### SEMINOLES PLAY FINAL REGULAR SEASON ROAD GAME AT VIRGINIA

Florida State, which has won ACC road games at Miami (80-65, January 8, 2025) and at Wake Forest (72-70, February 12) travels to Charlottesville, Virginia to face the Virginia Cavaliers in its final regular season ACC road game of the 2024-25 season. The Seminoles have won six games away from home this season with victories over Rice (73-65, in Houston, November 9), vs. Temple (78-69, in Uncasville, Conn., November 22), vs. UMass (92-59, in Uncasville, Conn., November 24) as well as at Miami and at Wake Forest in ACC play. Following Tuesday's game at Virginia, the Seminoles close out their regular season as they play host to SMU in their first game against the Mustangs as members of the ACC on Saturday, March 8, 2025 at 4:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee.

### LEONARD HAMILTON DAY SET FOR MARCH 8

Florida State Athletics will honor men's basketball head coach Leonard Hamilton on Saturday, March 8, following the Seminoles' regular season finale against the SMU Mustangs. Tipoff for the game is set for 4 p.m. The regular season finale will also serve as Senior Day. Tickets are available for the Seminoles game against SMU (March 8). Hamilton, who recently announced his resignation effective at the end of the season, holds the FSU record with 437 career wins and is the fifth-winningest coach in the history of the Atlantic Coast Conference. In 23 seasons at FSU, Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 16 postseason appearances and at least 20 wins 12 times. His Seminoles won the 2012 ACC Tournament championship, the first ACC basketball championship in program history, and earned the school's first ACC regular-season title in the 2019-20 season.

### HAMILTON NEEDS ONE ACC WIN TO EARN 200 CAREER ACC REGULAR SEASON VICTORIES

Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton enters Tuesday's game against Virginia ranked fourth in ACC history with 199 career regular season ACC victories. He needs just one regular season ACC win to become just the fourth coach in the illustrious history of the league to win 200 or more regular season conference games.

### HAMILTON IS THE ACC'S FIFTH ALL-TIME WINNINGEST COACH

Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton is the all-time winningest coach in Florida State history and the fifth all-time winningest coach in ACC history. He is No. 5 in the ACC rankings alongside Mike Krzyzewski (Duke, 1,129 wins), Dean Smith (North Carolina, 879 wins), Roy Williams (North Carolina, 485), Gary Williams (Maryland, 461) and Hamilton (Florida State, 437).

### SEMINOLES WATKINS HAS SCORED IN 20+ POINTS IN THREE CONSECUTIVE GAMES

Senior All-America candidate Jamir Watkins has scored more than 20 points in a career-high tying three consecutive games – 23 at Louisville (February 22), 26 against North Carolina (Feb. 24) and 21 at Duke on Saturday (March 1). It marks the second time in his career that he has scored 20 or more in three consecutive games – he also accomplished the feat earlier this season with 24 points at NC State (December 7), 29 against Tulane in the Orange Bowl Classic (December 14) and against 25 against Winthrop (December 19). The last Seminole to score 20 or more points in four consecutive games was Dwayne Bacon during the 2015-16 season – 20 points against Mississippi State (December 16), 23 points against Florida Atlantic in the Orange Bowl Classic (December 19), 20 points against Charleston Southern (December 21) and 24 against Florida (December 29).

### EWIN LOOKING TO BECOME THE FIRST SEMINOLE TO LEAD THE ACC IN FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE SHOOTING

Junior All-ACC candidate Malique Ewin enters Tuesday's game against Virginia as the ACC leader in field goal percentage shooting for the entire season (.594 in 28 games) and in ACC play only (.631 in 17 conference games). He is the **ONLY** player in the conference shooting better than 60 percent from the field in ACC games for the season. Ewin is looking to become the first Seminole to lead the ACC in field goal percentage shooting for an entire season and in ACC play only. Ewin has made 22 of his last 24 field goal attempts (.917 percent) in his last four games – he made his final attempt against Clemson (February 15), was a perfect 10 of 10 from the field against Miami (February 19), was nine of 10 from the field at Louisville (February 22), and was two of three against North Carolina.

### LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Virginia and earn its second victory in the last three games played between the two teams at the John Paul Jones Arena. The Seminoles earned a 64-63 win over the Cavaliers as Matthew Cleveland hit a long 3-point shot to give the Seminoles the victory on Feb. 26, 2022.

Jamir Watkins – "I have switched my number this season from No. 2 to No. 1 for my final collegiate season. I wore both No. 0 and No. 1 in high school at Trenton Catholic, No. 0 during my career at VCU, and No. 2 during my first season at Florida State. I think it's a great looking number. I will also become the first player in my family to earn a college degree and I want to show the younger members of my family that they, too, can earn a college degree."

