GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia (5-6, 0-2 ACC) plays its second and final ACC road game Saturday (April 12), when the Cavaliers travel to No. 9 Notre Dame (5-3, 1-1 ACC).
- · Opening faceoff from Arlotta Stadium is set for 5 p.m. on ESPNU.

SERIES HISTORY

- The all-time series between Virginia and Notre Dame, which began during the 1993 NCAA Tournament, is tied 11-11.
- After UVA won six consecutive games from 2019-23, the Fighting Irish enter Saturday's contest on a three-game win streak over the Cavaliers.
- UND won both meetings last year: 11-9 in the regular season at Klöckner Stadium and 18-9 in the ACC Tournament semifinal at American Legion Memorial Stadium (Charlotte, N.C.). The Fighting Irish went on to capture both ACC and NCAA Tournament titles.
- •The last time the two teams met at Arlotta Stadium was during the 2023 regular-season, when the then-No. 3 Cavaliers knocked off the top-ranked Irish, 15-10. UVA's starting attack, consisting of Connor Shellenberger (2g, 5a), Xander Dickson (6g, 1a) and Payton Cormier (2g, 2a), combined for 18 points in the win.
- In the 2019 ACC Tournament championship game, Virginia knocked off the Irish, 10-4, at Klöckner Stadium after holding UND scoreless for 42:12 of game time.
- •The two teams have squared off in the NCAA Tournament five times ('93, '94, '06, '12, '23) with the Cavaliers leading 3-2 in such contests.

THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAHOOWA

The origin of "Wahoowa" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wa."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

SERIES HISTORY (cont.)

- At Championship Weekend in 2023, UND scored four of the game's last five goals, including the game-winner in overtime, at Lincoln Financial Field (Philadelphia, Pa.). Shellenberger (3g, 3a) led all players with six points.
- \cdot The first-ever meeting on May 15, 1993, was an NCAA Tournament game that UVA won 19-9 at Klöckner Stadium in the facility's inaugural season.
- In 2006, Virginia defeated the Irish 20-8 in the quarterfinals before capturing the program's fourth NCAA title, in a 15-7 decision over UMass at Lincoln Financial Field (Philadelphia, Pa).
- In the 2012 NCAA Tournament quarterfinals at PPL Park (Chester, Pa.), both teams were tied 6-6 heading into the fourth quarter before the Irish outscored UVA 6-4 in the final period.
- Notre Dame attackman and Charlottesville native Max Pfeifer (Western Albemarle HS) recorded his first hat trick of the season. The Irish were eliminated by eventual-champion Loyola in the semifinals
- •The loss marked the final career game for UVA All-Americans Steele Stanwick, Colin Briggs, Chris Bocklet, Matt Lovejoy and Rob Fortunato.

SCOUTING THE FIGHTING IRISH

- The two-time reigning national champion Notre Dame Fighting Irish are ranked in No. 9 in both the USILA and Inside Lacrosse weekly polls.
- Virginia and Notre Dame are the only two programs to win back-to-back national championships since 2014.
- The Irish are led by UVA alum Kevin Corrigan, who was member of the Cavalier men's lacrosse roster from 1978-80. Corrigan is in his 37th season as Notre Dame head coach.
- Notre Dame is led by attackman Chris Kavanagh, who has scored at least one goal in 51 of his 53 career games.
- Including Kavangh, the Irish have seven midseason All-Americans according to Inside Lacrosse.
- Will Angrick (midfield), Will Lynch (faceoff), Will Donovan (LSM), Shawn Lyght (defense) and Kavanagh were name second-team midseason All-Americans, while Ben Ramsey (SSDM) and Jake Taylor (attack) were named to the third team and honorable mention list, respectively.
- For the third straight week, the Cavaliers will face another top-10 faceoff specialist in Lynch. A true senior, Lynch is currently tenth among all DI faceoff specialists with a 61.4 faceoff win percentage.
- Notre Dame is coming off its third and most lopsided loss of the season, a 14-9 decision at Syracuse last Saturday (April 5).
- · UND's only other two defeats this season have been by one score: 11-10 to Maryland and 10-9 to Ohio State. The Terps were ranked No. 2 at the time and Ohio State which is receiving first-place votes in this week's USILA and Inside Lacrosse polls has since solidified itself as one of the nation's top teams.

