 Series History: UCLA leads the series 6-3-2  
 Last Meeting: UCLA won in 2017 NCAA Round of 16  
 Of Note: Seventh meeting in the NCAA Tournament



### QUICK KICKS

- UVA's 29 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances is the second-longest active streak while the Hoos' 35 total appearances is the second most total appearances by a program in NCAA history.
- UVA is making its ninth appearance in the NCAA Tournament quarterfinals after making its 17th Sweet 16 appearance in the last 18 years last weekend at Penn State.
- Virginia is coming off a 3-2 overtime victory against the second-seeded Nittany Lions behind a second-half rally that saw the Hoos twice tie the game to force overtime.
- The Hoos had five players earn placement on an All-ACC team this season with **Lia Godfrey** (1st), **Haley Hopkins** (2nd), **Maggie Cagle** (3rd/Freshman), **Alexa Spaanstra** (3rd) and **Jill Flammia** (Freshman) all being recognized by the league's coaches.
- Spaanstra** is tied for third in total assists among active NCAA D1 players (34) for a career.
- Cayla White** has nine solo shutouts this year - tied for ninth all-time at UVA in season shutouts. Her 11 career shutouts is tied for seventh all-time and one shy of seventh at UVA.
- White's** 11 shutouts is second in the ACC this season and is 26th nationally in the category.
- Hopkins** leads UVA with 13 goals this season and is third among active NCAA D1 players in career goals scored (55) and 135 points to date. She is 14th nationally in goals (13) this season.
- Cagle** leads UVA with 12 assists, is 11th nationally in assists/game (0.55) and sixth in total assists.
- Lia Godfrey** turned in her first career multiple-goal game against Xavier in the second round.
- As a team, Virginia in the top 10 nationally in scoring offense (10th - 2.50 gpg), total goals (8th - 55) and total points (9th - 154). UVA is top four in the ACC in all three categories.

**THE SERIES WITH UCLA**

- Virginia and UCLA have faced each other 11 times with the Bruins leading the all-time series 6-3-2
- Seven of the 11 matches have come on the road for the Hoos with two more played at neutral sites and two in Charlottesville
- The teams first met in 1995, playing to a 1-1 draw in a match played in Livermore, Calif.
- The last game came in the 2017 NCAA Tournament, a 2-1 victory by the Bruins - the second meeting between the teams that year

**HOOS PICKED TO FINISH SECOND IN 2022 ACC PRESEASON POLL**

- The Cavaliers were picked to finish second in the ACC in a presasson vote of league coaches this season
- Virginia received four first place vote and tallied 153 points - picked behind Duke who had 156 points
- Duke had the most points, but the Cavaliers and Tar Heels both received more first-place votes with four each
- The Cavaliers won the ACC regular season championship a year ago after being picked to finish third in the preseason poll

**PRESEASON ALL-ACC HONOREES**

- UVA had sophomore midfielder **Lia Godfrey** and senior forward **Alexa Spaanstra** named to the preseason All-ACC team
- It's the second straight year for the duo to be named to the preseason team and Spaanstra's third year on the team
- Godfrey earned All-America honors and All-Region honors last season on top of All-ACC first team honors
- Spaanstra was an All-ACC second team selection and an All-Region honoree a year ago
- The preseason All-ACC team was made up of 12 players and featured players from seven different teams

**HOOS BACK FOR THE CAVALIERS**

- UVA returns 25 players from last year's team - including four All-ACC and three All-Region honorees
- Lia Godfrey, Samar Guidry, Haley Hopkins and Alexa Spaanstra all claimed All-ACC honors and return for the Hoos
- Godfrey and Spaanstra also garnered All-Region honors along with Talia Staude, while Godfrey was also an All-American
- The trio of Godfrey, Hopkins and Spaanstra combined for 18 goals and 30 assists in last year's offense
- Also returning to the lineup is fifth-year senior Rebecca Jarrett who had three goals and three assists before a season-ending injury
- Defenders Claire Constant and Laney Rouse also return to give the Hoos nine starters back - counting Jarrett who was a starter prior to the injury

