### THE GAME

- Another weekend, another road trip for the Orange as Syracuse, now ranked 13th in the USILA Coaches Poll, heads for the Blue Ridge Mountains to take on another longtime rival, third-ranked Virginia.  
 - Opening faceoff is set for 2 p.m. at Klöckner Stadium in Charlottesville, Virginia, the lone regular season meeting between 'Cuse and Virginia this season.  
 - Chris Cotter and Paul Carcaterra '97 will have the call on ESPNU, the third-straight TV game for the Orange.  
 - Tim Leonard '20 (PxP) and Kyle Fetterly '09 (analyst) will broadcast the action on TK99/105, Cuse.com, The Varsity App and the TuneIn App, while WAER will also carry the game.

### ROADS? WHERE WE'RE GOING WE'LL NEED PLENTY OF ROADS

- Like Willie Nelson said, we're on the road again as Syracuse continues its four-game road swing to round out the 2023 regular season. Saturday will be the second of three true road games in this set, with the outlier last weekend's game in Olney, Maryland against No. 12 North Carolina.  
 - This stretch is a gauntlet, featuring four teams in the top 15 of the USILA Coaches Poll: then-No. 14 Princeton, then-No. 12 North Carolina, Virginia, currently ranked third by the Coaches, and rounding out next weekend at No. 2 Duke.  
 - Syracuse has played four games away from the JMA Wireless Dome this season, currently holding a 3-1 record outside of Central New York this year. Syracuse dropped a close contest at No. 4 Maryland before later doubling Hofstra 16-8. The last two games have been ranked wins over No. 14 Princeton (16-13) and No. 12 North Carolina (15-14).  
 - The Orange have not played four regular season games away from home since the 2014 campaign. 'Cuse split those four games 2-2, falling at No. 4 Virginia and No. 3 Duke. The middle two games saw the Orange pick off No. 19 St. John's and No. 2 Johns Hopkins at Historic Homewood Field. Syracuse and the Red Storm met in Kennesaw, Georgia for the Cobb County Classic.

### THE VIRGINIA SERIES

- Saturday sees longtime rivals Syracuse and Virginia meet for the 41st time, and like many series for the Orange, this one predates World War II.  
 - Deadlocked at 20-20-0 in series history, 'Cuse and Virginia began playing against one another back in 1938, a 13-4 win for Syracuse down in the Blue Ridge Mountains.  
 - The sides met sporadically after that initial contest, but have squared off at least once every year since 1994 (sans 2020, though a league game was scheduled).  
 - Syracuse is 6-4 against Virginia in ACC games, and holds a 6-5 record since joining the ACC for the 2014 campaign.  
 - Virginia won both contests last season, clipping the Orange 20-11 in Charlottesville before edging Syracuse 21-15 in the JMA Wireless Dome in late April.  
 - The Orange are looking for their first win at Klöckner since knocking off the 'Hoos 13-11 on April 24, 2021.  
 - Syracuse and Virginia have met twice in each of the previous two regular seasons, splitting those four games as the Orange won both in 2021 and the Cavaliers taking both in 2022.

### ALL-TIME VERSUS #3

- Saturday will be the 28th time Syracuse faces a team ranked third in that week's USILA Coaches' Poll, and second time this season.  
 - The Orange hold a 15-12 record against third-ranked foes, including an even 2-2 mark for ACC contests.  
 - Syracuse dropped a decision against third-ranked Notre Dame earlier this season at home.  
 - 'Cuse is looking for its first road win over a third-ranked team since the 13th-ranked Orange nipped No. 3 Duke 15-14 on March 24, 2013 in Durham.  
 - Syracuse is 2-3 all-time against Virginia when the Cavaliers occupy the number three spot in the Coaches' Poll. The Orange won the last such show down 20-10 on February 27, 2021.  
 - Saturday's tilt will be the first time Syracuse takes on a third-ranked Virginia team in Charlottesville. Two of the previous meetings have been in Syracuse, while three other meetings have been neutral site in Newark, Delaware, Piscataway, New Jersey and Baltimore, Maryland.  
 - 'Cuse has won two of its last three against third-ranked foes.

