KEY STORYLINES

- The Hokies return all five of their All-Americans from a season ago including 2019 national champion and 3x All-American Mekhi Lewis and 2x All-American Bryce Andonian for their final year of eligibility.
- As a team Tech entered the season as No. 2, No. 3, and No. 5 according to Intermat, Flowrestling, and NWCA, respectively.
- Joining Lewis and Andonian to lead the Hokies are two-time All-American Sam Latona, Eddie Ventresca, and Caleb Henson. Tech also returns a total of 11 NCAA Qualifiers.
- Lewis looks to become the first 4x NCAA All-American in program history as he chases his second national title in his final year of eligibility.
- The Hokies finished ninth at the 2023 NCAA Championships, marking their 10th straight top-11 finish and the highest placing ACC team.
- Tech extended their streak of finishing with three or more All-Americans for the 10th straight season. The Hokies are one of only four programs to continue the streak – Penn State, Iowa, and Cornell.
- The Hokies boast the reigning ACC Freshman of the Year in Caleb Henson after claiming an ACC title and All-American honors as a true freshman.
- Head coach Tony Robie enters his seventh season at the helm after being elevated to head coach in 2017 after 15 years as an assistant in Blacksburg. Robie is the reigning 2023 ACC Coach of the Year – his fourth honor in seven seasons

REGULAR SEASON IN REARVIEW

- Tech wrapped up the regular season with a 9-4 dual record with four wins against ranked teams and a runner-up finish in conference dual meet standings
- Head coach Tony Robie improved his career record at the helm to 71-22 in his seventh season leading the Hokies
- Mekhi Lewis completed his final regular season undefeated at 13-0 with eight bonus point victories and stymied opponents to zero registered offensive points
- Caleb Henson finished an impressive sophomore regular season 24-1 with a 56% bonus rate
- Tech was ranked in the top-15 all season for the 15th consecutive season and reached as high as No. 2 this season - the highest in program history

HOKIES IN THE RANKINGS

- Tech finished No. 13 in the NWCA polls, No. 8 according to Flowrestling, and No. 9 on Intermat
- The Hokies feature ten ranked wrestlers in the latest Interamat rankings led by No. 2 Caleb Henson (149-pounds) and No. 2 Mekhi Lewis (174-pounds). Also ranked in the top-15 are No. 6 Cooper Flynn (125-pounds), No. 9 Bryce Andonian (157-pounds), No. 15 Sam Latona (133-pounds), and No. 15 Thomas Stewart, Jr. (184-pounds). No. 16 Tom Crook (141-pounds), No. 19 Hunter Catka (285-pounds), No. 21 Connor Brady (165-pounds), and No. 27 Andy Smith (197-pounds) also find themselves in the top-27 to round out the remaining ranked Hokies

HOKIES IN THE ACC - HISTORY

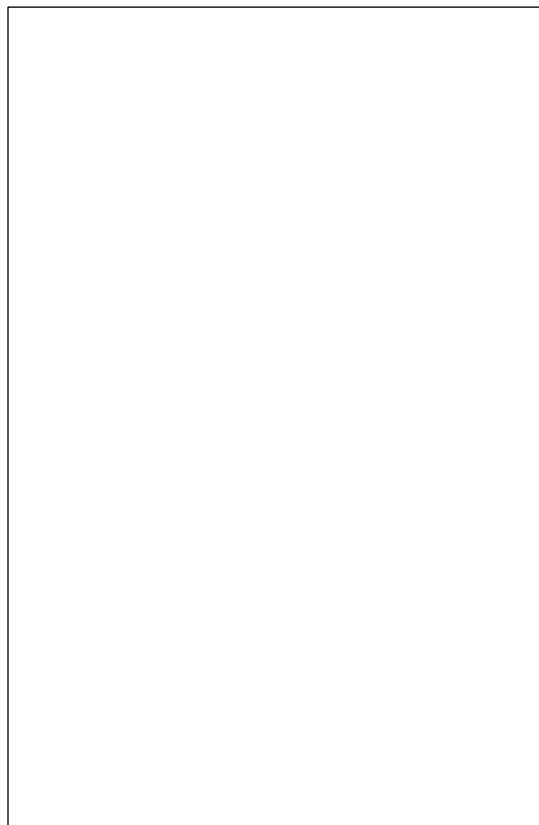
- Tech will look to pick up its fifth ACC tournament title since joining the conference in 2004

