## OPENING DRAW

### GAME OVERVIEW

- No. 18 Virginia (2-2) looks to reclaim the E. Doyle Smith Cup as the Cavaliers continue their three-game road swing Saturday (March 1), when they face No. 7 Johns Hopkins (4-1) in the 99th all-time meeting of the series.
- Opening faceoff from Homewood Field is set for noon on ESPNU.

### LAST TIME THEY MET

- In last year's NCAA Tournament quarterfinal at Towson, Connor Shellenberger's double-overtime goal [11-10] secured Virginia's spot at Championship Weekend for the fourth time in the previous five opportunities.
- The Cavaliers held Hopkins scoreless for nearly the final 23 minutes, a span in which UVA claimed the game's last four goals.
- Just minutes from his hometown, attackman **McCabe Millon** (3g, 3a) led the Hoos offensively with six points. Defensively, the Cavaliers were led by LSM **Ben Wayer**, who collected a career-high 10 ground balls. Wayer also dished out one assist and added two caused turnovers.
- Between the fourth quarter and both overtime periods, Hopkins committed nine turnovers, including three failed clears in the fourth.
- Goaltender **Kyle Morris** (8 saves) checked into the game midway through the first period and earned his first career win. Morris came up with a pair of clutch saves in the first sudden-death period to keep the Hoos afloat.

## THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

### UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

### UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

### THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

### UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

### WAHOOWAH

The origin of "Wahoowah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

SERIES HISTORY

- Dating back to 1904, Saturday's contest marks the 99th all-time meeting between the Virginia and Hopkins.
- The Blue Jays lead the all-time series over UVA, 62-35-1.
- The two teams met at least once every season from 1948-2019.
- Virginia has not faced any other opponent more than Hopkins in program history.
- The two teams have gone head-to-head a whopping 16 times in the NCAA Tournament, including in last year's quarterfinals (Towson, Md). UVA is 6-10 in such meetings.
- Four of the last 10 overall matchups have gone to overtime. UVA is 3-1 in such contests.
- Notable wins over Hopkins in the NCAA Tournament include the: 1972 championship game (13-12, College Park, Md.), 1988 semifinals when the unseeded UVA toppled the two-seed Blue Jays in overtime (11-10, Baltimore, Md.), 1996 semifinals (16-10, College Park, Md.), **1999 semifinals** (16-11, College Park, Md.), **2003 national championship** (9-7, Baltimore, Md.) 2009 semifinals (19-8, Annapolis, Md.) and the 2024 quarterfinals [11-10 (2OT), Towson, Md.]. **Bold** – national championship run.

DOYLE SMITH CUP (EST. 2006)

- Upon the Doyle Smith Cup's inaugural matchup in 2006, Virginia and Johns Hopkins joined together to honor Edward "Doyle" Smith Jr., for his lifetime of contributions to the lacrosse programs at both schools and on the national level with the annual winner laying claim to the cup.
- Smith served as team manager and statistician for Johns Hopkins under coach Bob Scott from 1963-68.
- He enrolled at UVA to pursue a doctorate degree in the fall of 1968, and became the University's first full-time assistant sports information director, a position he held for 31 years until his retirement in 1999.
- He is credited with writing the original manuscript that later became the framework for the current NCAA men's lacrosse statisticians' manual.
- As the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) information director from 1973-95, Smith compiled the weekly rankings and statistics for the organization.
- In 2000, he was elected to the US Lacrosse Hall of Fame and is believed to be the only inductee who never played or coached the game at any level.
- Smith passed away in June 2004, not long after the national championship game.
- With its 16-14 win at Klöckner Stadium last year, Hopkins laid claim the cup for the first time since 2018 as UVA had won the three previous regular-season meetings (2019, 2022, 2023).
- UVA won the first five Smith Cup matchups and has never relinquished its lead in the Smith Cup series standings. UVA leads the all-time series, 11-6.
- Following the conclusion of Saturday's game, there will be a brief presentation of the cup to the winning team.