### WHEN THE LIGHTS GO DOWN

- April 1 marked the final home game of the 2023 regular season. Despite the setback, the Orange have had lots of success in the final home game of the regular season since moving to the Dome.  
 - All-time since 1981, Syracuse is now 35-7 in the regular season home finale, including wins in 21 straight years from 1982 through 2002. Syracuse is a clean 9-0 against UMass in the regular season home finale, the most common foe.

## LAST TIME THEY MET

## #5 Virginia 21, Syracuse 15

April 25, 2022 | Syracuse, N.Y. | JMA Wireless Dome

The Orange scored first, but No. 5 Virginia quickly regained the lead and never trailed again, defeating Syracuse 21-15 on Saturday.

Jackson Birtwistle's five goals in his first collegiate start led the way offensively, while senior Brendan Curry notched six points on two goals and four assists. Tucker Dordevic also added a hattrick, while Owen Seebold scored twice as well.

Jakob Phaup bounced back from an earlier season defeat at the X against Petey LaSalla by winning 20-of-39 faceoffs for the Orange on Saturday. His 39 faceoff attempts were a program record and he has now moved into sixth in program history for most wins in a season (222).

Dordevic scored just 1:06 into action to open the scoring, but a 5-0 Cavalier run had stretched their lead to four by seven minutes into action.

Birtwistle (2), Jacob Buttermore and Dordevic combined to score four of the next five to pull 'Cuse back within one at 6-5, but that's as close as they'd get.

Virginia effectively put the game away early in the third quarter with a six-goal run that extended its lead to double digits. While the Orange continued to fight, getting goals from Carter Rice (first collegiate) and Brandon Aviles off faceoff play and goals from Curry and Seebold in the fourth, Syracuse never got closer than six in the final frame.

'Cuse will conclude the 2022 season on Sunday, May 1 when Notre Dame visits the Dome. It'll be Senior Day, with 20 fourth, fifth and sixth-year players honored prior to the Noon faceoff.

## THE KRAUS SIMMONS TROPHY

- The Kraus-Simmons Trophy has been presented to the victor in this annual showdown every year since 1986. The trophy is named for legendary Orange head coach Roy Simmons Sr., who coached at SU from 1931-70 and won 253 career games, and Babe Kraus who compiled 208 victories at Hobart. After Simmons Sr. his son Roy Simmons Jr. led the program from 1971-1998 winning six NCAA Championships. Roy Simmons III remained on staff as director of operations through last spring. A member of the three generations of the Simmons family was part of the program for 92 consecutive seasons (94 in total counting Simmons Sr.'s playing days) was part of 841 victories - more than all-but three programs in NCAA Division I history.

- Syracuse has won 33 of the 36 meetings since the trophy has been awarded, including 19 in a row from 1987 to 2005. The Statesmen gained possession of the trophy in 1986, 2006 and 2013. Otherwise it has resided in Syracuse.

- The Orange retained the trophy this year with a convincing 18-7 win to round out March at the JMA Dome.

- Due to space limitations on the prior trophy, in 2019 a new base addition was installed and the trophy was updated. There are now commemorative inscriptions for Kraus and Simmons on each side, with additional space to list the winners. The cup at the top remains the original.

## STATE CHAMPS

- The Orange won their final game of four in-state showdowns this on Saturday: UAlbany (W, 20-7), followed by three straight against Hofstra (W, 16-8), St. Bonaventure (W, 22-6) and Hobart (W, 18-7).

- Historically, Syracuse has dominated New York. Owing a combined 424-164-10 record against teams from the Empire State.

- Syracuse had five games scheduled against in-state competition last season, going 2-3, including a 16-15 overtime setback against No. 4 Cornell, the eventual NCAA Division I runner up.

