What's On Tap...

Richmond will battle a familiar foe in #2 Virginia in the first round of the NCAA tournament after winning the inaugural Atlantic 10 men's lacrosse championship, earning the new conference's automatic bid . . . Saturday's game marks the fifth time Richmond has made the NCAA tournament in just 10 seasons, not including the 2020 season cancelled due to the pandemic . . . The Spiders are 0-4 in NCAA tournament first round game's and will vie for the team's first tournament win when it meets the Cavaliers Saturday.

Series History ...

Richmond is 8-1 in all-time meetings with Virginia . . . Hall of Fame coach Dom Starsia brought his Cavaliers to Robins Stadium for Richmond's first-ever Division I game when the Spiders' start-up program began play in 2014 . . . Virginia won, 13-12, in front of a crowd of more than 4,200. "I told (Spider's Head Coach Dan Chemotti) I thought it would be a great way to kick off his Division I program. As that game went on, I was standing there on our sideline thinking 'wow, maybe I made a mistake coming here.' But I was happy to do that and it was an exciting moment for Richmond." . . . Since then, the Spiders have defeated Virginia just one time, taking down the No. 2 Cavaliers, 17-13, at Robin Stadium last season . . . The win over No. 2 UVA was the highest-ranked victory in program history, surpassing a win over No. 6 Notre Dame in 2019 . . . The win also snapped Virginia's 73-game winning streak against in-state foes, giving the Cavaliers their first loss in the Commonwealth since April 23, 1977 against Washington & Lee Virginia defeated Richmond in the last meeting on March 4, 25-8, in the Cavaliers largest margin of victory this season.

Champions ... Again ...

Atlantic 10 Offensive Player of the Year Dalton Young tied a career-high eight points to lead the No. 2 seeded Spiders over No. 3 UMass, 15-8, in the Atlantic 10 semifinals at Robins Stadium before knocking off No. 4 High Point by an indentical score to earn back-to-back trips to the NCAA tournament... Richmond's visit to the conference title game came as the program's ninth-consecutive... Richmond's first-ever NCAA playoff birth in 2014 came after defeating High Point in the Atlantic Sun Conference tournament... Since then, the teams have met for conference title matchups in 2015, 2019 and 2021... Six Spiders earned spots on the All-Tournement Team in attack Dalton Young (Most Outsanding Player), midfielders Lance and Derrek Madonna, goalie Zach Vigue, LSM Tommy Stull and close defenseman Jake Saunders.

Young, Madonna Earn Inside Lacrosse All-American Honors

USA Lacrosse Magazine released its Division 1 Men's All-Americans Tuesday with senior Dalton Young and junior Lance Madonna being named All-American Honorable Mentions . . . Young leads the Spiders with 69 points from a team-leading 30 goals and 39 assists and is seventh in the nation in assists per game with 2.60 . . . The Atlantic 10 Offensive Player of the Year put on a clinic in Richmond's 15-8 semifinals victory over UMass, tying a career-high eight points via five goals and four assists . . . He anchored the Spiders attack with two goals and an assist in the title game against High Point to help Richmond earn its fifth-trip to the NCAA tournament . . . Madonna earns All-American status after scoring 28 goals and dishing out 15 assists en route to being named the Atlantic 10 Midfielder of the Year . . . Madonna leads the Spiders in game-winning goals with three this season and is third on the team in points with 43 . . . Madonna has put up a 14-game scoring streak this season, scoring at least one goal in all but one game this season . . . So far he has 12 multi-point games and has recorded three or more points in 10 games in 2023 . . . He has recroded points in 32-of-40 career games.

USILA COACHES POLL

Spiders Well-Represented in Inaugural Atlantic 10 Men's Lacrosse Awards

Nine members of the University of Richmond Men's Lacrosse team were honored in the Atlantic 10 Men's Lacrosse end-of-year awards, released Thursday . . . The inaugural awards are highlighted by the Spiders taking home three of four possible Player of the Year spots . . . Dalton Young was named Offensive Player of the Year, while Lance Madonna was tabbed Midfield Player of the Year and Aidan O'Neil grabbed Rookie of the Year honors . . . Along with Young and Madonna, Jake Saunders earned a Fist Team All-Atlantic 10 nod and Tommy Stull and Zach Vigue were named to the Second Team . . . The future is bright for the Spiders as O'Neil, Jack Pilling, Joe Sheridan and Hunter Smith captured All-Rookie Team Honors, giving Richmond the most names of any other school on the list . . . In total, Richmond tied Saint Joseph's for the most All-Atlantic 10 selections with nine . . . Young, a business administration major, was also named to the All-Academic Team for his work both on the field and in the classroom.