SCOUTING THE BLUE JAYS

- Johns Hopkins won its first four games of the season and peaked at No. 4 in last week's USILA coaches poll before falling to North Carolina, 12-11, at Homewood Field last week.
- The Tar Heels scored the game's first three goals in the first minute of play. Another three-goal run by the Tar Heels in the fourth quarter put them ahead to stay.
- Hopkins' man-up unit leads the nation, scoring a clip of 80 percent (4-for-5) on the season, while UVA's man-down has held its opponents scoreless on all but one of its 16 chances (.062).
- In addition to its man-up group, JHU leads the Big Ten in shot percentage (.337), good for ninth among all Division-I teams.
- Attackman Russell Melendez leads the Blue Jays in both goals (2.80) and points (4.40) per game. In last year's NCAA quarterfinals, Melendez scored four goals on five shots along with three turnovers. In the regular-season meeting between UVA and Hopkins, he had only one goal on five shots.

VIRGINIA-HOPKINS, ONE OF COLLEGE LACROSSE'S MOST PLAYED RIVALRIES

- Virginia and Johns Hopkins are one of 11 rivalries in Division-I men's lacrosse that have played at least 98 times.
- The Cavaliers played both Hopkins and Maryland twice last season, once in the regular season and once in the NCAA Tournament, and went 2-2 in such contests.

CAREER STARTS

LAST TIME OUT

- In its 14-5 loss at Ohio State last week, UVA scored the opening goal, but its lead was short-lived as the Buckeyes dominated the rest of the way.
- A series of unanswered Buckeye scoring runs – one in each half – proved to be too much for the Cavaliers to overcome.
- Twenty-one turnovers, including four amid its clear, plagued UVA throughout the contest.
- Despite the results, Virginia dominated the faceoff X, winning 14 of the game's 20 total draws. The Cavaliers have won a majority of faceoffs in each of their four games played so far this season.
- For the second time this season, **Ryan Colsey** recorded a hat trick, leading the Hoos with four goals and one assist.
- Fellow attackman **Truitt Sunderland** added three assists.

THE EMERGENCE OF RYAN COLSEY

- Through Virginia's first four games, attackman **Ryan Colsey** (14-6-20) is leading the Cavaliers in both goals and points.
- Colsey's 3.50 goals-per-game average is tied for 13th among all Division-I players nationally, and good for second among all ACC players.
- He had a breakout game against High Point (Feb. 18), when he recorded career highs in goals (6) and assists (3).
- Colsey started in 16 of UVA's games at midfield in 2024 and finished with 19 goals, including five on man-up, and four assists.
- Colsey's younger brother, Kyle, is redshirting this season due to injury. Their father, Roy, Professional Lacrosse Hall of Fame class of 2023 inductee. Roy Colsey was an All-American midfielder at Syracuse, where he helped the Orange to two national titles (1993 & 1995) and was a three-time first-team All-American from 1993-95.

VIRGINIA'S STINGY MAN-DOWN UNIT

- Virginia's man-down defense is much improved from last year to this.
- Through their first four games this season, the Cavaliers have only surrendered one goal on 16 opponent extra-man opportunities, a clip of 93.8 percent, which leads the ACC and is fourth nationally as of Feb. 26.
- Last year, UVA opponents scored on 50.9 percent (28-55) of their EMO chances.
- UVA's man-down unit is coached by assistant coach and former UVA closed defenseman **Logan Greco** '19.

MAKE IT, TAKE IT

- The combination of **Anthony Ghobriel** (36-60) and **Andrew Greenspan** (25-36) has helped Virginia finish above 50 percent at the faceoff X in each UVA's first four games played this season.
- As a team, the Cavaliers have won 59.0 percent (62-105) of their total faceoffs, good for 14th nationally.
- Ghobriel transferred to UVA in 2024 after playing his first two seasons of college lacrosse at Navy. Last season, he was the Cavaliers' top-performing FOGO with a 55.5 faceoff win percentage.
- Greenspan transferred to UVA this offseason after competing as a member of Notre Dame's 2024 national championship team. Greenspan's most productive game at Notre Dame came against UVA in the ACC Tournament semifinals, when he finished 6-for-8 at the faceoff X and collected five ground balls.

