### Virginia at NCAA Championships

Championship History: UVA makes its 44th appearance  
 Of Note: UVA has four qualifiers for 2024 event with Justin McCoy earning his fifth NCAA bid



### QUICK SHOTS

- The Hoos head into the 2024 NCAA Championships making the program's 44th appearance at the event
- **Justin McCoy** is the only Cavalier in the field who has wrestled at an NCAA Championship as he earned his fifth berth this season with his runner-up finish at the ACC Championships.
- Three Cavaliers are making their first appearance with **Marlon Yarbrough** (133), **Nick Hamilton** (165) and **Krystian Kinsey** (197) all earning bids or the first time.
- Virginia has been no stranger to wrestling on the road this year with only two home competitions on the schedule. UVA went 7-2 to start the year with the first nine duals on the road or at neutral sites.
- The Hoos have three competing wrestlers ranked in the InterMat rankings as Marlon Yarbrough checks in at No. 22 at 133 and Nick Hamilton is No. 22 at 165. Justin McCoy is No. 16 at 174 pounds.
- Justin McCoy is 17-5 on the season with all five defeats coming at the hands of nationally-ranked opponents. He went 10-3 in dual action with a 2-1 overtime loss to No. 18 Max Maylor and a 2-0 loss to No. 2 Mekhi Lewis and a 4-2 loss to No. 18 Luca Augustine.
- **Nick Hamilton** brought home the program's 94th individual ACC Championship when he claimed the title at 165 pounds earlier this month to lock up his bid to the annual event.

### VIRGINIA IN THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

- UVA had wrestlers receive bids to the NCAA Championships for the 40th consecutive season in 2024
- The Cavaliers' best finish under head coach Steve Garland is 15th in the 2010 and 2017 championships
- The best finish all-time for Virginia came in the program's first appearance - 10th place in 1957
- Virginia has had four finalists at the NCAA Championships - Henry Jordan (1957 - HWT), Steve Garland (2000 - 125), George DiCamillo (2017 - 141) and Jack Mueller (2019 - 125)
- In addition to his finals appearance in 2019, Mueller also advanced to the semifinals in the 2017 NCAA Championships and took a sixth-place finish after having to medically withdraw from competition
- All-time, Virginia has had 17 wrestlers garner All-America honors. Three of them earned the honor multiple times with Chris Henrich, Nick Sulzer and Jack Mueller being three-time All-Americans

### HOOS AGAINST THE FIELD

- **Justin McCoy** has extensive experience against the field with 10 matches against wrestlers in the bracket at 174 pounds and has gone 5-5 in those 10 matches.
- McCoy's five losses include one injury default, three by two points or less and one to top-seed Mekhi Lewis on a takedown with eight seconds left in the finals at the ACC Championships.
- McCoy's opening match is a rematch against Brody Conley who he beat in an 11-6 decision in the quarterfinals of the Midlands Championships.
- **Marlon Yarbrough** faced six wrestlers in the field that includes a season split with Sam Latona - a win by major decision and a loss on riding time in tie breaks in the ACC Championships - and a one point loss to Dylan Ragusin of Michigan.
- **Nick Hamilton** had tight matches in his six matches against the field - including a wins in the ACC Championships over Derek Fields (NC State) and Connor Brady (VT) to avenge regular-season losses.
- **Krystian Kinsey** had seven matches in the field, all of them ACC opponents and will face ACC foe and second-seeded Trent Hilday in the opening round of competition on Thursday.

**HAMILTON GRABS FIRST INDIVIDUAL ACC CHAMPIONSHIP**

- Nick Hamilton brought home Virginia's 94th individual ACC Championship when he claimed the title at 165 pounds
- Hamilton repeated his victory over North Carolina's Isaias Estrada of UNC in the opening round before taking down top-seeded Derek Fields in the semifinals in tie breaks to advance to the finals
- Hamilton then defeated third-seeded Connor Brady in the finals to lock up the title - his first for the Hoos.

