#### VIRGINIA TECH HOSTS NOTRE DAME

- Virginia Tech seeks to secure its second-ever win against Notre Dame as the Irish visit Lane Stadium (10/9) in the fourth all-time meeting in the series.
- The Hokies enjoyed an open date last week after registering off a 21-10 win vs. Richmond (9/25).
- Tech is seeking to register two home wins against AP Top 25 foes in the same season for the first time since 2009: 16-15 vs. No. 19 Nebraska (9/19/09) & 31-7 vs. No. 9 Miami (9/16/09).
- The Hokies are seeking a five-game home winning under head coach Justin Fuente and the first such stretch since winning six straight at Lane Stadium (10/12/19 - 10/17/20).
- ND is coming off a 24-13 loss vs. Cincinnati (10/2). The Irish haven't lost back-to-back regular season games since dropping a 34-31 contest vs. VT (11/19/16) and a 45-27 decision at USC (11/26/16).
- Virginia Tech overcame a pair of 17-point deficits to register that a dramatic 34-31 victory in its initial meeting with the Irish at Notre Dame (11/19/16).
- Notre Dame won its only prior visit to Lane Stadium, claiming a 45-23 win (10/6/18).
- The Hokies nearly pulled off a road upset of No. 16 Notre Dame in Tech's last game in South Bend. Backup QB Quincy Patterson was making his first start and VT held a 20-14 lead before Irish QB Ian Book led his squad on a game-winning 18-play, 87-yard TD drive to secure a 21-20 win (11/12/19).
- That 2019 win for the Irish marked the start of a 16-game victory streak for Notre Dame.
- The Hokies and Irish aren't currently scheduled to meet again in regular season play until Virginia Tech returns to Notre Dame (11/6/27).
- Following the Notre Dame contests Tech returns to ACC action when the Hokies play host to Pitt (10/9).

#### KEY SCORING STATS ON HOKIES, IRISH

- Tech owns a 36-4 record under Fuente when leading at the half, including a streak of eight straight wins.
- VT is 28-7 when scoring 30+ points under Fuente and 13-1 when scoring 40+ points.
- ND has won 36 straight games when scoring 30+ dating back to a 49-16 win vs. Temple (9/2/17).
- ND is 5-11 when permitting 30+ points going back to the start of the 2016 campaign.
- VT is 31-1 under Fuente when holding foes to 21 points or fewer and has won 28 straight games when holding foes to 17 points or fewer.
- Notre Dame is 1-10 in its last 11 contents when being held to 17 points or fewer.
- VT is one of three ACC schools (Clemson, NCSU) that haven't permitted 28 points in a game this season.
- Notre Dame is 2-0 in games decided by three points or fewer this season and owns a four-game winning streak in such games.

#### OLD-SCHOOL SCORING DEFENSE

- Virginia Tech, Penn State, Clemson, Georgia and Arkansas are the only P5 teams to hold an AP Top

- 25 foe to 10 points or fewer this season. Tech did it in a 17-10 win vs. No. 10 UNC (9/3).
- Tech is one of 18 Power Five programs to hold another P5 program to 10 points or fewer this season.
- Tech is 14-0 under Fuente when permitting 10 points or fewer.
- ND is 0-5 under Brian Kelly when being held to 10 points or fewer. Four of those five losses have come vs. ACC foes: 10-3 at NCSU (10/8/16), 41-8 at Miami (11/11/17), 30-3 vs. Clemson (12/29/18) and 34-10 vs. Clemson (12/19/20).
- Virginia Tech is permitting 15.3 ppg in 2021 to rank seventh in the P5 and 11th in FBS. Only Clemson (12.2) is better in the ACC.
- Tech ranks fourth in the ACC and 13th in the FBS in third-down defense in 2021 at 28.9% (15-52). ND ranks 10th in FBS at 28.8 (21-75).
- No ACC team has allowed fewer first downs than VT (71), a figure that ranks seventh in the Power Five.

