OPENING DRAW

GAME OVERVIEW

- For the fourth time in the last five weeks, No. 3 Virginia (8-2, 2-1 ACC) will challenge a top-5 opponent in No. 2 Duke (10-2, 3-1) on Saturday (April 15) in Durham, North Carolina. The two teams previously went head-to-head at Klöckner Stadium on March 31 with Blue Devils getting the best of UVA, 16-14.
- Opening faceoff from Koskinen Stadium is set for noon as Chris Cotter (play-by-play) and Paul Carcaterra (analyst) will have the call on ACC Network.

LAST TIME OUT

- In wet and rainy conditions, the Cavaliers won their fourth game of the season away from Klöckner Stadium last Friday (April 7) at then-No. 10 North Carolina by a final score of 19-12.
- The win marked UVA's fifth over the Tar Heels in the series and fifth consecutive at Dorrance Field. UNC entered
 the game as the nation's No. 3 scoring defense. UVA's 19 goals marked the most by a UNC opponent in 2023.
- The Cavaliers dominated the ground ball game in Chapel Hill, 42-28.
- Payton Cormier scored a game-high five goals on eight shots and added two assists. Petey LaSalla (17-33 F0) finished at least 50 percent at the faceoff X for the ninth time this season and his pair of goals marked his first points in the Cavaliers' last six games. Grayson Sallade recorded four ground balls, two caused turnovers and one assist in the win.

SERIES HISTORY

- Virginia leads the all-time series over the Blue Devils, 50-37, but Duke leads the series in Durham, 22-19, and has won 14 of the last 15 meetings overall.
 The last time the two teams met was earlier this season on March 31, when Duke's Brennan O'Neill (6g, 3a) tied
- his career high of nine points in the Blue Devils' 16-14 victory at Klöckner Stadium over then-No. 1 Virginia.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

With 141 career goals, **Payton Cormier** needs just three goals to pass Michael Watson (142) and Matt Moore (143) on UVA's all-time career goals list.

Virginia's seven NCAA titles are third most by any program since the NCAA Tournament's inception in 1971.

The Cavaliers returned nine starters this season. UVA's only departure from last year's starting lineup was attackman Matt Moore, who was drafted No. 4 overall in the 2022 PLL Draft by the Archers.

THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

MORE ON THE DUKE SERIES

- The Cavaliers have dropped their last 17 regular-season meetings against Duke.
 UVA's last regular-season win over the Blue Devils was a 13-4 victory on April 17, 2004.
- · Virginia's last win in Durham was an 11-8 victory on April 12, 2003.
- UVA and Duke have different all-time series records due to the fluidity of when a program was a "varsity" sport up until the conclusion of WWII. UVA lists its "varsity only" record against Duke above.

VIRGINIA IN THE POLLS

- At No. 3 in this week's USILA Coaches poll, Virginia has been ranked in the top 5 of the poll in 323 weeks all-time, including all 10 polls in 2023.
- · UVA has been ranked No. 1 in the nation in 70 all-time polls.
- · Virginia has been ranked in 514 polls all-time.
- The USILA Poll began in 1973 and there have been 535 polls all-time.
- From 1973-89, the USILA ranked the top-15 teams before expanding the poll to 20 teams for the 1990 season.

CAVALIERS AMONG THE NATION'S STATISTICAL LEADERS

- Virginia currently leads the nation in assists (12.20/gm), ground balls (41.40/gm), points (30.40/gm), scoring offense (18.20/gm) and shot percentage (.388).
 The Cavaliers are third in man-up offense (.607), fourth in scoring margin (5.70/gm), fifth in win percentage (.800), ninth in clearing percentage (.906) and 10th in turnovers (14.90/gm).
- Connor Shellenberger leads the nation in assists (3.78/gm) and is fifth in points (5.33/gm). Payton Cormier is second in goals (4.25/gm), fourth in points (5.50/gm) and eighth in shot percentage (.534). Xander Dickson is third in goals (3.90/gm), 15th in points (4.90/gm) and second in shot percentage (.534). Cade Saustad is eighth in caused turnovers (2.00/gm) and Petey LaSalla is seventh in ground balls (9.00/gm).
- UVA is the only program in the nation with three players (Shellenberger, Cormier & Dickson) averaging at least 4.90 points per game.

