NOTES

SEASON OVERVIEW

- This year marks the 45th season of Virginia Volleyball, which held its inaugural season in 1979.
- In 44 complete seasons, UVA is 662-749 (.469)
- The Hoos are slated to face three AVCA preseason top-25 teams in No. 4 Louisville (Oct. 15), T-No. 5 Pitt (Oct. 18), at No. 20 Georgia Tech (Oct. 8).
- Virginia's 2023 schedule consists of seven 2022 NCAA Tournament teams in Florida State, Georgia Tech, Louisville, Miami, Pittsburgh, Quinnipiac, and UMBC.
- With a home-and-home series against Virginia Tech, both matches between UVA and the Hokies will be worth 0.5 points toward the Commonwealth Clash standings, presented by Smithfield.
- The Cavaliers are set to host 14 home matches in 2023.
- For the first time in history, Virginia will face Rider (Aug. 25) and Quinnipiac (Sept. 1).

SERIES HISTORY

- For the first time in program history, the Cavaliers will face Rider in their season opener in the Cavalier Classic on Friday at 7 p.m.
- Virginia will face either Rutgers or North Carolina A&T on Saturday. UVA is 4-1 all-time against Rutgers and 1-0 against North Carolina A&T.

- The Cavaliers are 27-17 (.614) all-time in season openers and have won eight of its last 10 season openers. The Hoos have out-matched their opponents 89-60 in total sets all-time in season openers.

CAVALIERS RETURNING IN 2023

- UVA will look to fill the void left seven departing student-athletes from the 2022 roster, including standouts Gabby Easton (S) and Grace Turner (OH). Last season, Easton was a staple in the Virginia rotation, appearing in all 29 games and 115 possible sets where she led the team in assists with 721 and was second on the team in total aces with 23. Turner, who was named to Second Team All-ACC, started in every match for the Hoos in 2022 where she notched six 20-kill performances.
- This season, Virginia returns three starters from 2022 in **Brooklyn Borum** (OH), **Abby Tadder** (MB), **Veresia Yon** (MB). Libero **Madison Morey** also returns for the Cavaliers, she started at the libero position in 20 of 29 matches last year.

VIRGINIA WELCOMES SEVEN NEWCOMERS IN 2023

- Of UVA's 16 active players, seven of them are new to the program.
- The Cavaliers' 2023 roster features three transfers: defensive specialist/libero **Milan Gomillion** (Maryland), outside hitter **Ciera Hecht** (Texas A&M) and setter **Regan Trueblood** (Illinois Springfield).

- The Hoos are also welcoming in four freshmen: defensive specialist/libero **Meredith Reeg**, middle blocker **Nala Cornegy**, middle blocker **Lily Gervase** and outside hitter/right side hitter **Laurny Bowie**.

WHY DON'T YOU JUST MEET ME IN THE MIDDLE?

- Middle blockers **Abby Tadder** and **Veresia Yon** were a steady force for the Hoos in the 2022 campaign and are set to return for another season of action. Tadder appeared in all 29 matches for Virginia while Yon appeared in 25.
- Yon led the Cavaliers in hitting percentage (.333) last year and finished second on the team in total blocks (77.0). Her .333 hitting percentage tied for seventh in the ACC.
- Last season Yon hit .786 (11-0-14) at Boston College (Nov. 4), the best hitting percentage by a UVA player in a five-set series in program history.
- Yon returns for her second year in Charlottesville and is a graduate transfer from West Florida, a premier Division-II program, where she was named the 2021 AVCA South Region Player of the Year and a First Team All-American.
- Tadder led the Cavaliers last year in total blocks (114.0), blocks per set (0.99), block solos (10) and block assists (104).
- Tadder had a career day in the Cavaliers' win over Florida State (Oct. 14) last year, when she posted a career-high 18 kills and hit .517 (18-3-29). Her 18 kills against the Seminoles are the most by a Cavalier middle blocker since Oct. 18, 2015, when Anna Walsh tallied 20 kills at Syracuse.
- Tadder also led UVA with nine blocks against then-No. 10 Pittsburgh (Sept. 28), which tied for third most by an ACC in a single match this season.

SETTING BY COMMITTEE

- Virginia's two setters this season are **Ashley Le** and **Regan Trueblood**.
- Le returns for her third year with the program after appearing in 57 matches and 198 sets for the Hoos. Last season, Le shared setting responsibilities with Gabby Easton. Le finished the 2022 season second on the team in assists (359) and assists per set (3.59). She contributed as a setter in a 6-2 rotation and a defensive specialist in a 5-1 rotation.
- Trueblood transferred to UVA from the University of Illinois Springfield, a Division II program, in January 2023. Trueblood sits at No. 5 all-time in assists for the Prarie Stars with 1,186 and her 780 assists last year were good for No. 8 in UIS single-season history. She also recorded 33 service aces which were good for No. 3 in program history.