LAST TIME OUT

- In last week's ACC road opener, Virginia fell behind early and was outperformed in the second half as then-No. 9 North Carolina cruised to an 18-9 victory in warm, bright conditions at Dorrance Field.
- UNC attackman Dominic Pietramala scored a game-high four goals, all of which came in the first half.
- The Tar Heels held UVA scoreless for the final 24:24, its second-longest scoring drought of the season and a span in which UNC scored six straight.
- The Cavaliers were led by **McCabe Millon**, who scored two goals and logged two assists. Midfielder **Will Inderlied** also notched a pair of goals to record the first multi-goal effort of his career.
- \cdot Both UVA faceoff specialists Andrew Greenspan (1g) and Henry Metz (1g) scored off draws.

VIRGINIA'S STINGY MAN-DOWN UNIT

- · Virginia's man-down defense is much improved from last year to this.
- •Through their first 10 games this season, the Cavaliers have only surrendered six goals on 41 opponent extra-man opportunities, a clip of 85.4 percent, which leads the ACC and is good for third nationally.
- Last year, UVA opponents scored on 50.9 percent (28-55) of their EMO chances.
- UVA's man-down unit is coached by assistant coach and former UVA close defenseman **Logan Greco** '19.

HOOS IN THE NATIONAL STATISTICAL RANKINGS

- In addition to being No. 3 among all Division I teams in man-down defense, Virginia is fifth nationally in ground balls (36.00/gm), 10th in man-up offense (.484) and 15th in caused turnovers (9.45/gm).
- Among all DI players, McCabe Millon is 21st in assists (2.00/gm). Fellow attackmen Ryan Colsey (4) and Truitt Sunderland (4) are tied for 23rd in man-up goals.

MILLON STARTING TO FIND HIS STRIDE DOWN THE STRETCH

- McCabe Millon has been highly productive in Virginia's last four games against UAlbany (March 18), Utah (March 22), Syracuse (March 29) and at North Carolina (March 5).
- · Millon has led UVA in goals, assists and points in three of its last four games.

THE CAVALIERS AT KLÖCKNER STADIUM

- Virginia owns a 184-50 (.786) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 4-3 mark in 2025, and has won 18 of its last 25 games played at the historic edifice.
- The Cavaliers' average margin of victory in their last 25 games at Klöckner Stadium is 4.56 goals.
- Virginia is 58-18 (.763) all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach Lars Tiffany.
- UVA is also 15-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in NCAA Tournament contests.
- · Lacrosse debuted in Klöckner Stadium in 1993.

VIRGINIA IN THE POLLS

- For the second time this season, Virginia fell out of the USILA coaches poll top-20 rankings on March 17, following its 12-6 loss to No. 1 Maryland (March 15).
- For the first time since the 2018 preseason poll, UVA was not ranked in the March 3 edition of the USILA coaches poll after dropping back-to-back games to Ohio State and Johns Hopkins.
- UVA has been in ranked in 95 percent of USILA coaches polls all-time, which began in 1973.
- This week, the Cavaliers are receiving votes in both the USILA and Inside Lacrosse polls, but are ranked No 18 in the USA Lacrosse magazine poll.

ON THE HORIZON

- Next Saturday (April 19), the Cavaliers return to Klöckner Stadium for Senior Day and to host Lafayette (7-4).
- · Opening faceoff is set for 1 p.m. on ACC Network Extra.