VIRGINIA IN THE POLLS

- Virginia, which is ranked No. 18 in this week's edition USILA poll, fell out of the top-10 on Feb. 17 for the first time in the prior 61 editions of the poll.
- The last time the Cavaliers were not ranked in the top-10 was in the March 9, 2020, edition of the poll, which marked the final poll before the season was ultimately canceled due to the onset of COVID-19.
- UVA has been in ranked in the top-5 of the USILA coaches poll in 342 weeks all-time.
- UVA has been ranked in the top-10 in 484 polls all-time.
- UVA has been ranked No. 1 in the nation in 70 all-time weekly polls.
- The USILA coaches poll began in 1973.

HOOS IN THE NATIONAL STATISTICAL RANKINGS

- Virginia currently leads the nation in ground balls (41.50/gm).
- UVA is also fourth in man-down defense (.938), 12th in assists (8.50/gm), 14th in faceoff win percentage (.590), and 16th in caused turnovers (9.75/gm) and points (21.25/gm).
- Among all individual Division-I players, **Ryan Colsey** is tied for seventh in man-up goals (3), 13th in goals (3.50/gm) and 15th in points (5.00/gm). **Ben Wayer** is 12th in ground balls (6.75/gm). **Anthony Ghobriel** is 19th in faceoff win percentage (.600), and both **McCabe Millon** and **Truitt Sunderland** are tied for 22nd in assists (2.25/gm).

ON THE HORIZON

- The Cavaliers conclude their three-game road stint on Saturday (March 8), when they travel to Houston, Texas for a neutral-site meeting with Towson (0-4).
- Opening faceoff at The Kinkaid School is set for 1:30 p.m. EST on the Corrigan Sports Network.

SEASON OVERVIEW

- The Cavaliers host nine regular-season games at Klöckner Stadium this year, including two ACC contests against Syracuse (March 29) and Duke (April 26).
- Virginia returns six starters from its 2024 roster, including preseason All-Americans **McCabe Millon** (attack), **Griffin Schutz** (midfield) and **John Schroter** (defense), and veteran netminder **Matthew Nunes**.
- UVA also returns Second Team Preseason All-American LSM **Ben Wayer**, who led the team in ground balls (98) last season, its primary faceoff specialist **Anthony Ghobriel** and goalie **Kyle Morris**, who saw action in all three NCAA Tournament games last season.
- The Hoos look to fill the void left by All-Americans Connor Shellenberger, the program’s only three-time Tewaaraton Award finalist and four-time First Team All-American, Payton Cormier, the NCAA Division-I all-time leading goal scorer, and four-year starting defenseman Cole Kastner.

THE CAVALIERS AT KLÖCKNER STADIUM

- Virginia owns a 182-48 (.791) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 2-1 mark in 2025, and has won 20 of its last 25 games played at the historic edifice.
- The Cavaliers’ average margin of victory in their last 25 games at Klöckner Stadium is 5.9 goals.
- Virginia is 56-16 (.778) all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach **Lars Tiffany**.
- UVA is also 15-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in NCAA Tournament contests.
- Lacrosse debuted in Klöckner Stadium in 1993.