O'Neil Three-Peats as Rookie of the Week

Aidan O'Neil recorded his third five-point game of the season when he scored three goals and dished out two assists in Richmond's dominant 26-10 win in the regular season finalea gainst St. Bonaventure... O'Neil also scooped three ground balls and notched his first career caused turnover in the win.

Keeping it 100

With his first goal of the day against St. Bonaventue, Dalton Young recorded his 100th collegiate goal, becoming just the fourth Spider to ever pull off the feat...The week prior at Hobart, grad transfer Derrek Madonna scored four goals while reaching the 100 career goal mark against his former team.

Dalton's Dominance...

It's been over two years since the last time Dalton Young didn't record a point in a game (March 7, 2021 at Duke) . . . One of the nation's most consistent scorers, Young carries a 40-game point streak into the NCAA tournament and has recorded a point in 42 of 48 career games . . . He is one of only a handful of active players with a 40+ game point streak, having racked up 97 goals and 68 assists for 165 points over the duration of his 40-game streak. Young's goal streak is also one of the longest nationally, having tallied 54 goals over the last 24-consecutive games.

All Clea

Richmond ranks 6th in the nation in clearing percentage, going 306-of-338 (.905) this season.

Cause and Effect

Richmond is tied 12th in the nation in caused turnovers per game with 9.60 . . . Led by Jake Saunders with 33 and Tommy Stull with 16, Richmond has racked up 144 caused turnovers so far this season . . . Jake Saunders came up with a career-high six caused turnovers against UMass during the regular season, marking his third game this season with five or more caused turnovers.

Young Named Offensive Player of the Week

Dalton Young scored four goals and added four assists and a ground ball in Richmond's 20-15 win over Hobart to be named Atlantic 10 Offensive Player of the Week.

Back-To-Back Rookie of the Week Honors for Sheridan

Freshman Joe Sheridan was named the Atlantic 10 men's lacrosse Rookie of the Week for two-consecutive weeks . . . Against High Point, he recorded two goals and a ground ball . . . The week prior against UMass he netted three goals on four shots for his second career hat trick . . He also scored the eventual game-winner at the 9:27 mark of the fourth quarter to give Richmond its first-ever conference victory.

Richmond's New Home ...

The Spiders have found a home in the newly-created Atlantic 10 men's lacrosse conference, joining UMass, Saint Joseph's, High Point, Hobart and St. Bonaventure ... The Spiders were selected by the conference's six head coaches to win the first-ever A-10 championship hosted by Richmond May 4 and 5 ... The team also boasts three Preseason All-Conference selections in attackman Dalton Young, midfielder Lance Madonna and defenseman Jake Saunders.

Decade of Excellence...

2023 marks the program's 10th anniversary season ... Richmond started its men's lacrosse program in 2014 and has since built one of the top programs in the country ... The Spiders have been in nine-straight conference championship games since inception, the only program in the country that has accomplished that feat ... Richmond was part of the Atlantic Sun for one season (2014) before moving to the Southern Conference (2015-22) for each year since as an affiliate member ... Over the past 10 years, the team has racked up 94 victories, five conference championships and five NCAA appearances, all under the guidance of head coach Dan Chemotti.

Iron Sharpens Iron ...

As they say, "to be the best, you've got to play the best" the Spiders have never taken the easy way out when it comes to scheduling, having played at least three ranked opponents each season, excluding 2016 when they played two ... Richmond is 9-31 all-time in program history against top 20 opponents ... En route to it's fourth NCAA tournament appearance in 2022, the Spiders played seven ranked opponents all within the nation's top 12 ... The Spiders' nine wins over ranked opponents have come in 2022 (2 times) 2019 (2 times), 2018, 2017 (3 times) and 2016 ... The highest-ranked opponent Richmond has ever beaten came last season when it knocked off No. 2 Virginia at Robins Stadium ... The highest-ranked opponent the Spiders have defeated on the road has been at No. 7 twice - North Carolina in 2017 and Duke in 2016 ... The Spiders will play the top three preseaon ranked teams in #1 Virginia, #2 Maryland and #3 Georgetown this season ... Other preseason ranked matchup on the 2023 schedule is preseason #15 Saint Joseph's April 1.

