LOOKING BACK

• The Black Knights secured the Patriot League's automatic bid to NCAA Regionals by defeating Bucknell for the Conference title in two games in a best-of-three series hosted at West Point.

• Shortstop Kevin Dubrulle was named Tournament MVP and was joined on the All-Tournament Team by outfielder Braden Golinski, third baseman Sam Ruta, and designated hitter Coleson Titus.

• Army slugged its way past Bucknell in Game 2, claiming a 21-6 win, behind Kevin Dubrulle who batted 5-6, with a two home runs, six RBIs, and a pair of runs.

• Dubrulle was 11-21 during the Tournament, scoring six runs, had two home runs, one of which was a grand slam, a pair of doubles, and picked up ten RBIs.

• In the Patriot League Championship, third baseman Sam Ruta batted 4-12, having three runs, a pair of doubles, seven RBIs, and a home run.

• In the Tournament, first baseman Ross Friedrich went 4-12, having a pair of home runs, brought in four runs, a pair of RBIs, and a home run.

• Starting pitcher Mike Ruggieri pitched in Game 2 of the Patriot League Championships against Bucknell on May 22, working 6.0 innings, earning his ninth win of the season.

• In the Patriot League Championships, center fielder Braden Golinski had a pair of doubles and a home run.

• In the Patriot League Championship, freshman second baseman Chris Barr batted 7-16, having a double, a triple, eight RBIs, and had 5 runs.

• The Black Knights were able to clinch home-field advantage in the Patriot League Tournament after winning the regular season title with a 21-4 conference record.

• The Patriot League crown marked the fifth-straight for Army Baseball and the 12th in program history.

POSTSEASON HISTORY

• Army is making its 11th appearance

in an NCAA Regional, having been in 2022 (Hattiesburg), 2021 (Lubbock), 2019 (Lubbock), 2018 (Raleigh), 2013 (Charlottesville), 2012 (Charlottesville), 2009 (Austin), 2005 (Tallahassee), 2004 (Baton Rouge) and 2000 (Montclair, N.J.).

• The Black Knights are 4-20 in the NCAA Tournament and will look to secure their first win since knocking off NC State, 5-1, in 2018 at the Raleigh Regional.

• The last time Army faced Virginia was in the 2013 Charlottesville Regional, where the Cavaliers defeated the Black Knights 2-1.

AWARDS AND HONORS

• Senior shortstop Kevin Dubrulle was named Patriot League Player and Defensive Player of the Year, becoming the first to do so in school history and Patriot League history.

• Starting pitcher Tanner Gresham was named Pitcher of the Year posting a 5-1 record, a 2.90 ERA, 56 strikeouts, and pitched 59.0 innings.

• Head Coach Chris Tracz collected Gene Depew Coach of the Year accolades with a 38-16 record overall and a 21-4 Conference record.

• A record eight Black Knights landed on the All-Patriot League First Team, as starter Tanner Gresham, starter Mike Ruggieri, starter Matthew Ronnebaum, reliever Robbie Buecker, catcher Derek Berg, first baseman Ross Friedrich, and outfielder Braden Golinski were selected.

• Third baseman Sam Ruta was selected to the Second Team, while Bret Copeland was an Academic All-League selection.

• Shortstop Kevin Dubrulle was recently named a Collegiate Baseball Third Team All-American.

• As a team, Army checks into the national rankings in numerous categories including earned run average (12th, 4.11), batting average (28th, .304), scoring (33rd, 8.0) and double plays per game (38th, .85).

toughest player to strike out in the nation with a value of 19.9 and is ranked 17th in hits (90). He is also 12th in the nation in batting average (.411), 34th in RBIs (68), and is ranked 26th in the country in sacrifice flies with 54.

- Starting pitcher Tanner Gresham is 8th in the country in complete games with 3.

- Catcher Derek Berg checks in at 33rd in the nation in runs per game with 1.23.

Third baseman Sam Ruta checks into the top-30 in triples (26th, 5)

the top-30 in batting average (30th, .385) and on-base percentage (30th, .491).

- Starting Pitcher Mike Ruggieri checks in top-20 in wins (16th, 9).

- Junior Tanner Gresham also checks in the top-30 in WHIP (23rd, 1.05).

WATCH LISTS

- Throughout the season, Army Baseball was featured on numerous watch lists for national awards including the Buster Posey National Collegiate Catcher of the Year Watch List, the Brooks Wallace Award Watch List, and the College Baseball Foundation Pitcher of the Year Watch List.

- Catcher Derek Berg was tabbed to the initial watch list for the Buster Posey Award, which is awarded annually to the top division one collegiate catcher.

- The junior has caught 16 runners stealing from behind the dish this year, in 53 games played, Berg is batting .317.

- Kevin Dubrulle was recently named one of 5 finalists for the Brooks Wallace Award and was one of just two non-Power 5 players to be honored.

- Tanner Gresham was named to the College Baseball Foundation National Pitcher of the Year Watch List.

- In the 2023 season, Gresham posted a 5-1 record, a 2.90 ERA, 56 strikeouts, and pitched 59.0 innings.

SKIPPER

- When Chris Tracz was announced as Army's head baseball coach in July 2022, he brought 14 years of collegiate experience to West Point.

- Prior to his move to the Hudson Valley, Tracz spent 13 seasons as the head coach at Marist College.

- This marks the second stint at West Point for Tracz. He was an Assistant Coach in 2009, under head coach Joe Sottolano. He helped lead the Black Knights pitching staff to lead the Patriot League in six statistical categories including wins, ERA, shutouts, complete games, strikeout, and saves. Helping the 2009 Black Knights to win the Patriot League Championship and went to the NCAA Tournament Austin Regional.