- With the 18-7 win over Hobart on Saturday, the Orange improved to 4-0 against the Empire State this season.

## SMOTHERED AND COVERED

- The Orange held opponents to fewer than 10 goals in the five of the nine home games in 2023.

- Syracuse allowed just five goals in the opener against Vermont before holding another potent offense in UAlbany to just seven. Syracuse then limited Holy Cross to just six 48 hours later. On Tuesday, the Orange held St. Bonaventure to six goals, allowing three in each half including a shutout third quarter.

- At the end of March, Syracuse held Hobart to just seven goals and one assist for a scant eight points, the fourth time this season Syracuse has held opponents to single digit POINTS, let alone goals.

## VERSUS THE ACC

- Saturday will be the 104th time the Orange lineup against a program currently aligned with the ACC.

- Syracuse is 53-50 all-time against the combination of Duke, North Carolina, Notre Dame, and Virginia.

- The Orange have at least a .500 record against all four other ACC schools.

- Since joining the ACC in 2014, Syracuse is 20-21 in league games. (SU was 0-1 vs. Maryland in the ACC).

## A WIN ON SATURDAY WOULD...

- End a two-game drought against the Cavaliers.

- Mark the third-straight win over a ranked opponent, the first time since the 2019 campaign Syracuse win three straight over top 20 opponents.

- Win back-to-back ACC games in the same season for the first time since going 4-0 in the league in 2018.

- Be the program's 937th all-time victory, second most for a program behind Johns Hopkins.

- Improve Syracuse to 21-20-0 all-time against Virginia since the series began in 1938.

- See 'Cuse win back-to-back true road games for the time since winning three in a row in April 2019 at Hobart, at No. 18 UNC, and at Navy.

- Log two ACC wins in the same season for first time since the 2021 campaign (2-4).

## KEEPING IT 100

- Graduate transfer Cole Kirst hit a milestone against Hobart, scoring the 100th point of his career, scoring with 27 seconds left in the first quarter.
- The BDJ student carries a 2:1 ratio of goals and assists into Saturday's game, notching 76 goals and 36 assists for 112 points in his career.
- Kirst averages nearly two points per game (1.87).
- The Bernardsville, New Jersey native has 31 points as a member of the Orange, scoring 21 goals with 10 assists, including 17 points across the last five games.

## NEARING THE CENTURY MARK

- Throughout his unique career, one constant remains for redshirt sophomore attackman Owen Hiltz: Points.
- The Peterborough, Ontario product is riding a 26-game point streak into Saturday, racking 51 goals and 43 assists in that span.
- He has scored in every game he has played in, made more impressive by gapping the 2022 season with an upper body injury.
- Hiltz is just six points away from hitting the century mark behind the aforementioned 51 goals and 43 assists.
- The attackman is currently ranked 32nd among active Division I players in career points per game (3.62) and 24th in assists per game (1.65).
- At that pace and with at least two games left, Hiltz could hit 100 career points in just two seasons.
- Hiltz could join rarified air if he hits the century mark in his first two seasons at 'Cuse; of the 17 players in the 200-point club, nine hit 100 points in their first two seasons in Central New York (M. Powell 154, C. Powell 126, R. Powell 106, O'Hara 116, Nelson 186, Zulberti 120, Marechek 120, G. Gait 116, Springer 121).

## BRINGING POWER TO THE MAN-UP

- Syracuse has one of the most potent man-up units in Division I, punishing opponents at a 57.4 percent clip this season, fourth-best in the country but one of just two teams with at least 60 chances through April 16.
- The three teams with better percentages, Georgetown (.706), Notre Dame (.609) and Boston University (.581) and have a COMBINED 71 chances on the man-up ('Cuse has 61).
- The Orange have hit on 35 of their 61 chances, the only Division I team to convert at least 30 power play goals. The second-closest, Quinnipiac, has hit 23-for-46.
- Joey Spallina has been the catalyst on the power play for Syracuse with a Division I-best 10 goals.
- Spallina is the first Orange player to hit for double digit man up goals in a single season since Dylan Donahue went for 15 during the 2015 campaign.
- Six different Orange players have scored at least two man-up goals this season. Jackson Birtwistle has the second-most with nine, the second-most across the Division I landscape.
- In 2022, just six of the 73 NCAA Division I programs scored at least 25 man-up goals. Villanova led the country in 2022 with 30.

