

FIELD HOCKEY

TEAM NOTES

- Virginia moved back up to a No. 3 ranking in this week's NFHCA Coaches Poll. The Cavaliers have been ranked in the top-four all season
- Virginia retained the No. 3 spot in the NCAA RPI rankings. With a field of 18 teams in the NCAA Championship, there are only four host sites for first and second round games
- Senior back **Emily Field** ranks 10th in the nation and second in the ACC in assists per game (0.67)
- Field has 10 assists, posting doubledigit assists for the second straight year, one shy of matching her 10 last season. Field did not record a point in either her freshman or sophomore seasons
- Sophomore Emma Watchilla scored her then team-leading six goal of the season in the win against Syracuse. She scored one goal her freshman season
- Watchilla is tied for second on the team in points with 12. Grad student Suze Leemans also has 12 points on five goals and two assists
- Junior midfielder **Daniela Mendez- Trendler** continues to lead the team in points with 16 (six goals, four assists). She moved back into a tie for the team lead in goal with her double-overtime game-winner last Friday at Wake Forest
- Three of Mendez-Trendler's goals have been game-winners
- In her three seasons at UVA, Mendez-Trendler has 23 goals and 16 assists for 62 career points
- Sophomore **Mia Abello** went 2-for-2 in the shootout against Syracuse, including converting the game-winner. She also converted a penalty stroke against Miami
- Abello was a defender last year. She made the transition to the midfield last spring and has been playing up all this year
- Of Abello's five goals, three have been game-winners
- Senior back **Jans Croon** scored the gametying goal against Syracuse, converting a penalty corner opportunity with 3:12 remaining in regulation. It was Croon's third goal of the year. She scored UVA's regulation goal at Wake Forest, at the time giving the Cavaliers a 1-0 lead
- Junior back **Madison Orsi** assisted on UVA's first goal on Friday against Wake Forest, becoming the 16th player on the team to log a point this year. Virginia has 16 field players who have appeared in more than five games this year, with all of them now with at least one point. 13 of the 16 have scored a goal (only Field, Orsi and Meghen Hengerer have not)

- Virginia has only allowed two goals in the first quarter this year and nine in the first half
- Virginia is averaging 2.44 goals per game and allowing its opponents 1.50
- 11 of Virginia's 16 games this year have been decided by one goal. UVA is 10-1 in those close games including an overtime win, a double overtime win and a shootout victory. UVA's only one-goal loss came in the overtime game against Boston College
- The Cavaliers 9-0 start was their best start since 2010

UVA IN THE ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

- Virginia finished in a three-way tie for second place in the ACC (with Duke and Boston College) but is the No. 4 seed in the tournament by virtue of tiebreaker (goal differential in conference contests)
- Virginia won its lone ACC title in 2016 at Kentner Stadium, defeating North Carolina in the final
- Virginia has advanced to the ACC final in two of the last three years
- Virginia is 15-3 all-time against Syracuse, winning the last 12 meetings
- 11 of the last 12 matches between UVA and Cuse have been decided by a onegoal differential including six that have gone into overtime
- The two teams played twice last season, with UVA winning 3-2 in double overtime in the regular season at Syracuse and 3-2 in regulation in the first round of the ACC tournament in Charlottesville
- The 2024 contest went to a shootout that extended into a sudden-death shootout after it was tied 2-2 after both teams made their initial five attempts. Mia Abello had the winning attempt for the Cavaliers as they took the shootout 4-3 (and the game 3-2)
- Syracuse's last victory against UVA was in the 2015 ACC Championship semifinals. The game went to overtime
- Virginia has been eliminated from the ACC Championship by North Carolina in six of its last eight tournament runs
- Virginia is the last team to defeat UNC with its 3-2 victory in Charlottesville on Oct. 20, 2023

HEAD COACH OLE KEUSGEN

- Ole Keusgen has been a member of the coaching staff since 2015. He spent six years as an assistant coach and three as the associate head coach before being named the head coach on Nov. 21, 2023
- This is his 10th season with the team
- He was the acting head coach for the final six games of the 2023 season (one regular season game, two ACC Championship games and three NCAA Tournament games), going 4-2 in those contests including leading the team to the NCAA Semifinals
- · As acting head coach, Keusgen guided the Cavaliers to a 3-2 comeback victory against Syracuse in the quarterfinals of the ACC Championship and, in a signature victory, defeated fourth-seeded Maryland 4-0 in the NCAA quarterfinals with the UVA defense holding the Terrapins to just one shot on goal
- In his time in Charlottesville, Keusgen has helped lead the team to the 2016 ACC Championship and the 2019 and 2023 NCAA Semifinals as well as eight NCAA tournament bids

