Series History: UVA leads the series 25-16-9

QUICK KICKS

- Virginia returns home to face No. 17 Duke after going on the road to face Wake Forest over the weekend - a match the Hoos dropped by a score of 2-0 to the Demon Deacons
- Virginia posted four consecutive shutouts and went 444:01 minutes of scoreless soccer to start the year and have five shutouts on the season.
- The UVA defense held opponents to the two goals on only 32 shots through non-conference play and have allowed only six goals on the season.
- The six goals allowed is tied atop the ACC with No. 8 Clemson and Wake Forest for fewest goals allowed this season. Only 20 teams nationally have allowed fewer goals this season.
- **Cayla White** is second in the ACC in goals against average and save percentage this season. She ranks 34th nationally in goals against average and save percentage entering the week.
- Underclassmen have been critical in the offense for the Hoos this season with 17 of 21 goals to date coming from freshmen or sophomores.
- Sophomores **Meredith McDermott** (6) and **Maggie Cagle** (5) and freshman **Allie Ross** (4) have combined to be the top three goal producers for the Cavaliers this season.
- **McDermott** and **Cagle** are both in the top six in the ACC in goals scored this season.
- **McDermott** is tied for second in the ACC in goals scored and is fourth in goals per game (0.60).
- **McDermott** and **Cagle** are tied for second in the ACC in total points this season with 14 to date.
- **Talia Staude** broke into the top 10 at UVA in games started (87) with her start against UNC and is now fourth in career minutes played (8,174) having passed Emily Sonnett at Wake Forest

THE SERIES WITH DUKE

- Virginia and Duke have met 50 times with the Cavaliers leading the all-time series 25-16-9.
- The teams met twice last year with UVA winning 1-0 at Duke and Duke winning 2-1 at Klöckner in an ACC quarterfinal matchup.
- Virginia is 11-5-5 in games played at home and 10-5-5 in games played against Duke at Klöckner Stadium.
- The Cavaliers have gone 3-1-1 against Duke in the last five meetings and the teams are 4-4-2 in the last 10 meetings.
- The nine contests not ending in a draw in the last 11 meetings have all been decided by one goal.

LAST SEASON AGAINST THE BLUE DEVILS

- Virginia picked up the win at Duke in the regular season meeting with a strike from Lia Godfrey in the 28th minute of play.
- Cayla White made six saves in the contest to help the Cavaliers pick up the shutout victory over the Blue Devils.
- Duke returned the favor with a 2-1 victory over the Hoos at Klöckner Stadium in an ACC quarterfinal matchup.
- Michelle Copper scored in the third minute for Duke before Alexa Spaanstra evened things in the 36th minute in that contest.
- The Blue Devils' Kat Rader then hit the go-ahead goal in the 55th minute off a pass from Michelle Cooper.

HOOS PICKED TO FINISH THIRD IN 2023 ACC PRESEASON POLL

- The Cavaliers were picked to finish third in the ACC in a preseason vote of league coaches this season
- Virginia was picked behind league favorite North Carolina and Florida State, but received one first-place vote
- The Cavaliers received 139 points, while FSU received 146 points and North Carolina received 166 points

CAGLE NAMED A PRESEASON ALL-ACC HONOREE

- Sophomore **Maggie Cagle** was named to the preseason All-ACC team in a vote of the league's coaches
- Cagle was an All-ACC Third Team and All-Freshman team selection a year ago

HOOS BACK FOR THE CAVALIERS

- UVA returns 23 players from last year's squad that advanced to the Elite Eight in the NCAA Tournament
- Among those returning are All-ACC selection Maggie Cagle and fellow All-Freshman selection Jill Flammia
- The Hoos return a stout defensive group with starters Samar Guidry, Laney Rouse and Talia Staude all back on the back line
- Goalkeeper Cayla White is also back in goal after posting 13 wins and nine shutouts last season
- Defender Lacey McCormack also returns after logging almost 1,000 minutes a year ago for the Hoos