## LEAGUE OPENERS

- Syracuse is now in its 10th men's lacrosse season as a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference.
- The Orange did not play any ACC games in 2020 before the pandemic shuttered the season.
- Since joining the ACC in 2014, the Orange are 8-4 all-time in the first ACC game of the year.
- Syracuse holds a 3-3 record when the first ACC game of the year is at home.
- The Orange are 5-4 in their first home ACC game of the season, including a 1-1 mark under head coach Gary Gait after last weekend's loss against North Carolina.
- Syracuse was a clean 4-0 in BIG EAST openers during its brief time in the conference. The Orange had just one BIG EAST game at home to begin the conference calendar, a 15-12 win for No. 2 Syracuse over No. 12 Georgetown.
- The Orange went 4-0 in their first home BIG EAST game of the season, regardless of when that happened (for example, Syracuse's first home BIG EAST game in 2011 was on April 30 after one true road game and three neutrals).

## ORANGE IN BOUNCE-BACK GAMES

- After the win over No. 14 Princeton, the Orange are 72-34 in games following a loss during a season (this record does not include the season opener following season-ending losses) in their last 106 tries.
- Since the team won its first NCAA Championship in 1983, 'Cuse has only had 17 "losing streaks" (two or more consecutive losses) in 40 seasons.

## ORANGE OPENERS

- Syracuse holds an all-time record of 83-21 in season openers after topping Vermont 7-5 in the season debut.
- Last spring, the Orange opened with a 28-5 season-opening win over Holy Cross.
- Since the JMA Dome opened in 1980, Syracuse is 28-3 in season openers at home.
- Head coach Gary Gait is a clean 16-0 in season openers, including a 14-0 mark as the head coach of the Orange women's program and a 2-0 record on the men's side as a head coach.

## TEN BELOW

- Syracuse has won 73-straight games when holding opponents to under 10 goals in a game.
- 53 of those 73 games have come since the start of the 2015 season, including a high of 11 in 2016.
- The last time Syracuse failed to win when keeping its foe to single digits was on April 28, 2012, when the Orange fell at Notre Dame, 8-6.
- The Orange are 6-0 this season when holding opponents to less than 10 goals.

## MARK ADDED TO WATCH LIST

- After a stellar start to the season, senior netminder Will Mark has been added to the Tewaaron Trophy Watch List.  
- Mark is tied for fourth in Division I with 182 total saves and is sixth in saves per game (14.00).  
- The Danville, California native is fourth nationally in save percentage (.569) and has made at least 13 saves in eight of the 13 games this season, including 22 against No. 5 Duke, staring down 66 total shots from the Blue Devils.  
- Mark joins teammate Owen Hiltz on the Tewaaron Trophy Watch List. Hiltz was named on the initial list.

## A GAUNTLET OF A SCHEDULE

- Eight of the 13 unique opponents on the 2023 schedule have been mentioned on the USILA Week 10 Coaches Poll: No. 1 Notre Dame, No. 2 Duke, No. 3 Virginia, No. 4 Maryland, No. 7 Johns Hopkins, No. 15 North Carolina, No. 20 Princeton, and Vermont received votes.  
- Syracuse will face five of these teams in the month of April, now through three games this month against top 15 teams.  
- Through April 16 and per the NCAA stats summary, the remainder of the schedule is a combined 18-5 on the year. Syracuse has the second-toughest future opposition schedule, with opponents winning 78.3 percent of their games this season. Virginia's future opponent winning percent is 61.8 (21-13).  
- All five ACC schools are inside the top 20 across Division I in cumulative opposition winning percentage.