All In The Family . . .

Last season, then-sophomore Lance Madonna gave opposing defenses headaches with his 37 points off 25 goals and 12 assists This year they'll have double the Madonna's to worry about as Lance's older brother, Derrek, joins the Spiders as a graduate transfer from Hobart where he was the team's leading scorer with 33 goals in 2022 . . . through 15 games, the brothers have linked on six goals, with Lance assisting Derrek on four.

Grayum's Big Return ...

Junior Luke Grayum made a statement return to Robins Stadium against Bucknell on Feb. 18 with four goals, four assists, two ground balls and two caused turnovers ... Grayum played in just one game in 2022 before missing the season to injury ... For his efforts in Richmond's first win of the season, he was named the Atlantic 10 Offensive Player of the Week for week two, marking the first weekly honor for any Spider in the newly-created league.

Saunders Named Defensive Player of the Week . . .

Jake Saunders powered the Spiders defense through a 9-2 scoring run and helped kill five St. John's extra-man opportunities on March 25 to be named the Atlantic 10's Defensive Player of the Week . . . Saunders led the Spider defense, tying a season and career-high five caused turnovers to go along with five ground balls . . . This marked his second Defensive Player of the Week honor this season.

"Young" Gun ...

Now a seasoned vet, senior Dalton Young brings a wealth of experience into 2023 ... He was named a Second Team All-SoCon selection in 2022 after starting in all 16 games, tallying 62 points via 39 goals and 23 assists as Richmond's second-leading scorer, only trailing All-American and eventual pro Ryan Lanchbury ... Young became the fastest player in program history to record 100 points, pulling off the feat in just 30 games . .

<u>Transfer Tracker . . .</u>

The Spiders picked up a few new additions to the team via transfers in the offseason ... Richmond added four transfers in attack/midfielder Derrek Madonna, face off specialist Trent Grainger, and midfielders Jack Averna and Brandon Smith ... Madonna (Hobart) and Grainger (St. Bonaventure) come to Richmond from now-members of the Atlantic 10, while Averna and Smith both come from Div. III Randolph-Macon located in nearby Ashland, Va.

Replacing Firepower . . .

Richmond loses 99 goals from last season due to the graduation of 2022 leading scorer Ryan Lanchbury (40 goals), who now plays professionally for the NLL's Georgia Swarm, Luke Frankeny (34 goals) and Ryan Dunn (25 goals) . . . The Spiders made up for the losses due to graduation this season with Richmond's top four goal scorers Dalton Young (30), Lance Madonna (28), Luke Grayum (26) and Aidan O'Neil (24) combining for 108 goals this season.

It's Always Sunny In Richmond . . .

Richmond's defensive leader, graduate student Jake "Sunny" Saunders, returned for his final year of eligibility in 2023 ... The 16th overall pick in the 2022 NLL Entry Draft by the Las Vegas Desert Dogs, Saunders has played in 48 games for the Spiders in his career ... He will be eligible to play for the Desert Dogs in the 2023-24 season ... Saunders was named Honorable Mention All-America on defense last spring by Inside Lacrosse, helping the Spiders win the Southern Conference Tournament championship and advance to the NCAA Tournament ... He started 14 out of 15 games last season on defense, helping the Spiders rank eighth in the nation in scoring defense at 10.06 goals per game ... Saunders led the team with 23 caused turnovers, leading the team to a ninth place showing in the country as a team with 9.62 caused turnovers per game. He led the Southern Conference and ranked 27th in the country with 1.53 caused turnovers per game ... Saunders ranked fourth on the team and third among non-faceoff specialists with 33 ground balls ... He picked up one of the biggest ground balls of last season in the final minute of regulation in the Southern Conference championship game, sealing the victory over Jacksonville.

Between the Pipes . . .

