight season, broke his own single-season UVA record for points by a midfielder (52). Aitken also became the only midfielder in program history to reach 100 goals for a career. Ian Laviano led the ACC and was No. 9 in the nation with 51 goals, which ranks No. 4 all-time at UVA on the single-season ledger.

Ryan Conrad, a First Team USILA All-American, was named the Senior CLASS Award winner for 2019, the second student-athlete to win the coveted award under Tiffany (Brown's Jack Kelly, 2016). Conrad, a two-time captain, was MVP of the ACC Tournament and named to the NCAA All-Tournament team. He finished the year with 31 goals and 18 assists, which places him tied for No. 3 all-time at UVA in single-season points by a midfielder.

UVA was one of the nation's most feared riding teams. UVA's opponents cleared at .711 percent for the season, which ranked No. 2 in the nation behind Cleveland State's .707 percent. UVA was also one of two programs to have a top 20 offense and defense, as the Cavaliers limited opponents to 10.25 goals per game, while scoring 14.10 per game. The scoring margin of 3.85 goals per game ranked No. 4 nationally and No. 1 in the ACC.

For the third year in a row, Tiffany's Cavaliers team ranked No. 1 nationally in ground balls (41.55) in 2019. Defensively in 2018, Virginia led the nation with 38.0 ground balls per game and in 2017 averaged 43.33 ground balls per game, averaging nearly seven more ground balls per game than No. 2 Brown (36.56). Tiffany's old program. Prior to Tiffany coming to UVA, his Brown squad in 2016 led the nation in ground balls as Tiffany's staff three years in a row has led the nation's best team on the ground. Goalie Rode was named Most Outstanding Player of the 2019 NCAA Tournament after going 4-0 with 43 saves between the pipes. Rode recorded 18 saves against Duke in the NCAA semifinal round and posted 13 saves against Yale in the NCAA final. Then-freshman LaSalla was stellar all season at the faceoff X, including going a perfect 6-of-6 in overtime periods. LaSalla, a College Crosse (SB Nation) Freshman All-American (1st), finished No. 1 in the ACC with 100 ground balls. He also was No. 2 in the ACC and No. 21 in the nation with a .587 faceoff winning percentage. LaSalla's 216 faceoff wins rank No. 2 in UVA's single-season record book.

In 2018, Tiffany's Cavaliers were No. 5 nationally in assists (7.72), No. 7 in points per game (20.33) and No. 7 in scoring offense (12.61). Michael Kraus became the third Cavalier in program history to reach 80 points in a season, finishing with 83, ranking No. 8 nationally. First Team All-American midfielder Aitken first set a midfielder program record with 51 points in 2018.

During Tiffany's first season on Grounds his Cavalier offense finished No. 1 in the ACC and No. 3 in the nation in three offensive categories: goals per game (14.40), assists per game (9.13) and points per game (23.53). Aitken shattered UVA's freshmen midfielder record of 29 goals and 40 points. Aitken broke the goals record in eight games. Attackman Kraus was named ACC Freshman of the Year and was the only rookie on the All-ACC team after leading UVA with 34 goals and 56 points.

Tiffany came to Virginia with 12 years of head coaching experience. He spent 10 years at Brown, his alma mater. He led the Bears to Championship Weekend in Philadelphia in 2016 behind a 16-3 record. The 16 wins in 2016 was a program record for the Bears. Brown's offense was potent in 2016, leading the nation with 16.32 goals per game. Under Tiffany's tutelage, nine Brown Bears earned All-America honors in 2016, while Dylan Molloy was the recipient of the 2016 Tewaaraton Trophy and was named by the USILA its most outstanding player and attackman of the year. Brown goalie Jack Kelly was named the nation's most outstanding goalie and the winner of the 2016 Senior CLASS award for men's lacrosse.

Tiffany returned his alma mater to national prominence with Ivy League regular season titles in 2008, 2010, 2015 and 2016 and NCAA Championship berths in 2009, 2015 and 2016. Tiffany was named the New England Coach of the Year in 2008, 2009, 2015 and 2016 and earned Ivy League Coach of the Year honors in 2015 and 2016.

Tiffany guided his 2015 team to the number one seed in the Ivy League Tournament, an Ivy League championship and NCAA Tournament berth, changing the landscape of college lacrosse with a unique fast break offense that scored 237 goals, averaging 13.94 goals per game, fifth best in the nation.

Since taking over the Brown program in 2007, Tiffany transformed the program from one that was winless in the Ivy League in 2006 into one of the preeminent teams in the Ivy League and the nation.

Tiffany guided Brown to its second Ivy League Championship under his watch in 2010, while also earning a berth in the first-ever Ivy League Playoffs. His team also posted back-to-back winning seasons in 2013 and 2014.

In 2009, Tiffany coached Brown to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1997, before falling in overtime to Johns Hopkins in the NCAA First Round. His 2009 team posted a 12-4 record and was ranked as high as eighth nationally during the season, finishing the season as the 11th ranked squad in the nation.

Tiffany's 2008 squad captured the Ivy League title with a 5-1 league mark, posting an 11-3 record to earn the most wins at Brown since 1994. Brown, the number one ranked team in New England, finished 13th nationally in the final USILA coaches poll, with just six teams in the nation winning more games than the Bears.

In his first season at the helm of the Brown team, Tiffany turned the fortunes of the program in the right direction, guiding the Bears to a 7-7 record in 2007, and a national ranking as high as 18th.

Tiffany came to Brown from Stony Brook, where he was the head lacrosse coach in 2005 and 2006, posting an 18-13 overall mark. His 2006 squad finished second in America East with a 4-1 league mark and was ranked in the Top 20 in two weeks. In 2005, Tiffany's Seawolves appeared in the Top 20 for the first time ever, and were ranked as high as 14th nationally. Tiffany, the 2005 America East Coach of the Year, led Stony Brook to wins over Penn State and Rutgers, as his Seawolves boasted the number-one ranked man-up unit in Division I.