**VIRGINIA WELCOMES ANOTHER HIGHLY-RANKED RECRUITING CLASS TO GROUNDS**

- UVA welcomed the ninth-ranked recruiting class to Grounds for this season with a group of six signees in the freshman class
- Five of the freshmen were ranked in the top 170 nationally with No. 26 Jill Flammia and No. 30 Maggie Cagle leading the way
- The other rankings included Maya Carter (No. 75), Helen Symbas (No. 158) and Tatum Galvin (No. 168)
- Also joining the Hoos are a pair of transfers in Chloe Japic (via Baylor) and Grace Santos (via William & Mary/Arizona)
- Both Japic and Santos are in their junior seasons as the settle into the roster with the Cavaliers

**CAVALIERS RESPOND WELL AFTER A LOSS UNDER SWANSON**

- Responding after a loss has been a trend for the Cavaliers throughout Steve Swanson's tenure at UVA
- Throughout the 23 seasons under Swanson, Virginia holds a 63-8-14 record in matches following a loss
- The number does not include season-ending losses where the next match would be part of a new season

**THE HOOS IN OVERTIME IN THE SWANSON ERA**

- The Hoos won't be going to overtime until postseason play due to changes in rules, but UVA is no stranger to OT
- Virginia has gone to extra time in 88 matches during the Steve Swanson era with a 24-12-53 record in those matches
- In those 53 draws, 15 have come in the postseason with the Cavaliers surviving shootouts in five of those 15 matches
- UVA played its first overtime game of the 2022 season in the third round with a 3-2 win at No. 2 seed Penn State

**HOOS CONTINUE STRONG PRESENCE IN PROFESSIONAL RANKS ON NWSL ROSTERS**

- UVA has a strong presence in professional soccer in the U.S. with 15 players appearing on NWSL rosters this season
- Becky Sauerbrunn now competes with the Portland Thorns after being traded by the Utah Royals
- Orlando features third-year player Courtney Petersen. Petersen was a first-round pick of the Pride in 2019.
- Chicago boasts three players in Morgan Gautrat, Danielle Colaprico and Zoe Morse.
- Kristen McNabb and Makenzy Doniak now play for San Diego, while Veronica Latsko, Phoebe McClemon and Laurel Ivory are with the OL Reign.
- Megan Reid was picked up by Angel City FC in the offseason, while Emily Sonnett is with the Washington Spirit.
- First-round pick Diana Ordoñez plays for NC Courage along with Brittany Ratcliffe.
- Virginia is one of only three schools to have a player taken in every NWSL Draft

**HOOS HAVE A PRESENCE IN TOP DRAWER SOCCER PRESEASON TOP 100**

- Virginia had several players ranked among the top 100 in the preseason by Top Drawer Soccer with four making the list
- Midfielder Lia Godfrey led the list at No. 5 after earning All-America honors for the second straight year in 2021
- Talia Staude came in at No. 14 on the list, while Alexa Spaanstra was No. 18 after All-ACC and All-Region honors a year ago
- Rebecca Jarrett was ranked No. 50 as she returns to the pitch after an ACL tear ended her season early last year

**GODFREY NAMED TO HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST**

- The Hoos had a player on the Hermann Trophy Watch list yet again this season when the 61 player list was announced
- Junior Lia Godfrey was tabbed for the watch list for the third consecutive season
- Virginia's Morgan Brian won the award twice in her career, taking the honor in 2013 and 2014
- Several UVA players have been finalists, including Emily Sonnett (2015), Caroline Miller (2012) and Amanda Cromwell (1991)
- Forward Diana Ordoñez was a semifinalist for the award last season as a junior with the Cavaliers

**HOPKINS NAMED ACC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

- Forward Haley Hopkins was named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week on August 30 for her performance in week two
- Hopkins tallied four goals on the week - including the game winner in a 1-0 victory at No. 11 Georgetown
- She followed that up with a hat trick in the first 13:07 of the match against Fairleigh Dickinson - a 5-0 victory for the Hoos
- It was Hopkins' first hat trick as a Cavalier and her fourth multiple-goal game of her career at Virginia

**STAUDE NAMED ACC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

- Defender Talia Staude was named ACC Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 6 for her performance in week three of the season
- Staude played the full time in both wins on the week - a pair of shutouts of JMU and No. 23 Memphis
- The shutouts extended a streak of five straight shutouts for the Hoos and a stretch of 468:08 without allowing a goal