THE CAVALIERS AT KLÖCKNER STADIUM

- With its pair of home losses to No. 3 Maryland (March 18) and Duke (March 31), UVA dropped back-to-back games held at Klöckner Stadium for the first time under head coach Lars Tiffany. The last time the Cavaliers suffered back-to-back home losses was in 2016.
- Virginia owns a 170-45 (.791) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 4-2 record in 2023.
- $\cdot\,$ Virginia is 44-13 (.772) all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach Lars Tiffany.
- The Cavaliers have won 20 of their last 25 games played at the historic edifice and boast an average margin of victory of 5.68 goals in such contests.
- \cdot UVA is also 13-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in NCAA Tournament games.
- · Lacrosse debuted in Klöckner Stadium in 1993.

ON THE HORIZON

- The Cavaliers return to Klöckner Stadium next Saturday (April 22) to host Syracuse.
- · Opening faceoff is set for 2 p.m. on ESPNU.

CONNOR SHELLENBERGER IS ELITE

- Connor Shellenberger, who is in his third season at UVA, is arguably the mostaccomplished active player in college lacrosse.
- In addition to being a two-time USILA first team All-American (2021-22),
- Shellenberger became UVA's 11th Tewaaraton Award finalist last season.
- Shellenberger currently leads all active Division-I players in career assists (120), is second in assists per game (2.79) and third in points per game (4.72).
- This year, Shellenberger was crowned a first team preseason All-American by the USILA, Inside Lacrosse and USA Lacrosse Magazine, and the top returning player in 2023 by Inside Lacrosse.
- This offseason, Shellenberger was invited to try out for a spot on the U.S. National Team for the 2023 World Championships.
- \cdot In 2022, he led UVA in points (76) and assists (44) and finished second in goals (32).
- In 2021, Shellenberger was sensational in the NCAA Tournament, guiding the Hoos to the program's seventh NCAA championship and was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player.
- In 43 career appearances, Shellenberger has posted at least one point in 42 contests and has recorded multiple assists in 35 career games, including 25 games with at least three assists.
- Shellenberger has tallied a career-best 10 points on two occasions this season: vs. then-No. 18 Harvard (3g, 7a) and vs. Towson (4g, 6a).

MORE ON VIRGINIA AND THE TEWAARATON AWARD

- In addition to Shellenberger in 2022, UVA's other Tewaaraton Award finalists include: Steele Stanwick (2011-12), Ken Clausen (2010), Danny Glading (2009), Ben Rubeor (2007-08), Kyle Dixon (2006), Matt Ward (2006), Chris Rotelli (2003) and Conor Gill (2002).
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Stanwick (2011), Ward (2006) and Rotelli (2003) were recipients of the award.
- Virginia, Maryland and Syracuse are the only schools in the nation to have three Tewaaraton Award winners. Only Duke (13) and Syracuse (12) have had more finalists than UVA (11).

GOING STREAKING

- Newcomer **Thomas McConvey**, a transfer in the midfield from the University of Vermont, is currently riding a 62-game point streak, which began on Feb. 1, 2019.
- · McConvey has registered at least one point in every game of his career.
- · His 62-game point streak leads the nation among all active players.
- · During his streak, McConvey has amassed 147 goals and 63 assists.
- Also riding a substantial point streak is UVA attackman Payton Cormier, who has recorded at least one point in his last 37 games.
- Cormier's 37-game point streak is currently the seventh longest in the nation.
 During his streak, which began on March 6, 2021, Cormier has registered 115 goals and 24 assists.