## WELCOME BACK, SEVENS

- After missing the entire 2022 season with an upper body injury, Owen Hiltz returned to form.  
- Hiltz was a USILA All-America Honorable Mention pick in 2021 after racking 29 goals, 19 assists and 48 points in his true freshman season (2021).  
- This season, Hiltz was tapped as a Media Preseason All-America Honorable Mention this season, joining Will Mark in the honors. He was also named to the Tewaaron Trophy Watch List.  
- In his return to the field, Hiltz finished a pass from a fellow 2022 injured reservist, Griffin Cook, to finish the scoring against Vermont.  
- Despite the year away, Hiltz carries a 26-game point scoring streak into Saturday.  
- Hiltz remains hot with 46 points on feed-heavy 22 goals and 24 assists, including four points (1g, 3a) against No. 12 North Carolina.

## THORPE NAMED US BOX HEAD MAN

- Former Syracuse men's lacrosse player Regy Thorpe has again been announced as the head coach for the USA Lacrosse men's box program.  
- Thorpe, currently a women's lacrosse assistant coach at the University of Florida, will coach the men's box team at next year's championships, at a site and date to be announced.  
- A former member of the USA Lacrosse box program, Thorpe led the US to a bronze medal finish in 2019 as the head coach, the fifth-straight bronze for the American side.  
- Thorpe spent 15 years playing for the Rochester Knighthawks, winning the NLL title in 1997 and 2007.  
- An All-American at Syracuse, Thorpe helped the Orange to the title game in 1992, and enjoyed a successful MLL career as well.

## BROOKS NAMED ATLAS LC ASSISTANT

- Another former men's lacrosse player at Syracuse, Steven Brooks, has been named as an assistant coach for Atlas LC of the Premier Lacrosse League.  
- Brooks most recently served Atlas LC as the interim head coach for the PLL Championship Series, a six-site event. He led the team to the Series championship game.  
- A two-time NCAA Champion, Brooks enjoyed a successful professional career with various MLL, LXM, and PLL teams before retiring in 2019.  
- The first former PLL player to join the league's coaching ranks, Brooks has been with the Atlas in a coaching capacity since 2020.

## THE NUMBER

- Every sport has its vaunted number, your 3s, your 23s, your 99s.  
- One number is synonymous with lacrosse and Syracuse Lacrosse: 22  
- This season Joey Spallina, a freshman from Mount Sinai, New York will wear the number.  
- Head Coach Gary Gait brought prominence to the number during his Hall of Fame playing career (1988-90). Later the number would be worn by All-Americans Charlie Lockwood, Casey, Ryan and Mike Powell, Dan Hardy and Cody Jamieson.  
- Now Spallina will wear the number, the first freshman to don the 22 jersey since Jordan Evans for the 2014 season. Other freshmen to wear it include Casey Powell, Charlie Lockwood and Chris Baduini.  
- In a nod to the caliber of that player, Syracuse's #22 has been an All-American in 27 of the 37 seasons it's been worn since Gary Gait in 1988.

## POLL POINTS

- Syracuse continued to climb in the USILA and Media Polls this week, jumping into the top 15 of both.  
- The Orange are slotted 13th in the USILA Coaches Poll with 129 points while ranking 12th in the Inside Lacrosse Media Poll with 151 points.  
- Overall, Syracuse has been ranked in 269 of the 285 USILA polls that have been released since 2000 and 484 of the 526 polls since the USILA began its national rankings in 1973.  
- Syracuse men's lacrosse has climbed as high as ninth under head coach Gary Gait.  
- The Orange appeared in 274 straight USILA polls from April 10, 1978 to April 30, 2007.

