### The Game

- The 11th-ranked Johns Hopkins (4-2) men's lacrosse team welcomes top-ranked Virginia (4-0) to Homewood Field for the 96th all-time meeting between the Blue Jays and Cavaliers. Faceoff is set for 4:02 pm with a live broadcast on ESPN+.

### When Last We Saw Them

- Johns Hopkins picked up its second straight win as the Blue Jays topped then 13th-ranked St. Joseph's, 15-14, at Homewood Field last Saturday.
- The top-ranked Cavaliers ran their season-opening winning streak to four games as UVA raced past Richmond, 25-8, at home last Saturday night.

### The Facts

- This is the 136th season of Johns Hopkins men's lacrosse. JHU first fielded a team in 1883.
- Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 1,008-366-15 (.731).
- Johns Hopkins is the only men's lacrosse program in the nation with 1,000 or more all-time victories. The Blue Jays picked up the program's 1,000th victory with an 11-10 win over Loyola on February 19, 2022.
- JHU owns 44 national championships with nine NCAA titles, 29 USILA titles and six ILA crowns to its credit.

### Oh Captain, My Captain

- Three individuals were selected to serve as Blue Jay captains during the 2023 season.
- Graduate students **Garrett Degnon** (A) and **Jack Hawley** (M) and senior **Beaudan Szuluk** (D) will lead the team this season after a vote of their teammates during the fall.
- This is the first season any of the three has served as a captain.

### Poll Position

- Johns Hopkins is ranked 11th in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and 10th in the *Inside Lacrosse* Media Poll.
- Virginia is ranked first in this week's USILA Coaches Poll and the Cavaliers are also first in the *Inside Lacrosse* Media Poll.
- The Johns Hopkins Athletic Communications Office uses the USILA Poll when referencing JHU's official ranking at the time of a game.

### 500th Top 20 Ranking

- After being listed as receiving votes in the USILA Preseason Poll, the Blue Jays made the jump to ninth after starting the season at 2-0.
- The number nine ranking marked the 500th time in school history that JHU has appeared in the top 20 of the USILA Poll.
- The USILA Poll debuted in 1973 and this week's poll is the 522nd issued; JHU's #11 ranking this week means the Blue Jays have appeared in 503 of the 522 polls.

### The Schedule - Just Sayin'

- This week's game against top-ranked Virginia will mark Johns Hopkins' sixth game (in seven) against a team ranked in the top 20 in the nation at the time of the game.
- In all, 10 of JHU's 15 opponents on the 2023 schedule are ranked in the top 20 this week and six of those 10 are ranked in the top 10.

### Series History

- This week's game will be the 96th game in a series that dates to a 9-0 Johns Hopkins win in 1904.
- JHU leads the all-time series 61-33-1 and has won two of the last four and seven of the last 12 against the Cavaliers.
- Since 2012, the visiting team has won five of 10 games played on campus (one neutral site game in that time).

### Things to Know - Virginia

- Head coach **Lars Tiffany** brings the consensus top-ranked team in the nation to Homewood as his Cavaliers are 4-0 after dismantling Richmond, 25-8, at home on Saturday night.
- The Cavaliers will arrive at Homewood Field with the nation's best offense as UVA is averaging a staggering 21.00 goals and 34.5 points per game. UVA has scored at least 17 goals in each of its first four games and has twice reached the 25-goal mark in wins over Harvard and Richmond.
- Among the many eye-catching numbers the Cavaliers have rung up in the early season, perhaps the best is their .449 shooting percentage, which also leads the nation by a healthy margin.
- While the offense grabs the attention, don't sleep on the Cavalier defense, which averages 8.00 caused turnovers per game. As a team, UVA is its usual dominant self with the ball on the ground with 41.5 GBs/game.
- The Virginia defense allowed 34 goals in the first two games of the season (although many of those came after the outcome had long been decided), but has surrendered just 14 in the last two outings.
- This week's game at Johns Hopkins is the Cavaliers' only true road game before March 25 and one of just five road games they'll play in 2023.
- Since the start of the 2019 season, UVA is 71-26 with two national championships to its credit.