THOMAS McCONVEY: ONE OF THE NATION'S MOST ELITE MIDFIELDERS

- Thomas McConvey (147-63-210) is currently tied for second among all active Division-I players in career goals and fifth in points.
- As of April 10, McConvey is the only active Division I midfielder with at leat 147 career goals.
- Against then-No. 3 Maryland, McConvey registered a season-high five points on four goals and one assist. His fourth goal of the day tied the score [13-13] with 1:18 left in regulation to ultimately force overtime.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- Since 2009, UVA has finished in the top 3 nationally in ground balls per game in all but one season, and led the nation in ground balls per game eight times.
- UVA is the only school to finish in the top 5 nationally in ground balls per game 13 times over the last 14 seasons.
- The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's Brown team.
- Virginia has led the ground ball battle in all **10** games this year and its season high in ground balls is 53 vs. Richmond (March 4).

PETEY LASALLA: THE NATION'S DEADLIEST FACEOFF SPECIALIST

- With 949 career faceoff wins, Petey LaSalla is currently second among all active Division-I players. He also ranks in the top-10 all-time in the NCAA Division I record book in both faceoffs won and faceoffs taken.
- LaSalla is the only player in all of college lacrosse with at least 949 career wins at the center-X and 35 career goals.
- With 480 career ground balls, LaSalla is currently third among all active Division I players.
- In addition to his 35 career goals, LaSalla has dished out 11 career assists, making him the only player in the nation with at least 949 career faceoff victories and 46 career points.
- \cdot Virginia is 23-3 (.885) all-time when LaSalla scores a goal, including 4-0 in 2023, and 28-5 (.848) all-time when registering at least one point.
- LaSalla recorded two goals in UVA's first three games of 2023 and two at then-No. 10 North Carolina (April 7).
- In Virginia's ten contests so far this season, LaSalla has recorded at least a 50 percent faceoff win percentage in nine games.
- · LaSalla set a career high with three points on two goals and one assist in Virginia's ACC-championship clinching game at Syracuse last season.
- · LaSalla won the first eight faceoffs of the game in UVA's 19-8 rout over Johns Hopkins (March 5, 2022), and finished the contest 9-of-10, setting his single-game career high in faceoff win percentage. LaSalla tied that career best mark (9-of-10) at Richmond (April 2, 2022) before exiting the game with an upper-extremity injury.

MATTHEW NUNES: UVA'S FRESHMAN SAVES LEADER

Lars Tiffany was named Virginia's 17th head coach on June 21, 2016. He is currently in his seventh season at UVA and 19th season overall as head coach. Tiffany is Virginia's only head coach to win back-to-back national championships (2019 & 2021). Tiffany begins the 2023 season with 67 wins as UVA head coach, good for No. 3 all-time in program history behind only Jim "Ace" Adams (137) and Dom Starsia (274).

- It marked the second time that Shellenberger and Kastner swept ACC weekly honors for UVA with first coming in 2021 after the Cavaliers' win over Johns Hopkins.
- Shellenberger's five assists against the Irish are the most by a Notre Dame individual opponent in Arlotta Stadium history.
 Kastner held Notre Dame star attackman Pat Kavanagh, who entered the game fifth

 in the nation in points per game, to just two goals and two assists in addition to a
 pair of turnovers. Kastner anchored a UVA defense that held Irish offense, which
 entered the game second in the country in scoring, to their lowest goal total in a
 single game since the Cavaliers defeated Notre Dame 12-8 at Klöckner Stadium
 last year.

DICKSON GARNERS ACC WEEKLY HONORS

- For his performance at then-No. 11 Johns Hopkins and against Towson, **Xander Dickson** was named the ACC's Offensive Player of the Week for games played March 6-12, the ACC announced on March 14
- Dickson tallied a team-best 10 goals, scoring on 62.5 percent of his shots, and added two assists in UVA's pair of wins on the week.
- Dickson's six goals at Hopkins marked his second straight outing with six scores, while his four goals and two assists against Towson marked his third consecutive game with six points.