## THE GARY ERA

- Lacrosse legend **Gary Gait** returns to the program that he helped win three NCAA titles as a player, to be the fifth Roy D. Simmons Jr. Head Men's Lacrosse Coach at Syracuse University in program history this spring.  
- The Hall of Fame player led the Orange women's team to the NCAA Championship game in 2021.  
- He's won everywhere he's been. His career includes 10 NCAA titles as a player and assistant coach, three NLL titles, three MLL Championships, three Mann Cups, a Heritage Cup and an ILF World Championship.

## NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

- Since joining the ACC, the Orange are 64-22 versus non-conference opponents, including a 60-17 mark in regular-season, non-league contests.

## DOME-INATION

- Syracuse is 262-52 (.834) in the JMA Wireless Dome since it began playing the majority of its home games there in 1981.  
- 'Cuse has won 40 of its last-60 home games.

## CARDIAC 'CUSE NO MORE?

- The Syracuse lacrosse program was always worth the price of admission, playing in a one-goal thriller almost every other time out from 2016-2019, but have only played in four 1-goal games since the conclusion of the 2019 campaign - albeit two coming in back-to-back contests late in 2022.  
- Still, 32 of Syracuse's last 92 games have been decided by one goal after the 12-second thriller against No. 12 North Carolina on April 15, a 15-14 win.  
- Overall 'Cuse had been widely successful in those matchups as well, winning 17 of the 31 games, snapping a five-game, one-goal slide with the win over UNC.  
- The Orange set the program record with 11 one-goal games in 2017.

## EXTRA, EXTRA

- Syracuse owns an all-time overtime record of 39-25-4.  
- Syracuse played its first OT game since 2019 in their game against Cornell on April 11.  
- SU has won 17 of its last 28 overtime games dating back to 2006.  
- 'Cuse snapped a five-game winning streak in games that needed extra time in their loss to Virginia in 2019 before rebounding and defeating Duke in OT later in the year.  
- Syracuse has won seven of its last nine home OT games.

## BLUE JAYS AND MAROONS

- For just the second-straight season and the only two years in modern history, only one member of the Orange's on-field coaching staff is a Syracuse alum. This is the fewest 'Cuse alums on staff since the program began hiring full-time assistants.  
- Pat March was the first non-Syracuse grad in a full-time on the coaching staff since BJ Ohara was hired as an assistant coach in 2002, when he joined the program in the fall of 2019. March is a Roanoke alum, and started his 11 year coaching career there.  
- Johns Hopkins grad and legendary player Dave Pietramala was tabbed as the Orange's defensive coordinator in the fall of 2021.  
- Nick Acquaviva, a Cicero North High School product, played two years at New England College after a spell at nearby OCC. He will work with goalies and the faceoff unit.  
- There will be another 'Cuse grad working with the program now as Carly Randall '17 returns to the Orange as the Director of Operations. Randall played for Gait on the women's team.

## THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE DOME

- Nearly 40,000 fans enjoyed seeing Syracuse at the JMA Wireless Dome this season.  
- The 38,089 cumulative attendance leads the country in total attendance as of April 16.  
- The Orange have the best average attendance in the country with 4,232 attending per home game.  
- The nine home games this season are all in the top 20 of single game attendance numbers so far in 2023.  
- On April 1, over 5,700 fans attended the Syracuse vs. Notre Dame game (5,744), the third-highest single game attendance number so far in 2023.

## RARE CHANGE ATOP

- Syracuse is one of two programs to win 900+ games in program history, with Johns Hopkins being the other.  
- Besides all the wins and tradition of success, the most remarkable item of the more than 100 years of Syracuse lacrosse is that the program has only had five head coaches. Laurie Cox (1916-1930), Roy Simmons Sr. (1931-1970), Roy Simmons Jr. (1971-1998) and John Desko (1999-21) and now Gary Gait (2022-pres.) have been the only bench bosses in the storied tradition of the program.

