TECH STARTS SEVEN-GAME HOMESTAND WITH ACC SERIES WITH EAGLES

Hokies home through regular season: After playing 13 road games, of 18 total, in the month of April, including three ACC road trips, Virginia Tech will close out the regular season with a scheduled seven-game homestand. This will be the third seven-game homestand for the Hokies this season, with mixed results in the first two. Tech went 5-2 from Feb. 19-March 2, but were 1-6 from March 22-31.

Success at home against the Eagles: Overall, versus Boston College, Tech holds a six-game edge with a 25-19 all-time mark, but its success at English Field at Union Park over the past four series is remarkable. The Hokies have won 12 straight home games over the Eagles and includes outscoring them by more than double (89-42).

In fact, Boston College's last win here wasn't even an ACC contest, it was a midweek 12-6 victory on March 20, 2008. It's most notable for being Tech's first game after its exhibition game with the New York Yankees - held March 18 and won by New York 11-0. The Eagles did sweep an ACC series here in 2006.

Tech owns a 17-5 overall mark against Boston College in games played at home and includes back-to-back walk-offs in Game 3s the last two home series. In 2017, Jack Owens hit a bases-loaded RBI single that gave Tech a 4-3 victory in 10 innings (after tying the game in the ninth to force extras). In 2015, Brendon Hayden's two-run home run in the bottom of the ninth (on Senior Day) lifted Tech to a 2-1 win.

Nick Biddison making some home run history: In the win over Marshall (April 9), Nick Biddison hit his second grand slam of the season in the second inning, marking a couple noteworthy accomplishments.

First, since Tech joined the ACC in 2005, the program has hit 26 grand slams, with the most being four hit by the 2010 squad, which the 2019 team has now matched.

Second, Biddison became the third Hokie in that time frame to hit multiple grand slams, joining Ronnie Shaban (3) and Rahiem Cooper (2). Shaban hit one in 2009, 2010 and 2011, while Cooper was the first Hokie to hit two in the same season (he actually did it in the same game - Feb. 26, 2017 at Nevada).

Lastly, since Trey McCoy set a Tech true freshman record with 24 home runs in a single season, only freshmen Casey Waller (8, 1987) and Wyatt Torgas (8, 2002) have hit more home runs in a single season than Biddison's seven. Redshirt-freshman Michael Seaborn hit eight, as well, in the 2008 season.

Winning big, playing close: Half of Tech's 24 wins have been decided by five or more runs, the team is 12-3 in such games, opposed to 8-14 last year. Meanwhile, of Tech's 22 losses, 14 have been decided by one or two runs. The Hokies are 7-8 in one-run games and 3-6 in two-run games - they were 5-11 and 5-4 in such games last year. And until March 30, Tech pitching had not allowed an opponent to reach double figures in scoring - Clemson did it twice, the only two times this season. Opponents reach double figures in runs scored 12 times last year. Lastly, Tech is 3-4 in shutouts this season, while they went 0-3 in 2018.

An early lead is the difference: Tech is 46 games into the season and it appears that most of its games are being decided by the end of the fifth inning, when the game has become "official". In games when leading after the fifth inning, Tech is 20-2, while they are 2-13 in games when its opponent has already claimed the lead, the two wins - No. 11 Georgia Tech (April 18) and at Radford (April 24). In games tied after the fifth inning, the Hokies are 2-7.

Virginia Tech Head Coach - Second Season



Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock announced the hiring of Tech's 25th head baseball coach on June 9 and formally introduced John Szefc as the head coach of the baseball program on June 15. The 2019 season will mark his second as the Hokies' head coach.

Szefc (pronounced SHEFF) accepted the position after leading Maryland to three NCAA appearances and a 180-122 (.596) overall record as the Terrapins' head coach. He owned a 392-259-3 (.602) career record in 12 seasons as an NCAA head coach, producing 10 campaigns with 30 or more wins before arriving in Blacksburg.

In addition to ending a 43-year NCAA tournament drought and becoming the fastest coach to 100 career wins at Maryland, Szefc spent seven seasons (1996-2002) at the helm of the Marist College baseball program, where he led the team to four conference championships, four NCAA Regional appearances and a 212-137-3 (.607) overall mark. Szefc earned Northeastern Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1997 and was the American Baseball Coaches Associate Northeast Region Coach of the Year in 2001.