#### TECH'S 4-GAME HOME WIN STREAK

- During VT's four-game winning streak that dates back to a 33-15 win vs. UVA (12/12/20), Tech has outscored its foes by a 76-24 margin (19.0-6.0 ppg).
- The Hokies have averaged 177.3 rushing ypg during their four-game home winning streak, while allowing only 106.8 ypg, a +70.5 ypg advantage for Tech.
- VT has scored eight rushing TDs in those four games, while allowing only one.
- After permitting 264 rushing yards at FSU (9/5), ND has allowed 263 rush yds in its last three games and hasn't given up a rushing TD in its last two contests.
- Tech's defense has only allowed opponents to convert 31.8% on third down (21-66) in its last four home games.
- Tech has accumulated 15.0 sacks and has forced six INTs in those four wins at Lane Stadium.

#### TAYVION ROBINSON = "SWEET FEET"

- WR Tayvion Robinson (nicknamed Sweet Feet), leads the ACC with a 15.0-yard punt return average, ranking fourth in the P5 and eighth in the FBS.
- Robinson had a 60-yard punt return TD vs. Richmond (9/25), helping give him an ACC-high 135 PR yards and earning him ACC Co-Special Teams POW honors.
- Robinson and Louisville's Braden Smith are the only two ACC players with a punt return TD in 2021.

#### HOKIES HAVE HISTORY STOPPING SIGNIFICANT WINNING STREAKS

- While not an exhaustive list, here is a look at some notable opponent winning streaks that VT has halted over the past 25+ seasons. Notre Dame has won seven straight true road games dating back to a 38-7 win at Duke (11/9/19). The Irish have won 35 straight vs. unranked teams following a loss to unranked VT (11/19/16).

#### BURMEISTER IS 5-0 AT LANE STADIUM

- In five starts at Lane Stadium, QB Braxton Burmeister has completed 61.2 pct. of his passes and has accounted for five TDs (four passing/one rushing). He is 6-2 overall as Tech's starter.

#### MORE TURNOVER/DEFENSIVE STATS

- Tech is 15-2 under Fuente when forcing two or more INTs, including a 9-0 mark at Lane Stadium. ND suffered two INTs vs. Cincinnati (10/2).
- The Irish haven't thrown two INTs in back-to-back contests since doing it vs. Virginia Tech (11/2/19) and at Duke (11/9/19).
- ND is +6 (11 takes/5 gives) in turnover margin in its four wins. The Irish were -1 (2 takes/3 gives) vs. Cincinnati (10/2).
- VT is second in the ACC & is 18th in the Power Five, allowing 190.3 passing ypg. Tech ranks third in the ACC in defensive pass efficiency (116.6).
- In the ACC, only Pitt (1) has thrown fewer INTs than Tech (2) and Louisville (2).
- Over its last six quarters dating back to the second half at WVU (9/18), Tech has permitted 13 points.

#### FINAL STATISTICAL TIDBITS ON VT/ND

- No FBS team has committed fewer penalties than Tech (15) & only Louisiana-Monroe (125) has been assessed fewer penalty yards than VT (136).
- ND has been flagged 35 times for 285 yards.
- VT is converting at 45.3% (24-53) on third down, while ND is at 35.8% (29-81).
- ND is 3-0 when leading at the half in 2021 & 1-1 when trailing after two quarters.
- Tech ranks second in the ACC with a 41.3-yard KO return avg., trailing only Syracuse (43.0). RBs Raheem Blackshear (78 yards) and Keshawn King (56) both have a KO return of 50+ yards.
- CB Jermaine Waller is tied for fourth in the nation with three INTs in 2021. He was the only FBS player to have an INT in each of 2021's first three games.
- WR Tré Turner posted his third career 100-yard rec. game with 6-102, 1 TD vs. Richmond (9/25).
- LB Alan Tisdale ranks seventh in the ACC, averaging 8.3 tackles per game (33 total/16 solo).
- P Peter Moore ranks third in the ACC with seven punts of 50+ yards and owns eight inside the 20.
- LB Dax Hollifield leads Tech with 4.5 TFL & is tied with DE TyJuan Garbutt with a team-high 3.0 sacks.