ACC CHAMPIONSHIP PEDIGREE

- Virginia has claimed at least a share of 19 ACC championships, including two (2019 & 2022) under head coach **Lars Tiffany**.
- The Cavaliers won 11 titles (1962, 1964, 1969, 1970, 1971, 1975, 1980, 1983, 1984, 1985 and 1986) prior the ACC establishing a tournament from 1989-2019 to determine the champion.
- Virginia has won seven ACC Tournaments: 1997, 1999, 2000, 2003, 2006, 2010 and 2019.
- In the 2019 ACC Tournament, which was held at Klöckner Stadium, UVA defeated Notre Dame 10-4 in the championship game.
- From 1989-2019, Virginia won 14 regular-season titles (1990, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2006, 2009, 2010, 2012 and 2019), more than any other ACC school.
- The ACC Tournament returns this season and will once again be contested at American Legion Stadium in Charlotte, N.C., on May 3 and 5.

VIRGINIA’S SEVEN PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Seven Cavaliers in **McCabe Millon** (second team), **Griffin Schutz** (second team), **Ben Wayer** (second team), **Noah Chizmar** (honorable mention), **Johnny Hackett** (honorable mention), **John Schroter** (honorable mention) and **Joey Terenzi** (honorable mention) were named Preseason All-Americans by Inside Lacrosse.
- Virginia was the only program nationally with three selections on the second team and one of three teams with at least seven honorees.

VIRGINIA’S RECORD IN 2024 WHEN...

- In 2024, the Cavaliers finished 10-1 when leading their opponents after three quarters, 9-2 when leading at halftime and 1-1 when tied at the half.
- Last season, Virginia was 11-1 when dishing out more assists than its opponent and 10-1 when winning the ground ball battle.
- In 2024, the Hoos were 0-3 when committing more turnovers than their opponents.

LARS TIFFANY AMONG THE VIRGINIA'S ELITE COACHES

- **Lars Tiffany** is in his ninth season as UVA head coach and 21st of his head coaching career with stops at Stony Brook (2005-06) and Brown (2007-16).
- Tiffany guided the Cavaliers to the program's eighth and ninth national championships overall in 2019 and 2021, marking the only pair of back-to-back titles in program history (note: COVID-19 forced the cancellation of the 2020 NCAA Tournament).
- He has also steered the Hoos to four of the last five Championship Weekends (2019, 2021, 2023, 2024), and is the nation's only head coach accomplish that feat.
- A native of Lafayette, New York, Tiffany entered the 2024 season eight wins away from the 100th of his UVA career.
- Tiffany-coached teams, including his 2016 Brown squad which also reached Championship Weekend, have finished top-2 in the nation in ground balls per game in the last nine consecutive seasons.
- Tiffany graduated from Brown University in 1990, where he played defense and was a two-time captain under former UVA head coach Dom Starsia.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- Virginia has led the nation in ground balls in seven of the last nine years
- UVA has also finished in the top-2 nationally in ground balls the last nine consecutive seasons.
- UVA is the only program in the nation to finish in the top-3 nationally in ground balls per game 15 times over the last 16 seasons.
- The only program in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was UVA head coach **Lars Tiffany's** 2016 Brown team.

BEN WAYER EYEING ALL-AMERICAN SENIOR YEAR

- Virginia senior LSM **Ben Wayer** was ranked No. 20 on Inside Lacrosse's preseason top-50 watch list.
- Wayer was also dubbed a second-team preseason All-American by both Inside Lacrosse and USA Lacrosse.
- In 2024, Wayer led all Division-I non-faceoff specialists in ground balls (98), the most by a UVA non-FOGO in program single-season history, and ground balls per game (5.44).
- Wayer also proved to be a dual-threat in transition after finishing the 2024 season with seven goals and six assists. Wayer registered at least one point in 11 of UVA's 18 total games.
- In 2024, he was voted an All-American honorable mention by both the USILA and USA Lacrosse.

