Division I Semifinal • #6 Virginia vs. #7 Maryland

General

- Saturday was the 10th NCAA tournament meeting between Virginia and Maryland, and the second in the national semifinals, with the last meeting coming in 2002 (14-4 Virginia win)
- Saturday was the first postseason meeting since 2022 quarterfinals (Maryland win 18-9 en-route to national championship)
- Maryland now holds a 51-47 all-time advantage in the storied series that has had 98 matchups in 99 years.
- Virginia's Lars Tiffany and Maryland's John Tillman are two of just three active Division I Head Coaches with two or more NCAA championships
- Today's Semifinal attendance of 32,269 is the highest since 2019 (also at Lincoln Financial Field, featuring Penn State/Yale/Virginia/Duke)
- Today is the The 12th-largest semifinal crowd in tournament history, and 20th semifinal weekend with over 30,000 fans in attendance.

#7 Maryland

- Maryland is tied with Johns Hopkins with 29 Final Four trips, the most in NCAA history.
- Eighth national championship game appearance under John Tillman

- Terrapins are making 22nd consecutive NCAA tournament appearance, the longest streak in NCAA history (second place is six consecutive trips shared by Virginia and Georgetown).
- Advances to 16th national final with win, will be playing for a fifth NCAA championship
- Maryland is 73-41 all-time in NCAA tournament games
- Maryland has now played in the second-most NCAA tournaments (behind only Johns Hopkins)
- Maryland is 122-19 since 2015 when scoring at least 10 goals (6-1 this season)
- Under John Tillman, the Terrapins have won 161 of 183 games in which they have scored 10 goals
- With his goal with 11:12 left in the second quarter, Daniel Maltz moved into a tie for 24th in Maryland program history for career points
- Second hat-trick of the season for Daniel Kelly (also against Rutgers on 4/13)
- Wierman and Maltz each have now played in 12 NCAA tournament games
- Maryland junior defender Colin Burlace scored his second goal of the season, and first since February 10 against Loyola (Md.)
- Maryland is now 5-0 when leading after the first quarter
- Maryland is now 7-1 when leading at halftime
- Maryland is now 7-0 when leading after the third quarter

#6 Virginia

- McCabe Millon, the nation's top rookie in both goals and points this season, scored his 40th goal of the season with 6:41 in the second quarter, tying a Virginia freshman record. He then broke the freshman record with his 41st tally (7:13 remaining in regulation).
- Maryland held the Cavaliers to just six shots on goal in the first half (21 total shots)
- The NCAA's career all-time goals leader Payton Cormier extended his lead with his 224th career goals in the fourth quarter. He is also Virginia's single-season record holder for goals (65 goals)
- Only team in NCAA lacrosse to advance to four of the last five national championship weekends

- 13-3 in last 16 national tournament games since 2019

– Just the second time the Cavaliers have been held to single-digit goals this season ... both previous instances were against No. 1 Notre Dame April 27 and May 3).