# #16 NOTRE DAME 21

NOTRE DAME STADIUM • NOTRE DAME, IND • NOV. 2, 2019 • ATTENDANCE: 77, 622

SOUTH BEND, Ind. – Notre Dame quarterback Ian Book scored on a 7-yard touchdown run with 29 seconds remaining and that carried the No. 16 Irish to a 21-20 nonconference victory over Virginia Tech on Saturday at Notre Dame Stadium. With the loss, the Hokies fell to 5-3 overall on the season and saw their three-game winning streak come to an end. Notre Dame moved to 6-2 on the season. Tech took a 20-14 lead after the second of two second-half field goals by Brian Johnson. Johnson had given the Hokies a 17-14 lead on a 44-yard field goal early in the third quarter, and Tech pushed it to 20-14 on his 25-yarder early in the fourth quarter. But in the final three minutes, the Irish put together their best drive of the day. They marched 87 yards in 18 plays – converting on fourth down on two occasions – and scored on Book’s run. Jonathan Doerer’s extra point provided the final margin. Tech had one last chance, but a Quincy Patterson pass was intercepted, and the Irish ran out the clock.

Making the first start of his career in place of an injured Hendon Hooker, Patterson struggled for much of the game, completing just 9 of 28 pass attempts for 139 yards, with a touchdown and an interception. He rushed for 77 yards on 19 carries, carrying much of the load on a day when the Hokies’ offense amassed just 240 yards. Patterson threw an 8-yard touchdown pass to Damon Hazelton with 1:15 left in the first quarter. Tech’s other touchdown came on a 98-yard fumble return by safety Divine Deablo with 9 seconds remaining in the first half. Notre Dame was in great shape to take a two-touchdown lead at halftime, but the Hokies’ Rayshard Ashby forced a fumble by Notre Dame’s Jafar Armstrong, and Deablo scooped up the ball and went 98 yards for the score.

### GAME NOTES

- The game marked just Tech’s third road loss to a ranked opponent in the past decade.
- Deablo’s fumble return for a score marked the Hokies’ 11th non-offensive touchdown under head coach Justin Fuente, including three by fumble return.
- Deablo’s fumble return for a score marked the longest fumble return ever against Notre Dame.
- Deablo’s third-quarter interception marked the second of his career (West Virginia, 2017).
- Hazelton’s touchdown reception marked his sixth of the season and 18th of his career (14 at Tech). Hazelton has caught a touchdown reception in three consecutive games and four of the past five.
- Johnson’s 44-yard field goal in the third quarter marked his second-longest field goal of his career (45 yards, William & Mary).
- John Parker Romo served as the Hokies’ punter against the Irish after normal starter Oscar Bradburn went down with an injury this past week.

### PREP QBS EXCEL IN NEW POSITIONS FOR VT

• Virginia Tech has a long tradition of converting talented high school QBs to new positions and having them excel for the Hokies, including these four key players for Tech in 2021.

#### TE DRAKE DEIULIIS – CHARLOTTE, N.C.

- Has played in all four games this season, recording three receptions for 51 yards.
- Played in 10 games with two starts in 2020, posting four receptions for 30 yards.
- Saw duty in 12 games in 2019.

#### TE JAMES MITCHELL – BIG STONE GAP, VA

- Led the team with four touchdown receptions in 2020.
- Ranked third on the squad with 26 catches for 435 yards in 2020. Also scored on a one-yard TD run.
- Suffered a season-ending injury vs. Middle Tennessee State (9/11).