The first coach in Maryland history to ever take the Terrapins to an NCAA Super Regional, Szefc accomplished the feat twice in 2014 and 2015 as he guided the program to the first two 40-win seasons in school history and claimed Maryland's first two NCAA Regional crowns. Maryland achieved a final No. 14 ranking both seasons, the highest finishes in school history.

He guided the Terrapins to the ACC Tournament final for the first time in 38 years in 2014 and then took Maryland to the Big Ten tournament final in the school's initial season in that conference, winning a program-best 42 games in 2015.

Szefc has coached 102 players that have been drafted or signed professional contracts since 1997, including six selected in the 2017 MLB draft and four in 2018 (including Tech pitchers Connor Coward and Andrew McDonald). Over the last six drafts, 29 of his players have been selected, including the 45th pick of the 2014 draft Jake Stinnett, the highest pick of a Maryland player in almost a decade. He has also helped develop 23 All-Americans, including 10 of the 20 players in Maryland history to earn that distinction.

The Middletown, N.Y. native arrived at Maryland after a two-year stint as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas State (2011-12) and a two-season stay as assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas (2009-10). He also enjoyed a six-season tenure as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Louisiana-Lafayette (2003-08). Szefc began his coaching career as an assistant at Sacred Heart (1995) and at Drexel (1990-93).

Szefc managed the New York Generals in the Atlantic College Baseball League during the summers of 1995 and 1996. He led the club to a 47-28 record, earned two consecutive division titles and the ACBL title game in 1996.

Collegiately, he played two years at Connecticut before transferring in 1987 to Drexel. During his senior campaign for the Dragons, he was tabbed an All-East Coast Conference outfielder.

He graduated from Drexel University with a degree in corporate communications in 1989. He also holds a master's degree in sports administration from Temple University.

Szefc and his wife, Barbara, have a daughter, Anna, and two sons, John Michael and Sam.

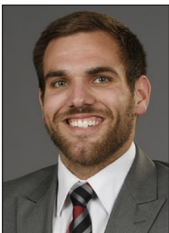

WHAT IS A HOKIE?

Probably the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics and the answer dates back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With it came a contest held by the student body for writing a new cheer and senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull said the words had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. "Hokie" soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. Below is the "Old Hokie" yell:

**Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!
Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!
Sola-Rex Sola-Rah
Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!!
Rae, Ri, V.P.I.**

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE!

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not **recognized names and should not be used.**

ENGLISH FIELD AT UNION PARK



On March 21, 2016, Virginia Tech renamed its baseball stadium to English Field at Union Park in recognition of a generous commitment of support to the athletics department from Union Bank & Trust. The stadium received substantial upgrading with help from the \$3.5 million committed by the Richmond-based bank. On the date, Tech's Board of Visitors approved extending naming rights to the stadium to Union Bank for 10 years in recognition of the company's financial support.

Located at the intersection of Southgate Drive and Duck Pond Drive, English Field at Union Park is an incredible new home for Virginia Tech baseball. Designed by Cannon Design and built by Whiting-Turner, the \$20 million renovation project added a new grandstand area – with new press-level premium suites – 1,132 permanent chair-back seats in concrete stands and a club level above the first-base dugout, along with a social picnic area down the right-field line. The terracing along the third-base line remains.

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8, 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who provided financial support for its initial construction.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on Tech's football team from 1930-33 and graduated in 1934. He contributed to Tech athletics for more than 50 years and was one of the founders of The Student Aid Association in 1949. He served as president of that organization two of its first three years. English received the most outstanding alumni award at Tech in 1984.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991. Laird recruited and coached Sampson at Tech.

The team's year-by-year overall mark in its 30 seasons at English Field at Union Park can be seen on the right. Before it, the Hokies played home baseball games at Tech Park, where it compiled a 431-122-1 (.779 winning percentage) record over 34 seasons. All-time, Tech is 1,273-581-12 (.685) in games played in Blacksburg.

Facing any ranked opponents: The chart on the left shows how the Hokies have fared against any ranked opponent in their history as a member of the ACC (since 2005). Currently, there is one team left on the Hokies' regular-season schedule that is currently nationally ranked.

