GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia (3-4) continues its four-game homestand and get back in the win column Tuesday (March 18), when the Cavaliers welcome UAlbany (2-5).
- Opening faceoff from Klöckner Stadium is set for 4 p.m. on ACC Network Extra and WINA (1070-AM/98.9-FM).

SERIES HISTORY

- Virginia is 2-0 all-time against the Great Danes with the inaugural meeting coming in the first round of the 2005 NCAA Tournament and most recent in last year's regular-season contest, both of which were contested at Klöckner Stadium.
- In the 2005 matchup, Virginia used an 11-goal first half run to build a 15-3 halftime lead.
- The Hoos' 23 goals tied the program record for most goals by UVA in an NCAA Tournament contest.
- The game was held up for 45 minutes due to thunderstorms in the Charlottesville area.
- Virginia's Kyle Dixon (3g, 3a) led the effort with six points.
- Current UVA assistant coach **Kip Turner** earned the win in net.

THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAHOOWA

The origin of "Wahoowa" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wa."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

LAST TIME THE MET

- In the second and most recent matchup of the series, a 16-10 win for the Hoos, former attackman Connor Shellenberger became the program's career points record holder. Shellenberger, who had one goal and five assists, went on to finish his career with 131 goals and 192 assists.
- The Great Danes led for more than 23 minutes of game time in the first half before a furious third quarter propelled the Cavaliers to victory.
- With the win, head coach **Lars Tiffany** tallied the 200th of his career.
- Virginia's **McCabe Millon** and Payton Cormier notched five goals each, and netminder **Matthew Nunes** finished with 12 saves while allowing only five goals in nearly 50 minutes of action.
- UAlbany attackman Silas Richmond finished with a game-high seven goals and former LSM Jake Pisenso scored two goals, and logged four ground balls and three caused turnovers.

SCOUTING THE GREAT DANES

- Despite its 2-5 record, UAlbany has played four teams that were ranked in the March 10 edition of the USILA coaches poll: No. 12 Georgetown, No. 15 Colgate, No. 17 Penn and No. 19 UMass.
- The Great Danes were voted by America East head coaches in the league's preseason poll to repeat as conference champions.
- Like Virginia, UAlbany has been stout on man-down as the Great Danes have killed of all 15 opposing EMO chances this season.
- UA also has two of the most productive attackmen in the country in Silas Richmond and Ryan Doherty.
- Richmond, who scored seven goals in last year's regular-season game against the Hoos, is 11th among all Division-I players in assists per game (2.50), which also leads the America East.
- Doherty leads the AE in goals per game (3.17), good for 14th among all DI players. The sophomore attackman had nine goals and an assist in UA's 17-10 win over Hobart (March 8), which tied the program's single-game goals record held by legendary brothers Lyle and Miles Thompson.
- UA lost its first-team All-American LSM Jake Pisenso, also last year's national defensive player of the year, to graduation. Pisenso was selected ninth overall by the Denver Outlaws in last year's Premier Lacrosse League college draft.
- UAlbany is led by Scott Marr, who is in his 25th season as Great Dane head coach. Marr played attack at Johns Hopkins from 1987-90 and was an assistant coach at Delaware (1992-94) and Maryland (1995-2000) prior to becoming UA's head coach for the 2001 season.

LARS TIFFANY & SCOTT MARR CONNECTIONS

- Virginia's **Lars Tiffany** and UAlbany's Scott Marr share a few connections over their shared 21 years of being head coaches.
- Tiffany and Marr both served as assistant coaches – under then-head coach Mark Burnam – of the 2018 Haudenosaunee team that won the bronze medal at World Games in Netanya, Israel.
- In 2023, Tiffany became the head coach and Marr served as an assistant coach under Tiffany. The 2023 World Games were held in San Diego, and the Haudenosaunee once again captured the bronze medal.
- Tiffany and Marr spent two seasons as America East foes, when Tiffany was the head coach at Stony Brook from 2005-06.
- UAlbany eliminated Tiffany and the Seawolves in the conference tournament both years, including in the 2005 championship game and in overtime of the 2006 semifinals.

LAST TIME OUT

- Top-ranked Maryland outscored then-No. 18 Virginia 5-1 in both the first and fourth quarters on the way to its 12-6 victory over the Cavaliers at Klöckner Stadium last Saturday (March 15).
- Despite trailing by as many as five goals in the first, UVA cut its deficit to as little as one goal twice, but the Terrapins' second 5-0 run of the game helped them pull away in the fourth.
- Maryland goalie Logan McNaney finished with a game-high 13 saves after facing 36 UVA shots.
- The Hoos held the edge in ground balls [32-33], turnovers [20-9] and shots [36-30], but UMD was able to make the most of its scoring chances throughout to remain undefeated on the year.
- Virginia was led by defensive midfielders **Ben Wayer** (6gb, 2ct) and **Noah Chizmar** (6gb, 2ct).
- Six Cavaliers found the back of the net, including short-stick defensive midfielder **Will Erdmann**, who notched his first career goal in the second quarter.
- Coming off an impressive performance against Towson last week, goalie **Matthew Nunes** (1-1) started in net for the Hoos, which also marked the 50th of his career.