#### WR TAYVION ROBINSON – VIRGINIA BEACH, VA

- Has totaled 14 receptions for 166 yards this season to reach the career 1,000-yard mark. Also leads the team with two receiving TDs.
- Scored on a 60-yard punt return vs. Richmond (9/25/21) his first career punt return for a score. He has nine returns for 135 yards on the season and leads the ACC with his 15.0 yard average.
- Started all 11 games at WR in 2020, leading the squad with 38 receptions for 592 yards and tied for second on the team with three TDs.
- Robinson earned PFF College All-Freshman First Team honors as a punt returner in 2019.

#### CB JERMAINE WALLER – WASHINGTON, D.C.

- Is tied for fourth in FBS with three interceptions and was the only FBS player with an interception his first three games.
- Talented corner fully healthy in 2021 after seeing duty in only two games in 2020.
- Honorable Mention All-ACC in 2019.

### MORE NUGGETS ON DEFENSIVE RETURNEES

• Tech returns 10 defensive players who started at least five games in 2020, including versatile CB Chamarrri Conner who led the squad with 81 total tackles (60 solo) in 2019, while tying for second with two INTs.

• Not included in that group is CB Jermaine Waller who was an All-ACC Honorable Mention pick in 2019 and is slated to return after missing the majority of the 2020 campaign.

### FOOTBALL IS FAMILY AT VIRGINIA TECH

Since 1987, Tech has seen 33 sets of brothers and 26 fathers and their sons compete for the Hokies.

### TECH ADDS FOUR VETERAN TRANSFERS

• The Hokies have added four veteran transfers from other Power Five programs: QB Connor Blumrick (Texas A&M), S Tae Daley (Vanderbilt), OL Johnny Jordan (Maryland) and DT Jordan Williams (Clemson).

• **Blumrick (6-5, 215)** comes to Tech after playing in 18 games the past three seasons at Texas A&M. He ran the ball 10 times for 48 yards, while completing one pass for eight yards. He also saw duty on special teams and recovered a muffed punt in last season's 20-7 win vs. LSU (11/28/20).

• **Daley (6-1, 203)** joins the Hokies after spending three years at Vanderbilt (2017-19). In 35 games with the Commodores, he accumulated 108 tackles (74 solo) to go along with three interceptions, 5.5 TFL, three passes defended, a forced fumble and 1.5 sacks. The Warner Robins, Georgia product started nine games at safety in 2019, collecting 57 tackles (35 solo) with three INTs and a forced fumble.

• **Jordan (6-1, 303)** was an All-Big Ten honorable mention selection as a senior at Maryland in 2020 after starting four games at center. He was part of a Terps' offense that ranked second in the Big Ten averaging 264.0 passing ypg. The Leesburg, Virginia native was a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection at Maryland.

• **Williams (6-5, 285)** joins Tech after racking up 55 total tackles, 9.5 TFL, 4.0 sacks, two pass breakups and a forced fumble over the past three seasons at Clemson. The Virginia Beach, Virginia native played in 38 games (three starts) for the Tigers, participating in 673 total snaps. He played in 11 games (three starts) in 2020.

### ACCOLADES, HONORS & MORE

- The consensus 2016 ACC Coach of the Year, Fuente was also named the top first-year FBS head coach in the nation by the Football Writers Association of America, sharing that honor with USC's Clay Helton.
- Tech finished the 2016 season ranked No. 16 in both the AP Poll and the Coaches Poll, marking the highest final mark for the Hokies since 2010 (No. 16 AP, No. 15 Coaches).
- Tech's 10 wins were the team's most since 2011 and the most ever by a first-year Virginia Tech head coach, surpassing the previous mark of nine wins by C.P. Miles in 1905.
- Compiled a 19-6 record in his final two seasons at Memphis, guiding the Tigers to back-to-back bowl berths after inheriting a program that went 5-31 in three years before his arrival.
- Unanimous selection as 2014 American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year when he led Memphis to its first conference title since 1971.
- Named the 1999 Ohio Valley Conference Offensive Player of the Year as a quarterback at Murray State and was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award.