Last season, Tech played 14 games versus ranked opponents and were 2-12. In 2019, the Hokies have faced five ranked teams - Florida State (No. 1 by Collegiate Baseball), North Carolina (No. 8, Baseball American), Clemson (No. 15, Collegiate Baseball), Georgia Tech (No 11, D1Baseball) and Miami (No. 22, NCBWA). Tech has gone 3-12 against those teams with one win each over the Seminoles, Tar Heels and Georgia Tech.

Series wins over nationally-ranked ACC opponents: In its history, Tech has won 11 ACC series over ranked teams, eight of which have come at home. Tech's last series win over a ranked ACC opponent was No. 1 Florida State, March 17-19, 2017. After dropping Game 1, the Hokies won the final two games of that set.

The Hokies' last series win on the road against a ranked ACC team was at No. 3 Georgia Tech, April 23-25, 2010 when the Hokies won the first two games before dropping the final. They also beat No. 4 Florida State that year as well - April 2-4, again taking the first two.

Facing a top-ranked ACC team: Since the Hokies joined the ACC, they've played 11 series against a No. 1 team, seven of which have been at English Field at Union Park.

Overall, Tech is 7-13 in home games and includes series wins in its last two. In 2015, Tech swept Virginia (March 13-15) and the 2017 squad took two-of-three from Florida State (March 17-19). The other top-ranked teams to visit Blacksburg were UNC (2013, 0-3), Virginia (2011, 0-3), UNC (2009, 0-2), Miami (2008, 1-2) and Florida State (2006, 1-2).

However, the Hokies have not been as successful on the road against top-ranked ACC teams, as they are just 2-10 in four sets. They were swept at Florida State (April 13-15, 2007) and Virginia (March 28-30, 2014) and went 1-2 at Virginia (April 16-18, 2010) and this year at Florida State.

The Hokies in the Sunshine State: The 2019 season-opening weekend marked the first of three trips for Tech to the state of Florida - as the Hokies returned to face No. 1 Florida State March 8-9 and made a return trip to Coral Gables to face No. 22 Miami last weekend. Their nine games in the Sunshine State was the most since the 1996 season, when Tech played nine times there as well - three at South Florida and six in Winter Park, but the team went just 1-8 in that span.

They opened this nine-game stretch 3-0 in the RyCass Classic in DeLand, with wins over Stetson, Manhattan and Sam Houston State. Tech won one game at Florida State (March 9, the first game of a doubleheader there), but were swept at Miami to finish 4-5 in Florida this season.

Overall, Tech has a 55-104 record in 159 games in the Sunshine State - which included a 3-2 record last year in DeLand. The Hokies are now 16-70 on the road, but hold a 39-34 edge in neutral site contests, which included six straight wins in the state before the Florida State series.

Speaking of the season opener: The 5-0 shutout victory over Stetson on Feb. 15 to open the season was just the sixth season-opening shutout recorded by a Tech pitching staff and the first since 1997 - Feb. 21 at NC A&T, a 10-0 victory. It was also just the 14th shutout during the month of February and the earliest by date - Feb. 16, 2013 at UNC Wilmington (the third game of the season).

The other years Tech had a shutout on Opening Day - 1909, 1945, 1950, 1978 (Game 2 of a doubleheader) and 1996.

A number of new faces in the opener: Tech, who features 20 new players on the 2019 roster (11 freshman, nine transfers), had seven different Hokies in the starting lineup compared to the 2018 season opener. According to SID research, the 20 newcomers for the Hokies are the fourth most for 2019 NCAA baseball teams. ETSU leads the nation with 25 (16 F/9 T), followed by Kentucky (16/5) and Western Kentucky (6/15) with 21 each.

Home Runs a plenty at VMI: In a 12-run victory in Lexington (April 2), the Hokies blasted a season-high five home runs, the most by the team in a single game in two years. Tech last hit at least five home runs on March 28, 2017 at home versus Campbell (interestingly enough in a 15-8 loss). The last time they hit at least five on the road was February 26, 2017 at Nevada - the Hokies hit six in a 24-10 win.

There were two other noteworthy events that took place with the home run onslaught.

1) Dalton Harum hit three home runs in the win, marking the first Tech player to hit three in a game since Rahiem Cooper belted three in that win over the WolfPack in Nevada on Feb. 27.

2) Harum's second home run followed Kevin Madden's three-run shot, which marked the first Hokies to hit back-to-back home runs since May 2, 2018 - Tom Stoffel and Sam Fragale at Liberty.