## HALLS OF FAME

- Gary Gait, Casey Powell and Pat McCabe were all members of the inaugural Pro Lacrosse Hall of Fame class, which was announced on Feb. 15, 2022.  
- The Hall of Fame, which is managed by the Premier Lacrosse League, announced an 11-man class consisting of a player for each of the 10 starting field positions (3 A, 3 M, 3 D, 1 G) and a specialist.  
- Syracuse was the only school to have multiple alumni selected in the inaugural class, which is fitting as the Orange also own the records for most professional lacrosse draft picks of all time and most first round selections.  
- All three are already members of the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame for their collegiate play. Gait is now a member of the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame, NLL Hall of Fame, Pro Lacrosse Hall of Fame and Greater Syracuse Sports Hall of Fame.

**TO THE RAFTERS**

- This spring, another Syracuse legend will have his jersey retired as Mike Powell's #22 jersey will join Gary Gait's high in the rafters of the Dome.

- The two legendary 22s are the first two men's lacrosse jerseys to hang in the Dome, while Katie Rowan's women's lacrosse jersey is with them as well.

- Powell was the first-ever two-time Tewaaraton Trophy winner, winning the honor in 2002 and 2004 after national championship seasons.

- A walking highlight reel, Powell was a four-time USILA First Team All-American, the Jack Turnbull Award winner for the attackman of the year, the 2004 Lt. Raymond Enners Award winner as the player of the year, and a two-time W.H. Brine Award winner as the NCAA Division I Championship Game Most Outstanding Player.

- The 2004 Syracuse graduate still holds the program's career points record (307), ranks sixth in career goals (150), and fourth on the career assists list (157). His 70 points as a freshman are the second-most for a first year player at Syracuse.

- Powell's jersey will reach the rafters at halftime of the March 11 game against Johns Hopkins.

**HILTZ HAS RECORD WORTHY ROOKIE SEASON**

- **Owen Hiltz's** freshman season was one for the record books.

- He wrapped up his first season on campus ranked eighth in points (48), goals (29) and assists (19) among rookies in program history, despite playing just 13 games. In the last-30 years, only four freshman have posted more than 40 points at Syracuse- Mikey Powell (70, 2001), Casey Powell (67, 1995) and Mike Leveille (41, 2005). All three went on to win national player of the year honors. Hiltz's 13 games tied Leveille for the fewest of the four.

- Mikey Powell and Leveille were the only two players to have more goals than Hiltz as a freshman this century. The eventual Tewaaraton Award winners notched 30.

- Larry Storrer scored 42 goals in 1976 to set the Orange record. Casey Powell's 39 in 1995 was the next-highest tally.

- John Zuberli (1986) owns Syracuse's freshman assists (41) and points (74) records. Mike Powell (40/70) is second in both of those categories.

**OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN**

- Five student-athletes will don the captains C on their jerseys this spring: Pete Fiorini, Max Rosa, Griffin Cook, Cole Kirst, and Caden Kol.

- Three of the captains are local kids: Cook (Syracuse/Jamesville-DeWitt HS), Fiorini (Baldwinsville/Baldwinsville HS), and Max Rosa (Syracuse/West Genesee).

- Caden Kol (Danville, Calif.) is the first Syracuse captain to hail from The Golden State since Denver Rorke (Saratoga, Calif.) during the 1996 campaign.

**AN UPGRADED HOME VENUE**

- Home to the Orange since the 1981 season, the Dome got a face lift this offseason.

- The bulk of \$118 million in renovations to the facility which hosts SU football, basketball and lacrosse, were done this offseason. They include: a new fixed roof, upgraded lighting and sound and a gigantic center-hung video screen, among other amenities.

- The venue has been Syracuse's home for all 11 NCAA titles and 'Cuse has finished first or second nationally in attendance every season since the NCAA has begun tracking it.

- In total, 1,540,984 fans have watched 314 lacrosse games in the Dome, or an average of 4,907 fans per contest. SU is 262-52 in the Dome all time.