- Named Virginia Tech's head coach on Nov. 29, 2015.
- The Hokies enter their sixth season under Fuente in 2020, who has compiled a 38-26 record in Blacksburg. With six more victories in 2021, he would move into fifth place on Tech's all-time coaching victory list.
- Since Fuente arrived in Blacksburg in 2016, the only ACC schools with more wins over that span are Clemson (65) and Miami (40).
- The only active Power Five head coach appointed during the 2016 hiring cycle owning more victories than Fuente (38) from 2016-20 was Georgia's Kirby Smart (52).
- The only other active ACC head coach who could top Fuente's 33 wins in his first four full seasons at an ACC school is Clemson's Dabo Swinney (36).
- The Hokies have been ranked in the AP Top 25 during each of Fuente's seasons at the helm at Tech with the squad boasting five victories against Top 25 foes.
- The Hokies have finished in the Top 25 twice under Fuente. Tech finished the 2016 season ranked No. 16 in both the AP Poll and the Coaches Poll and concluded the 2017 season at No. 24 in the AP Top 25 and No. 25 in the Coaches Poll.
- Prior to Fuente's arrival, Tech had never had two players selected in the first round of the same NFL Draft. That feat has occurred twice in the past four years with LB Tremaine Edmunds (Buffalo) and S Terrell Edmunds (Pittsburgh) going in the first round of the 2018 NFL Draft, while CB Caleb Farley (Tennessee) and T Christian Darrisaw (Minnesota) matched that feat in 2021.
- In total, 15 Tech alums who have played for Fuente have been selected in the NFL Draft over the past five seasons, a list that has included versatile offensive performers such as RB Khalil Herbert and TE Dalton Keene, as well as talented linemen on both sides of the ball in DT Tim Settle and G Wyatt Teller, in addition to Tech's 2021 selections.
- The 2021 NFL Draft illustrated the ability of Fuente and his staff to identify and develop talent. T Christian Darrisaw had no other FBS scholarship offers before developing into a first-round pick in Blacksburg. CB Caleb Farley was a record-setting prep quarterback who began his collegiate career at wide receiver before tapping his true potential at cornerback. S Divine Deablo also played QB in high school and also worked at wide receiver for the Hokies before moving to defense, where he blossomed into a third-round pick of Las Vegas in 2021.
- In his initial five seasons in Blacksburg, Fuente has compiled a 12-3 combined record against ACC Coastal Division rivals Virginia (4-1), North Carolina (4-1) and Duke (4-1).
- The Hokies own a 33-4 record under Fuente when leading at halftime, including a streak of five straight wins.
- Two of Fuente's key principles for quarterbacks center around sound decision making and executing plays that result in predicted outcomes. The numbers the past five seasons back up the soundness of that philosophy despite five different QBs playing prominent roles for Tech over that span.
- The Hokies averaged 440.7 ypg of total offense in 2020. Over the past 25 seasons, three of the top four seasons (2016, 2020 and 2018) for total offense at Tech have come under Fuente's watch.
- The Hokies have produced the top three passing seasons in school history since Fuente and offensive coordinator Brad Cornelsen arrived at Tech - 2016 (261.4 ypg), 2018 (253.8 ypg) and 2017 (239.5 ypg).
- Three of the top five seasons in Tech annals for total first downs (2016-18) have come under Fuente's leadership.
- The Hokies own a +77 TD-to-INT differential (118 TDs/41 INTs) since Fuente's arrival, a mark that only Clemson (+120) and North Carolina (+84) can top in