**MCCOY ENTERS NEW TERRITORY AS FIVE-TIME NCAA QUALIFIER**

- Justin McCoy became the program's first five-time NCAA qualifier when he locked up his bid with the runner-up finish at the ACC Championships
- He became the program's 14th four-time NCAA qualifier last season with his bid to the 2023 NCAA Championships
- McCoy advanced to the blood round

**PATIENCE AND PERSEVERANCE PAY OFF FOR KINSEY**

- Hard work and perseverance paid off for Krystian Kinsey as the sixth-year earned his first NCAA Championship bid
- Kinsey began his career at 165 pounds in the 2018-19 season and saw limited action through his first five seasons as he worked his way up in weight each year.
- In this, his final season, Kinsey earned the automatic bid at 197 pounds after advancing to the third-place match at the ACC Championships that included an upset of Andy Smith of Virginia Tech in the consolation semis

**REDSHIRTS PLAYED BIG ROLE FOR CAVALIERS IN 2023-24**

- Virginia welcomed a group of newcomers to Grounds for the 2022-23 season that includes the No. 8 signing class in the nation according to FloWrestling and the group redshirted last season
- Among those freshmen were six wrestlers ranked in the top 100 nationally and included nine wrestlers who won state titles in their senior campaigns and two state runners-up.
- Six of those redshirts have found themselves as staples in the lineup this season with Kyle Montaperto (125), Jack Gioffre (141), Michael Gioffre (149), Nick Sanko (157), Nick Hamilton (165) and Griffin Gammell (184)
- Three of those have been nationally ranked this season with both Gioffre brothers and Hamilton in the rankings.

**VIRGINIA HEAD COACH STEVE GARLAND AT A GLANCE ...**

- Head coach Steve Garland is in his 18th year at the helm of his alma mater.
- He is the winningest coach all-time in the Virginia wrestling program, passing George Edwards with a win over Southern Virginia (11/2/20)
- His UVA wrestlers have won 12 All-America honors and 21 individual ACC titles.
- Garland guided UVA to six straight top-30 finishes at the NCAA Championships (2000-15) marking the first time UVA recorded six straight NCAA top-30 finishes in program history.
- The 2010 ACC Coach of the Year, Garland led Virginia to an ACC championship and a 15th-place finish at NCAAs in 2010 (UVA's best NCAA finish since 1957) and matched that 15th-place finish in 2017.
- He is an alum of the program and was the NCAA runner-up at 125 pounds in 2000 and the 1997 ACC champ at 126 pounds.

**MCCOY, YARBROUGH PLACE AT MIDLANDS TO LEAD HOOS**

---

- Two Hoos led the Cavaliers in competition at the Midlands Championships with Justin McCoy and Marlon Yarbrough both ascending the podium at the prestigious event.
- McCoy went 4-1 at the event, storming into the semifinals before injury forced him to withdraw from that semifinal bout against No. 13 Phil Conigliaro of Harvard and medically forfeit the rest of the tournament.
- Yarbrough went 3-3 at the event, taking eighth place after he was injured in prior to the seventh-place bout and was forced to medically forfeit out of the remainder of his matches.
- Three Hoos advanced to the second day of competition as Nick Sanko (157) fell to No. 16 Chase Saldate of Michigan State and went 4-2 at the event.

- UVA's coaching staff consists of four former All-Americans, including a trio of NCAA finalists and an NCAA Champion.
- Head coach Steve Garland was the national runner-up at 125 pounds in 2000.

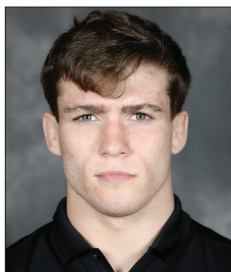

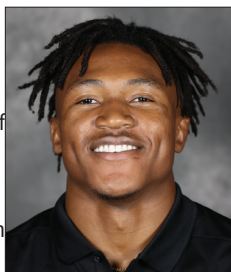