Strikeouts a plenty at VMI: It wasn't just a home run party in Lexington, as the Tech pitching staff combined to strike out 16 Keydets in the victory, with Luke Scherzer striking out the side twice en route to a career-high nine-strikeout performance. Peyton Alford (4), Jack Goonan (1) and Dillon Larsen (2) contributed to the season-high tying 16 K-effort. At Florida State on March 8, the Hokies also struck out 16, but in 10 innings (the team had 15 through nine).

Since 2005, when Tech joined the ACC, the pitching staff has struck out 16 or more batters just six times in a nine-inning game with the high being 18 vs. Navy on Feb. 20, 2005. The other five times were 16-K games, including a total of three times versus VMI (also on April 4, 2007 and March 30, 2010), versus Savannah State (May 8, 2010) and the last - and only time in ACC play - was on April 10, 2011 at Wake Forest.



Starting 5-0 and beyond: Tech started the 2019 season with seven straight wins for the first time since 1987 and just the fourth time in program history, however, even a 5-0 start to the season is rare at the school. Only 13 times in 126 seasons of baseball has the team been 5-0, and only six of those teams won their sixth game of the year to get to 6-0.

Of those three other teams, the 1987 team started the year 8-0 before its first loss, while both the 1920 and 1915 squads raced out to 10-0 marks. Only the 1915 team, which finished a perfect 21-0, won its first 11 games of the year. Throwing a monkey wrench into the equation, in 1992, the Hokies were 5-0, tied their sixth game and were unbeaten after 11 games holding a 10-0-1 mark before their first loss.

Of the 13 teams that started the season 5-0 and played at least 20 games, all except one (2017) finished 10 or more games above .500 and the last five (minus that 2017) won at least 32 games. Currently, the Hokies have 24 victories and are plus-two in the win column.

Winning seven straight at any point: For the first time since the 2015 season, the Hokies put together a winning streak of at least seven straight wins when they also won seven from April 26 through May 5. The team also had a seven-game win streak from Feb. 26 through March 9, 2012.

At his previous stop, head coach John Szefc's best start at Maryland was 4-0 to open the 2015 season and after 10 games, his best record was 8-2 which opened the 2014 campaign. His 2019 Tech team started 8-2 as well. Also, at Maryland, Szefc coached his teams to six winning streaks of seven games or more, with a long of 11 straight games in 2014 (May 2 through May 23).

Taylor sets a Tech and ACC record: In just his second collegiate game, freshman Carson Taylor tied both a Virginia Tech school record and an ACC record when four of his five hits against Manhattan (Feb. 16) that day were doubles.

It had been done just two other times at the school. Bryan Thomas first set the mark with four versus Savannah State on Feb. 21, 2005 and it was matched by Chad Pinder versus Bradley on Feb. 18, 2012.

Only eight ACC players (listed on the right) have ever accomplished the feat and Pinder was the last.

Horanski blasts a walk-off home run: With his team trailing by a run and looking to stay perfect on the season, Luke Horanski blasted his third home run of the season, a two-run shot in the bottom of the ninth inning, to lift the Hokies to an 8-7 victory over Radford (Feb. 26).

For Horanski, it was his second walk-off hit as a Hokie, as he also had a bases-loaded RBI single in the 10th frame against Old Dominion on April 18, 2018 as Tech beat the Monarchs 6-5.

Since 2005, a Hokie has hit a walk-off home run 10 times, but this was just the second when the team was trailing in the home half. The other was Senior Day at English Field at Union Park when Brendon Hayden hit a two-run home run to walk off Boston College 2-1 on May 3, 2015. That was also the last walk-off home run hit by a Hokie before this year.

Tech's walk-off wins: In his first home game as Tech head coach and his eighth game overall, John Szefc saw his team win in walk-off fashion in extra innings against Radford, 3-2 in 12 frames (Feb. 27, 2018). It took just seven games in the 2019 season to see his team register a walk-off win this year, ironically enough, against Radford again (Feb. 26). Luke Horanski hit a two-run walk-off home run in the bottom of the ninth to keep the Hokies perfect on the season.

Since joining the ACC (15 seasons), the Hokies have had 36 walk-off wins (15 in ACC games) - with the most occurring during the 2012 season, when they had seven.