McCABE MILLON'S RECORD-SETTING FRESHMAN SEASON

- The Cavaliers have turned to sophomore **McCabe Millon** to quarterback the offense this season, following the departure of attackmen Connor Shellenberger and Payton Cormier.
- Millon is UVA's top returning producer in goals, assists and points.
- As a true freshman, he started on attack in 17 of UVA's 18 total games in 2024. The only game he did not start in was on the Cavaliers' Senior Day against Notre Dame.
- Millon scored 41 goals and logged 25 assists to lead all Division-I freshmen in both goals and points (66).
- His 41 goals are a UVA freshman record, while his 66 points stand at No. 2.
- A native of Reisterstown, Maryland, Millon burst on to the scene in his career debut against Michigan, when he scored five goals. In the Cavaliers' 11-10 double overtime thriller over Johns Hopkins in the NCAA quarterfinals, Millon scored three goals and dished out two assists to help UVA advance to Championship Weekend for the fourth time in the previous five opportunities.
- Millon was dubbed a second-team preseason All-American by both Inside Lacrosse and USA Lacrosse, and was also ranked No. 16 on IL's preseason top-50 watch list.

GRIFFIN SCHUTZ ON UVA'S MIDFIELDER CAREER LEADERS LIST

- Senior midfielder **Griffin Schutz** has cracked UVA's top-10 career goals, assists and points lists by a midfielder.

OVERVIEW

Lars Tiffany was named Virginia's 17th head coach on June 21, 2016. He is currently in his ninth season at UVA and 21st season overall as head coach. Tiffany is Virginia's only head coach to win back-to-back national championships (2019 & 2021). Tiffany begins the 2025 season with 92 wins as UVA head coach, good for No. 3 all-time in program history behind only Jim "Ace" Adams (137) and Dom Starsia (274).

He was Co-MVP of the Brown squad that captured its first-ever NCAA playoff victory in 1990 (12-9 vs. UMass). Tiffany capped his career by playing in the North-South Senior All-Star game.

**MATTHEW NUNES: ONE OF UVA'S MOST ACCOMPLISHED GOALIES**

- Senior goalie **Matthew Nunes** set the Virginia single-season program record with 213 saves in 17 games in 2023.
- His 313 saves shattered Alex Rode's previous program record of 212 saves, which Rode achieved in 16 games during UVA's 2021 national championship run.
- Also in 2023, Nunes led all ACC goalies in save percentage (.551) among conference games only, and finished second overall in the ACC in both goals-against average (11.95) and saves per game (14.33).
- In 2022, Nunes set the program's freshman saves record (159).
- At then-No. 16 Harvard in 2024, Nunes scored the game-winning goal and made 17 saves to help UVA mount a successful comeback. Virginia trailed by as many as five goals in the third quarter. Nunes' goal was the first by a UVA goalie since Adam Ghitelman did so against Duke in the 2010 ACC Tournament.
- Nunes has been at his best in the biggest of games (see chart below).

**TRANSFERS ADD DEPTH ON OFFENSE AND AT FACEOFF X**

- This offseason, Lars Tiffany added five transfers to his squad: **Charles Balsamo** (Duke), **Andrew Greenspan** (Notre Dame), **Johnny Hackett** (Bryant), **Chase MacCartee** (Kenyon College) and **John Totaro** (Denver).
- The group makes up the nation's No. 3 transfer class – best among all ACC teams – according to Inside Lacrosse.
- Balsamo spent the past two seasons at Duke, where he competed as a midfielder in 38 games, including 21 starts. Over his two-year career with the Blue Devils, Balsamo recorded 27 goals, 20 assists and 16 multi-point efforts. In 2023, Balsamo finished the season with 31 points, which is good for second all-time in Duke freshman history.
- Greenspan, a faceoff specialist, was a member of Notre Dame's national championship team as a true freshman in 2024. Greenspan graduated high school from the Brunswick School, where he was the nation's No. 35 overall prospect (according to Inside Lacrosse), a High School All-American and a member of the U.S. National Team's U18 roster.
- Hackett played the previous two years at Bryant as a midfielder, where he was a two-time First Team All-America East selection, and the 2023 America East Rookie of the Year. In 31 appearances, including 29 starts, Hackett combined for more than 100 points on 64 goals and 37 assists.