### Cavaliers to Watch

#### Payton Cormier (Sr. • A)

- One of the top pure goal scorers in the nation as he already counts 18 goals to his credit in just four games. Had a seven-goal performance in a 17-6 win over Ohio State and now boasts 125 goals and 31 assists in 44 career games played.

#### Petey LaSalla (Sr. • FO)

- Versatile faceoff specialist who is a threat to score every time. Has won 61-of-101 faceoffs (.604) with 30 ground balls and six goals this season. Already Virginia's career record-holder for faceoff wins (842) and attempts (1,397) and counts 33 goals and 11 assist to his credit as well.

#### Connor Shellenberger (Jr. • A)

- A leading Tewaaraton Award candidate as he ranks second on the team in scoring with seven goals and 15 assists for 22 points. Equally adept as a goal-scorer or feeder, has 76 goals and 101 assists for 177 points to his credit with 30+ goals and 40+ assists each of the last two years.

**Why The "V", Scott?**

Johns Hopkins junior defenseman **Scott Smith** is listed as "Scott V. Smith" in the team's statistical software, but why?

Smith is actually the third individual with the name "Scott Smith" to play lacrosse at Johns Hopkins. As such, in the historical statistical database, the statistics for the three individuals began merging when the Johns Hopkins Athletic Communications office began entering old statistics into the software.

The easiest way to ensure that the statistics are attributed to the correct person was to differentiate the three individuals in some way - and adding a middle initial was determined to be the answer.

**The "V" does not need to be used by members of the media when broadcasting a Blue Jay lacrosse game, nor to writers need to insert the "V" in anything they write about the current Scott Smith.**

The initial Scott Smith played on the 1976 Blue Jay lacrosse team, while the second Scott Smith was a goalie for the Blue Jays from 2003-05.

also on display in the 15-14 win over St. Joseph's as seven different players scored at least one goal and nine players had at least one point.

- The Blue Jays' balanced scoring sheet already includes 10 players with three or more goals and 11 with four or more points.
- Leading the way for the Jays thus far are **Jacob Angelus** (5g, 17a), **Garrett Degnon** (11g, 1a), **Brendan Grimes** (8g, 4a), **Matt Collison** (10g, 1a), **Dylan Bauer** (6g, 3a), **Johnathan Peshko** (7g, 1a) and **Russell Melendez** (5g, 3a), who all have at least eight points thus far.

### Six With 2+ ... It's Been a While

- Johns Hopkins' 15-goal outburst against St. Joseph's was fueled by a balanced scoring attack that featured six players with two or more goals in the game. **Garrett Degnon** led the way with four, while **Jacob Angelus**, **Dylan Bauer**, **Johnathan Peshko**, **Matt Collison** and **Cameron Chauvette** all scored twice.
- Prior to Saturday, the last time Johns Hopkins had six or more players score two or more goals in a game was on April 22, 2017, when exactly six did it in a 19-9 win over Michigan. Current Johns Hopkins offensive coordinator **John Crawley** started at midfield that day for the Blue Jays ... he scored one goal in the victory.

### Three With Hat Tricks Against Utah

- Johns Hopkins got three goals from three different players in the 12-8 win against Utah.
- Senior **Ian Krampf**, junior **Brendan Grimes** and freshman **Matt Collison** all scored three times against the Utes. This marked the first time Johns Hopkins has had three players with a hat trick in the same game since February 11, 2022, when **Joey Epstein** (6), **Garrett Degnon** (4) and **Grimes** (3) all had three+ goals at Towson.

### 18 Straight For Degnon

- Graduate student attackman **Garrett Degnon** scored four goals in the 15-14 win over St. Joseph's and now leads the team in goals (11) despite missing one game.
- The four-goal effort against the Hawks pushed his goal-scoring streak to 18 games dating back to February 19, 2022, when he scored once in an 11-10 win over Loyola.
- During his 18-game goal-scoring run, Degnon has scored 46 goals and has 13 multi-goal games and eight games with 3+ goals to his credit.
- Degnon's 18-game run is also the longest by a Johns Hopkins player since **Kyle Marr** scored at least one goal in 19 straight games from early in the 2018 season through early in the 2019 season.