ACC CHAMPIONSHIPS ONE YEAR AGO

- Tech finished second with two individual champions at the 2023 ACC Championships in Raleigh, NC
- Mekhi Lewis won his third individual championship - 2019 (165), 2022 (174; named Most Outstanding Wrestler), and 2023 (174)
- Caleb Henson won his first title as a true freshman and would go on to win ACC Freshman of the Year
- Head coach Tony Robie would go on to win his fourth ACC Coach of the Year in seven seasons after leading the Hokies to a ACC-best ninth place finish and securing five All-Americans - the third most in the country and tied for second most in program history

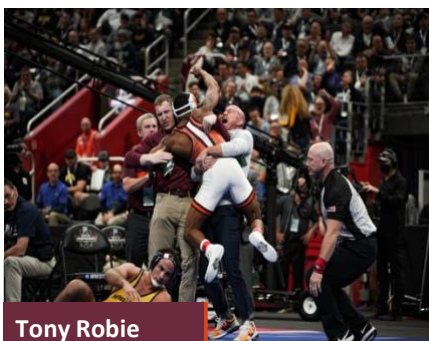

When Virginia Tech head wrestling coach Tony Robie arrived in Blacksburg in 2006, he was an associated head coach who inherited a barren program that had the potential to be great. Progressively he helped build the Hokies into one of the top programs in the ACC and a mainstay in the top-10 nationally. Six full seasons into his tenure as head coach, Robie is still leading the Hokies into new territory.

Robie led the Hokies to a record season in 2022-2023 to the beat of a ninth-place finish along with five All-Americans at the 2023 NCAA Championships in Tulsa. Tech placed the highest among ACC teams and the five All-Americans – Eddie Ventresca, Sam Latona, Caleb Henson, Bryce Andonian, and Mekhi Lewis – were the second-best in program history. The Hokies made history again under Robie’s leadership with ten automatic qualifiers for the first time in program history and just the second time Tech qualified ten wrestlers to the NCAA Championships. Robie also led Tech to a 10-3 dual record which saw the program garner an ACC regular season title and finish with two ACC champions. With a stellar season, Robie was named 2023 ACC Coach of the Year – the fourth honor in seven seasons for the head man.

History was made once again in the 2021-2022 season that saw Mekhi Lewis reach the NCAA finals for the second time in his career – the only two-time finalist in program history – under Robie’s tutelage. The Hokies also secured All-American finishes from Bryce Andonian and Korbin Myers to place eleventh in Detroit. Robie was once again named ACC Coach of the Year to add to his mantle.

Robie led the Hokies to a historic season in 2020-2021, piloting the first undefeated season in program history since 1956-57. At 9-0 under Robie’s guidance, the Hokies completed their longest undefeated season in program history, topping 1954-1955’s 8-0 mark. With the feat, Robie joined Frank Teske, George Herring, and S.B. Sutton. Tech won its fourth ACC Dual Meet title after posting a perfect 5-0 ACC dual record, the second such title in Robie’s tenure and fourth ACC Championship with Robie at the helm.

In 2019-2020, the program rose the ranks to No. 3 in the National Wrestling Coaches of America Coaches’ Poll, the highest rank under Robie and tied for the highest in its history at the time. He helped the progression of redshirt sophomore Hunter Bolen, who went on to win his first ACC title in 2020 and was the No. 2 seed for the 2020 NCAA Championships at 184-pounds.