LARS TIFFANY AMONG THE VIRGINIA'S ELITE COACHES

- Lars Tiffany is in his ninth season as UVA head coach and 21st of his head coaching career with stops at Stony Brook (2005-06) and Brown (2007-16).
- Tiffany guided the Cavaliers to the program's eighth and ninth national championships overall in 2019 and 2021, marking the only pair of back-to-back titles in program history (note: COVID-19 forced the cancellation of the 2020 NCAA Tournament).
- He has also steered the Hoos to four of the last five Championship Weekends (2019, 2021, 2023, 2024), and is the nation's only head coach accomplish that feat.
- A native of LaFayette, New York, Tiffany entered the 2024 season eight wins away from the 100th of his UVA career.
- Tiffany-coached teams, including his 2016 Brown squad which also reached Championship Weekend, have finished top-2 in the nation in ground balls per game in the last nine consecutive seasons.
- Tiffany graduated from Brown University in 1990, where he played defense and was a two-time captain under Dom Starsia, who would later become UVA's head coach following the 1992 season.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- · Virginia has led the nation in ground balls in seven of the last nine years
- UVA has also finished in the top-2 nationally in ground balls the last nine consecutive seasons.
- UVA is the only program in the nation to finish in the top-3 nationally in ground balls per game 15 times over the last 16 seasons.
- The only program in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was UVA head coach **Lars Tiffany**'s 2016 Brown team.

MATTHEW NUNES: ONE OF UVA'S MOST ACCOMPLISHED GOALIES

- Senior goalie **Matthew Nunes** set the Virginia single-season program record with 213 saves in 17 games in 2023.
- His 213 saves shattered Alex Rode's previous program record of 212 saves, which Rode achieved in 16 games during UVA's 2021 national championship run.
- Also in 2023, Nunes led all ACC goalies in save percentage (.551) among conference games only, and finished second overall in the ACC in both goals-against average (11.95) and saves per game (14.33).
- In 2022, Nunes set the program's freshman saves record (159).
- At then-No. 16 Harvard in 2024, Nunes scored the game-winning goal and made 17 saves to help UVA mount a successful comeback. Virginia trailed by as many as five goals in the third quarter. Nunes' goal was the first by a UVA goalie since Adam Ghitelman did so against Duke in the 2010 ACC Tournament.
- · Nunes has been at his best in the biggest of games (see chart below).

WAYER, CHIZMAR, SCHUTZ NAMED IL MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- LSM Ben Wayer (third team), and midfielders Noah Chizmar (honorable mention) and Griffin Schutz (honorable mention) were named midseason All-Americans by Inside Lacrosse on March 27.
- •At the time of the announcement, Wayer was third nationally and led the ACC among non-faceoff specialists in ground balls per game (5.56), and had four goals and one assist.
- Chizmar is UVA's top short-stick defensive midfielder and often times takes the opposite wing of Wayer on faceoffs. As of March 27, Chizmar had 26 ground balls, good for second on the team. He also matched his career high of six GBs at Ohio State (Feb. 22).
- Schutz led all UVA midfielders in goals (13) and points (16). With three goals and one assist against Utah (Mach 22), he entered ACC play by coming off a season-high four points. Schutz is inside UVA's career top-10 lists in goals, assists and points by a midfielder. See charts on page 6.

THE EMERGENCE OF RYAN COLSEY

- Attackman **Ryan Colsey** (25-9-34) has led UVA in goals for most of the year.
- Colsey had a breakout game against High Point (Feb. 18), when he recorded career highs in goals (6) and assists (3).
- He started in 16 of UVA's games at midfield in 2024 and finished with 19 goals, including five on man-up, and four assists.
- Colsey's younger brother, Kyle, is redshirting this season due to injury. Their father, Roy, is a Professional Lacrosse Hall of Fame class of 2023 inductee. Roy Colsey was an All-American midfielder at Syracuse, where he helped the Orange to two national titles (1993 & 1995) and was a three-time first-team All-American from 1993-95.

BEN WAYER EYEING ALL-AMERICAN SENIOR YEAR

- Virginia senior LSM **Ben Wayer** was ranked No. 20 on Inside Lacrosse's preseason top-50 watch list.
- Wayer was also dubbed a second-team preseason All-American by both Inside Lacrosse and USA Lacrosse.
- In 2024, Wayer led all Division I non-faceoff specialists in ground balls (98), the most by a UVA non-FOGO in program single-season history, and ground balls per game (5.44).
- Wayer also proved to be a dual-threat in transition after finishing the 2024 season with seven goals and six assists. Wayer registered at least one point in 11 of UVA's 18 total games.
- · In 2024, he was voted an All-American honorable mention by both the USILA and USA Lacrosse.