**GODFREY NAMED TOP DRAWER SOCCER PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

- Midfielder Lia Godfrey was named Top Drawer Soccer Player of the Week on September 19 and included on the weekly team
- Godfrey hit the game-winning goal for the Hoos in a come-from-behind victory at No. 2 North Carolina on September 17
- Godfrey's goal capped a three-goal rally over the span of 18 minutes as Virginia rallied from a 2-0 deficit for the victory
- It marked the biggest comeback in regulation ever against UNC and also marked the fifth victory over UNC all time by UVA

**GODFREY, WHITE EARN ACC WEEKLY HONORS FOLLOWING VICTORY AT DUKE**

- Midfielder Lia Godfrey and goalkeeper Cayla White were recognized by the ACC following the victory over Duke
- Godfrey earned ACC Co-Offensive Player of the Week after hitting the game-winning goal against the Blue Devils
- White earned ACC Defensive Player of the Week honors after posting six saves in the clean sheet against Duke

**GODFREY, WHITE EARN ACC WEEKLY HONORS FOLLOWING VICTORY AT DUKE**

- White also picked up her first national weekly honor this week when she was recognized by the United Soccer Coaches
- The senior was named the national Player of the Week for Division I by the coaches organization following the Duke win
- It's the first weekly honor on a conference and national level for White in her time as a Cavalier

**HOPKINS EARNS ACC WEEKLY HONORS FOR SECOND TIME**

- Haley Hopkins earned ACC Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors following her performance at Virginia Tech
- Hopkins tallied a brace and an assist in the match with the Hokies as she was involved in all three goals
- The weekly honor from the ACC was the second of the season for Hopkins

**HOPKINS HITS THREE STRAIGHT GAME WINNERS IN EARLY SEASON**

- Forward Haley Hopkins has been on fire offensively, scoring five goals through three games (8/25 - 9/1)
- Not only did Hopkins rack up the goals, she hit the game-winning goal for the Hoos in all three games
- The forward has tallied five game-winning goals for the Cavaliers across two seasons in Charlottesville

**JABLONOWSKI EFFICIENT OFFENSIVELY IN OUTING AGAINST MEMPHIS**

- Junior Brianna Jablonowski turned in a career performance for the Hoos and turned the tide in a win over No. 23 Memphis
- She scored her first collegiate goal in the 43rd minute to get UVA on the board just five minutes after entering the game
- Jablonowski would go on to add an assist and a second goal down the stretch in the second half to put a stamp on the win
- In all, the junior tallied the brace and assist in only 19 minutes of play and delivered the game winner on that first goal

**HOPKINS GOES ON HOT STREAK STARTING WITH GAME-WINNING GOAL AGAINST NO. 11 GEORGETOWN**

- Forward Haley Hopkins has been on a hot streak since scoring her first goal of the season at No. 11 Georgetown
- Hopkins has scored seven goals in the last five games - including hitting three game-winning goals in that span
- She tallied a brace for the Hoos in the win over Fairleigh Dickinson, notching all three goals in the first 14 minutes of play
- Hopkins also hit what proved to be the game-winning goal in the 2-0 victory over JMU as part of that five-game stretch

**HOPKINS CONTINUES ADDING TO OUTSTANDING CAREER NUMBERS IN 2022**

- Not only is Hopkins a part of a dynamic duo for the Hoos, but she continues building on stellar career numbers in 2022
- Hopkins is third among active D1 players in career goals and points with the 50 career goals and 123 points
- Hopkins is one of only three active players in Division I who have net at least 50 goals in their career
- She is also one of only three players to surpass the 120-point mark for her career among active D1 players.

**CAGLE MAKES IMMEDIATE IMPACT FOR HOOS AS A FRESHMAN**

- Freshman forward Maggie Cagle made an immediate impact for the Hoos, jumping right into the action from game one
- Cagle started the first three games of the season and notched four assists through the first three games of the season
- In those three games, Cagle assisted on the game-winning goal in each - including the game winner at #11 Georgetown
- Cagle then scored her first collegiate goal against Oregon State, delivering the game winner for the Hoos in that match

**CAGLE A NATIONAL LEADER IN SETTING UP GAME WINNERS**

- After the hot start, freshman Maggie Cagle has continued to be a key cog in the Virginia offense
- Of her 12 assists entering the week, seven of them have come on game-winning goals for the Hoos
- Cagle is tied for first nationally in game-winning assists and has directly factored into nine of the 16 wins for the Hoos
- Entering the weekend, Cagle leads all freshmen in D1 in game-winning assists this season and total assists this season
- In addition to her seven game-winning assists, Cagle also hit game-winning goals against Oregon State and Wake Forest