CORMIER, SAUSTAD EARN ACC PLAYER-OF-THE-WEEK HONORS

- For their performance against No. 9 Ohio State, Payton Cormier and Cade Saustad earned ACC player-of-the-week honors for games played Feb. 20-26, the conference office announced Feb 28.
- Cormier was named ACC Offensive Player of the Week after scoring a career-high seven goals against the Buckeyes. Cormier's seven goals also tied for No. 2 in UVA single-game history and tied for the most by an ACC player in a single game this
- Saustad recorded a career-high four caused turnovers and added a pair of ground balls. In addition to holding the Buckeyes to their lowest goal total this season, Saustad limited 2022 second team All-American Jack Myers to just two goals on 10 shots

SHELLENBERGER, LASALLA EARN ACC WEEKLY HONORS

- For their performance against then-No. 18 Harvard, Connor Shellenberger and Petey
 LaSalla were named the ACC's Co-Offensive Player of the Week and Co-Defensive
 Player of the Week, respectively, for games played Feb. 13-19, the conference office
 announced Feb. 21.
- Shellenberger (3g, 7a) recorded a career-high 10 points, and his seven assists are also a career best. At the time, his 10 points tied for the most nationally by an individual in a single game this season and most by an ACC player this year. Shellenberger's 10-point performance is also tied for eighth all-time in program history and marks just the 17th occasion that a UVA player has registered 10 points
- In a game that set the NCAA record for most combined faceoffs (49), LaSalla dominated the center X, finishing 18-for-29 (.621) against the Crimson. LaSalla also tallied a game-high 10 ground balls and ripped two goals off faceoff wins. LaSalla's second goal of the evening proved to be the game-winning goal in what was one of the highest-scoring games in NCAA men's lacrosse history.

SALLADE NAMED ACC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- With three ground balls and two caused turnovers in UVA's season opener against Michigan, Grayson Sallade was named the ACC's Defensive Player of the Week on Feb. 14.
- · The weekly award was Sallade's first of his career.
- Sallade and the UVA defense held the Wolverines to just one goal in the fourth quarter and scoreless on all four of their extra-man opportunities.
- · As a member of Virginia's faceoff unit, Sallade helped the Cavaliers finish 18-for-32 at the center X.

2022 SEASON RECAP

- Virginia finished its 2022 season with an overall record of 12-4, marking the Cavaliers' sixth consecutive winning season.
- UVA earned a share of the program's $19^{\rm th}$ ACC title, alongside Notre Dame, after finishing with a 5-1 record in
- · league play.
- Connor Shellenberger was named one of five Tewaaraton Finalists, UVA's 11th finalist in program history.
- Cole Kastner (Defensive Player of the Year) and Matthew Nunes (Freshman of the Year) earned ACC postseason honors.
- Payton Cormier (50g) became UVA's fifth-ever 50-goal scorer in a single season and first since Ian Laviano in 2019.

REIGNING ACC CHAMPIONS

- With its 21-15 win at Syracuse last season, Virginia earned a share of its 19th ACC championship, including two (2019 & 2022) under Lars Tiffany.
- The Cavaliers won 11 titles (1962, 1964, 1969, 1970, 1971, 1975, 1980, 1983, 1984, 1985 and 1986) prior to the ACC establishing a tournament from 1989-2019 to determine the champion.
- Virginia has won seven ACC Tournament championships: 1997, 1999, 2000, 2003, 2006, 2010 and 2019.
- In the last ACC Tournament, which was held in 2019 at Klöckner Stadium, UVA defeated Notre Dame 10-4 in the championship game.
- From 1989-2019, Virginia won 14 regular-season titles (1990, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2006, 2009, 2010, 2012 and 2019), more than any other ACC school.

LAST SEASON, VIRGINIA WAS UNDEFEATED WHEN...

- In 2022, the Cavaliers finished 12-0 when leading their opponents after three quarters.
- UVA combined to out-score its opponents 203-138 in the first three periods of 2022, which is an average lead of 4.1 goals entering the fourth period.
- Last season, the Cavaliers went 10-0 when leading at halftime and 1-0 when tied at the half
- In 2022, Virginia was 12-0 when dishing out more assists than its opponent. In the Cavaliers' 12 wins last season, UVA had 118 assists compared to its opponents' 55.