VIRGINIA'S STINGY MAN-DOWN UNIT

- Virginia's man-down defense is much improved from last year to this.
- Through their first seven games this season, the Cavaliers have only surrendered four goals on 30 opponent extra-man opportunities, a clip of 86.7 percent, which leads the ACC and is fourth nationally as of March 17.
- Last year, UVA opponents scored on 50.9 percent (28-55) of their EMO chances.
- UVA's man-down unit is coached by assistant coach and former UVA close defenseman **Logan Greco** '19.

VIRGINIA IN THE POLLS

- For the second time this season, Virginia fell out of the USILA coaches poll top-20 rankings on March 17, following its 12-6 loss to No. 1 Maryland (March 15).
- For the first time since the 2018 preseason poll, UVA was not ranked in the March 3 edition of the USILA coaches poll after dropping back-to-back games to Ohio State and Johns Hopkins.
- UVA has been in ranked in 96 percent of USILA coaches polls all-time, which began in 1973.
- This week, the Cavaliers are receiving votes in both the USILA and Inside Lacrosse polls, but are ranked No 18 in the USA Lacrosse magazine poll.

HOOS IN THE NATIONAL STATISTICAL RANKINGS

- Virginia is currently fourth in the nation in man-down defense (.867), fifth in ground balls (36.71/gm), 13th in caused turnovers (10.00/gm) and 18th in opponent clear percentage (.816).
- In the March 17 edition of the NCAA men's lacrosse Division-I RPI index, the Cavaliers are slotted at No. 17.
- Among all individual Division-I players, **Ryan Colsey** and **Truitt Sunderland** are tied for 21st in individual man-up goals with three each. Sunderland is also 20th in points (4.43/gm) and 22nd in assists (2.00/gm). LSM **Ben Wayer** is 22nd in ground balls (6.14/gm).

THE CAVALIERS AT KLÖCKNER STADIUM

- Virginia owns a 182-49 (.788) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 2-2 mark in 2025, and has won 19 of its last 25 games played at the historic edifice.
- The Cavaliers' average margin of victory in their last 25 games at Klöckner Stadium is 5.5 goals.
- Virginia is 56-17 (.767) all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach **Lars Tiffany**.
- UVA is also 15-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in NCAA Tournament contests.
- Lacrosse debuted in Klöckner Stadium in 1993.

ON THE HORIZON

- The Cavaliers continue their four-game homestand on Saturday (March 22), when they host Utah (1-6).
- Opening faceoff from Klöckner Stadium is set for noon on ACC Network Extra.
- Saturday's game is dedicated to the One Love Foundation.
- In their season opener, the Utes knocked off then-No. 19 Ohio State, but have dropped six in a row, including their last two by a combined margin of three goals.

LARS TIFFANY AMONG THE VIRGINIA'S ELITE COACHES

- **Lars Tiffany** is in his ninth season as UVA head coach and 21st of his head coaching career with stops at Stony Brook (2005-06) and Brown (2007-16).
- Tiffany guided the Cavaliers to the program's eighth and ninth national championships overall in 2019 and 2021, marking the only pair of back-to-back titles in program history (note: COVID-19 forced the cancellation of the 2020 NCAA Tournament).
- He has also steered the Hoos to four of the last five Championship Weekends (2019, 2021, 2023, 2024), and is the nation's only head coach accomplish that feat.
- A native of LaFayette, New York, Tiffany entered the 2024 season eight wins away from the 100th of his UVA career.
- Tiffany-coached teams, including his 2016 Brown squad which also reached Championship Weekend, have finished top-2 in the nation in ground balls per game in the last nine consecutive seasons.
- Tiffany graduated from Brown University in 1990, where he played defense and was a two-time captain under Dom Starsia, who would later become UVA's head coach following the 1992 season.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- Virginia has led the nation in ground balls in seven of the last nine years
- UVA has also finished in the top-2 nationally in ground balls the last nine consecutive seasons.
- UVA is the only program in the nation to finish in the top-3 nationally in ground balls per game 15 times over the last 16 seasons.
- The only program in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was UVA head coach **Lars Tiffany's** 2016 Brown team.