McCabe Millon's record-setting freshman season

- The Cavaliers have turned to sophomore **McCabe Millon** to quarterback the offense this season, following the departure of attackmen Connor Shellenberger and Payton Cormier.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Millon is UVA's top returning producer in goals, assists and points.
- As a true freshman, he started on attack in 17 of UVA's 18 total games in 2024. The only game he did not start in was on the Cavaliers' Senior Day against Notre Dame.
- Millon scored 41 goals and logged 25 assists to lead all Division I freshmen in both goals and points (66).
- His 41 goals are a UVA freshman record, while his 66 points stand at No. 2.
- A native of Reisterstown, Maryland, Millon burst on to the scene in his career debut against Michigan, when he scored five goals. In the Cavaliers' 11-10 double overtime thriller over Johns Hopkins in the NCAA quarterfinals, Millon scored three goals and dished out two assists to help UVA advance to Championship Weekend for the fourth time in the previous five opportunities.
- Millon was named a second-team preseason All-American by both Inside Lacrosse and USA Lacrosse, and was also ranked No. 16 on IL's preseason top-50 watch list.

HEAD COACH LARS TIFFANY

OVERVIEW

Lars Tiffany was named Virginia's 17th head coach on June 21, 2016. He is currently in his ninth season at UVA and 21st season overall as head coach. Tiffany is Virginia's only head coach to win back-to-back national championships (2019 & 2021). Tiffany begins the 2025 season with 92 wins as UVA head coach, good for No. 3 all-time in program history behind only Jim "Ace" Adams (137) and Dom Starsia (274).

A Biology concentrator, Tiffany played on two Brown teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament (1987 & 1990). He was Co-MVP of the Brown squad that captured its first-ever NCAA playoff victory in 1990 (12-9 vs. UMass). Tiffany capped his career by playing in the North-South Senior All-Star game.

VIRGINIA'S SEVEN PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Seven Cavaliers in McCabe Millon (second team), Griffin Schutz (second team), Ben Wayer (second team), Noah Chizmar (honorable mention), Johnny Hackett (honorable mention), John Schroter (honorable mention) and Joey Terenzi (honorable mention) were named Preseason All-Americans by Inside Lacrosse.
- · Virginia was the only program nationally with three selections on the second team and one of three teams with at least seven honorees.

SEASON OVERVIEW

- The Cavaliers host nine regular-season games at Klöckner Stadium this year, including ACC contests against Syracuse (March 29) and Duke (April 26).
- Virginia returns six starters from its 2024 roster, including preseason All-Americans McCabe Millon (attack), Griffin Schutz (midfield) and John Schroter (defense), and veteran netminder Matthew Nunes.
- UVA also returns Second Team Preseason All-American LSM Ben Wayer, who led the team in ground balls (98) last season, its primary faceoff specialist Anthony Ghobriel and goalie Kyle Morris, who saw action in all three NCAA Tournament games last season.
- The Hoos look to fill the void left by All-Americans Connor Shellenberger, the program's only three-time Tewaaraton Award finalist and four-time First Team All-American, Payton Cormier, the NCAA Division I all-time leading goal scorer, and four-year starting defenseman Cole Kastner.