- Keusgen was the head coach of the U.S. U-19 Women's National Team in 2019 after serving as a coach for the program and a mentor for the Junior High Performance program in 2017. He has also served as the head coach of the US Rise National Team, the de-facto U-19 junior national team
- Keusgen has been playing field hockey since the age of six, including playing professionally in Germany with one of the most successful field hockey clubs in European history, Uhlenhorst Mülheim, winning the German Indoor championship in 2015 and the Euro Indoor Club Cup in 2015

ASSISTANT COACHES

- Carrera Lucas was named as an assistant coach in February
- Lucas was a member of the Virginia field hockey team for five seasons (2014-18), including the Cavaliers' 2016 ACC Championship campaign, twice being named to the Longstreth/NFHCA All-South Region Second Team. In her final season, the goalkeeper led the ACC in save percentage (ranking fourth in the NCAA) and saves per game, earning two ACC Defensive Player of the Week nods as well as being named the NFHCA National Defensive Player of the Week and earning an invitational to play in the Victory Sports Tours/NFHCA Senior Game
- After graduating from Virginia, Lucas spent five seasons as an assistant coach at Villanova, focusing on coaching the team's goalkeepers. In 2022, she helped lead the team to its most victories since 2006 and the fifth-best winning percentage in program history. In 2023, the Wildcats made the BIG EAST semifinals for the first time since 2018
- · Assistant coach Alyssa Parker played on the US Women's Senior National Team for five years, retiring after collecting her 50th international cap. As a member of Team USA, she competed in the FIH Pro League from 2019-20, including a ninthplace finish in 2019, and participated in the 2019 FIH Olympic Qualifier in Bhubaneswar, India. She played collegiately at Maryland, playing her freshman and sophomore seasons in the ACC, including winning the league title in 2013, before closing out her career with the Terps in the Big Ten. She was a twotime NFHCA All-Region honoree (2014-15) and won the Big Ten Sportsmanship award in 2014
- Parker gave birth to a son, Parker Harold Rosenblumon August 20, 2024, and was back on the sidelines within weeks

- Jans Croon is a member of the US Women's National Hockey5s Team, helping to lead the squad to a gold medal and the 2023 Pan Am Cup and earn a spot in the Hockey5s World Cup that will be held in Oman in January 2024
- Madison Orsi has been named to the roster for the 2024-25 US Women's National Indoor team. The senior squad will participate in the RohrMax Cup from December 30 to January 6 in Vienna, Austria before the 2025 FIH Indoor Hockey World Cup (IHWC) to be held February 3 to 9 in Porec, Croatia
- Lauren Kenah was on the US Women's National Indoor Team and suited up for the squad at the 2023 Women's World Cup in February, 2023 in Pretoria, South Africa

JUNIOR NATIONAL TEAMS

- Jans Croon, Mia Abello and Daniela Mendez-Trendler are members of the US U21 team that won silver at the 2024 Junior Pan American Championships in Surrey, British Columbia in July, qualifying for next year's World Cup
- They also played on the gold-medal winning 2023 Junior Pan American Championships Barbados and the 2023 FIH Hockey Women's Junior World Cup in Santiago, Chile, last December

OLYMPIC GOLD MEDALIST

- Former Cavalier Pien Dicke won a gold medal at the 2024 Paris Olympics, playing for the Netherlands
- Dicke was the 2017 ACC Freshman of the Year and a First-Team All-American in her lone season with the Cavaliers beforereturning to the Netherlands to begin competing in the Dutch national team system
- Dicke is the first medalist in program history and the third Olympian, joining Michelle Vittese (Team USA, London 2012 and Rio 2016) and Paige Selenski (Team USA London 2012)
- Dicke had been a reserve on the team and was moved to the active roster for the gold medal match against China after Joosje Burg suffered a broken nose in the semifinal victory against Argentina