- Tracz found success with the Cadets, leading the 2023 Black Knights to their fifth straight Patriot League Title and their 12th in program history.

- Tracz was named the Gene Depew Coach of the Year after leading the Black Knights to a 38-16 overall record and a 21-4 Conference record.

- Prior to taking over the program, Tracz led Marist to the 2017 MAAC Championship and played in the 2017 NCAA Tournament Gainesville Regional.

- Tracz produced eight Red Foxes that

were picked in the MLB Draft. (2017 - Scott Boches- 30th rnd., Seattle Mariners, 2015 - Steve Laurino, 25th rnd. Baltimore Orioles, 2013 - Kevin McCarthy 16th rnd. Kansas City Royals, Zack Shank, 28th rnd. Seattle Mariners, 2011 - Mike Gallic, 18th rnd.

San Diego Padres, Jon Schwund - 41st rnd. Pittsburgh Pirates, Ricky Pacione - 48th rnd, Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim, and Eric Alessio 49th rnd, Cincinnati Reds)

- A pitcher at Marist, Tracz was a three-time captain (2003-05), a two-time First Team All-Region selection, appeared in three NCAA Tournaments (2001, 2002, and 2005).

- In his freshman year at Marist, Tracz won ten games, earning MAAC Rookie of the Year, Louisville Slugger All-America and Baseball All-America honors.

BLACK KNIGHTS IN THE PROS

- Army's baseball program has proven to be one of the most regular producers of minor league talent in all of the Northeast the past several years.

- Sixteen former Black Knights have logged time with a minor league team affiliated with the major leagues since 2005.

- Fifteen of those individuals have been selected in Major League Baseball's First-Year Player Draft, including a school-record total of three chosen in 2008.

- Chris Rowley, who signed as a Free Agent in 2013 with the Toronto Blue Jays, made history in August 2017 when he was called up, becoming Army's first alumni to reach the Major League Baseball ranks.

- Then, two days later on August 12, 2017, he was called in to pitch 5.1 innings against the Pittsburgh Pirates.

- He allowed five hits and just one run, while sprinkling in three strikeouts during his time on the hill.

- Rowley was also credited with the win, becoming the 13th pitcher in Blue Jays history to win his debut on the mound and the first since 2012.

- The Black Knights currently have three players active on minor league rosters in Jon Rosoff (Detroit Tigers Double-A Affiliate), Jacob Hurtubise (Cincinnati Reds Double-A Affiliate) and Cam Opp (New York Mets High-A Affiliate).

DOUBLEDAY FIELD

- Abner Doubleday, an 1842 West Point graduate, is said to have devised the game of baseball while on leave from the U.S. Military Academy in 1839, drawing out the diamond and the rules of the game.

- He called the game "Base Ball," but it was patterned after a game called "Rounders," which was played by boys and girls in England.

- While the origin of baseball has been disputed, Doubleday, nonetheless, is still given credit and the baseball field at the U.S. Military Academy was dedicated in his honor in May 1939, the centennial year of baseball.

- Despite the controversy, Doubleday distinguished himself throughout his military career, earning the rank of major general.

- He served in the Mexican and Civil wars. As a captain, he fired the first gun for the Union side in the Civil War at Fort Sumter.

- On Nov. 29, 1862, he was made a major

general of the volunteers. He retired from the U.S. Army in 1873 and died Jan. 26, 1893, in New Jersey at the age of 74.

THE NIGHT STALKERS

- Members of the team wear a sticker with the emblem of the 160th Special Operations Aviation Regiment (Airborne), nicknamed the 160th SOAR, on their helmets in memory of former Army Baseball pitcher and American soldier Steve Reich.
- Major Reich, Class of 1993, was one of the finest pitchers to toe the rubber for the Black Knights' baseball program and posted a career record of 19-10 while crafting a 2.49 ERA.
- His win total stands tied for fifth on Army's career chart, while his ERA lists sixth. Reich still holds Army records for career strikeouts (259) and strikeouts in a seven-inning game (17, versus Air Force). He also tied the Academy standard for strikeouts in a nine-inning contest, fanning 17 batters in his final collegiate contest. Additionally, Reich stands second on the career innings pitched ledger (260.2).
- He was a three-time league all-star and became the first Black Knight to be named Patriot League Pitcher of the Year (1993). A freshman All-American in 1990, Reich was tabbed first-team All-Eastern College Athletic Conference and first-team Northeast All-American in 1993.
- He was selected to play for Team USA following graduation and also spent a brief stint in the Baltimore Orioles farm system.
- A helicopter pilot, Reich was killed in action when he was 34 during a rescue mission, Operation Red Wings, in Afghanistan. The mission was described in the book Lone Survivor by Marcus Luttrell.
- The 160th AOE, nicknamed the Night Stalkers, provides helicopter aviation support for special operations forces and usually conducts its missions at night with high speeds at low altitude.



A LETTER TO MY YOUNGER SELF

- In the weeks leading up to graduation, first baseman Ross Friedrich penned a letter to his 18-year-old self.
- Friedrich, who graduated with a degree in Systems and Decisions Sciences, reflected on his time at the United States Military Academy and the 47-month Cadet-Athlete experience.
- He posted a .372 batting average, 17 home runs, 58 RBIs, 15 doubles, and 83 hits.
- In his appearance against Lafayette, he broke the program record for home runs in a single season (13, Joey Henshaw, 2009).
- In his appearance in Game 2 of a doubleheader against Navy on April 23, Friedrich batted 2-4 with two runs, an RBI, a double, and a home run.
- At the end of the letter, Friedrich wrote that "Baseball will teach you that failure is where growth occurs. Keep your head up in times of failure and understand that failure will help you grow into the man and leader you desire to be. Lean on our teammates, coaches, mentors, and family to help you in times of failure."