The earliest walk-off in that span (by date) was Feb. 25, 2012 - Chad Morgan sac fly in the bottom of the ninth that gave Tech a 4-3 win over Iowa in Conway, S.C.

In the last five seasons, the Hokies have 14 walk-off wins, eight against ACC opponents. Below is a list of Tech's walk-off victories the last five seasons.

2019 VIRGINIA TECH GAME NOTES - WEEKEND NO. 12



Tech playing ACC Doubleheaders: In its history in the ACC, when it comes to doubleheaders, Tech has now played 29 of them, including three this season, and overall has won two, lost 11 and has split 16.

Of the 29, it's almost split right down the middle with 15 of them being played on the road and 14 at English Field at Union Park. Last season, the Hokies played two at home (Pittsburgh and Louisville) and two on the road (at Boston College and Virginia) splitting three of four.

On the road, the Hokies are 0-6-9 in DHs, as the team split one at Florida State (March 9) and were swept in one at Wake Forest (April 6). The team is 2-5-7 in ACC DHs at home, losing both ends to No. 11 Georgia Tech (April 20).

Overall, Tech played five doubleheaders last year and with the DH against the Yellow Jackets, it was the team's fourth in 2019. Earlier this season, they also split a home DH versus Bryant (March 2).

Home Sweet Home in February: When the calendar turned to March 1 for the opening of that series with Bryant, it was a bit unfortunately for the Hokies, because they had to say goodbye to the month of February. Overall in program history in the month, Tech holds a 111-56 record (.665 winning percentage), but when it comes to playing in Blacksburg during February, the team is far better.

The Hokies have posted a 27-3 record (.900 winning percentage) in home games played in the month. Tech has won 13 straight dating back to its 2013 home opener against Temple (Feb. 23, a 7-3 defeat) and includes a program-tying best four wins this season - the team also won four at home in February 2009.

No-hit bids come up short: This season, two Tech pitchers have taken no-hitters further than any pitcher ever before in ACC action.

First, Chris Gerard tossed six no-hit frames at No. 1 Florida State before allowing a leadoff single in the seventh (more on that game later) and Ian Seymour went the furthest ever allowing an infield single with one out in the ninth.

The furthest prior on the road was Devin Burke (May 4, 2013) at Boston College, who took a no-hitter into the sixth. The latest in a home game was Packy Naughton (May 3, 2015) who was perfect after 5.2 innings before a two-out hit in the sixth.

One last note, Seymour had a no-hitter through five frames last year against Kansas State on February 19, 2018 in Myrtle Beach, S.C.

The last known no-hitter thrown by a Tech pitcher was Jon Hartness, a nine-inning no-hitter versus Utica College on March 18, 1984 (a 1-0 victory).

Gerard was named the ACC Pitcher of the Week and the NCBWA National Pitcher of the Week for his effort, while both he and Seymour were honored by Collegiate Baseball as one of several National Players of the Week.

A one-hitter in ACC action: Gerard combined with Jack Dellinger, who threw the final two innings without allowing a hit in that March 9 game at FSU, to record the Hokies' first ever ACC one-hitter. In Tech's 15 years in the league, the fewest hits ever allowed in an ACC game prior to that effort was three, six times - four times on the road and twice at home and includes:

- vs. NC State - March 29, 2018 at Boston College - May 3, 2013*
 - at Maryland - April 20, 2013 at Florida State - March 31, 2012*
 - at Boston College - March 27, 2011 vs. Maryland - March 13, 2010
- * - BC game went 12 innings, but all three hits were through 9; FSU game went 8 innings

Since March 9, Tech has twice allowed just three hits again, pushing that total to eight in 15 seasons - an eight-inning game at Pittsburgh (March 17) and the UNC game tossed by Seymour (March 22).

Owens home runs start the game: Jack Owens opened game 2 of the DH at Wake Forest (April 6) by hitting a home run to right field, the ninth of his career. With it, he became the first Hokie to ever hit two leadoff home runs against ACC foes and the only Hokie to hit three leadoff home runs in the first inning (home or road, Tech's first at-bat in a game) as a member of the ACC.

Only two other Hokies have ever hit a game-opening home run on the road in an ACC game (see below, *italics*), while seven have hit a leadoff home run in the first inning (home or road, Tech's first at-bat in a game) as a member of the ACC.