- the ACC dating back to 2016. In the the five seasons prior to Fuente's arrival the Hokies were +27 (98 TDs/71 INTs).
- VT set a school-record with a 62.2 completion percentage in 2020, breaking the previous mark of 62.1 set in Fuente's initial season at Tech in 2016.
- The Hokies led the ACC in rushing, averaging 240.1 ypg in 2020, which represented Tech's best mark since 2000. The squad's 27 rushing TDs were the most since 2010.
- Tech set a school record by averaging 5.58 yards per carry in 2020, the fourth-best mark by any P5 squad last season.
- Tech's defense has won 26 straight games when holding foes to 17 points or fewer, including six shutouts during Fuente's tenure.
- Virginia Tech has continued its special teams success under Fuente and special teams coordinator, James Shibest. Over the past four seasons, Tech's special teams were ranked fifth overall in the nation by SportSource Analytics.
- Tech has scored 13 defensive and special teams TDs during Fuente's tenure, including five in 2017 (two punt return TDs, two INT return TDs and one fumble return TD).

• The 67 players that took the field against Middle Tennessee (9/11/21) ties for the second most in the Fuente era with a contest at East Carolina (9/16/17). Seventy players saw action against William & Mary on September 8, 2018.

### MORE ON FUENTE'S DEFENSES & SHUTOUTS

- In those 13 games in which VT has allowed fewer than 10 points, six have been shutouts, and 11 have featured an ACC foe. VT is 3-0 vs. UNC, and are 2-0 against both Boston College and rival Virginia in that situation.
- Not only are the Hokies capitalizing on the defense's top performances they have a propensity to find the end zone. In Fuente's 13 10-point defensive efforts, the Hokies are averaging 33.1 points per game.

### JUSTIN HAMILTON'S SENSATIONAL SECONDARY

- In just 15 games as Defensive Coordinator, the Hokies' defense owns multiple INTS in five of those games, and Tech has won them all.
- Hamilton, Tech's safeties coach, took over DC duties in 2020.



### HOKIES GETTING COMFORTABLE AT HOME

- Virginia Tech opens the season with six of its first seven games at home. VT will become the third ACC team to end the season with four of its last five games on the road over the past 30 years.

## RECAPPING THE WVU GAME

### HEEM WITH THE SPEED

- Raheem Blackshear's 78-yard kickoff return in the second quarter was the 16th-longest return in Tech history since 1987 and the longest return since Khalil Herbert's 83 yarder at Duke (10/3/20).

### BURMEISTER'S CAREER DAY

- Starting QB Braxton Burmeister had a career day against the Mountaineers. When looking at both his Oregon and VT careers, he set career marks in completions (19), attempts (31), passing yards (223) and passing TDs (2). His 25-yard rush in the third quarter was also a career best.
- Burmeister recorded 16 rushes for the second time in his career, the first being against UCLA in 2017 as an Oregon Duck.

### I'LL TAKE THAT

- Defensive back Jermaine Waller grabbed his third INT of the season. The last time a player had three consecutive games with a pick was Dax Hollifield in 2019 when he collected one in the games against Notre Dame (11/2), Wake Forest (11/9) and Georgia Tech (11/16).
- Waller is tied for fourth in FBS with three INTs this season and was the only player to secure one in each of his team's first three contests.

- Three of the seasons with the fewest turnovers in Tech annals have come over the past five campaigns. The school record of 13 was established in 2010. Tech had only 14 in both 2017 and 2020. VT's 16 gives in 2018 tied as the fifth-lowest tally.
- The Hokies were penalized only 58 times in 2020, tying for the lowest seasonal mark in school history originally set in 1996. Tech's 60 penalties in 2017 were the third-lowest season total dating back to 1996.

## THE COMMONWEALTH CUP IS HOME!

- Tech reclaimed the Commonwealth Cup with a 33-15 victory vs. Virginia (12/12/20).
- The Hokies are 20-2 in their last 22 meetings with the Cavaliers and 16-1 in their last 17 contests.
- The next-closest school in terms of in-state dominance over an FBS rival over that span is Oklahoma over Oklahoma State. The Sooners are 18-4 in their last 22 meetings with the Cowboys.