### I'm Honored

- **Matt Collison** was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week after netting his first career hat trick in the recent 12-8 win over Utah and he followed that with a two-goal, one-assist effort in the 15-14 win over #13 St. Joe's.
- Collison now has 10 goals and one assist on the year, including nine goals and one assist in the last four games.

### In Case We Get To Overtime

- Johns Hopkins is 38-28 (.576) all-time in overtime. In their last overtime game, the Blue Jays topped Mount St. Mary's, 13-12, in what proved to be their last game of the 2020 season.
- Johns Hopkins has won eight of its last 12 overtime games.

### One-Goal Wonders

- Johns Hopkins is 135-87 (.608) all-time in one-goal games. The Blue Jays topped then 13th-ranked St. Joseph's, 15-14, in their last one-goal game (Mar. 4, 2023)
- The Blue Jays are 10-5 in their last 15 one-goal games.

### Playing for the Doyle Smith Cup

Johns Hopkins and Virginia will play for the Doyle Smith Cup for the 16th time this week. Virginia has won the cup 10 times in the first 15 years it has been presented. Six of the first 15 games played for the cup have gone to overtime and eight have been decided by one goal.

The Doyle Smith Cup is presented annually to the winner of the regular season game between Johns Hopkins and Virginia in honor of JHU graduate **Doyle Smith**.

Smith served as team manager and statistician for Johns Hopkins under head coach **Bob Scott** from 1963-1968. He graduated Phi Beta Kappa in 1966 and earned a masters degree in 1968. He received the H Club Cup for contributions to athletics at Johns Hopkins.

He worked as an assistant sports information director at the University of Virginia from 1968 until his retirement in 1999, serving as the lacrosse team's statistician for four head coaches--**Buddy Beardmore**, **Glenn Thiel**, **Jim Adams** and **Dom Starsia**.

On the national level, Smith is credited with the standardization of game statistics. He was the Information Director for the U.S. Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) and twice received their Man of the Year Award. The USILA media award bears his name. In 2000 he was elected to the US Lacrosse Hall of Fame as the first and only non-player and coach ever selected.

Smith passed away in June 2004 and the cup made its debut less than two years later.



• With four straight multi-goal games to his credit, he is the first Blue Jay freshman middle to score two or more goals in four straight games since **Paul Rabil** did it early in the 2015 season.

### Dunn Sparks Win Over #13 St. Joseph's

• Junior faceoff specialist **Tyler Dunn** turned in one of the best performances of his career in the 15-14 win over #13 St. Joseph's.

• Facing, statistically, the top faceoff team in the nation, Dunn won 18-of-32 faceoffs with 10 ground balls and one goal to help fuel the victory. The 10 GBs and 32 FO attempts tied his career high, while the 18 FO wins are the second best total of his career.

### Marcille With 15+ Saves in Three Straight

• Senior goalie **Tim Marcille** recorded his third consecutive game with 15+ saves in the 11-7 loss to 19th-ranked North Carolina as he posted 15 stops against the Tar Heels.

• The 15-save effort followed a 15-save performance in the season-opener against Jacksonville and a 16-save effort against third-ranked Georgetown.

• Marcille is the first Johns Hopkins goalie with three straight games of 15+ saves since **Brian Carcaterra** had 18 (Towson), 17 (Loyola) and 16 (Duke) in the final three games of the 1997 season. Marcille's streak of 15+ saves came to an end at Loyola, when he posted 13 stops in goal.

• Through games of March 4, Marcille currently ranks 14th in the nation in save percentage (.551) and 33rd in goals against average (11.60).

### Marcille From 55

• Senior goalie **Tim Marcille** etched his name in the Blue Jay record book in the recent game against North Carolina as he scored a second-quarter goal from 55 yards out with the Tar Heels in a 10-man ride and the net vacant.

• Marcille is believed to be the first Johns Hopkins goalie to score a goal since March 18, 1986, when **Stuart Jones** scored a third-quarter goal in a 16-10 win against Washington College.

• Marcille now has two points on the year as he had an assist in a 12-7 win over Jacksonville in the season opener.

### Versfeld Shines in Starting Debut

• Graduate student **Gib Versfeld** made the first start of his Blue Jay career in the 12-8 win over Utah and turned in a strong performance.