**CARTER STRIKES QUICKLY TO BREAK OPEN GAME FOR HOOS AGAINST BEAVERS**

- Maya Carter announced her arrival in the season opener against George Mason with a goal but upped that vs. Oregon State
- The freshman delivered two goals for the Hoos in a five-minute span to close the first half against the Beavers
- Carter struck with her first goal in the 41st minute before then finding the net again in the 45th minute to close the half

**SWANSON HITS THE 400 CAREER COACHING WIN MILESTONE TO PUT HIM AMONG ELITE COMPANY**

- UVA head coach Steve Swanson hit a rare milestone vs. NC State (10/25/18), hitting the 400 career win mark
- As a head coach, Swanson holds a 467-167-67 record through stops at Dartmouth, Stanford and Virginia
- Currently only a handful of D1 coaches have hit the 400 win milestone with eight of them currently active
- The list gained a coach when Merrimack College transitioned to D1 status for this season
- Swanson is one of only nine coaches who has recorded 400 wins all at a D1 institution
- In his coaching career, he has taken all three teams to league titles and the NCAA Tournament

**SWANSON GRABS HIS 300TH WIN AS UVA HEAD COACH**

- Head Coach Steve Swanson picked up his 300th wins as the head coach of the Cavaliers vs. Liberty (8/25/19)
- Currently, Swanson holds a 364-104-56 record as UVA head coach and is 143-49-23 in ACC matches
- He has 23 consecutive winning seasons at Virginia and 31 overall as a head coach
- Swanson has taken his teams to 25 consecutive NCAA Tournaments with Virginia's inclusion this season

**HOOS SET SCORING STANDARD NATIONALLY SINCE 2011**

- Virginia has had a high-powered offense under head coach Steve Swanson, but especially since 2011
- Over the past 12 seasons, UVA leads the nation as one of five teams to score 600 goals in that span
- With two goals against Syracuse (10/9) the Hoos became the only team to hit 700 goals in that time
- Virginia led the nation in goals scored in 2014 with 88 goals on the way to an NCAA runner-up finish
- UVA also led the nation in goals scored with 78 goals scored throughout the 2013 campaign
- The Hoos are eighth nationally in goals scored this season and in the top 10 nationally for the fifth straight season

**CAVALIER COMEBACK AT UNC MARKS HISTORIC FIRSTS**

- Virginia posted a comeback for the ages in the ACC opener at No. 2 North Carolina earlier this season
- Trailing 2-0 at halftime, the Cavaliers would put together a rally with three goals in an 18-minute span to grab victory at UNC
- It marked the first time ever that a team had trailed by two goals against North Carolina and rallied to win in regulation
- It was also only the second time ever a team had rallied from a two-goal deficit to beat the Tar Heels (Texas A&M - 9/11/11) as the Aggies overcame a 3-1 deficit to grab a 4-3 victory in overtime
- The three goals in the rally were also the most goals ever scored by Virginia in a match against the Tar Heels

**HOPKINS, FLAMMIA COMBINE FOR QUICK STRIKE AT VIRGINIA TECH**

- Jill Flammia and Haley Hopkins combined for a quick strike offense at Virginia Tech - notching two goals in 13 seconds
- Hopkins and Alexa Spaanstra found Flammia on a counter for the first goal in the 50th minute to get UVA on the board
- Following the kickoff, Hopkins intercepted a pass and found the back of the net just 13 seconds later for the Hoos
- The two goals 13 seconds apart was the fastest goals in succession for the Hoos in program history, passing a mark set against Virginia Tech in the 1995 season.

**HOOS TACKLE ACC SLATE WITH CHALLENGING FRONT HALF**

- UVA faced an incredibly challenging front half to ACC play that featured four-of-five games against nationally-ranked opponents
- The Hoos kicked things off at No. 2 North Carolina, picking up the 3-2 come-from-behind victory over the Tar Heels
- Virginia then went on the road to face No. 18 Notre Dame - who had been ranked No. 6 the week prior when ACC play opened
- The Hoos then came home for Louisville before traveling to face No. 4 Duke and returning home for No. 3 Florida State
- All told, UVA played three matches against top-5 teams at the halfway mark in ACC play and went 2-1 against those teams

