GAME OVERVIEW

- For the second consecutive year, Virginia will host Michigan at Klöckner Stadium in its season opener on Saturday (Feb. 10) at noon on ACC Network.
- \cdot Both teams advanced to the 2023 NCAA Quarterfinals site in Albany, N.Y. last season.
- The Cavaliers are ranked No. 3 in both the USILA coaches poll and the Inside Lacrosse media poll.
- Michigan is ranked No. 8 in the most recent USILA poll, which marks the highest ranking by a UVA
 opponent in a season opener since 2019, when the Cavaliers faced then-No. 4 Loyola.

SEASON OVERVIEW

- This season, the Cavaliers will host eight regular-season games at Klöckner Stadium, including two ACC contests against North Carolina (April 6) and Notre Dame (April 27).
- Virginia returns seven starters from its 2023 roster, including two-time Tewaaraton Award finalist **Connor Shellenberger**, 2023 USILA Preseason All-American **Payton Cormier**, 2022 ACC Defensive Player of the Year **Cole Kastner** and 2022 ACC Freshman of the Year **Matthew Nunes**.

2023 SEASON RECAP

- Virginia finished its 2023 season with an overall record of 13-4, marking the Cavaliers' seventh consecutive winning season.
- For the third time in their last four opportunities, the Cavaliers reached Championship Weekend after NCAA Tournament wins over Richmond and Georgetown.
- For the second consecutive year and 12th time in program history, Connor Shellenberger was named one of the nation's five Tewarraton Finalists.

THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

COMPARISONS (2023)

2023 SEASON RECAP (CONTINUED)

- Despite knocking off Notre Dame in both regular-season matchups last season, Virginia fell to the Fighting Irish in overtime, 13-12, in the NCAA semifinals at Lincoln Financial Field.
- Shellenberger combined for 11 goals and 11 assists in three tournament games and was named to the NCAA All-Tournament Team for the second time of his career.
- The Cavaliers did return a total of 18 players from 2023 to this year.
- Virginia had arguably its most prolific seasons offensively as the Cavaliers set program records in goals (293), assists (195) and points (488).
- Former UVA midfielder Thomas McConvey was named the program's seventh recipient of the Lt. j.g. Donald MacLaughlin Jr. Award, which is given to the nation's top midfielder.
- Xander Dickson set the program's single-season goals record with 61. He is UVA's only 60-goal scorer in a single season.

SERIES HISTORY

- · Virginia and Michigan squared off for the first time in last year's season opener, which was also held at Klöckner Stadium.
- •The Cavaliers defeated U-M 17-13 and never trailed in the game, but only led by one goal [13-12] entering the fourth quarter. **Payton Cormier** (5g, 2a), **Connor Shellenberger** (3g, 3a) and Thomas McConvey (3g, 2a) led the Hoos offensively, while **Matthew Nunes** tallied 15 saves in the win.
- · Virginia held the Wolverines' extra-man unit scoreless on four opportunities.
- During his tenure as head coach at Brown University, **Lars Tiffany** defeated Michigan twice by a score of 22-9 and 22-8 in 2015 and 2016, respectively.
- In addition to the Wolverines, UVA will also challenge Big Ten foes, Ohio State (Feb. 25), Johns Hopkins (March 2) and Maryland (March 16) later this season.

THE CAVALIERS AT KLÖCKNER STADIUM

- Virginia owns a 173-45 (.794) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 7-2 record in 2023, and has won 20 of its last 25 games played at the historic edifice.
- The Cavaliers' average margin of victory in their last 25 games at Klöckner Stadium is 5.68 goals.
- · Virginia is 47-13 (.783) all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach Lars Tiffany.
- UVA is also 14-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in NCAA Tournament contests.
- · Lacrosse debuted in Klöckner Stadium in 1993.

CONNOR SHELLENBERGER IS ELITE

- Virginia attackman Connor Shellenberger returns for his final collegiate season in 2024.
- Shellenberger guided the Hoos to Championship Weekend last season after leading the nation in assists (3.38/gm).
- Shellenberger, who enters 2024 with 140 career assists, needs just 20 more to break Tim Whiteley's all-time assists record.
- With 239 points, Shellenberger needs just 38 points to break Matt Moore's program record of 276 points.
- Shellenberger is one of just two Cavaliers to garner USILA First Team All-America honors, the other being former defenseman Ken Clausen.
- In addition to being a Tewaaraton finalist for the second time of his career in 2023, Shellenberger garnered NCAA All-Tournament honors after combining for 11 goals and 11 assists in the Cavaliers' three tournament games last season.

