

FIELD HOCKEY

TEAM NOTES

- The Cavaliers earned their spot in the NCAA Semifinals with a 4-0 victory against Maryland. It was the largest margin of victory in an NCAA Semifinal game since Syracuse defeated Princeton 5-0 in the 2015 NCAA Quarterfinals
- Maryland only had one shot on goal which came 1:34 into the first quarter
- Sophomore back Madison Orsi scored UVA's second goal against Maryland. It was the first of her career
- Orsi the 12th different Cavalier to score a goal this season
- Of the 19 non-goalkeepers to appear in more than one game this season, 16 have either scored a goal or assisted on a goal
- Sophomore midfielder **Daniela Mendez- Trendler** scored her fifth game-winning goal of the year against the Terps. She leads the team with 27 points and a teambest nine goals
- She also scored the game-winner against Saint Joseph's in the NCAA First Round
- Junior back Emily Field has a team-best 10 assists as well as having scored a goal. She had zero career points coming into her third season
- Field has scored a goal or assisted on a goal in five of the last six games
- Junior midfielder **Noa Boterman** scored twice in the ACC Quarterfinal win against Syracuse to give her eight goals this season, tying for the team lead
- Boterman also made her fifth defensive save of the season on Sunday at Maryland. She is tied for fourth in the nation in defensive saves this season
- Junior striker **Taryn Tkachuk** has also tallied eight goals this season, scoring those on 15 shots (.533 shooting percentage). Of those 15 shots, 12 have been on goal
- Grad student striker Laura Janssen and fellow grad student Adele Iacobucci were both key members of the Cavaliers' 2019 Final Four team. Iacobucci has played in 103 games, the most in program history. Janssen is second with 102
- Laura Janssen comes in with the highest career scoring numbers of anyone on the team with 39 career goals and 10 assists across her five seasons
- Adele lacobucci has appeared in more games (103) than any other player in program history
- lacobucci, who was a three-time All-Region First Team selection was named to the All-ACC First Team this year for the first time
- lacobucci has 19 career goals with eight assists for 46 career points

VIRGINIA & THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

- This is UVA's is the 27th trip to the NCAA Championship for the Cavaliers and their 15th in the last 18 years
- The Cavaliers advanced to the NCAA Semifinals for the sixth time in program history. UVA last made the final four in 2019 with a 1-0 victory against Maryland in Charlottesville
- Virginia is looking to advance to the NCAA Finals for the first time in program history

GOALKEEPERS

- Junior goalkeeper Tyler Kennedy has started every game this season for the Cavaliers and has all of the goalie decision
- Kennedy logged her sixth career shutout against Miami (Wake Forest was a combined shutout with Nilou Lempers)
- In 46 career games, Kennedy has a .718 save percentage
- She was named to the All-ACC Second Team this year, her first career postseason honor, and was named the ACC and NFHCA National Defensive Player of the Week during the season
- Freshman goalkeeper **Nilou Lempers** subbed into the Liberty game, playing the fourth quarter. She made one save in 15 minutes in her collegiate debut
- Lempers played the second half of the Wake Forest game but did not face a shot
- Kennedy and Lempers earned the combined shutout against the Demon Deacons

ALL-ACC

- Grad student midfielder Adele lacobucci was named to the All-ACC First Team. She was named to the second team last year
- Junior midfielder Noa Boterman, junior goalkeeper Tyler Kennedy, junior striker Taryn Tkachuk, sophomore midfielder Daniela Mendez-Trendler and sophomore back Madison Orsi were named to the second team

ACC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

- Junior midfielder Noa Boterman and junior back Jans Croon were named to the ACC All-Tournament Team
- Boterman scored two goals with a defensive save in the quarterfinal victory against Syracuse while Croon scored both goals in the 3-2 semifinal loss against UNC

MATCH-UP NOTES

- Virginia and North Carolina have split their two meetings this year. UVA won 3-2 in the regular-season meeting and North Carolina won 3-2 in the ACC Semifinals
- The Cavaliers scored three times in the first eight minutes of the second half in the 3-2 victory against the Heels. Taryn Tkachuk scored the game-winner at the 7:50 mark of the third quarter
- It was the Cavaliers' first victory against the Tar Heels since the title game of the 2016 ACC Championship, snapping a streak of 12 straight losses against UNC
- In the ACC Semifinals, the Tar Heels built a 2-0 lead in the first quarter and held a 3-1 lead in the fourth quarter. Virginia scored a goal with 1:50 left in the game to pull back within one, but the Tar Heels held on for the victory. Jans Croon scored both goals for the Cavaliers

ACC PLAYERS OF WEEK - OCT. 17

- Taryn Tkachuk was named the Co-Offensive Player of the Week and Adele lacobucci was the Defensive Player of the Week
- Tkachuk tallied seven points last weekend in a pair of road victories, scoring two goals with an assist at Wake Forest in the first multi-goal game of her career. She scored UVA's regulation goal in the 2-1 double-overtime victory at No. 2 Duke
- lacobucci made a game-saving defensive save in the first overtime against Duke.
 She also helped the Cavaliers hold the Demon Deacons to zero shots on goal in Friday's 5-0 shutout victory

NATIONAL PLAYER OF WEEK - SEPT. 12

- Tyler Kennedy was named the NFHCA Division I National Defensive Player of the Week and the ACC Defensive Player of the Week after logging a combined eight saves in the wins against William & Mary and Harvard (Sept. 12)
- The Harvard game was her second shutout of the season and the fifth of her career

- It was the first career ACC Player of the Week honor in her career and her first NFHCA national honor
- She is the first Cavalier to be named the NFHCA National Player of the Week since goalkeeper Taylor Henriksen in the 2020 season

SENIOR WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAMS

- Mia Abello is on the 2023-24 USWNT roster. She was also named to the team in 2022-23 while she was still in high school (The Kinkaid School, Houston, Texas), but she has yet to earn an international cap with the senior women's national team
- Jans Croon is a member of the US Women's National Hockey5s Team, helping to lead the squad to a gold medal and the 2023 Pan Am Cup and earn a spot in the Hockey5s World Cup that will be held in Oman in January 2024
- Lauren Kenah is on the US Women's National Indoor Team and suited up for the squad at the 2023 Women's World Cup in February, 2023 in Pretoria, South Africa

JUNIOR NATIONAL TEAMS

- Jans Croon, Mia Abello, Madison
 Orsi and Daniela Mendez-Trendler are
 members of the US U21 team that won
 gold at the 2023 Junior Pan American
 Championships in Barbados in April
- All four have been named to the roster for the 2023 FIH Hockey Women's Junior World Cup, being held in December in Santiago, Chile

ACTING HEAD COACH OLE KEUSGEN

- Associate head coach Ole Keusgen has been a member of the coaching staff since 2015. This is his ninth season with the team and third season as associate head coach
- In his time in Charlottesville, Keusgen has helped lead the team to the 2016 ACC Championship and the 2019 NCAA Semifinals as well as seven NCAA tournament bids
- Keusgen was the head coach of the U.S. U-19 Women's National Team in 2019 after serving as a coach for the program and a mentor for the Junior High Performance program in 2017. He has also served as the head coach of the US Rise National Team, the de-facto U-19 junior national team
- Keusgen has been playing field hockey since the age of six, including playing professionally in Germany with one of the most successful field hockey clubs in European history, Uhlenhorst Mülheim, winning the German Indoor championship in 2015 and the Euro Indoor Club Cup in 2015