• Versfeld posted a career-high 15 saves, including eight in the third quarter and 12 in the second half, and added five ground balls to help fuel the victory.

• With his 15-save performance against Utah, Versfeld is just the second Johns Hopkins goalie in the last 25 years to post 15+ saves in his first career start. Prior to Versfeld, the last Blue Jay goalie with 15+ saves in his first start was **Ryan Darby** in 2019; prior to that, **Brian Carcaterra** (1997 vs. Princeton) had been the last JHU goalie to turn the trick.

### Offensive Notes of Interest

• Since the start of the 2022 season, the Blue Jays are 10-1 when they score 11 or more goals.

• In 24 quarters this season, the Blue Jays have scored two or more goals in 17 quarters and four or more in 10 quarters.

### Quite a Fall at Johns Hopkins

Johns Hopkins teams had quite a fall with six of the eight qualifying for the NCAA Tournament or Championships. At the conclusion of the fall season, Johns Hopkins led the Division III Learfield Directors' Cup Standings after amassing a record 500.5 points.

### Extra-Extra

- The Johns Hopkins extra-man unit has converted on 5-of-13 (.385) attempts this season, but that hardly tells the story.
- After going 0-for-7 in the first four games of the season, the Blue Jays have converted on 5-of-6 chances in the last two games.

### Defensive Notes of Interest

- JHU allowed just 12 extra-man goals (on 35 chances) in 2022. The 12 EMO goals allowed are the fewest by a Blue Jay team since 2016, when Hopkins allowed just 11 (of 33 chances).
- Through six games this season, the opposition has cashed in on 5-of-17 (.294) chances on the year.
- Johns Hopkins was 6-0 last season and is 11-0 under head coach **Peter Milliman** and defensive coordinator **Jamison Koesterer** when holding the opposition to 10 goals or less.

### Pole Goals

- Johns Hopkins got a pair of goals from its long sticks in the win at Jacksonville as graduate student **Alex Mazzone** and junior **Patrick Deans** both scored in transition.
- Mazzone's goal, which gave JHU an early 2-1 lead, was his first as a Blue Jay and the ninth of his career, while Deans' goal was the first of his career.

- JHU added a third pole-goal in the game at Loyola as **Hunter Jaronski** traded in his short stick in the fourth quarter and scored in transition with a pole.
- Last season, the Blue Jays got 14 goals and eight assists for 22 points from non-offensive players and already have five goals and three assists through six games this season.

### The Win vs. #3 Georgetown

- The recent 13-12 win over third-ranked Georgetown marked the highest-ranked team Johns Hopkins has beaten since the Blue Jays topped then second-ranked Maryland, 16-11, on April 27, 2019.
- The win against the Hoyas was also Hopkins' first win over a top five team since May 2, 2019, when the Blue Jays topped then fifth-ranked Maryland, 12-7, in the B1G Semifinals.
- Prior to the win against the third-ranked Hoyas, Johns Hopkins' last win against a top 10 team came on May 6, 2021 when the Blue Jays topped then sixth-ranked Rutgers, 12-10, in the B1G Semifinals.

### Roster Breakdown

- The Blue Jays' 50-man roster includes five graduate students, nine seniors, 15 juniors, 10 sophomores and 11 freshmen.
- Johns Hopkins' 2023 roster includes players from 14 different states and nine players from Canada.
- By state, the Blue Jays hail from New York (12), Maryland (8), Pennsylvania (4), New Jersey (3), Virginia (3), Connecticut (2), Massachusetts (1), Florida (1), Ohio (1), Georgia (1), Delaware (1), Utah (1), Texas (1), Michigan (1).
- In addition to the 14 states represented and the nine players who hail from Canada, the roster also features one player from the Kahn-awake Mohawk Territory, which is located on the south shore of the Saint Lawrence River in Quebec, Canada.

### McDonald Wearing #19

The number 19 was assigned to **Jeremy Huber** in the fall of 2014; less than two weeks prior to the start of what would have been Huber's freshman year in 2015, he passed away suddenly from complications from pneumonia. Hopkins kept Huber on its roster through the 2018 season, when he would have been a senior, and nobody else wore #19 from 2015-18.