THE EMERGENCE OF RYAN COLSEY

- Through Virginia's first seven games, attackman **Ryan Colsey** (18-6-24) is leading the Cavaliers in goals and is second in points.
- He had a breakout game against High Point (Feb. 18), when he recorded career highs in goals (6) and assists (3).
- Colsey started in 16 of UVA's games at midfield in 2024 and finished with 19 goals, including five on man-up, and four assists.
- Colsey's younger brother, Kyle, is redshirting this season due to injury. Their father, Roy, is a Professional Lacrosse Hall of Fame class of 2023 inductee. Roy Colsey was an All-American midfielder at Syracuse, where he helped the Orange to two national titles (1993 & 1995) and was a three-time first-team All-American from 1993-95.

GRIFFIN SCHUTZ ON UVA'S MIDFIELDER CAREER LEADERS LIST

- Senior midfielder **Griffin Schutz** is inside UVA's top-10 career goals, assists and points lists by a midfielder.
- A graduate of Deerfield Academy (Massachusetts), Schutz was ranked No. 1 by Inside Lacrosse among all high school prospects nationally who entered college in the fall of 2021.

MATTHEW NUNES: ONE OF UVA'S MOST ACCOMPLISHED GOALIES

- Senior goalie **Matthew Nunes** set the Virginia single-season program record with 213 saves in 17 games in 2023.
- His 313 saves shattered Alex Rode's previous program record of 212 saves, which Rode achieved in 16 games during UVA's 2021 national championship run.
- Also in 2023, Nunes led all ACC goalies in save percentage (.551) among conference games only, and finished second overall in the ACC in both goals-against average (11.95) and saves per game (14.33).
- In 2022, Nunes set the program's freshman saves record (159).
- At then-No. 16 Harvard in 2024, Nunes scored the game-winning goal and made 17 saves to help UVA mount a successful comeback. Virginia trailed by as many as five goals in the third quarter. Nunes' goal was the first by a UVA goalie since Adam Ghitelman did so against Duke in the 2010 ACC Tournament.
- Nunes has been at his best in the biggest of games (see chart below).

ACC CHAMPIONSHIP PEDIGREE

- Virginia has claimed at least a share of 19 ACC championships, including two (2019 & 2022) under head coach **Lars Tiffany**.
- The Cavaliers won 11 titles (1962, 1964, 1969, 1970, 1971, 1975, 1980, 1983, 1984, 1985 and 1986) prior the ACC establishing a tournament from 1989-2019 to determine the champion.
- Virginia has won seven ACC Tournaments: 1997, 1999, 2000, 2003, 2006, 2010 and 2019.
- In the 2019 ACC Tournament, which was held at Klöckner Stadium, UVA defeated Notre Dame 10-4 in the championship game.
- From 1989-2019, Virginia won 14 regular-season titles (1990, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2006, 2009, 2010, 2012 and 2019), more than any other ACC school.
- The ACC Tournament returns this season and will once again be contested at American Legion Stadium in Charlotte, N.C., on May 3 and 5.

McCABE MILLON'S RECORD-SETTING FRESHMAN SEASON

- The Cavaliers have turned to sophomore **McCabe Millon** to quarterback the offense this season, following the departure of attackmen Connor Shellenberger and Payton Cormier.
- Millon is UVA's top returning producer in goals, assists and points.
- As a true freshman, he started on attack in 17 of UVA's 18 total games in 2024. The only game he did not start in was on the Cavaliers' Senior Day against Notre Dame.
- Millon scored 41 goals and logged 25 assists to lead all Division-I freshmen in both goals and points (66).
- His 41 goals are a UVA freshman record, while his 66 points stand at No. 2.
- A native of Reisterstown, Maryland, Millon burst on to the scene in his career debut against Michigan, when he scored five goals. In the Cavaliers' 11-10 double overtime thriller over Johns Hopkins in the NCAA quarterfinals, Millon scored three goals and dished out two assists to help UVA advance to Championship Weekend for the fourth time in the previous five opportunities.
- Millon was named a second-team preseason All-American by both Inside Lacrosse and USA Lacrosse, and was also ranked No. 16 on IL's preseason top-50 watch list.

HEAD COACH LARS TIFFANY

OVERVIEW

Lars Tiffany was named Virginia's 17th head coach on June 21, 2016. He is currently in his ninth season at UVA and 21st season overall as head coach. Tiffany is Virginia's only head coach to win back-to-back national championships (2019 & 2021). Tiffany begins the 2025 season with 92 wins as UVA head coach, good for No. 3 all-time in program history behind only Jim "Ace" Adams (137) and Dom Starsia (274).