VIRGINIA WELCOMES ANOTHER HIGHLY-RANKED RECRUITING CLASS TO GROUNDS

- UVA welcomed the fourth-ranked recruiting class to Grounds for this season with a group of five signees in the freshman class
- All five are ranked in the IMG Top 150 and include a pair of top 10 recruits in Yuna McCormack (6) and Victoria Safradin (9)
- Safradin was the top-rated goalkeeper, while McCormack was the rated the No. 2 midfielder in the nation
- Midfielder Ella Carter (27), forward Allie Ross (105) and defender Anyah Collier (139) round out the recruiting class

HOOS ADD A 2022 TOP RECRUIT IN TRANSFER KATHRYN KELLY

- Virginia also added depth to the back line with the addition of transfer Kathryn Kelly in the offseason
- Kelly was rated the No. 7 recruit in the country out of high school and redshirted at UCLA last season

INJURY BUG BITES HOOS EARLY AND HARD IN 2023

- The injury bug bit UVA early with team captain Emma Dawson and three-time All-America Lia Godfrey injured in the offseason
- In addition to the loss of the midfielders, starting defender Laney Rouse had her season end with injury in the opener vs. Nevada
- The Hoos have been without midfielder Brianna Jablonowski since injury in the fourth game of the season at George Mason
- UVA also lost midfielder Jill Flammia for one game - the ACC opener - after an injury in the second half against Iowa

McDERMOTT NAMED ACC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Sophomore forward Meredith McDermott was named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week for week three on Sept. 5
- McDermott scored three goals on the week, including a brace against West Virginia and the opening goal vs. VCU
- McDermott's brace against the Mountaineers was her second of the season and all the offense in the 2-1 victory for UVA
- Her opening goal vs. VCU came in the first minute (0:55) and was the sixth fastest goal in the regular season in UVA history

HOOS SEEING DOUBLE IN EARLY OFFENSIVE OUTBURSTS

- The Cavaliers were seeing double in the non-conference portion of the season with five braces tallied through seven games
- Allie Ross and Meredith McDermott both tallied a brace in the season-opening win against Nevada
- The Hoos then got a brace from Maggie Cagle in the win over Radford with two goals in 12 minutes from the sophomore
- Cagle then turned in another brace with a pair of goals in the 4-0 victory on the road at George Mason
- McDermott followed that up with her brace against West Virginia in the first 20 minutes of play

CAVALIERS STRIKE QUICKLY WITH TWO FIRST-MINUTE GOALS IN 2023

- The Cavaliers have struck quickly twice this season with a pair of goals scored in the first minute in non-conference play
- Maggie Cagle struck at the 0:50 mark against Radford with a penalty kick after she was taken down in the box
- Cagle's strike tied the mark hit by Angela Hucles against Virginia Tech in the 1996 season
- Meredith McDermott struck at the 0:55 mark against West Virginia when Cagle fed her for the opening goal against WVU
- The two goals are the fifth and sixth fastest goals scored by a Hoos in the regular season in program history
- The fastest goal scored in program history was at the 0:20 mark by Kim Smith against Arkansas in the 1992 season

CAVALIERS RESPOND WELL AFTER A LOSS UNDER SWANSON

- Responding after a loss has been a trend for the Cavaliers throughout Steve Swanson's tenure at UVA
- Throughout the 24 seasons under Swanson, Virginia holds a 63-9-14 record in matches following a loss
- The number does not include season-ending losses where the next match would be part of a new season

HOOS ENTER UNFAMILIAR TERRITORY WITH WEEK SIX OF THE SEASON

- The Hoos are in unfamiliar territory entering week six of play and following last week's losses to No. 1 UNC and Wake Forest
- It marks the first time UVA has lost consecutive games in a season since the 2009 season (10/11/09 and 10/17/09)
- UVA dropped a 1-0 decision in overtime to No. 6 Boston College and a 2-1 decision to No. 2 UNC in consecutive games
- That 2009 season marked the last the Hoos were unranked as UVA fell out of the rankings entering the week of the BC match
- Following the consecutive losses in 2009, the Cavaliers got back into the win column against the Duke Blue Devils (10/22/09)