THE ACC: THE NATION'S PREMIER VOLLEYBALL CONFERENCE

- For the second year in a row, two ACC teams (Louisville and Pitt) advanced to the NCAA Volleyball Tournament semifinals in 2022.
- Louisville advanced to the NCAA Championship, falling to Texas in three sets.
- Five schools from the ACC earned a spot in the 2022 NCAA Volleyball Tournament, including Louisville, which earned a No. 1 seed in the Tournament for the second year in a row.

UNIQUELY UVA

- The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.
- Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. Campus is never used.
- First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a senior implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process. This tends to be used less in athletic eligibility references.
- Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name Commonwealth instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

- Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are Cavaliers, Wahoos and Hoos.
- Although the terms Cavaliers, Wahoos and Hoos are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, Cavaliers is more often used by the media, while Wahoos and Hoos are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.
- Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players Wahoos during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, Wahoos was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated Hoos sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

- The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

NOTES

UNIVERSITY COLORS: ORANGE AND BLUE

- Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.
- One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, How will this do? UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAHOOWA

- The origin of Wah-hoo-wah is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.
- Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted Where'er You Are into Wah-hoo-wah.

SHANNON WELLS

Head Coach | Third Season

- **Shannon Wells** is in her third season as Virginia Volleyball head coach after being named the program's ninth head coach in program history by UVA director of athletic Carla Williams on April 26, 2021.
- Wells came to Virginia after serving on staff for seven seasons (2014-20) at the University of Florida under volleyball coaching legend Mary Wise. Wells was promoted associate head coach in 2017 after serving as an assistant coach from 2014-16. She also served as the Cavaliers' recruiting coordinator for all seven of her years in Gainesville, where she also mentored seven AVCA All-Americans.
- Last season, Wells guided the Cavaliers to their highest overall win total (12) and best ACC finish in the last three seasons.
- Virginia boasted an 8-3 record in non-conference action in 2022.
- With its five-set triumph over Florida State last season and four-set win at North Carolina in 2021, UVA has recorded wins over NCAA Tournament teams in back-to-back years, which is more than in the previous five years (2016-20).
- Wells also mentored Second Team All-ACC standout Grace Turner, UVA's All-ACC player since 2016.
- In 2021, her first year as a head coach, Wells helped the Cavaliers achieve the program's best start of 8-4 through its first 12 matches since the 2015 season.
- Wells' notable wins in her inaugural campaign included a five-set victory at VCU, three consecutive sweeps over Bellarmine, Georgetown and Fairleigh Dickinson and a four-set triumph at North Carolina.
- Prior to UVA's win over the Tar Heels, the Cavaliers had only defeated UNC once in the last 19 matchups.
- Wells, who signed former UVA middle blocker Alana Walker, guided the graduate transfer to finish the 2021 regular season second in the nation and atop the ACC in blocks per set (1.51). Walker's 1.51 blocks-per-set average was also good for second all-time in a single season in program history. Additionally, Wells mentored UVA outside hitter **Brooklyn Borum**, who was named an ACC All-Freshman Team selection after leading the Cavaliers in kills per set and reception percentage.
- During her tenure at Florida, the Gators went 184-33 (.848) and punched their ticket to seven consecutive NCAA tournaments. Florida won Southeastern Conference titles in 2014, 2016 and 2017. In 2017, the Gators advanced to the NCAA Championship finals for the first time since the 2003 season.
- In 2020, Florida posted a 21-4 record and reached the NCAA Regional finals before falling to top-seed Wisconsin in five sets. The Gators were 19-3 in SEC play, finishing second to eventual NCAA champion Kentucky.
- Wells arrived in Gainesville in the spring of 2014 after serving as the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator for Ole Miss in 2013. She previously spent three years as an assistant coach at Ole Miss prior to her promotion to associate head coach.
- Before her time on the Rebels' coaching staff, Wells spent three seasons as an assistant coach with the Winthrop Eagles of the Big South Conference. Before heading to Winthrop in 2007, Wells began her coaching career at her alma mater, the University of Southern Indiana, as an assistant coach before operating as a graduate assistant for two years at Morehead State in 2005 and 2006.
- An alumna of USI, Wells played four seasons and helped lead her team to 87 wins over that time span – including a school record 27 victories in the 2000 campaign. She ranks first all-time at USI in service aces and kills for her career. A two-time selection as the Great Lakes Valley Conference Scholar Athlete of the Year, Wells was also named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District team in 2002 and was a three-time GLVC All-Academic team selection.
- For her accomplishments in college, Wells was just the second volleyball player to be inducted into the USI Hall of Fame in February 2013.
- She was most recently inducted into the 2015 Great Lakes Valley Conference (GLVC) Hall of Fame.
- Wells served as the chair of the American Volleyball Coaches Association Assistant Coaches Committee with a seat on the AVCA Board of Directors. She is a graduate of the NCAA Women Coaches Academy and a member of The Alliance of Women Coaches and True North Sports Camp Elevate program.