**FLORIDA STATE IS THE SECOND-TALLEST TEAM IN THE NATION**

Florida State has been measured as the nation's second-tallest team in the nation by Ken Pomeroy's analytics. The Seminoles' roster contains 12 players listed at 6'5 or taller, 10 at 6'7 or taller, five taller than 6'10, and one seven-footer. Florida State is annually one of the tallest and lengthiest teams in all of college basketball. According to analytics supplied by the legendary Ken Pom, Florida State was the tallest team in the nation during the 2023-24 season.

**HAMILTON NEEDS JUST ONE REGULAR SEASON ACC WIN TO REACH 200 FOR HIS CAREER**

Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton needs just one regular season ACC victory to become just the FOURTH coach in the history of the ACC to win 200 regular season ACC games. He is the fourth-winningest coach in ACC history with 198 regular season victories and took sole possession of fourth place in the annals of the ACC with the Seminoles' win over Syracuse on January 4<sup>th</sup> in Tallahassee.

Florida State has made 17 3-point field goals in its last two games with 10 coming against North Carolina and seven more falling against Duke. The Seminoles also made 10 3-point field goals in their win over Miami on January 8 in Coral Gables. In making 10 of 20 3-point shots against the Tar Heels (.500 percent) the Seminoles tied their season-high for 3-point field goal percentage – after also shooting .500 in their win over UMass (nine of 18, 92-59, November 24) at the Naismith Basketball Tip-Off event.

**FLORIDA STATE AMONG ACC LEADERS IN BLOCKED SHOTS AND REBOUNDS**

Florida State is one of the top defensive teams in the ACC as it ranks first in the conference in blocked shots and second in steals. The Seminoles, Pittsburgh and Wake Forest are the only three teams in the ACC ranked in the top five for blocked shots AND steals.

**FLORIDA STATE SHOOTING THE BASKETBALL WELL**

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Virginia shooting .457 from the field as a team for the season. The Seminoles' shot their ACC season-high of .542 from the field (32 of 59) and from the field and scored 81 points against Louisville (February 22). Led by Malique Ewin's near perfect shooting nigh of nine of 10 from the field, the Seminoles shot .462 percent from the field in the first half (12 of 26) and an astronomical .606 from the field in the second half (20 of 33). Florida State outscored the Cardinals from the field (68-59) for the game, made more field goals (32-26), and finished with a higher shooting percentage for the game (.542 - .500) as the Seminoles nearly rallied from a 20-point first half deficit at the KFC YUM! Center. The Seminoles have shot better than 50 percent in seven games this season (including twice against nationally ranked Louisville and five times in ACC play. Florida State averages 85.8 points (601 total points) when they shoot .500 or better from the field.

**FLORIDA STATE VS. VIRGINIA – THE LAST GAME**

Virginia's Isaac McKneely scored 29 points and the Cavaliers withstood a furious rally by Florida State to win its eighth straight game with an 80-76 win over the Seminoles on February 10, 2024 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles rallied to within two at 77-75 with 11 seconds remaining before the Cavaliers scored three of the final four points of the game to gain the victory. McKneely was on fire throughout the night for the Cavaliers as he made eight of 12 field goals, was five of seven from 3-point range and missed just one of his nine free throws attempted. He pulled down four rebounds and was credited with two assists as Virginia improved to 10-3 in ACC play. Florida State was led in the scoring column for the 10th time this season by Jamir Watkins, who scored a team-high 21 points. Sophomore Chandler Jackson scored a career-high of 17 points. Watkins scored 20 points or more for the second time this season. He led the team in steals with two, along with blocking two shots. He was a near perfect 11 of 12 from the free throw line. Chandler Jackson had a stat-stuffing night with 17 points and five rebounds.

## Confidence At A Peak For Florida State's Swinton As Seminoles Travel To Play At Virginia

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. – For Florida State's AJ Swinton, the arrival of the month of February brought an incredible sense of confidence to a freshman who has always been a confident player.

As a 2024 graduate of Bishop O'Connell High School in Arlington, Va., he was a McDonald's All-American game nominee, led the Knights to 23 wins and a national ranking, earned All-WCAC honors by the *Washington Post*, and was named to the All-Tournament team at the Beach Ball Classic in Myrtle Beach.

In the Seminoles' eight games since the start of February, Swinton scored his freshman season scoring-high (10 points at Boston College), earned his top rebounding total (four against Boston College), earned the first start of his career (in the Seminoles win over the Fighting Irish), and earned his high watermark for minutes played during his first year in Tallahassee (21 against Notre Dame).