PAYTON CORMIER ON UVA'S CAREER GOALS LIST

- Payton Cormier, who has led UVA in goals the past two seasons needs just seven goals to break Doug Knight's UVA career goals record.
- Among all of UVA's 100-career goal scorers, Cormier is the only one to average at least 2.89 goals per game.
- Cormier is the only player in program history to log two 50-goal seasons, having recorded 52 goals last year and 50 goals in 2022.
- In 15 appearances in 2023, he recorded 12 multi-goal games, including 10 hat tricks.

HOOS IN THE NATIONAL STATISTICAL RANKINGS IN 2022

- ·Last year, Virginia finished as the nation's leader in assists (11.47/gm), ground balls (39.65/gm), points (28.71/gm), scoring offense (17.24/gm) and shot percentage (.381).
- Dating back to 2009, the Cavaliers finished in the top-3 nationally in ground balls in all but one season. Since 2009, UVA has led the nation in ground balls nine times, including in six seasons under Tiffany.
- With 54 assists 16 games played, Connor Shellenberger was the 2023 NCAA Division-I statistical champion in assists (3.38/gm).

VIRGINIA'S SIX PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Six Cavaliers in **Connor Shellenberger** (first team), **Cole Kastner** (first team), **Payton Cormier** (third team), **Griffin Schutz** (third team), **Chase Yager** (third team) and **Noah Chizmar** (honorable mention) were named Inside Lacrosse Preseason All-Americans.
- Virginia's six honorees are good for third most among all programs nationally.

VIRGINIA'S RECORD WHEN...

- In 2023, the Cavaliers finished 12-1 when leading their opponents after three quarters.
- UVA combined to outscore its opponents 238-153 in the first three periods of 2023, which is an average lead of 5.0 goals entering the fourth period.
- Last season ,the Cavaliers went 10-0 when leading at halftime and 1-1 when tied at the half.
- In 2023, Virginia was 12-1 when dishing out more assists than its opponent.

ACC CHAMPIONSHIP PEDIGREE

- Virginia has claimed at least a share of 19 ACC championships, including two (2019 & 2022) under head coach Lars Tiffany.
- The Cavaliers won 11 titles (1962, 1964, 1969, 1970, 1971, 1975, 1980, 1983, 1984, 1985 and 1986) prior the ACC establishing a tournament from 1989-2019 to determine the champion.
- · Virginia has won seven ACC Tournament championships: 1997, 1999, 2000, 2003, 2006, 2010 and 2019.
- In the last ACC Tournament, which was held in 2019 at Klöckner Stadium, UVA defeated Notre Dame 10-4 in the championship game.
- From 1989-2019, Virginia won 14 regular-season titles (1990, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2006, 2009, 2010, 2012 and 2019), more than any other ACC School.
- The ACC Tournament returns this season and will be contested at American Legion Stadium in Charlotte, N.C. on May 3 and 5.

- •No. 3 Virginia has been ranked in the top 5 of the USILA Coaches poll in 328 weeks all-time.
- UVA has been ranked in the top 10 in 468 polls all-time, including in the most recent edition of the poll.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- In 2023, UVA led the nation in ground balls per game (39.65) for the ninth time since 2009.
- It also marked the eighth consecutive year the Cavaliers finished in the top-2 nationally in ground balls.
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the top-3 nationally in ground balls per game 14 times over the last 15 seasons.
- The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.

- Junior goalie **Matthew Nunes** set the Virginia single-season program record with 213 saves in 17 games last season.
- Nunes broke Alex Rode's 2021 program record of 212 saves, which Rode achieved in 16 games.
- During his freshman season in 2022, Nunes broke Tillman Johnson's program freshman record with 159 saves.
- In 2023, Nunes led all ACC goalies in save percentage (551) among conference games only.
- He finished second overall in the ACC in goals-against average (11.95) and saves per game (14.33) last season.
- · Nunes has been at his best in the biggest of games (see chart below).

25TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE 1999 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM

- · This year marks the 25th anniversary of the Cavaliers' 1999 national championship team, the program's second NCAA title.
- The 12-10 victory over Syracuse in College Park, Md., ended Virginia's 26-year drought since it won its first title in 1972.
- · After the '72 championship run, the Hoos reached the NCAA title game four times (1980, 1986, 1994, 1996), but lost in overtime each time.
- · In 1999, the third-seeded Cavaliers knocked off No. 2 seed Johns Hopkins in the semifinals before defeating the eighth-seeded Orange.
- · SU nearly sent the game into overtime as the Orange scored five consecutive goals in the fourth quarter to close to within one [10-9] with 3:36 remaining. UVA then received goals from freshman attackman Conor Gill, who was also named the tournament's most outstanding player, and senior midfielder Henry Oakey (Charlottesville, Va.) in a 21-second span.
- · In addition to Gill, Ryan Curtis, Derek Kenney, Jay Jalbert, Tucker Radebaugh and Court Weisleder were named all-tournament team selections.
- ·The '99 championship run marked the first of four (99, 03, 06, 11) by the Cavaliers under former head coach Dom Starsia.
- · Virginia will honor members of the 1999 for Alumni Weekend at Klöckner Stadium for the Cavaliers' ACC opener against North Carolina on Saturday, April 6.



LARS TIFFANY LEADS HAUDENOSAUNEE NATIONAL TEAM AT 2023 **WORLD LACROSSE CHAMPIONSHIPS**

- · Last summer, Virginia head coach Lars Tiffany guided the Haudenosaunee national team to a third-place finish at the 14th World Lacrosse Games, which were held in San Diego, Calif.
- The Haudenosaunee roster featured star attackman Lyle Thompson and Zed Williams '17, who played close defense instead of his natural position, attack.
- · Tiffany grew up near the Onondaga Nation, located just outside of Syracuse, N.Y.
- · His Alfie Jacques' wooden stick is a close memento made for Tiffany's late father, Bradford.
- · Tiffany often reflects on the roots of the game and admiration of the Onondaga in interviews and press conferences (via Inside Lacrosse).

OVERVIEW

Lars Tiffany was named Virginia's 17th head coach on June 21, 2016. He is currently in his seventh season at UVA and 19th season overall as head coach. Tiffany is Virginia's only head coach to win back-to-back national championships (2019 & 2021). Tiffany begins the 2023 season with 67 wins as UVA head coach, good for No. 3 all-time in program history behind only Jim "Ace" Adams (137) and Dom Starsia (274).

KEVIN CASSESE NAMED ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH

- · Last summer, head coach Lars Tiffany announced the addition Kevin Cassese as the program's associate head coach and offensive coordinator.
- Cassese spent the previous 16 seasons as the head coach of Lehigh University, where he became the school's all-time winningest coach and guided the Mountain Hawks to three Patriot League titles.
- · A total of 21 Lehigh players achieved USILA All-America status under Cassese's tutelage, including 2021 first-team faceoff specialist Mike Sisselberger, who set the NCAA Division-I single season faceoff win percentage record (79.5).
- Prior to serving as Lehigh head coach, Cassese was an assistant coach at his alma mater, Duke, from 2005-07. In 2007, Cassese and the Blue Devils reached the NCAA Championship game, which marked the program's second national championship appearance. He also served as Duke's interim head coach for part of the summer of 2006.
- In 2005, Cassese was an assistant coach and offensive coordinator at Stony Brook under Tiffany and conducted the nation's top man-up unit. Tiffany, Cassese and the Seawolves finished the season with a 10-6 overall record.
- · A National Lacrosse Hall of Fame class of 2018 inductee, Cassese enjoyed an illustrious playing career at Duke from 2000-03, where he was twice team captain and Tewaaraton Award finalist (2002-03). a three-time All-American (2001-03), and the recipient of the Lt. j.g. Donald MacLaughlin Jr. Outstanding Midfielder award (2002). He was named ACC Player of the Year in 2001 and garnered All-ACC honors three times (2001-03).
- After his collegiate playing career, Cassese was selected second overall by the Rochester Rattlers in the 2003 MLL draft. He went on to play professionally for seven seasons and was a two-time all-star, including in 2006 when he was the game's MVP.
- Cassese represented the United States at the World Championships on four occasions, including as an assistant coach in 2014. As a midfielder, he helped the U.S. win gold in 2002 and 2010. He served as Team USA's captain in 2010.
- Cassese graduated from Duke in 2003 with a bachelor's degree in sociology. He was named a USILA Scholar All-American and named one of four ACC student-athletes conference wide to receive Weaver-James-Corrigan Honorary Award, which recognized student-athletes for outstanding athletic and academic achievement.