Richmond used two goalies in 2022, with Devin Craven making six starts before Zach Vigue took over goalkeeping duties and made 10 starts ... The pair combined for 211 saves with 83 from Craven and 128 from Vigue ... Vigue was named to the SoCon's All-Freshman team after he put together a 7-3 record in cage, facing 380 shots while allowing 104 to go by ... Through 15 games this season, Vigue is .526, making 162 saves while allowing 146 goals . . . Vigue was prolific in Richmond's championship game last Saturday, collecting 15 saves for the third time this season . . . He tied a career-high 19 saves against Georgetown on March 11.

At the Dot ...

Florida native Jared Chenoy returns as the Spiders' go-to face off specialist ... Last season he played in all 16 games, leading the team in ground balls with 88 ... he won 172 of his 332 face off attempts for a .518 face off percentage ... he also added three goals and an assist as well as 19 shots

Dan Chemotti

HEAD COACH

10th Season Duke, 2002

Dan Chemotti is in his 10th season as the men's lacrosse head coach at the University of Richmond in 2023. Chemotti is the program's first-ever head coach and has guided the Spiders to unprecedented success for such a young program.

The two-time Southern Conference Coach of the Year, Chemotti as guided the Spiders to four NCAA Tournament appearances (2022, 2019, 2018, 2014), in the first decade of program existence, including back-to-back seasons as Southern conference Tournament champions (2019, 2018). Richmond has won four regular season league titles and has been in the conference tournament championship eight times. The Spiders were the only program in the country to appear in six-straight conference tournament games from 2014-2019.

2022 saw the Spiders win its fourth conference championship and advance to the NCAA First Round, finishing the season ranked 14th in the country for the program's highest-ever final ranking. Defenseman Jake Saunders and attack Ryan Lanchbury were named All-Americans, and the team landed nine on the All-SoCon Team. The Spiders defeated No. 2 Virginia at home in 2022, snapping the Cavaliers 73-game streak of going undefeated against in-state teams.

Chemotti led Richmond to a share of the Southern Conference regular season title and the number one seed in the SoCon Tournament in 2021. The Spiders swept the postseason SoCon awards with Ryan Lanchbury (Offensive Player of the Year), Sean Menges (Defensive Player of the Year), Dalton Young (Freshman of the Year) and his own SoCon Coach of the Year award. The Spiders placed a SoCon record 11 players on the two All-Conference teams, including six named First Team All-Conference and five earning Second Team All-Conference accolades.

Chemotti has led Richmond to at 83-52 (.626) record as head coach, including six years of 10 or more wins. The Spiders have won 80.4 percent (41-10) of their conference games in program history and is an astounding 39-7 (84.78%) record in the eight years in the SoCon.

In the shortened 2020 season, the Spiders finished the year ranked No. 18 in the country with a 4-3 record. The Spiders' three losses all game to nationally ranked opponents in No. 4 Maryland, No. 6 Notre Dame and No. 13 Duke.

In 2019, the Spiders booked their third NCAA Tournament appearance in program history and second-straight by winning the SoCon Championship with a 15-7 victory over No. 11 High Point on the road. The Spiders dominated the Panthers in the championship game and goalkeeper Jack Rusbuldt was named the Most Outstanding Player after allowing 13 goals in the two SoCon games.

Richmond advanced to the NCAA Tournament with the automatic bid and played at No. 4 Duke in the first round. The Spiders gave the Blue Devils all It wanted, out-scoring Duke 4-0 in the fourth quarter before running out of time and falling by a 12-11 margin. Richmond finished the season ranked No. 18 in the country in the final polls.

Sophomores Ryan Lanchbury and Mitch Savoca earned All-America honors last season, becoming the third and fourth All-Americans in program history. Lanchbury set the Richmond single-season scoring record with 72 points and 52 goals. His 52 goals also set the SoCon single-season goal scoring record.

The Spiders placed five members on the First Team All-SoCon squad in

2019 as Ryan Lanchbury, Teddy Hatfield, Mitch Savoca, Jason Reynolds and Sean Menges picked up the honors. The Spiders' five First Team All-SoCon selections ties the school record set in 2017, which is also the most in SoCon history, happening for the fourth time in the league's five-year history of men's lacrosse. Additionally, Richmond added to its SoCon-record of 21 First Team All-Conference selections in program history, nine more than the second place team in league history (Air Force, 12 selections).

In 2018, the Spiders won the SoCon regular season championship with an 11-6 overall record and a 6-1 mark in league play. Richmond was a perfect 9-0 at home at Robins Stadium last season, including winning the 2018 SoCon Tournament championship. The Spiders won the tournament title in impressive fashion as Teddy Hatfield scored the game-winning, overtime goal to defeat Jacksonville and send Richmond to its second NCAA Tournament in program history.