**VIRGINIA'S FIRST-YEAR (FRESHMAN) CLASS**

- The Cavaliers' freshman class was ranked No. 1 in the nation by Inside Lacrosse.
- The class consists of five-star signees: **Hudson Hausmann** (Brunswick), **Luke Hublitz** (Brunswick), **Sean Browne** (Episcopal School of Dallas), **Kyle Colsey** (Ridgefield) and **Ryan Duenkel** (St. Johns College HS).
- UVA's list of four-star prospects consists of **JP Lagunowich** (Chatham), **Tommy Snyder** (St. Anthony's) and **Luke Jamin** (Taft).
- Goalie **Troy Capstraw** (Daphne, Ala.) and faceoff specialist **Christian Grosso** (Wellesley, Mass.) round out the Cavaliers' freshman.
- Additionally, the Cavaliers added first-year **Reese Stepanian** (Houston, Texas) to the squad this past fall.
- Earlier this year, it was announced that Browne, Colsey and Duenkel will miss the 2025 season due to injuries.

ORANGE & BLUE: IT RUNS IN THE FAMILY

- The Cavalier lacrosse program has a long history of sibling connections and this year is no different.
- Brothers **Ryan** ('26) and **Kyle** ('28) **Colsey** are both attackmen on this year's team. Ryan redshirted as a true freshman in 2023 – as will be the case for Kyle this year after suffering an injury in the fall. Their father, Roy Colsey, played midfield at Syracuse, is a Lacrosse Hall of Fame inductee, and was recently named head coach of the PLL's Carolina Chaos.
- Brendan Millon ('29), the younger brother of **McCabe Millon** ('27), signed with UVA this past fall and will join the Hoos as a true freshman in the fall of 2025.
- Defenseman **Griffin Kology** ('25) has a younger sister, Lara ('26) on the UVA women's lacrosse team. Griffin and Lara's older brother, Kyle ('21) was a member of both the 2019 and 2021 national championship teams and a USILA Third Team All-American.
- The sister of attackman **Tucker Mullen** ('25), Taylor, played for the UVA women's lacrosse team as a graduate transfer in 2023.
- Other notable UVA lacrosse sibling connections include: Chris and Casey (sister) Bocklet, Shamel and Rhamel Bratton, Brian and Kevin Carroll, Matt and Mark Cockerton, Rob and Matt Emery, Adam and Jake Ghitelman, Brendan, Conor and Gavin Gill, Billy, Danny and Pat Glading, and Griffin and Miles Thompson.

McNEAL RESIDES IN COVETED, SACRED SPACE ON GROUNDS

- This year, senior LSM **Tommy McNeal** joins an exclusive list of high-achieving students to live in residence buildings – designed by Thomas Jefferson – on the University's iconic Lawn.
- Living on the Lawn is one of the University's greatest honors and most enriching experiences for undergraduates.
- Students who are accepted to live on The Lawn must demonstrate, "commitment to academic exploration and growth," "meaningful and engaged participation" in extracurricular activities and a "willingness to embrace the ideals of The Lawn community."
- Former UVA midfielder John Fox, who captained the 2021 national championship team, also lived on The Lawn.
- Other notable UVA alumni to live on the lawn include: broadcast journalist Katie Couric and basketball legend Ralph Sampson.

VIRGINIA & THE TEWAARATON AWARD TROPHY

- Since its inception in 2001, three Virginia Cavaliers have laid claim to the Tewaaraton Trophy, college lacrosse's most prestigious award.
- Virginia, Duke, Maryland and Syracuse are the only four schools nationwide to have had three recipients each.
- Duke (15) and UVA (13) are the only two schools to have had at least 13 finalists.
- Last year, former UVA attackman Connor Shellenberger – along with former Notre Dame attackman Pat Kavanagh, the winner of the 2024 Tewaaraton Trophy – became two of only eight three-time finalists in the history of the award.
