#5 Virginia vs. VCU Series History: Virginia leads 5-0-1

Last Meeting: A 2-1 UVA road victory in 2020-21 Of Note: Hoos have won four straight in the series

QUICK KICKS

Virginia remains ranked No. 5 nationally by the United Soccer Coaches in the fourth week of play. The Hoos are 7-0-0 on the season and have posted six consecutive shutouts entering the weekend. Virginia has won consecutive games 5-0 after wins over No. 23 Memphis and Oregon State.

Maggie Cagle scored her first goal vs. Oregon State and has a goal and five assists. She has three assists on game-winning goals and hit the game-winning goal against the Beavers.

Maya Carter notched a brace against Oregon State, scoring twice in the final five minutes of the first half to help give the Hoos a 3-0 lead going into the half.

The shutout of Oregon State marks 568:08 minutes since the Cavaliers last gave up a goal.

Talia Staude was named ACC Defensive Player of the Week after the two shutouts last week. It was the second straight weekly honor for a UVA after **Haley Hopkins** was ACC Offensive PoW last week.

Hopkins continued the scoring onslaught on Sunday with a second-half goal against Memphis and has seven goals in the last five games - including three game-winning goals.

The Cavaliers are one of the most prolific offenses early in the 2022 season, tied for first nationally with 27 goals and 3.86 goals per game while Hopkins is tied for third in total goals scored (7). Alexa Spaanstra also continues to move up the UVA career record book and sits sixth all-time in assists at LIVA with 32 after her two assist performance against assist vs. Memphis on Sunday

THE SERIES WITH VCU

- ·Virginia and VCU have met six times in the history of the programs with the Cavaliers leading the series 5-0-1
- ·The Hoos have won four straight in the series dating back to the lone tie which came in the 1998 season
- · In the spring of 2021 the Hoos picked up a 2-1 victory over the Rams in a match played in Richmond
- · In that last meeting, UVA got goals from Claire Constant and Diana Ordönez to lock up the victory

HOOS PICKED TO FINISH SECOND IN 2022 ACC PRESEASON POLL

- ·The Cavaliers were picked to finish second in the ACC in a presasson vote of league coaches this season
- · Virginia received four first place vote and tallied 153 points picked behind Duke who had 156 points
- · Duke had the most points, but the Cavaliers and Tar Heels both received more first-place votes with four each
- ·The Cavaliers won the ACC regular season championship a year ago after being picked to finish third in the preseason poll

PRESEASON ALL-ACC HONOREES

- · UVA had sophomore midfielder Lia Godfrey and senior forward Alexa Spaanstra named to the preseason All-ACC team
- · It's the second straight year for the duo to be named to the preseason team and Spaanstra's third year on the team

- · Virginia has gone to extra time in 87 matches during the Steve Swanson era with a 23-12-53 record in those matches
- · In those 53 draws, 15 have come in the postseason with the Cavaliers surviving shootouts in five of those 15 matches

HOOS EARN UNITED SOCCER COACHES TEAM ACADEMIC AWARD FOR 13TH CONSECUTIVE YEAR

- ·The Cavaliers were named a recipient of the Team Academic Award by the United Soccer Coaches for the 2021-22 year
- · It marks the 13th consecutive season for the Hoos to receive the award from the coaches organization
- ·Teams must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 to be named as a recipient of the award each season

HOOS CONTINUE STRONG PRESENCE IN PROFESSIONAL RANKS ON NWSL ROSTERS

- · UVA has a strong presence in professional soccer in the U.S. with 15 players appearing on NWSL rosters this season
- · Becky Sauerbrunn now competes with the Portland Thorns after being traded by the Utah Royals
- · Orlando features third-year player Courtney Petersen. Petersen was a first-round pick of the Pride in 2019.
- · Chicago boasts three players in Morgan Gautrat, Danielle Colaprico and Zoe Morse.
- · Kristen McNabb and Makenzy Doniak now play for San Diego, while Veronica Latsko, Phoebe McClernon and Laurel Ivory are with the OL Reign.
- · Megan Reid was picked up by Angel City FC in the offseason, while Emily Sonnett is with the Washington Spirit.
- · First-round pick Diana Ordoñez plays for NC Courage along with Brittany Ratcliffe.

- · Forward Haley Hopkins has been on a hot streak since scoring her first goal of the season at No. 11 Georgetown
- · Hopkins has scored seven goals in the last four games including hitting three game-winning goals in that span
- · She tallied a brace for the Hoos in the win over Fairleigh Dickinson, notching all three goals in the first 14 minutes of play

- · UVA head coach Steve Swanson hit a rare milestone vs. NC State (10/25/18), hitting the 400 career win mark
- ·As a head coach, Swanson holds a 458-164-64 record through stops at Dartmouth, Stanford and Virginia
- · Currently only a handful of D1 coaches have hit the 400 win milestone with eight of them currently active
- •The list gained a coach when Merrimack College transitioned to D1 status for this season
- · Swanson is one of only nine coaches who has recorded 400 wins all at a D1 institution
- · In his coaching career, he has taken all three teams to league titles and the NCAA Tournament

SWANSON GRABS HIS 300TH WIN AS UVA HEAD COACH

- · Head Coach Steve Swanson picked up his 300th wins as the head coach of the Cavaliers vs. Liberty (8/25/19)
- · Currently, Swanson holds a 354-101-53 record as UVA head coach and is 138-48-22 in ACC matches
- · He has 22 consecutive winning seasons at Virginia and 30 overall as a head coach
- · Swanson has taken his teams to 24 consecutive NCAA Tournaments with Virginia's inclusion last season

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

- Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson: "Campus" is never used.
- First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may
 ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas
 Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process. This tends to be
 used less in athletic eligibility references.
- Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

- · Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."
- Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.
- Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely
 contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in
 general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos"
 sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

•The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS: ORANGE AND BLUE

- Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.
- One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAHOOWA

- The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.
- · Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."