**VIRGINIA FORWARDS OF HOPKINS/SPAANSTRA MAKE FOR DYNAMIC OFFENSIVE DUO**

- Forwards Haley Hopkins and Alexa Spaanstra are a dynamic duo offensively for the Cavaliers
- Currently there are 12 active D1 players who have hit the 30 goal and 20 assist mark - and the Hoos have two of them
- Hopkins has 55 career goals and 26 career assists with 21 goals and 14 assists coming in her time as a Hoop
- Spaanstra has tallied 37 career goals and 34 career assists as one of the most balanced offensive threats for the Cavaliers

**SPAANSTRA CLIMBING IN THE OFFENSIVE RECORDS AND HITTING OVERALL MARKS AT UVA**

- Alexa Spaanstra is making her way up the career record books in several categories throughout the record books
- Spaanstra currently sits at sixth all-time at Virginia for assists in a career with 34 and is two shy of tying for fourth
- She also is tied for eighth all-time at UVA in game-winning assists with nine - matching a mark held by Tracy DiMillo
- Spaanstra has 108 career points which is sixth all-time for a career at Virginia
- She scored her 37th career goal against FDU to tie for seventh all-time in goals scored by a Cavalier
- She has made 106 career starts, passing Laurel Ivory (100) to take over the top spot in Virginia history
- Her 106 games played is the most all-time in a career by a player at Virginia

**HOPKINS, CONSTANT JOIN SPAANSTRA IN BREAKING THE CENTURY MARK**

- Two more Hoos hit the century mark for games played in a career this season: Haley Hopkins and Claire Constant
- Hopkins hit the 100 games played mark when she started against Duke in the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament
- Constant hit the 100 games played mark with her start against Xavier in the second round of the NCAA Tournament

**HOOS EARN UNITED SOCCER COACHES TEAM ACADEMIC AWARD FOR 13TH CONSECUTIVE YEAR**

- The Cavaliers were named a recipient of the Team Academic Award by the United Soccer Coaches for the 2021-22 year
- It marks the 13th consecutive season for the Hoos to receive the award from the coaches organization
- Teams must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 to be named as a recipient of the award each season

**CAVALIER CONNECTIONS WITH US SOCCER**
**VIRGINIA HAS STRONG TIES WITH US SOCCER**

- The Virginia women's soccer program has strong ties historically with US Soccer
- Current head coach Steve Swanson assisted with the USWNT and previously served as head coach of the U20 team that won the 2012 Women's World Cup
- A total of 11 players have been called up to the USWNT through the program's history, including ACC Network commentators Angela Hucles and Lori Lindsey

**PAIR OF FORMER HOOS WIN OLYMPIC BRONZE**

- Two former members of the UVA women's soccer program were on recent rosters with the USWNT: Becky Sauerbrunn ('07) and Emily Sonnett ('15)
- The pair helped the United States claim a bronze medal in the Tokyo Olympics in the summer of 2021

**SEVERAL FORMER HOOS COMPETE WITH USWNT**

- Three Cavaliers helped the USWNT claim consecutive FIFA Women's World Cup championships when the US claimed the 2019 title in France
- Brian and Sauerbrunn were also part of the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup title in Canada
- Danielle Colaprico, the 2014 ACC Midfielder of the Year, was called up for the USWNT in competition with Portugal and Scotland played in November of 2018

**OTHER HOOS WITH US SOCCER ON WORLD STAGE**

- Rebecca Jarrett and Alexa Spaanstra represented the US in the Concacaf Cup to help the US qualify for the U20 Women's World Cup before it was canceled.
- Fellow Cavaliers Diana Ordoñez and Talia Staude were part of the Nike Friendlies with the US Team in preparation for the Concacaf Cup along with new freshman Lia Godfrey.

