Team Notes

- UVA ended its season at 15-17 overall and 8-12 in the ACC
- Virginia is 5-10 away from home and 4-7 in true road contests
- UVA has allowed 30 or more points in the paint in each of its last seven games (40 today)
- UVA forced one shot clock violation (11 this season)
- UVA held Georgia Tech without a field goal for 8:48 of the first half
- The game was tied at 25-25 at halftime
- UVA allowed its fewest first half points (25) since 19 in a win at Pitt on Feb. 3
- UVA (10 steals) registered 10 or more steals for the third time

All-Time vs. Georgia Tech

- Virginia is 50-41 all-time vs. Georgia Tech, including a 5-6 mark in ACC tournament action, in a series that dates to 1947-48.
- The Cavaliers' 13-game win streak in the series ended with the loss
- Georgia Tech's last win vs. the Cavaliers in the series prior to today was a 68-64 victory in Atlanta on Jan. 9, 2016
- Virginia is 20-3 in its last 23 games against Georgia Tech

All-Time in the ACC Tournament

- Virginia was the No. 9 seed in the ACC Tournament for the fourth time (1998, 1999, 2010, 2025)
- UVA's No. 9 seed was its lowest since its No. 9 seed in 2010.
- UVA has posted a 1-4 mark as the No. 9 seed in tournament with all four appearances in North Carolina (Greensboro 1998 and 1999 and Charlotte 2010 and 2025)
- The Cavaliers are 47-67 all-time in the ACC Tournament and 8-15 in Charlotte
- UVA is 2-1 in the second round of the ACC Tournament

Player Notes

- Double Figure Scorers: Isaac McKneely (27)
- McKneely scored a season-high 27 points with his eighth 20-point effort of the season (14 career)
- McKneely made a career-high seven 3-pointers
- McKneely has made multiple 3-pointers in 23 games
- McKneely (6 3-pointers) moved into fourth on UVA's single-season 3-pointers list with 101
- McKneely moved into 47th on UVA's all-time scoring list with 1,089 career points
- McKneely reached double figures for the 24th time (50 career)
- Dai Dai Ames' (4 points) 10-game double figure streak ended