The Spiders had their name called in the NCAA Selection Show and made it out of the play-in game for the first time in program history. Richmond went on the road and battled No. 2 Albany in the First Round.

The Spiders had six members named to the All-Conference team last year. Joining the First Team, is senior LSM Austin Cates, redshirt-senior attacker Mitch Goldberg, junior attacker Teddy Hatfield and freshman defenseman Jason Reynolds. Freshman midfielder Mitch Savoca is lone Spider representative on the Second Team but in addition, joins fellow newcomer Ryan Lanchbury on the All-Freshman Team.

2017 was a historic season for the Spiders, posting a program record 12 victories and reaching as high as No. 11 in the national polls. For the second straight year, Richmond knocked off a national power, taking down defending national champion UNC, 6-5, in Chapel Hill. In addition, two Spiders earned First Team All-American honors for the first time when Brendan Hynes and Benny Pugh were recognized. Pugh and Hynes also became the first Spiders to ever be drafted into the professional ranks, both being drafted in the Major League Lacrosse draft.

The Spiders saw success again in 2016, their second season in the Southern Conference, posting an 11-5 overall record and a 6-1 mark in conference play. After jumping out to a 4-1 start, the Spiders logged the biggest win in program history, taking down No. 9 Duke on the road, 12-10. The win and another victory over Jacksonville would give the 6-1 Spiders the best start in program history, propelling the team to a No. 18 ranking, the highest in program history.

Shortly after, Mitch Goldberg was named to the prestigious Tewaaraton Award Watch List. The team finished third nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 7.44 goals per game, and first in caused turnovers and clearing percentage for the second year in a row. Junior Brendan Hynes ranked second in the nation in caused turnovers, while junior Ryan Dennis ranked ninth nationally in the same category. Seven Spiders earned postseason honors, led by Hynes and senior Alex Hatem, who were named to the SoCon First Team.

In 2015, the Spiders finished 6-0 in the new league and boasted the nation's second-most stingy defense. The Spiders allowed just 7.44 goals per

game, within less than half a goal per game from the nation's leader. Richmond also lead the country in clearing percentage and finished fourth in the country in scoring margin, winning on average by more than four goals per game.

The Spiders boasted the league's Defensive Player of the Year in Brendan Hynes, while goalie Benny Pugh was second nationally in both save percentage (.590) and goal-against average (7.42) for the year. On the offensive side, the second-year program scored 20-or-more goals three times, finished 15th nationally in scoring offense (11.75) and 11th in assists per game (7.25). Richmond earned its first national ranking for the season, appearing at No. 20 in a national poll. UR was among teams receiving votes for the majority of, and in the final poll of, the season. Richmond got above .500 after just two seasons, sitting at 17-16 overall in just two years as a varsity program.

Chemotti did what no other coach in the history of Division I lacrosse was able to accomplish; he took a first-year program to the NCAA Tournament in 2014. He followed that by taking the Spiders to an undefeated league season in the newly-formed Southern Conference in 2015.

After helping lead the Loyola University Maryland men's lacrosse team as offensive coordinator to the 2012 Division I National Championship in 2012, Chemotti was named head coach of the Richmond men's lacrosse team in October of 2012. He spent that school year recruiting and putting in place the tenets of the program which began play in the 2014 season, and it led to the young squad earning an Atlantic Sun Conference championship and berth into the newly-expanded NCAA Tournament.

The Spiders jumped into their inaugural season by hosting No. 7 Virginia on February 8, 2014. Over 4,000 fans packed into Robins Stadium to see the beginning of a magical season. The Spiders did not come away with a win that day, but battled the Cavaliers to a 13-12 loss, which set the tone for things to come.

Despite losing the first five games of the season, the Spiders kept things positive, and finally broke through for a win against Vermont in Durham, North Carolina on March 8. That was the start of a run of four wins in eight games, including a pair of Atlantic Sun Conference games that propelled the young squad into the four-team Atlantic Sun Championship Tournament.