**PRESEASON HONORS**

- Owen Hiltz and Will Mark each garnered national attention ahead of the 2023 campaign.

- Back from the IR, Hiltz was named an Inside Lacrosse Media Preseason All-America Honorable Mention.

- Mark joined him in that honor, as well as a selection by USA Lacrosse Magazine.

**LEAGUE DOMINANCE**

- The Orange have won nine conference titles in the last 12 seasons, including five regular season titles (2010, 2011, 2013, 2017, 2018) and four conference tournament titles (2012, 2013, 2015, 2016).

- Syracuse collected its second-straight ACC regular season championship in 2018. Virginia took home the regular season crown in 2019. No conference champion was crowned in 2020 due to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

- The ACC did not hold a tournament last spring, nor will it this season. Virginia and Notre Dame were named Co-Champions.

**TOUGH ON THE RIDE**

- Hard-riding attackman has become a big trend for Syracuse in the last handful of seasons.

- Joey Spallina leads the starting attack unit with eight caused turnovers this season, with Owen Hiltz close behind with four.

- In 2021, **Hiltz (6)**, was fourth on the team in the category. **Griffin Cook** had seven through five games in 2020 before the season was cut short.

- Under **Pat March**, the Orange have posted some of its best statistical seasons on the ride by attackmen.

- Cook had the most caused turnovers by an attackman in the country in the shortened 2020 campaign, but played mostly through the midfield in 2021 and 2022.

**IN THE CLEAR**

- The Orange cleared at nearly 86-percent (248-289) in 2022, where they finished 34th nationally. Historically one of the nation's best clearing teams, they've improved over last season, which finished as the 47th-best clearing team at just 83-percent.

- According to research done by the Virginia Athletic Media Relations Office, there have been 57 seasons (excluding the 2020 shortened season) in which a Division I team has cleared the ball at 90 percent or better, including five by SU.

**ATTENDANCE LEADERS ONCE AGAIN**

- Syracuse once again led the nation in average (3,910) and total (31,277) attendance in 2022.

- Syracuse leads the country in average attendance so far this season, with 4,232 fans on average (38,089 cumulative through nine home games).

- SU has finished first or second in lacrosse attendance in every season since the NCAA began tracking it (with the exception of the 2021 season where COVID protocols limited fans across the country).

- Since the The Dome opened in 1981, 1,535,240 fans have seen the Orange play in a total of 313 games.

- All nine home games 2023 season are among the 20-most attended on campus lacrosse games (non-neutral site) this season have been in the Dome.

**900 CLUB**

- Syracuse became the second program in NCAA Division I lacrosse history to win 900 games in 2018.

- Johns Hopkins (1,013), **Syracuse (936)**, Maryland (880), Army (833) and Navy (829), and now Hobart (800) are the only six programs with 800 or more wins.

- There are six other programs in the 700 win club, Johns Hopkins (1,013), Maryland (880), Navy (829), Army West Point (833), Hobart (800) and Cornell (797).

## GARY GAIT • ROY D. SIMMONS JR. HEAD MEN'S LACROSSE COACH • SECOND SEASON



Widely considered to be the greatest player in lacrosse history, Gary Gait has been hired as the Roy D. Simmons Jr. Head Men's Lacrosse Coach at Syracuse.

Gait becomes the fifth head coach for the 107th year of Syracuse men's lacrosse, replacing Hall of Fame head coach John Desko, who announced his retirement on Monday. He assumed the roll after a 14-year stint as the head coach of the Orange's women's lacrosse program.

Gait's remarkable playing career features a winning theme at every level. A three-time NCAA Champion, Gait led Syracuse's most dominant stretch in program history, losing just one game in three seasons from 1988-90. He is a two-time recipient of the Lt. Raymond J. Enners Award, presented annually to the nation's most outstanding player, and was the NCAA Championship Most Outstanding Player on a team considered to be the greatest ever assembled in college lacrosse.