**FOUR HOOS REPRESENT THE U.S. IN FRANCE AT 2018 FIFA U20 WOMEN'S WORLD CUP**

- Four members of the Virginia women's soccer team represented the U.S. at the 2018 U20 Women's World Cup in France
- Zoe Morse, Laurel Ivory, Taryn Torres and Alexa Spaanstra all earned spots on the U20 roster in '18
- Ivory started all three games of pool play for the U.S. team that went 1-1-1 vs. Japan, Paraguay and Spain

**CAVALIER DUO REPRESENT THE U.S. IN COSTA RICA AT 2022 FIFA U20 WOMEN'S WORLD CUP**

- Current Cavaliers Samar Guidry and Laney Rouse were a part of the U.S. squad at the U20 WWC in Costa Rica
- The duo missed the first two games of the 2022 NCAA season in duty with the U.S. Team
- Rouse delivered the assist on the opening goal of the tournament in a match with Ghana
- The duo also helped the US advance through qualifying tournaments for the U20 Women's World Cup

**OTHER CONNECTIONS**

- Former assistant Jaime Frias joined the Hoos after a stint with US Soccer in player development
- Former head coach Lauren Gregg was head coach of the USWNT from 1997-2000
- Former head coach April Heinrichs coached the USWNT from 2000-2004 and played on the first Women's World Cup Championship team in 1991

## UVA IN THE ACC CHAMPIONSHIPS

- The Cavaliers made a 35th straight ACC Tournament appearance in 2022 and have been in every tournament
- Virginia holds a 24-26-9 all-time record in the ACC Championships after falling to Duke in the quarterfinals
- The Hoos have won the ACC Championships twice in program history - 2004 and 2012
- In its nine draws, the Cavaliers have twice advanced on PKs, once being the 2004 title

## UVA WINS THE ACC CHAMPIONSHIP IN 2004, 2012

- UVA won the ACC Championship for the first time in the 2004 season over UNC by shootout
- The Cavaliers claimed the title 5-4 on PKs after playing the Tar Heels to a 1-1 draw
- Lindsay Gusick scored the goal for UVA off a Sarah Huffman assist in the 24th minute
- Virginia won its second ACC Championship in the 2012 season with a 4-0 win over Maryland
- UVA got goals from Morgan Brian, Makenzy Doniak, Gloria Douglas and Caroline Miller

## VIRGINIA IN THE ACC CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS

- The Cavaliers have advanced to the ACC Tournament finals eight times in program history
- Virginia is 1-5-2 all-time in the championship match of the ACC Tournament
- The Hoos first advanced to the ACC Tournament Championship in 1990, falling to UNC
- Virginia has advanced to the finals in 1990, 2004, 2005, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2019 and 2021

## VIRGINIA TOUGH TO BEAT IN OVERTIME IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

- The Cavaliers have been strong in matches that head to overtime in the history of the ACC Tournament
- UVA has played 13 matches that have gone to overtime with a 3-1-9 record in overtime matches
- The Cavaliers' only outright loss in overtime in the ACC Championships came in the 2019 final against UNC
- Virginia's three overtime wins have come against Duke (2001), Wake Forest (2008) and Florida State (2019)
- The Cavaliers have forced a shootout in nine instances when heading to overtime at the ACC Tournament


## UVA VS. DUKE IN THE ACC CHAMPIONSHIPS

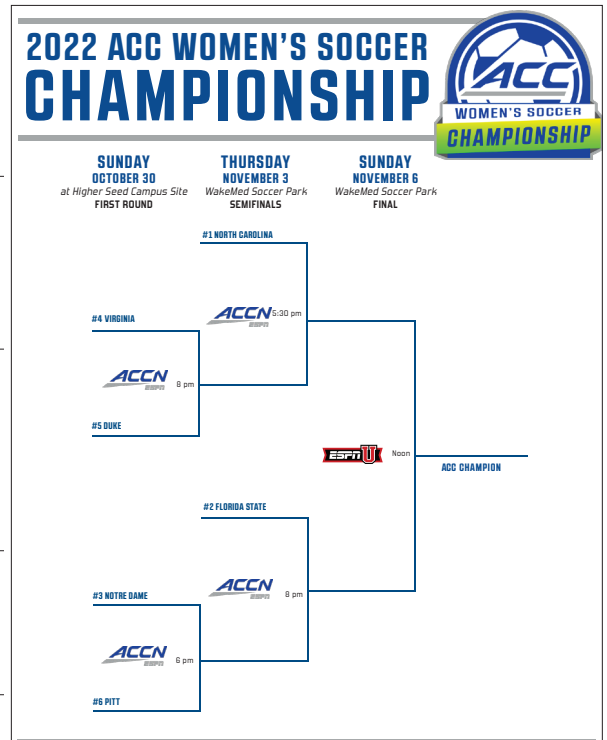
- Virginia and Duke have met seven times in the ACC Championship with Duke leading 4-2-1
- The Hoos won the last meeting by a score of 1-0 in Charlottesville in the 2019 quarterfinals
- The other UVA victory came in the quarterfinals of the 2001 tournament with a 2-1 overtime victory