After the 2018 season ended, the coaching staff met with members of the senior class (Huber's classmates) and discussed issuing the number to a returning player in 2019 who best exemplified Huber. By a vote of the graduating seniors in 2018, **Robert Kuhn** was selected to be the first player to wear #19 after Huber. **Forry Smith** was then chosen by the 2019 seniors to wear #19 in 2020.

Head coach **Peter Milliman** and his staff worked closely with the Huber family and members of Jeremy's class to chart a course for the issuing of #19 moving forward. Those three groups determined that a freshman would be selected annually to wear the number; for the 2023 season, midfielder **Eric McDonald** was selected and will join Kuhn, Smith and Stu Phillips (2022) on the list of individuals who have worn the #19 since Huber's passing.





Lacrosse's Winningest Program

- Johns Hopkins enters this week's game with an all-time record of 1,008-366-15 to rank as the all-time winningest program in college lacrosse history.
- With the win against Loyola on February 19, 2022, Johns Hopkins became the first men's college lacrosse program to reach 1,000 all-time wins.
- JHU is one of just seven schools with 700+ victories, one of just five with 800+ wins and one of two that has won 900 or more games.

- Johns Hopkins set a program single-season record in 2022 as the Blue Jays averaged 7.63 caused turnovers per game. This came one year after the Blue Jays had set a record by averaging 6.92 CTs per game in 2021.
- Among returning players, senior **Beaudan Szuluk** (21 CTs) and juniors **Scott Smith** (18) and **Brett Martin** (11) all totaled more than 10 caused turnovers last season, while graduate transfer **Alex Mazzone** had 20 CTs at Georgetown in 2022.

Strength of Schedule

- The Blue Jays' 15 regular season opponents combined to post a 160-82 (.661) record in 2022 with JHU's 10 non-conference opponents rolling up a 107-53 (.669) record. In addition, seven of the 15 qualified for the NCAA Tournament with two of those teams advancing to championship weekend.

- Named the 23rd head coach in Johns Hopkins history on April 27, 2020.

Team showed great progress through the season and, as the number six seed, made a run to the Big Ten Tournament title game to become the first number six seed in Division I college lacrosse history to advance to a league championship game.
- In 10th season as a head coach at the collegiate level with four seasons at Pfeiffer (2009-12) and three seasons at Cornell (2018-20).
- One of three active Big Ten head coaches with previous head coaching experience in the Ivy League as he joins Penn State's Jeff Tambroni (Cornell) and Maryland's John Tillman (Harvard).
- Has a career coaching record of 80-56 (.588), including a 28-10 mark at Cornell.
- Led Cornell to the 2018 Ivy League Tournament title and a trip to the NCAA Quarterfinals that year.

- Johns Hopkins leads the all-time series, 61-33-1. The teams have met every year since 1948.
- Johns Hopkins and Virginia have met 11 times since 2002 with one of the two ranked number one in the nation (including this season).
- The home team has won 14 of the last 23 meetings played at a campus site.
- JHU has won seven of the last 12 meetings.
- The last 10 meetings at Johns Hopkins have been decided by a total of just 16 goals. Included are seven, one-goal games and a pair of two-goal games.
- Virginia has won 12 of last 17 games between the two teams in Charlottesville. Prior to the 11-10 win in overtime in 2012, JHU's last win at UVA came in 1998 ... Hopkins has since won three more times at UVA (2014 & 2015 NCAA, 2018).
- Virginia defeated Johns Hopkins, 9-8, in four overtimes in 2001. That game ranks as the longest in Johns Hopkins history.
- 12 of the last 28 games between the two teams have been decided by one goal. In all there have been 21 one-goal games between the Blue Jays and the Cavaliers.
- Johns Hopkins and Virginia have met 16 times in the NCAA Tournament with the Blue Jays winning 10 of the 16. Three of the meetings have come in the national championship game with UVA grabbing NCAA titles in 1972 and 2003 and JHU winning in 1980.
- The 16 games JHU and UVA have played in the NCAAAs are the most any two teams have met in tournament history.