Seymour strikes out 11 at Miami: In his last start at Miami (April 26), Ian Seymour struck out a career-high 11 Hurricanes in a 4-3 loss to No. 22 Miami. He became just the fourth Hokie to strike out 11 or more ACC batters in a regular-season game since Tech joined the league (2005).

Seymour strikes out 10+ again: In all, a total of 17 Hokies have struck out 10-plus batters in a game since 2005 and only 12 have done it in an ACC game. Seymour became the first to do it as a freshman, when he struck out 10 Pittsburgh Panthers last year on March 10.

The last freshman with more 10+ Ks in a game was Pat Pinkman, vs. Liberty, when he struck out 12, March 3, 1998.

Combining that effort with Miami's, Seymour became the fifth Hokie pitcher with two 10+ K performances against ACC opponents in a regular-season game.

Gerard in rare company: Freshman pitcher Chris Gerard has done a couple things this season rarely, if ever done, in Tech's history in the ACC.

1) He is just the second freshman to win three games in ACC action, joining Justin Wright (2008), but he's the first to win all three of those games as a starter.

2) He's just the third Tech pitcher to win three ACC road games in a single season, joining Joe Parsons (2011 - at BC, Maryland and Duke) and Devin Burke (2013 - at Duke, Maryland and BC), but he's the first to do it as a freshman (at Florida State, Pittsburgh and Wake Forest). All three did it as starters as well.

3) He's the 12th Hokie to strike out at least 10 batters in an ACC game (at FSU March 9-G1) and just the second to do it as a freshman - Ian Seymour vs. Pittsburgh (March 10, 2018).

Four-game road trip closed April for Hokies: Tech entered the ACC series at Miami winners of two straight and reached 24 wins for the first time since 2015, when the Hokies finished with 27 victories and made the ACC Championship tournament.

Winning on the road had much to do with Tech's success this year, as the Hokies had won five games away from home in the ACC for only the sixth time in program history and the most since 2013 (school-record high tying eight). They also won 10 road games overall, the most since the 2015 team won 11, and their 12 wins away from Blacksburg overall is the most since 2013 as well.

Winning in the non-conference: The Hokies had won five straight midweek games before their loss at Old Dominion (April 30), pushing their season total to 17 which is the most in a single season at the school since the 2013 team won 20 during the regular season. From 2003 through 2013 (11 years), Tech won at least 16 non-conference regular season games, while the team won a high of 14, twice, during the past five years.

Also, their previous seven-game winning streak over non-conference foes which started the 2019 season was the longest streak since the 2012 team won 18 in a row during the year and went on to win 23 during the regular season.

Tech sweeps an ACC opponent: Back in April 2017, Tech took three games from Boston College and continued its success against the Eagles in Blacksburg. In its history in the ACC, Tech has swept nine opponents, with six of those

coming at home - four of them (2010, 2012, 2015, 2017) against Boston College. The other home sweeps include Pitt (2015) and No. 1 Virginia (2015), the team's only sweep of a nationally-ranked opponent since joining the league.

On the road, Tech has three sweeps and two were at former member Maryland (2009, 2011). The program's only other sweep on the road was at Duke in 2013.

A pair of Hokies named to watch lists: Many national award Watch Lists have been announced in the month of April and two Virginia Tech baseball players, senior Luke Horanski and freshman Chris Gerard, have found themselves on one of those lists joining the nation's best at the collegiate level.

The Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission announced a new name for the 20th Anniversary of the national collegiate catcher of the year award when it released the official watch list. Previously known as the Johnny Bench Award, the Buster Posey National Collegiate Catcher of the Year Award will continue to honor the nation's top division one collegiate catcher as voted on by head coaches and sports information directors.

The Buster Posey Award will be administered by the Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission.

Seventy-nine catchers, including Horanski, were nominated for the 2019 Buster Posey Award by their coaches. Because the award is given annually to the top division one collegiate catcher, the list will be updated to include other candidates until May 6, 2019. The watch list will be narrowed down to the semifinalists, whom will be announced May 17, 2019.

The College Baseball Foundation also recently released its initial 2019 Pitcher of the Year Award Watch List, highlighting 69 of the top arms in the country, and includes Gerard, who is one of six ACC pitchers on the list. The award, college baseball's version of the Cy Young Award which was created in 2009, and is given annually to the nation's top collegiate pitcher. Sponsored by Diamond, the award winner will be announced this summer by the CBF.