A Biology concentrator, Tiffany played on two Brown teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament (1987 & 1990). He was Co-MVP of the Brown squad that captured its first-ever NCAA playoff victory in 1990 (12-9 vs. UMass). Tiffany capped his career by playing in the North-South Senior All-Star game.

BEN WAYER EYEING ALL-AMERICAN SENIOR YEAR

- Virginia senior LSM **Ben Wayer** was ranked No. 20 on Inside Lacrosse’s preseason top-50 watch list.
- Wayer was also dubbed a second-team preseason All-American by both Inside Lacrosse and USA Lacrosse.
- In 2024, Wayer led all Division-I non-faceoff specialists in ground balls (98), the most by a UVA non-FOGO in program single-season history, and ground balls per game (5.44).
- Wayer also proved to be a dual-threat in transition after finishing the 2024 season with seven goals and six assists. Wayer registered at least one point in 11 of UVA’s 18 total games.
- In 2024, he was voted an All-American honorable mention by both the USILA and USA Lacrosse.

VIRGINIA’S SEVEN PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Seven Cavaliers in **McCabe Millon** (second team), **Griffin Schutz** (second team), **Ben Wayer** (second team), **Noah Chizmar** (honorable mention), **Johnny Hackett** (honorable mention), **John Schroter** (honorable mention) and **Joey Terenzi** (honorable mention) were named Preseason All-Americans by Inside Lacrosse.
- Virginia was the only program nationally with three selections on the second team and one of three teams with at least seven honorees.

SEASON OVERVIEW

- The Cavaliers host nine regular-season games at Klöckner Stadium this year, including ACC contests against Syracuse (March 29) and Duke (April 26).
- Virginia returns six starters from its 2024 roster, including preseason All-Americans **McCabe Millon** (attack), **Griffin Schutz** (midfield) and **John Schroter** (defense), and veteran netminder **Matthew Nunes**.
- UVA also returns Second Team Preseason All-American LSM **Ben Wayer**, who led the team in ground balls (98) last season, its primary faceoff specialist **Anthony Ghobriel** and goalie **Kyle Morris**, who saw action in all three NCAA Tournament games last season.
- The Hoos look to fill the void left by All-Americans Connor Shellenberger, the program’s only three-time Tewaaraton Award finalist and four-time First Team All-American, Payton Cormier, the NCAA Division-I all-time leading goal scorer, and four-year starting defenseman Cole Kastner.

TRANSFERS ADD DEPTH ON OFFENSE AND AT FACEOFF X

- This offseason, Lars Tiffany added five transfers to his squad: **Charles Balsamo** (Duke), **Andrew Greenspan** (Notre Dame), **Johnny Hackett** (Bryant), **Chase MacCartee** (Kenyon College) and **John Totaro** (Denver).
- The group makes up the nation’s No. 3 transfer class – best among all ACC teams – according to Inside Lacrosse.
- Balsamo spent the past two seasons at Duke, where he competed as a midfielder in 38 games, including 21 starts. Over his two-year career with the Blue Devils, Balsamo recorded 27 goals, 20 assists and 16 multi-point efforts. In 2023, Balsamo finished the season with 31 points, which is good for second all-time in Duke freshman history.
- Greenspan, a faceoff specialist, was a member of Notre Dame’s national championship team as a true freshman in 2024. Greenspan graduated high school from the Brunswick School, where he was the nation’s No. 35 overall prospect (according to Inside Lacrosse), a High School All-American and a member of the U.S. National Team’s U18 roster.
- Hackett played the previous two years at Bryant as a midfielder, where he was a two-time First Team All-America East selection, and the 2023 America East Rookie of the Year. In 31 appearances, including 29 starts, Hackett combined for more than 100 points on 64 goals and 37 assists.

VIRGINIA’S FIRST-YEAR (FRESHMAN) CLASS

- The Cavaliers’ freshman class was ranked No. 1 in the nation by Inside Lacrosse.
- The class consists of five-star signees: **Hudson Hausmann** (Brunswick), **Luke Hublitz** (Brunswick), **Sean Browne** (Episcopal School of Dallas), **Kyle Colsey** (Ridgefield) and **Ryan Duenkel** (St. Johns College HS).

- Earlier this year, it was announced that Browne, Colsey and Duenkel will miss the 2025 season due to injuries.

ORANGE & BLUE: IT RUNS IN THE FAMILY

- The Cavalier lacrosse program has a long history of sibling connections and this year is no different.
- Brothers **Ryan** ('26) and **Kyle** ('28) **Colsey** are both attackmen on this year's team. Ryan redshirted as a true freshman in 2023 – as will be the case for Kyle this year after suffering an injury in the fall.