THE HOOS IN OVERTIME IN THE SWANSON ERA

- The Hoos won't be going to overtime until postseason play due to changes in rules, but UVA is no stranger to OT
- Virginia has gone to extra time in 89 matches during the Steve Swanson era with a 24-13-53 record in those matches
- In those 53 draws, 15 have come in the postseason with the Cavaliers surviving shootouts in five of those 15 matches
- UVA played its first overtime game of the 2022 season in the third round with a 3-2 win at No. 2 seed Penn State and followed it up with an overtime match at No. 1 UCLA in the Elite Eight

HOOS CONTINUE STRONG PRESENCE IN PROFESSIONAL RANKS ON NWSL ROSTERS

- UVA has a strong presence in professional soccer in the U.S. with 18 players with NWSL teams this season.
- Becky Sauerbrunn continues her NWSL career with the Portland Thorns.
- Houston has 2022 first-round pick Diana Ordoñez and 2020 first-round pick Courtney Petersen after off-season trades.
- Kansas City has 2023 first-round pick Alexa Spaanstra along with Morgan Gautrat who was traded by Chicago in the off season
- Danielle Colaprico, Makenzy Doniak and Kristen McNabb play for San Diego, while Veronica Latsko, Phoebe McClernon, Laurel Ivory and Emily Sonnett are with OL Reign.
- Megan Reid was picked up by Angel City FC for a second straight season in 2023.
- 2023 first-round pick Haley Hopkins plays for NC Courage along with Brittany Ratcliffe and Sarah Clark.
- Sinead Farrelly signed with NJ/NY Gotham FC for the 2023 season while Taryn Torres is out with injury.
- Virginia is one of only three schools to have a player taken in every NWSL Draft

HOOS HAVE A PRESENCE IN TOP DRAWER SOCCER PRESEASON TOP 100

- Virginia had several players ranked among the top 100 in the preseason by Top Drawer Soccer with three making the list.
- Forward Maggie Cagle led the trio of Hoos on the list as she came in at No. 71 overall.
- Midfielder Jill Flammia came in at No. 77 on the list, while defender Talia Staude was tabbed for the No. 96 spot.
- Goalkeeper Victoria Safradin was named to the preseason Freshman Best XI team by the outlet.

HOOS EARN UNITED SOCCER COACHES TEAM ACADEMIC AWARD FOR 14TH CONSECUTIVE YEAR

- The Cavaliers were named a recipient of the Team Academic Award by the United Soccer Coaches for the 2022-23 year
- It marks the 14th consecutive season for the Hoos to receive the award from the coaches organization
- Teams must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 to be named as a recipient of the award each season

SWANSON HITS THE 400 CAREER COACHING WIN MILESTONE TO PUT HIM AMONG ELITE COMPANY

- UVA head coach Steve Swanson hit a rare milestone vs. NC State (10/25/18), hitting the 400 career win mark
- As a head coach, Swanson holds a 472-170-70 record through stops at Dartmouth, Stanford and Virginia
- Currently only a handful of D1 coaches have hit the 400-win milestone with 11 of them currently active
- The list gained a coach when Merrimack College transitioned to D1 status for this season
- Swanson is one of only nine coaches who has recorded 400+ wins all at a D1 institution

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

- Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.
- First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process. This tends to be used less in athletic eligibility references.
- Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

- Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."
- Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.
- Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

- The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS: ORANGE AND BLUE

- Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.
- One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAHOOWA

- The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.
- Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

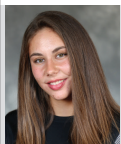

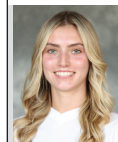