Tiffany arrived at Stony Brook after successful stints at Penn State, Dartmouth, Washington & Lee and LeMoyne. He spent his four years at Penn State (2000-2004) as the top assistant under head coach Glenn Thiel, and was involved in all facets of the lacrosse program as the team's defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator. Tiffany's defensive units were outstanding during his four years, and in 2002, the Nittany Lions led the nation in man-down defense.

Prior to coaching at Penn State, Tiffany was an assistant coach at Dartmouth College, where he spent the 1999 and 2000 seasons under head coach Rick Sowell. In his two seasons as defensive coordinator, the Big Green's goals allowed per game in Ivy League contests dropped from 15.3 to 9.0. Dartmouth earned its first share of the Ivy League title and a berth in the NCAA tournament in 2003.

Tiffany was an assistant coach from 1997-98 at Washington & Lee University. In 1998, the Generals went 13-3 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament while finishing fifth in the USILA Division III national rankings.

Tiffany began his collegiate coaching career at LeMoyne College, where he served as an assistant coach of men's lacrosse and co-head coach of the women's lacrosse program from 1994-96. A native of LaFayette, N.Y., Tiffany graduated from LaFayette High School where he lettered in football, basketball and lacrosse. Upon graduation from Brown, he taught biology and coached lacrosse and football at the Robert Louis Stevenson School in Pebble Beach, Calif., from 1990-94.

He was Co-MVP of the Brown squad that captured its first-ever NCAA playoff victory in 1990 (12-9 vs. UMass). Tiffany capped his career by playing in the North-South Senior All-Star game.

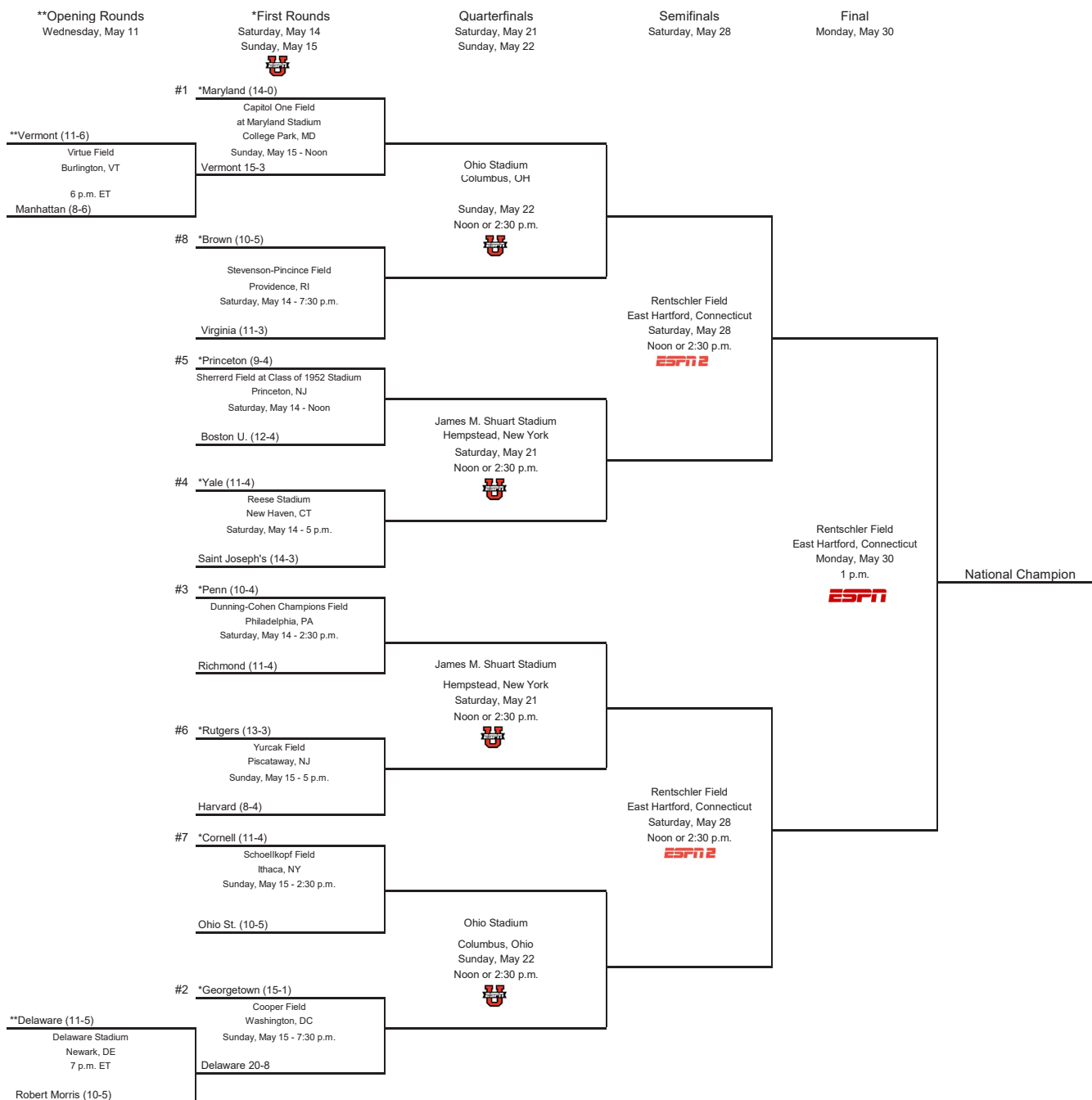