## NFL EXPERIENCE ON DEFENSIVE STAFF

- Four members of Tech's defensive staff own NFL experience.
- Defensive coordinator Justin Hamilton was a seventh-round pick of Cleveland in the 2006 NFL Draft.
- Defensive line coach Bill Teerlinck owns eight seasons of NFL coaching experience with Indianapolis (2007-11) and Buffalo (2017-19).
- Co-defensive line coach J.C. Price was a third-round pick of Carolina in the 1996 NFL Draft.
- Director of Player Development - Defense, Pierson Prioleau was a fourth-round pick of San Francisco in the 1999 NFL Draft. He played in 160 regular season NFL games and earned a Super Bowl XLIV ring with New Orleans.

## HOMEGROWN HOKIE COACHES

- Head coach Justin Fuente currently has seven former Virginia Tech players serving in full-time roles on the football staff.
- Tech's on-field coaching staff includes three former players: Justin Hamilton (Defensive Coordinator/Safeties), J.C. Price (Co-Defensive Line/Defensive Recruiting Coordinator) and Jack Tyler (Linebackers). All three played for head coach Frank Beamer and defensive coordinator Bud Foster.
- Other former Tech players associated with the program include: Pierson Prioleau (Director of Player Development - Defense), Kyschoen Jarrett (Asst. Director of Player Personnel), Jeron Gouveia-Winslow (Asst. Director of Player Personnel) and Ryan Shuman (Director of Football Strength & Conditioning).
- Like Hamilton and Tyler, Ryan Smith is also a Virginia native. Smith added defensive passing game coordinator to his duties as cornerbacks coach in 2021.

BLACKSBURG, Va. (AP) — Braxton Burmeister ran for a touchdown and threw for another and Virginia Tech made Sam Howell look pedestrian in a 17-10 victory over No. 10 North Carolina on Friday night in the opener for both teams.

Burmeister scored on a 4-yard run and found James Mitchell for an 11-yard scoring strike as the Hokies built a 14-0 lead they took into halftime.

Howell, who'd thrown eight touchdown passes in two prior games against Virginia Tech, was sacked six times and intercepted three times, the last when he threw wildly while in the grasp of Jordan Williams and found Chamarrri Conner at the Hokies 40.

The play was reviewed, and when the officials announced that it was an interception, the sellout crowd at Lane Stadium erupted with relief. Many fans joined the team in celebration on the field after the game, which marked the first time since the 2019 season that fan attendance was not limited.

Howell did become the Tar Heels' career touchdown pass leader with 69 when Josh Downs took a screen pass 37 yards for a score in the third quarter, but he was unable to find his usual magic late.

THE TAKEAWAY

The Hokies drove for two touchdowns and to the North Carolina 10 on their first three possessions, failing to score on the middle drive when Keshawn King fumbled the ball away. They then played conservatively until Howell's pass to Downs got the Tar Heels on the board at 14-7.

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. (AP) — Jarret Doege threw two touchdown passes, Leddie Brown rushed for 106 yards and a score and West Virginia survived No. 15 Virginia Tech's furious rally from a 20-point deficit to beat the Hokies 27-21 on Saturday.

The Mountaineers (2-1) built a 27-7-point lead midway through the third quarter but saw that mostly evaporate behind Virginia Tech's Braxton Burmeister.

Burmeister threw for two scores, including a 29-yard TD toss to Jalen Holston with 3:10 left. Virginia Tech (2-1) had allowed only three touchdowns in its first two games but gave up two quick scores to the Mountaineers, who couldn't keep up the momentum after halftime.

Burmeister overcame a sack to throw three straight completions at the end of the third quarter, and his 25-yard scramble on third down set up Raheem Blackshear's 20-yard scoring run at the end of the third quarter to close the gap to 27-14.

Doege finished 15 of 25 for 193 yards and West Virginia outgained the Hokies 369-329.