The Spiders beat both the top seed and host Mercer and second-seeded High Point, avenging two regular-season losses and stringing together back-to-back wins for the first time in team history, and the one time that it mattered, as they earned the league's automatic bid to the NCAA. That feat drew a trip to Colorado Springs and a road game at Air Force in the NCAA Tournament.

During his five seasons with the Greyhounds, Chemotti was a part of four NCAA Tournament berths and at least a share of three ECAC conference titles at Loyola. Chemotti also saw 30 players earn all-conference honors and 12 be named All-Americans during his time there.

Chemotti's powerful offense helped lead the Greyhounds to and 18-1 mark and their first-ever national championship in 2012. The Loyola offense ranked eighth in goals per game (12.05), ninth in EMO at .444% and fifth in turnovers per game at 12.84. A versatile and diverse offense, the Greyhounds saw eight players rack up 10 or more goals, three tally more than 20 and three reach the 50-goal barrier in 2012.

The offense of which Chemotti was the architect afforded Loyola players the ability to shoot quickly, whether in transition or settled offense, and garner a high volume of shots. Despite the high number of shots, Loyola's shot percentage did not drop. In fact, the Greyhounds' shot percentage rose from .249 in 2011 to .299 during the team's 18-1 run to the NCAA Championship.

Two members of Chemotti's offense, Sawyer and midfielder Davis Butts, earned All-ECAC First Team honors in 2012, and Lusby was named to the Second Team. Sawyer was a USILA Second Team All-American, and Lusby and Butts earned All-America Honorable Mention.

In 2010, a pair of Loyola attackers, Collin Finnerty and Cooper MacDonnell, were named to the All-ECAC First Team, and MacDonnell picked up ECAC Offensive Player of the Year honors and was named All-America Honorable Mention. In addition to those honors, Finnerty, MacDonnell and Matt Langan split ECAC Offensive Player of the Week honors five times, and freshman attacker Patrick Fanshaw earned ECAC Rookie of the Week laurels once.

During the 2009 season, Chemotti's attack produced three players with 30 or more total points - Shane Koppens (41), Cooper MacDonnell (38) and Collin Finnerty (37) - a mark not accomplished by a Loyola trio since 2003.

The Greyhounds led the ECAC in goals per game (10.43), a category they finished 17th in all of NCAA Division I during 2009. Koppens led the conference in points per game (3.42) and finished his Loyola career 12th in the nation in the category.

In 2008, the Greyhounds captured the ECAC title behind an explosive offense that ranked second in goals per game and points per game (13.43), and first in shooting percentage, in the league.

Under Chemotti's direction in 2008, Koppens was named ECAC Offensive Player of the Year after finishing as the league's top scorer. In Chemotti's three years calling the offense, nine offensive players have been awarded with post season All-ECAC honors (four first-team and five second-team). In 2007 the Loyola offense ranked 17th nationally in team offense and finished the season with a .640 assist percentage.

A 2002 graduate of Duke University, Chemotti led the Blue Devils to back-to-back ACC Championships during his junior and senior seasons. During his career in Durham, N.C., the Blue Devils reached the NCAA Tournament all four years, advancing to the NCAA Quarterfinals three times. He was selected a team captain his senior year, and was awarded the school's Roy Skinner Award for Dedication and Sacrifice.

Following graduation, Chemotti worked as an assistant coach at Dartmouth College from 2002-2004, working primarily with the offense and the face-off men. In 2004, the Big Green's offense ranked third nationally in assist percentage and 15th nationally in team offense, and in 2003, Dartmouth's face-off percentage was good enough to finish ninth in the country. Chemotti then worked as an assistant at St. John's for two seasons, 2004-2006, before moving to Loyola for the 2006-2007 academic year.

In addition to coaching, Chemotti played lacrosse professionally as a midfielder for the New Jersey Pride and Washington Bayhawks of Major League Lacrosse. He was a member of the Pride from 2003-2008 and the Bayhawks in 2009. Serving as a two-way midfielder for the Pride and Bayhawks, Chemotti has amassed 54 points and 143 ground balls in 69 career games. Chemotti also played one season (2003) in the National Lacrosse League (NLL) for the New Jersey Storm.

Chemotti, a native of Syracuse, N.Y., played high school lacrosse for West Genesee in Syracuse, where he was named an All-American and the Central New York Player of the Year in his senior campaign. He led the Wildcats to a Class A New York State Championship his senior season and to a runner-up finish his junior season.