The crowning moment of his first season in Tallahassee came in the Seminoles' victory over Miami at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

Swinton made two of the biggest shots of his 25-game Florida State career – within 33 seconds of each other – as he hit two 3-point shots in the second half of the Seminoles' victory over the Hurricanes. His shots at the 9:20 and 8:47 marks (with no timeouts in between) helped the Seminoles erase a three point second half deficit and sent the Seminoles to their 14<sup>th</sup> win over the Hurricanes in the last 15 games between the two teams. Swinton's first 3-pointer broke a 45-45 tie and gave the Seminoles a 48-45 lead and the second gave Florida State a six point advantage with a 53-47 lead – a lead that never dropped below five in earning the home team the victory.

"Those were rhythm shots, and honestly, they were created by my teammates," said Swinton. "They put me in the right spots. All I had to do was step up and knock them down. As soon as the ball left my hand, I knew they were good. Those are the same shots I take every day in warmups and practice."

As Florida State travels to play at Virginia on Tuesday, Swinton's confidence has never been higher. The Seminoles and the Cavaliers are set to tip-off at 9:00 p.m. The final road game of the ACC season for the Seminoles will be televised by the ACC Network.

"The biggest reason for my confidence right now is the excitement of the moment," said Swinton. "As we get closer to the postseason, the stakes get higher, and that fuels me. Instead of overthinking, I'm just playing free and trusting my game."

Swinton's month began with his first double figure scoring performance with 10 points on the road at Boston College. Against the Eagles, the social sciences major made four of six field goal attempts including his first multiple 3-point shots made game of his career. He also tied his career-high with four rebounds.

Based on his performance against Boston College, Swinton earned his first career starting assignment against Notre Dame. He responded with a stat sheet stuffer game against the Fighting Irish with nine points on a career-high five of six free throws made, one assist and one steal.

"Honestly, I was nervous at first," said Swinton. "But my teammates had my back, reminding me that I'd started plenty of big games before. They told me to just go out there, have fun, and play my game, and that really helped me settle in."

Swinton enters Tuesday's game against Virginia on the heels of a seven-point, two-rebound performance in his first appearance in Cameron Indoor Stadium against Duke. Against the Blue Devils, he was a perfect two of two from the free throw line and made his eighth 3-point field goal of the season.

In Florida State's eight games since the start of the month of February Swinton is averaging 5.4 points (as compared to 1.9 points per game in the first 17 games of his career), 2.1 rebounds (as compared to his 1.1 rebounds per game average on November, December, and January) and is shooting .778 from the free throw line (as compared to .500 in his first 17 games).

Swinton has made five of his eight 3-point shots for the season since the calendar turned to February.

"AJ is so competitive that he doesn't allow a mistake to bother him," said Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton after the Seminoles' victory over Miami on February 19. "He's confident. He's developed that mindset that 'I'm just going to give it all I have.' He missed the first, but he took his time and held his follow through. He has all the ingredients, and it just shows the maturity in the growth that he has developed over the years. There was no hesitation on his part, and I'm very proud of him."

Swinton has had Florida State's game at Virginia circled on his own personal schedule mainly because of its proximity to his home in Cabin John, Md., a suburb of Washington, D.C. He'll have a large contingent of family and friends make the drive along the Blue Ridge mountains to see their hero suit up for Florida State. Among his group of family and friends cheering on Swinton's every move in the court, will be his mom, Danielle Swinton, who has always been her son's biggest fan.

"This game is special for me, one I've been looking forward to for a long time," said Swinton. "I have eight family members and friends coming out to support me and my teammates. Growing up in the DMV (the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area's National Capital Region), I was a big ACC fan, and with my grandfather and cousin having attended UVA, this game means even more.

"My mom has been to nine games this year. Her support means everything to me. Even when she can't make it in person, she rearranges her work schedule to make sure she's watching. That kind of dedication pushes me to go even harder."

With only two games remaining on the Seminoles' regular season schedule, Swinton is hopeful to continue his run of recent success as his play and confidence continue to shoot skyward.

CLEMSON -- Junior Malique Ewin earned his fourth career double-double of 15 points and 10 rebounds while Jamir Watkins and Jerry Deng scored 11 points each as Florida State fell to Clemson at Littlejohn Coliseum by a 77-57 margin. The Tigers made 13 3-point shots, outscored Florida State 13-2 to begin the second half, and scored 41 second half points to win their fifth ACC game of the season. Ewin and Watkins have now scored in double figures in 13 consecutive games. Both players have scored in double-figures in each Florida State game since November 15. TALLAHASSEE – Taylor Bol Bowen scored a career-high 20 points, and Malique Ewin earned his fourth consecutive double-double of 17 points and 11 rebounds to lead Florida State to its second consecutive ACC victory with a 91-78 win over Georgia Tech at the Donald L.