TRANSFERS ADD DEPTH ON OFFENSE AND AT FACEOFF X

- This offseason, Lars Tiffany added five transfers to his squad: **Charles Balsamo** (Duke), **Andrew Greenspan** (Notre Dame), **Johnny Hackett** (Bryant), **Chase MacCartee** (Kenyon College) and **John Totaro** (Denver).
- •The group makes up the nation's No. 3 transfer class best among all ACC teams according to Inside Lacrosse.
- Balsamo spent the past two seasons at Duke, where he competed as a midfielder in 38 games, including 21 starts. Over his two-year career with the Blue Devils, Balsamo recorded 27 goals, 20 assists and 16 multi-point efforts. In 2023, Balsamo finished the season with 31 points, which is good for second all-time in Duke freshman history.
- Greenspan, a faceoff specialist, was a member of Notre Dame's national championship team as a true freshman in 2024. Greenspan graduated high school from the Brunswick School, where he was the nation's No. 35 overall prospect (according to Inside Lacrosse), a High School All-American and a member of the U.S. National Team's U18 roster.
- · Hackett played the previous two years at Bryant as a midfielder, where he was a two-time First Team All-America East selection, and the 2023 America East Rookie of the Year. In 31 appearances, including 29 starts, Hackett combined for more than 100 points on 64 goals and 37 assists.

VIRGINIA'S FIRST-YEAR (FRESHMAN) CLASS

- The Cavaliers' freshman class was ranked No. 1 in the nation by Inside Lacrosse.
- The class consists of five-star signees: Hudson Hausmann (Brunwsick),
 Luke Hublitz (Brunswick), Sean Browne (Episcopal School of Dallas), Kyle
 Colsey (Ridgefield) and Ryan Duenkel (St. Johns College HS).
- UVA's list of four-star prospects consists of **JP Lagunowich** (Chatham), **Tommy Snyder** (St. Anthony's) and **Luke Jamin** (Taft).
- Goalie **Troy Capstraw** (Daphne, Ala.) and faceoff specialist **Christian Grosso** (Wellesley, Mass.) round out the Cavaliers' freshman.
- Additionally, the Cavaliers added first-year **Reese Stepanian** (Houston, Texas) to the squad this past fall.
- Earlier this year, it was announced that Browne, Colsey and Duenkel will miss the 2025 season due to injuries.

ACC CHAMPIONSHIP PEDIGREE

- Virginia has claimed at least a share of 19 ACC championships, including two (2019 & 2022) under head coach **Lars Tiffany**.
- The Cavaliers won 11 titles (1962, 1964, 1969, 1970, 1971, 1975, 1980, 1983, 1984, 1985 and 1986) prior the ACC establishing a tournament from 1989-2019 to determine the champion.
- Virginia has won seven ACC Tournaments: 1997, 1999, 2000, 2003, 2006, 2010 and 2019.
- In the 2019 ACC Tournament, which was held at Klöckner Stadium, UVA defeated Notre Dame 10-4 in the championship game.
- From 1989-2019, Virginia won 14 regular-season titles (1990, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2006, 2009, 2010, 2012 and 2019), more than any other ACC school.
- The ACC Tournament returns this season and will once again be contested at American Legion Stadium in Charlotte, N.C., on May 3 and 5.

ORANGE & BLUE: IT RUNS IN THE FAMILY

- The Cavalier lacrosse program has a long history of sibling connections and this year is no different.
- Brothers **Ryan** ('26) and **Kyle** ('28) **Colsey** are both attackmen on this year's team. Ryan redshirted as a true freshman in 2023 as will be the case for Kyle this year after suffering an injury in the fall. Their father, Roy Colsey, played midfield at Syracuse, is a Lacrosse Hall of Fame inductee, and was recently named head coach of the PLL's Carolina Chaos.
- Brendan Millon ('29), the younger brother of **McCabe Millon** ('27), signed with UVA this past fall and will join the Hoos as a true freshman in the fall of 2025.
- Defenseman **Griffin Kology** ('25) has a younger sister, Lara ('26) on the UVA women's lacrosse team. Griffin and Lara's older brother, Kyle ('21) was a member of both the 2019 and 2021 national championship teams and a USILA Third Team All-American.
- The sister of attackman **Tucker Mullen** ('25), Taylor, played for the UVA women's lacrosse team as a graduate transfer in 2023.
- Other notable UVA lacrosse sibling connections include: Chris and Casey (sister) Bocklet, Shamel and Rhamel Bratton, Brian and Kevin Carroll, Matt and Mark Cockerton, Rob and Matt Emery, Adam and Jake Ghitelman, Brendan, Conor and Gavin Gill, Billy, Danny and Pat Glading, and Griffin and Miles Thompson.