In 2018-2019, Robie helped guide Mekhi Lewis to the program’s first national championship and Most Outstanding Wrestler honors at the 2019 NCAA Championships in Pittsburgh. Lewis’ title run at 165-pounds wrapped up a season that saw the Hokies finish in the top-11 at the NCAA Championships for the eighth consecutive season and a top-two placing at the ACC Championships for the seventh-straight year. Tech had three All-Americans and three ACC champions in Lewis, David McFadden, and Zack Zavatsky. Robie’s performance earned him 2019 ACC Coach of the Year accolades, the second time receiving the honor.

In his first season leading the program, Robie continued Virginia Tech wrestling’s run of success as the Hokies won its second consecutive ACC Championship and placed eighth at the NCAA Championships in Cleveland. Robie became the first coach in the history of ACC wrestling to guide his team to conference championships in his first two seasons. With Robie on staff, Virginia Tech has won 12 ACC titles over the last seven years and 10 conference trophies overall when including dual meet championships.

In Robie’s first full campaign, Virginia Tech placed at least three wrestlers on the podium at nationals for the sixth consecutive season. Jared Haught led the group of three All-Americans in 2018 by becoming the Hokies’ second-ever national finalist, joining Devin Carter in 2014. Four Hokies – Haught, David McFadden, Brent Moore, and Dennis Gustafson – won ACC titles, with Moore taking home Most Valuable Wrestler honors. Robie also coached McFadden to a regular season record of 30-0, the first undefeated season at Virginia Tech since 2001-02.

In duals, Robie led the Hokies to a 14-3 overall record, a 4-1 mark in ACC matches and a final ranking of No. 10 in the final NWCA Coaches’ Poll. Robie’s 14 dual meet victories ranks second in the ACC record book for most wins by a first-year head coach behind Wade Schalles’ 15 wins with Clemson in 1978. His .824 winning percentage ranks third all-time in ACC history for a rookie head coach. In Virginia Tech history, Robie’s winning percentage ranks first among rookie head coaches while his 14 wins ranks second behind Tom Brands’ 16 dual meet wins in 2004-2005. Robie, who started five freshmen in duals for a majority of the season, was also named a finalist for the Therawox NWCA National Coach of the Year award.

On March 21, 2017, Robie was promoted to head wrestling coach at Virginia Tech after serving as interim head coach since February of that year. During that span, Robie led the Hokies to the team title at the ACC Championships and a sixth-place finish at the 2017 NCAA Championships in St. Louis – Tech’s fifth-straight top-10 finish at nationals.

Robie was an integral part of the Virginia Tech wrestling staff for 11 seasons as associate head coach under former head coach Kevin Dresser. Between that 2006-07 and 2016-17, the Hokies won three ACC Dual Meet Championships, three ACC tournament championships, and finished in the top-10 at the NCAA Championships five times. One of those top-10 team finishes included a then-ACC record and program best fourth place and six All-American finish in 2016. He also helped recruit and coach 17 ACC champions and 14 All-Americans.

Robie came to Blacksburg after serving as the head coach at Binghamton University, a program that had been discontinued after the 2003-04 school year because of budget constraints. Before taking over at Binghamton, he was an assistant coach for four seasons at the University of Michigan.

In seven years as a Division I assistant coach, Robie helped coach 23 All-Americans, nine Academic All-Americans, and one national champion. As the Wolverines’ top assistant coach, Robie recruited three top-10 classes, including the No. 2 ranked class in 2004. His one-on-one work with Michigan student-athlete Ryan Bertin culminated with Bertin’s 2003 NCAA championship – the school’s first national champion in 18 years. In all, Michigan’s team earned national top-10 status all four years that Robie was a coach there. His dedication and influence off the mat resulted in the team winning the 2003 community service award at the school.

Robie joined the Michigan staff after coaching stops at West Virginia (1998-99) and Edinboro (1999-00).