**A DEEPER LOOK AT VIRGINIA IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT**

- Virginia holds a 49-29-8 record in matches played in the NCAA Tournament all-time
- That record is impressive in the Swanson era with a 49-18-7 mark under his leadership
- The Cavaliers have out-scored foes 190-to-93 in NCAA Tournament matches
- That score margin is more pronounced under Swanson coming in at 177-to-68 all-time

**HOOS HAVE BEEN A MAINSTAY IN THE POSTSEASON WITH A STRETCH OF DEEP NCAA RUNS**

- The Hoos have been a mainstay in the NCAA Tournament with 35 appearances overall and 29 straight berths
- The 35 appearances is second all-time, while the 29 straight appearances is the second longest active streak
- Virginia had an active streak of 14 consecutive appearances in the Sweet 16 until the 2019 season's loss to eventual College Cup participant Washington State in the second round
- The appearance in the Sweet 16 last weeked at Penn State was the 17th in the last 18 years for the Cavaliers
- Virginia has made eight appearances in the quarterfinals under head coach Steve Swanson - making it in 2001, 2005, 2011 2013, 2014, 2015, the 2020-21 season and this year in 2022
- The appearance in the quarterfinals against UCLA is the ninth quarterfinal appearance all-time for UVA
- UVA advanced to the College Cup in the 2013, 2014 and 2020 seasons - making a finals appearance in 2014
- UVA also advanced to the quarterfinals in 1991 when Virginia went on to make its first semifinal appearance

**THE PATH SO FAR FOR THE HOOS**

- Virginia's path to the quarterfinals has included matches against two conference champs and a runner-up
- The Hoos downed NEC Champion Fairleigh Dickinson 4-0 in the first round with a balanced attack
- Virginia defeated Big East runner-up Xavier in the second round behind a first-half brace from Lia Godfrey
- The third-round saw freshmen spark a rally on the way to a 3-2 overtime win at B1G champions Penn State

**FRESHMEN LEAD THE CHARGE FOR THE HOOS IN ROUND OF 16**

- Virginia's freshmen came up big and led the charge into the quarterfinals for the Hoos
- Jill Flammia scored the first goal in a second-half rally with an unassisted goal in the 74th minute as she followed up her initial header and cleaned up the deflected ball in the box to put the Hoos on the board
- Maggie Cagle then connected with Maya Carter for a header in the 88th minute after keeping a ball alive cleanly along the endline before resetting the attack and finding Carter with her cross
- Cagle then found Hopkins for what proved to be the game winner in the 94th minute when she played a ball in to Hopkins near the back post for the go-ahead score

**VIRGINIA VS. UCLA IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT**

- Virginia and UCLA will face each other for the seventh time in the NCAA Tournament with UCLA leading 4-1-1
- Three of those meetings in the NCAA Tournament have come in the quarterfinals or later
- UCLA won quarterfinal matchups in 2005 while the Hoos won the 2014 quarterfinal matchup
- The teams played to a draw in the 2013 semifinals with UVA advancing to the championship in a shootout
- Six of the seven NCAA games played between the teams will have been at UCLA with the seventh at Cary, N.C.

**WHAT'S ON THE LINE THIS WEEKEND**

- Virginia and UCLA are playing for a spot in the College Cup and will be the last game of the quarterfinal round
- The Hoos are looking to advance to the College Cup for the fourth time under head coach Steve Swanson
- UVA advanced to the semifinals in the 1991 season and a win would give them a fifth semifinal appearance
- The winner of the game between UCLA and Virginia will face either No. 1 seed Alabama or No. 2 seed Duke

**UNIQUELY UVA**

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

- Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.
- First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process. This tends to be used less in athletic eligibility references.
- Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

**UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES**

- Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."
- Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.
- Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

**THE CAVALIER MASCOT**

- The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

**UNIVERSITY COLORS: ORANGE AND BLUE**

- Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.
- One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

**WAHOOWA**

- The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.
- Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

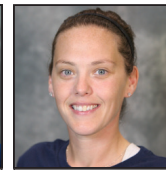

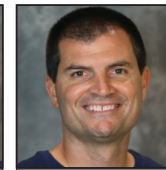

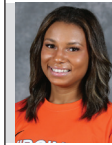
