Team Notes

- UVA (10-2, 2-1 ACC) has a 10-game winning streak vs. Georgia Tech
- UVA is 4-1 away from home, including a 2-1 true road record
- UVA went on a 25-0 run spanning halftime (16-0 to start second stanza)
- UVA held Georgia Tech scoreless for 8:36 spanning halftime
- Virginia is 151-11 when scoring at least 70 or more points under Tony Bennett
- UVA is 7-0 when scoring 70 or more points in 2022-23
- UVA started 4 of 6 from 3-point range and finished 10 of 22
- UVA buried 8 of 15 3-pointers en route to a 36-25 lead at the half
- UVA recorded 12 assists on 13 made field goals in the first half
- UVA had a season-high 14 steals, most since 16 vs. NC State (2/24/08)
- Virginia had 30 points off 23 Georgia Tech turnovers

Bennett Wins Watch

- Tony Bennett (326-119, 14 seasons) tied Terry Holland (326-173, 16 seasons) for first on the all-time wins list at UVA
- Bennett (395-152) needs five wins to reach 400 career wins

Series Notes

- Virginia is 47-40 all-time vs. Georgia Tech, including a 16-24 mark in Atlanta, in the series that dates to 1947-48.
- The Cavaliers have a 10-game winning streak in the series, including a four-game winning streak at McCamish Pavilion.
- Virginia is 18-2 in its last 20 games against Georgia Tech, including a 17-2 mark under head coach Tony Bennett.

Player Notes

- Double Figure Scorers: Kihei Clark (15), Jayden Gardner (14), Armaan Franklin (11), Kadin Shedrick (11)
- Gardner reached double figures for the 110th time
- Clark reached double figures for the 59th time
- Shedrick reached double figures for the 18th time
- Franklin reached double figures for the 41st time
- Franklin had a career-high five steals
- Clark matched a season high with three steals
- Clark (4,634 minutes) passed North Carolina's Ed Cota (4,631 from 1997-00) for ninth on the ACC's Career Minutes Played list.
- Clark (1,220 points) passed Jimmy Miller (1,218 from 1982-85) for 37th on UVA's all-time scoring list.
- Reece Beekman returned to the lineup after missing the UAlbany game due to injury
- All 12 Cavaliers saw action in the win
